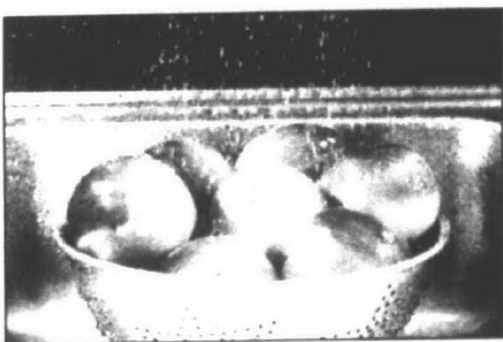

## Bush visit seeks swing votes



The presidential election season opens early in Canton and Plymouth, with a visit by president George Bush scheduled for Tuesday. Some say the attention being paid Canton by state and national politicians is bound to benefit Canton.

The most obvious reason for President Bush's scheduled visit to Canton on Tuesday, most local political and community leaders agree, is to boost the campaigns of local Republican candidates for the redistricted area.

But local leaders also say it represents both parties' growing awareness that the election will be won in suburban areas like Canton.

"The fight is following the flight," says Canton Community Foundation Director Bill Joyner. "People are moving to the suburbs and as along as the votes are out there, that's where the battleground will be."

With Michigan considered one of the five swing states in the national election, Democratic presidential candidate Bill Clinton made his bid for the suburban vote last week when he held rallies in Battle Creek and Waterford.

In Canton on Tuesday, Bush is scheduled to hold a rally in the early afternoon in the Heritage Park Amphitheater. From 8:30 a.m. until 5:30 today, the 5,000 tickets available for the rally at no charge will be distributed at the Canton Township Clerk's office.

The key to Michigan, Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack says, could very well lie in the hands of Canton.

"They know that coming to Canton will have a spill over effect into the whole county," Yack says.

Securing Canton's alliance, however, might not be that easy, said state Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton.

"I find Canton to be very individual," said Kosteva, who is running against

Republican candidate Debbie Whyman in November. "It's people who don't hold strong political affiliations. One only needs to look at its political history to know that."

Before 1970, Canton Township was a more rural area with a little more than 10,000 residents which tended to vote the Democratic ticket.

"Canton has many of its roots in the West Side of Detroit," Kosteva said. "Many current residents' mothers and fathers worked in the auto industry, who had Democratic roots."

In the 1980's these people began to move to Canton, supervisor Yack said, finding the comfort of the suburbs and

## Mettetal goes down in flames

Mettetal Airport won't be saved by federal money, according to a Federal Aviation Administration official.

"It's over as far as we're concerned," said Peter Serini, FAA Detroit airports district manager.

That's the strongest language spoken so far to signal an end to the effort started two years ago to buy the tiny Canton airport.

Plymouth Township and Canton signed an agreement a year ago to jointly seek an FAA grant so they could buy and run the airport.

The townships put several conditions into the joint agreement, including a clause letting Canton out of the agreement after 10 years. Observers, and even officials who voted to create the joint agreement, said it was

unlikely the FAA would accept such a provision.

And FAA officials said they couldn't recall the FAA giving a grant to buy an airport with such restrictions as part of the deal.

Plymouth Township trustees agreed Tuesday to set a deadline, Sept. 8, for the Federal Aviation Administration to approve the joint operating agreement signed by the two townships.

The Canton board of trustees at their July 28 meeting also voted to accept Plymouth Township's request to set the Sept. 8 deadline for hearing from the FAA on the joint grant request.

"We'll send that on and see what response they have," Plymouth Township supervisor Gerald Law said.

But Serini said the FAA decided to reject that language earlier this year.

In a May 22 letter, state bureau of aeronautics deputy director William Gehman wrote, "We have informed the townships, both verbally and in writing regarding FAA rejection of the suggested 10-year language."

Still, the Plymouth Township board of trustees is scheduled to meet on that deadline day, Sept. 8. If no word of approval comes from the FAA by that day, "Then the joint operating agreement of the two townships is considered terminated," Law said.

Yet, he added that Plymouth Township can't by itself dissolve the agreement with a vote, suggesting that the Canton board must also vote to dissolve the joint agreement to buy Mettetal.

## Restaurateur plans to fill downtown location

Move over country ducks — They'll soon be serving roast duck downtown.

In the former Cloverdale restaurant, just a few doors down from those shops where country ducks are the rage, a restaurant specializing in Chinese nouvelle cuisine plans to open.

Ann Arbor restaurateur Khee Kwok said he plans to open "in six or seven months."

Kwok is one of several restaurant owners who say they're interested in

moving into some vacant Plymouth store fronts.

By last week, there were four inquiries from restaurant chains interested in the former Taco Bell restaurant on Main Street, according to the city building department.

To the southwest, Mr. B's Plymouth Grill has received city commission approval for locating in the former Holly By Golly's building on Ann Arbor Road.

There are several Mr. B's bar-restaurants in metro Detroit, including Rochester and Royal Oak. The establish-

ments tend toward a sports bar theme.

According to the application presented to the city commission, the Plymouth Mr. B's plans to have karaoke entertainment. The owners were unavailable for comment on other plans for the business.

Kwok has hired an architect to redesign the inside of the former Cloverdale restaurant.

Ken West, city engineer, said he's had discussions with architect Dean Sakamoto about the former Cloverdale building. "He's coming up with con-

cepts to present to the owner of the restaurant," West said.

At the Cloverdale site, payment for parking credits — something that has deterred some restaurant developers from locating downtown — won't be a problem, as the building is already zoned as a restaurant.

All that's needed, West said, is a building permit for remodeling.

"Part of what they need to do is take paneling out," West said, to examine the building structure.

Republican Jerry Vorva, who beat incumbent Georgina Goss in the Aug. 4 Republican primary, will be the only state House candidate listed on the November ballot, according to a county elections office spokesman.

Democrats Doug Blair and Thom Gillis did not get the number of write-in votes needed to be listed on the ballot.

Blair got 17 votes and Gillis 97 — both less than the 230 needed.

number of senior citizens," said Clapper, who works for Charter Bus Unlimited in Detroit. "I've seen seniors go from existence living to a poverty state. Now I want to vote for someone who is going to change that — and I do think it's time for a change."

Republican Plymouth Township Supervisor candidate Kathleen Keen-McCarthy, however, does not believe her party has made a bid to women solely on the basis of the abortion issue.

"I think the Democrats are making pro-choice their major issues, but the Republicans are simply saying there's a broader spectrum

here involving the whole family," says Keen-McCarthy. "What's interesting, however, is that suddenly those issues that women have been talking about for years are becoming the focus of these campaigns — family and quality of life."

The credit for the clammer to garner support from women, says Canton resident Tillie Schultz, 69, goes to Barbara Bush. Schultz also thinks the first lady will go a long way in swaying women to the Republican ticket.

"She's a down to earth person and I think a lot of women identify with her," Schultz says. "I think

she's a role model for all women and I think some of the men should try to measure up to her as well."

Canton resident Carol Hay, 37 and president of her company, United Software Solutions, acknowledges that both parties are pursuing women as a political power base in the 1992 campaign, but fears the attention is too good to be true.

"Half of me says it's about time," she says. "The other half of me says it's because they see us as their route to success... my fear is that they're using us."

Trustee Smith Horton commented that when the two townships created the joint agreement last summer, he thought it was "something the FAA would never agree to."

The saga began in 1990, when the Canton board of trustees rejected an effort advanced by some citizens to buy and run the airport.

In August 1990, then Plymouth Township supervisor Maurice Breen announced his intention to seek a federal grant to buy the air-

port and have Plymouth Township run it.

Breen said his interest was motivated by a desire to maintain a high quality of life in the area, and keep industrial development away from Plymouth Township homes just across Joy Road from the airport.

But a group of citizens organized to fight the effort, claiming residents would eventually pay local taxes to support the airport opera-

tion, even though Breen and township trustees said they planned to spend no local taxes on the airport.

Plymouth Township sought to create a joint airport authority with the city of Plymouth, angering a group of anti-airport residents in the city.

In November 1991, a city ballot proposal over the airport was soundly defeated, and so were some city commission incumbents who supported the airport purchase.

appeal of Ronald Reagan.

What's clear is that Canton Township residents are often ticket splitters. They may vote for one party on the local level, Congressman William Ford says, but they're likely to vote the other on a national level.

Supervisor Yack agrees. "I think it has less to do with party affiliation and more to do with local issues," said Yack. "In the 1980's residents were concerned with growth issues such as land use and commercialization so they voted the candidates that spoke to them."

No matter which party get Canton's votes, the township is likely to benefit from the attention this fall, Yack said.

"We will get a chance to share our concerns," he said. "And hopefully after the election they will be translated into action."

The architect has expressed interest in creating more windows, and reducing the number of seats in the restaurant, West said.

"We'll have nouveau Chinese cuisine," he said, such as pasta dishes with sea clam sauce and roast duck. "It looks like Italian style but it's

West said most fixtures from inside the building, including ice-cream making equipment used by the former dairy, have been removed.

# Canton is battleground in tough state House race

State Rep. James Kosteva called it "a real championship fight." Deborah Whyman compared it to the World Series.

So you see, these two candidates for the 21st district state House seat can't even agree on a metaphor for the campaign.

Kosteva is the incumbent Democrat, having held the seat since 1984. But Canton's political stance has since moved to the right, and the district was redrawn this year, adding a few more Republican voters to the campaign ball game, or prize fight.

Ergo, Kosteva seems to be running like a challenger this year. Almost every day he's out knocking on doors from 4 p.m. until sundown, guided by a list of "good consistent voters" with records of regularly casting ballots. He said he can reach 50-70 voters a day in this way.

Kosteva also plans "a number of mailings between Labor Day and November," and he's stockpiled more than 1,000 campaign signs to spread around the district beginning in late September.

But all those additional Republicans have not run to the campaign

of GOP candidate Whyman. Interestingly enough, Kosteva has received overt, covert and inadvertent support from several Canton Republicans.

It's already been noted that township Supervisor Tom Yack won't actively support either candidate, a tacit endorsement of Kosteva. Now Canton Big Boy owner and self-described "staunch Republican" Mitchell Howard has thrown his support to Kosteva.

Howard said he's writing a letter of support that Kosteva may use any way he sees fit in the campaign. "Two or three other (Republicans) might join me in that respect," Howard said.

Whyman, on the other hand, has a big fan in Gov. John Engler who personally promised to speak at a fund-raiser on her behalf in September or October. She began going door-to-door last Wednesday, plans to mail information to voters and has more than \$40,000 to spend. "I believe I have a message that people like," she said.

To support her assertion, Whyman can point to an Aug. 4 primary campaign victory over Dan Calabrese by a margin of several hundred votes. But she can't count on

the support of her fellow Republicans.

Calabrese said he's "not going to take an active role in this race," but nevertheless criticizes Whyman. "I'm not entirely confident that she's a well-rounded enough person and steady enough on all the issues," he said. "I'm not entirely convinced she knows what she's doing."

Although Calabrese doesn't support Kosteva, either, his criticism is much less severe. "People don't feel that (Kosteva) is dishonest," he said. "And he has been there when you needed a question answered or when you needed a problem solved."

Asked why the Republican support has come his way, Kosteva said that "a good part of the work we do in the legislature is non-partisan. Ninety percent of the votes we cast are not Republican or Democrat, liberal or conservative."

Calabrese attributed it to a set of priorities that say politics run second to pragmatism. "It's true that Canton is a very Republican community," he said, "but it's also true that the people are loyal to the community first."

# Woman ponders differences between U.S., El Salvador

Ever since she returned from a two week humanitarian aid trip to war-torn El Salvador last June, little things keep happening to Plymouth Township native Jane Lindamood that remind her of the difference between that Central American country and the United States.

"I went to the mall with a friend shortly after I returned, and it was strange to see all this excess we have compared to the devastation I had seen over there," she said.

Lindamood was part of a five-person contingent that dispensed medical supplies and aid for the Salvadorans caught up in the country's decade-long struggle to eject the existing military dictatorship and replace it with a representative government.

During the trip, which was sponsored by Detroit-Windsor Refugee Coalition and Salvadoran Humanitarian Aid, Research and Education (SHARE), the delegation spent four days in the city of San Salvador holding clinics on Post-Traumatic Stress Syndrome for the guerrillas returning home from years of fighting in the mountains. Through the clinics, the group hoped to prepare the fighters for the difficult adjustment to daily life.

While there, Lindamood said they also had an opportunity to tour the city. But what she found was different than she had expected.

"The pictures you see on television are always of the slums, but there were some very modern sectors where the wealthy land owners and international businessmen live," she said.

The slums, however, were very sad and frightening, she said. The only sewage system available in the desolate areas is a ditch running through the city known as "The Stinking River". The houses, constructed of almost any materials available, are virtually piled on top of each other, she said.

## Armed soldiers

The most difficult thing to become accustomed to, Lindamood said, was the sight of armed soldiers at every turn. In that city, uniformed soldiers with machine guns even directed traffic.

"One time we were watching a street corner show and all of a sudden I realized that wherever I looked there were soldiers around us watching," she said. "It set me off balance because as an American that's something I'm not used to, but to these people it's just a fact of life."

After four days, Lindamood's group then moved into the mountains along the Honduran border. For five days they met with and dispensed medical supplies to the guerrilla fighters and refugees struggling to cross the border into Honduras. Lindamood remembers one particular day when she and the others made a two-hour hike up the mountains, following the footsteps of thousands who took that path to seek refuge in the neighboring country. That single experience, Lindamood said, clarified for her what the lives of Salvadorans struggling for political freedom have been like for the last 10 years.

"When we got to the top, we were all so exhausted," she recalled. "To think we felt this way after only two hours and the refugees hike like this for days and weeks on end, fearing that if they're stopped they'll be killed. That experience brought it all into focus."

## Year of interest

For Lindamood, this trip was the culmination of many years of interest in the Central American civil war and a desire to help in some way. She first learned about the situation from her teachers at Plymouth-Canton High School when they would discuss current events

of the mid-1980s.

When she went to Western Michigan University in 1986, she attended a church which had a sister parish in El Salvador. Often she would hear the reports from the sister church about how it had been taken over by the government to be used as a military outpost and of other events in the war. Money and time constraints always kept her from making the journey, however, until last year when she became a teacher with the Marshall school district. With her summers free and a steady income, Lindamood finally was able to save up the \$1,800 needed to

make the trip.

Now she has decided her recent trip was only enough to get her feet wet and has hopes of spending future summers in Central America.

In the meantime, she expects to struggle once again with the differences between life in El Salvador and in her own country when she returns to teaching this fall.

"The children over there are begging to learn, but the schools don't have the resources," Lindamood said. "Here, an education is so available and free for the taking and it's abused and ignored."

## Canton family welcomes new addition from Korea

Canton residents Bill and Terry Maynes' eyes were glued to the double doors as passengers on Northwest's Flight No. 30 from Seoul, Korea, passed through customs and entered the international terminal at Detroit Metropolitan Airport on Tuesday.

They knew the representatives from the Americans for International Aid and Adoption (AIAA) would depart from the plane last, but still the Mayneses looked on nervously, waiting for AIAA representative Heather Fuller to appear with Katrina, the three-month-old Korean baby girl they were adopting.

"Do you know who's coming?" said Terry Maynes, leaning over and speaking quietly into the ear of her 4-year-old son Dustin, who the Mayneses adopted through the same agency just four years ago.

"My new baby sister," Dustin responded with wide eyes and a big smile.

For Bill and Terry Maynes, now 34 and 32 respectively, the arrival of Katrina signified the completion of their family. Married in 1979, the Mayneses tried for six years to have children of their own. They went through the usual battery of tests, but doctors could find no reason for their difficulty in conceiving a child.

Finally, they decided to adopt, but there they encountered obstacles as well. Working through a social service agency could take as long as seven years, Bill was told. A private adoption agency, while much faster at placing children in homes, could cost as much as \$20,000 to \$30,000.

"We had already been married seven years," Terry Maynes said. "We didn't want to wait another seven, and a private adoption was just too expensive."

They also looked into some religious agencies, but not being of the same denomination, there were no opportunities with such organizations. Finally, a friend of Terry's referred them to the AIAA, and the application process which would bring Dustin to their family began.

They filled out a preliminary application and then a social worker visited and conducted a home evaluation. Finally, after the FBI concluded its investigation of the Mayneses, a common event in international adoptions, the Mayneses were approved. In all, the process took 10 months, \$6,000 and the Mayneses had their first child.

Even when the Mayneses adopted Dustin, they knew they wanted another child. Bill and Terry both come from large families, and they didn't want Dustin to be an only child. But it wasn't until last September they decided the time was right. So the Mayneses began the application process again. By January they had the papers filled out and turned into the AIAA. Even though they had worked with this agency before, the organization conducted as thorough an investigation as the first time, including fingerprinting and an FBI interview. Also, a social worker who conducted the second evaluation even questioned Dustin about his home life.

Seven months and \$13,000 later, Bill and Terry got the call telling them they had been approved and their baby girl was on her way.

At the airport, Terry said she was still quite nervous, even though she had gone through this experience before.

"I'm excited. I want to get her and hold her," Terry said, starting every time the double doors swung open. "But I have the general fears that any parent does. I want to make sure she's healthy and OK."

Finally, AIAA representative Fuller walked out with Katrina and placed her in Terry's arms.

"Oh my baby girl," Terry whispered, her eyes filling with tears as Katrina smiled up at her.

From his father's arms, Dustin leaned over and kissed Katrina on the forehead. Then Bill Maynes and the remaining 25 friends and family who gathered there that afternoon lined up to welcome in likewise fashion the new edition to the Maynes family.

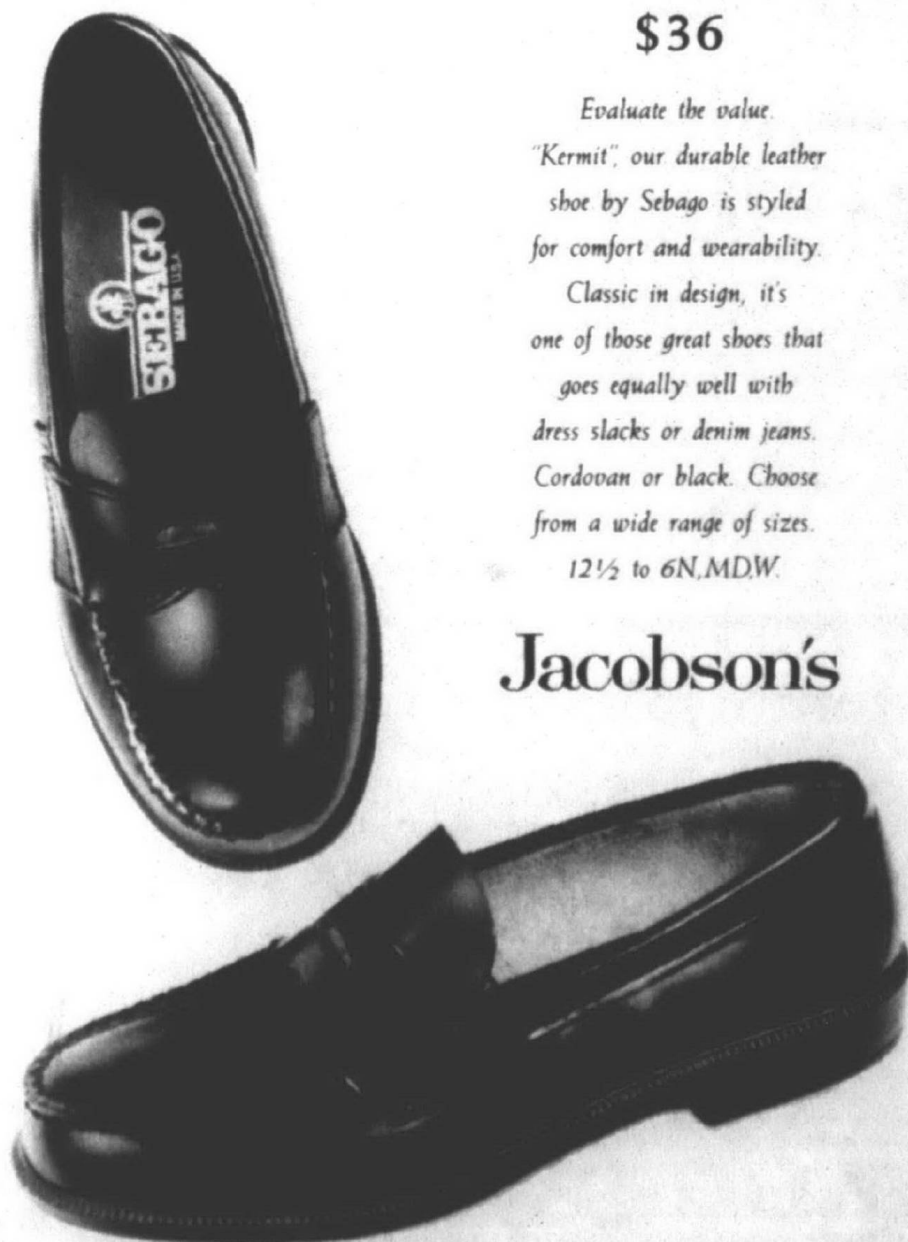

## Self image: reality vs. perception

Three years ago, an Oakland University sociology instructor noticed that men and women given an assignment on body image answered questions differently depending on their gender.

"They were worlds apart. I was really surprised," said Susan Haworth-Hoepfner, a Rochester Hills resident.

"The female would describe body image in terms of transformation, lack, or need for improvement. Even when by cultural standards they were classically beautiful they still described their feet as too big, or their pores as too large."

"This was in contrast to male responses. A response I have which was typical of males was, 'tall, dark, medium build, chest larger than most, and I don't lift weights, it's a natural body build.'"

From that point, Haworth-Hoepfner decided to pursue the topic for her dissertation. The result is an ongoing research project on body image and eating disorders. She hopes to receive her Ph.D. from Wayne State University based on her research.

Haworth-Hoepfner's study examines the relationship between the "construction of femininity and the predisposition towards eating disorders."

It's significant for instance that in anorexia nervosa, in which a per-

son pursues thinness through self-starvation, 90 to 95 percent of sufferers are women, she said. The age range of victims is generally 14 to 18.

"My question was, what is it that makes it seem to be predominantly a female phenomenon," she said.

There are no easy answers, she said.

Her findings did seem to indicate, however, that its normal for females to distort their body image - but not for men.

In medical literature she found when those women with distorted body images were compared with normal women, even the "normal" women overestimated their sizes. The fact that normal women did so was not recognized.

"It's a fact that is absolutely glossed over," she said.

"I think one of the assumptions that seems to be emerging is that women's body image is located within pathology." It is assumed that they will do so, and so is not pursued, she explained.

As regards how women distort their body image, that could be cultural, she found.

"Our ideas in this society can be very constraining," she said. "What we seem to memorize in our bodies is this notion of lack, of never being good enough. It has to do with the way Western culture constrains feminine identity."

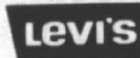

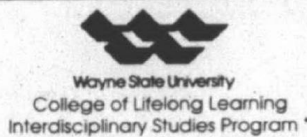

# Ford: trade pact to cost local jobs

The proposed North American Free Trade Agreement will cost more jobs in southeast Michigan, U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Ypsilanti Township, predicted at a suburban Rotary Club program Thursday.

He pointed out the problems of many companies shifting operations and jobs to a 60-mile-wide strip along the U.S.-Mexican border to improve profits.

An example is Ford Motor Co. shifting the production of its former Mercury Lynx model to Mexico where it now builds a more expensive model, called the Tracer. At the same time, the company continues to assemble its Escorts for a \$2,000-

lower price tag at the Wayne plant on Michigan Ave. at Newburgh.

The shifting of jobs is to increase profits, not to hurt people, Ford said.

But he made it clear that he opposes the agreement that is designed to provide tariff-free products among the United States, Mexico and Canada.

"I cannot support any agreement which sanctions job flight south in pursuit of cheap labor and ignores the workers and communities left behind," he told the Westland Rotarians at its weekly luncheon meeting.

"I cannot support any agreement that doesn't include enforceable labor standards, health standards, environmental protection standards

and public safety standards," said Ford, a 28-year House member seeking his 15th term Nov. 3.

There are 2,000 plants in the Maquildora strip along the U.S.-Mexican border, with the average wage of a worker being less than \$1 an hour with no union or pension rights, he said.

Typically, a worker in that area lives on a two-room shack without running water, electricity or car and has to work four days to buy a pair of blue jeans, he added.

That strip has 550,000 hourly workers, of which 75,000 work for auto companies, who have replaced people in the Midwest and New England, said the congressman.

"I will do everything I can to oppose the (trade free) agreement,"

said Ford, adding that Gov. John Engler feels it will be good for Michigan.

Ford, whose district boundaries have changed under the redistricting required every 10 years, said he now has more auto plants under his district than any other in the House. There are 15 Ford plants and eight General Motors plants in his district, which includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, the Plymouth community, the southwest section of Livonia and stretches west to Ann Arbor.

On another economic issue, Ford said that economists have said that technically the country "is in a mild recovery," but people here would have stoned me and thrown me out. They (people) just don't believe it."

## Schedule set for parent academy nights

A Parent Academy to provide important information regarding the developmental, social, emotional and intellectual growth of children is being offered once again this year for parents in the Plymouth-Canton Community School District.

From September to April, the Parent Academy will hold free monthly meetings on topics of interest to parents. The meetings feature professionals who share their expertise and answer questions. This is the program's second year of operation.

The program was formed by Bird Elementary School parents Dorian Soper and Sue Nisch, along with principal Claudia Kulnis. According to Soper, the program is designed to help educate parents.

"The purpose of the program is to give parents tools to help them enhance their child's skills for living," Soper said. "The unique aspect of the program is that it was created by parents and is designed for parents. The program concentrates on parental needs."

**CITY OF PLYMOUTH  
SUMMARY OF THE  
MESSAGE ESTABLISHMENT  
AND MASSAGISTS LICENSING  
ORDINANCE**

A Massage Establishment and Massagists Licensing Ordinance has been introduced before the City Commission of the City of Plymouth at their regular meeting on August 17, 1992, a summary of which is set forth hereinafter.

**THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:**

**SECTION 1.** This ordinance shall be known as the MESSAGE ESTABLISHMENT AND MASSAGISTS LICENSING ordinance.

**SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.** Various terms, phrases and words, and their derivations, are defined for the purpose of this ordinance.

**SECTION 3. LICENSE REQUIRED.** No person will practice as a massagist, nor operate a massage establishment, massage school or similar business without first having obtained a license, as provided by this ordinance.

**SECTION 4. REQUIREMENTS AND DUTIES OF OWNERS, OPERATORS, MANAGERS OR PERMITTEES.** It is the responsibility of the owner, operator, manager or permittee to insure that each person employed as a massagist is licensed pursuant to this ordinance.

**SECTION 5. APPLICATION INVESTIGATION FEE.** Each application for a license under this ordinance shall be accompanied by a non-refundable investigation fee.

**SECTION 6. APPLICATION CONTENTS.** Application for a license shall be made, in writing, to the City Clerk, upon a form provided for that purpose. This section further provides for and lists certain information which shall be provided with the application for a massage establishment, massage school or massagist license.

**SECTION 7. LICENSE PROCEDURE.** Upon receipt of an application in proper form the City Clerk shall refer the same to the Wayne County Health Department, the City Engineer, the Fire Chief and the Police Chief, each of whom shall investigate and report, in writing, with a recommendation. The object of such investigation and inspection is to determine whether or not the building and premises are properly located, constructed and equipped for the purpose for which it is desired to license the same, whether or not the applicant is a person of good moral character, and other facts and circumstances which may be required under the provisions of this ordinance and the regulations authorized herein.

**SECTION 8. FACILITIES NECESSARY.** No license to conduct a massage establishment or massage school shall be issued unless an inspection reveals that the establishment complies with certain standards set forth in Section 8.

**SECTION 9. MESSAGE ESTABLISHMENT OPERATION AND HYGIENE.** All massage establishments shall conform with the rules and regulations of the Wayne County Health Department, as well as the minimum hygienic standards set forth in this section.

**SECTION 10. LICENSE FEE.** Sets forth the annual fee for a license, as well as defining the license year.

**SECTION 11. FORM OF LICENSE.** Establishes the form of license for massage establishments and massagists.

**SECTION 12. RENEWAL.** Renewal of licenses shall be applied for at least fifteen (15) days prior to the license expiration and comply with the provisions of this section.

**SECTION 13. DISPLAY OF LICENSE AND ORDINANCE.** All licenses issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be prominently displayed with a copy of this ordinance in a conspicuous place.

**SECTION 14. LICENSE, TRANSFER PROHIBITED.** No license issued under this ordinance shall be transferred or assigned.

**SECTION 15. HOURS OF OPERATION; LIVING OR SLEEPING QUARTERS.** No massage establishment shall be kept open, for any purpose, between the hours of 12:00 A.M. AND 8:00 A.M., nor shall any such establishment be used for living or sleeping quarters.

**SECTION 16. LIST OF EMPLOYEES; MAINTENANCE; DISCLOSURE.** The owners and operators shall maintain a list of the names and addresses of all employees, and provide such list to the Police Chief, quarterly.

**SECTION 17. UNLAWFUL ACTS.** Sets forth specific acts which are prohibited, and deemed grounds for the revocation of licenses, including the performing of massages upon individuals of the opposite sex, and acts performed for primarily sexual gratification.

**SECTION 18. RIGHT OF ENTRY.** Authorizes the Wayne County Health Department, as well as specific City Departments, to enter and examine for the purposes of enforcing this ordinance.

**SECTION 19. RULES AND REGULATIONS.** Empowers specific departments to make such rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 20. CHANGE OF LOCATION.** A change of location of any license may be approved, provided all requirements of the State and local laws and regulations are complied with and the fee paid.

**SECTION 21. EMERGENCY EMPLOYEE.** Defines emergency employees and permits the use of such, if necessary, due to illness or incapacity of a regular licensed employee, provided this ordinance, and specifically this section, are complied with.

**SECTION 22. LICENSES; REFUSAL; REVOCATION; NOTICE.** Any license requested may be refused, or any license issued may be revoked or suspended for the reasons set forth herein, and establishes the procedure to do so.

**SECTION 23. APPEAL; HEARING.** Establishes a procedure for appealing and obtaining a hearing for a refusal, revocation or suspension.

**SECTION 24. APPLICABILITY OF REGULATIONS TO EXISTING BUSINESSES.** Provides that this ordinance is applicable to existing businesses, and provides a grace period for compliance.

**SECTION 25. EXEMPTIONS.** This ordinance shall not apply to the specific occupations enumerated in this section of the ordinance.

**SECTION 26. NUISANCE PER SE.** Provides that any establishment operated contrary to this ordinance is unlawful and a public nuisance, and permits the City to commence civil proceedings for the abatement or termination of said activity, and to seek damages in connection therewith.

**SECTION 27. PENALTIES.** Any person violating, neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or less, or ninety (90) days in jail, or less, or both.

**SECTION 28. SEVERABILITY.** Should any portion of this ordinance be held invalid, for any reason, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this ordinance.

**SECTION 29. REPEAL.** All ordinances, and parts of ordinances, inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 30. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after the final passage thereof.

## Goober survives switch from stage to 'Complete' CD

looks like he's made up of spare parts kicking straw into the audience and backed up by his legion of cowpoke musicians searing mutated punk rock and country into our consciousness.

The joke is funny and we continue to howl.

Somewhat lost in all this has been the band's music, which has never really been held up for dissection. The release of "The Complete Works of Goober & the Peas" obviously changes all that.

Stripped away from all its hokey surroundings, Goober and the Peas' music is served on a musical plate unadorned. It's not bad and the guitar work, especially on the harder edged rock numbers, is brilliant. Yet the release misses the proper ambience at times.

Songs such as "Consider Me," which is sung in twangy reverence to Hank Williams Sr., have a state-like grace about them while others like the usually scorching "Funky Cowboy" seems to lose some kick under the constraint of a studio. The crackle and spunk on the band's previously released EP was a far better showcase for anthems like "Hot Women (Cold Beer)."

The CD version of Goober and the Peas doesn't retain the charm. (Municipal Recordings, P.O. Box 20879, Detroit 48220)

"Death of Cool," Kitchens of Distinction: Sure, the Kitchens of Distinction owe their sound to a number of innovative 1980s bands — Joy Division, the Cure, Cocteau Twins and the Smiths to name a few. "Strange Free World," the band's 1991 debut on A&M, was still a captivating amalgamation of

welled up emotion, cloud bursts of guitar and shimmering textures that hinted at free jazz at times.

So the direction and mood of "Death of Cool" should come as little surprise. Patrick Fitzgerald, Julian Swales and Dan Goodwin tinker somewhat, experimenting with various guitar and vocal tracks and revealing a bit more of themselves through more introspective lyrics.

While retaining the radiant aspects of their music, Kitchens of Distinction come away sounding largely formulaic here. "Death of Cool" resembles the B-side of "Strange Free World."

The soft acoustic strumming and an easy rhythm may introduce a song such as "Mad as Snow." The glimmer of hope for any wholesale deviation is promptly squashed by the predictable crescendo of space-age pyrotechnic guitars, protracted to the point of sounding extraneous. (A&M)

"Stand So True," The Lovekings: This seven-song release is crafted in the best breezy heart-yearning pop intentions, the kind of stuff that made Elvis Costello a musical deity and Marshall Crenshaw a king of cool.

The Lovekings pursue this earnestly, revealing several strengths and betraying a few weaknesses along the way.

The sinuous, rhythm-infested guitar playing and the band's effervescent harmonies are the most endearing qualities of the Lovekings. Lyrically, the outfit also packs a good deal of punch while tackling the basest of emotions of love and unrest.

The frustration here is that these attributes never seem to fully reach fruition in the form of a simple, indelible pop song. "Melinda," featuring some great guitar work, is one of the catchier songs here as is the opening track "Lover's Lane."

The ingredients are there, but not always the right recipe. (The Lovekings, 7427 Middlesex, Dearborn 48126)

## Hanifi tries again with Kiss Me



There's a self-inflicted sense of urgency at the center of Kiss Me Screaming. It comes from its founder, Khalid Hanifi, who has started in on his first musical project since his former band, Map of the World, broke up in 1990. And this new four-man outfit isn't losing track of where its going.

Khalid Hanifi has already watched helplessly as one of his bands sank into the abyss. He's determined not to let happen again.

Such a self-inflicted urgency burns at the center of Kiss Me Screaming, which is Hanifi's first project since his former band Map of the World broke up in 1990. The four-man outfit features a frontal twin-guitar attack and a satchel of aggressive yet melodic songs.

For the singer/guitarist, the group is the musical equivalent to the Phoenix rising from the ashes of Map of the World, a band that carved its own niche in area music circles.

Map of the World, a progressive guitar pop band fronted by Hanifi and his sister Sofia, signed with Atlantic and recorded an LP. Before the album was released, though, the A&R person who signed the band had left the label.

The person replacing him didn't like the album nor the band, according to Khalid. Subsequently, Map of the World was unceremoniously dropped from the label.

"It certainly gave me a renewed distrust for the corporate mentality, not that I didn't have one before," Khalid said. "I saw it and I was a pawn in its grasp, and that's not fun . . . I was bitter for awhile but I learned from it."

When the band broke up, Hanifi was left pondering for nearly two years what went wrong. He has some ideas, but he's more concerned about getting on with his musical career at the moment.

In Kiss Me Screaming, Hanifi joins Map of the World alums drummer Donn Deniston and bassist Tim Delaney along with guitarist Brian Delaney. Hanifi's sister Sofia didn't partake in this outfit ("It never came up," said Khalid, who shared songwriting duties with his sister).

As Tim's brother, Brian Delaney provides a sibling connection in Kiss Me Screaming. The former member of the Faithhealers and Scott Morgan Band also supplies a good deal of the verve as one of the band's two guitarists.

"He's found a unit that is able to come up

with songs," Brian Delaney said about Hanifi. "He comes up with a blue print and we can hammer it out pretty effectively."

Kiss Me Screaming's songs are more personal in scope than those of Map of the World, which intertwined political and social themes into melodic discourse. Khalid is in charge in the songwriting department of this band.

While numbers such as "Mutually Assured Destruction" would appear to fall into the neo-political realm, Khalid puts them more in personal perspective.

"I'm writing for myself as a performer," he said. "I wouldn't say it's more personal, but the person intended to sing the songs is me."

Kiss Me Screaming has performed a spate of the dates since April, including a gig at Lili's Aug. 14. There's talk of a CD being released sometime in six months to a year, but Hanifi is quick to add there's no hurry.

Unlike the past, Hanifi added he'll take more charge in the band's affairs instead of letting someone else do it for them.

"It's difficult," he said. "There's so many people doing this. When you step away for one or two years like I did, nobody remembers what you did and they don't care. . . . You are starting from scratch."

My husband and I have been married for two years. We are both happy and content. We are in our early 20s.

When we were dating, we made love all the time. At least it seemed

that way. We couldn't keep our hands off each other. It was an exciting time for both of us. Since our marriage, our sexual interest has declined. At first it was four times a week and then shrunk. Now we make love once a week.

I read many articles in women's magazines about this topic. They say two-three times a week is average. I am worried. Does my husband and my lack of sexual interest mean there is something wrong with our marriage or with one of us?

Probably because we do not want to be behind the national average, sometimes we try to make love more often. But truly, the joy is not there at those times — it really isn't any fun.

Dear Muriel,

It is not normal to lose your sexual desire at such an early age; an age when many other women are just growing into their sexuality. Often women report that they do not even reach the ability to be fully expressive sexually until they are older and have been in a committed monogamous relationship for some time.

There is no material in your letter to explain what is going wrong in your marriage, but a couple's sexual interaction is revealing of their relationship. So, even though you state you are both "happy and content," the assumption is that there are some underlying problem of which neither of you is aware.

National averages are just that, averages, and cannot be applied to individuals. Your difficulty is not that you do not meet the average, but that you seem to have lost a sexual interest in each other.

Call a counselor who is experienced in sex therapy. If you cannot find one, send me your address and I will send you some names. Normally, through therapy couples change their relationship so that their natural desire will return.

# 'April' will enchant fans of romance

Even by Harlequin standards, "Enchanted April" gets a bit overboard with its romantic intentions. Yet this flapper-era story about an Italian holiday and its effect on four very different women has the kind of passion and beauty that makes it almost work.

It's a rainy, cold London afternoon when Lottie (Josie Lawrence) gets the nerve to approach Rose (Miranda Richardson), a woman she has watched for some time. Lottie has spotted an advertisement in The Times for a small medieval Italian castle smothered in wisteria and sunshine and wants to take her

new friend along to split the month's vacation rental. When the 60 pounds plus house-keeping expenses prove too much for them alone, the women must enlist two additional women — one the wealthy and beautiful heiress Lady Caroline (Polly Walker), the other a crusty old Mrs. Fisher (Joan Plowright).

The obvious incongruity of the group leads to much of the film's comedy. Rose and Lottie arrive later than their housemates, who have quickly snatched the two best bedrooms. Mrs. Fisher takes over the best sitting room as well.

While Rose is easily put off by such rudeness and snobbery, Lottie remains undaunted. She is convinced that the atmosphere of the castle and its grounds will cast a spell on everyone. Broken marriage will be mended again and soon Mrs. Fisher will be inviting the other

women to share the sitting room with her.

And sure enough, Lottie is right. The changes come subtly at first. Mrs. Fisher experiences feelings of restlessness and creativity that she hasn't had since childhood. Lady Caroline soaks up the privacy of the place, where there are no "grabby" men making demands of her.

Lottie and Rose, meanwhile, invite their husbands in the hope that the castle has for them the same heavenly effect.

For many viewers, "Enchanted April" will work similar magic. The scenery is indeed lovely and there are lingering walks through gardens and lazy naps on hammocks. You can almost smell the wisteria when a breeze blows in from the ocean.

Many of the performances are also strong. Miranda Richardson's Rose does indeed look like what her husband calls "a disappointed Ma-

donna." Josie Walker's Lottie is intentionally wackier and New Age, while both women have a way of looking plain or extremely beautiful when the moment calls for it.

Polly Walker, in her film debut, always looks stunning as the bob-haired brunette Lady Caroline. She doesn't have the range to show the complex changes going on inside her so the movie relies on voice-over narration to tell us how she feels.

"Enchanted April" also has a bad habit of bonking an audience on the head with heavy symbolism. There's plenty of philosophical talk about the "inner person" which works better on the printed page than it does on the screen.

Director Mike Newell is best known for "Dances with a Stranger," a dark story of obsessive love set in the 1950s. He has too heavy a hand for such light and breezy romance.

HOUSTON — Many TV-watching Americans will need a civics lesson if E. Spencer Abraham and Guy VanderJagt are to succeed this year. The two Michiganians co-chair the National Republican Congressional Committee, and last week unveiled a list of 100 House seats they plan to make competitive.

"The anti-incumbent wind is not a breeze," said VanderJagt. "It's a hurricane, and I'm living proof that every incumbent is vulnerable." After 26 years in Congress, VanderJagt, once a vice-presidential possibility and convention keynoter in 1980, lost his primary to a first-time candidate.

The problem: Few Americans know that Democrats even control Congress. The trade magazine Editor & Publisher reported a survey showed that only 10 percent of young, TV-watching voters knew it, and only 56 percent of older, newspaper-reading voters were aware.

Abraham said their polls showed only two-thirds knew Democrats

control the House; only 11 percent came close to guessing they had controlled it 38 years; and very few knew "control" meant domination of committees and power to pick witnesses.

"That will be part of our generic advertising," said Tom Cole, their chief staff aide.

Abraham, a former Michigan GOP state chair, and VanderJagt, who as a lame duck plans to put all his time into the "change the Congress" campaign, unveiled their plans to the national press corps last week.

Their message is that Democrats have meant mismanagement, corruption, unbalanced budgets and obstruction of George Bush's programs in education, crime, jobs and movement toward a balanced federal budget.

Nine Michigan candidates are on their list of 100 districts that will be competitive this fall. Local contests:

11th District — Joe Knollenberg

seeking an open seat in the district which includes part of Livonia and Redford Township against Democrat Walter Briggs IV.

18th District — John Pappageorge seeking to unseat 10-year incumbent Democrat Sander Levin.

13th District — state Sen. Bob Geake seeking to unseat 28-year incumbent Democrat Bill Ford in the district which includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, Plymouth, Plymouth and part of Livonia.

9th District — newcomer Megan O'Neill taking on incumbent Democrat Dale Kildee.

Outstate contenders are Philip Ruppe, seeking his old Upper Peninsula seat; Peter Hoekstra, who bested VanderJagt Aug. 4; and state Rep. Keith Muxlow, seeking an open seat in the Thumb area; and Sen. Doug Carl, challenging Democratic whip David Bonior in Macomb County.

Left out were Republican incumbents and those with hopeless races

against such Democrats as John Dingell of Trenton, John Conyers Jr. and Barbara-Rose Collins of Detroit.

Abraham said the list could swell to 150 of the 435 House races. To be eligible, candidates had to win their primaries, raise \$15,000 or more on their own and be rated by other House Republicans as having a chance.

Bach will get \$1,000 seed money, issue research, survey work and candidate training, Abraham said.

Vander Jagt said the \$1,000 checks will be "a signal to PACs that these are serious candidates."

In some races, said Abraham, the amount could grow to \$58,000, the maximum permitted by law.

They refused to predict how many, if any, seats they would win. "It's possible we could lose seats. It's possible we can elect a Republican majority. Jerry Ford predicted we could see 150 to 200 new faces in the House next year, said VanderJagt.

#### TMJ PAIN

TMJ pain refers to discomfort in the jaw joint-anatomically called the Temporomandibular-Joint.

TMJ pain can travel down to the chin or up into the ear. The discomfort may be sharp, aching, intermittent or pulsating. You may have pain only while chewing, or the pain can be severe enough to wake you at night.

The differing features of TMJ pain depend on whether the jaw joint takes the brunt of the strain or if the muscles of chewing that surround the jaw are under the greatest stress.

In most cases the pain comes from a malocclusion of teeth or dentures. Another common source is from unconscious grinding of the teeth as a reaction to tension. These are the reasons why your physician, if he believes you have TMJ pain, will refer you initially to a dentist for evaluation.

However, TMJ discomfort can occur in rheumatoid arthritis, can be part of fibromyalgia, and may arise as a late reaction to a previous fracture or dislocation of the jaw.

Medical treatment may not be satisfactory. The anti-inflammatory drugs used for arthritis do not work well. Most physicians have little experience in TMJ injection and depend on dental colleagues for this procedure. Surgery, while possible, is the subject of controversy.

Fortunately in most cases, time and nature intervene, and the initial distracting discomfort resolves.



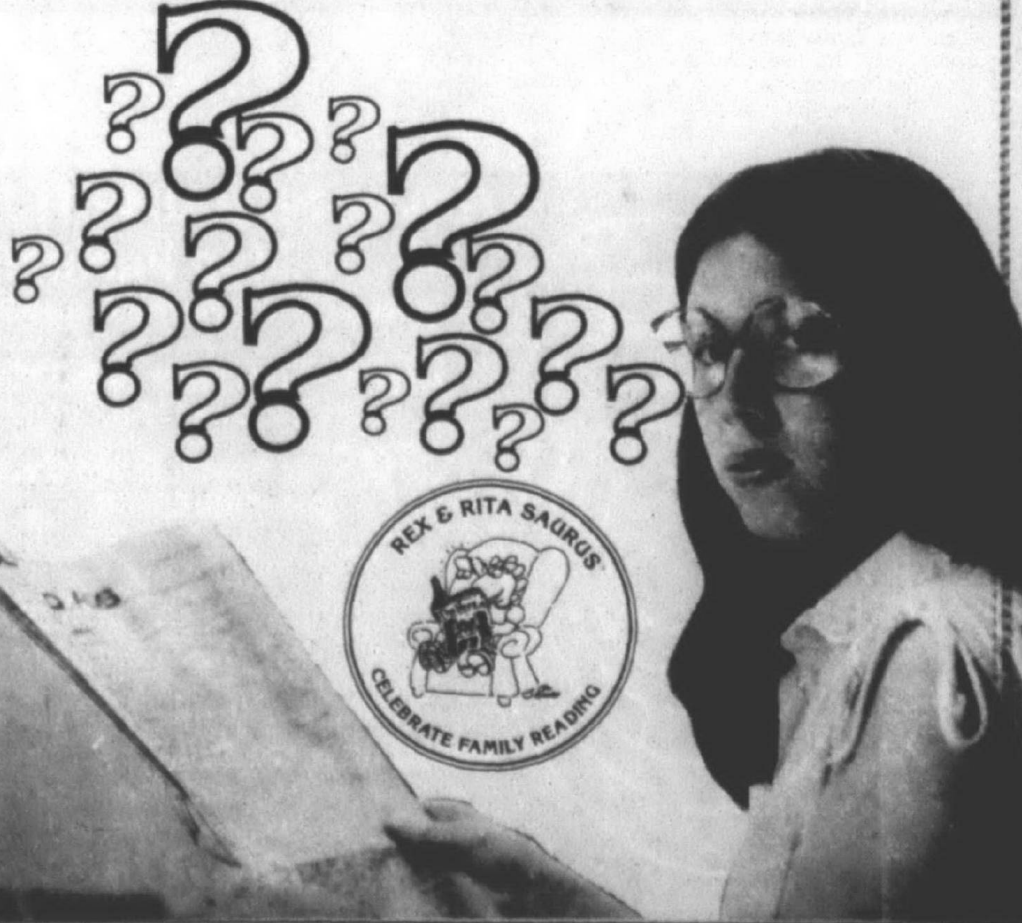

# GOP gives state bigger play at convention

**H**ouston — You asked me, or I might not have written this piece. A member of a Rotary Club audience wanted to know how a Republican National Convention differs from a Democratic conclave. A state Senate GOP staff member asked the same question.

• Michiganians are more prominent at the Astrodome podium — Gov. John Engler, Max Fisher, Detroit Councilman Keith Butler, outgoing Rep. Guy VanderJagt, Mary Fisher, young Michael Flory of Benton Township, Frank Stella, ex-President Gerald Ford. Democrats had no one from Michigan on the podium. Photographer Doug Ashley, at his eighth series of conventions, is working far harder in Houston than in New York.

• The top of the Republican ticket is giving Michigan consideration. The Clinton-Gore ticket didn't put Michigan on its initial bus tour. President Bush will be in Canton Township Tuesday afternoon; Vice President Quayle will be at the GOP state convention Friday evening in Grand Rapids.

• Gov. Engler is being given far more serious attention by the national leadership and the national media and more applause from his delegation than Democratic Gov. James Blanchard ever got in 1984 and 1988. That struck me as extremely odd because Blanchard had had more prominence as a congressman working on the Chrysler bailout and more exposure to the *New York Times* and *Washington Post* than Engler had had as a state legislator.

Already Engler is being gossiped about as national ticket material in a way that Blanchard never was considered. And yet Blanchard had better paper credentials and, in my view, more accomplishments than either Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis or Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton, the last two Democratic presidential nominees.

• Michigan Republicans are hearing a higher level of speakers in their caucus than Michigan Democrats had in theirs. The GOP has heard Quayle, trade negotiator Carla Hills, chairman Michael Boskin of the President's Council of Economic Advisors, and

House whip Newt Gingrich. Democrats heard Sen. Jay Rockefeller of West Virginia and a Nebraska congressman married to a Michigan woman; the name escapes me.

• Republicans are much more tired. They have more organized functions that run later. Their roll call Wednesday ran into the wee hours. They have a 40-minute bus ride from their airport hotel at the extreme north end of town to the Astrodome at the south end, the equivalent of commuting from Brighton or Howell to Detroit on I-96. (Texas roads, however, are in much better shape because of Michigan's pathologi-

cal aversion to raising the fuel tax.) Democrats had a 20-minute ride to the Garden but through heavy traffic.

• Republicans have no place to walk. Democrats had New York City; many were smart enough to take in the live theater.

• Democrats had the joy of seeing their candidate open up a 17-point lead in the polls after their convention; it later topped 30 points. Thursday morning Spencer Abraham, the former GOP state chair rising to national party prominence, said the gap has narrowed to single digits because "This convention has done its job."

• Democrats treat their delegates dreadfully, packing them in like sardines both in caucus and on the convention floor. Any corporation treating its factory workers like that would be hounded instantly by OSHA inspectors. GOP accommodations are more spacious, their delegates more accessible to each other and to reporters.

I respect both parties. They are nine-tenths volunteers who will never get a penny of patronage. They intend to be civic improvers, just like the Garden

Club and Lions. Among big-time columnists, mine is distinctly a minority view.

My dad taught me that. "If you're not a Republican or a Democrat, you're nothing," he said.

Despite the apparent glamor, national conventions are nowhere near as much fun as state conventions.

State conclaves last only a day and a half. Results aren't a foregone conclusion weeks in advance. They actually make decisions, nominating candidates for the Michigan Supreme Court, state Board of Education and university board.

You don't need to beg for credentials to attend next weekend's GOP convention at the Amway Grand in Grand Rapids or the Democratic gathering in the Cobo in Detroit.

Pay attention. You may see a real floor fight or two like the Hollywood movies. Your friends and neighbors who are delegates may actually make a difference.

And that's what's happening in Warrendale these days.

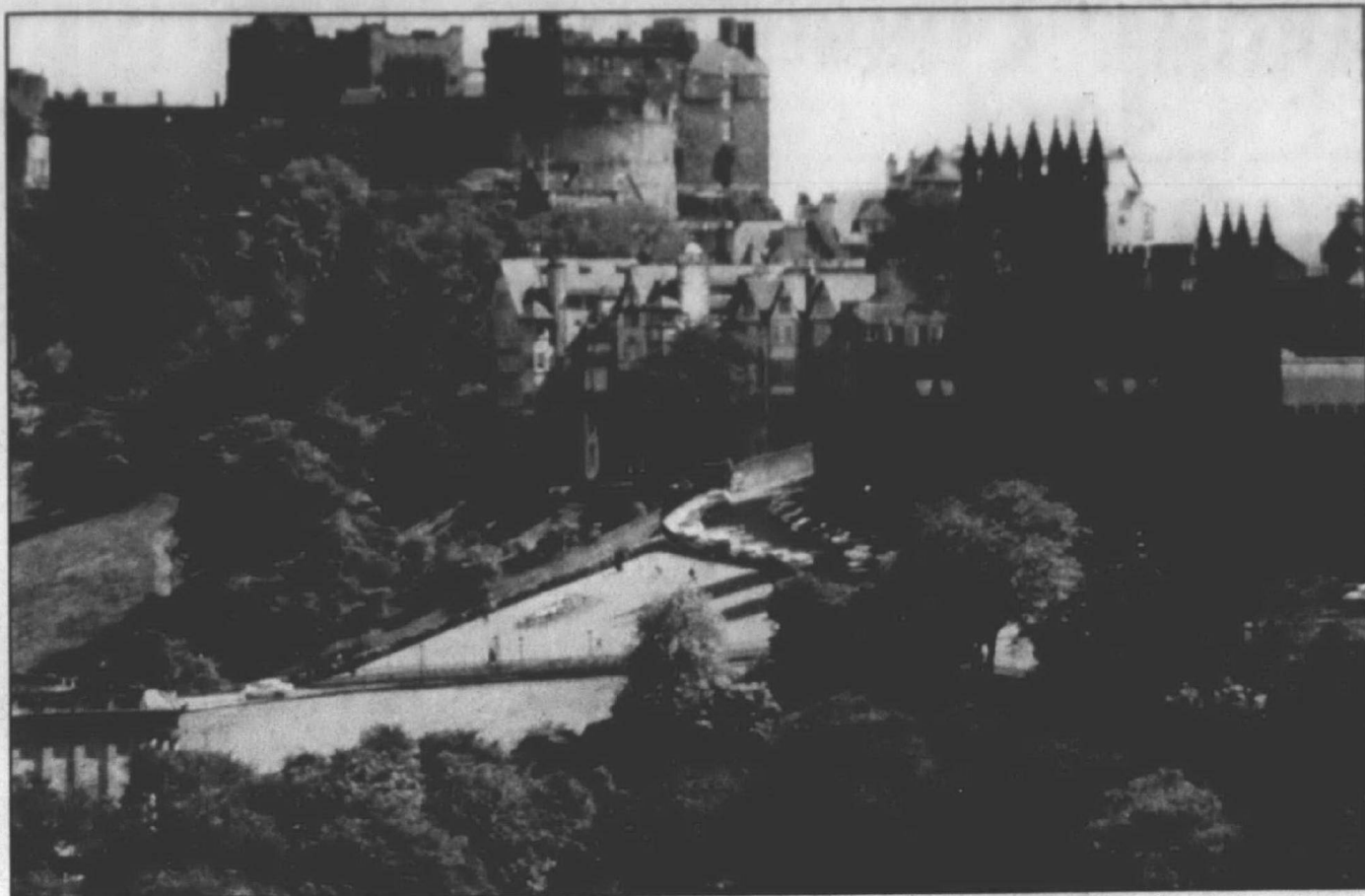

## City's Scot festival spirit

In the mid-18th century, just before the city's Georgian New Town was built, more than 20,000 people lived in Edinburgh's old town.

In the towering stone tenements lining the Royal Mile, the ancient street that slopes from Edinburgh Castle to the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the wealthiest occupied the middle stories so that they did not have too many steps to climb, but could be far enough away from the unsavory streets below.

Today only about 6,000 people live in the Old Town. Every summer, however, the 18th-century crowding is re-created — in a more convivial and salubrious fashion — when Edinburgh throws its arms open to the world for its three-week international festival, this year from Aug. 16 to Sept. 5. The festival attracts hundreds of thousands of people each year.

Like bursts of summer fireworks, the Edinburgh Festival and its wackier cousin, the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, set off explosions of color and sound that illuminate and enliven the cobble, winding streets.

### Events

A myriad of dance, drama, opera, concerts, lectures and art exhibitions is planned for this year's

### Edinburgh tunes bagpipes for international event

#### International Festival.

Rembrandt, Vermeer, Hals and company feature in "Dutch Art and Scotland: A Reflection of Taste" at the National Gallery of Scotland until Oct. 18, while the sculptures of Joan Miro will be shown at the Royal Scottish Academy until Sept. 20. Admission \$6.

Tchaikovsky will figure largely in the festival this year (the centenary of his death is next year).

The Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, conducted by Riccardo Chailly, will perform at Usher Hall at 8 p.m. on Aug. 31 (including works by Haydn and Beethoven) and at 7:30 p.m. on Sept. 1 (Beethoven and Tchaikovsky); tickets \$16 to \$44.

The plays of the Edwardian dramatist Harley Granville-Barker and of the Glaswegian playwright C.P. Taylor, who died in 1981, dominate the festival's drama schedule.

Festival schedules and tickets are available at the festival office (21 Market St., near Waverley Station; 225-5756), open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday and from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday.

A booth in the parking lot of the National Galleries of Scotland on

The Mound will sell some same-day tickets for half price from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. daily.

The 46th Edinburgh Festival Fringe, held during the same period as the International Festival, is bigger than ever: More than 1,100 different shows will be staged by some 8,500 performers from around the world.

The full Fringe program and tickets are available at the Fringe office (180 High St., on the Royal Mile; 226-5138), open daily from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.; tickets from \$1 to \$74.

#### Sightseeing

Most visitors to Edinburgh stroll the Royal Mile. For a detour from the tartan-and-bagpipes trail, however, consider a walk along the Water of Leith, an 18-mile river, most of which snakes through the city.

For a leisurely three-hour meander start at the Scottish National Gallery of Modern Art (Belford Road; 556-8921), open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Saturday and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday; admission free.

The gallery owns works by Picasso, Hackney, Bacon and oth-

ers; the grounds are studded with Henry Moore sculpture. There is also a cafe with an outdoor patio where one can lunch at reasonable prices on homemade soups, quiches and cakes.

A sign behind the museum points the way to the leafy riverside path, which leads to Dean Village, a onetime center of grain-milling. The next stop is St. Bernard's Well, a Doric temple built in 1789 on the site of a mineral spring.

From there stroll to Stockbridge, a former industrial village that now, on St. Stephen Street, is home to some of Edinburgh's most interesting antiques shops.

For refreshment stop at Bert's Bar (2-4 Raeburn Place; 332-6345). A few minutes away is the west gate of the Royal Botanic Garden (no admission charge; 552-7171), a good final destination on a Water of Leith walk.

Stockbridge is on the northern edge of the New Town, a trove of Georgian houses and elegant crescents. Begin any New Town tour at the National Trusts Georgian House at 7 Charlotte Square (225-2160), designed in 1791 by Robert Adam.

The house is beautifully furnished, and there is a 20-minute video on Georgian architecture and the family that once lived in the house. It is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday. April through October. Admission is \$4.80, \$2.40 for children.

## Computer networks take byte out of travel costs

Computers are changing the way travelers decide where they want to go.

Home computer networks such as Prodigy, CompuServe and Delphi give people with a modem and a telephone access to detailed information that once was the exclusive domain of travel agents and other professionals.

Customers can get reports on hotels and motels, ski conditions, the weather, food in Chinese restaurants, political conditions and health advisories — for hundreds of domestic and foreign cities.

Many of the networks feature travel clubs whose subscribers can "talk" with other people in nearby or far-flung places. They can get a feeling for a political situation, a storm that just passed or a low-priced hotel.

The computer networks offer access to travel information as just one part of the service. Subscribers can also access financial reports, games, news stories, reference libraries, sports data and other resources.

And while the number of subscribers is still relatively low, interest remains high.

"I'd say about a quarter of our subscribers use our travel features heavily," says Steve Hein, a spokesperson for Prodigy, which now claims to have 1.5 million subscribers.

Among Prodigy's travel features are weather forecasts for 100 foreign and 250 domestic cities, "best" and "worst" guides for in 12 major cities and restaurant reviews from the Zagat series.

Prodigy's Travel Club is a feature that allows subscribers to communicate with each other. On a recent day some of the "talk" was about Los Angeles and how safe it was to go there in the wake of the devastating riots.

The start-up kit for Prodigy is \$49.95, but it's often sold at a discount price that includes a free month of use.

Thereafter, the monthly charge is \$12.95. That is good for 30 electronic messages per month. Additional messages are 25 cents each.

For further information contact Prodigy Services Co., 445 Hamilton Ave., White Plains, N.Y. 10601 or call (800) PRODIGY.

CompuServe, which has 980,000 members, also has a wide array of travel information, including the Easysabre service.

"Our Travel Forum is very popular," explains Debra Young, a CompuServe spokesperson.

"It's an on-line gathering place. If I'm going to Barbados, for example, I might send out a message asking about hotels and restaurants.

"I could easily get a response from a user in Barbados and even end up meeting that person when I get there. It's a worldwide service that can create computer pen pals."

Users have access to the latest U.S. State Department travel advisories. They can find out whether a visa is needed for a visit to a specific country.

The system also carries Worldspan Travelshopper, formerly known as PARS, the second most popular airline-reservations system.

The software and start-up kit for CompuServe cost \$39.95. Thereafter, users pay \$7.95 a month for the basic service or can elect a pay-as-you-go service and be billed just for on-line time plus a \$2 monthly fee.

"The Peaches are gorgeous this year," said Sharon Ashton of Ashton Orchards in Ortonville. "But the flavor is down a little. On a scale of 1 to 10, I'd say they're an eight or a nine."

If you like to can peaches, expect to spend a little more time preparing them this year. Because of the cool weather the pits are sticking. Ashton recommends canning quarters as opposed to halves.

Not all the farmers are feeling peachy keen. A May frost, hale storm and cool summer hurt the peach crop in some parts of the state. Some of the farmers I

talked to bought peaches from other farmers to sell at their markets.

Ashton has peaches for sale at Ashton Orchards, 3925 Seymour Lake Road, Ortonville, (313) 627-6671.

Juicy Red Haven peaches are available at The Strawberry Patch, 1 mile E. of Milford between Burns & Duck Lake Road, 2375 Wixon Trail, (313) 685-1393, and at Blake's Orchard 7 Cider Mill, 17985 Armada Center Road, three miles north and four miles east of Romeo, (313) 784-5343.

I found a couple of u-pick farms nearby for people who prefer to pick their

own fruit. Blake's Big Apple Orchard, N. Ave at 33 Mile Road, call (313) 784-9710; Brookwood Fruit Farm, north of Romeo on M-53, six miles, right on Bordman, 1/4 mile to apple storage building, (313) 798-8312, and Sylvan Orchard, one mile north of I-94 between Kalmbach Road, (exit 156) and Pierce Road (exit 157), on Cavanaugh Lake Road, (313) 475-1943.

Never buy soft peaches, said Ashton. Look for peaches that are yellow with a red of golden blush background color.

Avoid any that are extra hard or greenish, said Lois Thieleke extension

## Just peachy Fuzzy fruit easy to love

home economist for the Cooperative Extension Service, Oakland County office.

"Picked green peaches will just get soft and wither. Peaches don't become any sweeter after they are picked, but ripening makes mature fruit softer and juicier," said Thieleke.

To ripen peaches, Ashton recommends putting them in a paper bag or open air basket. Close the bag and check it every day. Peaches will ripen evenly in a paper bag.

"Peaches are fragile," said Ashton. "After they're ripe, refrigerate them. They'll last about a week. Buy them as you use them."

Peaches are second to apples in popularity in the United States. Peach season ends about mid September in Michigan. Early apple varieties like Paula Reds are now available at some farms including Blakes and Ashton Orchards.

#### FRESH TOMATO SAUCE AND PASTA

- 2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 1/2 cup onion, minced
- 4 cups (5-6 tomatoes) tomato pulp, chopped coarsely
- 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 imported bay leaf
- 1-2 large cloves garlic, pureed
- 6 fresh basil leaves, chopped salt
- fresh ground black pepper

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Drop the tomatoes in, a few at a time, for 10-15 seconds. Remove, run under cold water, slip off skin. Cut each tomato in half and squeeze out the seeds.   - 2 Tablespoons grated onion
  - 1 1/2 cups grated Parmesan
  - 1/4 cup flour
  - 1/4 teaspoon Italian herbs salt and ground pepper to taste
  - 1/2 cup mozzarella
- Grate unpeeled zucchini into a paper towel and squeeze out moisture. Combine ingredients and mix well. Form into 2-inch diameter pancakes and saute in oil on medi-

um high heat until browned on both sides. Arrange pancakes in a shallow, oven-proof pan and sprinkle lightly with grated mozzarella. Set in upper third of a 350 degree preheated oven. Bake until cheese is melted and lightly browned.

- salt and pepper to taste

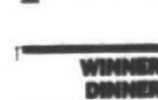
Combine ingredients in large bowl. Stir. Season to taste and refrigerate until served.

## CHEF BRIAN POLCYN'S WILD MUSHROOM TORTE

1/2 cup each of lobster, morel, chanterelles and shitake mushrooms  
3 Tablespoons butter  
1/4 cup shallots  
1 cup dry sherry  
flour  
cream  
salt and pepper  
phyllo dough  
melted butter

Cut mushrooms into uniform size. Melt 3 tablespoons butter and add shallots and mushrooms and cook over medium heat until all

moisture has evaporated. Add sherry and cook until all moisture evaporates. Dust with flour and cook for one minute.

Add just a pinch of cream to thicken and season with salt and pepper to taste. Remove from stove and allow to cool. Lay one sheet of phyllo dough out on a towel. Brush with melted butter. Lay another sheet on top and repeat three times. Lengthwise, place mushrooms on dough and roll up. Seal ends and brush top with melted butter. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 20-30 minutes or until hot in the center and dough is brown. Slice and serve. Serves 10.

1/2 pound raw salmon  
3 egg whites  
1 1/2 cups heavy cream  
salt and pepper to taste

4 cups peeled and sliced ripe peaches  
2/3 cup plus 3 Tablespoons granulated sugar  
1 teaspoon grated lemon zest  
1 Tablespoon fresh lemon juice  
1/4 teaspoon almond extract  
1 1/2 cups unbleached all-purpose flour  
1 Tablespoon baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup vegetable shortening  
1 egg, lightly beaten  
1/4 cup milk

1 cup heavy cream, chilled  
3 to 4 Tablespoons peach brandy or cordial  
Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Butter a 2-quart baking dish. Arrange peaches in baking dish. Sprinkle with 1/2 cup sugar, the lemon zest and juice, and almond extract. Bake for 20 minutes.

While peaches are baking, sift flour, 1 tablespoon of the remaining sugar, the baking powder and salt together into a bowl. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles cornmeal. Combine the beaten egg and milk and mix into dry ingredients until just combined.

Remove peaches from oven and quickly drop dough by large spoonfuls over surface. Sprinkle with remaining 2 tablespoons sugar. Return to the oven for 15 to 20 minutes, until top is firm and golden brown.

Whip cream to soft peaks. Flavor with peach brandy to taste. Serve cobbler warm, accompanied by whipped cream. (Four to six portions).

# Lowly eggplant stars in Italian dish

AP — The lowly eggplant is much loved on the Italian island of Sicily. There it stars in caponata (pronounced kap-oh-NAH-tah), an antipasto that stands as the hallmark dish of the island — and the benchmark of cooking ability. The careful blending of garden-fresh vegetables with vinegar, olives and capers results in a marinated ensemble that is delightfully versatile.

For an appetizer, guests can spoon caponata onto toasted pita wedges or crusty sliced French bread. For a salad, you can arrange it on a bed of torn fresh greens. Or pass it around the table as a relish for grilled chicken or fish.

## CAPONATA

1 medium onion, sliced and separated into rings  
1/4 cup sliced celery  
1 Tablespoon olive oil or salad oil  
1/4 pound unpeeled eggplant, cut into 1/2-inch pieces  
1/2 pound yellow summer squash, cut into 1/2-inch pieces  
1 small tomato, peeled, seeded and chopped  
2 Tablespoons halved pimiento-stuffed olives  
2 Tablespoons red wine vinegar

1 Tablespoon capers, rinsed and drained  
1 Tablespoon raisins (optional)  
1 teaspoon sugar  
1 tablespoon pine nuts or slivered almonds (optional)  
Toasted pita bread triangles and/or French bread slices (optional)

In a large skillet cook onion and celery in hot oil until tender. Add eggplant, squash, tomato, olives, vinegar, capers, raisins (if desired) and sugar; stir to combine. Simmer, covered, for 8 to 10 minutes or until eggplant and squash are tender. Simmer, uncovered, for 5 to 10 minutes more or until most of the liq-

uid has evaporated. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Cool slightly.

Add nuts, if desired. Cool and serve at room temperature or cover and chill overnight. Let stand at room temperature before serving. To serve as an appetizer, spoon the mixture onto pita triangles and/or French bread slices. Makes about 3 1/2 cups (8 to 10 appetizer servings).

about \$5, contain everything you need to make a novelty birthday cake — mix, frosting, and reusable pan. Some of the choices are Garfield the cat, Miss Piggy, and Kermit the frog.

Astro low-fat yogurt is packaged with a stir-in granola topping. Heinz, well known for ketchup and vinegar, is introducing a vinegar cleaning solution in a spray bottle. Comet Cleanser is also introducing a new cleaning product in a spray bottle. Refills are available for both.

If you're a big kid and love Gummy Bears, but are embarrassed to

admit it, try the new Gummy Chevy's and Chevy Trucks. Another popular item at the show was the Crystal Pepsi, a clear cola.

Foodland Distributors and participating affiliated supermarkets are teaming with local schools to help supply books, computer equipment, athletic equipment and other materials.

Here's a tip for canning tomatoes from Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service. The acidity level of varieties of tomatoes may be too low to assure a safe canned product. Therefore the

USDA recommends adding 2 tablespoons bottled lemon juice or one-half citric acid to each quart of crushed, whole, halved or juiced tomatoes. Add directly to jars before filling them with tomatoes.

For pints use one Tablespoon bottled lemon juice or one-quarter teaspoon citric acid.

Do not forget to process all tomatoes according to the latest USDA recommendations. The Ball Blue Book 32nd has the latest recommendations and can be purchased at stores carrying canning supplies.

Betty Crocker tip of the week: When washing jars for canning and freezing fruits and vegetables, use nonabrasive sponges and cleaners so that the glass remains smooth and undamaged.

## Get on a roll with pastry dough

AP — Tender, flaky pastry makes a perfect partner to any pie filling. Yet, the truth be known, even the best pie crust makers can run into a snag now and then. Fortunately, these problems are easily fixed, with a few tips from our test kitchen.

To make crumbly pastry easier to roll: Add more water, 1 teaspoon at a time. Toss the flour mixture and water together a few more times or just until evenly moistened.

To prevent tough pastry: Use a pastry blender to cut in the shortening or lard until well mixed. All of the mixture should resemble small peas. Use as little cold water as possible to moisten the flour mixture. Toss the flour mixture and water only until all of the flour mixture is moistened. Use less flour when rolling out the pastry.

To keep the crust from shrinking away from the sides: Roll the pastry to an even thickness. Mix in water only until evenly moistened. Don't stretch the pastry when transferring it to the pie plate.

To prevent the bottom crust from becoming soggy: Use a dull metal or glass pie plate, not a shiny metal pan that reflects heat. Patch any cracks in the pastry with a scrap of the pastry before adding the filling. Be sure the oven temperature is accurate. If the temperature is too low, the bottom crust will not bake quickly enough to seal out the moisture of the filling.

To keep the top crust from getting soggy: Make several cuts in the top before baking to allow the steam to escape.

To prevent the pastry from blistering excessively: Lightly press

a single-crust pastry into the pie plate so there are no air pockets underneath. Prick it with a fork. Make several cuts in the top crust.

To keep the crust from over-browning: Cover the edge of the unbaked pie with a 12-inch square of foil at the beginning of baking. Fold the foil in quarters and cut a quarter-circle off the folded corner (about 3 inches from the tip). Unfold the piece of foil and place it over the pie, slightly molding the foil over the edge. Remove the foil about halfway through the baking time.

To prevent the pie from bubbling over: Add less filling to the pie shell. Place a pizza pan or baking sheet under a double-crust fruit pie to catch any filling that does bubble over.

## Tips make kitchen chores easier

Here's a couple of handy tips. To keep fruits and vegetables fresher longer in your refrigerator, line the vegetable bin with paper towels or dry sponges to absorb excess moisture.

Corn silk can be removed more

easily with the aid of a damp toothbrush.

Hard boiled eggs can be easier to peel if you plunge them into cold water, crack the shell and then roll the egg lightly between the palms of your hands.

## Two managers receive praise

John Moraitis, the manager of Little Caesars, deserves some credit after he said Walter's Appliance "could win it" prior to the All-American Amateur Baseball Association 20-and-under tournament in Johnstown, Pa.

Many thought John was smoking those funny cigarettes, but he turned out to be a prophet.

Walter's, if you didn't know, went all the way to the finals before losing to New Orleans 9-6 in the title game. It was the best showing ever by a team from the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League.

Moraitis, whose club won the LCBL regular season title before being ousted in the playoffs, liked Walter's hitting lineup.

## Rocks ready to roll in soccer

Plymouth Salem appears to have a quality soccer team once again, one capable of challenging for the Western Lakes Activities Association title as usual.

Opponents should not underestimate the Plymouth Salem boys soccer team because of the young players in its starting lineup.

The Rocks, always among the best Observerland teams, will start four sophomores — an unusually high number for them, said veteran coach Ken Johnson.

"The level of skill doesn't drop off," he said. "We didn't just go with the young guys because we had to."

"The sophomores we're starting play year round at a high level. We have a lot of depth; it's a well-rounded team."

Salem lost five starters (eight players) from another typically fine team that was 14-5-2 and ranked fifth in Class A.

The Rocks, who were fourth in the rugged Western Lakes Activities Association, upset Livonia Churchill in the district final but lost 2-1 to eventual state champion Livonia Stevenson in the regional when Travis Roy converted a penalty kick with 40 seconds left in the second overtime.

Salem returns nine players, including all-stater Tom Baker, and has added nine new faces to its roster. Johnson expects the Rocks to challenge for the WLAA title and receive another state ranking.

"We have a lot of new players, but all of them have talent," he said. "I won't make any promises, but we'll give it a good shot."

The Rocks lost their top scorer in John Truskowski, who had 17 goals and 21 assists while floating between half-back and forward positions. Salem, which alternates between a 4-4-2 and 4-3-3 alignment, also is minus Rich Andrusiak from the front line.

Senior Joe Perron, the third-leading scorer with 12 goals and five assists,

does return up front and will be joined by sophomore Mark MacInnis, who had some varsity experience last year.

"(Perron) is looking good and playing like a senior," Johnson said. "I expect he'll be a leader up front, and MacInnis is mature for a sophomore."

Baker, the No. 2 scorer last year with 12 goals and 10 assists, anchors the midfield and is teamed with senior Ryan Phipps and sophomores Mike Kley and Scott Buczek, a natural left-footer who will play the wing on that side.

The Rocks also lost halfbacks Eric Stemmer and Brian Kirby to graduation while senior Brian Spuck, a member of the Vardar championship team along with Baker, moves to defense.

"Baker is a good leader in the middle," Johnson said. "He's a good tackler and defender when we need him, and he can push through the middle, too."

"Baker will be right in the thick of (the offense) with his hard shot. Each one can bust through and help the forwards. I can see five or six with 10 goals and the offense being spread around."

Spuck, who will play stopper, joins returning starters and senior fullbacks Chris Saline and Jeff Kley on defense. Junior Brad Jaskolski becomes the sweeper.

Kley and Saline played on the under-17 Canton Juventus state championship team along with Perron and Phipps.

The Rocks, however, will miss All-Observer defender Matt Lee, who was a fixture on defense for several years.

## Heaton anchors line for Spartans

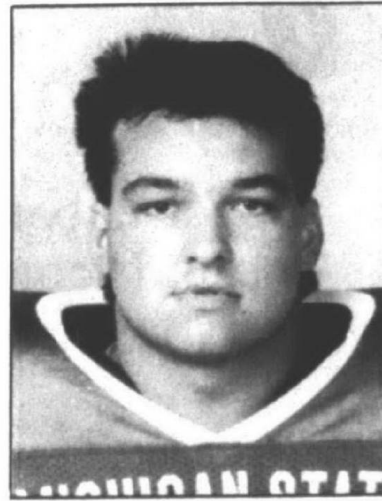
It wasn't supposed to happen like that.

Michigan State's football team had established itself. The losing seasons were in the past, and were supposed to remain there. The Spartans had posted six winning records in a row and were coming off a Big Ten co-championship, their second title in four years.

With the number of player losses from that title team, another Big Ten crown wasn't expected in 1991. But MSU would still get its seven or eight wins and a fifth-straight bowl berth, right?

Wrong. The Spartans lost their first five games en route to a 3-8 season, including home-field defeats to Central Michigan, Rutgers and Michigan. They got beat by Northwestern, too.

Hardly a memorable campaign. With an unproven quarterback (the job went to UCLA transfer Bret Johnson at first, but Jim Miller took over in game No. 4) and a mostly inexperienced line, the offense sputtered. MSU scored just 20



points in its first four games.

Toby Heaton suffered through all of it. The Redford Catholic Central grad from Plymouth started all 11 games; he was one of the two offensive line starters returning from the 1990 championship team, but he was in a different position, at left guard. Heaton had played

there his first year, then moved to tackle as a sophomore.

"We had a lot of inexperience last year — a lot," said the 6-foot-6, 283-pound senior.

This season's team should return to its winning ways. Miller is entrenched at quarterback and the line has plenty

of experience, led by Heaton, an academic all-Big Ten selection for three-straight years and honorable mention all-conference player last year.

As Heaton noted, experience is a must for a unit that has to work together to succeed. "If there's one mental breakdown, one miscommunication, one technique error on a play, a linebacker can bust through and it can be a two-yard loss," said Heaton.

Offensive linemen, it is often said, don't get noticed unless they fail. Since MSU's line struggled throughout '91, Heaton had to share in the frustrations.

## Shamrocks powerful as usual in football

Redford Catholic Central's football schedule includes an entree from Canada: Windsor Brennan Catholic.

Because of a winning reputation, CC always has trouble filling its non-league schedule, but coach Tom Mach is excited about facing a team from across the Detroit River. Canadian football allows only three downs instead of four so Mach has a suggestion for the Sept. 12 meeting against Brennan.

"They get three downs, since that's what they're used to, and we get four," joked Mach.

CC doesn't play Detroit Public School League power Martin Luther King but the Shamrocks meet a pair of Toledo schools — St. John's and St. Francis — and Detroit St. Martin DePorres.

"Check the schedule the last 15 years and who's played the toughest schedule in the state? We have," Mach said.

### A return appearance?

The Shamrocks finished 11-2 but failed in their bid to win two straight Class AA championships, losing to Saginaw Arthur Hill 13-12 in last year's final at the Pontiac Silverdome.

"I've got the film on the shelf," Mach said. "I've never looked at it and probably never will."

CC's chances of returning to the state final, as always, will rely on a big offensive line (that averages 234 pounds) and a rugged defense. The Shamrocks lost several two-way starters to graduation, including speedster Frank Yoakam and backs Dan Gusoff, Jeff Tibaldi, Brett Walter and Matt Roney.

But the Shamrocks return nine players who bench press at least 300 pounds and one of the strongest players is senior quarterback Chris Barbara. The lefty completed 35 of 80 passes for 613 yards, threw six interceptions and three touchdowns.

"Before we started practice, the three Joes (Joe

Suhajda, Joe Herman and Joe Lopez) got the team together and talked about last year but we decided that's not going to be our focus," said Barbara, who bench presses 355 pounds. "That's over and done with. I'm not worried about stats, I just want to prove to myself that I can be a better quarterback."

Barbara won't have a guy like Yoakam to throw to, but he has a capable backfield. Senior Jason Krueger (5-11, 185) played some at fullback and will be No. 1 this fall. The tailback position will be filled by junior Fred Taylor (5-9, 160), senior John Raasch (5-8, 200) and senior Jon Wolfe (5-9, 175).

The leading receiver candidates are seniors Ken Rys, Brady Pankow and Chris O'Keefe, none of whom caught a pass in 1991. Barbara's experience will be key, according to Mach.

"His leadership, control of the kids and his ability to think on his feet are good," Mach said.

# Exercise won't cause arthritis

I am 56, a runner and concerned with arthritis in my future. I don't have any problems yet. Will running promote a problem with arthritis?

Exercise in all forms have been proven good for arthritis. Physi-

cians say that a runner's chance of developing arthritis is the same as in sedentary people. Because of the amount of runners out west, the University of California (San Francisco) and Stanford University have studied the situation.

They say exercise is good for the joints, even the pounding from years of running doesn't increase arthritis risk. Running doesn't even increase the rate of knee deterioration in runners who have arthritis already.

As we know, arthritis causes a narrowing of the space between bones as cartilage in joints break down. Bone spurs develop in response to inflammation, and hardening and thickening of fibrous tissue occurs.

If a person develops arthritis in their feet, knees, or hips, regular

exercise will keep joints flexible and muscles strong enough to relieve some stress on joints. Strengthening your running muscles, therefore, will help if you develop any problems caused by arthritis.

You should be aware as long as running doesn't increase the pain in joints, there is no firm evidence that it will cause additional damage.

If you have been running for years and feel good and strong, I wouldn't worry. Are you concerned because of genetic predisposition? Do your parents have arthritis?

If so, what age did they detect the problem? If that is your concern, it is rightfully so.

Be aware you won't escalate arthritis by running. Try not to worry before you have to. There is always plenty of time for that.

# Coleman billed as star wide receiver

Funny, but George Perles has always — and probably always will — been known as a grind-it-out kind of football coach.

The running game suits his style. Pound it at your opponent and see who's toughest.

But since Perles has been coaching Michigan State, he has sent three top-notch receivers into the pros — in order, Mark Ingram (with the New York Giants), Andre Rison (Atlanta Falcons) and Courtney Hawkins (Tampa Bay Buccaneers).

Hawkins completed his reign as the No. 1 Spartan receiving threat last season, catching 47 passes. The question now is, who's next in line?

Perles believes it will be Mill Coleman. "He's very similar to Ingram and Hawkins," the MSU coach said. "I've seen enough to know that he'll go on to play professional football."

High praise indeed, and in one way surprising. Not that Coleman is the recipient; since his freshman year playing high school football at Albion to the two Class B titles he later guided Farmington Harrison to, Coleman has proven himself to be an exceptional talent.

But at quarterback, not receiver.

And yet, it now seems his future is as a pass catcher, not thrower. Playing split end last year, Coleman caught 16 passes (tied for third on the team) for 156 yards and one touchdown. He also rushed 17 times for 76 yards and, yes, he passed the ball, too — four times, completing two for 28 yards.

Coleman's ability was utilized on kick returns as well (7.0 on punts, 14.9 on kicks) and will be again this year. Indeed, the Coleman qualities the MSU coaching staff likes best are his versatility and intelligence. "He's got better hands than we

thought, and he's smart," said Perles.

Added offensive coordinator Morris Watta: "The most foolish thing you can do is keep him off the field. Mill is an exceptional person. He's a leader, he's got a charisma about him."

"We're going to use all his talents. Anytime he gets his hands on the ball and he's behind the line of scrimmage, he's a double-threat. Yes, we will use him at quarterback in special situations, particularly at the goal line where we can utilize his speed."

Coleman's reaction to all this is, typically, to downplay it. "It's always good to be mentioned," he said. "Whatever they want me to do, I'll be happy to do it. I'll do whatever I can to help the team."

The Spartans will ask for a lot from a player who's small by college standards (just 5-foot-10 and 170 pounds) and lacking experience

(sophomore eligibility).

Now that he's been at wide receiver — he'll switch to flanker this season — for a year, how does he feel? "I feel a lot more comfortable," Coleman answered. "I've been working on it all summer."

And how about part-time duty at quarterback? "I'll be happy to do that," he replied.

The one thing Coleman wants no part of is another outcome like last year's. The Spartans suffered through a 3-8 campaign, their worst since Perles took control.

"It was a new experience," said Coleman, who suffered through more defeats in one season than in his three years quarterbacking Harrison. "But you've got to deal with the winning, and you've got to deal with the losing."

If Coleman can come close to living up to the lavish praise heaped upon him, his team won't have to worry about the latter.

Hodgkin's Disease, an ailment that can cause the enlargement of several organs.

Graham missed spring drills, lost 20 pounds and ended up having his spleen removed. Still, he's slated to battle sophomore Mark Birchmeier for the starting position.

Graham — who's back up to 291 pounds and said he "didn't have any problem putting (the weight)

back on" — insists he feels no after-effects. "I lost some strength, and I still don't have all that back," he said. "But I feel fine."

And he never gave any thought to quitting. Quite the contrary.

"I want to play more now," Graham said. "For a while there I wasn't sure I'd get a chance. I saw the doctor last week and he took some chest x-rays and said I was OK."

Then he added, "I don't really care what they say. Unless they tell me I'm going to die, I'm going to play."

That kind of attitude, combined with his experience (like Heaton, Graham is a fifth-year senior), are reasons why MSU expects to rebound this season.

"I've been practicing. I've had enough practice — four years of it," said Graham. "I just want to stay

away from injuries."

Bowl games and conference titles are not topics of conversation this year, which could be a benefit. As Heaton noted: "If everyone tries their hardest and we win a few football games, then whatever happens, happens."

Whatever does happen, both Heaton and Graham hope this year is more memorable than last year was.

# Madonna coach wants flag back

# Morrison's goal to play full season

Steve Morrison hopes everything goes right for him this fall.

And it's not just because that, in the past when things seemed to be going so right, something went wrong. The thing is that when bad stuff happens, it happens on his left.

His left leg, to be precise.

Morrison is entering his third season as an inside linebacker for the University of Michigan. If the Birmingham Brother Rice product can get through the 12-game campaign (bowl game included), it'll be a first.

Morrison got into three games as a true freshman — ironically, because five others listed ahead of him on the depth chart were injured. He made six tackles against Michigan State, but missed the final seven games with an injured left calf.

Still, he won a starting position in spring drills prior to the 1991 season. He got off to a strong start,

twice recording 11 tackles in a game (in wins over Boston College and Iowa) and intercepting three passes.

Then it happened again.

At Michigan State, Morrison gave chase on a screen pass. "The turf was wet," he recalled during Friday's media day in Ann Arbor, "and I took a helmet on my knee."

That the helmet belonged to a U-M teammate didn't matter; it broke his leg. His left leg, of course.

Is it just coincidence? If so, three times should be enough. In his junior year at Brother Rice, Morrison injured his left knee in the third game and missed the remainder of the season.

Such misfortune is frustrating. "It is, especially when the team is at an away game and you're sitting at home watching," Morrison said. "You don't feel like you're a part of the team."

So how did he react? "It got me really fired up to work out and get back in there," Morrison said. At least he got the chance to prove he was a fast healer — Morrison

missed just four weeks last season, returning for the final two Big Ten games and the Rose Bowl against Washington.

Of course, when you're playing for the Wolverines you're rarely guaranteed a position. "We've got so much quality depth here, you've got to work your butt off to get in, then if you get hurt and miss a week you might not get back in," Morrison said.

U-M coaches are hoping to get a full season out of Morrison this year. When he was in the lineup last year, he made things happen; he intercepted his fourth pass of the season against Washington, tying him for top honors on the team.

"The thing Steve does the best is he sees the whole field," said inside linebacker coach Jim Herrmann. "That's something you can't coach."

Morrison's strategy for dealing with his past problems is direct: Put them behind you and work even harder. One bright note: The injury his freshman year came early

enough to allow him to redshirt. Now a junior, Morrison has sophomore eligibility.

"The injuries he's had weren't because he wasn't in shape," Herrmann said. "But I think, the way he's trained this summer . . . he's never worked out that hard. Hopefully, his bad luck has ended."

His weight is up 10 pounds, to 245, and he can still run a 4.9 40-yard dash. He has shown the ability, according to Herrmann, perhaps to play professionally.

But first, he has to stay healthy. "I try not to think about getting injured," Morrison said. "It can be psychological."

Mental anguish is something Morrison would rather deal with.

Notes: Morrison is one of four Brother Rice graduates on Michigan's roster. The others: Gannon Dudlar, a 6-foot-4, 265-pound junior defensive tackle; Paul Manning, a 6-4, 257-pound senior offensive lineman; and Marc Milia, a 6-3, 268-pound junior offensive lineman.

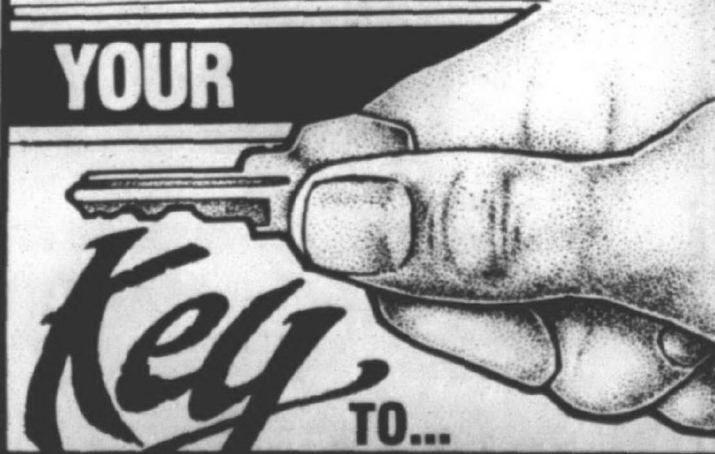

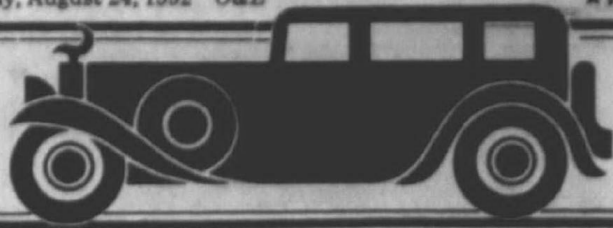

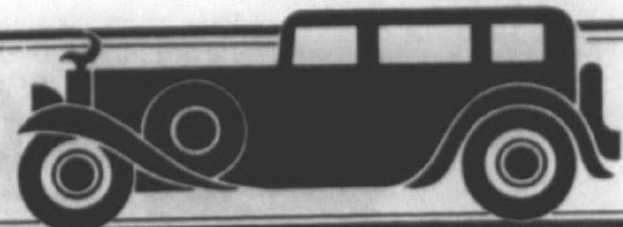

# Slouching toward wisdom: 'Middle Ages' finds mark

Producer Stan Rogow calls the 1990s "the '60s without drugs." Pointing to political changes at home and abroad and the expectation of more change to come, Rogow observes, "it's not unlike something that was happening in the late '60s, only now it's happening for a lot more people."

It was that idea and a conversation Rogow had with former NBC entertainment chief (now head of Paramount studios) Brandon Tartikoff that led him to develop *Middle Ages*, an ensemble drama debuting Monday, Aug. 31, on CBS. The series moves to a Thursday time slot on Sept. 3.

The producer of *Shannon's Deal*, *Playing for Time* and *The Clan on the Cave Bear*, Rogow, like Tartikoff, is a man in his 40s. When Tartikoff, who midwived hits from *Hill Street Blues* to *Fresh Prince*,

suggested a series about "guys our age," Rogow took umbrage.

"I said, 'I'm not interested in guys our age. Look at the way I dress, look at what I do for a living. It's not interesting to me.'"

In fact, *Middle Ages* includes people of all ages who are trying to keep their dreams from being buried in the debris of daily life. Peter Riegert (*Local hero*) and William Russ (*Wiseguy*) play lifelong buddies who've arrived at mid-life and are assessing their options.

Riegert, a family man and traveling electronics wholesaler, is suddenly haunted by his memories of a beautiful young woman who took drugs and jumped off a building 20 years earlier. Laughing, the vision tells him she can fly and so can he. But can he? While he is still wondering, the real woman (Ashley Crow) in his life reminds him that her exis-

tence, too, is something less than a fairy tale.

Russ is more impulsive, and, seeing the sexy 20-year-old lead singer he always wanted for his rock 'n' roll band, decides to quit his desk job, return to music and ask the young woman to marry him.

There's humor in *Middle Ages*, and hope, but only about as many car chases, shootouts, bikini-clad women and sunny days as there are in an ordinary life. Set in Chicago, the show captures both the energy and the dinginess of that great, sprawling city.

James Gammon co-stars as Riegert's single, 60-ish father-in-law, Dave, who is laid off by the same firm that employs Riegert. Dave survives a dark night of the soul to discover that he still has choices before him. He decides he'll drive a cab.

**Wartime art collecting; kids gone wrong**

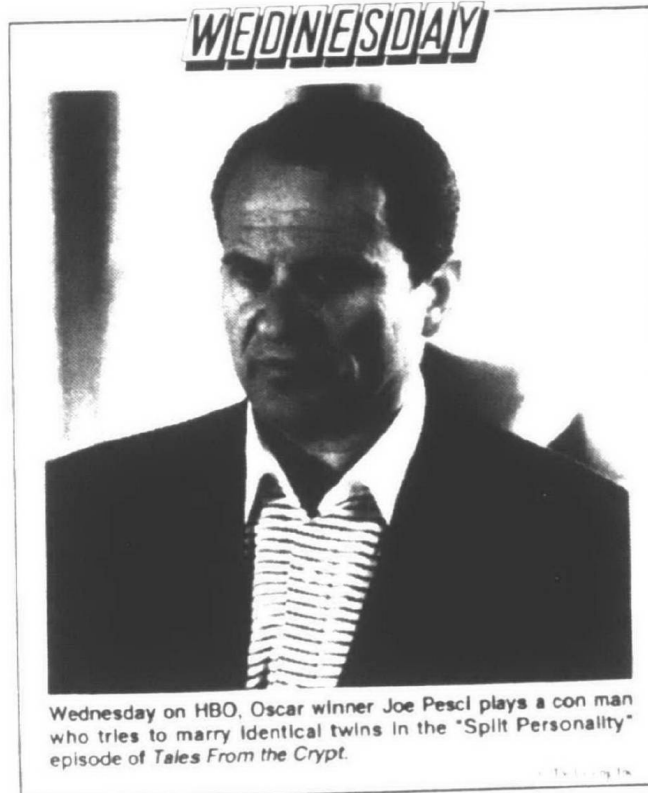

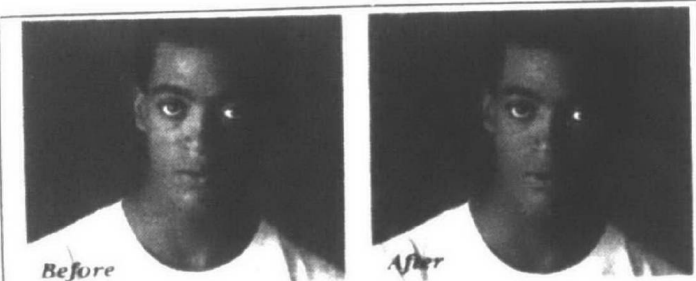

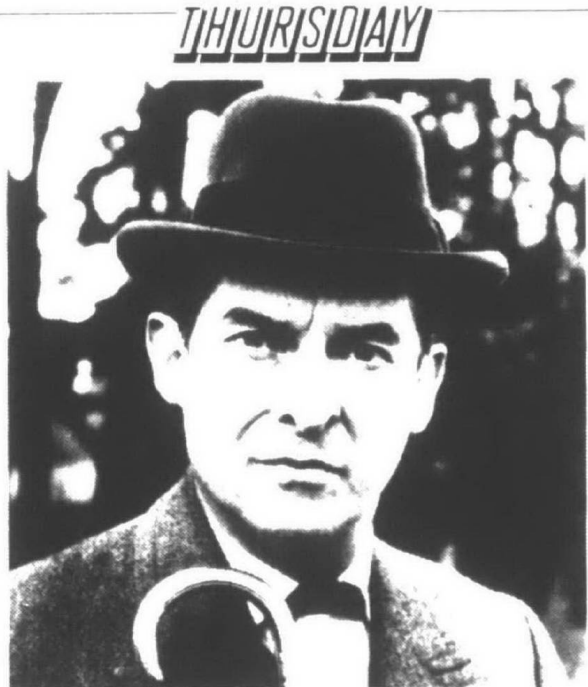

## ABC, ESPN cover Little League series

ESPN kicks off coverage of the 46th annual Little League World Series from Williamsport, Pa., on Thursday, Aug. 27, presenting both the foreign and U.S. championship games. On Saturday, Aug. 29, the respective winners meet on ABC's *Wide World of Sports* to determine this year's champion. ABC introduces the game with a half-hour pregame show for the first time in its 30 years covering the Series.

Julie Moran, an ABC announcer covering the final game with colleagues Jim Palmer and Brent Musburger, says the spirit of the competition is what makes the event special.

"It has none of the commercialization and corporate sponsorship of pro sports," says Moran. "It's sport being played for the enjoyment of sport and its just pure. It's like going back to the basics of why people play sports and what you get out of them."

The Series is the biggest event of the year in Williamsport, the only city in which the championships have ever been played, according to Bob Roiley of the *Williamsport Sun Gazette*.

"It brings millions of dollars to the city and more than doubles our population on the day of the final game," Roiley says. "People here plan year-round for the week-long event, and thousands of people volunteer each year to help out in any way they can."

## Producer promises brighter 'Days'

**Dear Candace:** I am a big fan of *Days of Our Lives*, and so far it has been a terrific summer on the show. Unfortunately, the source of these misguided story lines is the producers and writers, and *Days*, along with several other daytime shows this year, has gone through a fair number of both.

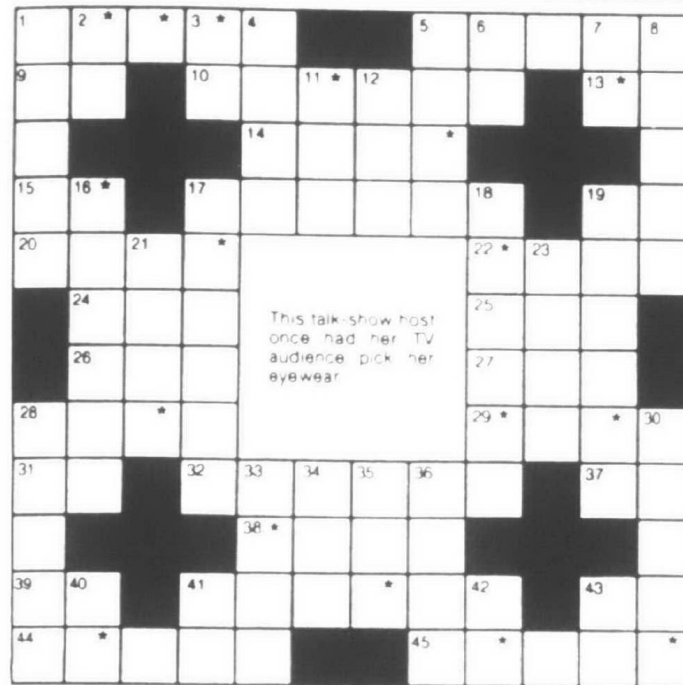

Unlike Monty, Riche has brought back the fun and intrigue that have made *GH* so popular.

Executive Producer Ken Corday of *Days* is aware of the problems his show has suffered and has promised a return to the core of the show: the Hortons and the Bradys. I expect when Jennifer returns from maternity leave, the story line and characters of Jack and Jennifer will be much more mature.

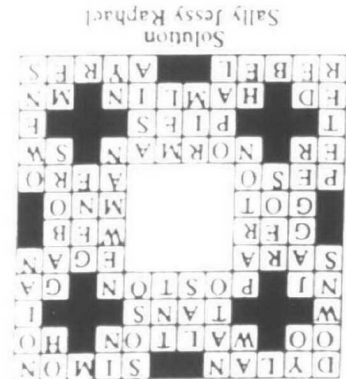

## 'Screenworks' makes impressive debut

Movies love dreamers. Perhaps because the industry was founded by men and women who staked their futures to a dicey enterprise, filmmakers seem drawn to stories of individuals who risk everything to realize the marvelous, magical (and, at times, maniacal) things they see in their heads.

Such a tale comes to the screen in *The Water Engine*, the debut presentation of TNT's *Screenworks* series. Produced in association with Steven Spielberg's Amblin Entertainment, *Screenworks* seeks to produce new material by America's leading playwrights. *The Water Engine* was scripted by Pulitzer Prize winner David Mamet.

William H. Macy stars as Charles Lang, a Chicago machinist who spends his evenings in a secret lab building his dream: an eight-horsepower engine that runs on water. When Charles tries to patent his amazing invention, his attorney (John Mahoney) enlists the involvement of wealthy businessman Lawrence Oberman, played by Joe Mantegna. Charles balks at the outright sale of his engine design and soon finds himself running from Oberman's thugs, ordered to nab the blueprints at any cost.

Macy carries the film with his intense portrayal of the naive inventor. Patti LuPone is sympathetic as Charles' blind sister Rita, and Mantegna is an icy menace as the powerful Oberman. Besides Mahoney, the fine supporting cast includes Treat Williams and Charles Durning.
