## Golf course work will be delayed



The club house at Hilltop Golf Course needs renovation, but the Plymouth Township budget just doesn't have the money in it for the work.

Plymouth Township's supervisor agrees with the township building director that the Hilltop Golf Course clubhouse needs attention. But supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy said budget constraints will likely rule out replacement of the clubhouse this year, urged by building

director Charles McIlhargey.

"The key is we can't afford to build," she said, adding that some attention to the clubhouse is likely needed.

Keen-McCarthy recently toured the clubhouse, after McIlhargey earlier this month urged the building of a new one.

The clubhouse is sagging, decayed and leaky. "I've found that it's

structurally unsafe," McIlhargey said earlier.

"The concern is for safety of people who are out there," Keen-McCarthy said.

"We also need to determine what our options are in terms of repairing or totally replacing the facility," she said. "There may be some repairs or things we can do to gain a little more time."

Higher on a list of priorities are the hiring of three firefighters to staff the new third fire station and the balancing of the township budget, she said.

Still, "We're going to have to address it in some fashion. Financing is a key

issue," Keen-McCarthy said.

McIlhargey has suggested building a new \$650,000-\$700,000 clubhouse by borrowing from the township water fund and paying the fund back with \$50,000 of the annual \$250,000 in golf course proceeds over several years.

But Keen-McCarthy stressed that golf course revenue that goes into the township's general fund "is used to pay for police, fire and general operations."

Engineer Edwin Shymanski has cited several problems with the structure, including roof leaks, rotted wood beams, bulging or buckling walls and a deteriorating plywood floor and wood floor footings.

## Pursell's Plymouth office closes door

The boxes are packed and the movers are coming today to empty the office of Plymouth's hometown U.S. Congressman, Carl Pursell.

"When Carl called to tell me he was retiring, I didn't cry then," said Pursell's longtime field representative Denise Radtke.

But when they packed up the phones Dec. 15, she couldn't hold back a tear or two.

Radtke, who came to the Plymouth office when it opened nearly 10 years ago, said her greatest satisfaction in the job "was helping people resolve their problems with bureaucracy."

"Many of the things a congressman helps with are personal in nature,"

she said, declining to talk of some contacts.

But she does recount the time she helped a man, 67, obtain a copy of his birth certificate to get a passport. That was when the man learned for the first time he was adopted.

When the Plymouth office opened, on Main Street across from Central Middle School, Radtke came from

Pursell's Livonia office to run it. She had recently moved to town.

Plymouth became a main office, as it is centrally situated in the 2nd Congressional District, soon to be altered by redistricting.

Radtke said she was struck that compared to Livonia, more people

## Would-be thieves damage cement owl

"Apparently someone tried to pick it up and it was too heavy," Boomer said.

When the Boomers' awoke Wednesday morning, they found the 75 pound, 2 feet tall, cement owl removed off its perch on their brick decorative wall outside their Canton home. The owl's ears had been broken, as well as part of the base. The step leading into the driveway where the would-be robber dropped the heavy bird also was broken, Boomer said.

The Boomers, who live in the Ca-

valier North subdivision, were excited Monday morning when they awoke to find that one of the two cement owls that had been stolen two years ago had been returned with a Christmas card attached. The card writer apologized for taking the pair of owls and signed it, Love, your neighborhood hoodlums."

The Boomers were glad to get at least one of the birds back and were planning to repaint the owl and per-

haps buy another owl to match if they could find one.

Unfortunately, Frances Boomer only days ago had remarked that the return of the owl was a sign of the Christmas spirit. The latest robber, however, didn't even bother to leave a note.

"Oh well, it would have been real nice. We had a day of fun. I'm just not going to put the owl up anymore," Boomer said.

# Man held in failed toy theft

A 23-year-old Detroit man was arrested Monday for attempting to break into Toys R Us on Haggerty.

# Leaders to discuss services

The heads of five local communities met for a second time last week to talk about shared government services — and agreed to meet again on Jan. 8.

At the meeting were Plymouth Mayor Robert Jones, Plymouth Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy, Canton Supervisor Tom Yack, Northville Mayor Chris Johnson and Northville Township Supervisor Karen Baja.

At a Dec. 22 meeting, the group created subcommittees to discuss issues related to merging services. The subcommittees include finance, governance, personnel, and administration.

In January, the five community leaders will review areas each group will address with community department heads, unions and boards, according to a statement released on behalf of the five government leaders.

"The plan is to eventually produce a generic process acceptable to all five communities leading to potential inter-governmental cooperation," according to the statement.

Officials in some communities are seeking merging of fire departments, among other services.

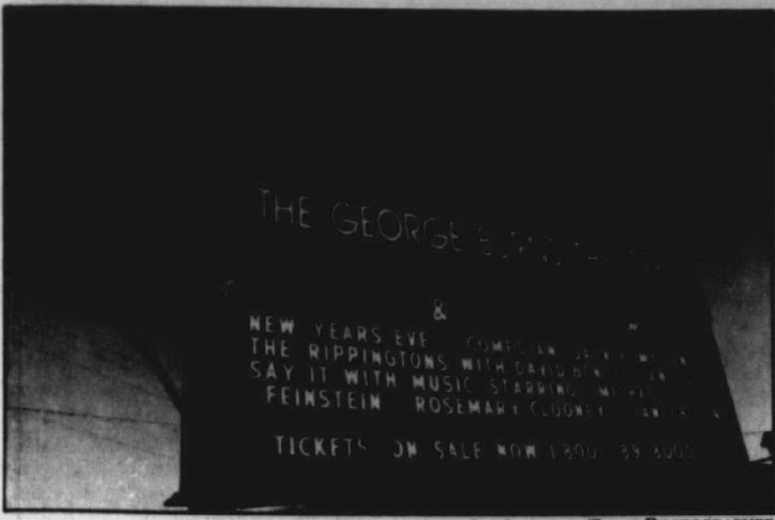

## If you drink a bit too much, don't drive — call for a ride

Have a safe New Year's Eve. If you drink too much and need a ride home, there's a way. And if you decide to have a party and you want to keep your guests sober, there's a way.

Volunteers from the Wayne and Oakland chapters of Mothers Against Drunk Driving will provide rides to people on New Year's Eve. And there is no charge for LifeRide.

"It's only for those who have no rides home," according to Kathleen Kennedy, MADD administrative assistant. "We encourage people to assign a designated driver or make arrangements to have a party."

Last year MADD volunteers gave 663 New Year's Eve revellers rides in Wayne and Oakland counties. That was 29 percent more rides than the year before.

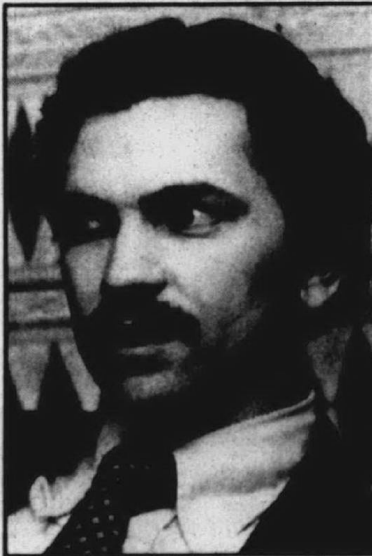
Some area police departments will offer rides to those who can't drive home safely. For instance, Redford Township police will drive home people who need a ride in Redford and surrounding communities. However, Redford Township Police Chief Dave Parker says the department doesn't have the resources to drive people 30 miles or farther.

Livonia police will drive people who can't drive and need ride from a Livonia location to another Livonia location. But they won't travel out of the city limits.

Westland Police won't provide a ride but will call a cab for folks unable to drive.

Tammie Colling, information officer with Canton Township Police, said: "If you're out drinking and driving in Canton, police will offer you a ride to the police department — through the back door." She added: "We suggest you be responsible and have a designated driver."

Realizing you're drunk is the first and best step. A lot of people

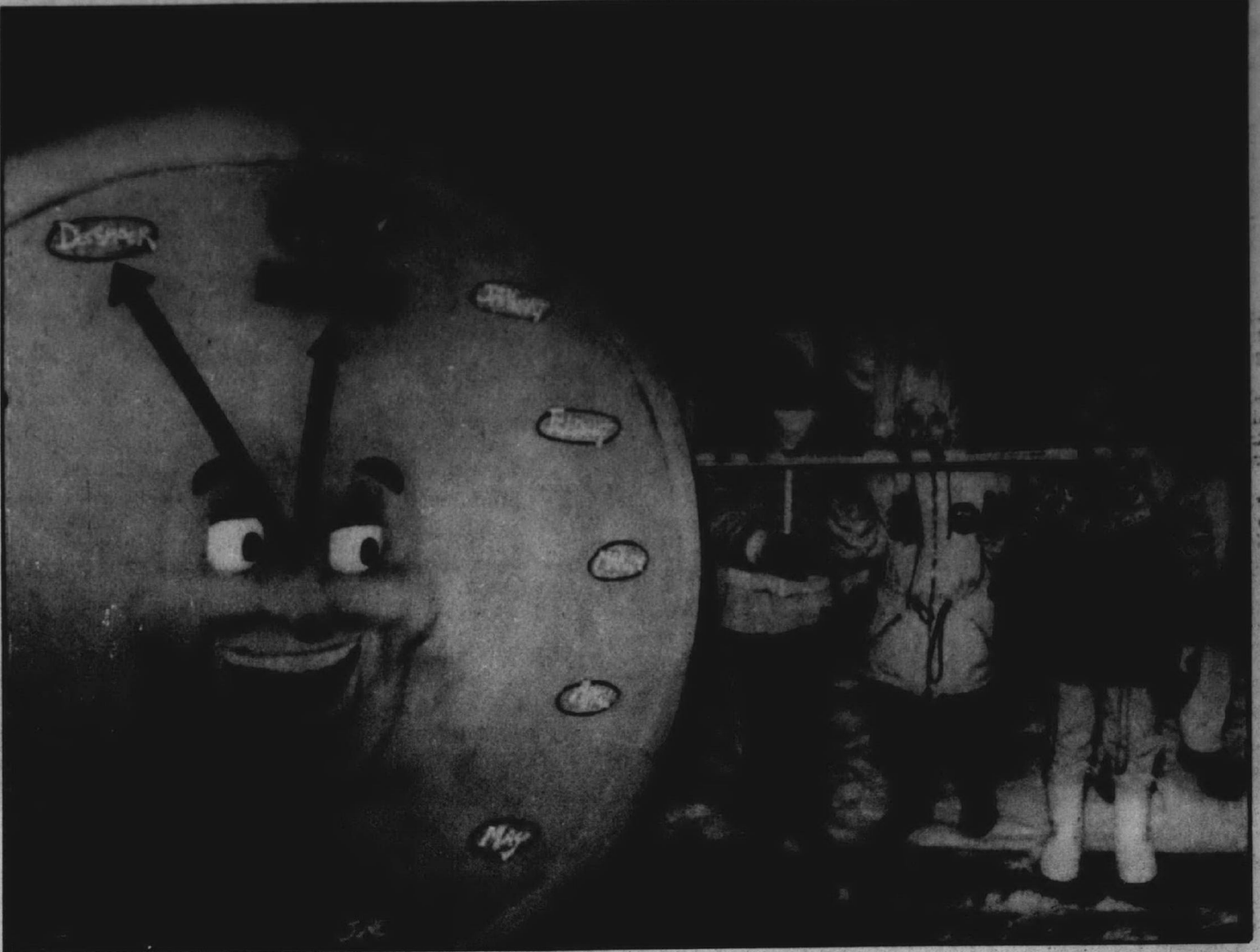
who are legally drunk think they're fine, because their mental image of someone who had too much to drink is throwing up or passing out, according to John Farrar, executive director of Livonia Counseling Center, Westland Counseling Center and Northville Counseling Center.

"One of the things I've learned is the bottom line is it takes a heck of a lot less to be legally intoxicated than people realize," he said. "People don't know how many drinks it takes to be legally intoxicated or how long you have to wait. Once they get busted and come to see me they learn the hard way."

Pointing to a 20 percent reduction in drinking and driving accidents, Farrar said, that's a great start, but there's still too many people dying as the result of an alcohol related accidents.

If you don't want to worry about your guests leaving your party and driving home drunk, have them spend the night or save yourself the trouble and consider serving non-alcoholic drinks.

Don't despair, there are alternatives — lots of them.

Weather permitting, you can charter a helicopter and see the metro area from on high. But beware, it's a pricey way to usher in 1993. The cost ranges from

\$600 to \$800 an hour. And on special holidays there's usually a minimum. Ski celebration

If you prefer to keep your feet on the ground — go skiing. Mt. Brighton, in Brighton, has a torch light procession planned for skiers celebrating the new year on the slopes. Ski patrol and instructors will etch "1993" in the snow.

If that sounds too cold, take refuge indoors. A lot of people spend the night at the movies. Most theaters, including Westland Showcase Cinema and AMC Laurel Park 10 Theaters in Livonia, are open.

"New Year's Eve night is really busy," according to Tim Jahn, Canton Cinema 6 manager. "A lot

of people go out to dinner and go to a movie. Most movies are out by midnight and they can be home before midnight. And you can buy the ticket at noon and walk in at night."

## Seniors meet the families they adopted

For the first time in the senior community's short history, the approximately 100 senior adults adopted two single-parent families — through the Salvation Army — for Christmas. And they got to meet them and have lunch with them Tuesday.

The seniors adopted Annette Pierce and her 5-month-old daughter, Sarah, and Karolyn Beardslee and her 15-month-old son, Jonathan.

"What's really good about this is that a lot of the seniors don't have families," Kwasny said.

Lunch for the families and seniors was only the beginning. Lo and behold, in walked Santa Claus. "I can honestly tell you each and every one of our residents has been very good this year," Kwasny said.

Immediately Santa headed toward the Christmas tree surrounded by gifts for the two families. And one by one Jonathan and Sarah took turns receiving their gifts.

"This is for them as well as the families," Cheri Yargus, Carriage Park manager, said of the seniors who watched the children open their gifts.

The senior community always had a Christmas party. "But this year we wanted to get more involved with the community," Yargus said.

In addition to the Christmas

gifts, the seniors donated two laundry carts full of goods for a Christmas dinner for the two families. "We never expected to get that much," Kwasny said.

As far as next year, the senior community already plans to adopt more families at Christmas. "We'll try to expand with a couple more families," Yargus said.

## Geake backs veto of retirement bill

Sen. Bob Geake, R-Northville, was one of several Republican senators who signed a letter to Gov. John Engler urging him to veto HB 4975, which would make legislators eligible for retirement benefits earlier than the current 50 year age requirement.

"There were some good aspects to the proposed changes for the retirement system," Geake said. "However, the change in eligibility requirements went too far. I think the public made their views very clear on the matter as well. The governor is doing the right

thing for the people of our state."

The legislation would have offered taxpayers some relief by self-funding a portion of health care benefits for legislators with legislative salary contributions. The bill dropped to 65, from 70, the combined service-age qualification for legislators to begin collecting pension benefits and permitted retired legislators to collect benefits prior to age 50.

Legislators currently contribute 9 percent of their salary to the retirement fund.

# Nature nuts are self-serving, greedy people

Let's face it, most of what passes for environmentalism in suburban Detroit is nothing more than property values and greed.

And the reporting of such issues is at best shallow. Sure, we see a picture of some tree hugger standing in front of a wooded area screaming about some developer who is taking aim at the property.

But chances are that tree hugger lives in a \$200,000 house adjacent to the wooded area and sees his or her property values going up, if a new subdivision doesn't go in.

That's not usually reported. It's tiresome.

And then there's landscape racism. It's always woods and wetlands that receive attention. That's because few tend to appreciate the beauty of a former farm field with its grasses, bushes and wildlife.

The reason for this is we've been beat over the head for too long by the granola-eating fanatics from the Sierra Club and the Greenpeace save-the-animal -of-the-day types.

But there is an antidote to granola, it's a book by poet Gary Snyder, "The Practice of the Wild."

While the fanatics envision a world without people and berate us for our intrusion on nature, Snyder gently shows us how we could live at peace with the land. And that includes land that doesn't have trees, wetlands or a great view.

This isn't to say that Snyder is some sort of front for Dow Chemical. This guy is a radical environmentalist, but he does it without the heavy doses of shrillness that usually come from such folks.

Part of his gentleness comes from studying people who live in their envi-

ronments. He has spent much time studying native Americans, and approaches this subject without the cheap sentiment of feeling sorry for these folks, which usually comes when our attention is turned to American Indians.

Instead of dwelling on the obvious ultra liberal tripe of how we displaced

Indians, he looks to these people for methods of living with the earth.

One quote that jumps off the page is from a Crow elder who said: "You know, I think if people stay somewhere long enough — even white people — the spirits will begin to speak to them. It's the power of the spirits coming up from the land. The spirits and the old powers aren't lost, they just need people to be around long enough and the spirits will begin to influence them."

The idea here is that all landscape can be important in our lives, not just the Rockies and that all animals can be significant in our lives, not just the whale.

The quote is also a great antidote to the idea that all land is real estate waiting to be developed or re-developed. And the idea in it can be applied to the city of Detroit where pheasants

have been sighted near the eastern Market.

There is much talk about re-developing Detroit, which conjures up ideas in our minds of a building on each vacant lot. We're thinking real estate again.

Re-development in older neighborhoods could also mean nature preserves, not not parks, preserves. Parks are mowed to death by workers and turned into baseball fields.

As the Crow elder said, we should live in a place for a while and listen to the spirit of the land.

It would certainly be a welcome change.

# New telephone technology rips off consumers

Technology, I still insist, always costs more and frequently does a poorer job than the old ways.

And when telephones are in the act, get ready to be ripped off, gouged and skinned.

Consider the promotion in one of the daily papers — a telephone horoscope. For \$1 a minute, you can get Joyce Jilison; for 95 cents a minute, Jeanne Dixon.

To chat with a "live psychic/astrologer/reader," the price is a penny — for the first minute. Then it becomes \$2.99 a minute. I don't know how many minutes they tie you up because my religion frowns on astrology, but I suspect a believer's phone bill would be hefty.

If you like comics, you can order facsimile copies of Dick Tracy, Gasoline Alley and Archie for \$2.50 a minute. Things are expensive by telephone.

But for 25 to 50 cents, you get horoscopes, comics, the news, features, the wisdom of columnists, sports, display ads, classified ads and coupons by buying an entire newspaper.

Are you a gambling person? Are you a gambling person who likes to throw money away? There's a telephone contest just for you.

If you spell 30 or so words correctly, you win big money. It costs about \$3 a minute, and the tiny words in the TV commercials say a typical call takes five minutes. That's a \$15 wager.

The Michigan Lottery is not a particularly good deal, as wagers go, but the payback is something like 45 cents on the dollar. Or you can bet the horses, where the payback is in the upper 80s per dollar, and the ticket price is only \$2.

Those gambles are a lot safer than a \$15 telephone call where you don't know the odds, don't have impartial judges and never learn who won.

So much for the extremely high cost of technology. What about its failures?

Believers in technology made fools of themselves on general election day. I've already told you the story of the primary where Kalamazoo County held up the entire state because of a private contractor's computer glitches.

Apparently things were even worse up north on Nov. 3. George Weeks, my brother political columnist at The Detroit News, tells the story of that snafu:

The state House of Representatives is split 55-55 between the two parties. In the 104th District, Democrat Geraldine Greene lost her race by a scant 261 votes and demanded a recount.

"The problem is that there were so many foulups in Grand Traverse County that two-thirds of the votes could not be recounted . . . Part of the problem is that the voting machine company just 10 days before the election added an 'updated' computer chip to the machines that on Election Day occasionally printed commands to which election workers were not trained to respond."

Candidate Greene likened it to "an out-of-body experience. As a friend said, if this had happened (overseas), they'd send in United Nations troops to oversee the count," Weeks wrote.

Note well: Ballots could not be recounted. If they had used 1940s paper ballots, there would have been no problem.

Not only do computers count votes slowly, they fail to count accurately, and you can't get a recount.

In my nightmares, Michigan Bell Telephone Co. sells the state on voting by telephone — you know, punch 1 or 2 for president, 11 or 12 for state rep, etc. Bell refuses all recounts, claiming it's exempt from the Freedom of Information Act.

And the staggering cost of all the calls (the government must pay for elections) bankrupts the state.

The cost is brushed aside by the salesman's contention that medical science is too arrogant to admit the "commonsense" approach being sold to you is superior to "highfalutin" science.

BRAISED LAMB SHANKS

- 5 lamb (or veal) shanks (7-8 pounds)
- Seasoned flour for dredging the lamb
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 3/4 cup garlic cloves, coarsely chopped
- 6 onions, each cut into eighths
- 1 cup dry red wine
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 6-8 new potatoes, peeled and halved
- 4-6 carrots, peeled and cut into thirds

Dredge the lamb shanks in the flour, shaking off the excess. In a large skillet, heat the oil over moderately high heat until it is hot but not smoking. Brown the lamb shanks in the oil, transferring them as they are browned to paper towels to drain.

Add the garlic and the onions and cook the mixture over moderate heat, stirring until the onions are softened and begin to turn a golden color.

Return the lamb to the skillet, add the wines, the broth, salt and pepper to taste, and bring the liquid to a boil. Simmer the shanks, covered, stirring occasionally, for 1 1/2 hours and then add carrots and new potatoes.

Continue cooking for an additional 1 1/2 to 2 hours, or until meat is tender. Serves 5.

TOSSED VEGETABLE SALAD

- 1 red pepper, diced

- 1 can artichoke hearts, quartered (13 ounces)
- 1 can hearts of palm, sliced (14 ounces)
- 1-2 tomatoes, diced
- 1 can water chestnuts, sliced (8 ounces)
- 8-10 black olives, sliced
- 3-4 leaves fresh basil, chopped
- Salt to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper to taste
- Olive oil
- Balsamic vinegar

Prepare the vegetables and combine in a bowl. Drizzle a small amount of olive oil over the vegetables so that they are very lightly coated and then add a splash of balsamic vinegar. Toss gently and season with salt and freshly ground pepper to taste.

HENRY'S CHEESECAKE

- 1 1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 2 cups sugar, divided
- 1/4 cup butter, softened
- 3 pounds cream cheese, softened to room temperature
- 9 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- juice of one lemon
- 1 1/2 cup sour cream

Make crust by mixing together graham cracker crumbs, 1/4 cup sugar and softened butter. Lightly butter 10-inch round cake pan that is 3

of Mothers Against Drunk Driving, Oakland County Chapter, said MADD isn't against people drinking, just drinking and driving.

"We work in conjunction with First Night in Birmingham, and AAA to try to advocate alternate outings on New Year's Eve. Make it a family outing, and set an example by not drinking. Have a theme party and make non-alcoholic drinks. Add a candy cane to the glass so people won't feel like they're missing something. Make drinks exciting."

First Night in Birmingham is an alcohol-free festival of the arts the whole family can enjoy on New Year's Eve. It begins at 4 p.m. and ends at 11:30 p.m. with a midnight celebration in Shain Park.

First Night admission buttons are \$7 and allow you access to First Night Entertainment sites. Children under 5 are free. For information, call 540-6688.

If you do plan to drink on New Year's Eve, McNeil encourages people to make arrangements for a designated driver. "People need to look ahead and consider the consequences of drinking and driving. If you do drink and haven't made arrangements for a driver, you can call our hot line for a free cab ride. It will be operating 9 p.m. New Year's Eve to 5 a.m. New Year's Day. Call 353-1993."

"Last year 11 people were killed in 11 crashes in Michigan during the Christmas and New Year's period," said Jerry Basch, AAA Michigan Community Safety Services manager. "Half of those fatal crashes involved alcohol."

If you're hosting a New Year's Eve party, or going to one, here are some things to consider.

When you are at a party, know what you are drinking. Holiday punches and egg nogs often have a higher alcohol content than beer or wine.

Offer plenty of foods high in protein and carbohydrates, such as cheese, cookies, pastry, pasta, and nuts which help retard the absorption of alcohol into the bloodstream.

Serve alternative beverages such as non-alcoholic beers, non-alcoholic champagnes, and wines, fruit juices, and mineral water.

Fruity frozen ice cubes add a festive touch to drinks and punches. Freeze pieces of fruit in ice cube trays with water or fruit juice and add as special holiday gems to "on-the-rocks" beverages.

Stop serving alcohol at least an hour before the party is to end.

inches high (not a springform pan.) Press crumb mixture into bottom of pan and shake on sides to coat.

With an electric mixer, beat cream cheese with remaining sugar until smooth. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add vanilla, lemon juice and sour cream, beating until mixture is smooth. Pour cream cheese mixture over crust. Place cake pan in another large, deep pan. Pour water around cake pan to a depth of about 1 1/2 inches. Bake in a 300 degree oven for 2 hours or until center is set.

When cake is baked, chill several hours or overnight in refrigerator. To remove cake from pan, place cake on a burner that has been heated and turned off, for one minute. Carefully turn cake out onto a 10-inch plate and then turn it right-side-up onto serving plate.

## Death and departure doesn't keep Generals from playing

The Generals' Tony Cole will always remember Aug. 17, 1991, as the day his bassist Flip Cherven died in a car accident.

Ask Cole about the death and he'll make sure you remember it.

"Let's see," he says. He pushes his shirt down around his shoulder to reveal a tattoo with Cherven's name and date of death inscribed. "Aug. 17, 1991," he says. He fixes his shirt. Case closed.

Cherven will never be out of mind, however. Cole and the other members of The Generals have remembered Cherven while trying to march on.

"The first couple gigs without him were tough. (But) once things started, we were really rocking," Cole said.

The death is one in a long line of setbacks for the Ferndale-based band. Since its inception in 1986, The Generals have also gone through five lead guitarists and a handful of vans. Although Cherven's death devastated the band, The Generals decided to stay together in honor of the late bassist. Drummer Matt Washburn says there's one other basic reason.

"What it comes down to is we're the best rock band in Detroit and we can't deny ourselves or anybody else of that," he says with a grin.

Believing the group was back on track, The Generals released a self-titled tape in mid-1992 on Chaos Network/Eastlawn. The excitement over the release was soon hampered, however, when the group's then-lead guitarist John Liccardello quit. The next guitarist lasted one gig. Now with Lenny Pops on lead guitar, the group's foundation is solidly, yet cautiously, planted.

"We wrote songs that we can do without (a lead guitarist) if someone dies or bails," says Washburn.

Cole says the changes delve much deeper. "More than before, we're emphasizing vocals and melodies," he said. "It was more of a decision of what we like and what we think will work for us."

The Generals also collaborated with outside songwriters for the first time — Jimmy Doom from the Almighty Lumberjacks of Death, and guitarist/vocalist Kevin James' cousin from New York, Zudhi K.

"We've selected help from all (musical) sides to put the best possible songs on stage and on tape," Cole said.

But they wouldn't have the opportunity if The Generals hadn't mustered the courage to go on after each mishap.

"After each setback I've found there's a healing process," Cole said. "After awhile you get this urge. Even if it's in the basement. Eventually it leads to the stage."

# 'Lover' offers sex without substance

She leans over the ferry railing, a floppy-brimmed fedora shading her eyes, her mother's oversized dress clinging in the heat of the summer afternoon. From a shiny black limousine, a rich man watches the girl, struck by her innocent beauty, and approaches her shyly and cautiously.

"The Lover," which has plenty of foreplay like this and even more explicit sex, gives us the structure and satisfaction of a porno movie but without the cheapo lighting and camera work. I suppose there are worse ways to spend a winter evening than between the sheets in a steamy Saigon bachelor's room.

The film is based on a novel by Marguerite Duras, the popular French writer responsible for, among other things, the screenplay for "Hiroshima, Mon Amour" (1960). But "The Lover," her best-selling and partially autobiographical novel first pub-

lished in 1984, is amazingly hackneyed. The people populating the film are referred to only by their place in the story, not by name. So the young English girl in 1929 Vietnam is simply The Young Girl. Her lover is The Chinese Man. The impersonality makes a valid point about the characters and their inability to relate outside the bedroom, but it doesn't help audience's empathy with their situation.

English model-turned-actress Jane March is a bit older than the film's girl of 15 and she plays the part fairly effectively. But in the movies, where a new nymphette sizzles on screen every couple of years or so, she is simply this year's model.

In a film where surface emotion and surface texture is everything, she looks fabulous. So does Tony Leung as the title character, who impresses the girl so much because he has virtually no responsibilities in life except to make love and eventually marry a wealthy Chinese virgin.

Director Jean-Jacques Annaud previously brought us the laughable "The Bear" and has similar trouble here getting expression

from his lead performers. The love scenes are indeed steamy, but there is always the sense of lumbering manipulation, as if he's again trying to move bear (here bare) meat into proper position.

The movie does provide some emotional dynamics in a scene where the girl's mother and brothers meet the man for dinner and take leering advantage of his hospitality. They don't approve because he is Chinese; they know that he is more than just a friend. Still, they exercise varying degrees of denial when it comes to stopping the gravy train.

"The Lover" is also beautiful to look at. Cinematographer Robert Fraisse shows us the muddy expanse of the Mekong River during ferry crossings. The scenes in the man's bachelor's room (the place wealthy men take their mistresses) are dimly lit, with bustling peasant shadows cast against wooden blinds. Street noise clatters just outside.

"The Lover" was made by a French director and producer in English for MGM. They have obviously seen the box-office receipts generated from erotic epics like Japan's "In the Realm of the

Senses." Here, they can deliver the goods in a European package without all those annoying subtleties.

At least a quarter of the film (the press kit boasts one-third) is either sex or preparation for sex. There is a detailed depiction of the girl losing her virginity; a scene of unbridled, can't-even-make-it-over-to-the-bed lust and a rape, where the girl clenches her teeth and then asks the man how much this act would have cost him in a brothel.

Fortunately, we are spared another potential rape scene with the girl's creepy brother, which always seems to loom on the horizon. Violent and opium-addicted, he is the most interesting character in the film, yet he, like the other family members, is only handled peripherally.

# Guns change response for coming of age in the '90s

Dear Readers, Often, when someone learns that I am an advice columnist, they have a question ready and waiting for me.

That happened this week. I had been at a meeting and when it was over the man next to me asked, "What is it you write?" I answered and he immediately told me the following story. After you hear it you will understand the subject's importance and why I have included it in this column.

The man who requested advice has a 15-year-old stepson who was recently threatened by a boy at school. The boy doing the

threatening says he owns, and is well known, to have a gun. Worried, the stepfather and his wife went to see the principal who told them that while he is aware of the problem he cannot do anything about it. He said that in other interactions with the family of the boy with the gun, he found them to be mistrustful of everyone but their son and supportive of the boy's attempt to "protect himself."

I asked the man with this problem if he understood how his stepson had gotten into this mess. He said that his stepson fought with another boy about some inconsequential matter and that when he won the loser engaged the boy with the gun to help him get revenge.

When he told his stepson to ignore any further attempts to in-

volve him, his stepson said that would make him look and feel like a coward; he couldn't run away and feel good about himself.

The questioner said he feels even greater concern because he knows his stepson has a big mouth and that his birth father supports him in his belief that only by fighting back can he "be a man." So, my now friend wanted to know, "What should he do?"

(This is a story that took place in a suburban school not in the city where there is less surprise about young boys using guns.)

I am puzzled as to how to answer the concerned stepfather. One reason is that as women, my friends and I have not had this typical boys' experience of being bullied. As women, we have not had to learn how to react in these situations because they do not come up for us.

As I understand, many boys encounter the experience with a bully and their parents do not know

how to help them because of this new entity in our culture, the presence of a gun in the hands of children.

In the "old days" the advice usually given to a young boy was that he should not run away from the bully. Running away merely increased the bully's victimizing the "sissy." Often, when the boy refused to be intimidated by the bully and would fight back, the bully would not pick on him anymore and would look for a new victim.

Such a scenario would allow the boy to gain confidence in himself and in his feelings of maleness. This could be overdone in cultures where being macho was very important. It even turned out that sometimes the former "sissy" became a bully.

With the presence of guns, giving advice to stand and fight can be foolhardy, if not fatal. America has become a violent culture with the possession of hand guns proli-

ferating at a rapid rate. The United States has the highest rate of violent crimes in the industrialized world.

I do think that the school system has the responsibility to do something about banning the possession of guns in school but that won't protect this young man outside of school.

The government also has a responsibility in this major problem. When Thomas Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence he based it on the belief that individuals should learn to control themselves, using values, such as the 10 Commandments and the New and Old Testaments. He felt that in a democracy the government should step in to handle those individuals who are incapable of governing themselves.

To me, our government agencies, schools, legislature and executives need to more seriously ad-

dress this problem of gun control. Until this happens, parents need to become more involved. They need to take a more active role to protect their children from dangers that can lead to the death of young boys.

It is no longer safe for boys to go through the rites of passage that had, before now, been a part of their identities as men. We no longer live in a society in which normal aggressiveness can be worked through. It is important to work to make our world a safe one again.

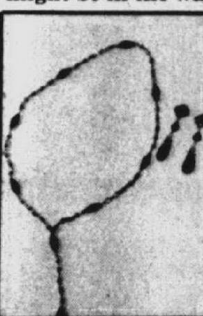

Butler pointed out that unlike other menswear markets in the United States, Detroit-area men are big on double-breasted suits.

"Double-breasted suits account for 30-percent of our suit sales here," he said. "And many of these are in all-season wool and gabardine fabrics."

Butler said men can look for suit jackets and pants to be sold separately soon.

"This way, the customer can pick out pants with a waist size that fits, and a coat that fits. I think most men will appreciate these trends. We're very excited about them at Anton's."

## No holiday cheer for sad Ocelots

**T**is the season to be jolly... Honest. It is. To be painfully accurate, these could indeed be the final days of joy for Dave Bogataj, as pitiful as they seem.

It takes a long step away from conventional understanding to describe what Bogataj has endured thus far this basketball season as joyous. His Schoolcraft College men's team is, in his own terminology, "O-for-December."

If you're mathematical, that adds up to seven losses in seven December games. Merry Christmas.

The Ocelots are 3-10 overall (they've lost eight straight, going back to November). They are 0-4 in the Eastern Conference.

Unless something very dramatic happens very quickly, they will finish this season as they have the last four under Bogataj's direction: with a losing record, a non-threat in the playoffs.

In heartless, but precise, terms — a patsy. How can this team start so optimistically each season, then fold up? Said Bogataj, showing his frustration: "Every year, it's something different."

There is one similarity in the last 4½ years of losing, however, and it happens every January. Which also tells you how things can get even worse this year. Because January is here.

### Time to pay dues

Anyone remotely familiar with SC men's basketball knows what happens the first week of January. First-semester grades are posted.

Every year, that has cost Bogataj players. And on a team that rarely possesses the talent to compete in the Eastern Conference, the loss of any player hurts.

A couple of seasons ago, Bogataj lost so many players at the semester break, he had to recruit the guy working as his scorekeeper — Lee Hunt, a soccer player at SC — to join the team.

Believe me, it was a pitiful sight. No slight to Hunt — he wasn't a bad ballplayer. Before joining the SC varsity, he used to play with a bunch of us old guys on Thursday mornings, and he was easily as good as any of us.

But, somehow, I don't think many in that group would fare too well against Eastern Conference-caliber talent.

Nor is this a slam at Bogataj. His position borders on impossible. Academic standards are higher at SC than at most other NJCAA schools in the state, the enrollment is lower, and administration support and interest is, at best, mediocre.

So — a nightmare without an end, right?

### Worse times ahead

The situation is deteriorating. Bogataj started pre-season practice with 14 players on his roster. Eight remain.

Two (Quincy Mitchell and Jon Fitzpatrick) were casualties before the season opened. Jerome Carter played a couple of games, then tore up his knee. He's out for the year.

Frank McCray played several games, but a series of family tragedies forced him to leave. Craig Bowdry and John Lathan each had a disagreement with their coach and were suspended, for what Bogataj said were "disciplinary reasons."

Of the eight remaining, only one — center Jarvis Murray — played at SC last year. Now the question is, how many will be around when SC returns to action Jan. 9 at home against Alpena CC.

If Bogataj loses just two players — and that would match SC's previous best performance since he's been coaching — he would be left with six.

Who would play? Well, one guy has been added: Dan Stevens, a 6-foot guard from Plymouth Salem. Problem is, Stevens never played for Salem's varsity.

The Ocelots have been unable to win with a full team. How will they win with even less? Bogataj will tell you, they play 30 to 35 minutes of solid basketball a game, but for five minutes they go vacationing and it costs them.

"I don't know what it is," said Bogataj. "You can go back every game to a point where we go four or five or six minutes without scoring. It's perplexing."

It's worse than that, really. It's shameful. This team has talent, with Murray, Courtney Williamson, Steve Whitlow, Bryant Markowicz, Mohammed Abdrabbah and Vincent Turner. Those guys can all play.

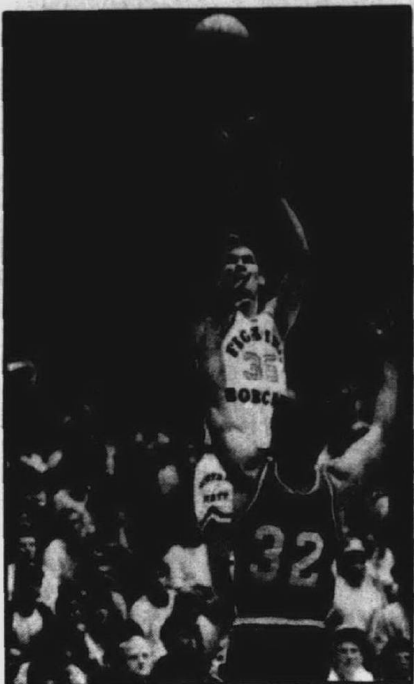
Problem is, they never show up at the same time. They certainly never did during December. Consistency is lacking.

How Bogataj maintains an upbeat attitude — and he does — amazes me. It will amaze me even more if everyone on the team makes grades, injuries subside, and there's a team-wide winning attitude implant.

Then, maybe, SC can turn this thing around. But that's a big maybe.

# All-Area '83: 10 years after



Ten years ago they were the brightest stars on the Observerland basketball scene. They left the area for various colleges and universities, each armed with an athletic scholarship and a dream.

One is a pilot. Another is a successful auto executive who spends his off hours counseling high school kids. One is still chasing a dream of playing in the NBA. One has forsaken all sports except hunting. Another is still trying to find and forge a career path.

Ten years ago, they were the brightest stars on the Observerland basketball scene. Mike Maleske of Redford Catholic Central, Lewis Scott of Redford Bishop Borgess, Tom Domako of Livonia Stevenson, Dave Houle of Plymouth Salem and George Sibel of Redford Thurston comprised the 1982-1983 Observer All-Area team.

"This is good," said Scott. "I always wondered what paths all these guys chose. I'll bet we've gone in all different directions."

Yes and no. All five went to college with athletic scholarships. Four of the five endured injuries at some point along the way. Three of the five left athletics somewhat bitter or disappointed. Four of the five are married but none have children. Some made a smooth transition from athletics to the real world. Others struggled. All seem to be living happy and productive lives.

Here, then, is a 10th anniversary look at the 1982-1983 All-Area basketball team — where have they been and where are they going.

### MIKE MALESKE

The 17.5 points and 13 rebounds per game he averaged during his senior year at CC proved to be his peak production, thanks to a host of injuries, most notably a surgically re-

paired knee that all but ruined his four-year career at Bowling Green.

"I knew right then that my basketball career was pretty much over," Maleske said of the surgery in his sophomore year. "When the mind wants you to do something and your body won't do it, it's time to go."

The problem wasn't so much the sudden ending of his basketball career but the uncertainty of what to do next.

"I kind of foundered a bit," he said. "I figured I would just play ball in Europe or someplace and postpone getting a real job for as long as I could. Luckily, I found aviation."

He found aviation the hard way. He left Bowling Green without a degree and took a job as a ramp laborer at Detroit Metropolitan Airport.

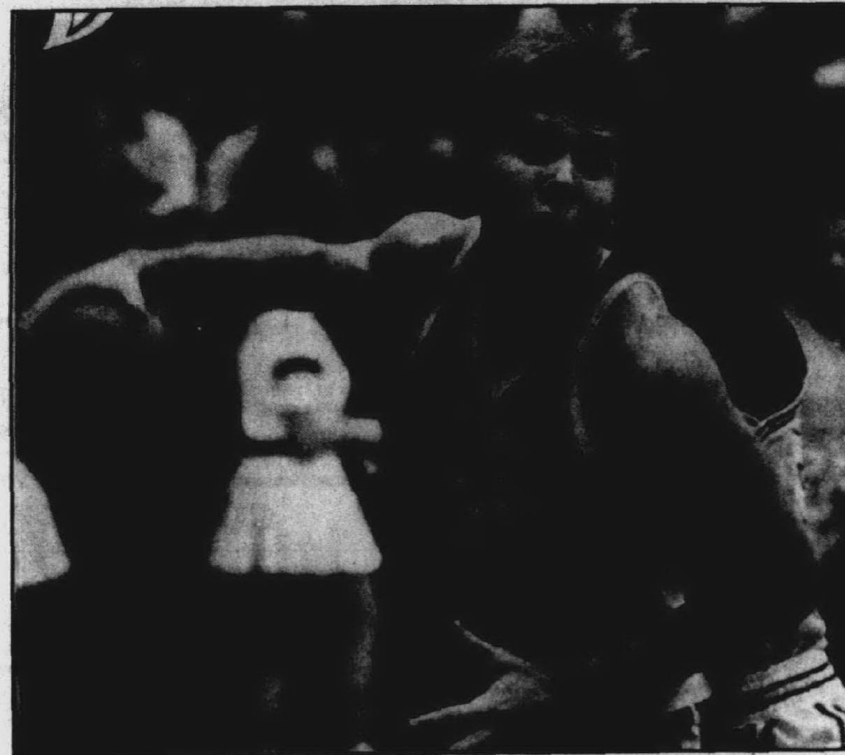
"I would be out there busting my butt and I would look up and see those pilots," he said. "I said to myself, 'I can do that.'"

He saved his money and enrolled in flight school in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He learned his lessons so well that he became a flight instructor. He got a job with a commuter airline in Miami flying shuttles to the Bahamas and Key West. But the airline, Bar Harbor, went out of business two years ago.

"The major airlines require their pilots to have a four-year degree, so I had to go back to Bowling Green and finish up," he said.

Maleske, who has been commuting back and forth from Bowling Green to southern Florida where his parents and his girlfriend of four years live, will have a degree in aeronautic technology in May.

"I'm doing real well right now," he

said. "Once I get the degree out of the way, I'll be back on track. You might want to put in the article that I'm available and looking for work."

### LEWIS SCOTT

In the All-Area story 10 years ago, Borgess coach Mike Fusco was quoted as saying that Scott was totally focused in two areas: basketball and books. And now, after a highly successful basketball and academic career at Eastern Michigan University, Scott is coming back to his old stomping grounds as living proof that

basketball is only a means to success, not the end itself.

"Myself and Joe Gregory (another basketball standout from Borgess) come back to the school about once a month to talk to the kids. We are trying to establish a mentor program," said Scott, who is 18th on Eastern's all-time scoring list with 1,014 points. "We try to let them know that they don't have to play ball to do OK for themselves. We have to get these kids to realize that academics and basketball are related. We

## Atchinson walking on air as walk-on at Notre Dame

Please, what ever you do, don't pinch Susie Atchinson. Because if this is all a dream, she does not want to wake up. Not yet.

There she was Monday night, in a Notre Dame basketball uniform, sitting on the bench. It was late in the first half. Notre Dame was losing to Georgia and its top two shooting guards were in foul trouble. Suddenly, Irish coach Muffet McGraw looks down the bench.

"Susie, go in for Sherri," she says.

Just that quickly, Atchinson is in the game. In the game. Not garbage time, mind you. We're talking quality minutes here. Quality Division I women's basketball minutes.

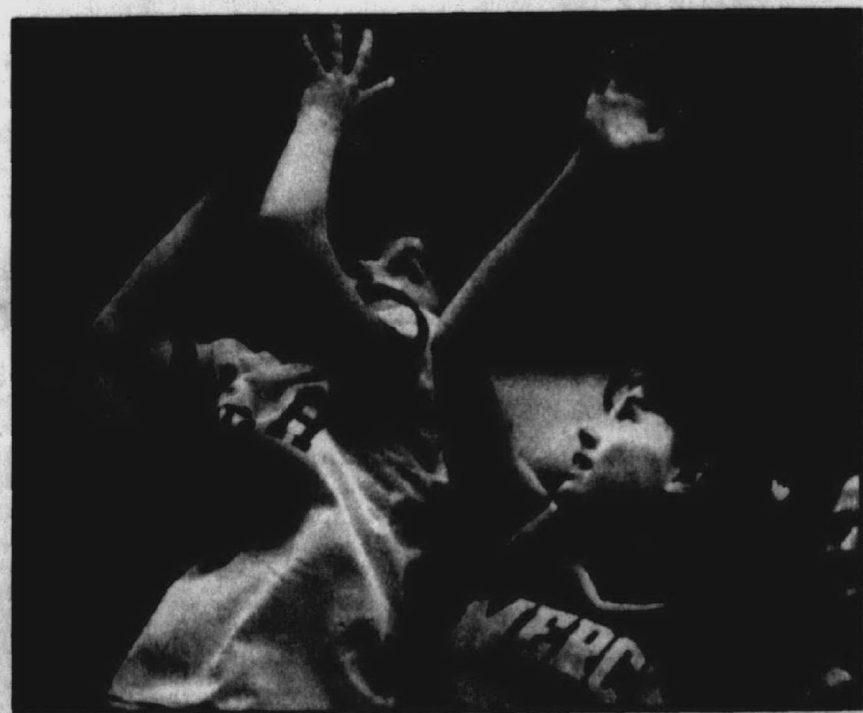
"Sometimes I wake up in the morning and I can't even believe this is happening," said Atchinson. Believe it.

Atchinson was a solid, over-achieving shooting guard at Farmington Hills Mercy from 1988 to 1991. She was a tireless worker and a dangerous perimeter shooter. But she was not what you would classify as a hot Division I prospect. In fact, the only scholarship offers she got were from small, far away Division III schools.

"I had a fine high school career. I played four sports and I really enjoyed it," said Atchinson, who is from Plymouth. "But I figured that was the end of it."

She went to Notre Dame, figuring to put her academic skills (she was salutatorian at Mercy, carrying a 4.0 grade point average) to work. But basketball wouldn't leave her alone. She played nearly every day at The Rock, Notre Dame's intramural facility.

have to get them to look at and prepare for life after basketball."

Scott is the perfect role model. After graduating from Eastern with a degree in business communication, he took a job with Pepsi. He worked his way up the ladder there for three years before landing a job as district manager for the Chrysler Corp. He is currently in charge of the largest sales district in the Metro Detroit area. He was married last August and lives in Southfield.

"I hope they can look at me and see that I'm doing real well without playing basketball," Scott said. "I want them to know that the lessons they learned in sports relate to the real world. The things that make you great in business are hard work, the ability to work with people and be a part of a team. That's what these companies are looking for."

"I was lucky that when I was at Eastern I had people who helped me keep focused on academics. When I was done playing, I still had two credit hours left before I could graduate. I chose to come back and finish school. Who knows, if I didn't, I might still be chasing that NBA dream."

### TOM DOMAKO

The dream still burns for Domako, but it is starting to flicker.

"I'm kind of at a crossroads right now," said the 26-year-old, who left Stevenson and became somewhat of a folk hero at Montana State University. "I'm getting on in years as far as basketball goes. There are so many things I want to do with my life. I want to go back and get my degree. I want to raise a family. I don't want to be 55 years old and have a kid in high school, you know?"

But, "But I still think there is a lot of good basketball left in me."

Fate has intervened to give Domako some time to weigh all his options. He was playing in the top professional league in Belgium and averaging 22.5 points per game. But last week his step-mother died and he wanted to come home to be with his father. The Belgium officials wouldn't let him leave. He came home anyway and he was cut

from the team.

"This would be a good time to change course in my life," he said. "If I decide I want to change course."

He's certainly traveled a long and exhausting road since leaving Stevenson. He was a star at Montana State, averaging better than 21 points per game his junior and senior seasons. He was first team all-Big Sky both years and was the league's most valuable player his junior year.

"I scored 27 points in my first college game and from then on people started giving me all kinds of nicknames," he said. "They called me Downtown Domako. They called my three-pointers Livonia Layups. They called me Instant Offense."

He played a year in France before the Houston Rockets came calling before the 1989-1990 season and gave him a guaranteed contract.

"That was my one legitimate shot at it," he said.

But he wound up a victim of the numbers game and was the last person cut from the team. Since then, he's been a basketball vagabond, traveling throughout the Continental Basketball Association, making stops at Cedar Rapids, Columbus and Rockford, before heading out to Belgium.

Domako's production has steadily decreased over the years, largely due to a bum knee.

"I knew I needed surgery, but I couldn't afford to miss the games," he said. "Time is money."

He finally had surgery to repair the knee last fall and his game has shown a marked improvement.

"I wish I would have had it done years ago," he said. "I can't remember when it has felt this good."

So, maybe he'll return to the CBA and give it one more shot. Or, perhaps he and his wife of four years, Vicki, will move back to Montana where he'll return to school and pursue a degree in computer science. But for the time being, he's going to stay home and be with his father.

"I told my agent not to do anything until after the holidays," he said. "Then I'll see what's next."

### DAVE HOULE

Sometimes it ends too quickly

and you don't get time to shift gears and chart a new course.

Houle was at the top of his game one minute, down and out the next.

"It was hard," said Houle, who went from being a 215-pound basketball star at Salem to a rugged 275-pound offensive lineman at Michigan State.

"When you are in a lifestyle as structured as sports, and then all of a sudden you are working and you're married — it's just not the same thing. It's tough."

Houle became the starting right tackle on one of the best offensive lines in Big Ten history. He, along with Tony Mandarich, Bob Kula and Pat Shurmer, anchored a line that propelled Michigan State to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl victory in 1987. Behind that line, the Spartans averaged close to 300 yards rushing per game and Lorenzo White amassed 1,572 yards and 16 touchdowns.

He was drafted by the New York Giants and then the spotlight was shut off. First, a series of shoulder injuries forced him out of pro football. Then came allegations that Houle, Mandarich and other Spartans took steroids; allegations that Houle vehemently denied, allegations that were never proven.

"The way everything ended left a bad taste in my mouth," Houle said. "I don't play sports anymore and I don't watch football on television. I haven't been back to East Lansing. It hurts too much. When it's over, it's over."

Don't misunderstand. Houle isn't unhappy with his life. Like everyone, he just has some bad memories. But the future, he says, is bright.

"I've got a good job (he's the safety director at Harlan Electronics in Southfield), a nice wife (Michelle) and nice home in Plymouth," he said. "Things are real good for me now."

### GEORGE SIBEL

Speaking of bad memories. Sibel, after averaging 22.5

points per game and leading

Thurston to its first Northwest Suburban League title in 20 years, had a brief and unhappy college career at Siena Heights.

"I didn't really enjoy it," Sibel said. "I ran into some biased coaching."

After spending a season on the junior varsity, Sibel became a starting guard for Coach Ben Braun (now at Eastern). He played well, but when a couple of other players rejoined the team after sitting out academic suspensions, Sibel was relegated to the bench. He didn't return to Siena for his junior season.

"Everything is politics," he said. "I've learned that no matter what you do, no matter how good you are, you are expendable. There's no loyalty."

Sibel finished his education at Madonna University, getting a degree in criminal justice. But he has yet to settle on a career path. He's currently a security officer working the afternoon shift at the Ford Rouge Plant.

"I am keeping my eyes open," said Sibel, who married the former Julie Hultquist of Redford. "It's hard to find an occupation where there are jobs. I'm looking at a bunch of things. You are very lucky if you can do in life what you really want to."

He thinks he might like to try robotics. He may return to school and study computer science or seek a master's degree in corporate law. He is looking into a job as a probation officer.

"My life is moving full-speed ahead," he said.

As for athletics, Sibel is the scourge of the area's recreation leagues.

"My brother (Jim) and I kill," he said. "We played in this four-on-four league and I averaged 52 points per game. My game is better now that it was in high school."

He has put on about 30 pounds of muscle mass since his high school days and he has developed an inside game.

"I can still dunk," he said. "Not bad for a 27-year-old."

"Sitting out that year made me realize how much I loved playing basketball," she said. "I played against some of the girls from the team at The Rock and they kept telling me I should try out for the varsity. It was something that was always in the back of my mind, wondering whether or not I could make it. I just decided that I would rather have somebody tell me that I couldn't play. I needed to prove to myself, either I could or I couldn't. Really, I had nothing to lose."

So, last fall, she and 12 other non-scholarship players showed up for varsity practice all hoping to win the one open spot on the team. The selection process was grueling, both mentally and physically.

"It was so crazy, nobody would tell you anything," she said. "Every day I would check the list for my name. I told myself, if it was there, fine; if not, well, at least I tried."

The list shrank to eight, then to four, then to two — but Atchinson's name was always there.

"One day I showed up to practice and I was the only one there," she said. "The manager started asking me what shoe size I wore and I said, 'Does this mean I made it?' She said, 'Oh, yeah, didn't anybody tell you? Congratulations.'"

Atchinson has never been told why she was chosen over the 11 other girls.

"I don't think it had much to do with talent," she said. "I think it had more to do with desire and attitude. I wanted it so bad that I would do anything to make it. I wasn't frightened by the amount of time it took or by all the hard work and I think the coaches

picked up on that." What the Notre Dame coaches saw in Atchinson were the same qualities that Coach Larry Baker marveled at and applauded her for at Mercy.

"She is a terrific self-made player," Baker said. "When we first saw her, we were impressed by her quickness. But she broke her leg and had to sit out her entire freshman season. And the quickness was gone. She had to re-create her style of play. As coaches, we really appreciated her attitude and dedication to the sport. And I am sure she impressed the Notre Dame coaches with what she will bring to the practices in terms of her talent and her attitude."

So far, Atchinson has played in two games. She got four minutes against Purdue on Dec. 4 (no shots, one foul, one turnover) and two minutes against Georgia on Monday (no statistics).

"I basically just ran up and down the court," she said. "But it was great. I was ready to play and I was under control. I never thought I would get to play when the game was still on the line. But now I figure, hey, I can play an integral part for this team. If they get in trouble, I can help."

Atchinson isn't allowing herself any delusions. She knows nothing is guaranteed. She isn't counting on winning a scholarship and she knows that she will have to win her spot back again next season.

"I just want to help this team be better in any way I can," she said. "If I can help in a game, great. If not, then I will help in practice. I'm not even thinking about next year. I still can't get over all that's happened this year."

## 'Good Morning America' expands to Sundays

Anchor, producer happy  
with prospects for new show

"This is on the record, right?" asks Bill Ritter, ABC's newest anchorman. Ritter is a 20-year veteran of print and broadcast journalism who's nothing if not cagey in a question in a question-and-answer session.

What's "on the record" in this case seems innocuous enough: It's just Ritter's response to a comment by his new producer, Jerry Liddell, that the Los Angeles-born reporter-anchorman was entertaining more than one offer of a network job when he accepted the post of co-host for ABC's latest news venture, *Good Morning America/Sunday*.

Read an "Aw, shucks," into the record, followed by an "I was in a very flattering position." Not that Ritter isn't enthusiastic about his new job on a show debuting Sunday, Jan. 3, on most ABC affiliates.

"I think the different thing about this job is gonna be getting people who don't watch Sunday-morning television to watch it. The overwhelming majority of people in America don't watch Sunday-morning TV at 8 o'clock."

True enough. Fully 80 percent of U.S. homes leave the TV off at that hour. The 20 percent who do watch already have two network talk-show choices: the long-established *CBS Sunday Morning* show with Charles Kuralt and NBC's 6-month-old *Sunday Today* show, anchored by Scott Simon and Jackie Nespral.

Producer Liddell takes a realistic view of the competition.

"We were never going to compete with Kuralt directly. I'm not going to go after his audience; I can't, he owns them; they're his."

The *Today* audience, however, is fair game.

"By default, 41 percent of (*Sunday Today*) viewers are (weekday) *Good Morning America* viewers. So, we want 'em back."

"I don't think they're necessarily addressing the weekend audience," Liddell says of *Sunday Today*. "They're giving you what you get Monday through Friday. I think they're not taking advantage of the

Sunday audience in particular."

Sunday morning, according to Liddell, is "when you take time" to enjoy family, newspaper and breakfast. So he plans to open *GMA/Sunday* with a few minutes of conversation between Ritter and co-anchor Dana King on a "modified, cosier" version of the weekday set.

"We won't necessarily be driven by events of the news," Ritter adds. "We're gonna try to be looking ahead as much as we can."

To Liddell, this means leaving political heavyweights to David Brinkley, whose roundtable show airs later in the morning. "You can let other people talk to the suits, and we'll talk to the people the suits affect."

With just an hour to fill, Liddell plans for a news segment to follow the opening. Then he'll give the middle of the show to feature stories generated by his anchors.

"What I hope to be my signature pieces," Ritter says, "are what I call day-in-the-life pieces. I've done it several times and found it very rewarding."

Speaking of King, Ritter fairly gushes. "We get along really well. It's really a blast to be with her.

She's funny and she's smart and she's very quick. We get along, I would say, much like a brother and sister get along.

"She has the ability to talk directly to people the way that few people have. People really enjoy her."

Such camaraderie may be a key to the show's success; certainly *Sunday Today* has suffered without it. The differences behind the scenes at each show are telling, too. *Today* formed a separate staff for weekends, while budget-conscious ABC simply hired a few more staffers for the established *GMA* crew.

"Our staff," Liddell says, "is totally integrated; they (*Today*) created this guerilla outfit on the side, and I think logistically that was probably a mistake."

For the record, then, Ritter is as happy as a newsman can be with the prospects for his untried new product.

"We are not under any pressure (from the network) to pull this off in a month. We have one-hour show, not a four-hour blockbuster with two hours a shot (like *Today*). They're very smart about this. It's a long haul kind of thing."

## The Learning Channel gets preschoolers ready to learn

### Commercial-free block costly, but worth it

In its report "Ready to Learn: A Mandate for the Nation" the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Learning revealed that 35 percent of America's children are not ready to learn when they begin school. The report stressed that better pre-school preparation would make use of television as a teacher.

In direct response to the Carnegie report, cable's The Learning Channel has created *Ready, Set, Learn!*, a commercial-free block of weekday programming geared to give preschoolers a head start on reading and social interaction. *Ready, Set, Learn!* commences on Monday, Dec. 28.

The block of six half-hour series has as its host children's singer/songwriter Rory. The cornerstone of the block is *The Magic Box*, a reading program designed by education pioneer Wendy Pie that uses "whole language" techniques as well as a rap-singing Alphabet Soup Woman to hook 2- to 5-year-olds on the ladder to literacy.

*Bookmice* reinforces the desire to read with its cast of puppets and people in a library setting. The fun of learning is the focus of *Iris*, the *Happy Professor*. The birdlike puppet *Iris* covers such subjects as the four seasons and the ocean with song and humor. The puppet players of *Kitty Cats* attend to problem solving and honing interpersonal skills, while the multicultural adults of *Join In!* encourage their young viewers to share activities

with them, learning social lessons along the way. Finally, there's an old favorite, *Zoobilee Zoo*, offering animal-costumed actors who employ song, dance and magic to foster imagination in viewers.

The Learning Channel, with a subscriber base of 18 million in the U.S., hopes to pick up some foundation funding for *Ready, Set, Learn!*, just as similar public-television programs do. The revenues lost from the exclusion of commercials from the block will be substantial, but TLC's aggressive promotion of *Ready, Set, Learn!* to parents' groups and day-care centers is likely to attract new viewers to its regular slate of commercially sponsored programming.

## Another television year has flashed before our eyes

### Remembering the good, bad, notorious of 1992

1992 will be remembered as a year of transition in television. For NBC, it was the year the network lost Johnny Carson. Bill Cosby and, not coincidentally, its grip on the No. 1 spot in the ratings. NBC's decision to jettison *The Golden Girls*, *Matlock* and *In the Heat of the Night* in favor of shows aimed at an audience of young adults has stalled the peacock out at No. 3.

Currently, the network is on the brink of canceling the Emmy-winning series *I'll Fly Away* and losing Emmy-winning late-night host David Letterman. New *Tonight Show* host Jay Leno is locked in a ratings duel with syndicated challenger Arsenio Hall. Bright spots include a long-term deal with comic Dana Carvey that even George Bush would call prudent.

Meanwhile, a resurgent CBS caught fire with the Winter Olympics and continues to occupy the No. 1 spot despite the fact that its spring season netted duds (One CBS executive quipped that the network should have a Pet Cemetery retrospective weekend featuring the late *Scorch*, *Tequila and Bonetti* and *Fish Police*) and the fall slate has failed to produce a new top-10 series.

1992 had its highs and lows for viewers, too, though some, like Howard Stern's interview series on E! Entertainment Television, can only be judged in the eye of the beholder.

Prominent in the plus column was the appearance in July of TV's first disabled game-show contestant, Rebecka Sessions, who competed on Nickelodeon's *Family Double Dare*. The network saddened fans, however, by firing *Ren & Stimpy* creator John Kricfalusi and disbanding his team of merrily demented animators. With fewer than 10 completed episodes on celluloid, the series will probably become a collector's item.

The wide world of cable found new frontiers in The Sci-Fi Channel and The Cartoon Network, while HBO made room for *The Larry Sanders Show*. Garry Shandling's canny send-up of desk-and-couch talk shows. The Learning Channel came to the aid of

educators with *Teacher TV*, and MTV brought us *Real World*, a soap opera *verite*.

The age of live television returned this year on Fox's Super Bowl Sunday *In Living Color* Halftime Show and the series *Roc*. The fourth-place network is No. 1 in animation, too, with the hand-drawn hit *Batman* joining *The Simpsons* in prime time.

On PBS, *Sesame Street* planned an episode dealing with divorce but found breaking up too hard to do and shelved the project. On Main Street, Vice President Dan Quayle spent some quality time blasting Murphy Brown, CBS' ace fictional journalist, for having a baby without a husband. But for family values, there's nothing like the team of Roseanne and Tom Arnold, whose heavyweight clout convinced ABC to move No. 4-rated *Coach* from Tuesdays to Wednesdays to make room for *The Jackie Thomas Show* following *Roseanne*.

Aaron Spelling became a one-man trend in the summer and fall when the success of *Beverly Hills, 90210* spawned similar shows, all with addresses in the titles, on Fox, NBC and CBS.

Finally, there are the obituaries. Series that have come and gone this calendar year include *Boys of Twilight*, *The Fifth Corner*, *Grapevine*, *Home Fires*, *The Human Factor*, *The Human Target*, *Julie*, *Mann & Machine* and *Vinnie and Bobby*. Remember?

### Bowl games dominate sports week

College football wraps up another season this week with a flurry of bowl games that includes an outright battle for the national championship.

ESPN begins a bowl marathon with Washington State against Utah in the Copper Bowl on Tues., Dec. 29, while Hawaii and Illinois face off in the Holiday Bowl on Wednesday, Dec. 30. New Year's Eve features a doubleheader of patriotic proportions as Wake Forest faces Oregon in the Independence Bowl and Air Force meets Mississippi in the Liberty Bowl.

On CBS, Arizona meets Baylor in the John Hancock Bowl Thursday, Dec. 31, and Penn State takes on Stanford in the Blockbuster Bowl the following day.

The annual controversy over who's No. 1 should be at least partially silenced this year when top-ranked Miami faces No. 2 Alabama in the Sugar Bowl New Year's Day on ABC.

The national championship game caps an ABC gridiron tripleheader, beginning with Georgia and Ohio State in the Florida Citrus Bowl and a great matchup between Michigan and Washington in the Rose Bowl. On NBC, unbeaten Texas A&M takes on Notre Dame in the Cotton Bowl, Syracuse meets Colorado in the Fiesta Bowl, and Florida State and Nebraska match up in the Orange Bowl.

The fun ends Saturday, Jan. 2, with North Carolina and Mississippi State in the Peach Bowl on ESPN.

## LET'S TALK

Orbach started on stage;  
many a 'Madame X'

**Q: I am interested in knowing a little about actor Jerry Orbach and an address where I can write to him. —C. Foulsham, Newport, N.H.**

**A:** Orbach, who replaced Paul Sorvino on NBC's *Law & Order* earlier this season, was born on Oct. 20, 1935, in Bronx, N.Y., but grew up in Waukegan, Ill., the son of a restaurant manager. He gravitated to acting while at Northwestern University and figured to make it big in New York upon graduation. His rise wasn't immediate, but after a break as an understudy on Broadway in 1955's *The Threepenny Opera*, stage work began to come with more frequency. He was nominated for a Tony award for *Chicago* and finally won the prize in 1968 as the star of *Promises, Promises*. In the late 1980s, he appeared on television's *Murder, She Wrote* as Harry McGraw, which led to a brief spin-off titled *The Law and Harry McGraw*. Among his more prominent films are *Prince of the City*, *F/X*, *Someone to Watch Over Me*, *Dirty Dancing* and *Crimes and Misdemeanors*. **Q: Please assist me in finding the title of a movie I saw long ago. It's about a woman who is either accused of murder, is an alcoholic or both. At the end of the movie, she is defended in court by a man she does not recognize as her son. I've been trying to identify this movie for over two years. —Chip Kinney, High Point, N.C.**

**A:** The plot you describe is a story written by Alexandre Bisson that was made into a 1929 movie directed by Lionel Barrymore titled *Madame X*. This picture was actually a refilming of earlier efforts in 1906, 1916 and 1920, which would also be remade in 1937, 1966 and in a television movie in 1981. As you can see, there are quite a few versions of this story (the 1929 version even appeared on television as *Absinthe*), and only you know which one you originally saw. All concern the plight of a wife and mother who is cast out of the family to fend for herself on the streets by the cruel father. Years later, a vagrant, she is defended on a murder charge by a hotshot attorney — her son, who grew up believing she was

dead and never realizes she is his mother. I'm betting you saw the 1966 version with Lana Turner in the pivotal role. It also starred John Forsythe, Constance Bennett and Burgess Meredith. Ring any bells?

**Q: During World War II, a film was made regarding a Sullivan family with several boys in the Navy. A younger teenage son wanted to join but couldn't without his parents' permission, which was finally given. All the brothers were on the same ship, which went down and claimed their lives. I believe the film was based on truth. Can you tell me the name of the film, who played in it and if it's available on video? —Florence Sullivan, Jacksonville, Mo.**

**A:** That film is 1944's *The Sullivans*, also released as *The Fighting Sullivans*. The story was based on actual events, and the movie effectively conveys the heroic, tragic story.

Five Sullivan sons from Waterloo, Iowa, were quick to join the Navy after the attack on Pearl Harbor, and all eventually wound up on the same ship stationed off the Solomon Islands. In an instant, their ship was sunk, claiming all five. The Navy went on to name a ship after them and made a policy change unconsidered before the tragedy: Siblings were no longer allowed to serve on the same vessel at the same time. The picture stars Anne Baxter, Thomas Mitchell, Selena Royle and Edward Ryan. It is available on video.

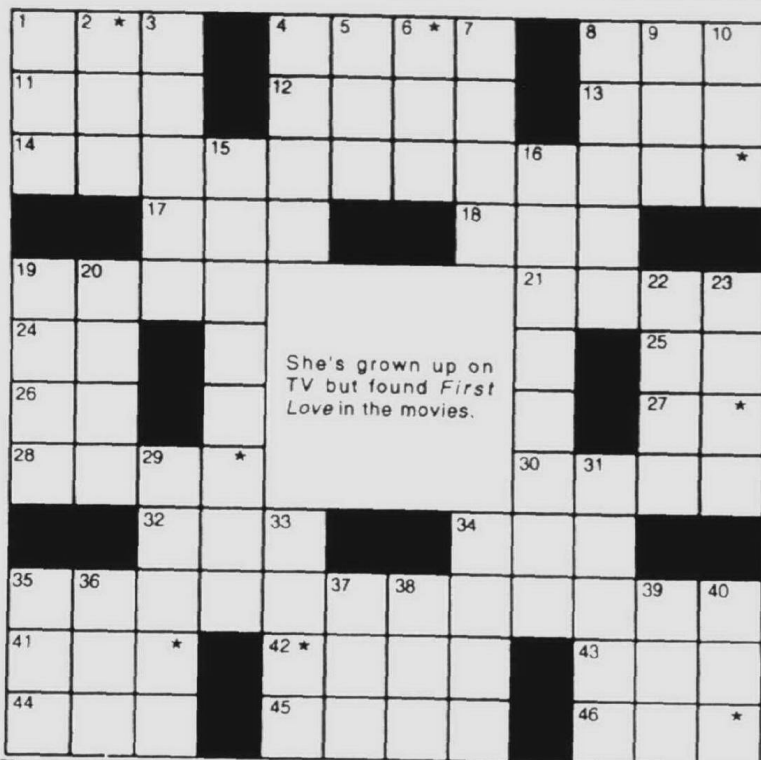

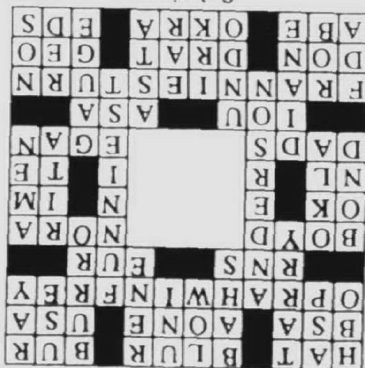

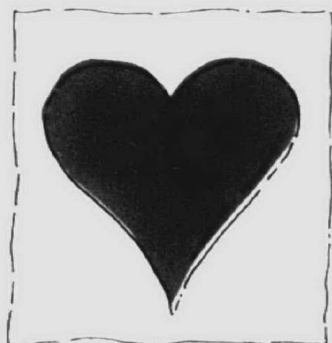
