## Rape heightens students' fears



The rape of a Plymouth girl on her way to high school has sent shivers through the community. Parents and school officials are dealing with the aftermath of the assault. The school district has psychologists and social workers to help students deal with crises.

In the aftermath of Wednesday's rape of a Plymouth Canton High School junior, students are worried about their safety and that of their classmates.

The 16-year-old was walking to her bus stop in the dark at about 6:45 a.m. when the incident occurred, ac-

ording to Plymouth Township police.

The teenager was approached by a lone white male, armed with a knife, who grabbed her and forcibly took her to a wooded area where she was assaulted.

The victim was taken to St. Mary Hospital.

Kara Colangelo, a junior at Plym-

outh Salem High School, heard about the crime from her teacher. "I feel bad, and I'm afraid to go out now," said Colangelo.

"I'm worried about people who walk to school," said Salem junior Michelle Carter. "My mom said she wonders how parents can let kids walk to school."

Becky Rader, also a Salem junior, said some bus drivers have posted a police composite drawing of the suspect on their buses.

Richard Egli, community relations director for the district, said students are encouraged to be aware as they

walk to school.

"We are alerting students to be very aware, and to travel in groups of two or more where possible. We're letting them know that they need to have that awareness as they're walking anywhere," he said. "This can happen anywhere."

"We're looking at the middle schools and the elementary schools in that area, alerting students to be aware, and also to report anything that's suspicious," added Egli. Students in the area off Ann Arbor Trail

## His complaints help turn crossing into smooth ride

If it wasn't for Paul Nastoff, that new smooth rubber railroad crossing on Main Street wouldn't be there.

Of course, the \$250,000 in federal money and \$45,000 in city money — along with city engineer Ken West's work with state, federal and railroad officials — had a little something to do with it.

But it was Nastoff, a retired teacher, who over five years hounded city officials at city commission meetings about the bumpy state of the crossing.

West, directed by the city commission, kept tabs on federal officials and CSX Transportation Inc. to make sure the road work got done, even when they wanted to put it off until next spring.

Installation of new crossing signals and other finishing touches, all part of the project, is scheduled for spring.

"It's really something to be grate-

ful for, to live in this town," Nastoff told city commissioners at their Dec. 7 meeting, after completion of the work.

"Ken West has done a lot of letter-writing, and I'm thankful," Nastoff said.

Mayor Robert Jones recognized Nastoff's role in something getting done.

"He's brought it up and kept it in front of us meeting after meeting of course," Jones said.

It was in 1987 that Nastoff, first began talking at city commission meetings about the bumpy state of the crossing. Other downtowns have smooth crossings, and so should Plymouth, he urged.

In 1988, he presented to the city commission 110 petition signatures from residents wanting improvements to the crossing. He also called CSX officials several times to complain.

The effort to finally get something done started two years ago, when West got state inspectors to

inspect the crossing.

"They said that we needed to put a different kind of signal there and I suggested a rubber crossing," West said. "They agreed to make the rubber a part of the entire order."

The city applied for a federal grant, and word came in September that the grant would come to allow the work to be performed.

Once the word came that the work would actually happen, "I was so surprised," Nastoff said.

While he's happy that the Main Street crossing is improved, Nastoff isn't stopping there. Recently, he's complained about the railroad crossing and road condition along Sheldon Road just northwest of the city, in Plymouth Township.

"We do not have to tolerate such poor maintenance, it really is the worst," he said.

"I'm going to be talking to new (county) commissioner (Thaddeus) McCotter, I'm going to hold him up to that."

# Task force to investigate arson

A newly formed task force will serve as a clearing house for information as investigations continue into arson and vandalism of model homes in several western Wayne County communities, including Canton Township.

"We are using them as a central depository for information," said Canton police Chief John Santomauro.

The task force's formation comes on the heels of an arson fire Nov. 29 in an unoccupied model home in Linden Village subdivision at Warren and Beck roads.

"As a result of the occurrence in Canton, we were able to determine that other communities in southeastern Michigan are having the same type of problems," Santomauro said.

In the past 12 months, 11 arsons have been reported in communities such as Novi, Wayne and Westland. In addition to the recent arson, builders in Canton also have reported problems with vandalism and malicious destruction of property, Santomauro said.

The task force will include representatives from the affected communities, such as Canton, Wayne and Westland, as well as the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and the Michigan State Police.

Because of the regional nature of the arsons and vandalism at new homes, the state police and ATF will lead the task force, which will catalog information provided by area fire and police departments, and will coordinate investigations and resources, Santomauro said.

The Canton arson is still under investigation. "This is the first (in a model home) in Canton that we know of," said Art Winkel, Canton fire marshal.

Fire officials are certain the fire was not set by youngsters fooling around in the unoccupied model home. "We know gasoline was used to set it. This was deliberately set," Winkel said.

The fire resulted in about \$40,000 damage to the model house, which was not yet complete but had drywall up.

The fire also prompted township, fire and police officials to host a meeting with about 30 builders to alert them to the continuing problems and what they can do to prevent such problems. Lighting areas around model homes was one of many suggestions. Builders also were urged to contact the township if they encounter any unusual incidents.

The ATF was asked to join the task force because "they were already conducting investigations into other similar incidents in the state," Santomauro said.

The group has met twice already. The first meeting was to share information and to determine if there were any common denominators to the arsons and vandalism at model homes. At the second meeting, Canton officials recommended formation of the task force to jointly coordinate continuing investigations in various communities.

A \$5,000 reward is being offered for information leading to the arrest or conviction of the arsonists. For information, call 1-800-44ARSON.

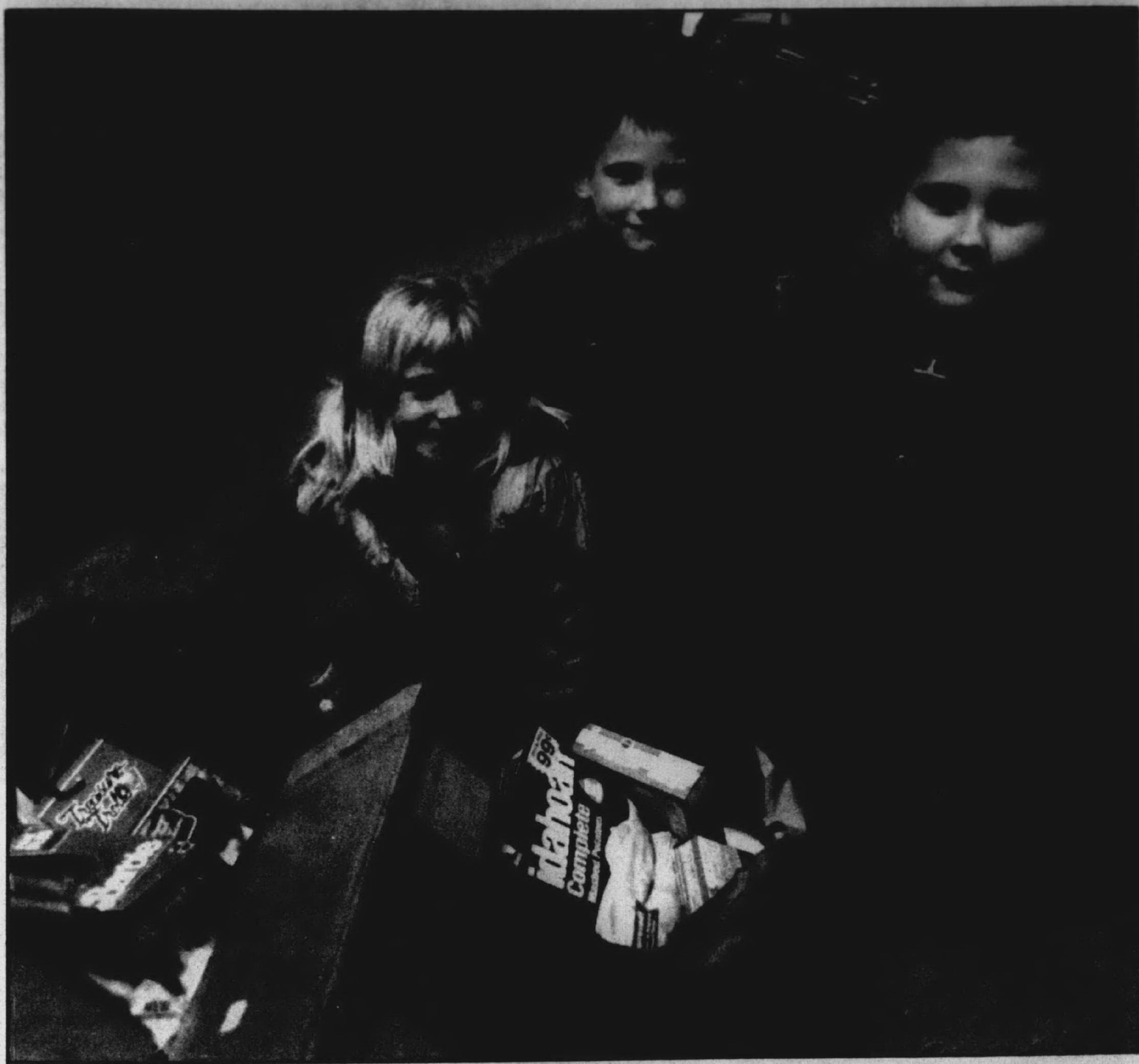

## Salvation Army to meet goal of helping families

Thanks to an outpouring of help, it's looking like the Salvation Army will be able to meet the needs of deserving Plymouth and Canton families this Christmas.

But it's still not too late to contact the local Salvation Army office to offer a hand, as last-minute calls for help are likely.

By Friday the Salvation Army had received enough calls from concerned families and companies to help nearly 300 needy families, reported Howard Matthews, director of the Adopt-A-Family program.

"We'll get well over 300," Matthews predicted. Last year, 240 families sought help through the program.

Families and companies that have chosen to "adopt" families have been given clothes sizes and the gender of family members

they're "adopting."

Those buying gifts and a Christmas dinner for these families were scheduled to drop off their donations today and Tuesday. Families accepting donations are scheduled to pick them up Wednesday through Friday.

But to meet the needs of those seeking last-minute help, Matthews said the Salvation Army could still use donated gift certificates for Meijer or similar stores.

By simply donating a gift certificate, "It just cuts out a lot of red tape," Matthews said.

The \$100 to \$300 "is hopefully enough to help a family of four," he said.

The Salvation Army phone number is 453-5487.

The community effort to help make Adopt-A-Family a success "has been excellent," said Matthews. While the program is

in its second year, it's his first heading it.

"The community has risen to the occasion beyond all my expectations," he said.

He thanked all volunteers, among them business coordinator Lynette Decker, Doris Clifford, toy shop coordinator Ross Myers and Matthews assistant Annette Pierce.

He also thanked Bob Jeanotte Pontiac, the Cherry Hill United Methodist Church and the Plymouth and Canton Goodfellows, as they combined to help more than 100 families.

And Matthews stressed that anyone wanting to donate clothes or toys items should do so at the Salvation Army drop box by 5 p.m. Tuesday, so there's time to distribute them by Christmas.

Canned goods, he said, can be donated later and still be used in time for Christmas.

## Substitute teacher suspected of striking student in fracas

Canton police are investigating a fight that broke out between two high school students Dec. 4, that resulted in a 30-year-old Canton High School substitute teacher apparently knocking out a 17-year-old Plymouth Salem student after he broke up the scuffle.

Teachers broke up the fight between two students — as about 300 students watched — near the bridge connecting the two high schools. As the substitute teacher escorted one of the fighting students through the crowd, someone

either threw something at him or actually struck him, according to a police report.

The substitute teacher apparently turned around and struck two male students, including the 17-year-old and a 16-year-old with his elbow. The 17-year-old told police he did not see the punch coming when he walked about three people behind the teacher.

The 17-year-old, who was struck on the left side of the chin and received cuts inside his

mouth, was knocked out and stepped on by other students. The student was treated by the school nurse. He went to St. Mary's Hospital, Livonia, for further treatment, according to the police report.

More details of the incident were unavailable. Richard Egli, community relations director for the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, said school officials would not comment while the incident is being investigated by police and school personnel.

attend Allen Elementary and Central Middle School.

Egli said this is the first rape of a Plymouth-Canton student he can remember in recent times. The school district has a team of counselors, psychologists and social workers available to help students deal with crises, he said.

Thomas George, chief security officer for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools and a retired Detroit police officer, urges students to travel in pairs or groups whenever possible.

"Obviously, they should try to

walk at times other than in the dark or at night. But I don't know how students can do that given school hours," George said. "If at all possible, students should try to get someone to drive them to their bus stop."

A growing number of women are carrying self-defense weapons, he said. George doesn't advocate that, but says "there are people who feel people should carry a whistle, or a noise-making device which can draw attention."

"Just blowing a whistle might scare the person off."

George said there was a rash of

schoolgirl rapes before he retired from the Detroit Police Department. One of the tactics police found effective in curtailing the attacks was to have more officers on patrol.

"They got anyone they could muster and put them out in a patrol car in the school neighborhoods. All precincts are doing that. It seems to help," George said.

It might be worth it for local police departments to alter their shift changes so that they don't occur at 7 a.m. High school students walk to school between 7-

7:20 a.m.

"Having cars driving around at the time students are on their way to school might be something to look into. Having a uniformed presence in the area might be a good deterrent," he said.

George said he's saddened by the incident. "I think it's terrible we have to live in a society that really prevents women from being able to walk alone or walk with a feeling of security. Unfortunately, there is that element who prey on women who are alone and vulnerable."

"I don't want to scare people, but just be a little more observant than usual."

"Rape is usually a repetitive crime," Berry said, adding the at-

tacker could try again.

He urged students to walk to school in pairs or in larger groups.

While the victim was assaulted

in a wooded area, Berry said this shouldn't suggest that women can be less vigilant while walking in a residential neighborhood.

That's because a potential victim can be assaulted among large shrubs between two houses, or taken to a vacant house, he said.

# Schoolcraft ponders prayer-less graduation rite

In response to a U.S. Supreme Court decision, Schoolcraft College officials are seriously considering a ban on prayer at graduation ceremonies.

The court decision, *Lee versus Weisman*, came on a 5-4 vote last June and says that prayers at public school graduation ceremonies violate the establishment clause of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

The First Amendment goes like this: "Congress shall make no law respecting

an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

The court's opinion did not specifically include college and university ceremonies, but Schoolcraft President Richard McDowell feels that someone somewhere might challenge a college's right to have a prayer at graduation and he doesn't want Schoolcraft to be the test case.

However, McDowell hasn't made a de-

cision yet to ban the invocation and benediction at next May's ceremony. He said that the college board of trustees will be asked to discuss the matter after it picks two people to replace trustees Jeanne Stempien and Thaddeus McCotter, who were elected to other offices.

The new trustees aren't expected to be sworn in until late January.

Schoolcraft graduation ceremonies have been laced with prayers for as long as anyone can remember, but pains were taken to see that these messages to God were ecumenical in nature, or in other

words, phrased so as not to favor any particular religion.

"But it still reflects a Christian ethic, so that's where you've got a problem," said Barbara Geil, vice president of student services.

The Rev. Robert Schaden, a Catholic priest who has often uttered the Schoolcraft graduation prayers, said good arguments exist both pro and con for eliminating the prayers from graduation rites.

"To some extent prayer has been trivialized in the way we've used it, certainly in the political arena," he said. "I'm not

as adamant that we need religion as I am that we need spirituality."

A local pastor who requested anonymity and also gave the Schoolcraft graduation prayer on occasion said he has "no problem with there being no prayers at a secular event such as that. It really kind of cheapens the prayer. God is not going to be mad if they have that event without a prayer."

The pastor said he didn't want to be identified for fear of an angry backlash on the part of religious "fundamentalists" in the community.

## County starts work on new morgue

The Wayne County Medical Examiner's Office outgrew its current facility 20 years ago, and Dr. Bader Cassin, the medical examiner, is delighted that a new building is now in the works.

Cassin and Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara broke ground on the new, \$14.5-million facility last week.

"This is just a truly depressing place to work," Cassin said. "I'm excited about the new facility. It's the only reason I'm sticking around."

The current medical examiner's office has

been in use since 1953 when the county established the office, Cassin said.

The new building will be paid for with money from a capital improvements bonds sale that was approved several years ago.

"It's taken awhile to get this one going," Cassin said.

It will take about two years to build the state-of-the-art complex to be built adjacent to the county youth home and juvenile court in Detroit, near I-75 and Warren Avenue.

"This project is one we are very pleased to have under way," McNamara said in a press release. "We certainly understand the need for a new medical examiner's office in

Wayne County to handle the work load that is placed on Dr. Cassin and his staff. This new facility should make their job a lot easier."

Advances in technology and an increasing work load have made the current facility obsolete, Cassin said.

The medical examiner's office handles 2,500 to 3,000 autopsies per year and has a staff of 40 full-time employees.

The new facility will serve a second function as it will allow the county to add parking space to help solve a parking shortage for the youth home and juvenile court.







# Careful when you're shoveling snow

Unfortunately, hundreds of people die each year from snow shoveling — the hazardous winter exercise. Newspaper and medical reports of snow shoveling deaths are common.

The association between snow shoveling and heart attacks is probably no coincidence. If you shovel light snow at the rate of 10 "throws" a minute, you burn as much energy as playing a match of singles tennis. Heavy snow can require the energy equivalent of running at a 9 mile per hour pace! If you're out of shape and unaccustomed to vigorous physical activity, snow shoveling may easily be your toughest workout of the year.

In addition to the high levels of energy expenditure, snow shoveling stresses your heart in several different ways. Stresses include heavy lifting with your arms, much time on your feet, breathing

cold air, and cold exposure. Lifting a given weight with your arms raises the heart rate and blood pressure more than with your legs. Prolonged standing forces your heart to work against gravity to keep blood moving. Breathing cold air can temporarily narrow the blood vessels that feed your heart. And to maintain body temperature, your heart pumps harder to circulate blood.

Among persons with cardiovascular disease, these effects may lead to a lack of oxygen supply to the heart muscle, chest pain, or potentially dangerous heart rhythm irregularities.

Who is at increased risk? If you are over 45 years of age and are inactive, smoke, have high cholesterol or blood pressure, are overweight or have a heart condition, you are the type of person most likely to suffer a heart attack while shoveling. Persons with one or more of these characteristics would be well-advised to hire a plow or someone else to do their snow removal.

Several recommendations are offered to persons who are considering clearing their walks or drive-

way of snow:

- Consider buying a snow blower, preferably one with an electric starter.
- If you shovel, pace yourself. Adopt a work-rest approach by taking frequent breaks.
- Use your legs and your arms in lifting the snow. Maintain a slight knee bend when pushing or lifting the shovel and keep your back as straight as possible.
- Lift small loads more often, using a short shovel with a small scoop.
- Wear a cold weather breathing mask or scarf to avoid inhaling cold air or exposing the face and neck to it. Also, remember to wear a hat.
- Avoid large meals, alcohol, and tobacco both before and after shov-

veling. These place added stresses on your heart and blood vessels.

- Take extra precautions when it's windy. The wind-chill factor may result in a temperature that is much lower than your thermometer indicates, as accompanying chart indicates.
- Dress in several light layers rather than one heavy layer. This allows you to take off or put on clothing as you work.

# Volunteers sought for snow shoveling study

Last winter, at least 22 middle-aged to elderly people in the Detroit metropolitan area suffered a heart attack or died from shoveling snow during a Jan. 14 snowstorm.

Snow removal at the rate of 10 shovels a minute can be equivalent to playing singles tennis or running at a pace of 9 mph. The physical demands of shoveling snow can be extremely dangerous for the elderly or for those with heart disease. Automated snow removal with a snowthrower is a popular alternative, but like manual shoveling, also involves physical exertion.

To assess the physiological demands of manual versus automated snow removal, William Beaumont Hospital's Cardiac Rehabilitation Department will be putting young snow shovelers to the test through a research study that is the first of its kind in the country. Beaumont is seeking inactive men between the ages

of 25 to 35 years to serve as volunteers for this snow shoveling research study.

Volunteers will receive free cardiovascular and body fat testing to assess their fitness at the start of the study. When a snowstorm hits the Detroit area, study volunteers will be called in to clear away a tract of snow, both manually and with a snowthrower. Oxygen consumption, heart rate and blood pressure will be measured for each participant during both forms of snow removal. These results will be compared with fitness measurements taken during cardiovascular testing at the start of the study.

In addition to free exercise testing, volunteers will receive an individualized exercise prescription.

# Media bombardment of Somalia landing mistaken

There isn't a story on this planet worth the life of a soldier.

The yowling media dogs kind enough to leave a little room on the Mogadishu beach for a few thousand Marines to come ashore should be sentenced to life playing Shemp in bad Three Stooges episodes, lucklessly threading through eternity on endless film loops.

I'm referring to last week's Circus Circus episode in Somalia, when U.S. Navy Seals, and, later, an advance team of U.S. Marines, tried to land quietly on the beaches for reconnaissance purposes.

Each team, thinking it was on a secret mission, went in under cover of darkness only to land and be welcomed by dozens of well-appointed journalists in freshly pressed Eddie Bauer official jungle garb, firing off flashes and firing up those hot little lights on top of TV cameras.

(It will derail my argument if I allow for the fact that military intelligence somehow should have known their advance teams were landing in nests of

journalists, so I'll save that for another time.)

Then, of course, came the main landing, well-publicized so far in advance that the criminals choking off the Mogadishu food lines had enough time to stroll into the hillsides with all their heavy artillery and wait out the invading forces.

Even National Public Radio led one Morning Edition broadcast with: "Marines land in Mogadishu — only shots fired were over the heads of journalists to back them off."

I perfectly understand the circumstances that lead to such overkill.

Had the media not been diligent in Vietnam, we wouldn't know about some of those minor annoyances like My Lai, Agent Orange and soldiers missing in action (then and now).

Had the media not been diligent in its coverage of President Reagan's heroic, TV Western-style storming of Granada, we wouldn't have known that not only was there no real enemy available to fight, but that the rules of war don't include shooting at unarmed col-

lege students who were trying to study.

Had the media not been denied access to almost everything during the Persian Gulf war, we might know more than we do now. However, other than a daily briefing in an air-conditioned tent in the middle of the nowhere, reporters in the gulf were kept on such a short leash that they couldn't report anything.

They were watching CNN, just like we were.

And that's the problem.

The media are making up for the shabby treatment they got at the hands of an over-protective Army in the Persian Gulf. This time, nobody's going to tell them what to do.

And they've swung too far in the wrong direction. Cover Operation Restore Hope? Certainly. Limit media access? Absolutely not — that's how untidy little details stay covered up. Implore journalists to use a little common sense? You bet.

You know things have gone too far when:

■ Marines are chugging across the

beach at midnight in full gear and wiseguys in Banana Republic outfits shouldering television cameras are keeping pace.

■ Houses that don't look like they could survive a moderate rain have been crowned with satellite dishes.

■ Journalists heap shame on the despicable, murderous, heavily armed, drugged-out-of-their-minds teenage thugs driving around Mogadishu in Jeeps with machine guns bolted to the roof, only to turn around and hire those same teens as bodyguards, guides and drivers.

The media have hurt themselves on this one. Next time — hopefully there won't be a next time, but we all know better — someone in the military will want to treat the journalists who covered Somalia as errant children, and it will be hard to argue with them.

# County council to ponder economy

Solving the problems that have led to the decline of Wayne County's aging communities is a pretty tall order, but a group of county, city and business leaders have been charged with this gargantuan task.

Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara established the Competitiveness Council and presented its members with a 120-day mission to develop concrete solutions to Wayne County's threatened business climate.

The council is chaired by Ford Motor Co. land development chairman Wayne Doran and Deputy Wayne County Executive Michael Duggan.

During this 120-day period the council is charged with finding answers to a half dozen questions concerning why economic growth has been hindered.

"Clearly, there is a need to address not only image problems, but also reality problems," McNamara wrote in an article about the council. "Our older areas need to find what's broken economically and fix it."

Wayne County has suffered severe job loss and business shutdowns in recent years with the entire state suffering from the effects. New

businesses have shown that they prefer to take their new jobs and new facilities to newer communities that may offer them less of a challenge.

The final product of the Competitiveness Council won't be an abstract study or list of suggestions, but a legislative package which will be brought to Lansing for consideration in early 1993, McNamara said.

Specific areas to be approached by the council are:

- Liability awards and litigation. How can Wayne County correct a legal environment that has led to larger damage awards for plaintiffs than in other counties?
- High taxes and over-reliance on property taxes. What can the county do with its tax burden and structure to make the area more attractive to business investment?
- Health care costs. What can Wayne County do to begin controlling health care costs that are already higher than the national average?
- Environmental regulation. What can the county do to make an unpredictable environmental review process more streamlined?
- Workforce quality. What can be done, near term and long term, to upgrade the quality of the local workforce?
- International and interstate trade. With the

North American Free Trade Agreement moving forward and a large shared U.S./Canada border, what can Wayne County do to capitalize on the changed business environment? Inside our border, what can be done to facilitate movement of goods.

In addition to offering a representative to serve on the council, the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce will serve as a resource for the council. The 1992 business climate survey compiled by the chamber will be an important guide as it outlines factors identified by chamber members as creating a major impact on the business climate in Southeast Michigan.

The council will also seek input from regional business groups as some of the factors outlined require regional action rather than solely county solutions.

Once the Competitiveness Council members arrive at a plan to solve these problems, they will present it to legislators and work to win bipartisan public and private support, McNamara said.

"Some changes will be easily made, others will require more intensive effort at both the local and state levels," he added. "Either way, the council report will gather attention — but not dust."

## Choir to sing Handel tune

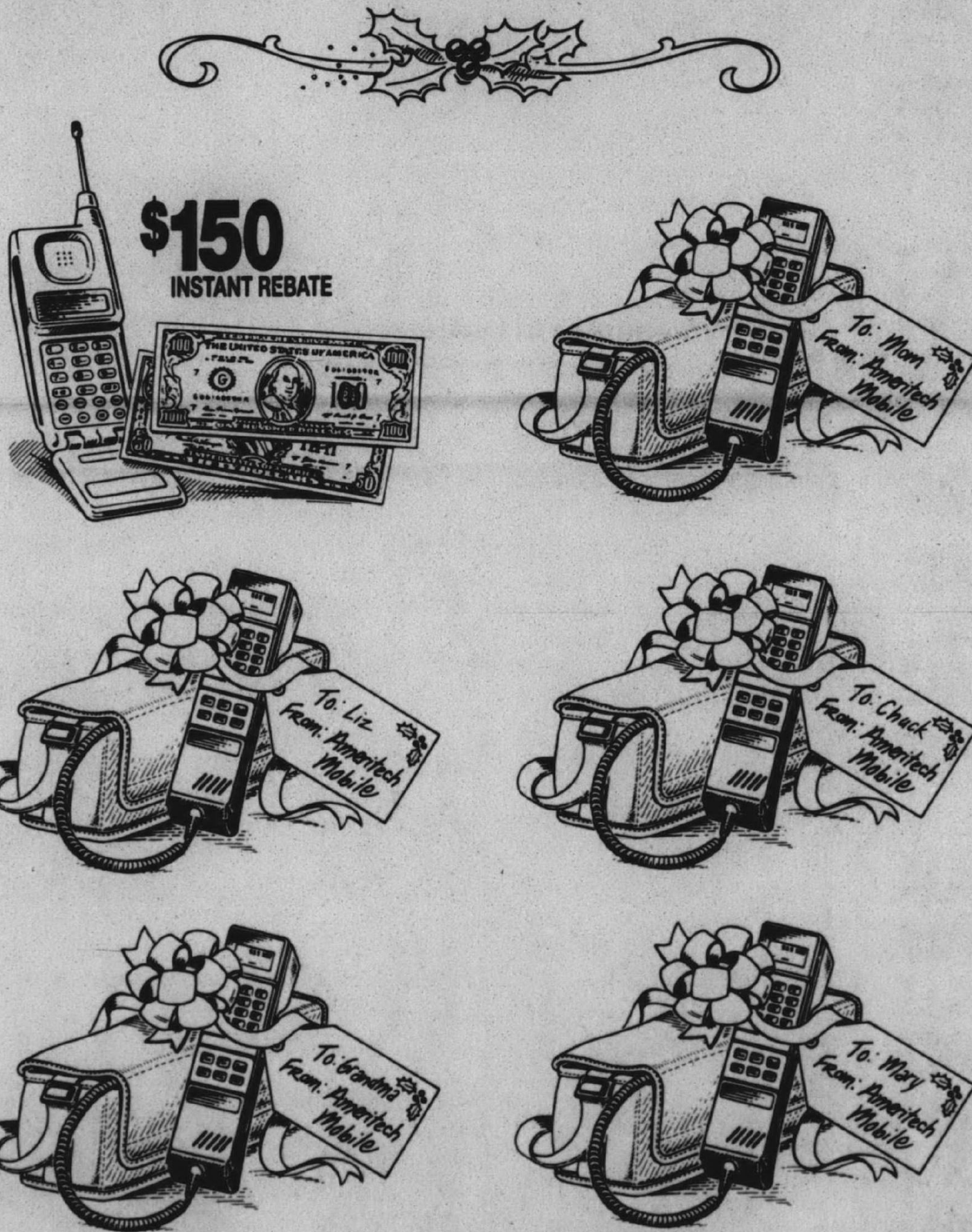

## Master the sweet art of stovetop candy making

Have you ever started your holiday baking and ended up eating more than you give? If preholiday dieting has control of your destiny, be forewarned. This column is not for the weak willed. As a matter of fact, it's guaranteed to add a few pounds to both the maker and the recipient.

I'll be the first to admit that when I make cookies, the need to sample each batch has been written in stone. But forget the cookies today because here's a holiday primer on the things to make in your kitchen that are loaded with sugar, chocolate and all those other things diet mavens have warned us about.

### Holiday treats

I'm talking about popcorn balls, turtles, truffles, sugared nuts and mouthwatering holiday mints that have us joining diet groups and health clubs for our New Year resolutions. Just about anyone can make cookies, but it takes a strong willed culinary afficionado with a cupboard filled with candy thermometers, marble slabs and finger-lickin' good batches of fudge without first having it go literally to your waist, thighs, hips and chin.

It also takes a guiltless conscious and a certain amount of willpower to put out bowls of popcorn balls, trays of truffles and finger-lickin' good batches of fudge without first having it go literally to your waist, thighs, hips and chin.

### Candy equipment

When it comes to equipment, you can purchase anything and everything at most local gourmet shoppes and houseware departments in major stores. But is a \$10 candy thermometer really necessary to turn out a \$6 batch of holiday candy? Can you justify its purchase when you know it will be used for only 20 minutes out of the year? Read on.

### Momma's test

Momma explained the difference between a hard ball candy stage and a soft ball stage by showing how the boiling sugar felt when dropped into ice water. If it sank immediately taking no known structure, it wasn't boiled long enough. If it felt "soft" and squishy in the ice water it was considered to be in its "softball" stage (approximately 235 degrees F).

If it landed in the water and immediately hardened into teeth crunching hardness, it was in its "hardball" stage (approximately 300 degrees F.) Unfortunately, for too many of us novice candy makers, an additional 30 seconds on the stove was all it took to transform something sweet and gooey into a rock-solid ball of hard candy.

To answer the above question, yes, for best results, rely on a candy thermometer. You can invest in a candy thermometer but better than that, pick up an "instant read" all purpose thermometer and you'll have the best, not just for candy making, but also for meat cooking as well. Taylor makes the best and expect to pay in the neighborhood of \$12.

Even more important when preparing holiday candies however is the need to have on hand long handled wooden spoons that don't reek of garlic from last night's stir-fry, and more importantly, measuring cups and spoons.

### Proper cookware

Always use cookware that is at least four times the volume of the ingredients or a three-quart capacity for each 1 1/2 pounds of candy being made.

Anyone who has ever made stovetop candy can attest to this reasoning, especially after the first pot boils over and you spend the remainder of the holidays scraping caramelized sugar from the reflector pans and stovetops.

Candymaking in the home kitchen is an art with its secrets lying in following the recipes closely, using the correct equipment, measuring carefully, and making accurate tests for the "doneness" of holiday candies.

No "fingerfuls" or "handfuls" are allowed. Cooks interested in picking up the necessary goodies, foil wraps, boxes and other accoutrements should head for reputable baking shops that have knowledgeable sales staff.

The Baker's Acre in downtown Wayne, Michigan is one of my favorite stops, as are all of the Kitchen Glamor Shops with locations in Rochester, West Bloomfield, Novi and Redford.

Take it from a pro, if you're interested in pursuing the recipes provided for the best holiday candies, farm the kids out for a few hours, turn on the answering machine and get ready to do nothing more than make candy.

You won't be disappointed in the results, but then again, your stick-skinny friends and relatives who are concerned about their weight might be. Bon Appetit.

## FAMILIES CELEBRATE FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS

Giggles float like bubbles in Davida Robinson's kitchen in Franklin where Avery, 3, is helping her bake Holiday Sugar Cookies. Avery isn't tall enough to reach the counter so he stands on a step stool.

He rolls out dough with a miniature version of his mother's rolling pin, makes menorahs, stars and dreidels with cookie cutters and decorates them with blue and red sprinkles. On this particular day, Avery was wearing a black shirt that was soon streaked with flour.

Mom didn't seem to mind, and Avery was having a ball. Soon he was joined by his brothers Ian, 6, and Ruby, 9.

Hanukkah, like Christmas, is "for children," but that's where the similarity ends.

"Christmas is one of the holiest holidays for Christians, and Hanukkah is a minor festival," said Lissa Hurwitz of the Jewish Community Council of Metropolitan Detroit. Hanukkah is not considered a major Jewish holiday because it is not prescribed in the Torah. This year, it will be celebrated from sundown on Saturday, Dec. 19 to sundown Sunday, Dec. 27.

For Jewish families, Hanukkah is a time to celebrate their religious freedom and to entertain family and friends.

During this Festival of Lights, Jews remember a miracle that occurred long ago in the Greco-Roman world. The Syrians outlawed the practice of Jewish rituals, and tried to convert Jews to Hellenism. Some refused, battled, and regained Jerusalem and the holy Temple. There was only one vial of oil left, but miraculously it burned for eight days. The celebration of Hanukkah dedicates Judah Maccabee's small Jewish army reclaiming the Temple from An-

tiochus' mightier Syrian forces.

To Jews, the miracle of Hanukkah is that the light of Judaism has never been extinguished, and that the Jewish people have remained loyal to the Torah and to the Jewish way of life.

Some families decorate their homes with Hanukkah posters and paper chains.

"It's a totally fun holiday. It's casual," said Davida Robinson. Most of the celebrations are in the home. There are parties, and children receive gifts, often small amounts of money, called Hanukkah gelt.

Families also play a game with a four-sided top called a dreidel. Depending on the top letter showing after the top stops spinning, the player will either put in the kitty, take the entire kitty, win half of the kitty or pass. The "stakes" are usually nuts, candy or pennies.

From a child's perspective, Hanukkah "lasts longer," (than Christmas), "and it's fun," said Ruby Robinson.

Children look forward to receiving gifts, but like many moms, Davida tries to stress other parts of the holiday like making cookies, reading about the

### Winner Dinner Recipes



#### 3-BEAN CHILI

- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon olive or cooking oil
- 2 cans (14 1/2 ounces) Italian style stewed tomatoes with seasonings, chopped coarsely and undrained
- 1 cup water
- 1 can (6 ounces) tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 tablespoon Dijon style mustard
- 1 teaspoon dried basil, crushed
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano, crushed
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 can (15 ounces) kidney beans, drained
- 1 can (15 ounces) garbanzo beans, drained
- 1 can (15 ounces) great northern beans, drained
- 1 cup carrots, chopped
- 1 cup whole kernel corn, fresh or frozen
- 1 cup zucchini, chopped

In a Dutch oven, cook garlic in hot oil for 30 seconds. Stir in undrained tomatoes, water, tomato paste, chili powder, mustard, basil, oregano, cumin and pepper. Add the three cans of beans and chopped carrots; bring to a boil. Reduce heat

and simmer, covered, for 20-30 minutes.

Stir in corn and chopped zucchini. Simmer, covered for at least 20 minutes or until the vegetables are cooked. Hot pepper may be added to taste. Spoon into serving bowl and top with either grated Parmesan cheese or grated cheddar cheese. Serves 6.

#### APPLESAUCE MUFFINS

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup applesauce
- 1 3/4 cup all purpose flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup walnuts, chopped

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease bottoms only of 12 (2 1/4-inch) muffin pan cups. Cream butter and sugar in large bowl until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs, one at a time, and then add applesauce. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt and add to the butter mixture. Stir in nuts and beat with a fork until all the ingredients are moistened. Don't over stir; batter will be lumpy. Fill each prepared muffin pan cup two-thirds full with batter.

miracle at the Temple, and helping others who are less fortunate than they are.

In previous years, Robinson's children exchanged gifts with their friends at a Hanukkah party.

Every child brought a \$5 gift that went into a grab bag. Each child got to pick something from the bag.

"This year, instead of having the grab bag we will take the gifts

to an agency that helps Jewish Russian families who recently moved here," said Robinson. "This gift-giving business gets out of control. We want the kids to feel like they're helping others who don't have as much as they do."

Besides exchanging gifts, Jews light candles, one for each night of the celebration, to symbolize the oil that burned miraculously in the reclaimed Temple for eight

days. The candles are placed in a holder called a menorah.

"The candle lighting and blessings that are sung always touch me," said Wendy Wagenheim of Birmingham.

Every year, Wagenheim's family and friends bring their menorahs with them to a big party at her home. Everyone gets to light their own menorah which makes the occasion more memorable.

While the holiday requires no

dietary changes, during Hanukkah, Jews eat latkes — potato pancakes, and other foods fried in oil — to symbolize the miracle at the Temple.

There will be lots of latkes at the Robinson house, but they will be fried in as little oil as possible because Davida, a member of the health club at the Jewish Community Center in West Bloomfield, is always looking for ways to reduce the amount of fat

in her family's favorite foods. They are traditionally served with sour cream and applesauce.

Wagenheim's recipe is for 50 latkes, with good reason. "In our family the problem is the latkes don't make it to the table. We have four pans going at once in the kitchen, but someone is always going in the oven to take one."

ter is flavored as desired. To store butter cookies, place each variety in a different container to preserve its special texture and flavor.

Don't package soft cookies and crisp cookies together. The soft cookies will cause the crisp cookies to soften.

Because salt acts as a preservative, salted butter has a longer shelf life than unsalted butter.

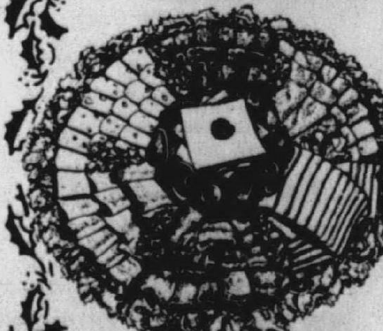

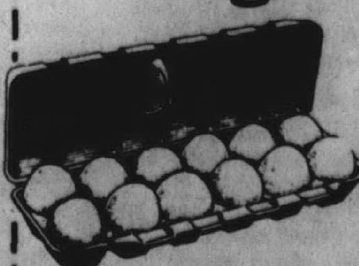

**HOLIDAY SUGAR COOKIES**  
Cookie dough

- ¼ cup sugar
- ½ cup soft tub margarine (regular or light)
- 2 egg whites
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- ½ cup nonfat vanilla yogurt
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda

Cream sugar and margarine until fluffy. Add egg whites and continue beating. Add vanilla and yogurt — mix well. Gradually add flour, baking

powder and baking soda to sugar mixture. Mix well. Divide dough into three equal parts. Shape into disc, cover with Saran wrap and chill for three hours.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees at baking time. Spray cookie sheets with vegetable oil spray. Roll dough out on floured surface and cut with cookie cutter.

Decorate cookies with sprinkles or colored sugar at this time. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 minutes. Remove cookies from cookie sheet and place on cooling rack.

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 8 oz. sweet cooking chocolate, grated
- tablespoon rum (optional)
- 1 cup cocoa

Cream butter until softened. Blend in egg yolk, then sugar. Add grated chocolate and rum. Mix well. Form into ½ inch balls. Roll in cocoa. Chill on waxed paper.

**OLD FASHIONED HARD CANDY**

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup water
- ¾ cup light corn syrup
- food coloring, if desired
- ½ teaspoon oil of cinnamon, wintergreen, peppermint, etc.
- powdered sugar

Mix together sugar, water and syrup; cook to 300 degrees on a candy thermometer. Remove from heat; add coloring and flavorings. Mix well. Pour into a well greased pan or marble slab. Cool candy until warm enough to touch. Cut into ½-inch strips and then into small chunks. Drop onto greased cookie sheet. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Makes 1 pound.

Denning also offers beautiful cakes, tortes, and French pastries, a variety of holiday cookies, muffins, and a cupcake bouquet — an edible centerpiece.

Jennifer created the cute decorated brownies that look like sleds with a snowman on top.

"Our cookies are made with real butter, the way mom would make them," said Denning.

If you've tried, and failed at making gingerbread houses, Denning offers these tips — When you make the dough, roll it

out on parchment paper, foil or a pan. Then cut out your pattern.

Chef Larry Janes recommends baking the gingerbread house pieces on parchment paper, then cool them on a wire rack.

"People always wonder why their gingerbread houses fall apart after a couple of days," said Denning. "Let it (the gingerbread) age a couple of days before you assemble it. Gingerbread shrinks."

To make royal icing, for every 2 cups of powdered sugar, add 1 egg white, and 1 teaspoon of boiling water, and whip for 5 minutes.

Janes makes houses out of graham crackers instead of gingerbread, and assembles them with royal icing.

If you've got visions of "Chestnuts Roasting On An Open Fire," after our first real snow, here's a tip from Rina Tonan of Cafe Cortina in Farmington Hills. "Pierce the chestnuts with a sharp knife. Wrap them in foil, or put in a pan covered with foil, in a 350 degree oven. Bake for 30 to 40 minutes."

# Shrimp salad Thai-inspired

AP — In her new cookbook, "Back to Square One," Joyce Goldstein writes that it's hard to live in California (she runs Square One restaurant in San Francisco) "without becoming addicted to Thai cuisine."

"These recent immigrants to our country have marked our palates in a most impressive way," she says. "Thai food has the flavors Americans love: sweet, tart and hot." The following is Goldstein's recipe for Thai-inspired shrimp salad (William Morrow, \$23).

- 1/2 cup peanut oil or mild olive oil
- Salt
- 1/2 cup toasted peanuts, coarsely chopped
- 30 medium to large shrimp, shelled and deveined
- White wine for poaching
- 6 cups small spinach leaves, well washed and drained
- 1 1/2 cups carrots, cut in strips 2 inches long and 1/4 inch wide
- 2 cups cucumbers, diced 1/2 inch
- 1 1/2 cups thinly sliced red cabbage

For the peanut vinaigrette, whisk the vinegar, sugar, cayenne or jalapeno peppers, soy sauce and oil together in a small bowl. Season to taste with salt; stir in the peanuts.

Poach the shrimp in a large saucepan over low heat in white wine or water to cover until just cooked through, about 5 minutes. Remove from the poaching liquid

and let cool. Then cut the shrimp in half lengthwise.

To serve, toss the spinach with enough vinaigrette to lightly coat and place a bed on each of six salad plates. Then toss the carrots, cucumbers, red cabbage and shrimp with the remaining vinaigrette. Arrange on top of the spinach. Makes 6 servings.

Note: A pinch of anchovy paste may be added to the vinaigrette instead of the salt to produce the flavor of Thai fish sauce, which is not readily available in many American markets.

Wine notes: White wines that are light in body, fragrant and flavorful are best. Sauvignon Blanc from Italy, Chile, or California are excellent choices. You might also try a dry trocken or halbtrocken Riesling from Germany, a mild chardonnay, or even a dry French or American rose.

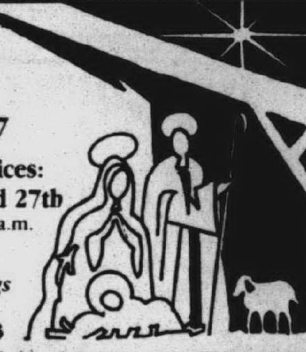

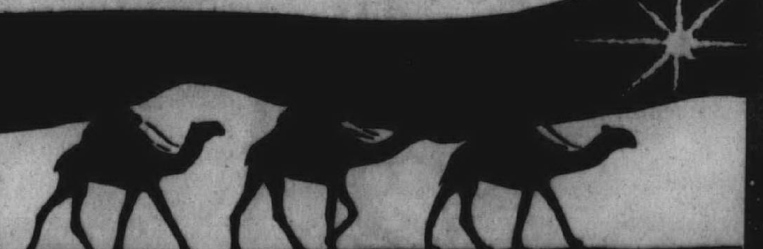



# Area attorneys bothered by security measures

For the cost of \$40,000 in equipment and 21 additional sheriff's deputies, Oakland County began screening visitors to the county building last week with metal detectors.

Although there has been no single crisis in the courthouse to precipitate such action, several incidents over the last 10 years have given officials reason to worry, county Clerk Lynn Allen said.

Allen, whose office provides administration service to the circuit court, can remember two instances where attorneys were caught with handguns in courtrooms.

One attorney dropped his briefcase, a gun fell out, went off and

holed the courtroom ceiling. Another attorney's gun fell out of a briefcase and onto the floor. The attorney's client, Allen said, picked up the piece and returned it to his counselor.

Allen remembers one other incident when a distraught man who had just left the courthouse took a gun from his car and killed himself in the parking lot.

More recently, officers intercepted a death threat to a judge.

Happenings such as those led the county commission to believe, Allen said, that restricted access to the county building on Telegraph Road through metal detectors was prudent.

## How inconvenient

"We know it's inconvenient,"

Allen said. "(But) it's been a necessary program for a long time."

He certainly wasn't wrong about the inconvenience. Perhaps 100 people were lined up at the main entrance Tuesday morning waiting their turn to be electronically frisked.

Sheriff's deputies also opened purses and briefcases, rummaging around inside to see if anyone was packing a weapon.

Also, visitors are asked to dump jack knives and other "weapons" in a box near the detectors. The alternative is to take the knife back to your car, then rejoin the queue.

Most of the people contacted by the Observer & Eccentric Tuesday didn't mind the inconvenience, but the Oakland County

Bar Association is ticked off.

President Edward Gold asked chief Judge Richard Kuhn to let attorneys skip the detectors, but Kuhn wouldn't hear of it.

## No can do

"The message we are getting is that lawyers, who are officers of the court, are not . . . trustworthy," Gold said. "We do not understand why lawyers are being required to stand in line each and every day, to pass through metal detectors and be forced to submit their belongings to these security measures."

Troy attorney Donald Williams doesn't like the situation much either. "I don't think I've ever seen anything that would justify this kind of security," he said.

"As an attorney I'm not afraid. Now maybe the judges are."

Another attorney, who declined to give his name, said, "I guess I figured Oakland County was too civilized for that sort of (security)."

Other courthouse visitors seemed more accepting of the additional security. "It feels safer," said Robert Larson of Keego Harbor. "It's not a big problem" to submit to the detectors.

## X-rays could help

Sheriff's department Lt. Damon Shields, who supervises the courthouse deputies, said that "the majority of the public has been patient with us. It's a lot

better than we anticipated." Shields expects to get an X-ray machine to examine briefcases and handbags, but one hasn't been ordered yet. "Without the X-ray machine, it's very labor intensive," he said.

That's a big part of the reason why they need 21 deputies to operate the system now. However, 19 of the new deputies are part-time, Shields said, meaning they don't get insurance. Therefore, two part-timers cost county taxpayers less than one full-time deputy does.

Shields said the extra expense to taxpayers is worth it. "We just want to deter people from even thinking about bringing a weapon into court," he said.

Shoppers, collectors get handle on unusual works of art



A shopping riddle: What comes in all shapes and sizes? What can hold 50 pounds before it snaps? And what is fast-becoming a favorite with collectors? If you guessed the shopping bag, score 10 points and ride to the top of the escalator.

Shopping bags are hot. Especially during the holidays. When bringing packages home or transporting gifts to a party, nothing beats an elegantly designed flat-bottom bag with a twisted cord handle from a department store.

"Hudson's distributes 2.3 million shopping bags annually," reported Karen Kleinfelt, a spokeswoman for the department store. "During November and December we come out with a limited number of special holiday-design bags that are available at the store entrances and near the escalators. This year we have 400,000 to distribute. They are very pretty and colorful, picturing our Santa Bear blowing a horn."

Hudson's requests 30 cents for each bag, and the money is donated to the United Way, according to Kleinfelt. JC Penney charges 25 cents for its large-size holiday bag, this year featuring Santa Claus sitting in a rocking chair painting a face on a toy doll.

The Neiman Marcus bag is a rich, laminated red with the store's name across the center of the bag in gold script. The handle is a shiny gold braid which matches the color of the type. This bag is used year-round. No change for the holidays.

The bag is a gift to the customer who makes a purchase, according to Karen Emde of Neiman's.

Retailers wishing to be politically correct use shopping bags made from "recycled material containing post consumer waste" said Diane Pierok, marketing director for the Durobag Company of Kentucky, the largest do-

mestic manufacturer of retail shopping bags in the United States.

#### Environmentally sound

"Even Bloomingdales switched to bags made from recycled materials this year," she said. "We make bags for hundreds of the nation's retailers at two plants in Kentucky and Mexico."

Durobag usually creates the bags from designs submitted by a retailer's advertising department, Pierok said. Each bag costs between 20 cents and \$1 to manufacture, depending on size, weight of paper, printing and type of handle.

The company's tests show that its average bag can hold up to 50 pounds before it rips or the handle breaks away.

"Some bags are very fancy these days," Pierok said. "Retailers want bottom boards, eyelets around the handle fastening, windows in the bag . . . We made a bag for the Coach Company that had a leather handle, very customized."

"My favorite was a Halloween bag for one of the greeting card companies that read, *Yo! Candy, NOW! We deal with bags every day yet some of them are so neat our staff keeps a few around.*"

"Bags as art"  
Durobag employees aren't the only collectors of unusual shopping bags. They're art to some keen-eyed shoppers who delight in showing off their collections, using them in home decor, in the lunchroom, and the classroom.

"I had hundreds of shopping bags

from stores around the world," Chris Smiley of Rochester said. "Collecting them was a practical and fun hobby. I'd use them to carry things to school when I was involved with a big project. I used them to bring things back and forth for parties. Friends and relatives loved to surprise me with new bags from their travels, and I really appreciated acquiring new ones."

There's no doubt that shopping bags are cost-effective advertising for retailers. They show up at airports, charity auctions, banquets and boardrooms filled with whatever, but always carrying a message.

"My favorite shopping bag makes

me happy whenever I see it," Mary Lou Parsons of Livonia said. "It's the Sak's December bag. Every holiday season the calendar is printed on the outside of the bag. It symbolizes all the glitter and glamour of the holidays — the shopping, the parties. I honestly break into a grin whenever I see that bag!"

Patricia Grossman of Madison Heights likes to collect shopping bags. She has them hanging on the wall around her dressing table.

"My husband teases me with lines like, 'Can't we afford a painting?' she said with a laugh. "But, hey, some of these are works of art to me. They're just on bags not in frames!"

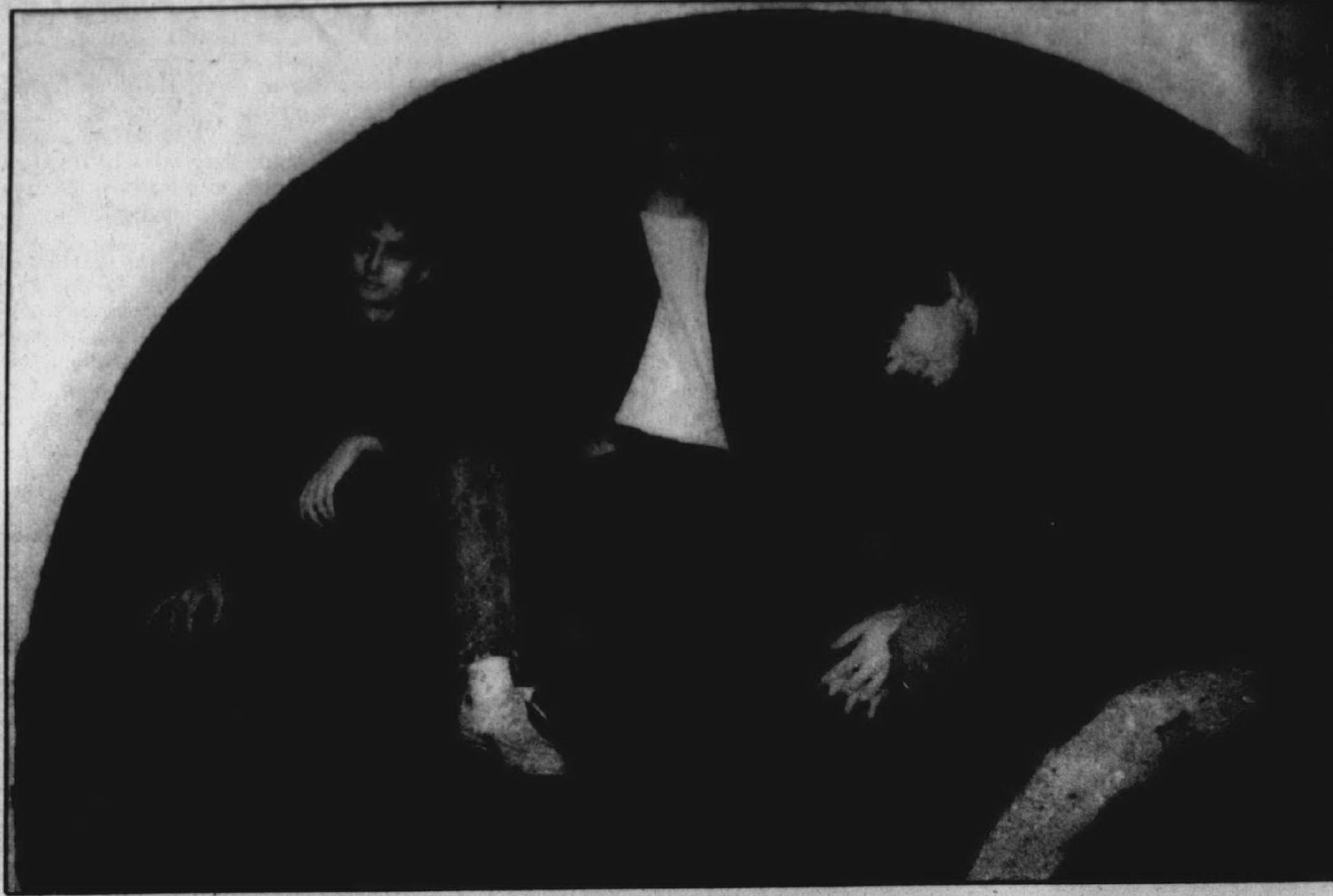

## 22 Belows up to music's challenge

The folks at the Rev. Jerry Falwell's Liberty University may not have appreciated Blake Miller's music, but the new-music troubadour is finding there are those who like the sounds he and his band 22 Belows are churning out.

In his college days, 22 Belows founder Blake Miller created shimmering acoustic music with an unrelenting beat. The problem was his rhythm section often came uninvited.

The pounding was usually a resident adviser rapping on his dorm room door to shut down the secular music proceedings.

After all, this is Liberty University we're talking about. The place the Rev. Jerry Falwell made famous and not the least hospitable to new music troubadours.

"I always had these guys coming to my room and begging me to play these songs for them," says

Miller, 22, recalling his freshman year at Liberty University. "A crowd would always gather and wouldn't be 10 or 15 minutes later the RAs would be down there busting me.

"We would sort of goof around. It just seemed like the RAs were working overtime."

Such subversive activity landed Miller before the board of review after accumulating too many reprimand points. All of this would seemingly paint a picture of an angry young man.

Yet, his new band, 22 Belows, is anything but an angst-ridden, suffocating endeavor. The group features guitarist Greg Naumann, 21; drummer Jeff Clinton, 17; bassist Ross Haupt, 17, and Miller.

22 Belows go the guitar driven introspection route, unearthing soulful emotion and frayed melancholy with gushing frequency. My Bloody Valentine, Ride and Inspiral Carpets can only be used as reference points.

The band has been together since September, putting together some demos and playing an infrequent number of gigs. 22 Belows open for another soundscape band with a former Liberty University student, Spectacle, this Saturday at Finney's Pub.

One may wonder about the feasibility of a burgeoning noise pop band. Few, such as My Bloody Valentine, are proficient at it and the genre is saturated with imitators.

"That's what I've been wrestling with myself," Miller says. "All of these alternative genres are recycled anyway. Some people say Pearl Jam is alternative. To me, it's '70s rock with a '90s production sound."

"I think what American bands have on our side is that it hasn't exploded here yet. I hope American bands here can cultivate their own sound."

Miller is already trying to do that. After moving off campus, he became involved in the rave scene in Lynchburg, Va.

House and techno influenced his songwriting, Miller says, contrasting melodies and pulsating rhythms underneath. The 22 Belows sound is still evolving, though.

"Once you kind of cash in on an idea you like, it's very hard to let that be it's own idea and leave it there . . ." Miller says. "It's a challenge for yourself to constantly write something clever or different."

22 Belows will perform along with Spectacle and Charron on Saturday, Dec. 19, at Finney's Pub, 3965 Woodward, Detroit. For information, call 831-8070.

## Christmas rocks on 2 spirited releases

The holiday spirit is alive and well recorded on two locally produced releases, "Christmas in Detroit" and "A Christmas Eve Get-Together With . . . Goober & the Peas."

Both embody the sense of community and goodwill in which they were conceived. Proceeds from "Christmas in Detroit" will go to the Lakeshore Optimist Club while the Goober & the Peas' effort will benefit the non-profit social work agency Crossroads.

Beyond their charitable merits, though, both projects are sterling examples of the bountiful array of musical talent in this area. (Besides how can you go wrong when Ernie Harwell shows up on both of them.)

"Christmas in Detroit" brings together some of the Motor City's more talented groups. The 11-song release contains both classics and originals, some incorporate a serious message while maintaining an overall festive tone.

There's blues with the all-star conglomeration, Blues Disciples, tearing through "(Havin' a) Christmas Party" while the Detroit Blues Band put forth a smoky rendition of the yuletide classic "Merry Christmas Baby." Another blues highlight is The Chisel Brothers, featuring Thornetta Davis' majestic vocals, performing "Boogie Woogie Santa Claus" with aplomb and soulful clarity.

The rock corner is aptly manned by DC Drive — whose members Brian Pastoria, Mark Pastoria and Jimmy Romero put the project together — as they contribute their own rollicking number "Santa Bring My Baby to Me." Frosty & the Snowmen,

featuring members of the Silver Bullet Band and DC Drive torch up the chesnut Chuck Berry made famous, "Run Rudolph Run."

The Howling Diablos' "Another Christmas Story" is a haunting, R&B tinged number sung in an ominous Lou Reed-like commentary about homelessness. Skeleton Crew's uplifting acoustic rendering "Nam Myoho Renge Kyo (Peace on Earth Will Live Forever)" serenades as much as it rouses the spirit.

Sandra Mandella's exalted vocals on The Johnny Trudell Band's nightclub jazz version of the somber "My Christmas Tree" provide a state of grace to the proceedings. Mitch Albom and Janine Sabino's contribution "Jingle Bells (Ring for the Lonely)" and Tramaine's "Someday at Christmas" are cherished for their sentimental tenor.

All of which makes some of the DJ prattle between numbers rather superfluous instead of

being overbearing.

Not surprisingly, Goober & the Peas take a more mistletoe-in-cheek approach on their three-song CD holiday release. The band does a Seattle/surf version of "Snoopy's Christmas" while "My Love for Her" gets the "hill-billy" tear-in-the-beer treatment and nearly eclipses the emotional wallop of Elvis' "Blue Christmas." Like we said, nearly.

"Tell the Lord (What Santa's Done)" features Goober in the true Christmas spirit, calling to heaven with intrepid urgency ("there's a man, who's done you wrong/last name Claus, first name of Santa/Steals the glory when your day comes along.")

Christmas never sounded so good.

## Parent's actions have effect on child

Dear Barbara,  
I would like to know what effect it has on children, whether preschool or high school age, to sleep in a divorced parent's home while the parent shares a bed with a friend of the opposite

an experience will influence a child. It will influence the child's values, the child's ethics and the child's character.

Mothers and fathers are role models for their children. With their actions, they set a path to follow and reveal deeper, although unsaid, attitudes in themselves. When Mom or Dad sleeps in the family home with someone who is not their husband or wife they are making a strong statement about their values or lack of them.

Although it may or may not be obvious, they're making this statement all the time with other

behaviors as well. Children are necessarily influenced by the messages their parents impart and with some children unsaid messages are more powerful than messages that are voiced.

How and to what degree any one child will be affected by this experience is unknown because there are so many other factors bearing down on the child. Some of these are the values, in this area, of the other parent, the values of the neighborhood and the school system in which the child lives, the child's relationship with the friend who sleeps over and the

child's own inborn temperament. We don't know whether some of these other factors will reinforce or negate the child's reaction to this experience.

# Reiner delivers a compelling drama with 'Good Men'

Rob Reiner's "A Few Good Men" offers a "twentysomething" twist on the great movie courtroom dramas. Tom Cruise, Demi Moore, Kevin Bacon, and Kiefer Sutherland fill the uniforms in a military murder case, but it takes a big gun like Jack Nicholson to leave you thinking long after leaving the theater.

The drama results from the death of Santiago, a young Marine stationed in Cuba who can't make the grade. When he travels outside his chain of command to request a transfer, fellow Marines issue a Code Red, an unofficial order to whip him back in shape.

This time the reprimand results in murder.

The government wants to make it seem like these young men simply flew off the handle. They want to bargain a light sentence and save the Corps some embarrassment. Lieutenant Kaffee (Tom Cruise) wants to prove that the order came straight from the top — an omnipotent colonel played by Jack Nicholson — and could not be disobeyed.

As a Harvard graduate serving time in the Navy, Cruise plays the part extremely quirky, almost too much so. He slams down chocolate-flavored soda called Yoo-Hoo, drives a beat-up Chrysler, and spends more time worrying about softball than his clients.

Kaffee has some help on the case, specifically from Sam (Kevin Pollack), a bright young Harvard colleague, and Joanne (Demi Moore), a tough but predictably

sexy military lawyer. Montages show them working late in the night in his dorm room-style apartment, with Nerf basketball net over the door and last night's carry-out atop the kitchen sink.

Though the scent of a romantic relationship lingers, Reiner wisely focuses on the courtroom scenes. Even though you know after the first 10 minutes who needs to answer for Santiago's death, you wait to see if Kaffee can really topple Colonel Jack on the witness stand.

And that climactic showdown between Nicholson and Cruise is well worth the price of admission. In the past, Nicholson has acted with every wrinkle on his face. Here he's stiff from the nose up. His unblinking, steely eyes penetrate while his mouth does all the acting. He's brilliant.

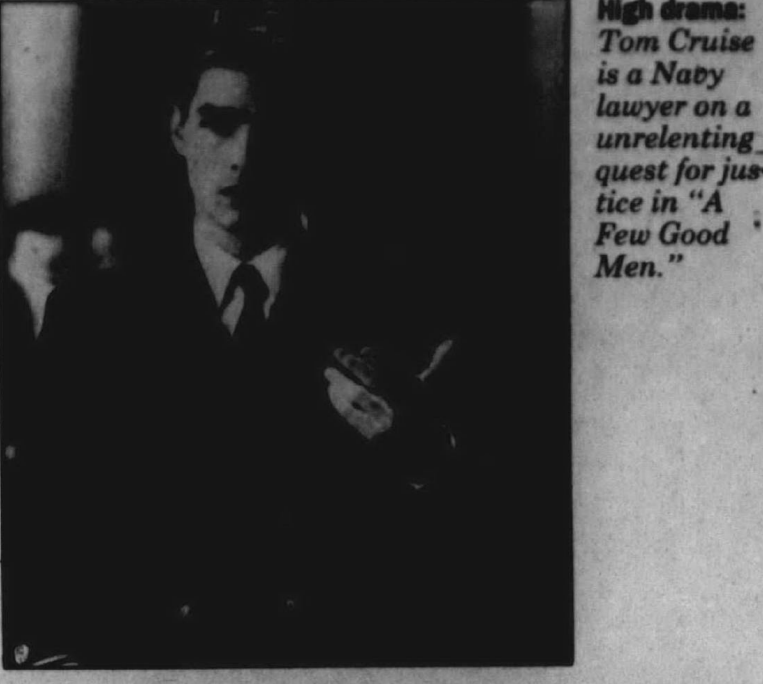
This is not a starring role (he's on-screen for maybe 15 minutes),

but his presence dominates the film. In essence, Nicholson has taken on a role as big as the entire Marine Corps.

There are more than a few good moments in "A Few Good Men," which was originally written for the stage. The movie hums along as solid entertainment, something Rob Reiner has learned to provide masterfully in films as diverse as "This Is Spinal Tap," "The Princess Bride," "When Harry Met Sally," and "Misery."

The actor once known solely as Meathhead has yet to serve a turkey.

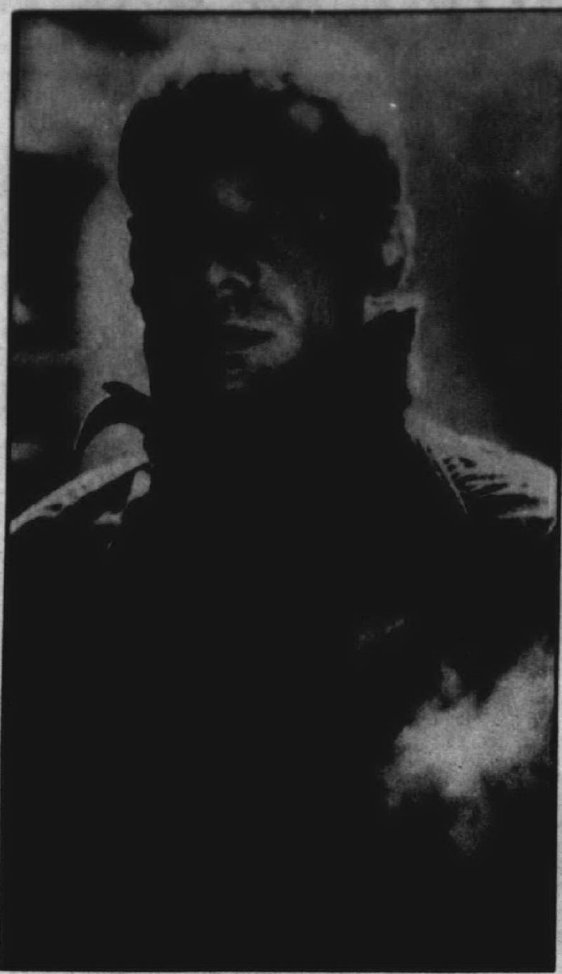

## Lady Crusaders hailed

For the second-straight year, Madonna University volleyball player Dana Hicks has been named to the NAIA All-American team. But this year, she has company.

Teammate Elena Oparka, a senior outside hitter who played two years at Schoolcraft College before transferring to Madonna, was named to the third team.

Also honored was senior outside hitter Melissa Mars (Redford Bishop Borgess), chosen to the NAIA National All-American Scholar-Athlete first team. Mars, who was also a second team all-NAIA District 23 selection, carries a 3.6 cumulative grade-point average, with a major in education. It was the second-straight year she was chosen.

Hicks, Madonna's leading middle hitter, was named the district's player of the year for the second time, sharing the honor this season with Northwood University's Michelle Williams. A junior, Hicks collected 673 kills (4.5 a game) with a .326 kill average. She also had 1.6 solo blocks and five digs a game.

Oparka was nearly as effective, collecting 653 kills (4.3 a game) while hitting .327. She averaged three digs a game.

Two others were all-district first-team selections: senior Tonia Smith (Walled Lake Central), named for the fourth-straight year, had 447 kills (3.4 a game), hit .322 and led the team with 627 digs (five a game); and junior setter Mazie Pilut (Borgess), who averaged 12.4 assists-to-kills and 3.2 digs per game, and hit .289.

Madonna set a school-record for match wins this year, going 43-11.

## UMass signs Murray

Jarvis Murray, Schoolcraft College's standout basketball player, has signed to attend the University of Massachusetts-Lowell in Boston next year.

Murray, a 6-foot-5 sophomore center, is averaging more than 20 points and 10 rebounds a game for the Ocelots. He is expected to start next season at forward for UMass-Lowell, an NCAA Division II school.

Murray had been contacted by several NCAA Division I schools, but he opted for a three-year scholarship at UMass-Lowell where he'll have two years of eligibility remaining.

The Detroit Cody High product will accompany UMass-Lowell when it tours Spain for two weeks next summer.

## Ocelots cagers fall

The shooting slump continued for Schoolcraft College's men's basketball team — and so did the losing streak.

The Ocelots lost their fifth-straight game, 82-74 at St. Clair Community College in their Eastern Conference opener Wednesday. They are 3-7 overall. St. Clair improved to 5-2 overall, 1-1 in the conference.

"It was absolutely horrendous shooting," said SC coach Dave Bogataj. "The kids' effort was there. They played better than in their previous two ball games."

An extended scoreless streak midway through the first half doomed the Ocelots. They were leading by seven before going seven minutes without a point and falling behind by 13. "It probably should have been worse," said Bogataj.

Jarvis Murray turned in a solid performance, collecting 29 points and 13 rebounds. Courtney Williamson finished with 16 points. The two combined for 19-of-25 shooting (76 percent).

Unfortunately, they were about all the offense SC could muster. The rest of the team was 13-of-49 from the field (27 percent) and was 1-of-11 from three-point range. Making matters worse, the Ocelots managed to convert just 11-of-23 free throws (48 percent); St. Clair was 13-of-17 (76 percent).

The Skippers were paced by Brian Shafer's 16 points. Rasah Reeves had 13 and Matt Clark 11.

## Lady Ocelots tumble

St. Clair CC's size and first-half pressure put SC into a hole it could not climb out of Wednesday. The Lady Ocelots lost their Eastern Conference opener to the NJCAA's 18th-ranked team, 68-54 at SC.

The Lady Skippers used a pair of 6-foot-1 post players and some good pressure defense to build a 30-20 lead by halftime. Lisa Kollomgren led the assault, scoring 10 points. But SC put on a press of its own to start the second half, scoring the first six points to pull to within four.

The game remained tight until, with St. Clair ahead 44-40, the Lady Ocelots' Lori Murphy drove to the basket and scored. A foul was called, but it was against Murphy; the basket was disallowed. St. Clair bumped its lead back up to 10 and SC could not catch up.

Poor shooting by two of SC's top scorers hurt. Dana Hudson, averaging 19 points a game, scored just six on 2-of-19 shooting; she did have 10 rebounds. Angie Cerne, who has been scoring 10 points a game recently, managed just four on 2-of-9 shooting.

Alisa Wechter and Becky Piotrucowski each netted 15 points for SC. Wechter also had 10 rebounds. Murphy finished with 11 points.

SC is 6-4 overall. St. Clair is 6-0 overall, 2-0 in the conference.

## Rocks solid

Supporting cast comes through after Head misses start

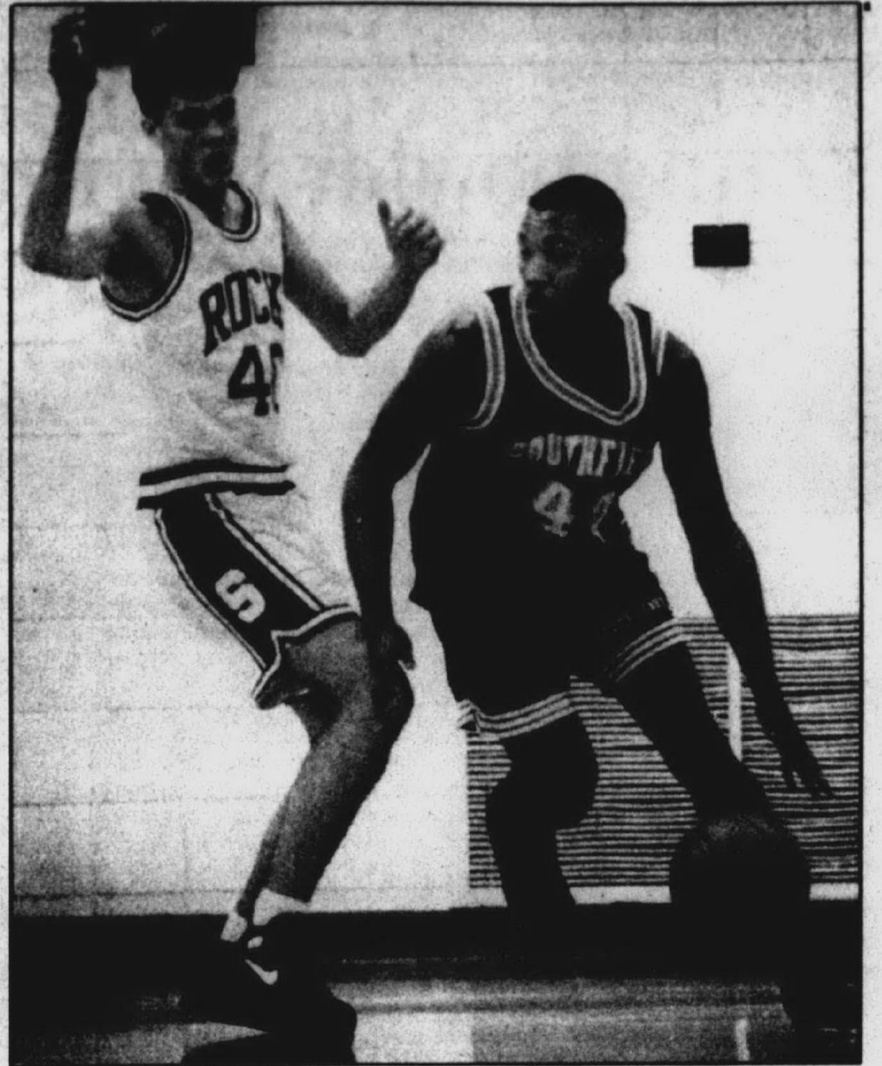

The closest Southfield got in the third quarter was six (42-36) after a basket by Harris but the Rocks went on a 10-4 run to end the quarter, capped by a two-handed dunk by Head on an out-of-bounds pass from teammate Jeff Lamb.

"I need to look at the tapes and see what the hell we're doing differently from last year (when Southfield was 15-6 with similar personnel)," South-

Senior tri-captains Matt Erickson, Scott Helmstadter and Chris Lynn lead the Rocks.

Erickson is a three-year state qualifier and was a member of the Rocks' 200-yard medley relay team that set a school record two years ago. Erickson has a personal best time of 2 minutes, 7 seconds in the 200 Individual Medley. Erickson, who has swam a personal best time of 23 seconds in the 50 butterfly and 55 in the 100 butterfly, also swims freestyle.

"Matt is a real good sprinter in the fly and that really helps you in the medley relay, making it go pretty good," Olson said. "But we want his 100 fly to be as good as his 50 fly."

# Canton cagers spank Monroe for 2nd win

Plymouth Canton went down to gain its first basketball victory of the season.

The Chiefs got 28 points from junior guard Matt Paupore and 22 more from senior guard Brad Paskievitch in a 75-56 boys triumph Friday at Monroe.

Paskievitch hit six 3-pointers, while Paupore contributed five.

"They had uncontested shots and knocked them down," Canton coach Dave Van Wagoner said. "Offensively we played as a team and moved the ball around."

Junior forward Bryan Whittle contributed 13 points and 10 rebounds for the victorious Chiefs, now 1-1 overall.

Van Wagoner was also pleased with the play of sophomore point-guard Mark Sanborn.

"Even though he didn't score a point, he did a great job of controlling the offensive tempo and he played great defense," said the Canton coach. "I thought we came out and played defense tonight with tremendous intensity. We also blocked out on the boards and that got us going."

"It feels good to get a win, especially when you're a young and inexperienced team."

Kelly Lofton paced Monroe (0-2) with a team-high 24 points.

**WAYNE 68, REDFORD CC 64:** Wayne Memorial held on down the stretch to gain a 68-64 victory Friday against visiting Redford Catholic Central.

The Zebras are now 2-0 on the season, while CC falls to 0-2.

Wayne nearly blew a 12-point lead midway through the final quarter as CC made a late charge. But the Zebras held on for the victory.

Both teams shot poorly from the free

throw line — Wayne (16 of 32) and CC (12 of 25).

Senior guard Antonio Dodd led Wayne for the second consecutive game with a team-high 20 points. Teammate Rod Hardison, a junior forward, contributed 17.

Senior center Brian Paluk paced the Shamrocks with a game-high 26. Marc Gondek, a senior forward, contributed 10.

**HARPER WDS. 70, PLY. CHRISTIAN 62:** Plymouth Christian made only six-of-17 free throws and lost three players to foul trouble in a non-league defeat Thursday against the host Pioneers.

Both teams have 1-1 overall records. The Eagles led 21-12 after one quarter but Harper Woods pulled within 27-25 at halftime with a 15-8 second-quarter advantage.

Harper Woods outscored Plymouth Christian 17-14 in the third quarter and 21-17 in the fourth quarter.

Senior forward Jason Neil led Plymouth Christian with 21 points and 12 rebounds. Neil's half-court shot just before the halftime buzzer gave Plymouth Christian a two-point lead. Sophomore forward Aaron Jones added 11 points and freshman forward Jamie Neil contributed nine.

Harper Woods was led by Brian Gykstra's 22 points.

# Krueger eyes state title in return to mats for CC

**PBS special aims to keep kids off drugs**

Other than the overworked analogy to a fried egg, do children have a healthy understanding of what dangerous drugs can do to a helpless brain cell?

A new 3-2-1 *Contact Extra* titled "Brainstorm: The Truth About Your Brain on Drugs" plays better than a speech from mom or dad and is much more fun to watch. Premiering Monday, Dec. 14, in prime time on most PBS affiliates, "Brainstorm" gets directly to the gray matter at hand by skillfully weaving sight, sound and science into a package children will understand and enjoy.

Stephanie Yu and Z Wright do a fine, understated job as hosts of the special by avoiding the somber melodrama that generally accompanies such serious matter. Armed with plenty of intriguing experts and gigantic, flashing models of neurons, endorphines and the like, Yu and Wright let the facts speak for themselves. The only real editorial comes in short interviews with recovering children, who seem too humbled by their experiences to do more than simply relate the tragedy of addiction.

Powerful footage of brain surgery in progress and an eye-opening chemical breakdown of street heroin also effectively convey the program's message. Children have always been told that drugs are poison, but on "Brainstorm," they're told exactly why.

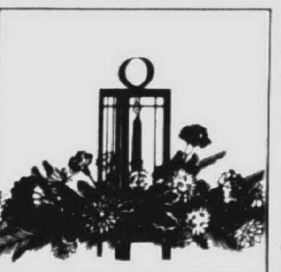

## TIME OUT

### HBO corners boxing's greats outside ring

By Michael Scogin

Through the years, many champions have worn the heavyweight boxing crown, but only a few have transcended the sport to become American institutions. On Sunday, Dec. 13, and Thursday, Dec. 17, HBO chronicles some of these larger-than-life figures in *In This Corner ... Boxing's Legendary Heavyweights*.

George Foreman is the host of the unusual boxing documentary, which uses never-before-seen footage and in-depth interviews with boxing historians, trainers, authors, fighters and announcers to focus on the character and personalities of six champions of the ring. From John L. Sullivan to Muhammad Ali, all began their careers as mere mortals but ended them as American icons. *In This Corner* doesn't linger on the wins and losses, height, weight and reach of the men, but the character each exhibited.

All the boxers are well represented in the hourlong special, from Ali, the showman and humanitarian, to Jack Johnson, the controversial figure who was the first black athlete to cross the color barrier. Joe Louis is seen as a gracious champion who put his country first in time of war, and Rocky Marciano is the blue-collar bruiser who became a hero to America's underclass. John L. Sullivan was the nation's first post-Civil War hero, while rugged Jack Dempsey had a renowned weakness for Hollywood's leading ladies.

### Damone, not Dean, got girl; soap vets reach 'The Heights'

**Q: Please settle a dispute between my sister and me. She says singer Vic Damone's first wife was singer and actress Anna Maria Alberghetti. I say he was married to Pier Angeli, they had one son and she committed suicide at the age of 39. I would appreciate it if you would let me know who's right.** —Mary A. Campisi, Casa Grande, Ariz.

**A:** Vic Damone was born Vito Farinola on June 12, 1928, in Brooklyn, N.Y. He broke into show business on Arthur Godfrey's *Talent Scouts* show, which aired in the 1940s, tying for first place on one night's competition. His good looks and singing voice landed him the romantic lead in a number of subsequent films and attracted the attention of Pier Angeli (Anna Maria Pierangeli), an aspiring Italian actress who had also dated James Dean. Damone and Angeli were married in 1954 with a jealous Dean petulantly revving his motorcycle outside the church. The marriage was short-lived, and after their divorce just four years later, Angeli moved back to Europe. She died of an overdose of barbiturates in 1971.

Perhaps your sister remembered Angeli's given name, Anna Maria, and confused her with Alberghetti. Take it easy on her — she is your sister.

**Q: I am a big fan of the Dallas Cowboys. My favorite player is Troy Aikman. I was hoping you could tell me where to write him and tell him how big a fan I am.** —C.C., Nacogdoches, Texas.

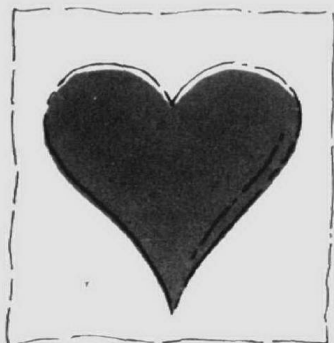

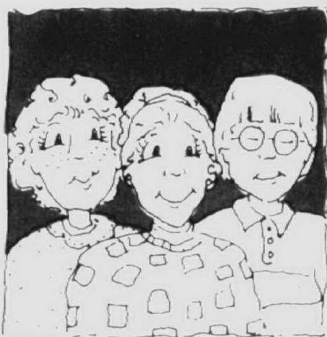
