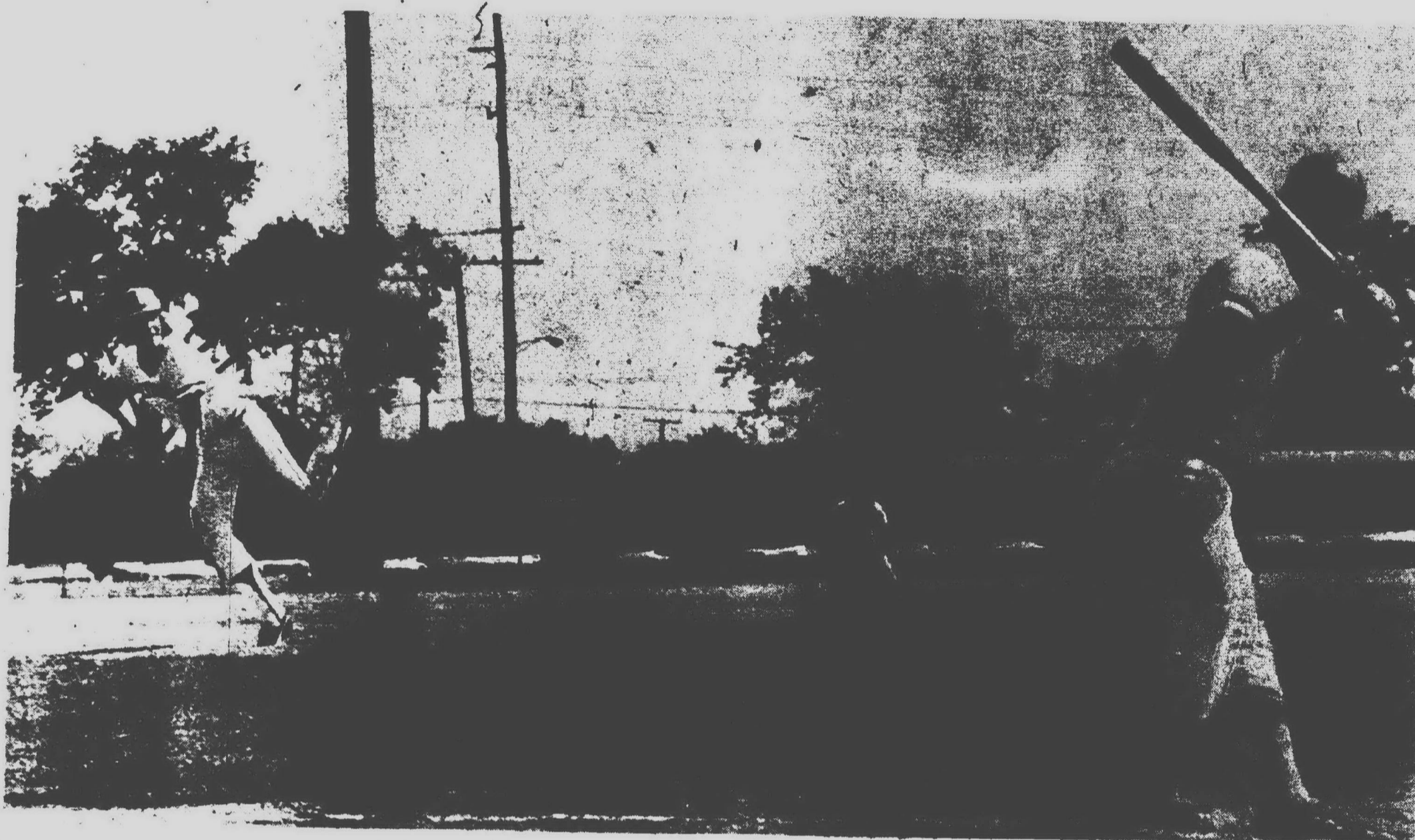

Townships consider dropping funding

The Plymouth-Canton Development Commission (PCDC), an agency charged with the attraction of industry to the Plymouth-Canton area, could soon enter the throes of death.

Governing bodies of Canton and Plymouth townships, two of the four local governmental units which support the PCDC, have agreed to reevaluate their participation in the industrial agency and could decide to drop out.

That, says PCDC president Harold Guenther, could signal the agency's death.

"If one unit dropped out, I think it would have a domino effect," Guenther said. "The drop-out would have a reason and impinge on the other municipalities. It would take \$5,000 annually out of the budget and preclude the hiring of a professional person. If one or two units dropped out, it might cause the other units to reevaluate their participation."

PCDC MEMBERS, which include the City of Plymouth, the Plymouth Community School District and Plymouth and Canton townships, recently received their semi-annual bills of \$2,500, covering the period April 1 through Sept. 31.

Raymond Hoedel, the school district's assistant superintendent for business, said the school board has al-

ready pledged its share of the funding through Sept. 31. The school board, he added, will probably reassess its participation between now and September.

Plymouth City Manager Fred Yockey said the PCDC's semi-annual bill will soon appear before commission members.

"I'm sure there'll be some discussion on our further participation," Yockey said. "I really don't know what they'll decide to do."

The boards of trustees of Canton and Plymouth townships, however, have already begun to seriously consider the dropping of the program.

THE PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP

Board of Trustees last week deleted the PCDC payment from its list of approved bills. Board members directed Trustee Frank Millington to submit a report on the PCDC in four to six weeks as well as a recommendation on the township's continued participation in the program.

"We've questioned before whether we've been getting use out of the commission," said township Clerk Helen Richardson. "There was a question whether we should stay in when they hired Jim McCartney (as executive director in September).

"It's hard to say whether the commission's done us any good," she added. "We have no idea how much industry came in because of the PCDC. There's no way you can tell. Our balance of industry is good right now."

CANTON'S BOARD of trustees Tuesday considered ending its participation in the PCDC but decided to table the matter, pending action from the PCDC's board of directors concerning the replacement of former executive director James McCartney, who recently resigned.

PCDC members will discuss that matter next week, according to Guenther.

"It's sitting in a state of limbo right now," he said. "I will be calling for a reaffirmation of the PCDC concept. We may see that the whole concept of PCDC is no longer supported by governing bodies."

Canton board members questioned the benefits the township has received from the agency.

"We're not against industrial development," said Supervisor Robert Greenstein. "But what we're getting from the PCDC doesn't seem to justify our participation."

Added Clerk John Flodin, "I have the feeling the organization has done its work, and it may be time to longer participate. I think we have the right to withdraw at any time. I think this may be the opportunity."

BART BERG, president of the Canton Chamber of Commerce, said, "I would hate to see the township abandon this, unless we earmark these funds for the attraction of industry to the township. I think you could spend \$5,000 without a full time director."

Although the Plymouth City Commission's position on the PCDC is undetermined at this time, Yockey expressed hopes that the agency will survive.

"I personally hope that everyone stays in it," the city manager said. "I think there's a need for a place where people wanting to locate in the area can go."

Residential sewer rates may be increased soon

A rate increase of close to 50 per cent for sewage treatment by the Metropolitan Detroit Water Department, could mean an even bigger boost in rates for area residents.

The increase, scheduled to begin on Sept. 1 has officials in the city of Plymouth and Canton and Plymouth

townships taking a closer look at rates charged to residents.

According to Plymouth City Manager Fred Yockey the rate increase will represent an average boost of \$2.71 per quarter for city residents, "but that doesn't mean a whole lot. Some people use 10 times that

amount. It depends on their usage of water," Yockey said.

Plymouth Township Water Department head Web Kincade said rates will be increased to at least cover the cost increase from the MDWD, but added there may be an additional markup by the township. "Everything else has gone up too. We buy autos like everyone else and our labor has gone up.

"THERE PROBABLY will be a markup because of the added expense for us," Kincade said.

Yockey said he thought the city would be able to keep the increase at the same level as the rate hike from Detroit, with no additional markup, but Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein said he wasn't sure the same could be said in Canton.

"We've absorbed several rate hikes already and I don't honestly know whether we will add our own markup at this point.

Greenstein added some criticism of the hike: "In my discussions with Livonia Mayor Ed McNamara (a member of the MDWD) I've learned that only half of the rate hike may be necessary at present. The increase is set up so that half goes to general improvement of the system and the other half goes to improvements within the Detroit system. I don't enjoy supporting the Detroit system with out-county donations."

The supervisor said he doubted that

Rape victim identifies assailant in open court

PLYMOUTH — A Westland woman who charged she had been sexually assaulted identified the alleged assailant in open court Thursday during pre-trial arraignment conducted by 35th District Judge Dunbar Davis.

At the request of defense attorney John McDonald of Farmington Hills, a lineup was established during the proceedings to see if the defendant could be identified.

The victim, without hesitation identified, Lawrence Franklin Jr., 32 of 7631 Kingsbridge, Canton Township, as the man who assaulted her.

FRANKLIN was bound over to Wayne County Circuit Court for trial. Bond was continued at \$100,000. He stood mute (no plea) at pre-trial and the court entered a plea of innocent on his behalf. The pre-trial arraignment in circuit court is scheduled for July 10.

Franklin, vice-president of the Windsor Park Civic Association, remains in jail having failed to post bond. His attorney is expected to petition circuit court for a reduction in bond.

Evidence gathered by police was introduced by Varskin Baydarian, Wayne County assistant prosecutor who handled the prosecution in 35th District Court.

WHEN FIRST arraigned, Franklin's defense attorney entered asked that his client be sent to the forensic center for examination because he was mentally incompetent to in his own defense.

Judge Davis granted that request and says the report back from the forensic center in Ypsilanti indicated Franklin was mentally and emotionally incompetent and could stand trial.

The investigation was conducted by a task force of City of Plymouth Police Department officers and Michigan State Police troopers in Plymouth.

FRANKLIN HAS been charged with criminal sexual conduct, first degree.

He was arrested in his home May 28 after a Westland woman filed a complaint with police that she was forced at gunpoint to commit a sexual act in the creek near McKinley and Ann Arbor Road four days earlier.

The pre-trial in Plymouth established that the evidence against Franklin was "sufficient to establish probable cause" that a crime had been committed and the accused had com-

mitted the crime. Evidence gathered by police was introduced by Varskin Baydarian, Wayne County assistant prosecutor who handled the prosecution in 35th District Court.

To match union employes

Pay raises eyed for elected county officials

WAYNE COUNTY—County commissioners will consider today (June 16) whether to add \$750,000 in extra expenses to the county's current budget already expected to strain with a projected \$8 million deficit.

Recommendations to add \$256,600 for 4.5 per cent pay raises for elected officials, their deputies and all non-union employes, and \$481,528 for criminal justice programs were approved Thursday by the board's Ways and Means Committee.

Approval was given despite protestations by the county's Board of Auditors.

THE PAY RAISES, timed to coincide with a 4.5 per cent raise negotiated for Council 23 union employes, will, if approved, become effective July 1 and run to the end of the fiscal year, Nov. 31. The raises would cost \$612,800 for the next fiscal year.

Except for county commissioners, the raises will apply to all elected officials—county judges, auditors, county clerk, drain commissioner, prosecuting attorney, register of deeds, sheriff and treasurer—and their appointed deputies.

Pay hikes will also be given to 511 other employes exempt from collective bargaining.

COMMISSIONER Richard Manning (D-Redford), whose district includes

Redford Township and part of Livonia, argued in favor of the raises to bring the officials and employes into equity with other county employes. He called 4.5 per cent "extremely modest."

Manning contended savings in personnel expenses could be negotiated in terms other than the 4.5 per cent raise.

"It is a unique logic to say we should make things (deficit) worse and worse before we deal with it," said Commissioner Tom F. Taylor (D-Westland), whose district includes Garden City and part of Westland. "It shows a unique callousness on the part of elected officials."

On another item requiring raises for supervisors totalling \$168,100 for the rest of the year, Taylor exploded at his fellow commissioners who favored the raises. "I'm going to change my tactic (of opposing additional expenses) and I'm going to vote to push us into a crisis situation. Maybe then we will all sit down and work out our problems at the table."

COMMISSIONER Mary Dumas (R-Livonia) opposed the raises, saying, "They must make some kind of sacrifice. The people (employes) are basically at equity."

The vote was 12-7 with Manning in favor and Commissioners Royce Smith (D-Belleville), whose district in-

cludes Plymouth and Canton Township, Taylor and Mrs. Dumas opposing the raises. Commissioner John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights), whose district includes part of Westland, was absent.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE programs approved by Ways and Means for funding include five previously funded by the federal and state governments. The position of an administrator in

the prosecutor's office was approved, but will not cost the county any additional money.

Others approved and the amount of funding for the remainder of the fiscal year are:

- Prosecutor's Consumer Protection Unit, \$193,415;
- Recorder's Court Drug Addict Probation Services, \$155,913;
- Sheriff's Metro Narcotic Squad, \$132,000; and

•Sheriff's Metropolitan Helicopter Program, \$41,000 to continue an experimental patrol of the Westland-Garden City-Wayne -Inkster area.

County Auditor John Gourlay said: "To extend these grants at this time to the end of the year would be folly...you people (commissioners) will have to bear the brunt of this action... If you do this, you will have to cut basic services."

County budget cuts ordered

WAYNE COUNTY—A \$2.5 million reduction in the county's current budget has been mandated by the board of commissioners.

At its June 5 meeting, the board ordered several of its departments to cut their spending by \$2,487,235 so the county can reduce its projected \$8.8 million deficit.

Other steps taken to save money are: stringent enforcement of the freeze on hiring, expanding use of Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) employes, reserving \$3.5 million in capital improvement projects appropriations for possible operating expense use, and reducing non-departmental spending by \$0.4 million.

The Labor Relations Board has been authorized to meet with county labor unions, the board of auditors and the board's fiscal adviser to discuss ways of cutting personnel costs. Any agreement requiring sacrifice by county employes would be unilaterally applied to all of them, according to an amendment sponsored by Commissioner Tom F. Taylor (D-Westland).

REDUCTIONS in departmental spending include \$1.7 million at Wayne County General Hospital, \$407,000 in circuit court, \$214,790 in recorder's court and its probation department, and \$150,375 in common pleas court.

An approved amendment sponsored by Commissioner Richard Manning

(D-Redford) stipulates that the hospital, in reducing its spending, should consider layoffs as a last possible solution and should meet with interested alternatives.

STEPS TOWARD reducing the deficit were begun last year by a special committee, including area commissioners John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights) and Manning, and only were finally approved by the board's ways and means committee last month.

Commissioners Mary Dumas (R-Livonia), Royce Smith (D-Belleville), Barr, Manning and Taylor voted with the majority, 16-5, with one abstention to approve the cost-cutting program on June 5.

Commissioners revoke county hospital layoffs

WAYNE COUNTY—Layoff notices issued to about 40 Wayne County General Hospital employes have been rescinded while other means of saving \$1.7 million at the hospital are sought.

Notices delivered May 30 with an effective date of June 20 were ordered pulled back by the board of commissioners June 5. The board directed the board of county institutions (BCI) to withdraw the notices, as recommended by the board's human resources committee.

Commissioner Tom F. Taylor (D-Westland) opposed the board's action, while Commissioner Mary Dumas (R-

Livonia) abstained. Commissioners John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights), Richard Manning (D-Redford) and Royce Smith (D-Belleville) voted with the majority, 14-3, with five abstentions.

Barr's district includes part of Westland; Mrs. Dumas', most of Livonia; Manning's, Redford Township and parts of Livonia; Smith's, Plymouth and Canton Township; and Taylor's, Garden City and part of Westland.

LAYOFFS WERE ordered by the hospital administration when it became apparent in early May that commissioners wanted to cut the hospital's budget by \$500,000 more than hospital officials had anticipated.

A May 15 report sent by the BCI to the human resources committee detailing steps to cut back nonpatient care personnel was apparently disregarded when committee members voted June 4 to censure the board of institutions for its "unilateral" action.

The board of commissioners, however, killed the committee's recommendation for censure for approving the notices without board clearance.

THE BOARD OF institutions, comprised of three commissioners and two elected county auditors, is responsible for policy decisions concerning the hospital. Symuel Smith is the hospital administrator responsible for management.

Some viewed the committee's action as a challenge to Smith.

Commissioner Manning June 12 said the implication made by some commissioners was that "Smith should either save the money (in some other way) or find a new hospital. Smith was a test case, and the test only showed we have no money."

UNDER A DECISION prompted by Manning, representatives of hospital management and employes and the board of commissioners are to meet to discuss ways of saving the board-ordered \$1.7 million out of the hospital's \$40 million budget.

Hilton Inn requests rezoning for parking

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP — A request to rezone the remaining portion of the parking lot for the Plymouth Hilton Inn will be considered Wednesday, June 18, by the Plymouth Township Planning Commission.

Deane Baker, owner of the inn, is seeking the rezoning for the remaining portion of the parking lot on the east side of Northville Road.

If approved, the change would be from single-family residential to vehicular parking.

Commission meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. in township hall, Lilley at Ann Arbor Road, and are open to the public.

IN OTHER ACTION, under new business, the commission will consider a rezoning request being made jointly by the Marathon Oil Company and Standard Federal Savings & Loan Association.

The petitioners want to rezone from residential to commercial property on the southwest corner of Haggerty and Ann Arbor Road.

It involves the same parcel which Marathon wanted to build a gasoline

station on a few years ago. At that time, the township denied the rezoning and Marathon went to court.

A consent judgement was rendered against the township allowing Marathon to build a gasoline station. But the station was never built, and the consent judgement has now expired. Details for planned future use for the property by petitioners will be revealed Wednesday.

UNDER OLD BUSINESS, commissioners will consider:

• A revised tentative preliminary plat from Gould Development Company for the Plymouth-Joy Subdivision, north of Joy and west of Lilley.

• Final plat approvals for Plymouth Village East, for an Amoco Oil Company gasoline station at the northeast corner of I-275 (Haggerty) Freeway and Ann Arbor Road, and for the Robinson Tool Company on the north side of Joy at Haggerty.

COMMISSIONERS WILL also consider:

• Site plan approval requested by Binder & Lark Building Company for Plymouth Corners Apartment com-

plex at the southeast corner of Five Mile and Bradner Roads.

• A request from Frank Pellerito to rezone the north portion of the first lot west of Bill Knapps Restaurant, on the north side of Ann Arbor Road at Haggerty, from single-family to office service.

• A request from J-P Properties to rezone the lot immediately north of Bill Knapps, on the west side of Haggerty, from office service to vehicular parking.

The commission will also elect a vice-chairman to fill the term ending in January 1976, of Dale Siefker who resigned from planning commission some time ago.

County agrees to resurface

PLYMOUTH — The Board of Wayne County Road Commissioners has agreed to resurface Ann Arbor Trail if the City of Plymouth agrees to pay for half the expense.

If the commission does agree, explains City Manager Fred L. Yockey, it is likely Ann Arbor Trail will be resurfaced with asphalt from Main Street to Sheldon.

If not, the minimum work to be done would be the stretch from Harvey to Sheldon. "We'll certainly do that much, and whether the entire stretch is resurfaced will be decided between the city commission and county once our engineers come up with project plans and cost estimates."

Once Ann Arbor Trail is improved, it will then be designated as a local

street with the city accepting responsibility for maintenance. Presently Ann Arbor Trail is a city street east of Main Street.

The city commission has agreed in principle to the redesignation if the county first gets Ann Arbor Trail in good condition. If negotiations are finalized, and construction agreed upon, work is expected to start in 1976.

The city attorney is presently preparing an agreement to be presented to the commission for consideration at a future meeting.

The commitment from the road commission was relayed to Yockey by Robert A. Larson, director of transportation for the Wayne County Road Commission.

Mayors to debate mass transit needs

PLYMOUTH—Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch will join with two other western Wayne County mayors Wednesday to try to get the Southeast Michigan Transit Authority (SEMTA) to include the area in more extensive transit plans.

Joining with mayors Eugene McKinney of Westland and Edward McNamara of Livonia, the mayor will argue on behalf of the area's need for more mass transit.

According to Mayor McAninch proposals which include the city in metropolitan transit plans only provide for bus service. "We've made a big headway by getting both SEMCOG

and SEMTA to look at the C&O railroad tracks as a possibility, but so far there's been no real change."

The public meeting will begin at 10 a.m. at the Senior Citizens Center, Seven Mile and Middlebelt, in Livonia.

On hand to debate some of the merits of the present plans will be representatives of both SEMTA and SEMCOG.

Plans for the area are part of a regional transportation study which has been completed by SEMCOG and outlines projected transportation needs and main and secondary arteries through 1990.

The students perform a skit on bike safety in the elementary schools and then pass out a Michigan State University pamphlet on bike safety and a quiz.

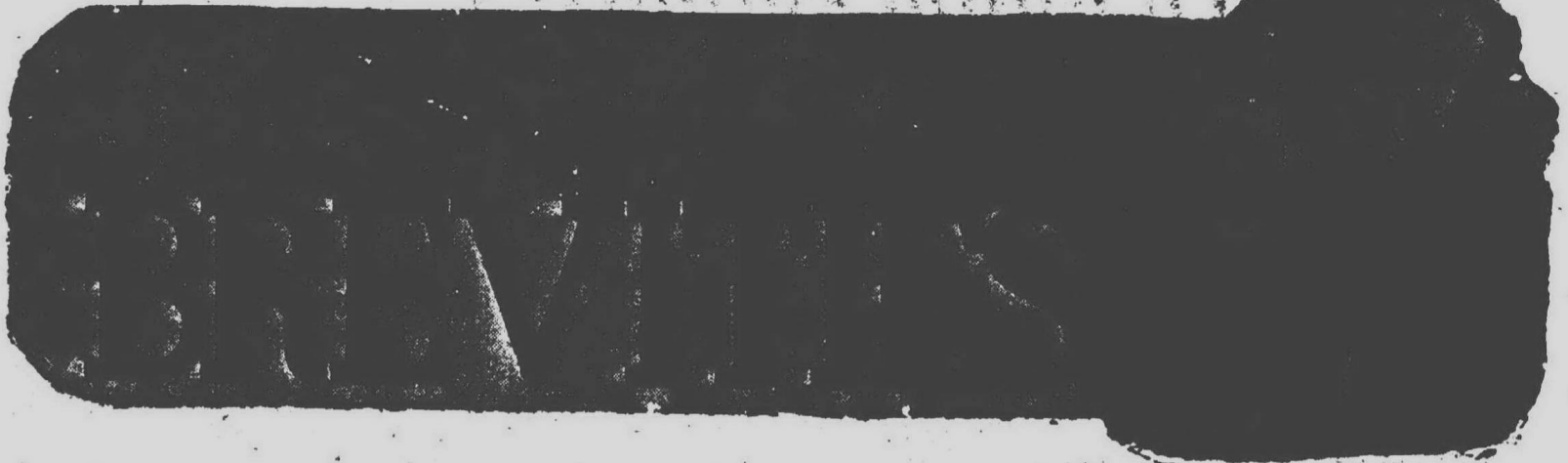

much would be done by suburban officials to fight the Sept. 1 hike which will put the price of treatment for one million gallons of waste water at \$140.96, from a previous \$94.18.

"The thinking right now is to accept the increase at present and fight to insure that it doesn't happen again."

GREENSTEIN said he is hopeful the state legislature will take action on three proposals to bring some equity into the current operation of the water department which services southeastern Michigan.

"We've made three recommendations which would insure the suburbs aren't treated unfairly including:

• Equal representation on the MDWD by the suburbs (currently there are four Detroit representatives and three from Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties).

• An annual up-to-date audit of the books which will be available to the public.

• A 'real' public hearing prior to any proposed rate increase with a method for appealing the ruling of the MDWD."

Sewage charges in all three communities are based on the amount of water that is metered as it comes into the home or business. The sewage rate is then applied to the amount of water taken in and added to the actual water charge to produce a combined water and sewer bill.

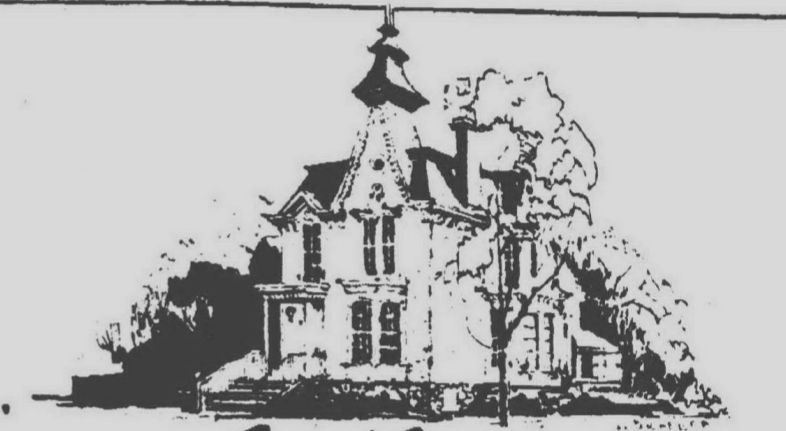

Real estate dealers see gains

Last year was not a complete bust for residential sales in the area served by the United Northwest Realty Association (UNRA). In fact, UNRA officers feel some of the modest gains shown in the association's annual statistical report are significant — especially when compared to other market areas.

"In the face of high interest rates, tight money supplies and the generally depressed state of the economy, we consider 1974 a remarkable year of growth," says Michael D. Samonek, executive vice president of UNRA.

Although the number of multi-lists and actual units sold declined slightly from 1973, the average sale price during 1974 increased from \$27,280 to \$29,445 and total sales volume rose by nearly \$50 million over the \$335 million in 1973.

1973 WAS a peak year for the number of listings and units sold since 1946. Last year, however, was the peak year for total sales volume in dollars and in the average sales price per home sold.

Of those homes listed in 1974, 42.2 per cent were sold compared to 43.7 per cent in 1973, 43.4 per cent in 1972, and 53.1 per cent in 1971. The peak year for the sales-listing ratio was 1965 with a 70.2 per cent mark achieved.

"With the value of many existing houses increasing by as much as 10

per cent annually," comments Samonek, "many persons recognize house ownership as their only hedge against inflation. Certainly, a house is a sound investment. One thing which is clear from the figures is that no one should delay the purchase of a home. Even lower interest rates can cost money in the long run."

Samonek was referring to the inflationary spiral in the housing market, continuously inching upwards since 1946 when the average sales price for homes sold by UNRA was \$9,450. In 1965 the average sales price was \$15,460, in 1967 \$17,400, in 1969 \$21,650, in 1971 \$24,590, in 1974 \$29,445.

Sales in suburban areas rose 1.2 per cent overall with the strongest increases in the "bedroom communities." Home sales in four of seven areas in Detroit showed decreases from 1973 but these were nearly offset by gains in the stronger areas with the total decline being less than 0.3 per cent. "Obviously, the Detroit market remains strong and reasonably viable."

IN REDFORD TOWNSHIP, the average sales in 1974 was \$27,800 — an increase of 6.7 per cent over 1973.

There were 703 units sold last year in Redford — an increase of 19 units. The two previous years, Redford experienced a decrease in the units sold compared to earlier years.

Of Redford's 1974 residential sales,

43 were financed with cash, 145 by assumption of an existing mortgage, 18 FHA, 43 VA, 376 conventional loans, and 78 land contracts.

IN THE MARKET AREA consisting of Garden City, Westland, Wayne and Inkster, the average sales price for 1974 was \$24,780 — an increase of 2.9 per cent over the year before.

In this area, a total of 1,607 units were sold which was an increase of 37 units over the year before. The last decline in units sold was in 1972 when sales were 135 units below 1971.

Of the 1,607 units sold, 50 were financed with cash, 462 by mortgage assumption, 132 FHA, 193 VA, 615 conventional and 154 land contract.

IN LIVONIA, the average sales price in '74 was \$36,190 which was a 10 per cent increase over 1973.

In 1973 the price per house increased 4.8 per cent over 1972 and increased 2.9 per cent from 1971 to 1972.

There were 1,308 units sold in Livonia last year — an increase of 27 units over '73. This was a rebound from 1973 when the units sold declined by 148 from 1972.

Of the 1,308 houses sold, 43 were financed by cash, 431 by mortgage as-

sumption, 10 FHA, 27 VA, 670 conventional, and 126 by land contract.

IN THE PLYMOUTH-CANTON area, the average sales price last year was \$38,895 — an increase of 8.5 per cent over 1972. Plymouth-Canton home sales have been rising steadily since '71.


In this area in 1974 there were 532 units sold — an increase of 70 over 1973. This was also an improvement over '73 when this market had a decline in units sold of 65 from 1972.

Of the 532 units sold in Plymouth-Canton, 24 were financed by cash, 163 by mortgage assumption, 4 FHA, 3 VA 254 conventional, and 84 by land contract.

In the entire UNRA area, of the total sales 38.6 per cent were financed by conventional, 24.3 per cent by mortgage assumption, 14.5 per cent FHA, 11.3 per cent land contract, 7.7 per cent VA and 3.6 per cent cash. The figures reflect only sales handled by firms who are members of UNRA.

Samonek said the figures represent a decided shift in methods of financing with a decline in the percentage of conventional mortgages, assumption sales, and an increase in land contracts.

What's best way to improve area tax base?

Seeking the right kind of industry and commerce for a community is a tough job. It requires a level of expertise on the part of those who are selling the community and a spirit of cooperation among those businesses and industries already in the community to gain added services for residents and to expand the tax base.

Add to that the cooperation of local governments and the school district and you have the Plymouth-Canton Development Commission. Begun in the hopes of expanding the tax base within the area of the Plymouth Community Schools, the group has sought industrial and commercial growth within the community.

Since its inception five or six years ago, growth has taken place within the community, but one has to question whether that growth would have taken place without a body like the PCDC.

Those same questions are now crossing the minds of elected officials in Canton and Plymouth townships and to a lesser degree within the Plymouth Community Schools.

When times get tough, the expenditure of an additional \$5,000 for membership in an organization which holds no assurances of success, becomes a serious question which has no simple answer.

When first formed, the plan was that each com-

munity was contributing to something separate from its local chamber of commerce. At the time there was only one in existence for the entire community, and this avoided the problem of possible subsidy of private enterprise by government through chamber contributions.

In reality, the situation has become closely skin to that, as all five representatives paid the salary of the outgoing PCDC executive secretary, while he also sat in the same position for the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce.

We see this as blatantly unfair to those residents and businesses of Canton who were not doubly represented with their contributions.

If the PCDC is to survive, it must operate in complete independence from a local chamber so that all taxpayers of each community receives equal representation.

The alternative is the abolition of the PCDC with each community taking the option to go it alone and make the investment in their own brochures and do the selling on their own.

Or make the contribution directly to either the Canton or Plymouth Chamber of Commerce allowing them to strengthen each community's non-residential tax base.

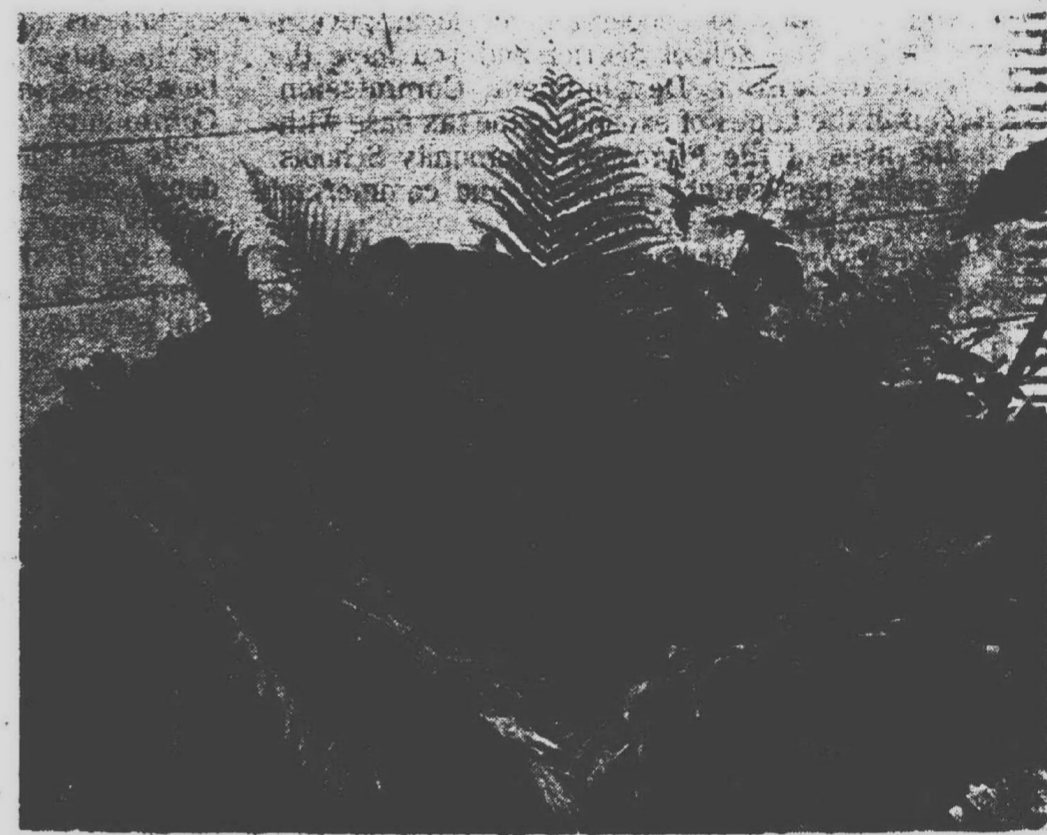

30 fern varieties grow in collector's lush garden

Margaret Converse of Livonia will have one of spring's most unusual shows to put before the Farmington Naturalist Club when it visits her Sunday.

In her garden, she has assembled 30 different varieties of ferns. She figures there may be 50 varieties that grow in Michigan, but she doesn't know of anyone who has more growing in the same garden.

And, for anyone who stops beside

the cool greenery, Mrs. Converse is glad to point out her garden's inhabitants.

Like the Ostrich fern—"That's the common one; you see it all over and I have to keep pulling it out or it takes over."

Or the Maidenhair—"That's my favorite; you see it all over northern Michigan, but some grows here too. I found it in Volk's Woods near Schoolcraft College before they built the apartments there."

She'll also introduce the tall bracken fern and the tiny Oak fern and a cinnamon fern with curling, reddish brown fronds—"They're the fertile fronds; they die away after they open."

THIS SPECIAL GARDEN had its beginnings years ago and, as Mrs. Converse puts it, "one thing led to another."

There was first an interest in unusual rocks, and that led to rock gardening, she explained.

"And I've always liked ferns and palms, but in Michigan weather ferns seemed more practical, so I started a fern collection because I didn't know of anyone else who had one."

"I kept getting more and then decided to try to get all the Michigan varieties."

Most of the ferns now in the garden have been dug up by Mrs. Converse and friends interested in her project in woods all over the state.

"But recently I've gone to the catalogues and started buying some I didn't have," she said. One of the recent acquisitions is a Goldie fern, carefully tended in a favored spot.

"It's just two fronds now, but it will be massive. They grow six feet high in some places."

ONE OF THE NICEST things about her garden, Mrs. Converse said, is the

chance to share it with others.

She's showed it off to many school groups, ranging from elementary children, "only the ones who are interested—not the whole class," to visitors from University of Michigan botany classes.

"And sometimes Girl Scouts troops come to see the ferns and learn about them," she said. "I like to be able to work with them and teach them."

Mrs. Converse has picked up a lot of her knowledge from natural history courses offered from time to time by Schoolcraft College.

"I've signed up for everything they offer," she said.

HER FERN collection has plenty to interest the visiting student, whether a beginner or one long interested in these plants that are flowerless and seedless, that grow fronds rather than leaves and that reproduce by means of spores.

The cinnamon fern, with its fronds both fertile and infertile, belongs to the Osmunda family, Mrs. Converse said. Others related are the royal fern and the interrupted fern, so named because the little, dark fertile fronds grow on the same stem with the infertile fronds, leaving a space when they die away.

She likes to point out the Christmas fern.

"It stays green all winter—great to have in the garden because you can have greenery for holiday flowers," she said.

She also is fond of the fragile fern.

"It's the first you see in the spring, and then it dissipates during the hot weather and comes back in the fall," she explained.

And she points out the Lady fern and the marginal fern—"they look a lot alike, but if you look closely you see the lady's stem is slimmer and more delicate."—and five members of the Dryopteris family—"That's the confusing group, and you have to get down on hands and knees and study them to be sure."

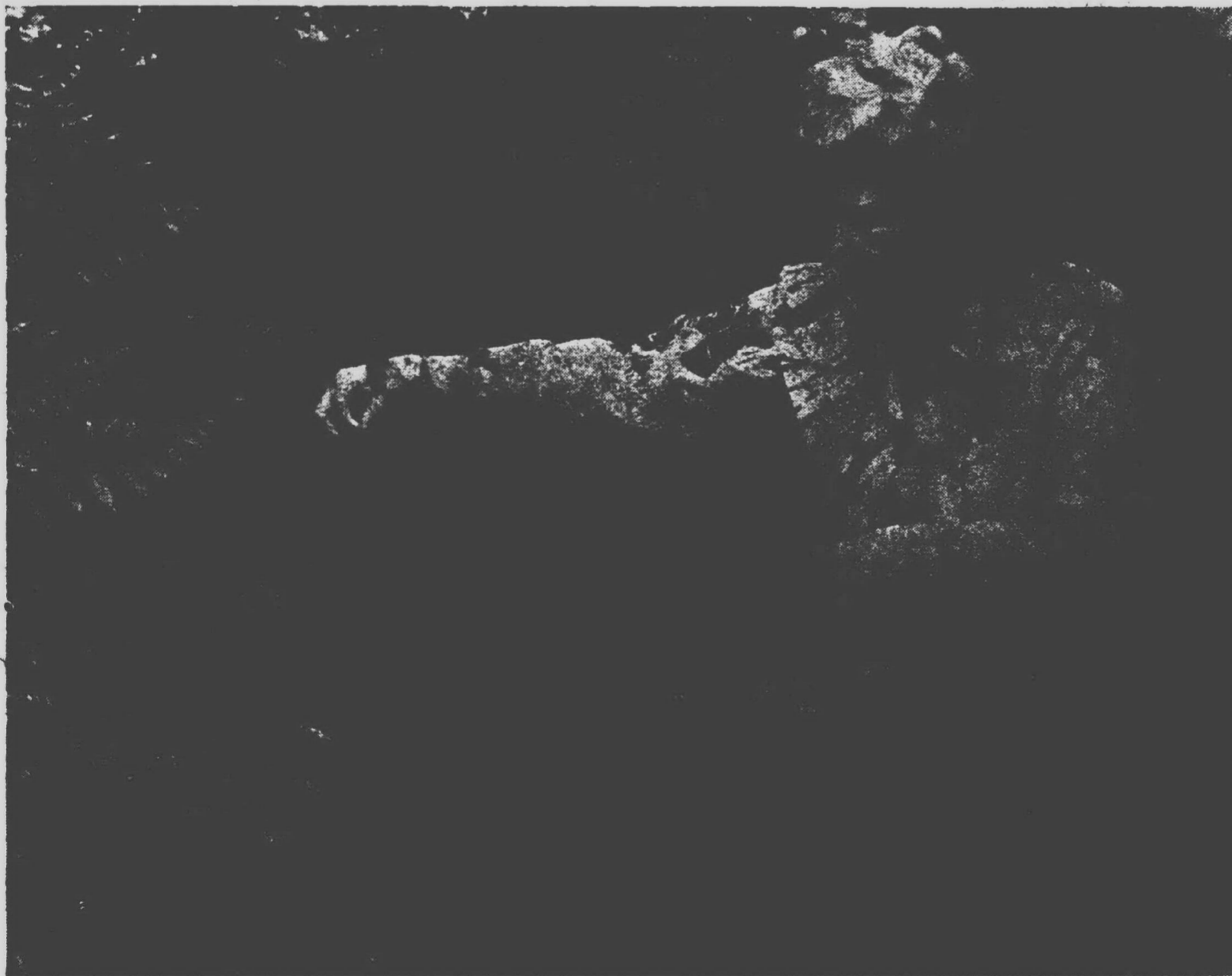
MRS. CONVERSE'S fern garden is her most unusual planting but by no means is it alone in her pleasant yard. She also has a bed of perennials and a place for vegetables, a wild flower garden designed to bloom from spring to fall little Alpine garden with the kind of plants that live well in mountainous country.

There even is a bog garden, ingeniously constructed with an old-fashioned bathtub buried to hold water and simulate marshland.

She mentions ruefully that she shares her territory with Duke, the family's aging basset hound. He has worn paths along the edge of all the gardens but has to be confined to quarters during a storm or he would crush the ferns while seeking their protection.




Tom Willette wins final pair

Flying Rocks win Class A diamond title

1975 Michigan High School Athletic Association Class A baseball championship at Wyandotte Memorial Park. Willette was magnificent in two

WILLETTE RELIEVED STARTER Chuck Thomas in the fifth inning of the final game and gave up only one hit in the three innings which he pitched.

Salem was trailing 3-2 when Willette came on but scored three times in the bottom of the fifth and with Willette throwing smoke, the game was virtually over.

In the critical fifth, Dan Moore started the Rocks off with a solid single to right. Dave Pierce bunted along the first baseline and was safe when the bag was left uncovered.

Brian Wolcott was safe on an infield single and Doug Tripp struck out to bring up Willette.

Willette responded with a solid single to left scoring Moore and when the Handy leftfielder had trouble picking up the ball, Pierce also scored.

Charlie Johnson grounded out to deep short, scoring Wolcott with the insurance run and the rest was up to Willette.

Two Handy runners reached base in the sixth but Willette got out of the inning on a long fly to Tripp in right. Tripp stumbled on the play but recovered to make a fine one-handed grab.

In the seventh, Willette took no chances, striking out the side, to give the Rocks the championship.

The Rocks had scored first in the opening inning.

Pierce opened with a single to left and Tripp walked. Willette picked up

his first RBI of the day with a single to center scoring Pierce and Inch later knocked in Tripp with a single off the glove of the Bay City shortstop.

Handy really got to Rock starter Chuck Thomas only once when it scored three runs on four hits in the second.

The Rocks showed their class in the bottom of that inning, however, when they scored the run that got them into the finals.

Pierce walked on a 3-2 pitch with one out and Wolcott sacrificed him to second for the second out.

Doug Tripp then hit a slow roller to Viking shortstop Mark Schmitz and just barely beat the throw for an infield single.

Displaying alert and courageous coaching, Salem head man Wayne Sparkman sent in the fleet Pierce all the way from second on the play and the surprised Hazel Park team could not make a play.

Salem had scored in the fourth inning when Inch walked and came home on Charlie Johnson's triple to right which got beyond the Viking right fielder, who tried to make a play on the ball.

In the top of the fifth, Hazel Park got its first hit off of Willette and in the bottom of that inning the Rocks scored their second run when Tim Dillon singled to right and came home on Dave Pierce's shot to the leftfield fence.

Willette finished his season with a 14-1 mark and the Rocks closed with a 21-7 record and a state championship which was truly deserved.

The final game was no contest as Borgess ran away to the first state title ever played in the sport.

In the finals it was the Borgess hitters along with Intyre who dominated the game.

The Spartans scored four times in the opening frame, added one in the second and exploded for seven in the third to put the game out of reach with a 12-0 lead.

In the big third inning, Borgess scored on three singles, four walks and four Portage Central errors.

Intyre and Lori Temonti each went three-for-three to lead the Spartans offensively.

All games were played in Lansing's Ranney Park.

Crissey — Canton's 'family man' is baseball coach of year

Coach Fred Crissey leaned forward in the third base coach's box, his face intense as the jammed Les Anders' championship game crowd edged forward in their seats.

Tied 2-2, with one out in the sixth inning, Canton's three baserunners danced off the sacks as ninth batter Scott Dunagan got ready for a two-strike pitch.

Crissey went through many motions, much like a man brushing away mosquitos, as the tension mounted. As the pitch came flying toward the plate, suddenly Dunagan swung around and bunted the high fastball back toward the pitcher's mound. The surprised hurler juggled the ball momentarily, then fired to the catcher who made a belated swipe at the sliding runner.

Safe! The surprise element had sent Canton into a 3-2 lead and the Chiefs scored on a sacrifice fly from the next batter to capture the coveted Les Anders' title, 4-2.

"Grace under pressure" is how writer Ernest Hemingway defines courage.

Crissey, a great history buff, quotes Hemingway and other authors in helping build discipline and tradition in the short three years he's been at the helm of Plymouth Canton High School baseball fortunes.

For his efforts in bringing Canton so far so fast, Crissey has been selected Observer & Eccentric Coach of the Year.

The intense coach, of Italian and English ancestry, comes from the old school. "I believe in discipline, handed out fairly, and total commitment to the job at hand," he said.

Dedication to baseball helped Crissey take a group of 9th and 10th graders, only one of whom played regularly the previous year, and record a 14-3 record playing an independent JV schedule in 1973. Last year, Canton went 11-9 in its first varsity season, finished second in the Western Six League with a 6-4 mark, the first time any Canton team had wound up over .500. Against 1974 state champion Livonia Churchill, Canton won 1-0 in the first game and dropped the second, 4-1, in 13 innings during the regular season.

This year the Chiefs were rated the

number one team in the state by a vote of coaches. They ranked first in the Observer & Eccentric ratings, won the Western Six title with an 8-1 record and went to the state district finals before bowing out. They finished the season with a 22-4 record.

Crissey comes by his knowledge of baseball from playing under Art Masucci, the builder of diamond powers at St. Benedict in Highland Park.

"I believe he's the main reason I'm coaching today," Crissey reflected. "He helped me so much and guided me in my personal decisions that I felt I could do the same for others."

The 40-year-old veteran coach, who is also a physical education instructor at Central Middle School in Plymouth, pitched four no-hitters while at St. Benedict's.

Crissey graduated from University of Detroit in 1960 after finishing two years in service. After serving as assistant coach for Massucci for three years, Crissey coached football, basketball and baseball in grades 1-8 at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Plymouth.

In 1970 Crissey joined the Plymouth School system, teaching at Pioneer Middle School and serving as assistant high school varsity football coach and tutoring the JV baseball squad. Then when Canton opened, he assumed the role of assistant varsity football coach and head baseball mentor.

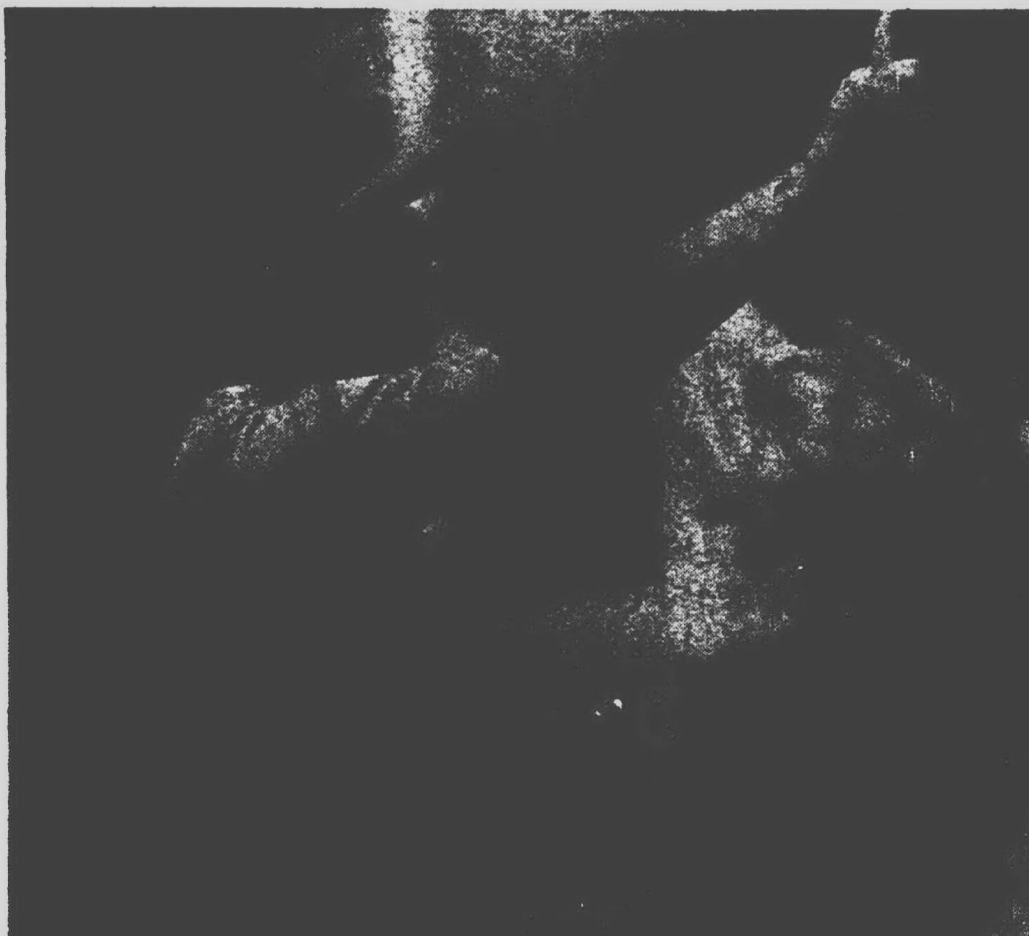
Coach Crissey believes strongly in the family concept—even carrying it to the ballfield.

"I stress strongly the need for everyone on my team to care about the other guy. That's one of the main reasons for our success, I believe."

Crissey has helped take Canton out of the shadow of its 'Big Brother' Plymouth Salem by putting the Chiefs on the state baseball map.

"I believe our trip to Cincinnati this past Easter vacation week helped build unity and the family feeling," the Canton coach adds. "Seniors mingled with sophomores and everyone had a real good time. The main thing I'm trying to promote around Canton is that baseball is a means to an end — not the end itself," he says.

Crissey's effectiveness at teaching everyone to care for the others on the team and his 'one big family' concept
