Postal decision up in air but needs remain same

Plymouth postal employees will sort mail and conduct customer services in the old brick building on Penniman for the next few years.

That the word from Joseph J. Loukotka, district director of the United States Postal Services' customer service division, who says the decision against building a new postal facility in the City of Plymouth is unrelated to a proposed Canton Township zip code.

"There won't be a new facility built in Plymouth," Loukotka said, "but it's solely due to economic conditions. The decision has no relationship to Canton Township."

U.S. Rep William Ford (D-Taylor), whose 15th District includes Canton, and several local officials have interpreted a recommendation to create a Canton zip code and consolidate the township's four existing delivery routes into one as related to a decision against building a new Plymouth postal facility.

That interpretation, according to Loukotka, is not based on fact.

The United States Post Office will suffer an \$850 million deficit during its 1975 fiscal year, Loukotka explained. Postal officials predict an additional loss of \$1.3 billion next year and have decided to postpone unnecessary building projects under those economic conditions.

Preliminary plans of postal authorities proposed the construction of a new Plymouth Post Office on an Ann Arbor Trail site near Hamilton, owned jointly by the City of Plymouth and the Pilgrim Non-Profit Housing Corp.

"It's adequate for the immediate future," Loukotka said of the present Plymouth Post Office. "It would be nice if we had a bigger facility at some future date."

Under a recommendation, submitted by Detroit Postal District officials to the U.S. Postal Services' Regional Office in Chicago, postal authorities would transfer Canton's four current mailing routes to the Plymouth or Wayne-Westland post offices, Loukotka said.

The recommendation would create a Canton zip code and consolidate the township's four existing delivery routes into one. Canton is currently served by four post offices—

Plymouth, Wayne, Belleville and Ypsilanti.

Although Loukotka sees "no problem" with the recommendation's approval, he says the proposal does not specifically include consolidation of a Canton postal facility.

Postal authorities will not examine the need for a Canton post office, until two years after the township's new zip code is implemented, he said. Officials will then examine the township's population figures and projected growth.

Canton residents will probably receive their new zip code in January or February of 1976, Loukotka said.

Plymouth Postmaster John A. Mulligan says overcrowding problems began to plague the present postal facility on Penniman about 1968. Those problems have worsened in more recent years.

A section of the post office, devoted to carrier operations, is the most overcrowded area of the postal facility, lacking space for additional equipment and supplies, Mulligan said.

Many carriers use nearby Fralich Street every morning to load their postal vehicles with mail. Mulligan attributes that problem to insufficient loading areas near the postal facility.

Other overcrowding problems concern customer services. The main portion of the building, constructed in 1935, and the addition, built in 1958, lack facilities for the handicapped as well as adequate parking and customer waiting areas.

"It's really bad at Christmas time," Mulligan said. "I've seen the customer lines go from two people to out the door. That's not very good."

Loukotka will discuss and answer questions about the postal issues at a meeting of Total Citizens Power of Canton Township, scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 29, at 8 p.m. in the Plymouth Canton High School cafeteria.

A press release from Ford's office, dated Oct. 9, read in part: "... assignment of a zip code, and consolidation of delivery routes, would be the first step toward eventual establishment of an independent Canton Post Office."

Ford's release claimed Postal Service had made a "comprehensive survey" released the first week in October which agreed with his position it would be impractical to build a new

post office in Plymouth to serve Canton.

The release continued: "Although the Canton zip code and delivery consolidation are in the form of recom-

mendations to the Regional Office in Chicago, Congressman Ford expressed confidence that they would be approved there, and also by Postal Service authorities in Washington."

Loop road splits candidates in campaign for commission

(Following is one in a series of articles examining issues discussed by candidates for the Plymouth City Commission in an open forum sponsored by the Plymouth League of Women Voters. Eight are running for four seats in the Nov. 4 election.)

other four candidates gave qualified support.

JOHN CUMMINGS, an incumbent, said he is supportive of the concept but stressed the commission must first get some straight information from city planners and get the cost figures straight.

"The biggest part of the loop road plan now before us is rounding off the corners and the cost that involves."

Mary Childs, a planning commissioner, commented: "The biggest boner we pulled is that we should have called it the 'Old Surrey Trail' instead of the loop road and it would've been more easily accepted."

"I think people are afraid of more traffic and problems of pedestrians getting around. But these problems can be worked with. When we have

the Fall Festival each year, the loop road is put into effect without spending thousands of dollars. I'm sure when the time comes, the idea of a loop road will go right through and be accepted."

SCOTT DODGE, a local attorney, commented that any major improvement must have good economic revenue behind it.

"The present loop road, as proposed, has a price tag of \$½-million and although you might see a return on that investment, right now you won't get a return of \$½-million. There is not a need for the loop at the present time. I don't see this kind of a pressing need to ease traffic flow now."

"I have not been persuaded that the loop road will create that much utility

and attract that much additional business into town."

Les Howes said some people are concerned about "a speedway around the downtown section, but this isn't what it's about. The loop road concept would work and I support it. It's a question of what comes first, the chicken or the egg—the loop first and then new business, or hope new business comes and then think about building the loop."

"The city must create a reason for people to come to town and invest more money in the central business district, and that reason has to be profit."

"The loop concept is to take land now zoned commercial but being used for residential purposes and use it for shops and offices."

"Inflation will increase the cost of the loop road and we should get started right away, not wait. I think we should get more benefit from Kellogg Park by closing off Main Street and Penniman from traffic. Let people walk across Main Street without fear of being hit by cars. Expand the park area. This will help keep taxes down."

BEVERLY MCANINCH, mayor seeking re-election to the commission, said she is opposed to the loop road.

"I have come around 180-degrees on this. I was open to this concept. But for \$½-million, and more when you add in the bond expense, it will put the city much too far in debt. And I don't know the return we'll get on that debt."

"I cannot agree the loop road will (Continued on page 4A)

Personal growth highlighted at CASTLES grand opening

Self-questioning, self-awareness and CASTLES, the Plymouth Community School District's new teacher in-service center, line the road to personal growth and better teaching relationships with children.

That was the underlying theme of CASTLES' official opening Tuesday night, celebrated by an open house at the teacher center, 987 S. Mill, Plymouth, and a speech by Vito Perrone, dean of the Center for Teaching and Learning at the University of North Dakota.

CASTLES, sponsored by the Plymouth, Novi and Wayne County Intermediate school districts, is geared toward teacher development through workshops and increased self awareness.

Gordon Hill, one of two British educators who heads the CASTLES program, defines teachers as "anyone closely involved in child learning." "We've got to recognize that the educational skills aren't necessarily always housed in the schools," Hill said. "I believe the talent is all over the community. We feel anyone closely involved in child learning qualifies for the title of teacher."

"In the last 10 years, education and

schools have become divorced from the community. We're saying we've got to come together. If parents want to get involved in the development of education, come to the CASTLES building."

THROUGH THE USE of workshops and seminars, Hill and CASTLES co-director Malcolm McDonald hope to help teachers improve their relationships with children and educational techniques.

Achievement of those objectives begin with self-awareness and examination, Perrone told about 150 teachers, administrators and residents Tuesday night.

"When teachers more deeply understand their own situation, this is the beginning of growth," Perrone said. "A school climate that supports this exploration will surely find teachers who are experiencing growth."

To grow and improve their educational techniques, teachers should constantly examine themselves and their methods of teaching, Perrone said. Teachers must try new teaching methods and reduce educational objectives to workable parts.

"Evaluation ought to be a positive factor in schools through which teach-

ers and children better themselves," the North Dakota educator said. "Evaluation is often associated with narrow accountability and standardized tests, but there are alternatives to that."

"May this center help reestablish a commitment to learning and growth and a high degree of teacher professionalism," Perrone said of CASTLES. "I wish this center were in North Dakota, but if it can't be, I'm glad it's here."

Many join Randy's fight with leukemia

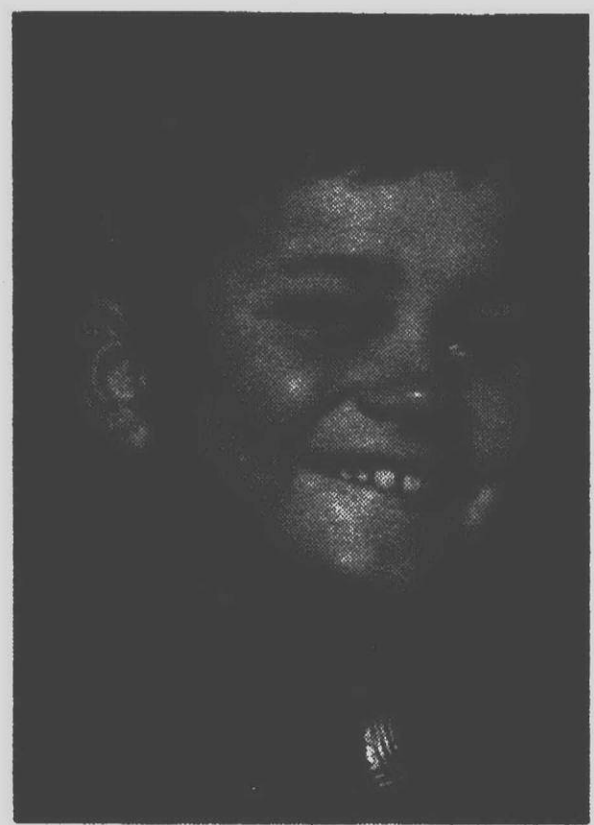
A number of people have already joined with Randy Aton, age 9, in his fight against leukemia and more help would still be appreciated.

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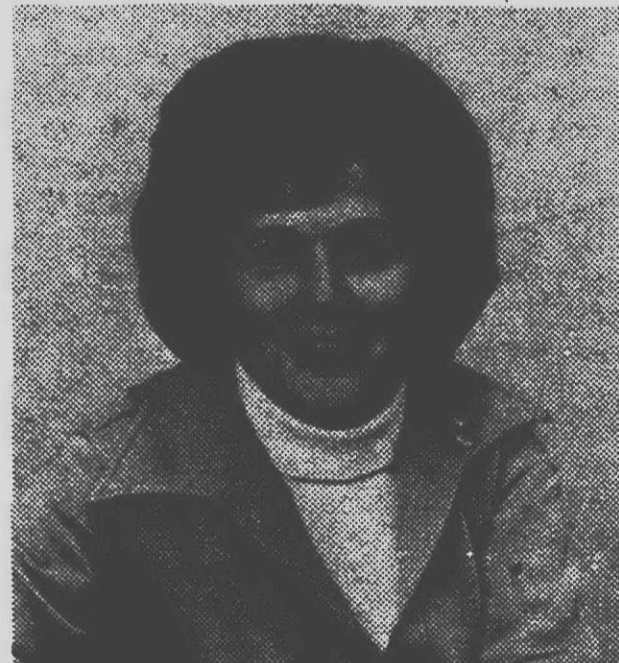

Bird School gets face-lift

Everyone pitched in and cooperated for Bird Elementary School's playground work day except the weatherman.

In spite of the cold rain, 75 parents and a host of students, equipped with rakes, shovels, wheelbarrows and enthusiasm, gathered to give the school grounds a new look.

Kathy Wood, chairperson of the effort, said they accomplished just about everything they had planned. But it was too wet to paint the fence.

THREE PICNIC tables were assembled, stained and placed in the court-yards for the use of teachers and students.

Two 18-foot benches were constructed and put in the ground at the edge of the courts facing the playgrounds.

Following a landscaping sketch of the area around the school sign, the ground was dug up, sod removed and shrubs planted. Wood chips were added to complete the effect.

A split rail fence was installed in one courtyard to enclose the area. They planned on installing one in the other courtyard, but ran out of time. It will be installed later.

A PIN OAK tree was planted in the front lawn.

A tire climb was built in the playground. It was constructed of tractor tires which were donated to the school.

In the general cleanup, the areas around and under the fences were raked, the rock garden and vegetable garden were weeded, and wood chips were placed on flower beds and around shrubs and trees.

To complete the project the PTO group plans to paint all the playground equipment and the fence along Ann Arbor Trail, and install benches by the ball field.

expand the downtown commercial tax base but think the result will be expansion of commercial into residential areas and I think Plymouth should remain a city of homes."

David Pugh gave a qualified yes. "The loop should be part of a total downtown plan. It's not the only answer, but a step in the right direction."

Tex Thoman, city planning commissioner, said he's definitely in favor of the loop.

"This idea dates back some 15 years ago when it was first recommended by people trained in needs for growth, traffic control and development control."

"We have the loop now—it's already in existence—just stand at Ann Arbor Trail and Deer, and now with the light there it will be much more usable."

"The money that ended up in signs for a bike trail would have been better spent for signs to better control traffic around the existing loop. The

simple use of road signs can make the present loop workable."

Thomas Turner said it was an extremely complex subject. "It would be presumptuous of me now to take a yes or no position. It's been considered for the past decade, and yet we have no position."

"I'm receptive. If the need can be

clearly identified, and costs vs. benefits made clearer, I'd consider voting favorably for the loop. But this is a large amount of money we're talking about and until a number of trends can be defined, an the absolute need for increased commercial tax base made clear, I'd be hesitant to approve."

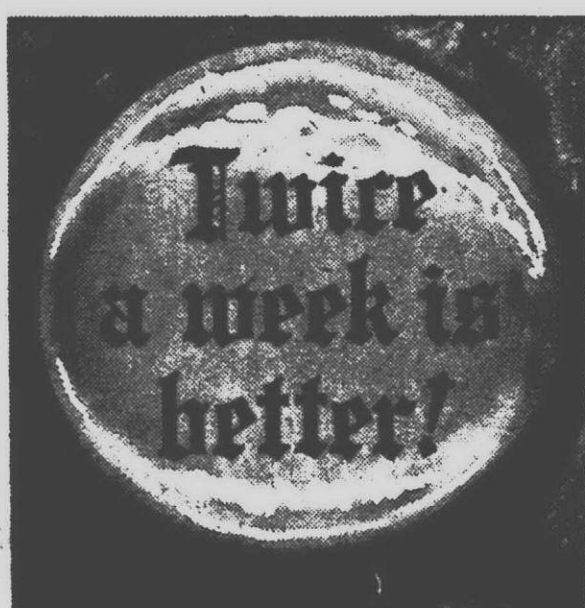
How to get ride to polls

They're a cool bunch of fellas and to be perfectly honest, they fooled me," said Kaestner, whose Churchill team took the crown for a second time. The other conference crown came in 1972 and Churchill has never finished lower than a tie for second since the Western Six was inaugurated in 1970.

His being fooled, Kaestner said, meant "I figured Northville and Waterford Mott would be the teams that would probably end up on top. But our kids worked hard during the off season and showed me plenty. They really wanted this thing."

Farmington Harrison, coached by Kaestner's close friend, John Herrington, took a first quarter lead on Paul Rogind's 26-yard field goal and took the 3-0 margin into the second period.

Who says Churchill only has a defense? The fired-up Chargers proved they have some teeth in their attack when they put together two scoring drives in the second quarter to leap into a 16-3 edge.

Early in the stanza, quarterback Mike Streicher, coming on stronger in every game, fired a 47-yard scoring strike to split end Jim Wright and the fleet receiver danced across into paydirt. Matt Foster, who also was praised by his coach for a tremendous two-way performance, added the extra point.

Churchill, which had stopped Harrison on first-and-goal from the four and forced the field goal earlier, stopped the Hawks again and drove 65 yards in 15 plays.

With four minutes left in the half, Bill Coyle sputtered three yards to score and Foster added the frosting as the Chargers took charge, 14-3. Churchill's defense, again led by Foster, John Curran, and his linebacker brother, Tim, and nose guard Gary Czarnik, then scored a safety.

Foster booted the kickoff into the end zone and Harrison got the ball on its 20. When the Hawks couldn't move the ball, they had to punt and the center's snap sailed past the punter and out of the endzone for two points and Churchill led, 16-3, at halftime.

Lest Churchill think things were over, Harrison came roaring out in the second half and scored in less than two minutes to cut the home team edge to 16-10.

Quarterback Jeff Thorne hooked up with Paul Rogind on a key 39-yard pass play that put the ball on the Charger five. Then Mike Bowden ran four yards to paydirt. Rogind's PAT made it 16-10.

"Bowden had been averaging more than 100 yards gained a game and we shut him off with only 47 yards in 19 carries," praised a happy Churchill head coach Kaestner. He gave praise to his assistants, who he said made the victory possible.

With Harrison coming on strong and the momentum seeming to swing to the Hawks of Farmington, Churchill was faced with a third and five on its own 31 yard line.

Quarterback Streicher then faded back and hit Foster with a screen pass and the talented senior fullback followed a covey of five blockers 69 yards for the clinching TD. It was a beautifully executed play and gave the charged-up Chargers all they needed.

Foster, who led in tackles with nine first hits, added the point as Churchill reveled in the sun and in the 23-10 final count.

Churchill, which prides itself on its defense, rolled up a startling 342 yards in total offense against a Hawk defense which had posted shutouts against Canton, Northville and Walled Lake Western.

Streicher had a fantastic day in hitting 10 of 13 aerials for 181 yards while Foster's 94 rushing yards in 20 carries paced his team's 161 ground total. Streicher also hit for two TDs in playing a tremendous game.

Harrison was held to 117 yards rushing and 68 passing as QB Thorne completed five-of-eight with two inter-

ceptions by linebacker Mike Welch and safety Scott Shepard. Churchill led in first downs, 13-8.

Churchill has quietly slipped into the prominence of a top-ranked squad and now sports a 6-1 season record to go with its championship 5-0 Western Six League mark.

"Harrison has a very fine football team and I think John Herrington is one swell guy and a heckuva coach," said Kaestner, who added: "Paul Rogind of Harrison is the best kicker in the state and one of the finest defensive halfbacks anywhere."

Now Churchill will get the acid test this Friday afternoon when it hosts a rugged Livonia Franklin team. "Franklin has a very fine team also and I just hope we can play our best and give them a good game like we did Harrisso."

Glenn rips East

Coach Lloyd Carr's John Glenn Rockets belted Garden City East, 36-14, in "living color" Friday night in the locally televised prep game of the week.

And it was a colorful performance put on by Panther back-up quarterback Bob Davis that had East barely trailing, 21-14 at the half.

After Glenn had jumped to a 21-0 lead in the Northwest Suburban League tussle, Davis pumped life into the sagging Panther hopes by firing touchdown passes of 13 yards to Greg Emery and 22 yards to Brian Dominick.

However, Glenn made some half-time adjustments and Todd Deluca took a page from Davis' book and tossed two touchdown passes to end George Roberts.

East suffered a blow a week ago when starting quarterback Wally Krol was injured and may be out for the season. He sat on the sidelines and watched hopefully as his substitute Davis played a fine game against a rugged defense.

"I thought Davis played a really fine game," said winning coach Lloyd Carr, whose Rockets are now 3-1 in clinching second place in NSL play and were hoping for Thurston to upset Franklin Saturday so they could tie the Patriots for the title with identical 3-1 marks.

"We had to make some adjustments at halftime and the boys came through like they have so many times

this year," Carr added.

Glenn started out like it would blow East off the field before a large crowd and even bigger TV audience on channel 56. Flying Freddie Shoemaker, who's a play to go all the way on any play, picked up 70 yards in the first half in leading the Rockets to a 21-0 lead.

Quarterback Todd Deluca moved the Rockets 55 yards in eight plays and took the ball over on a seven-yard run with 1:15 left in the first period. Then he added the extra point. "I thought Todd played his usual outstanding game and was magnificent in bringing us back when we needed it," said Carr.

Then the "Shoemaker Shuffle" added two more TDs as the slight, 140-pound speedster scored on jaunts of six and 15 yards in the second period. His first score capped a 10-play, 52-yard drive and his second TD came after Glenn recovered a fumble on the Panther 21 yardline. Deluca added each extra point and gloom had started to settle over Panther stadium and coach Gary Humphrey's followers.

But they didn't count on Bob Davis, a 6-0, 160 pound junior who had hardly played until Krol's injury a week earlier against Franklin.

The quarterback with a common name put on a very uncommon performance, hitting seven of his first 11 passes and moving his team on two scoring marches that brought East fans up roaring.

The first drive moved 74 yards in eight plays with a 45-yard aerial to flanker Brian Dominick the key gain. Then Davis faded back and connected with lanky Greg Emery for a 13-yard scoring pass. Rob Taraskavage added the point and East trailed, 21-7, with 5:25 left in the half.

East stopped Glenn and Davis engineered a 77 yard drive in just seven plays to narrow the gap to 21-14. Three key passes carried the Panthers past the rugged Rocket defensive wall. First, Davis zeroed in on Dominick with a 25-yarder to mid-field. Emery stretched his 64 frame to grab a 12-yard advance and then Davis gunned a 25 yard aerial into the middle of the end zone that a flying Dominick made a diving catch on.

"It was the best catch he's made all year and he's made some good ones," said an East assistant coach. The diving grab came in the middle of the endzone. Taraskavage added the point and East was back to 21-14.

However, any hopes of the Panthers prevailing were thwarted when linebacker Rich Bonk intercepted Davis' first pass of the second half and returned to the Panther 39 yard line.

Under the sleight-of-hand artistry of Deluca's option play, Glenn moved to two touchdowns, both coming on passes to end George Roberts.

The Deluca deluge buried Panther hopes as Roberts caught aials of 12 and 15 yards sandwiched around a 24-yard Deluca field goal. The three pointer was set up by Terry Bixler's pass theft and 30-yard return to the East 21 yardline.

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Salem leaves Allen Park in dark

This homecoming affair was delayed 50 minutes by a power failure. However, it took the Plymouth Salem Rocks two quarters to recharge their offense, as they rolled to a 13-0 shutout victory over the Allen Park Jaguars.

A power failure blacked out the entire Centennial Park from 4 p.m. until electricity was restored at 8:15 p.m. A half hour later the opening kickoff put the contest into action.

The first half saw both teams go scoreless although both clubs had ample opportunities to get on the

board. Salem posed the biggest scoring threat of the half late in the second quarter.

Salem held Allen Park on downs at their own 19-yard line. After taking over, a 43-yard run by Tim Lilley and a 19-yard gain by Charlie Johnson gave Salem a first down at the Jaguar 12 yardline.

With their backs to the wall the Parkers defense held the Rocks in four plays and two minutes later the half ended with the score deadlocked at 0-0.

The second half saw the improving Rocks take command on offense, scor-

ing on their first possession of the third quarter.

"We were sluggish in the first half, but we came out in the second half and just played better football," said coach Tom Moshimer.

Howard Inch returned the second half kickoff 20 yards to the Salem 45. Seven plays and two first downs later quarterback Ben Wilcox faked a hand-off into the line and kept the ball himself, sprinting 27 yards to score the game's first touchdown. Rick Doherty's conversion was good and Salem was up 7-0.

Meanwhile, Allen Park's offense had little real estate to work with.

The Jaguars were bottled up in their own end for the majority of the second half. The Parkers could muster but 29 yards total offense in the second half compared to Salem's 175.

The Salem defense closed off the Allen Park running game with strong support from the defensive line.

Salem scored their final touchdown of the evening with seven minutes remaining in the game. Charlie Johnson carried the ball over for the Rocks from the six-yard line for a 13-0 lead. The score was set up by a pass from Ben Wilcox to John Horton, good for 31 yards.

Plymouth accumulated 245 yards rushing and 58 yards through the air for a sum of 303 total yards. Tim Lilley was the game's leading rusher

with 85 yards while Charlie Johnson ran for 72 yards.

Plymouth Salem now stands at 3-3 in the Suburban Eight conference, and sports an overall mark of 3-4. The Rocks close out their league schedule with a game this Friday night at Belleville beginning at 8 p.m. The season finale for Salem is Nov. 7, at home against the Farmington Harrison Hawks.

'Mott squad' gets Canton

Canton High School journeyed to Waterford Mott Friday night and was bombed by the "Mott Squad" 33-13 for its fourth loss in five Western Six conference games.

"We played a terrible first half," said coach Jim Muneio in summing up the game. Mott rolled up 33 points, leading 27-0 at the half before Canton got on the board with two scoring passes from Tom Close.

In finishing with a 1-4 Western Six mark and now 2-5 overall, Canton couldn't get untracked as Waterford rolled to a 27-0 lead at halftime.

The host squad scored five touchdowns in three different ways. Greg Smith scored two TDs on runs of nine and two yards and Brent Bonriver covered nine yards to paydirt.

Mike Wallace gathered in a punt and galloped 70 yards to tally and Jim McKay collared a Close pass and sprinted 26 yards with the stolen property for another Mott score.

Quarterback Close got the Chiefs rolling in the second half when he connected on scoring passes of 20 yards

to senior fullback Mike Ogden and six yards to senior end Keith Hammonds. The win gave Mott a 3-2 Western Six finish and it is now 5-2.

For the Chiefs, they'll have to get things together as they prepare for a good Garden City East team's appearance at Canton field this Friday at 8 p.m.

Canton winds up its season a week later when it travels to Dearborn to face a Pioneer team that is 4-2 in the Suburban Eight League and 5-2 on the season.

Hodges fired 30 yards to Tim Oakley to up the lead to 19-8 before Mike Robbins gathered in a 35 yard scoring aerial for his second of the game and 10th of the season. "I don't know of another player that has 10 touchdown receptions this year," said Goode, adding, "Mike is one of the best receivers I've ever seen in my life and his catches have set up many other scores."

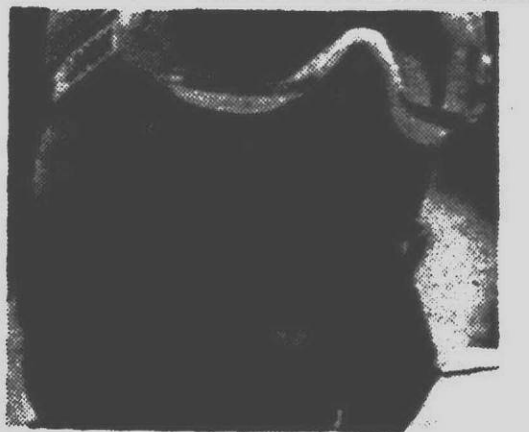

The Bulldogs host state-rated Trenton Friday at 7:30 p.m. and then battle crosstown Franklin in the annual meat-grinder.



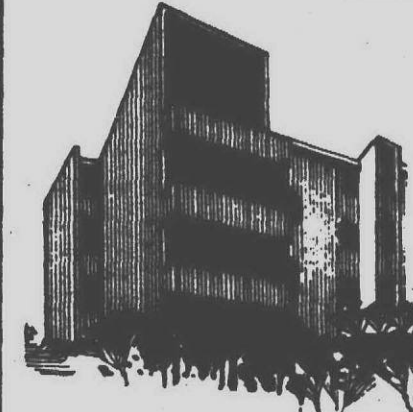

Leaping across Sheldon: An impossible dream?

If the community were to formulate a priority list of needs, the integration of transportation should be near- if not at- the top.

A lot of improvements have been made to move automobiles from Canton into Plymouth and vice versa. Road improvements to keep pace with growth in the area include work on Ann Arbor Road, Sheldon at Ford, Main between Ann Arbor and Joy Roads, and Joy Road from Lilley to Newburgh.

These improvements provide a better circulation of traffic within the City of Plymouth, Plymouth and Canton townships. These widening projects and intersection improvements have been mandated by growth, commercial and residential, but have not been integrated into the total transportation needs of the community.

A MAJOR highway addition this year was opening of the I-275 freeway link through Plymouth and Canton townships.

The freeway, especially when completed, will ease the flow of automobiles and freight-bearing trucks into this area. But we must ask what is happening to all this traffic when it enters the general area bounded by Sheldon and Joy, Main and Mill (Lilley)?

What often happens is that cars are lined up for blocks waiting for a train to pass. These waits can vary from 20 to 45 minutes, and the longer the wait, the more traffic becomes congested. So why build a freeway, widen major arteries, and

improve intersections just to have traffic pile up for a half-hour at a railroad crossing?

A WHILE BACK a public hearing was held in the city to discuss construction of grade separations. The result was a search to see if federal and state funds were available. The search for funds apparently is still in progress.

Yet the federal and state governments can find funds to build freeways, the state and county governments to widen major roadways. It really may not be a financial problem at all but a need for federal and state planners to better prioritize how funds should be spent.

The only recourse is for the police to issue tickets to the C&O whenever it piles too many cars onto one train and holds up traffic beyond the legal time period.

A number of tickets are issued each week, and the C&O happily pays its \$100 fine because the extra freight cars it tacks onto its train more than compensates for the fines.

This is a local-regional-state-federal problem which requires a lot of interaction. Hopefully, local officials haven't given up hope, while attempting to work through the maze of departments and authorities in search of the solution.

A nation which can send men to the moon should be capable, somehow, of getting a train across Sheldon Road in 10 minutes. More pressure, some hot air, fuel and a spark from anywhere might propel the C&O across Sheldon. It's not an impossible dream.

One difficulty with the present campaign is that the CEP educational concept is being attributed as the major cause for numerous problems, such as alcohol and drug abuse, vandalism, absenteeism, sex, and under-achievement in learning.

Well I can't buy that. Each one of these problems exist at other high schools and junior high schools throughout suburbia. Indeed these problems occur at schools with very traditional educational philosophies and with attempts at very rigid discipline.

IT WOULD BE a cop-out to blame these problems on the home and argue it is the parents' major responsibility to make sure proper attitudes are learned about respect for property, life, self and others.

But it is just as great a cop-out for parents to use the CEP as a whipping post just because it's different. I've heard a lot of reasons why modular scheduling and unstructured time promotes anti-social behavior.

But with each problem discussed I can see a student who refuses to accept responsibility for his own behavior, and with many problems I can see a parent who wants the schools to assume responsibility totally for what should be shared.

WE ALL MUST understand that young people are being called upon

today to mature faster than a couple decades ago. But are we preparing them to mature?

I suppose that depends upon the definition of maturity and my definition of a mature person is one who accepts responsibility for his own behavior. If a student isn't living in a climate conducive to promoting this self-discipline, then his ability to mature is thwarted.

Of course, he is going to make mistakes. But show me one person who

The opportunity exists for students to opt for a traditional schedule if they, or their parents, so desire. That option, it seems to me, provides flexibility in the system to serve those students who aren't ready to cope with that much freedom.

The concept should be explored and the community has a right to challenge. But open minds are needed and a less defensive attitude from both sides.

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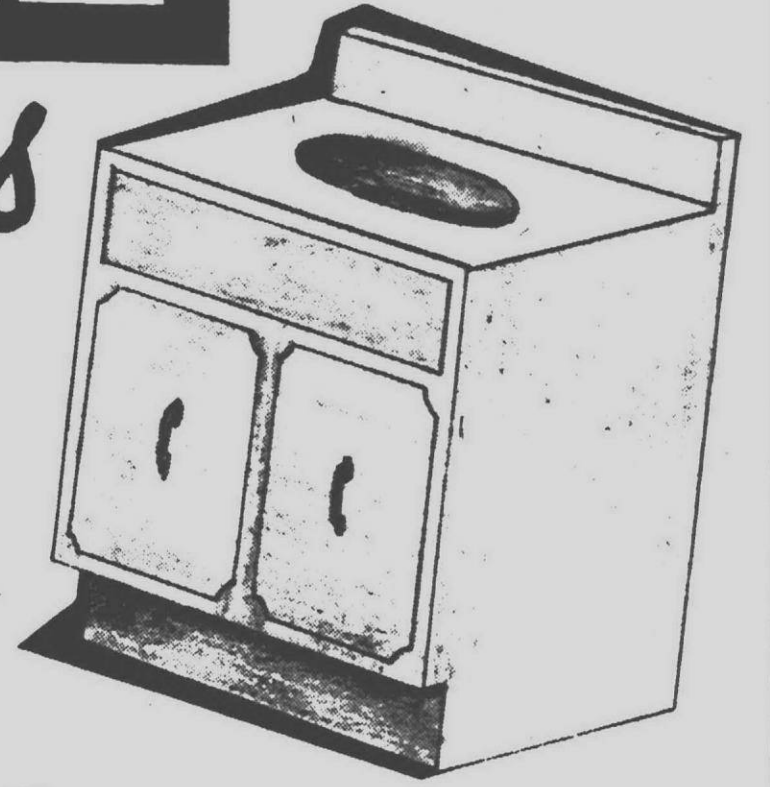
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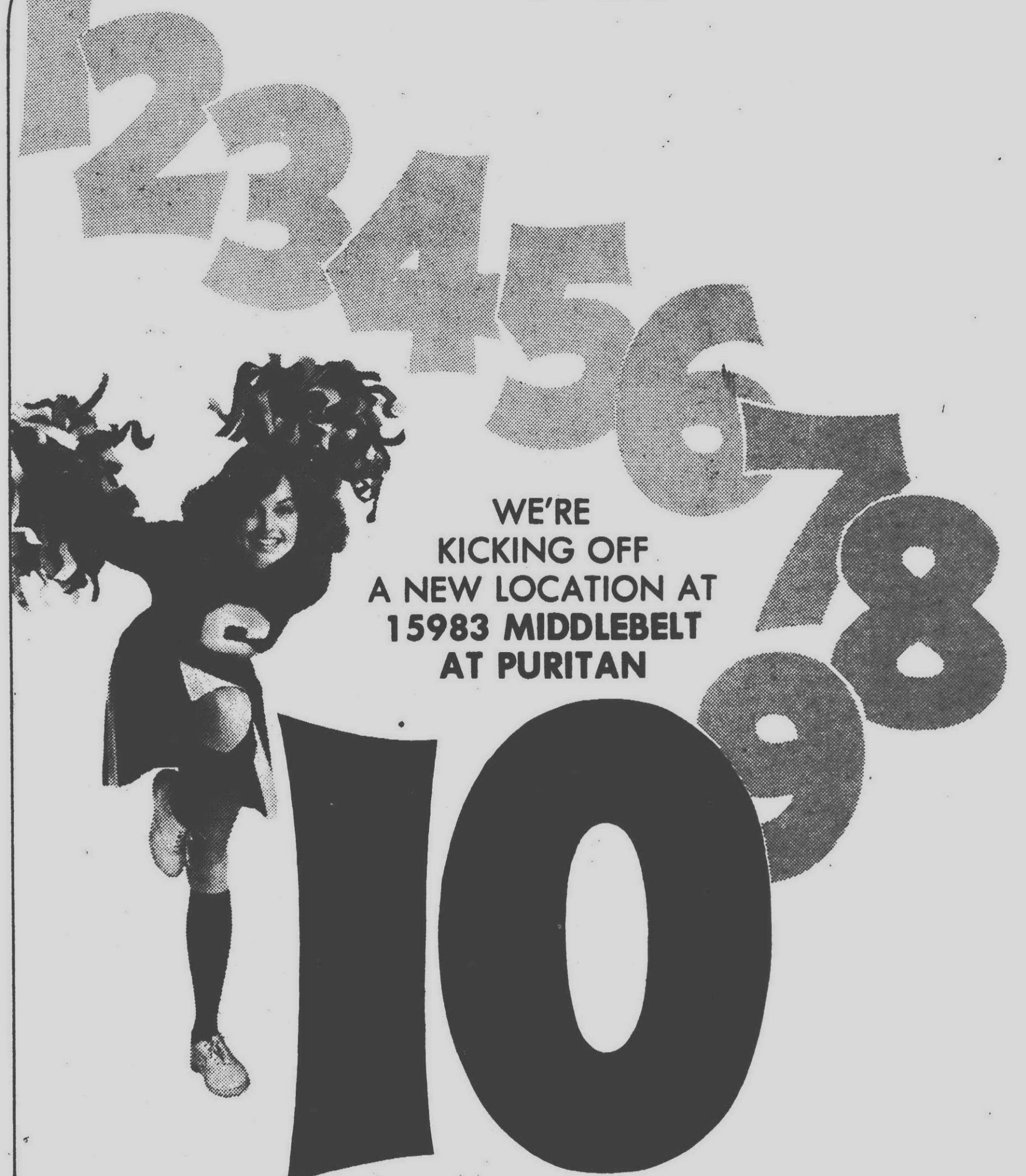

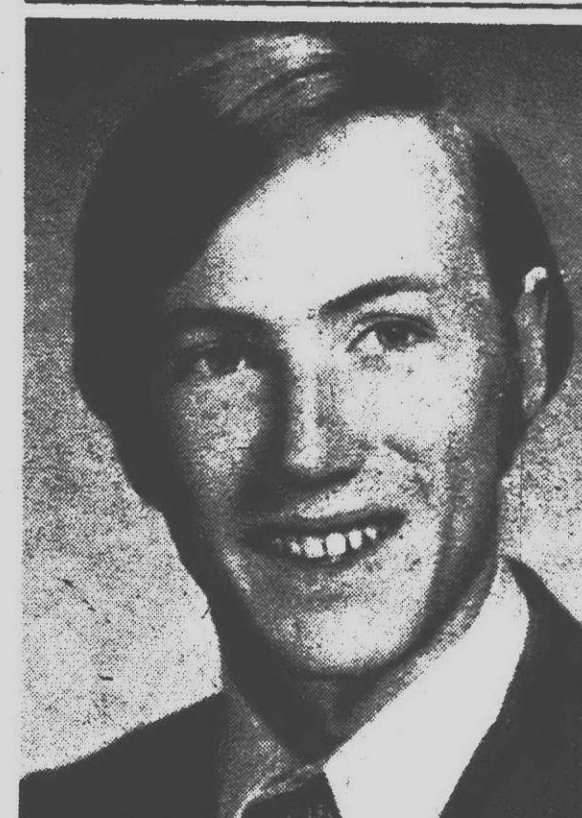
Wayne County General Hospital and was a cook when he served a term in the Army.

On election apathy

Every time an election day nears, The Stroller gets a hankering for one of those old time political campaigns with torch light parades, mass meetings in the village square, and the public debates of rival candidates.

In the old days, the weeks before elections were great times... the political battles fiercely fought and the camp rivalry even extended to verbal battles among the neighbors over the backyard fences.

But somewhere along the line these colorful shindigs have given way to apathy, and one wonders why?

At the moment many of our suburban areas are in the midst of campaigns to elect mayors and other top officials. But for the appearance of a few signs here and there along the highways no one would know it.

A fine example of the present day apathy was furnished the other morning when The Stroller met one of the mayoral candidates and asked, "How are things going?"

"I just don't know," he answered. "My biggest problem is getting the voters to realize there is an election coming up. Most of them don't even know the date is Nov. 4."

AND THAT FROM a fellow who is trying to regain the office he once held for a half dozen years. It certainly wasn't like that when The Stroller was a young voter.

Glance over the situation in our suburbs and you'll find the ingredients for some good old political battles. For instance, there's Harvey Moelke, former Livonia mayor, trying to regain the chair he gave up to present mayor Edward McNamara. This should be a real old-fashioned donnybrook. Instead, most of their battles are being conducted in the public prints or in small neighborhood meetings.

In Plymouth, Mayor Beverly McAninch is trying to retain a seat on the City Commission with the hope of being retained as the leader of the group. But walking through the streets, or visiting any of our business establishments, one would never know it.

And the surprise comes in Garden City where Mary Markowicz, long time critic of the government, is seeking the mayor's chair in a race with Sam Pappas, a member of the council. This has all the ingredients of a great political battle. Yet, at least on the surface, all is calm.

The same is true in Westland where Mayor Eugene McKinney is seeking another term. There is scarcely a ripple on the political waters. If the present apathy continues, chances are that little more than 30 per cent of the eligible voters will cast ballots.

WHAT HAS CAUSED the change from the old fashioned political battles to the present day apathy?

No one, as yet, has put a finger on

the real reason. Television has brought a change in the presidential elections, but it shouldn't affect local races.

On the national front, the presidential candidates use television as a means of speaking to the nation in one setting.

In the old days they travelled by train and made their appearances on the rear platform along the railroad sidings. The last to do this was the late President Eisenhower, and his appearance in Saginaw furnished one of the oddities of his campaign.

He was little more than half way through his speech before several thousand people, when the train pulled out. He never got to finish and the Democrats were blamed for it.

Then there was another time back home The Stroller remembers with a chuckle.

At the final mass meeting in the public square Harry Gangware, seeking re-election as county treasurer, rose to oratorical heights in his plea for votes, pointed to his years in office and shouted, "There is no substitute for experience—not even honesty."

The next day he was defeated. No wonder The Stroller longs, at times, for the old days.

Joe McWilliams believes family dining doesn't have to be expensive. A variety of good food, at reasonable prices, in a quiet, relaxed atmosphere—that's what McWilliams is

striving for in Joseph's Inn, his new roadhouse-style eatery in Westland. On Warren Road just east of Wayne, Joseph's Inn opens at 7 a.m. with a breakfast menu which stretches from waffles to steak and eggs. Luncheon selections include

ground sirloin burgers, an assortment of hot and cold sandwiches and salads. The dinner menu features steaks, chops, chicken and seafood. Lunch customers may order from the dinner menu.

Lunch prices start at \$1.50 and dinners range from \$3.95 for ham steak Hawaiian to \$5.95 for a steak. Dinners are served with all the trimmings.

McWilliams, who lived in Livonia for 12 years and recently moved to Farmington, opened his restaurant about six weeks ago. He's relatively new to the food business, having previously worked as a tool salesman.

It was the traveling and continuous dining in restaurants that prompted McWilliams to open his own.

"Because of my job I was always eating in a restaurant and constantly looking for one that offered good, homemade food at decent prices. I thought it would be fun to start a business of my own," says McWilliams.

"My wife, Pat, and I belong to several gourmet societies. We have always enjoyed cooking. We collected our favorite recipes and any others we could squeeze from chefs and friends."

Capitalizing on his Irish heritage, McWilliams' menu features 21 flavors of Irish coffee and a baked "Irish" potato, seasoned with herbs and cheeses numbering the counties in Ireland.

Salad dressings, gravies, sauces, bar mixes and batter used for fish and mushrooms are homemade. "And the mushrooms are market fresh," adds McWilliams.

During lunch and dinner hours, McWilliams invites customers to sample hors d'oeuvres.

The menu at Joseph's offers variety and so does the wine list. An appropriate selection of cocktail and dinner wines is available by the glass or bottle. Beer is poured by the mug or pitcher on draught. Special drinks include the pina colada, a coconut milk and pineapple concoction laced with rum. "If we have the ingredients on hand we'll make any drink a customer requests," says Mc Williams.

McWilliams constantly is changing his menu, considering comments and suggestion from customers.

Desserts include cherries jubilee and fresh fruit parfaits.

Entertainment is presented Wednesdays through Fridays, and for persons who enjoy television, Joseph's provides a seven-foot TV screen.

McWilliams has initiated several promotions including Monday night football night when sports fans receive a special price on dinner and drinks.

On Tuesday night beer is 25 cents a glass and a happy hour is in effect every day from 3 to 6 p.m.
