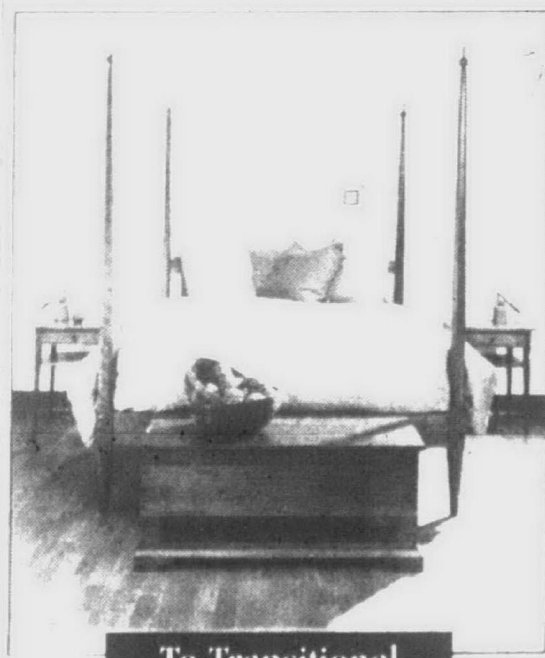

# Law calls Stewart on ethics violation

In what could signal the start of an intense election for Plymouth Township supervisor on July 1, John Stewart came under fire this week for hosting an alleged campaign fund raise at township park.

Stewart and supporters say it was a birthday party featuring pizza and birthday cake.

Supervisor Gerry Law says tickets and receipts to the May 8 party show a total gross collection of the township of \$1,500.

The question has to do with Mr. Stewart using township property for personal gain, says Law. That is prohibited by the township ethics policy.

The township Board of Ethics, better known as the Board of Trustees, will meet on Monday to consider the matter. The Board of

Trustees voted 4-1 Tuesday to vote on the ethics board. Stewart cast the lone "no" vote and Treasurer Mary Brooks and Trustee Art Miantaki were absent.

Referring to Law, Stewart says he was "set up by the lowest of politicians, a man who I have asked to resign."

Stewart is one of four candidates running for Law's supervisor's job by December 1, but when his term expires in November.

Noting he is not running for anything, Law says his motives were not political when he asked the township board to convene the ethics committee. It is their responsibility to seek impartiality, he says.

One person asked me why they couldn't use township park to promote their candidate," the

supervisor says.

"I don't see how you could promote the park if the supervisor is not running for township office," he says.

Stewart says he was asked to resign by Law, but he says he was not running for anything. The tickets were sold to 100 people for \$15 each, and Stewart says he was not running for anything.

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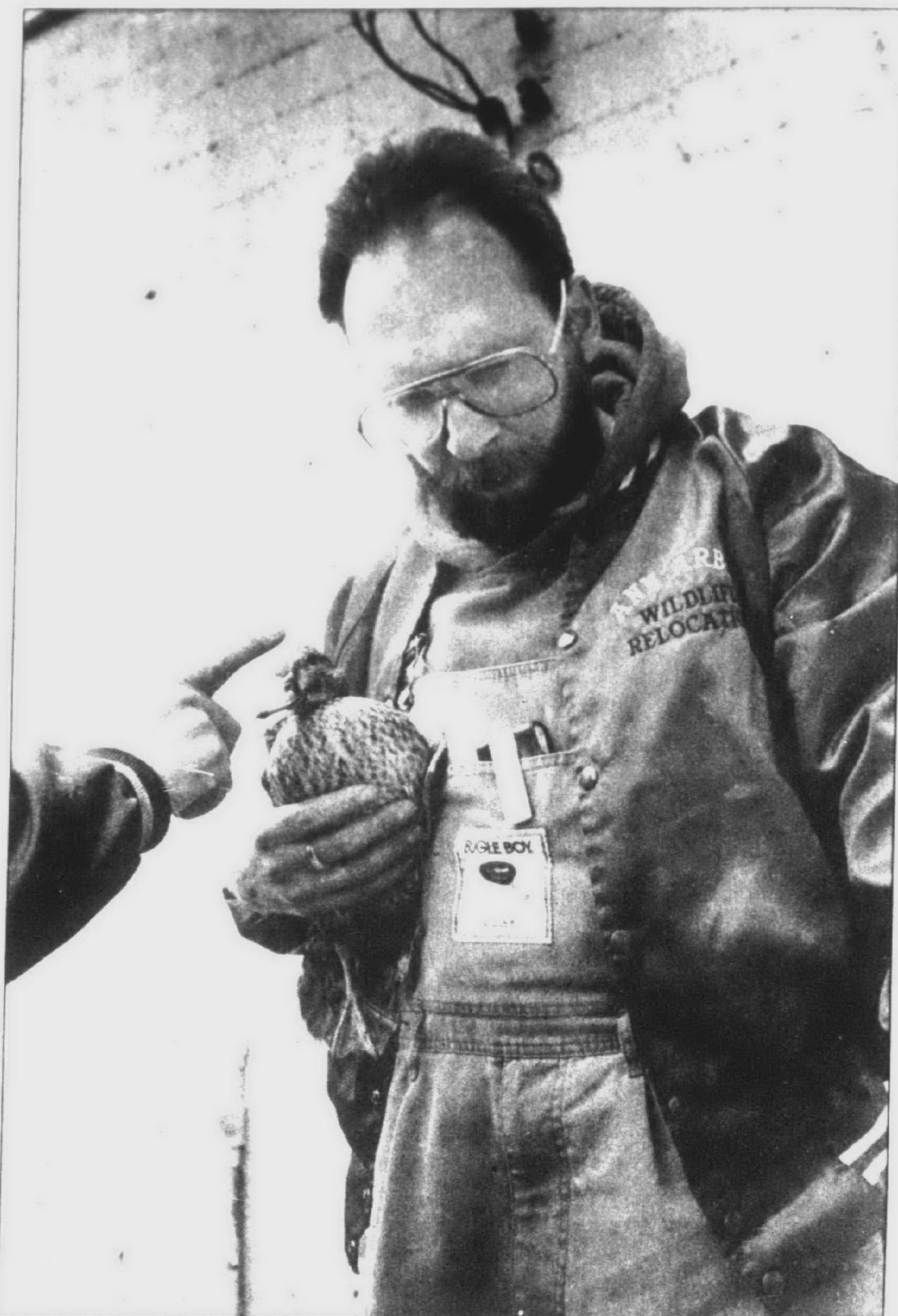
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Moving day: Glen Cutright carries the mother duck to her new home at Tonquish Creek.

# City business owners didn't duck this rescue

A mother duck and her eight babies are safe now, after some caring people spent 4 1/2 hours May 4 rescuing them from busy downtown Plymouth.

Charlene Miller, former owner of Baskets and Bows, 995 Ann Arbor Trail, said the excitement began when a mother duck leading her ducklings walked along Forest.

"A year ago at this time we figure it was the same mother — or maybe this year one of her off-spring — was walking along Forest Avenue and the babies fell in the drain last year," Miller said.

Employees of Empire Care, IV, Inc. and others along Forest joined in the effort to rescue the ducks.

When the mother and her ducklings neared the drain again this year, "We wondered what could we do?"

The first thought was to put the ducklings in a box and take them to Willow Lake as they did last year.

We went to Penniman Deli and asked Russ (Webster) if we could borrow a box, he jumped in his car and came over to help.

The next step was trying to get the mother to go with the babies. But when he went to put an apron over her head, she flew up on the building," Miller said.

Calls to the Humane Society and other animal control places brought no response until someone from Specialty Pet suggested they call Glen Cutright of Ann Arbor Wildlife Relocation.

After returning from a run in Ypsilanti, Cutright got his net and took the babies and her to Tonquish Creek. "At least the babies didn't end up in the drain again," Miller said.

"You hated to see something happen to them. She (the mother duck) wasn't scared of the cars."

"The moral of the story is we should have something local when something like this happens," Miller said, adding, "Some people do care."

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# Geake bill sets guidelines for rails-to-trails projects

Cities and towns would have to be involved in planning rails-to-trails projects under bills moving through the state Senate.

"Nothing prevents the state from creating linear parks. But this sets specific criteria," said an aide to Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, sponsor of a key bill.

"Local units would have to be involved in plans for land use, law enforcement and facilities."

"There is liability protection for landowners (from suits by hikers or bicyclists who cross their property)."

"No general fund money would be used. The state would access federal trail money. Easements can be sold to utilities for fiber optics lines."

As railroads and the state have abandoned tracks in Michigan, hikers, bicyclists, equestrians and even snowmobilers have sought to convert them to trailsways.

One parallels Paint Creek in northeastern Oakland County. Another runs from Livingston County to Jackson. A third goes from Kalamazoo to Grand Haven.

Adjacent property owners in Green Oak Township of Livingston County have stymied railway plans by acquiring former railroad strips before the state could do so.

At the same time it advanced Geake's bill, the Senate moved a companion measure to make it easier for the state Department of Transportation to transfer unused rail lines into the trail system.

Sponsor James Barcia, D-Bay City, cited bad experiences in Bay County where adjacent property owners bought property and extended their lots before trailways could be established.

Geake's aide cited a Penn State University study showing trailways enhance the value of adjacent private property.

Senate passage is due this week. Geake's bill declares that a system of trailways will provide public enjoyment, promote fitness, protect open space and preserve the land for future possible public use.

It lets the state Natural Resources Commission designate state trailways "only if potential negative impacts of trailway development on owners or residents of adjacent property are minimized" by:

- Promulgation and enforcement of rules.
- Maintenance of crossings for farmers.
- Fencing, where necessary.

NRC may contract with local units for maintenance and law enforcement. Two or more local units of government may establish a management council to run a trailway.

NRC may collect user fees, seek federal grants, accept gifts and charge private vendors such as utilities for use of the land.

A year-end surplus in the trailways fund cannot go into the general fund.

Senators were absent.

# New fee to fund children's trust

For the first time since it was started a decade ago, the state children's trust fund will have its own source of funds.

The state Senate last week approved two bills to place a \$4 charge on the issuance of birth certificates.

Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, sponsor of the bills, said it would produce an estimated \$612,000 annually for state grants to combat child abuse.

So far the children's trust fund has been paid for only by voluntary checkoffs on state personal income tax returns.

An aide to Geake said donations reached \$1.3 million in 1987 but tapered off to \$1.1 million last year.

The state was running recession deficits when the fund was begun in 1982, so the Legislature adopted the voluntary contribution system.

The state fee would be levied on top of whatever charge a local clerk made for a birth certificate.

Senate Bill 208, to impose the fee, was passed 31-1 with support from all area senators. SB 209, allocating the money to the children's trust fund, won 32-0 approval. Six senators were absent.

# SC center offers free business advice

Schoolcraft College's Business Development Center (BDC) now has resources to help local businesses diversify into the government or international marketplace.

Any business in Wayne, Oakland, Washtenaw or Livingston county can take advantage of the free assessments that are available.

For government contracting, the BDC offers a session every first and third Thursday entitled "How to Become a Government Contractor."

This session answers questions on what it takes to become a successful government contractor, and what services and resources are available to a small business pursuing the government market. No fee is required to attend the session. However, registration is required.

For exporting, the BDC offers the CORE II assessment. CORE (Company Readiness to Export) II is an evaluation tool for companies interested in assessing their readiness to

export products beyond domestic borders. The assessment was developed by S. Tamer Cavusgil of Michigan State University International Business Center. There is no fee for the assessment, but an appointment at the BDC at Schoolcraft is required to complete the assessment.

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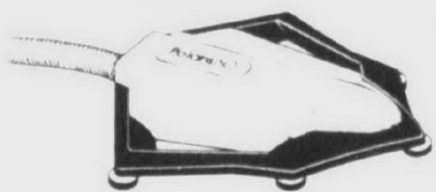
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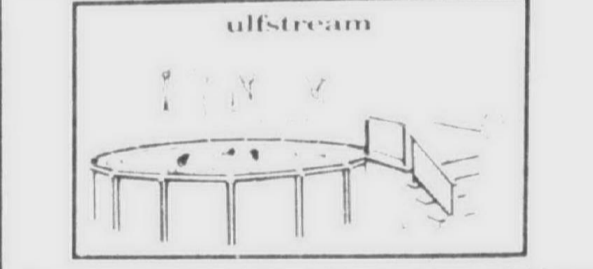
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# Early ambitions are not always realized

If there had been more music majors at Kent State University in the 1960s, Plymouth's police chief would probably be a band director today.

You see, Bob Scoggins played the trumpet while working toward a degree in music education at Kent State, and even studied for three years with the first-chair trumpeter of Cleveland's symphony orchestra.

However, three of Scoggins' classes were cancelled in his senior year because too few students signed up for them. Scoggins' draft standing subsequently metamorphosed from exempt status to that of grade A prime soldier material.

"From there my life changed," Scoggins said.

In short, Scoggins was drafted by the Air Force and compelled to become a military policeman. Although he left the service after one hitch, Scoggins never seriously played the trumpet again, and not at all in at least 10 years.

"It's a little loud and it gets on people's nerves at home," he said.

Like Scoggins' experience, the career aspirations that most people held in their youth bear little resemblance to the profession they ultimately landed in.

Take John Hoben, for example. The Plymouth/Canton schools superintendent "wanted to be a pro-

fessional athlete" in his salad days.

Growing up in Adrian in the 1930s, Hoben trod the boards of the basketball court with great frequency. Upon graduation from college, he spent six years as a Marine Corps artillery officer in World War II, then played basketball for two seasons with the Toledo Jeeps, a professional hoop squad.

Hoben was even drafted by the Boston Celtics in the late '40s, but refused to report. "I gave (basketball) up when I found I was only 6-feet, 5-inches tall," he said.

Soon thereafter, Hoben went into teaching and coaching, which led to his current job.

Lisa Boland, general manager of Omnicom Cablevision, began her college career with visions of scalps gaining primacy over her lesser dreams. "I wanted to be a doctor," she divulged. "I always had an interest in how the body works and the amazing things that medicine can do."

However, Boland had the misfortune to encounter three poor teachers simultaneously at Michigan State University in the late '70s.

"After three courses of horrendous professors, I said, 'No, this isn't for me.' It was very uninteresting and killed my desire to go into the medical field. Looking back, I'm sorry that I let my interest wander."

Boland proceeded to take a cable TV course, "fell in love with it,"

and climbed to the top of a major franchise.

Canton's newest planning commissioner, Phyllis Johnson, likewise gave serious thought to the medical profession.

"I was one of those kids that probably ran through a different career every two weeks," she said. "I was interested in everything, (but) it usually involved the medical field."

Johnson grew up in Detroit and graduated from Redford High School in 1969. From there she became a secretary, met her husband and bore a couple children (as opposed to delivering them).

"It's not a disappointment to me that I didn't pursue any of these (former dreams)," she said. "I find myself awfully busy. I really do not have any boring moments. My life has sort of taken over me."

Russ Webster, owner of Penniman Deli in Plymouth, "wanted to be a lot of different things" while growing up, but an attack of agricultural aspirations are what come to mind most readily.

"When I was very young I wanted to be a farmer," he revealed. "All it took (to change my mind) was a garden in the back yard."

But not everyone ends up doing something entirely different from what they thought they'd do.

Tom Yack was a school teacher in Westland until four years ago when

he got himself elected Canton Township supervisor.

"I only remember thinking I was going to be a teacher," Yack said.

Growing up in the 1950s in Wyandotte, Yack had an inkling of artistic talent, but a vast reservoir of respect for Jim Taskof, his elementary school art teacher.

"(Taskof) was a warm individual you just wanted to be close to," Yack said. "He had more to do with

me becoming a teacher than anybody."

Yack has even visited Taskof periodically since leaving grade school, most recently about five years ago. As for the supervisor's innate artistic talent... "I had a little artistic ability; just enough to be scary."

Myers took French, German and Spanish in high school and college in the '60s and '70s, but knows no tongue but English at present.

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# Supporters of arts sing optimistic tune at rally

You didn't hear anyone singing "Happy Days Are Here Again," but those at the Arts Alive '92 rally Wednesday morning on the lawn of the state Capitol in Lansing weren't singing the blues, either.

The rally was sponsored by the Concerned Citizens for the Arts in Michigan and Michigan Advocates for the Arts. This is the third year a demonstration of support for the arts took place.

Last year's event, called Art Attack, solemnly noted cuts in state

aid for the arts. This year's rally celebrated the strength of the arts in Michigan. Those present pledged and encouraged advocacy on behalf of the arts and seeking financial support from other sources.

"The arts are alive and well in Michigan," Judy Rapanos, chairwoman of the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs, told the gathering of 200 people.

The committee, formed by Gov. John Engler in September 1991, will develop a new agenda of art support, Rapanos said.

"I expect and hope that you will

see a blend of public and private support. I think you will see an emphasis on education. It is essential for young people to have creative opportunities in the schools. Creative problem solving helps all students in all areas of their curriculum.

"I think you will see a further development of partnerships. . . . A flourishing cultural environment is essential to this state."

## Staying strong

The feeling was shared among comments from area representatives before the program began.

"I think we'll all persist. I think we're just going to see a rather conservative period," said Kenneth Gross, executive director of the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association. "I hope to see something exciting happen, some new energy from the recent graduates. I'm very committed to restoring some of the networks."

"I think we're going to stay as strong as we possibly can," said Susan Froelich, former interim executive director of the Plymouth Community Arts Council.

"(The past year proved) the arts have a lot of staying power."

"I don't know that funding will be better but I hope that things will be better, that communities will start coming together and talking about how to fund the arts," said Wally Klein of Birmingham, past president of Cultural Council of Birmingham Bloomfield and now with Business Volunteers for the Arts.

Commerce director, explained how the arts council is a part of the department. The arts organization reports directly to him, he said.

"I make no attempt to influence, control or affect policy. The citizens are free from political encumbrances from me.

"Once we got the system stabilized we have been able to hold firm for no more reductions (in arts grants or appropriations in the state)."

Ellis pledged to change the process of the Michigan Equity Program to its original intent. Engler recommended that the grant program be eliminated. The House rejected the elimination.

miserable place," the Seaholm senator said after the rally.

Those attending had the chance to sign a "Declaration of Arts Support," meant as a visual symbol. Free posters were distributed, and T-shirts, mugs, buttons and videos sold.

## Funding fought

A counter demonstration was staged by a few protesters near where Arts Alive took place. The protesters, who said they supported art education but not taxpayer financing for the arts, carried signs with such messages as "The Bleeding Art State," "Tax money should buy roads, police and school books not 'art,'" "I don't need your money . . . why do they?" and "Real art doesn't need public funding."

"We are protesting public funding for the arts. Art should be self-supported," said one of the group, Greg Brodeur of Flint, a professional novelist.

The rally included time for constituents to meet with their legislators. Architect William Kessler gave a tour of the Michigan Historical Center, two blocks from the Capitol. The center featured art work by Michigan artists David Barr, Sergio De Giusti, Al Hinton, Richard Kozlow, Gerhardt Knodel and Glen Michaels.

Arts Alive featured a student competition. Poems, drawings, photos and collages carried the theme, "What the Arts Mean to Me." Among the winners chosen from the 172 entries were Alec Sanger, 5, of Troy and Rebecca Berdy, 17, of Birmingham.

Alec said in a drawing that "Art Means Coloring." Berdy's poem, "Senses," declared that "Art is not only a word, but a feeling, moving and gripping, Dripping with substance, emotion."

"What would the world be like without art? It would be a pretty

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# Bills aim to boost retail, high-tech

Cities would get new powers to promote retail commerce and high-tech industry under two bills before the state Senate.

The retail bill was pushed by Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, and high-tech bill by Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills.

"I have the same concerns in my district," said Sen. Fred Dillingham, R-Fowlerville, whose Corporations and Economic Development Committee reported out the bills last week.

Bouchard's SB 582 was the more controversial. It more tightly defines the rules under which cities may use special assessments in areas defined as "principal shopping districts" to promote them.

The sticking point: the cap on the largest assessment, set in the bill at \$20,000 for one store.

The Michigan Merchants Council, prodded by Jacobson's department stores, sought a \$5,000 limit

and refused Bouchard's offer to compromise at \$12,500.

"We're back to a special interest bill. Our group views it as Birmingham retailers who couldn't bring it together in one focused front," said Chris Hindstratter of the Merchants Council.

But Peter Kuhnmuensch of the Michigan Retailers Association liked it. "It's not limited to promotions. It can affect economic development activities."

"It's vital to economic development. It's not limited to one city," said Bouchard, adding that northern Michigan towns like Petoskey are supporting it as well as small cities in the metropolitan area like Royal Oak and Plymouth.

Bouchard's bill amends a 1963 act allowing special assessments for malls, pedestrian walkways and other physical improvements. Besides the \$20,000 cap on a single assessment, changes include:

- At least 10 retailers must be affected.
- They could do market re-

search, cooperative advertising, public relations and promotions such as fashion events.

Small owners can organize such projects, Bouchard said, but older downtowns lack such mechanism.

Clarifying amendments limited the assessment to the businesses, not property owners, and to the retail portions of buildings with upstairs apartments.

The \$20,000 cap cost Bouchard one committee vote.

"It makes me, as a senator from Detroit, feel good to help those poor folks in Birmingham and the suburbs," said Sen. Michael O'Brien, D-Detroit.

But he voted no after the cap was raised to \$20,000.

"I thought you wanted to help us," said Dillingham.

"I changed my mind," said O'Brien, and the bill came out on a 3-1 vote. (Sen. William Faust, D-Westland, was absent.)

Faxon's SB 677 extended for five years the time that high-technology firms — such as research, engineer-

ing and product development — can qualify for tax increment financing.

"We endorse the bill, and the Michigan Development and Financial Association endorses it," said Don Gross, Southfield's director of community development.

High tech was "sunsetting" from the TIFA (Tax Increment Financing Act) last Dec. 31. If Faxon's bill becomes law, the new sunset date will be the end of 1996.

With TIFAs, a city may "capture" an increase in property taxes in a defined district for city improvements within the district.

Eligible property includes real estate, machinery, equipment, furniture and fixtures used in agricultural processing, energy production, manufacturing and now high technology.

Faxon's bill got 4-0 committee approval with no trouble.

The panel tacked on an amendment to expand the high-tech definition to cover information processing.

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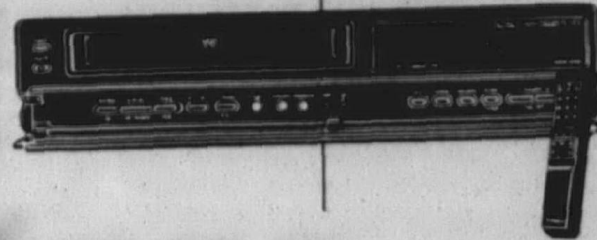
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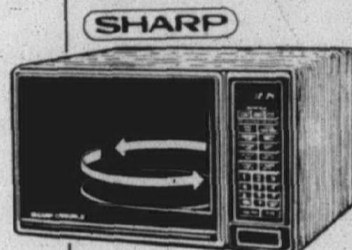
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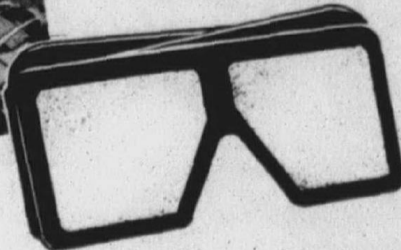

There could just be another William Shakespeare or Emily Dickinson living in the Plymouth-Canton community.

If the quality of writing produced by winners of this year's Laureate Prizes for Literature is any indication, an abundance of literary talent exists in the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Awards are given each year to elementary school students, and the winning entries are published in an anthology.

The program, now in its 11th year, was established "to just encourage young writers to keep writing and be creative," said Nancy Weycker, a fifth-grade teacher at Fiegel Elementary School in Plymouth Township and a laureate board member.

Students produce poetry, short stories, drama and other kinds of writing. They compete in the primary division, for kindergartners through third-graders, and the intermediate division, for fourth- and fifth-graders.

"We notice we're getting more and more poetry, which I think is interesting," Weycker said. Students are exposed to more poetry in the classroom, and thus are more likely to consider submitting such entries.

The judging process for awards begins the previous spring at each elementary school, and continues on through the district, with the laureate board making final decisions. That board includes teachers and learning

specialists from the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

"By the time a book makes it that far, you can be sure it's high quality," she said. "It's really fun to be a judge. It's interesting. With kids, you just never know."

Themes of student work are varied, ranging from getting lost to having a family pet die. Students share their work in author circles, reading excerpts and offering feedback. One boy in Weycker's circle wrote a science fiction story.

"He loves to write in that genre." In recent years, more boys have been among the medalists, she said. Some honorees from previous years are among the 1991 winners.

Could any of the student writers go on to fame and glory as literary giants?

"Oh sure, why not? We've got all different kinds of styles of writing that were outstanding. We have a lot of real-

ly creative, bright kids in this school district," Weycker said.

Medalists in the primary division whose work will be published include: Devin Burnstein; Elizabeth Filios; Sarah Holmes; and Shauna Young. Intermediate division medalists are: Jane Glaza; Sara Harris; Amy Anderson; and Heidi Anderson.

Other medalists whose collections will be published in the anthology include: Matt Bright and Shanna Foley, both in the intermediate division. Special certificates for recognition went to Beth Goodhart and Tim McDonald in the intermediate division. Ryan Gairdner and Amy Retherford received special certificates for separate poems to be published, primary division, and Alysa Remsburg received such a certificate in the intermediate division.

Honorable mentions went to: Lauren Pine; Sean Rahman; Lauren Burniac; Heather Thompson; Jennifer Wagner;

Mike Schultz; Kirsten Pine; Elizabeth Isakson; Lindsey Root; Faye Sheridan; and Vanessa Morsman.

Weycker and other educators in the district are impressed with the quality of work produced even by very young students.

"It was just really surprising to me. You forget to challenge them as much as you can."

Many parents get involved in the project each year, helping students produce the best work possible. "They get encouragement and they just keep at it," Weycker said of the young authors.

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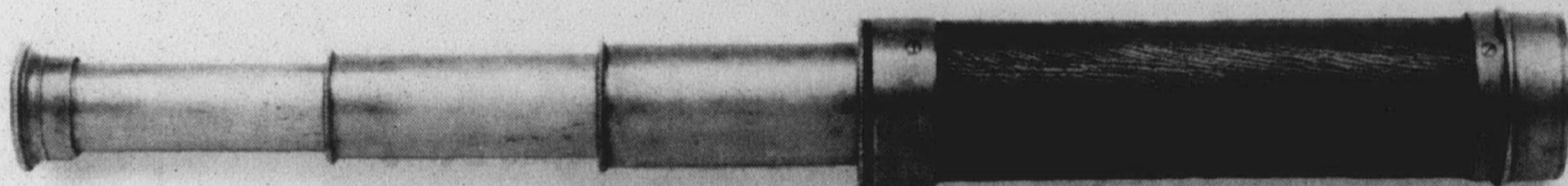
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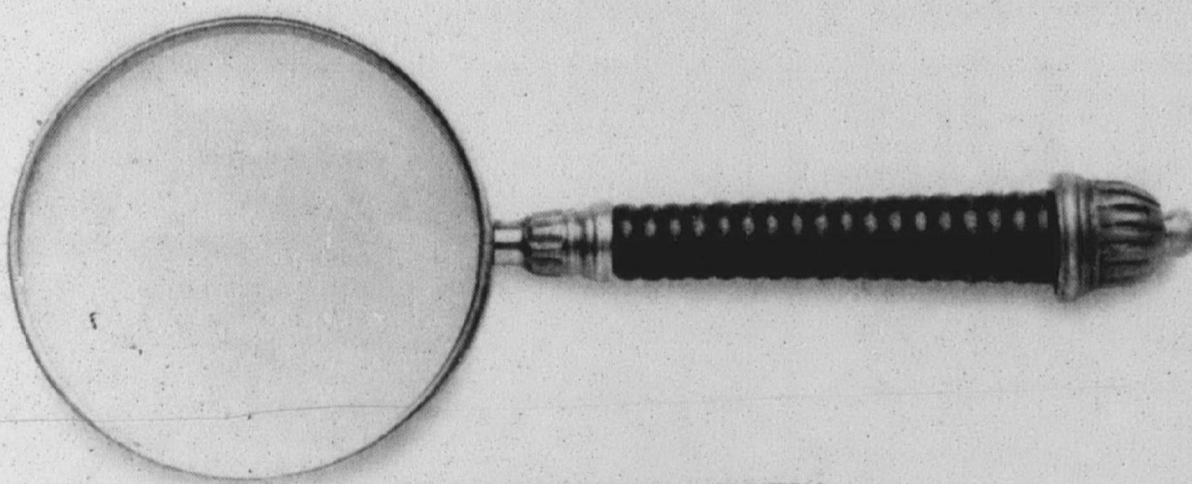
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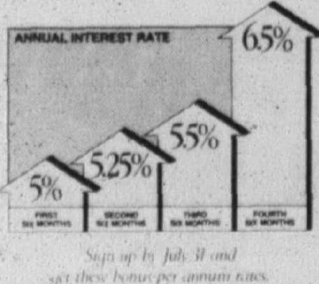

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# Millage

## Teachers hurt its chances

**J**ust when you thought it was safe to send your kids to the Plymouth-Canton schools, the teachers and administrators showed they're not much better than a pack of Wall Street bankers intent on sucking every penny out of the school district with no thought to parents, students or taxpayers.

The district's 824 teachers rejected taking 2 percent less of a raise this fall in voting on Friday and Monday. The plan called for teachers to take a 5 percent raise this fall instead of a scheduled 7 percent pay hike. However, that 2 percent would be added to the following year's pay raise. That would mean teachers would receive a 5 percent pay increase for the next two years.

That's not bad in our current economy. The district sought the contract concession from the teachers as a way to deal with a projected \$5.6 million shortfall that has prompted the district to pink slip 156 teachers. Another part of the plan is a 1.5 mill property tax proposal on the June 8 ballot.

The teachers' vote turns the 1.5 mill proposal into an endangered species. But they aren't totally at fault. School administrators, most of whom are making \$70,000 a year plus, are also to blame.

When quizzed about such freezes, administrators said they wouldn't ask the teachers to do

anything they wouldn't do. They didn't deliver. If administrators were serious, they would have announced they were taking pay freezes before teachers voted.

The administration and board also bear some responsibility for the teacher rejection of the wage proposal. Union members sought assurances from the administration that if the teachers took a wage reduction, the jobs of some of the 156 pink-slipped teachers would be saved.

The board and administration dropped the ball. They couldn't come up with assurances that any certain number of jobs would be saved, if teachers took the hit in their salaries.

The result is another school mess. With less than a month to election, voters have little time to digest the budget deficit situation, the teachers' refusal to cooperate, administrative foot dragging and the proposed lay off of 156 teachers.

We suspect voters will reject the millage increase. But that wouldn't be all bad.

The school board could come back to the voters in the fall after the teachers and administrators put their pay freezes in order. Also, the situation with the state's budget and spending on education would have time to settle down.

Right now, voting for any school millage increase is like trying to hit a moving target.

# Require female restroom equity

**W**hether a new Tiger Stadium is built or not, the Michigan Senate should adopt the bill to require more women's restrooms in public buildings.

The House, prompted by Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farmington Hills, overwhelmingly passed House Bill 4319 in mid-April. Complex in detail, it's simple in principle. The various plumbing codes should be amended by a single law that will require more stalls in women's restrooms. The goal is to avoid the long lines we've seen in theaters, stores, convention halls and stadiums.

It's a greater issue than the sight of women, eyes shielded, invading the men's room and causing giggles. It's greater than women's discomfort.

It's a health problem. Women get urinary tract infections from infrequent voiding, according to a 1979 study by a University of Michigan urologist.

A Virginia Tech study found that women require nearly 150 to 180 seconds versus 84 seconds for men to use a restroom. The Virginia Legislature in 1989 responded by requiring a 2-1 ratio of women's to men's stalls.

When female toilets are in short supply, their overuse tends to make them dirty, uncomfortable, plugged or broken. The problems are compounded.

Dolan pushed the bill this session because of heavy discussion over construction of a new baseball stadium in Detroit. Last weekend the University of Michigan announced it will ren-

vate Hill Auditorium — a hall renowned for its acoustics but notorious for its shortage of female facilities. U-M should take note.

Long known to women, the problem was publicized in many Observer & Eccentric newspapers seven years ago this week in a series by freelancer Penny Wright Steele. We made her documents available to state lawmakers.

It's hard to write legislation dealing with those additional problems. Store managers and architects should face them as a matter of conscience and profit rather than because of the force of state law.

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# Minorities thrive in business

**F**or those old enough to remember the Detroit riot of 1967, seeing the violence in Los Angeles on TV was like a recurring nightmare.

I remember it vividly. Some of these newspapers were printed in the old Polish Daily News plant on Canfield Street. I took a crew of volunteers downtown to put out the papers while the riot raged. The sight of corner stores blazing and armed National Guardsmen patrolling the streets is forever burned in my memory.

What Los Angeles burned into many minds was that a lot of the burned and looted shops were owned by Koreans. Like Detroit 25 years earlier, many black store owners displayed "Black Owned" signs to avoid destruction.

This raises an ugly question we must ask if we are to avoid a continuing cycle of urban violence: Why are blacks less successful in starting businesses than Koreans, Chaldeans or Vietnamese, immigrants who arrived penniless and voiceless in America but now dominate commerce in many inner cities?

If the answer is blacks are unwilling to work hard to build a business, then the only appropriate response is to continue dependence on welfare and hope for the best.

I don't believe this is true. And neither does Larry Doss, a tough-minded Coopers & Lybrand partner who happens to be black and who ran the successful Inner City Business Improvement Forum in Detroit in the '60s and '70s.

Doss points to two business problems affecting blacks more than recent immigrants:

- Capital. Most black families have not accumulated enough wealth for business capital. Venture capital isn't easy to come by. That's true for many immigrants, too.

- Labor. Most immigrant communities are very effective in financial networking, providing long-term and low-interest loans to their members. Think of Mike George and his enormous support to the Chaldean business community.

- Labor. Most immigrant businesses employ family members who work fantastic hours at very low

pay to support a collective family enterprise. The structure of black families is much less stable than immigrant ones: 66 percent today are headed by single parents, up from 36 percent in 1970.

These factors suggest what can be — and has been — done in Michigan to help create a stable, thriving, urban middle class and prevent another explosion.

A minority business and industrial development company (BIDCO) was started last year and is lending to black entrepreneurs.

Banks in metro Detroit have put up \$600,000 to help inner city folks build businesses.

For children, the Buddies in Business program at Greater Christ Baptist Church this summer will develop products, market them and learn the skills to make a business work.

Doss said the seeds planted two decades ago by ICIBF have grown. Today the Detroit area is "probably one of the top four cities in the country for black businesses — much better than Los Angeles."

Government programs have failed because they're blunt and imprecise, not targeted at the problems of real people.

People are realizing that resolving the problems of inner cities will come through thriving local businesses and a growing middle class.

# Can our suburbs serve up equal justice?

I wouldn't wear that if I were you, a passerby said to my husband at a Pontiac mall last week.

He was wearing a button denoting he was a juror, as instructed by the court during a lunch break from his duties in a murder trial in Oakland County Circuit Court.

It was the week following the verdict in the Rodney King beating, and apparently the backlash against that jury was so strong as to roll all the way across the country to splash up against a juror deliberating a completely unrelated case.

His was a case in which one drug dealer was charged with the murder of another drug dealer in Pontiac. There was no video but there was a body and a lot of conflicting testimony. The defendant was found guilty of the lesser charge of manslaughter, although the prosecution went for Murder 1.

But the trials had one thing in common: Both juries — the one in a suburb of Los Angeles and the other in a suburb of Detroit — were white and suburban. And they were being asked to try cases which involved inner city blacks.

A jury of their peers? Can the haves fairly try the have nots?

Our legal system relies on us all having a common vision of justice.

These days that vision may have broken down, a byproduct of unequal education, diminishing family life, less spirituality. Charged with a crime, blacks may not expect to get a fair shake from a suburban, all-white jury.

Our justice system also relies on the presumption that the police are our protectors.

Yet, blacks from Detroit say they are

afraid to drive to our suburbs, because they are stopped by police merely for being black.

Our black suburban residents have been stopped — even in their own subdivisions — on the suspicion that they don't belong there.

It will be interesting to see how Philip Eagleson, a black resident of Troy, makes out in his law suit against the Troy police for violating his constitutional rights.

Last December, Eagleson was on his way home from graduate studies at Wayne State University when he was pulled over on Long Lake Road, ordered out of his car, questioned at gun point about his residence and told to hand over his driver's license.

After searching his car, Eagleson says, the officers told him there had been a robbery and he matched the description of the

suspect because he was a black male.

Eagleson's suit contends illegal search and seizure, violation of his rights to equal protection under the law, racial intimidation and assault because a loaded gun was pointed at him.

Troy police maintain they followed proper procedures. Unfortunately, for suburban police, that often includes a predilection for stopping cars driven by blacks.

Whether or not Eagleson's suit is successful, it can serve to sound a warning to police in our suburbs — a warning that is overdue.

Happy Father's Day!" said the voice on the phone. It was the mother-in-law.

"Aren't you a little confused?" I asked. "It's Mother's Day. I'm supposed to be wishing you a happy day."

"Well, I just figured that since it's Mother's Day and you're doing all the cooking and cleaning and laundry and stuff, that it's sort of a Father's Day, too."

"Right," I said. "I'll let you speak to your daughter."

"Hi, Mom."

"Happy Mother's Day!"

"Uh, Mom, aren't you a little confused? I'm supposed to wish you Happy Mother's Day."

I didn't hear the rest of the conversation. But if the mother-in-law had things a little mixed up, it's no wonder.

Mother's Day — the second Sunday in May according to a proclamation signed by Woodrow Wilson in 1914 — is one of those Hallmark occasions whose primary purpose has been to sell lots of greeting cards, flowers and dinners out.

It's the one day of the year when — in traditional families — mom is served breakfast in bed (burned toast and spilled orange juice), presented with flowers and homemade greeting cards and taken to dinner at Bill Knapp's (GOOD things to EAT at a reasonable price). The next day she gets to clean up the mess made by her attentive husband and kids.

It's the time of year when hard-boiled male columnists feel compelled to write heart-wrenching soliloquies about that "silver-haired momma of mine."

An Episcopal priest I once knew referred to the day as "St. Oedipus Day." He was a cynical sort.

But this is the '90s and traditions aren't what they used to be. Neither are families. More women (including mothers) work today than ever before. (Work outside the home, that is. I don't want to get any of those "household engineers" who write letters to Ann Landers on my case.)

Divorce is more common than it has ever been. "test tube babies" are about to become teenagers and genetic engineering is

no longer limited to science fiction novels. Surrogate mothers have become the subject of philosophical treatises, religious ruminations and civil lawsuits. Single-parent families are not necessarily the result of divorce or death.

Mother's Day has become symbolic for a variety of special interest groups. The anti-abortion people like to use it as a time to hold vigils mourning the death of the unborn. Other groups use it as a time to protest violence against women. In Plymouth Township on Sunday, a group of activists staged a rally outside the Scott Regional Correctional Facility to demand equal rights for women in prison. A newspaper, headlined the story: "For Moms in Prison." And in Omaha, Neb., of all places, one woman ended up in the hospital and her mother in jail after they got into a fight over who was the better mother.

It's the '90s, all right. And the greeting card companies are right on top of things.

When I took the third-grader out to buy a card for her mother — and, yes, it was on Saturday before the Big Day — even I got

confused. Now the "For Someone Who's Been Like a Mother to Me" variety has been around for years. So has "To a Dear Aunt on Mother's Day" and "To My Wife on Mother's Day."

But I had never before seen one that said "From One Single Mother to Another." It was there. A variety of cards said "To My Daughter on Mother's Day," and there were even more "For a Darling Granddaughter on Mother's Day."

So I figured that's why the mother-in-law was confused. If St. Hallmark says you should send your daughter Mother's Day greetings, it must be so.

Now I can't wait until Father's Day. I'll send cards to the mother-in-law, to The Feminist and to The Third Grader. Heck, I'll even send The Architecture Major a card: "To a Dear Son on Father's Day."

And if anyone tells me I'm confused, I'll say, "No way! It's the '90s. Silliness isn't only acceptable, it's the norm."

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# GOP, Dems agree on adoption points

Lt. Gov. Connie Binsfeld's Commission on Adoption went over some of the same ground covered by a legislative panel headed by Rep. David Gubow.

On two key points, Republican Binsfeld's group and Democrat Gubow's group agreed:

- Adoptees should have greater access to medical and genetic information about their birth parents.

- Health insurers should be required to cover adoption children from the day they enter their new homes rather than a year later when the adoption becomes final.

A key difference is that Gubow's report calls for shortening the time for adoptions to be finalized from a year to six months. It also advocates permitting direct placement adoptions between birth parents and adoptive families.

Gubow of Huntington Woods headed a subcommittee of the House Judiciary Committee that worked 14 months before issuing its report in mid-March.

His bipartisan group held 13 public hearings and produced an agenda for legislative action.

Binsfeld, whose office isn't covered by the Open Meetings Act, met in closed session with her group for a year, producing its report at the end of April.

Binsfeld's report contains some items requiring legislative change but has a greater orientation toward social agency and administrative speedups.

They agreed Michigan's system is better than most others but still can stand improvement.

The direct placement question

divided the two groups. Gubow's panel said:

"Almost all states allow biological parents who wish to place their child for adoption to choose the adoptive couple.

"Michigan remains only one of a few states to require a child placing agency to make the choice in all non-relative adoptions. Parents must release their child to the agency, which assumes the responsibility of finding satisfactory parents for the child and consenting to its adoption."

Gubow recommends permitting direct placement adoption. Binsfeld's panel is silent.

Binsfeld's panel recommended prohibiting "for-profit" adoption agencies. Gubow's group took no position.

Gubow's panel dealt gingerly with the question of transracial adoption, particularly white couples adopting black children.

"Many agencies and workers feel black children 'only' should be placed with black families," said Gubow's panel. They argued that a black child needs to develop a strong racial identity and be prepared for inevitable racial bias. Lawmakers noted "there are more black children than available black homes."

Gubow's panel recommended only that DSS monitor agencies to assure they are following the law where there are insufficient numbers of black foster care and adoptive homes.

Binsfeld's group, after calling for recruiting of ethnically matched families, urged that "placement practices assure that children bonded with a family not be removed based on race."

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# Trout need chance to survive

Ron Spitler leaned against the forest green pickup truck and breathed a small sigh of relief. "It sure feels good," he said, as a smile slowly appeared on his face. And the Michigan Department of Natural Resources District 14 fisheries biologist had good reason to smile. After all, there were brown trout swimming in the upper stretches of Paint Creek.

The DNR has planted brown trout in Paint Creek since the early 1960's, but the fish never ventured into the upper four miles of the creek. Not until Monday that is, when the DNR planted 500 brown trout just beneath the dam at Lake Orion.

The construction of a bottom draw pipe at the base of the dam last year has lowered the water temperature in the upper part of the creek enough to enable the delicate trout to survive.

"The trout just love it," said

Spitler, watching some of the browns dimple the surface of the cool water Monday afternoon. "We just ask that people will enjoy looking at them for now while we establish a population for fishing later on."

The planted fish are sub-legal size when released in the creek and won't reach the legal size of eight inches until later this summer. Anglers who insist upon fishing for the little ones stand a very good chance of killing the fish before it even reaches a legal size. You can't keep them anyway, so stay away from the creek for a month or so and give the fish a chance to acclimate themselves with the area.

Trout are cold water fish and thrive when stream temperatures hover in the 60's. Water in the lower section of the creek rarely gets above 65 degrees in the summer. But with warm surface water from Lake Orion flowing over the dam, the water temperature in the upper four miles of stream often reached 80 degrees during the middle of the summer — a temperature lethal to trout.

Paint Creek starts at Lake Orion and flows southeasterly through the

Bald Mountain Recreation Area and into Rochester where it empties into the Clinton River. The creek is planted annually with brown trout and received 5,500 fish this spring.

Through the combined efforts of Trout Unlimited, the DNR, the Paint Creek Trailways Commission, the Michigan Wildlife Habitat Foundation and many others concerned organizations the creek has been the recipient of a major facelift over the past few years. Log jams and debris have been removed and erosion control devices such as riprapping and log shoring have been added. The abandoned railroad grade which runs the length of their creek has been upgraded and several stairways have been added to provide easy access to the stream for anglers and hikers alike.

In the spring of 1991, the DNR completed a major improvement by sinking the bottom draw pipe at the base of the dam. The pipe runs out 740 feet from the base of the dam and is anchored in 62-feet of water. The bottom draw only operates when water is flowing over the top of the dam but is expected to drop the temperature of the water in the creek by up to 10 degrees.

Unfortunately, due to bridge construction in downtown Lake Orion just 100-yards downstream from the dam, the bottom draw was not in operation last summer and Spitler and his staff had to wait until this year to analyze the water and stock trout in the upper stretches of the creek.

Paint Creek isn't the only stream in the area in which trout were introduced this spring. Earlier this month the DNR and members of the Western Wayne County Conservation Association planted 4,500 browns in the Johnson Drain, a tributary of the Rough River, in western Wayne County. It was the first trout plant in this section of the Rough River system in recent history.

Hopes are that the introduction of trout will create a sustaining fishery, but no fishing will be allowed this year.

Nikki Fayne most certainly will have opening night jitters when she takes the stage in Michigan Opera Theatre's production of "Samson and Delilah." Haven't heard of her? Can't find her name on the playbill?

That's because she's not listed. She's not even an opera singer. She's not a super star. She is a supernumerary.

Fayne, a 16-year-old junior at North Farmington High School, is one of the many unknowns who populate the Masonic Temple stage in Michigan Opera Theatre productions. Some, like Fayne, are interested in an acting or singing career. But most perform as amateurs in the true sense — for the love of it.

"I want to be an actress," she said. "Anything you can do to gain experience will help."

Shawn McIntyre, an administrator of a computer sales firm, would also like to further her part-time dancing career.

"I had heard through friends about it," she said. "I knew my dance background would be a plus for some parts."

Others, who have long given up on any dreams of an acting or singing career are still susceptible to the allure of the stage.

"I had performed in some high school productions and I liked being on stage again and being part of the action," said Jim Szalony, a travel agent who lives in Farmington. "I was put into some roles that had a lot to them. As a soldier in "La Boheme" I walked Musetta around the stage."

Szalony, who had not seen an opera before becoming a super, said his roommate, a member of the MOT chorus, talked him into trying the Masonic stage. He now considers himself a fan.

"Unfortunately, when you're a super,

you don't get to see the opera," he said. "I saw acts one and three of "Romeo and Juliet."

Al Wisnieski, a systems analyst for Ford Motor Co. from West Bloomfield, had not attended an opera before becoming a super along with his wife Sally.

"It is a whole lot different than what I'd thought," said Wisnieski. "I thought it was a bunch of people yelling at the top of their lungs. But when you see the principals warming up and performing on stage, it's incredible."

Lots of fun

Supers can play almost any part in an opera, depending on the director's needs. MOT's production of "Samson and Delilah" requires eight body builders. "Candide" used supers to portray animals, the ever popular "Aida" uses large numbers of supers, while some operas use none at all.

"Some of the parts require certain skills," said Dee Dorsey, MOT production coordinator. "We have a core group of supers that we've used for many years. They usually call me."

The pay of \$7 per performance is not what keeps supers coming back.

"People just do it for the fun of it," Dorsey said.

That describes many supers, who like Ann Perniciaro of Birmingham, jumped at the chance to perform.

"I've always loved opera," said the 28-year-old custom clothier. "I was talking to one of the performers about singing and decided I'd like to be a super. I had a wonderful time. Listening to the singers practice is great, even during rehearsals when they warm up their voices. You can tell that it takes so much training to sing like that."

Perniciaro's versatility was put to the test in "Candide" where she played two roles — a sheep and a Spanish dancer.

"I considered it to be a privilege,"

she said. "Besides, I got free tickets for friends."

But, like the professional performers, stage hands and directors they work with, supers have to put in the hours. There can be 10 or more three-hour rehearsals for just three performances.

Lots of work

"It was a lot of fun — and a lot of work," said Mary Hall of Livonia. "We rehearsed for seven weeks. We did it so many times, by the time it came time to perform, it was like nothing."

Wisnieski said after long hours of practice, supers know their parts by heart, but there is still the occasional faux pas.

"You're working with the director," Wisnieski said. "If you make a mistake,

nobody knows except you and him."

Well, usually.

"In Carmen, one of the Spanish dancers tripped going off the stage," Wisnieski said. "It was just on the corner of the stage. He was almost off, but it was comical."

The rehearsals are necessary, if only because of the number of people needed to bring off a performance.

"I never realized how many people it took to put something like that on," said Szalony.

"We'd been in community theater productions before," Wisnieski said. "But that was small scale. It takes so many different people. There are costume people, set people, painters — there are probably 150 people working on one production."

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# JET's 'An Evening of Schisgal' memorable

Performances of the Jewish Ensemble Theatre production of "An Evening of Schisgal" continue through May 24 at the Aaron DeRoy Theatre at the Jewish Community Center in West Bloomfield.

Murray Schisgal's "A Need for Brussel Sprouts" and "74 Georgia Avenue" are two very disparate one-act plays paired under the boring title "An Evening of Schisgal" at the Jewish Ensemble Theatre.

As a playwright Schisgal is best

known for "Luv" and as a screenwriter for co-authoring "Tootsie," but his name is not a household word. So "An Evening with Schisgal" gives little hint of what to expect.

"Brussel Sprouts" is an urban romantic comedy, pleasant but unimpressive and uninspired except for its clever title. "Georgia Avenue" is a deeply moving comic drama about a man's need to believe in something stronger than himself.

In "Brussel Sprouts," struggling actor Leon Rose (Glen Allen Pruett) is a new tenant whose loud stereo annoys his upstairs neighbor. Unknown to Rose, his neighbor is an attractive policewoman (Annette DePetris) who is finally driven to

pounding on his door and handing him a summons for noise violations.

In an effort to avoid the fine, Rose starts to court the officer. Soon each confesses a mistrust of the opposite sex based on their backgrounds of multiple failed marriages. Too bad, says Schisgal that men and women are stuck having to get along with each other when they are so very opposite, but there's just no choice but to keep trying.

As officer Margaret Heinz, DePetris nicely conveys the tough facade that hides the vulnerable woman underneath, while Pruett does a good job of capturing Rose's slightly inept quality.

"74 Georgia Avenue" is an ad-

dress in an all-black section of Brooklyn that was once a Jewish neighborhood. Marty Robbins (Paul Hopper) has come back to the spot where he was born and raised in a vague effort to find himself by renewing his roots.

His sudden appearance, suitcase in hand, seems a nervy imposition to current occupant Joseph Watson (Harold Hogan), but the later soon warms to his strange visitor.

As a youth, Watson hung around the old neighborhood synagogue a lot because his father was the janitor there. When Robbins and Watson reminisce about acquaintances from the past, Watson shows some old clothes and prayer books he rescued when the synagogue was torn down.

Whenever Watson dons the clothes of the old Jews he is mysti-

cally transformed into one of them. Demonstrating, Watson uses his assumed personage as a refuge from the pain of losing his beloved wife, while the transformation enables Robbins to relive conversations from his youth, and come to grips with a lot of his suppressed anger. Man, says Schisgal, has to have something strong to fall back on in order to survive the harsh buffetings of life.

As Watson, Hogan gives an extraordinary, moving performance both as the warm, sensitive husband devoted to his dying wife, and as Robbins' aged, crotchety grandfather.

While "An Evening of Schisgal" is uneven in many ways, Hogan and director Michael Tolant make "74 Georgia Avenue" a very worthwhile and memorable stage experience.

hayride, but we want to branch out and be more pro-active (in the community)," said Elizabeth Kanter, a group founder and insurance agent for the American Benefits Group in Southfield.

"The more people we get involved, the more people we can help. In the past, we've raised money on a project basis. Now, with the help of volunteers, and hopefully some area corporations, we can help the community in another way."

But organizing an event that will involve a projected 500 people who will collect an estimated \$45,000

has proven to be difficult. Already, an area corporation pulled out after offering to donate \$15,000 to cover printing and distribution of hundreds of mailers, as well as all other organizational costs.

So Kanter was left to pay for the effort from collected donations — a task she felt was both risky and self-defeating. But last week, a publishing company in Troy and a law firm in Southfield offered grants that will help defray a portion of the event's start-up fees.

Volunteer Impact still needs additional donations — both mone-

ary and physical — to coordinate what it hopes to be an annual event.

"Basically for the event to work we need volunteers, not only to go out and paint and repair homes and pack food boxes for the needy, but also to ask their friends and colleagues for pledges," said Kanter, a Southfield resident and 1979 graduate of Cranbrook School in Bloomfield Hills.

Bonnie Cohn, volunteer service coordinator for the Jewish Association for Residential Care in Southfield, which provides for adults with developmental disabilities, said a

recent hayride sponsored by Volunteer Impact for residents would not have been possible without outside assistance.

"In the last few years, we've really seen young people reach out and make that extra effort to help others," she said. "And no one benefits more than our residents. They really get a big smile on their face when someone takes the time to care."

7,000 used cars for sale in Metro Detroit.

"If we could grab 10 percent of the used-car market, I would be very happy," said Avedian, who hired six employees to help run the operation. "We feel we offer people a very viable alternative to selling their used cars through a newspaper or at a car dealership."

John DeBrabander, used car manager for Glassman Oldsmobile in Southfield, said he doubted the Auto Bazaar would have an impact on used car sales at the dealership, as many customers prefer the convenience of trading in their old car when buying a new model.

"Many of our customers also like the fact that they can purchase an extended service contract when they purchase a used car, which offers a

lot of peace of mind," said DeBrabander. "At a place like the Auto Bazaar, you really don't know what you're getting."

By comparison, a classified ad in the Observer & Eccentric, which operates 12 suburban newspapers in Oakland and western Wayne counties, is \$9.45 for one day for three lines, and \$18.90 for two days. Papers are published every Monday and Thursday.

Fran Gillis, supervisor of classi-

fied ads for the Observer & Eccentric in Livonia, said it remains to be seen what impact the Auto Bazaar will have on used-car advertising for the suburban newspaper chain.

"This may be a last resort for people who have trouble selling their cars due to one reason or another," said Gillis. "The other drawback is the inconvenience of driving out to the Silverdome to set up."

In addition to cars and trucks,

the Auto Bazaar welcomes boats, motorcycles and recreational vehicles.

Joe Tsao, director of marketing and events for the Silverdome, said the stadium signed a contract with Avedian for 14 weekends extending through August.

Avedian said he got the idea for Auto Bazaar from a friend in Los Angeles 10 years ago, but he said it took him this long to set up a Michigan version due to resistance from individual communities and area auto dealers.

"The biggest problem was finding a landmark site big enough to hold the Bazaar," said Avedian. "And then once you find a site, the cities and car dealers fight you all the way. Certainly, the car dealers see us as a threat."

# Alas poor Yugo, I knew her well

Now that we don't have Yugo to kick around anymore, I have to confess that I will miss it.

Yugo of America closed for good a couple of weeks ago, listing \$600,000 in assets against \$15 million in liabilities, the sort of balance sheet only a Texas S&L operation would be comfortable with.

Yugo's demise marked the end of the last foreign car in the U.S. I don't mean imported — I mean truly foreign, a vehicle loaded with the kind of idiosyncrasies that used to tug at the heart-strings of the owner of, say, a Humber Super Snipe, or maybe an Austin America.

As a true foreign car, the Yugo was never any threat to anyone. It had the louisiest quality records seen in the U.S. in decades, mediocre fuel mileage, and weird handling. None of these in themselves would have kept it from at least modest success had it appeared 15 years or so ago, but it had the misfortune to appear just when the U.S. automotive scene was changing for all time.

The basic concept, to make a car so ridiculously cheap no-one could afford not to buy one, ran afoul of today's staggering insurance costs and finance charges — which are so high you could give a new car away and still only the richest ten percent of the country could afford to drive it.

But even more important was the fact that it was made in Yugoslavia. Remember Yugoslavia? Americans have deep-seated pre-

judices about their cars, knowing that the French are cooks and lovers, Italians are only good at Ferraris, and Germans and Japanese are born with motor oil in their blood. Yugoslavia? That's the question you flunked in high school geography.

But of all the problems that plagued the Yugo, the most surprising was the hostility of the foreign-car magazines. Two decades ago, the Yugo would have been the darling of Road and Track, and Car and Driver would have been busy stuffing a 289 V-8 under its hood. Instead, the Yugo was dumped on, because it was slow, because it looked funny, because it was... well, foreign.

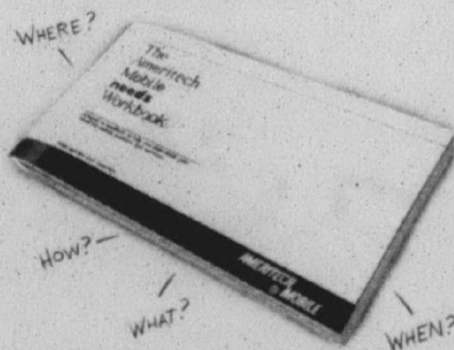
Yugo did all the right things to cultivate the media, taking them to Europe (well, all right, Yugoslavia); taking them on factory tours (big mistake); taking them to nude beaches... nothing seemed to work.

The magazines that coddled and promoted weird cars for all those years had changed. They saw only the flaws, none of the fun. The Yugo was an embarrassing reminder that the enthusiast magazines had grown up, sort of. Now they were owned by junk-bond conglomerates that kept an eagle eye on potential advertising revenues, and were perfectly aware of the state of hard currency in Yugoslavia.

With the Yugo folding in the midst of a bloody civil war, another question emerges. What in the world is going to pull the old Eastern bloc into 20th century commerce? It wasn't a great car, but it was the best effort ever seen in that part of the world to produce a viable export. A lot more has been lost with the end of the Yugo than just another weird automobile.

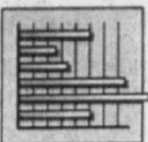

# Advertisers aim at new horizons



Who are the advertising industry's latest targets? Sports enthusiasts queuing up to answer nature's call at stadiums and arenas.

Talk about your captive audiences. It used to be the only place you could escape the all-intrusive advertisements was to slip into the john.

Well, you can forget that too. Privy Promotions, a Farmington Hills, firm specializes in getting a message across to the most captive of audiences — people waiting to use the bathroom during sporting events and concerts.

Sounds funny? Even chief financial officer Roger Avie said the company is willing to laugh a little about the concept, but be assured the business is serious about its idea and what it can do for advertisers.

The typical stadium audience is affluent, educated, and numerous. For example, if a stadium's annual attendance is roughly 3 million people, that could result in 100,000 people going through one restroom a year.

And it's worth noting, he said, "that they're going to be standing there for a long time."

"It's not a new idea," Raymond Malover, partner in Privy Promotions, said.

Other firms throughout the country are already advertising in restaurant lavatories. Generally, these advertisements take the form of poster-sized advertisements, usually split up among many smaller advertisements.

Privy Promotions is taking the concept and running with it.

That's only part of the idea. In addition to better presentation, Privy Promotions is targeting sports arenas. By the end of this year, Malover said he expects to be in about 12 stadiums across the country, including the Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Three Rivers Stadium in Pittsburgh and Philadelphia Park in Philadelphia.

"A sports arena restroom is an exceptional place for advertising," Malover said. Not only do people spend a long time in them but retention for restroom advertising is higher as well.

The average time according to a recent study at Virginia Polytechnic Institute is 84 seconds for a man and 3 minutes for a woman. "That's probably not addressing sports arenas."

According to a study done by Rice University for some of the other firms that have done restroom advertising, people are more likely to remember restroom advertising.

"It's called a retention curve," he said. Since there is little to do in a bathroom, other than take care of business, people seek a distraction. The advertisement provides that distraction. When coupled with a lengthy amount of time, a person is going to remember the message.

In fact, people may appreciate the advertisement, which is another plus.

"When people stand in line, they become bored," Malover said. "But when the mind is occupied, it seems like they don't wait as long."

### Gender-specific advertising

Feedback for the idea has been overwhelmingly positive, Avie said. "Especially the women, they tell me great, I'll have something to read while I'm standing in line."

"That's another plus about Privy Promotions," he said. "It's very gender specific."

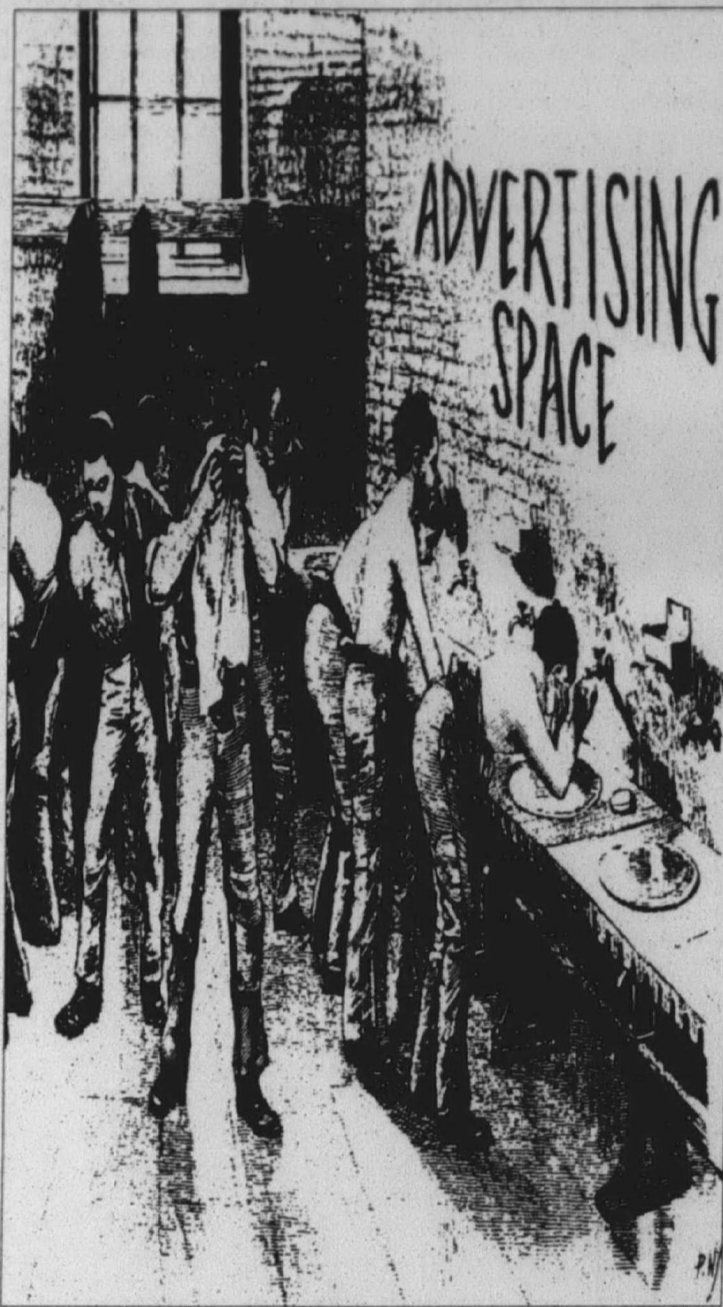
If a company wants to advertise only to men, or only to women, there are few — if any — places they can advertise in a direct manner. "Even a woman's magazine can't guarantee that many won't see the ad — we can. It's a perfect

### Complement, not compete

For \$2,000, each advertisement gets special treatment — a 15-by-15 inch diamond with a marbled matte border. Privy Promotions pays a royalty to the stadiums for each advertisement sold, he explained.

That price rents the space for a year and allows the advertiser to change the advertisement once a month.

"We're not looking to reinvent the wheel — we hope to be a complement to a company's other advertisements, not a competitor."



venue to get a gender-specific message across."

But will it work? Milton Pierce, chairman of Guardian Alarms in Southfield, said any idea has potential to work, but whether he would advertise in such a manner is something he couldn't say.

"With all advertising, you don't know if it will work until you try it," he said.

"There are plenty of people who will see it, there's no doubt about that," he said. "But there's no such thing as guaranteed advertising."

Bruce Annett, director of University Relations at Lawrence Technological University, has also seen Privy Promotions plans, but again, whether LTU

would advertise using the medium is another question.

"It is innovative, I'll say that," he said. "And it certainly seems to be an economical way to reach an upscale audience."

"Looking at it from an advertising standpoint, it appears to be a very real marketing tool," Annett said.

Avie and Malover said they expect some skepticism when it comes to their idea, and the first advertisers will be pioneers of sorts, but they are confident the end-result will mean a big future for Privy Promotions.

"Hey," Malover said, "everybody's got to go to the bathroom sometime."

# Got the time? Volunteer Impact offers all kinds of opportunities

With a tattered leather mitt and a golf ball-sized stone, Kenny, a 7-year-old boy who lives in an area homeless shelter, dreams of one day playing first base for the Detroit Tigers.

"I use a rock 'cause my mom says we don't have money to spend on sports stuff," said Kenny, tossing the crude ball in the air before catching it. "I had a baseball once I found, 'til it got run over by a truck."

It is children like Kenny — who have everyday dreams sputtered by

impossible odds — that Volunteer Impact, an active, Peace Corps-like group of mostly young professionals based in Southfield, has set out to reach.

Volunteer Impact allows for area residents to tap into a wide range of charitable programs benefiting area shelters and soup kitchens via a monthly newsletter whenever time and ambition present themselves. The two-year-old group, which has seen its membership grow from a handful to a legion of more than 900, is sponsoring its first Volunteer-A-Thon, a May 16 event where members put in an eight-hour day

packing food for the needy and planting trees for the elderly while asking friends and neighbors to pledge a donation.

The resources collected will be used to take a group of homeless children like Kenny on field trips — a baseball game at Tiger Stadium, a special tour of the Detroit Institute of Arts, a children's play at the Fox Theatre — as well as sponsoring meals at area shelters.

"Up until now, we've been able to provide volunteers to fix up old homes or take disabled adults on a

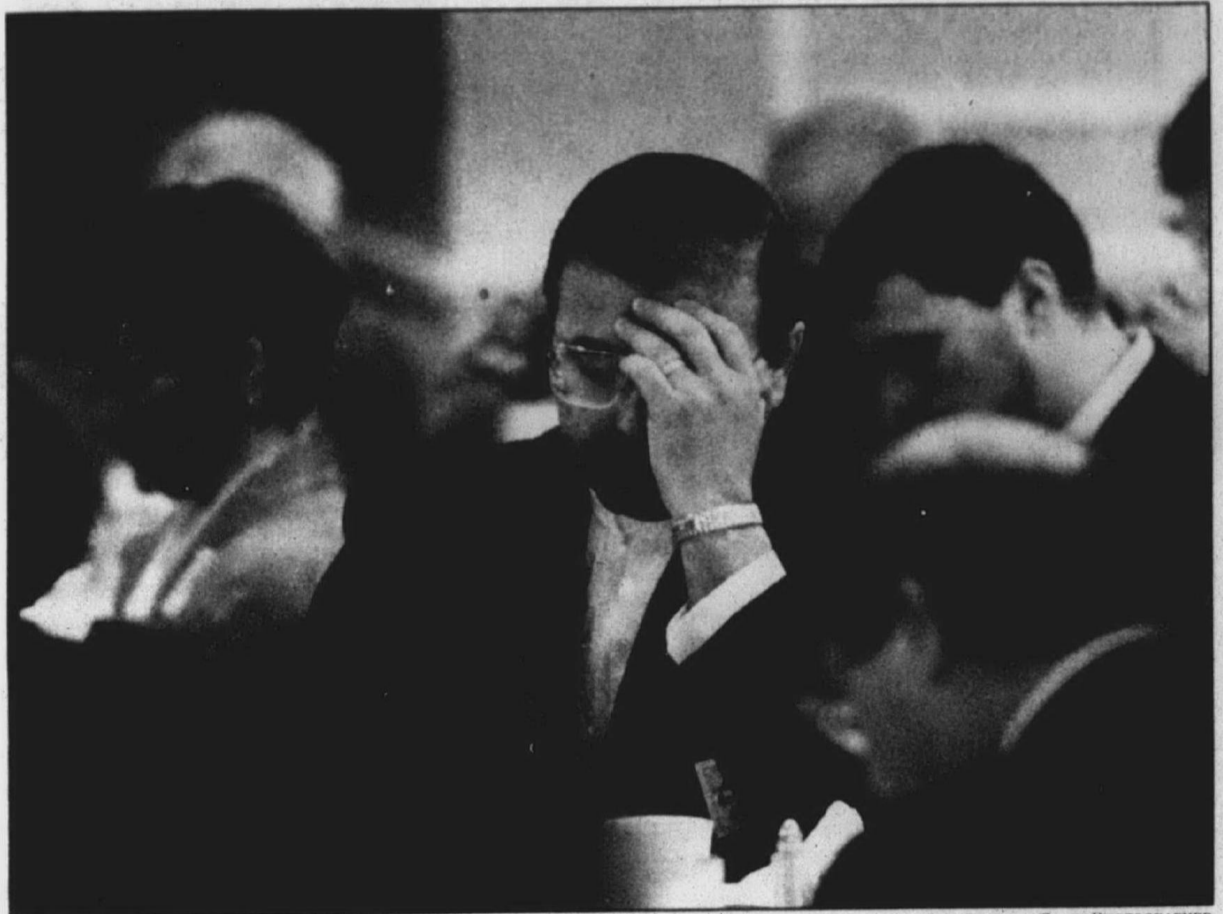
Christian beliefs call for honesty in government and at home, he said. Accountability and serving one another are what hold communities together.

The breakup of the family, an educational system that no longer teaches right from wrong, and the failure of Detroit ministers to exercise moral leadership have all contributed to the city's problems, he said.

Plymouth-Canton area clergymen and women were impressed with the message of healing and hope that Butler brought to the breakfast, the second such annual National Day of Prayer observance.

"Excellent perspective," said the Rev. William Myers, Canton Community Foundation president and pastor of Faith Community Moravian Church in

Canton. "Wonderful leader, gifted leader. I was impressed with what I perceived to be his humility."

Myers was touched by the fact that Butler shrinks away from the "black leader" title, preferring instead to describe himself as a leader who happens to be black.

Many area churches are involved in Cass Corridor ministries, providing

food, toiletries and other items for shelters, Myers said.

"But we're not immersed in it. I have a sense there's more we can do."

The breakup of the family unit has contributed to the city's problems, Myers said, and those problems affect the suburbs as well. "Our planet is not all that large, nor is our country."

Lt. Jeffrey Beachum, corps com-

mander for the Salvation Army in Plymouth, Canton and Northville, was equally impressed with Butler's message.

"I thought it was excellent," he said. "I was impressed with his view of the ministry. He's got some good ideas."

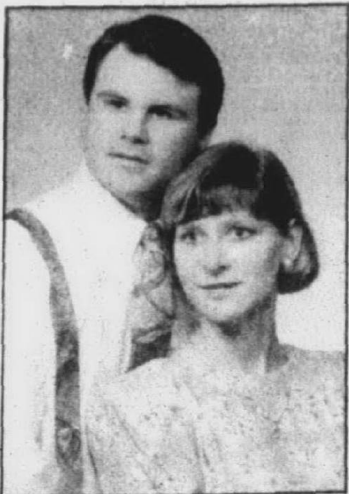

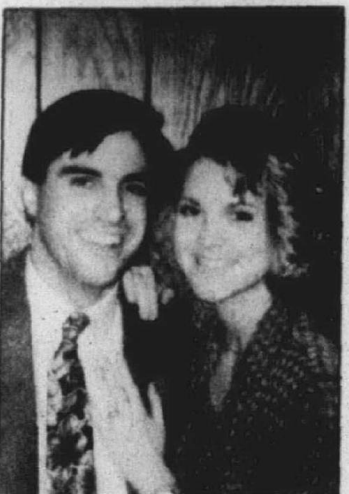

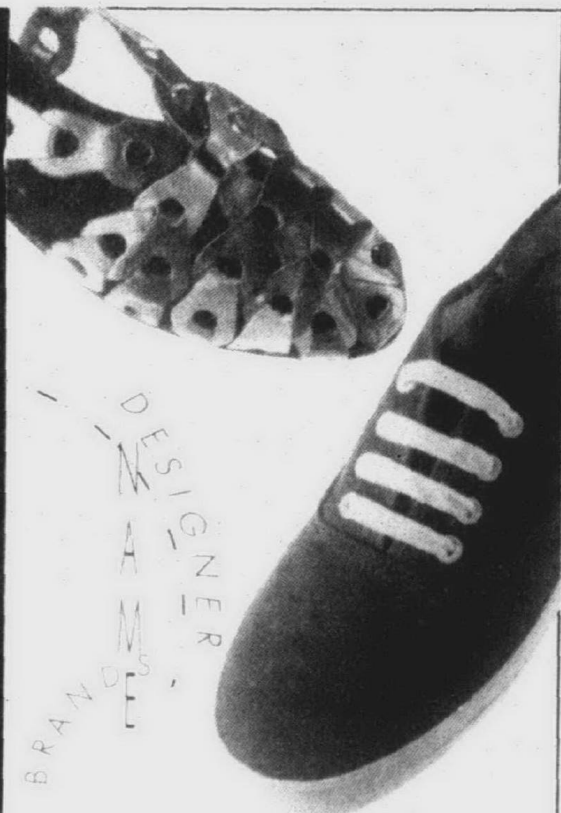

The ministry's not merely doctrine or principles but also involves helping those in need, Beachum said.

Black officers are still a minority in the Salvation Army, representing about 30 percent of the total in the U.S. with a greater concentration in inner city areas. The Salvation Army works with crosscultural ministries to build bridges that go beyond providing financial support, Beachum said.

"A financial donation soothes a lot of guilt. We do need to be responsible with our finances, but we

need to be responsible with our other resources."

Butler's message was a thought-provoking one, particularly given its timing related to the Rodney King case. The prayer breakfast, sponsored in part with funding from the Canton Community Foundation, wasn't without its lighter moments, however.

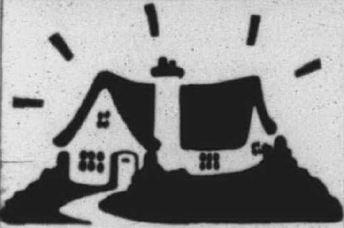

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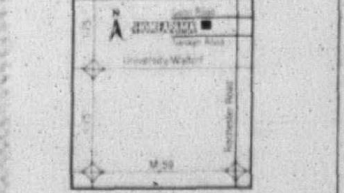

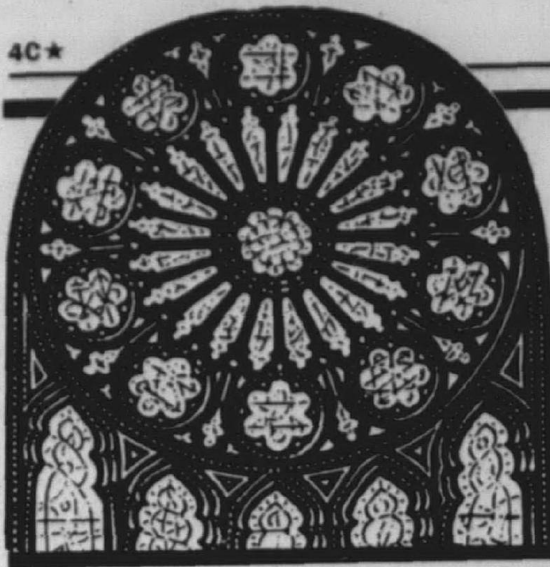

# Heed God's wake up call to rid our hearts of racism

For the past weeks you, like myself, have thought about and talked about the Rodney King case and the events in Los Angeles. What I first felt immediately was shame, shame for a nation that has avoided, ignored, pretended that the problem wasn't there. Some called the violence a 'bloody wake up call' to the nation. People across the nation have felt fear, alienation and worse of all hate and anger, worse of all because these emotions become uncontrollable and often end in violence.

Division and alienation feel more real, more in the foreground of our lives now. You and I have discussed

these events. We have read and watched countless analyses. Riot, uprising, urban race war, lawlessness, a city at war, the looting and sacking of a city, all of these are phrases which point to a deep illness in the body of this nation. The pain, the continual attention to the illness this past week and a half, point to a diseased condition.

This sickness is first of all racism, prejudice, disregard for people of a different color and style of life. This sickness is secondly economic and social separation - separation between the haves and the have nots. Third, this sickness is neglect of the major social problems of our age, concentrated in the older cities of our nation. Fourth, this sickness is the breakdown of the four major pillars of a decent society: the church, the schools, the family and the neighborhood.

We have come to the borders of our nation, to the very border of

freedom and slavery, of peace and war, of fear and trust, of violence and forgiveness, of life and of death. A void has appeared for all to see in the body politic, in hope for a future America. We see the gulf which can widen and lead to death. We see the possibility of healing which can lead to life.

### Crisis in history

At the borders of life we can go no farther. It is a crisis in human history like that marked by the Berlin Wall. People have hit the wall again and blood is on the streets of our nation. We cannot avoid this painful reality. We must make new decisions, new directions, new movements to heal. This moment is not unlike what happens to us in our individual lives. We stand on the border of our life when we say good-

bye to one thing and we face something quite different.

My father died. I experienced a border in my life in which the past is gone, my father is no longer here. I must adjust, heal, decide how I will live without a parent. A child leaves home, a marriage breaks up, a death happens, a job is lost, at such a moment we stand on the edge of void.

We contemplate life. We ask how to heal and move on? We ask where is God in all of this?

A mother told me one day that her last daughter had just left home. There was a note of puzzlement in her voice as she said, "Now I'm going to have to decide what I am going to do with my life." She had given so much to her children. Now they had gone. She stood on the edge of a gap in her life.

### Special moments

Such moments, whether they be

personal or an event in our social history, such moments are deeply religious events. For individuals these experiences push us to grasp the deepest truths for our lives. What is God's will in this situation? How can I overcome despair? What meaning or value calls me back to healing and wholeness?

This week I heard the personal story of an African American young man in Los Angeles. He was stopped by the police, pulled out of his car and given a body search as he was stretched up against his car. He is a respected professional person, yet he is black and he happened to be in the wrong place at the wrong time. He was badly frightened. He did not know what might happen to him. Throughout this ordeal he remembered the words of his Sunday School song when he was a small child. He repeated over and over again in his

mind, "Let your light shine, let your light shine."

There are moments in our lives when we are pushed up against reality. It hurts. We are tempted to push it out of our mind. If we avoid it we do not have to deal with it. Yet, this is the very border of life at which God calls for us to decide. Whom will we hear? What decision will we make? Will we change our life or try to make the old way that has failed lead to another crises and fail again?

Yes, the events in Los Angeles are a wake up call to each and every one of us. The wake up call is from God. It is a wake up call to individuals to rid their soul of racism. We must respect every human being as a child of God. It is a wake up call to our society to effectively address the multiple problems which we have ignored and allowed to multiply in the center of the cities of our nation.

# No butts: District proposal would outlaw smoking

It's a good thing Old Joe of Camel cigarette fame doesn't teach in the Wayne-Westland school district.

No butts about it: District schools may soon be smoke-free.

The school board has unanimously endorsed a proposal to stamp out cigarette smoking on school grounds.

"Let's get rid of cigarettes in the buildings and on the premises," board member Kathleen Chorbಾಗಿ said.

Even the board's sole smoker hasn't hedged, saying she fears she's sending the wrong message to students when she lights up at outdoor sporting events.

"I feel crummy smoking in front of the kids," board member Laurel Raisanen said.

In a meeting Monday, the seven-member board embraced the proposal from board member Vicki Welty to make Wayne-Westland schools a smoke-free place to work and learn.

Students are already prohibited from smoking in school. Teachers and other workers who smoke in designated areas would be next.

The policy would extend past school hours to include PTA meetings, special programs, socials and athletic events, though some officials already question how they'd enforce the rule at football games.

School officials cited several rea-

sons for considering a no-smoking policy:

- It would encourage healthier lifestyles for students and employees.

- Many public buildings already are smoke-free, and the state appears to be clamping down even more.

- Officials fear potential lawsuits from non-smokers claiming health problems from secondary smoke.

Recent court decisions have favored non-smokers, noted Bill Taylor, associate superintendent for employee services.

Schweitzer Elementary has already implemented a smoke-free environment. A teacher there filed a grievance saying smoke from a nearby lounge filtered into her classroom.

She brought a doctor's note supporting her claim. She won.

Because a no-smoking policy relates to a working condition, Taylor will have to negotiate with every employee union to implement it. The board told him Monday to launch talks.

The board indicated it would offer a stop-smoking clinic for employees.

Taylor appeared optimistic about the no-smoking proposal and said: "I'm convinced that overwhelmingly a majority of our employees do not smoke."



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## TV comes to classroom

Educational television that combines geography lessons and jeans commercials in an MTV-like format will be beamed into Wayne-Westland schools.

Channel One, a 12-minute news program aimed at young audiences, has been approved for local classrooms — but not without a school board debate about Madonna and rappers 2 Live Crew.

In a 6-1 decision Monday, the board voted to allow the broadcast of Channel One in junior highs and high schools that want it next fall. The controversial program from Whittle Communications has sparked a national controversy.

Supporters have hailed Channel One, saying its fast-paced, colorful format has grabbed students' attention in subscriber districts and taught them about the Soviet

Union's fall, the Los Angeles riots and other news events.

Two minutes of commercials weaved into the daily 12-minute segments are a small price to pay for boosting student interest in world events, they say.

"I'm appalled by the geography skills of the students in my classes," said school board member Vicki Welty, a part-time instructor at Eastern Michigan University. "They come in and they don't know where Europe is."

But critics have raised ethical questions about beaming Channel One and its advertisers into public schools charged with educating — rather than what some fear would be indoctrinating — students.

Moreover, some critics fear Channel One will take more time away from the teaching of reading, writing and arithmetic.

# Special interests monitor waste, perks in Congress

Voters are mad as heck about scandal and privilege on Capitol Hill, and while lawmakers are trying to calm them down, a few interest groups are stroking the outrage.

Citizens Against Government Waste, which claims 450,000 members nationwide, is circulating what amounts to a primer on 1991 congressional votes on issues of waste and perks.

While most of the votes spotlighted by CAGW took place before problems were unearthed at the House bank, post office and members' dining room, the group says those shenanigans have added timeliness to its "voting report card" for last year.

"We try to be the leading taxpayers' organization on these types of issues," said Research Director Marlo Lewis. "Members are very upset when they find out that we've rated them 'taxpayer unfriendly' or 'taxpayer hostile.'"

### Votes reported

The group's "Government Waste Watch" covers votes on such issues

as returning unspent staff payroll and expense account allotments to the Treasury, raising senators' pay, spending \$49 million to insure profits for beekeepers and sending \$2 million to Chicago for library restoration.

The American Conservative Union's 1991 report card features roll calls on House mailing privileges and the Senate pay raise, among other "key votes" for the year.

The ACU hopes that the voter hostility now directed at incumbents will hold up until election day in November, so that the GOP can reclaim control of the House after nearly four decades of chafing under Democratic rule.

So it is preparing a one-page document titled "The Foley House," which charts each House member's use of the franking privilege, votes on perks and, if applicable, culpability in the check-kiting scandal in the three years since Rep. Thomas F. Foley, D-Wash., became speaker.

ACU executive director Bob Billings said the purpose is "to let people have a second examination on what they think of the 'Imperial

Congress.' We're printing up one million copies, and we'll drop them out of airplanes if we have to to get this information to the voters."

Ron Zucker, program director of the liberal Americans for Democratic Action, said the Congress's preoccupation with its own problems "is making it much harder for bold movement on our legislative agenda, because members will be forced to do so much of their time on damage control and explaining all this to their constituents."

He said the worst political outcome for the ADA would be President Bush getting re-elected and the GOP taking control of Congress. "Right now, that looks plausible," he said.

The ADA, ACU and CAGW are three of eight interest groups whose 1991 voting report cards are included in "The Ratings Game" by Roll Call Report Syndicate.

This annual story pulls together an ideological cross-section of ratings, so that constituents can see in one place how capital insiders from left to right assess their lawmakers. Scores for area mem-

of labor won when the House passed a bill prohibiting employers from replacing workers striking over economic issues, but was dealt a blow when Congress allowed President Bush to negotiate a "fast track" trade pact with Mexico.

Thomas off the Supreme Court.

# Safety-belt use on the rise

Safety-belt use in the United States has increased 236 percent in eight years, according to the Bloomfield Hills polling firm of Research Data Analysis Inc.

Its March survey of 3,000 U.S. residents was commissioned by Traffic Safety Now Inc., an arm of the auto industry.

The survey data were compared to a national poll of 2,000 U.S. residents conducted in December 1984. Everyone interviewed in both surveys was above the age of 18.

Results of the 1992 survey show:

• 64 percent of U.S. residents "always" buckle up when driving or riding in a car, compared to only 19 percent in the 1984 poll.

• 8 percent "hardly ever" or "never" buckle up, compared to 40 percent in 1984.

Participants in Traffic Safety Now include Chrysler, Ford, General Motors, American Honda, the Automotive Occupant Restraints Council, the Motor Vehicle Manufacturers Association and the National Automobile Dealers Association.

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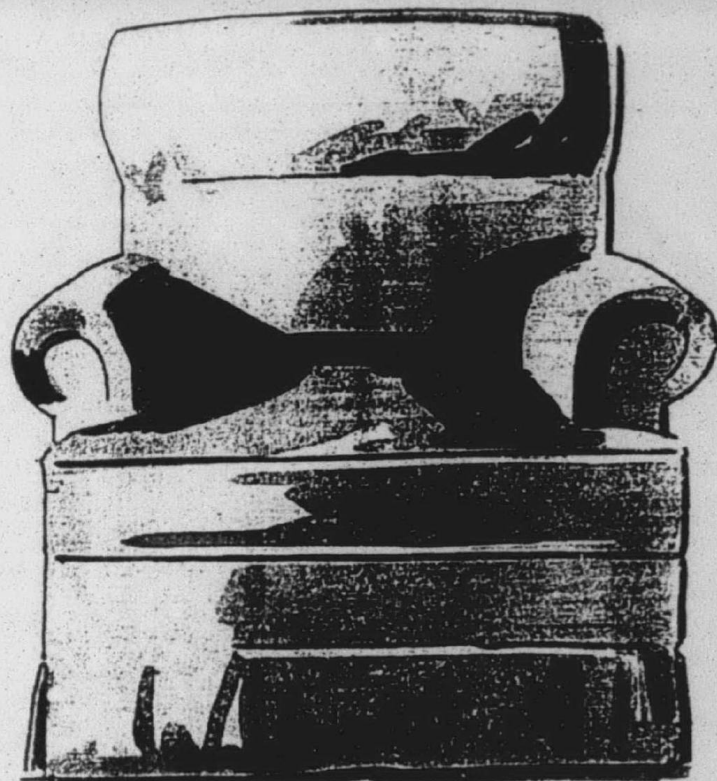
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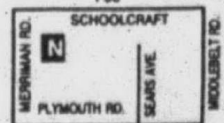
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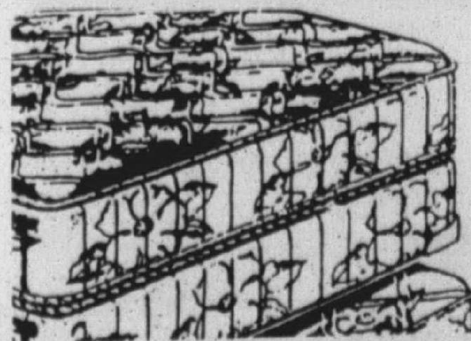

## Art fest spotlights restoration of mill

To help boost community interest in their restoration efforts, Friends of Nankin Mills again will host a spring art show in conjunction with a country fair, despite lack of cooperation the last three years from Mother Nature.

The fourth annual "Spring Elegance," a juried show for artists and artisans co-sponsored by the Wayne County Parks Division, will be noon to 5 p.m. Sunday, June 7, at the Westland historic site, by Nankin Lake at Ann Arbor Trail and Farmington Road.

Nankin Mills, a Civil War-era gristmill and later one of Henry Ford I's village factories, is now home to the Wayne County Parks Division. It's being restored to 1930s vintage and will feature machinery from the Ford era.

"The show's purpose is to keep the public aware of what's going on at Nankin Mills," said Bev Melasi, president since the Friends formed in 1987. "I think of it as the people's mill."

"We receive a lot of grant money so this event serves more as a recognition builder to keep people coming to the mill than it does as a fund-raiser."

The county acquired the mill from Ford Motor Co. in 1948. From 1957 to 1979, naturalist Mary Ellsworth ran a popular nature center there.

Last year, the county unveiled \$1.5 million in restoration and expansion plans. Expansion will double the size of the three-story mill and make it accessible to the disabled by 1993. That'll allow for a return of the nature center and the opening of a multimedia community room.

Henry Ford, who had visited it as a child and had a yen for preserving history, operated the mill from 1920 to 1947.

## Variety awaits

Up to 35 exhibitors, each paying \$25 for tent space, will showcase paintings, pen and ink sketches, jewelry, ceramics, sculpture, wearable art and selected crafts during the upcoming art show. Westland artist Sandra Weed, an art instructor at Schoolcraft College in Livonia, will be the juror for the show.

Other family events — square dancing, round dancing, Irish step dancing, face painting, a bake sale, and a country music concert hosted by the Westland Cultural Society — also are planned.

"I think this is going to be one of the best shows we've done, if Mother Nature doesn't doublecross us again," Melasi said.

The first year, the temperature was 30 degrees. A tornado warning came the next year.

Last year, it rained off and on. "But all of the artists came and people were square dancing in the slosh," Melasi said. "I was surprised at first, but then I realized everyone who came did so because they recognized the importance of the event to our restoration efforts."

This year, booth requests have been brisk. "Artists are very familiar with what we're doing to preserve its heritage," Melasi said. "They've shown they care about the mill and want to preserve its beauty also."

## Historic flavor

The Friends will wear period costumes from the late 1800s during the show, thanks to vice president Kathy Myers, whose grandfather, Floyd Bassett, owned the mill when Ford bought it. She lives across from the mill.

Make no mistake: The public has had a front-row seat to restoration work.

As Melasi put it: "It's been in the same neighborhood for more than 100 years. So people eagerly watch for events we host there — the art show, the fall wine and cheese reception, the Christmas tree lighting. And they also follow what we've done there — new paint, new windows, new roofing."

"After all, it's their support that has brought the mill to where it is."

Melasi grew up near the mill and attended Nankin Mills Elementary and Nankin Mills Junior High.

"I think it's important for people to have a foundation of where they came from, to have something they can reflect on and identify with when they were children," she said. "Things are changing so rapidly in Westland, many things we grew up with are no longer here."

Historical preservation also gives newcomers a sense of their hometown's past, Melasi said.

Melasi especially remembers visiting Mary Ellsworth's nature center at the mill.

"I want to see the mill restored for my children and for my children's children so they too can benefit from it being a nature center," Melasi said.

Joe Benyo, a Westland historical commissioner and city liaison to the Friends, sees the mill gaining popularity among younger families:

"We're seeing a lot of young couples who, when growing up, came to the mill to see the animals and go on the nature trails," he said.

"Now, years later, they're coming back to the mill and bringing their kids. That's what's really neat."

## Whimsical: Artistic images draw a smile

■ Bold, dark and expressive, John Shannon's whimsical wood artwork deals with nature, industry and man.

Canton artist John Shannon's tropically flavored totems stretch upward into space, like ancient, mythological Gods. Green snakes and alligators wrap themselves around the lyrical, magical towers.

Wild flames of red, yellow and green flow across the surface of a cat-like table nestling beneath, drawing smiles from visitors to the avant-grade Urban Park gallery in Greektown's The Alley (formerly Trappers Alley), 508 Monroe, Detroit.

All this and more, including Shannon's square cat boxes paused on four legs, remain on exhibit through May 16. Oil-painted in deep rich colors, his artwork reminds the viewer of an island in the South Seas.

"A lot of it is figurative. The images I've been using are images you can identify with — the industrial ideas and nature ideas," said Shannon, who graduated with a bachelor of fine arts degree from the Center for Creative Studies in Detroit in 1986.

"We need industrial things and we need nature."

Built from found objects, Shannon's evolutionary process of creating a piece begins once he conceives an idea, then lays down a sketch. Although the basic idea for a new work takes form on paper, it is relegated to his subconscious until the appropriate material is found.

"I get ideas from found objects, like the drawers and panels," Shannon said. "I do sketches to get ideas but it evolves with the material."

## Throwaways become art

From building sites or anywhere discarded objects lie, Shannon retrieves the dreams of a throwaway society.

Once a decision is made on which material to use in the creation of his whimsical figurative friends, Shannon never realizes the pieces trail or final destination until it arrives.

"At the museums, I like the island art. I like working on the bigger pieces, like the totem. I like the confrontation of work that's taller than you are," Shannon said.

Foliage reminiscent of Henri Rousseau decorates the totems, tables and objects.

Shannon's expressionistic painting of green, sword-shaped leaves accented with pink outer edges and bursts of bright yellow rays create a tropical theme.

"I like a balance of using the different complementary colors, more

browns, earthy and subtle shades," he said.

## A popular artist

Few words pass his lips. Shannon's art speaks for him.

His work has been exhibited in Finland, Germany, France, Holland, Brazil and New York's Greenwich Village.

In the Detroit area, it has graced the space of the Detroit Institute of Arts, Detroit Artists Market, Willis Gallery, Michigan Gallery, Detroit Focus Gallery and 55 Peterboro Gallery. It also has appeared in statewide competitions like the Plymouth Community Arts Council's Michigan Art '89.

"I love John's work — the quality, the appealing fantastic nature and bold use of color and form in creating narrative imagery," said Dave Roberts, Urban park director.

Barbb's acrylic paintings dramatically rebel in purples, while Enders' working in oil and pastel uses colors found in nature. Barbb paints in a graphic style, Enders in realism.

However different their palette and style, strong activist feelings for their subject matter prevail, binding their work together.

"I like to evoke emotions and put some kind of message in my painting. I did it for dramatics. The earth is disintegrating because of man. We know we're polluting the earth and we continue to do so without regard for future generations," Barbb said.

"February of the Year 2404" foretells the future, its dark, barren landscape void of vegetation.

"That's all that's gonna be left of Mother Earth," Barbb said.

Enders' work speaks gently of man's destruction. She paints because she feels if she can't raise people's consciousness about the destruction of wildlife and their habitat, by the end of her life, none will remain.

She now works in pastel to render the keepers of the land, the true founding fathers of our country, the Native Americans.

"Keeper of the Dreams," a pastel portrait of a Native American with violet background, presents the original landowners in a regal light. Lines in the Indian maiden's predominantly white blanket lead the viewer's eye upwards to an aged face that has weathered untold cruelties.

"It's a new medium that I'm working in. I'm

looking for comments from people about the piece," Enders said.

The majority of artists in the show seek the same.

"I like to have other people look at it to see if they see what I see in it," said Westland resident Art Fallert, art club vice president.

Fallert is working toward a graphic arts degree at Henry Ford Community College. It's apparent in his work — he likes design.

"A Walk in Central Park," a glowing acrylic cityscape, showcases his love for New York City.

"I was really fascinated by the city. One morning, I got up early to take photographs of the wonderful park in the middle of the city," Fallert said.

A stone bridge over a walkway provides contrast to the background with watercolor blocks of luminous pastel colors portraying lights in the windows of background buildings. "I do care if they like it," Fallert said.

Garden City resident Norma McQueen debuts paintings influenced by a February cruise. "Caribbean," a large acrylic on canvas, is dramatic with its green foliage.

"I took a lot of photographs. It was lush and beautiful on Martinique in the rain forests," McQueen said.

Each artist is donating a painting to be given away in a drawing. Ticket price is \$1.

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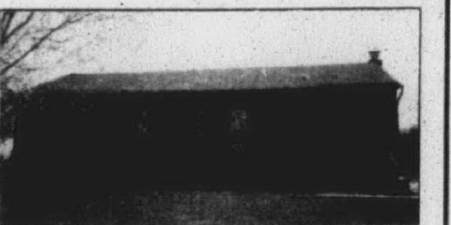

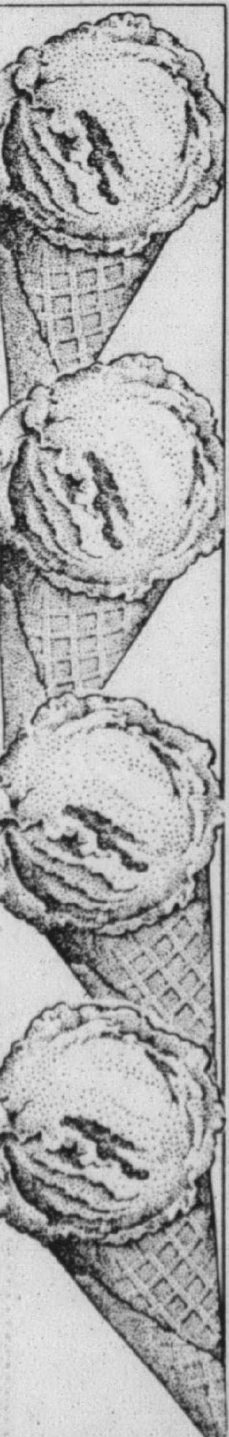

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# Spring into photo action

## FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

It's said that in spring, "a young man's fancy turns to love." Well, springtime is one of the best times for your fancy to turn to photography. It's one of the most exciting times for capturing images on film.

Flowers are, of course, associated with spring, but few people manage to photograph them successfully. They tend to point the camera quickly and shoot.

Without careful composition and attention to depth-of-field, the results can be disappointing.

First, get down low on the flower's level. Concentrate your viewfinder on just a few blossoms, maybe even one, and move in close. A tripod will help steady the camera.

Remember that the closer you get to your subject, the more depth-of-field you'll lose, necessitating a

smaller aperture.

One of the most common errors in photographing flowers is a distracting background. Use a piece of black cloth or cardboard behind the flowers and you'll be amazed at the difference in the results.

As in most photography, try to shoot flowers in the early morning or late afternoon so that the crosslighting will highlight the color and texture of the petals.

To photograph bees or butterflies on the flowers, shoot in early morning when the insects are sluggish and won't fly away.

Springtime is usually marked by changeable weather that will reward you with impact-filled shots if you're alert.

It can be raining one minute, then suddenly the sky will clear and the sun will burst through. This moment along with wet pavement, raindrops trickling down a window, or a rainbow itself will offer you excellent photographic opportunities.

Be on the lookout for trees or a city skyline silhouetted against a receding storm cloud as emerging

sunbeams highlight the scene. This is perhaps one of the most dramatic images you'll see through the viewfinder.

How about photographing the progression of spring? A series of pictures of that special tree in the back yard as it gets progressively thicker and thicker with darker and darker leaves will produce an exciting picture story.

Don't overlook other springtime photographic possibilities. Festivals and celebrations are usually in abundance. People become more active in spring both at work and leisure, so look for picture potential here.

Animals become more active, too, so a trip to a nearby farm or zoo will reward you with shots of our animal friends.

It's springtime... "spring" yourself and your camera into action!

## no gain

At Homearama it's a glass act

■ Ideas are the main commodity of Homearama, a showcase of the latest in architecture, landscape and decor. Doors will be open through May 25.

This month's Homearama is enough to make a Windex salesman beam.

Huge windows in non-traditional shapes and sizes abound in the Homearama houses, which are open now through May 25 in the Meadows at Oakland Farms subdivision in Oakland Township. Consider:

- A two-story family room in the Franklin accommodates French doors leading outside to the deck. The French doors are flanked on each side by windows the size of a single door with additional glass above, all of which is topped by a centering semi-circular window. The Franklin was built by Pinnacle Residential Homes of Rochester Hills, architecture by Bryce & Palazzola, West Bloomfield.

- Seven skylights brighten the master suite, second floor and exercise room of the Albertville, a house by Classic Custom Homes of Bloomfield Hills, Jannis Vann & Associates architect.

- Two-story, floor-to-ceiling bay windows in the living room and dining room and half-round top windows in the family room and breakfast room in the Knorrwood, a house by Robert R. Jones Associates of West Bloomfield, architecture done in-house.

- Triple-glazed, argon-filled Weathershield windows in the Smart House by Wake-Pratt Construction Co., Troy, architecture by Bowers &

Rein Associates.

- A huge transom window above the entry in the two-story foyer of the Sussex by S.R. Jacobson Development Corp., Birmingham, Bryce & Palazzola architects. The kitchen is accented by walls of windows.

In other features, visitors are likely to notice the shrinking of the formal areas of the home such as the living and dining rooms, and the expansion of the informal: the kitchen and family room. Architects seemed to favor positioning the formal rooms in the front of the house, and the informal in the back. But they were split in placement of the master suite, with some on the first floor, others on the second.

To help with the traffic, builders have installed double staircases so family members have access from either the formal or non-formal areas from both the front and back of the house.

Interior pillars or columns are also in vogue, adding some decorating flair while serving to isolate an otherwise open room.

Decorating colors lean toward the dark, with forest green and deep hues of pink favorite colors of the designers.

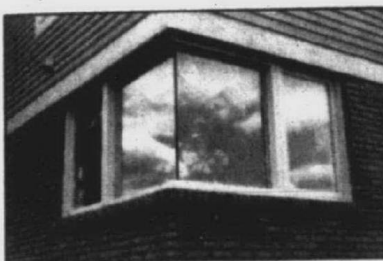

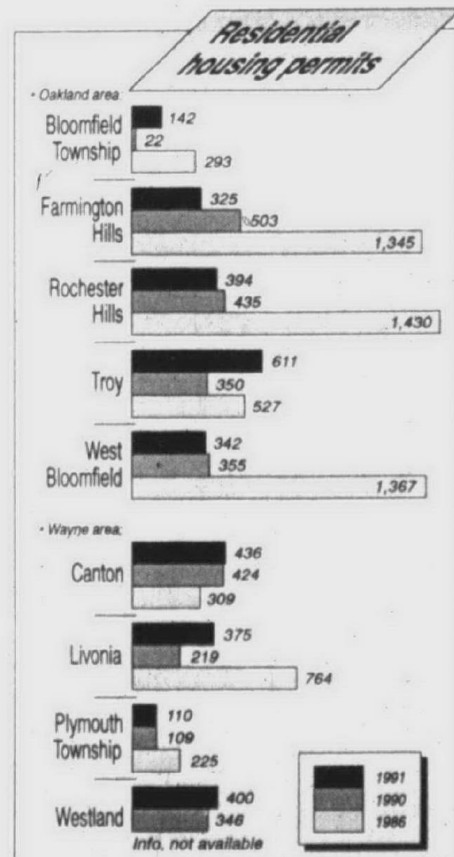

## Housing begins to hum



Last year was a mixed bag for O&E communities in terms of residential building permits issued, according to an annual survey compiled by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

Troy, Bloomfield Township, Livonia and Westland were up substantially from 1990 figures. Rochester Hills and Farmington Hills were down substantially. Canton, West Bloomfield and Plymouth Township remained about the same.

This year is shaping up to be a good one, several building officials have reported.

"Single family was up at the end of March about 11 percent," said William Dinnan, director of planning for Rochester Hills.

"I'm not an economist. I can only tell what I hear from builders. They're getting a lot of traffic. It appears that things are stabilizing," Dinnan said.

Permits were pulled for 66 single-family detached units and cluster units in West Bloomfield during the first quarter of this year. That's more than double processed during the same period in 1991, said JoAnn Kochanowski, office coordinator for the township building department.

"Builders feel the economy is on an upswing," she said. "Interest rates are holding."

### Room for growth

John Weyer, building official in Canton, predicted that more than 500 permits will be issued for single-family detached units there

this year, a 30 percent increase from 1991.

"Canton has the growth capacity if you compare it to other communities," he said. "It's at the stage Livonia has gone through, other communities have gone through."

Building permits issued in Troy are running at a clip 50 percent greater than last year, said Gary Shripka, chief building inspector for that municipality.

"Last year, in general, there was a lot of uncertainty. Used housing is moving better this year," he said. "A lot of areas in the city are mid-priced now, \$150,000-and-up market. Last year, everything was in the large (expensive) market."

"We're up from last year, not a great amount, but we're up," said Al Gilhuly, plan examiner for the city of Westland. "Builders keep telling us the economy is bad."

"Apparently, we're putting up houses in a price range people can afford, \$100,000," Gilhuly added. "I have a feeling interest rates have something to do with it. Money is a little looser, too. They (builders) don't seem to have trouble getting money. Commercially they do, not residentially."

Bernard Gliberman, president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, also is upbeat.

"People in this area obviously are optimistic about the economy," he said. "We probably offer the greatest value for each housing dollar to be found in the nation and, despite a slight rise, our interest rates are

the lowest they've been in nearly 20 years."

## Building leaders

Pulte Homes of Michigan, Royal Oak, was identified as a major builder in both Rochester Hills and Canton.

"We had a very good year last year. We didn't experience a slowdown," said Deen Hyde, director of marketing for Pulte. "This year, we're doing about the same."

"I think a lot of it is our ability to make large land purchases and do our own development without being dependent on outside financing," Hyde said.

More residential units last year were permitted in Troy, 611, than any other Oakland County community, SEMCOG reported.

Holtzman and Silverman of Farmington Hills pulled permits for a major apartment complex on John R north of Maple.

Other major players identified by Shripka were Gulf Construction of Troy, Fairway Estates, Rochester Road south of Square Lake Road, and Woodland IV, Northfield Parkway and Wattles; S.R. Jacobson, Crescent Ridge subdivisions III and II at Square Lake and Crooks; and Divine Homes of Mt. Clements, Somerset North, Big Beaver at Coolidge, and Crescent Ridge.

Canton issue more residential building permits, 436, than any other community in Wayne County, SEMCOG reported.
