## Pastor seeks win-win outcome

The pastor for Temple Baptist wants a win-win situation even though the church is suing Plymouth Township because the planning commission denied its site plan.

Even though Temple Baptist Church is suing Plymouth Township, church leaders are anxious to "work with the community to come up with a win-win situation," said Temple Baptist senior pastor Brad Powell.

The Redford Township church, looking to build on 56 acres it owns on the southwest corner of North Territorial and Ridge roads, sued after the township planning commission rejected its site plan.

Facing a Nov. 1 court date, Plymouth Township is in the process of

hiring a law firm that specializes in land use for religious purposes.

"Even though we are in litigation, we are not doing it with vengeance, vindictiveness, or because we are angry with the township," said Powell. "By not allowing us to build what we have asked to build, our rights have been violated as it relates to freedom of use of private property. It has nothing to do with the religious right to practice."

"We really have two things," he said. "First of all, we have asked for absolutely not one variance as it re-

lates to the statute, township ordinance, or Michigan law as it relates to building on that land. The second thing is, we are told we are too big a church for Plymouth Township, which is not necessarily too American. America was formed on the right to worship freely, not bound by other people's views on how worship should be done."

Plymouth Township officials met in closed session last week to discuss the hiring of a law firm, and to plan

## Woman's body discovered in park

The naked body of a Roseville woman was found at 10:40 a.m. Friday in the woods near the southeast corner of Hines and Haggerty in Hines Park.

The preliminary autopsy report indicates that Debbie A. Linkewitz, 36, was strangled to death, said Wayne County Sheriff Robert Ficano.

Linkewitz appears to have been beaten and killed before her body was dumped in the park, Ficano said.

There is no evidence of drug or alcohol use, Ficano said, but a toxicology report, which would indicate that, has not come back yet.

A Roseville police spokesman said Saturday that the Wayne County Sheriff's Department detectives are handling the case.

Tire tracks leading to the vicinity of the body seem to indicate that someone drove off the road and dumped the woman's body out, Ficano said.

The tracks were being examined to determine what kind of vehicle was used to transport the body, Ficano said.

The coroner believes Linkewitz died sometime after 10:40 a.m. Wednesday, Oct. 11, Ficano said.

Linkewitz's body was discovered by a pedestrian on a nearby path.

The pedestrian flagged down a passing car.

The car's driver phoned the Parks Division of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, Ficano said.

Linkewitz was last seen, Ficano said, by her sister, Lynn Marie Amy-Linkewitz, on Saturday, Oct. 7, when the two of them patronized the Encounters Lounge in Roseville.

Amy-Linkewitz told investigators that Linkewitz left the bar with a male friend, who dropped her off somewhere on Eight Mile Road, Ficano said.

Linkewitz leaves behind a 10-year-

old child, Ficano said, who is in the custody of his grandmother.

Two or three other bodies have been found in Hines Park since 1984, said Nancy Mouradian, Ficano's chief of staff.

The last was Mary Evelyn Busby, 39, of Detroit, who was found strangled in the Plymouth Township section of Hines Park a year ago this month.

Busby's husband, Bethel, told police his wife was a crack addict and prostitute.

She was apparently raped before being strangled, police said.

its next move. Plymouth Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy and township attorney Tim Cronin were unavailable for comment, as was Temple Baptist attorney Joseph Galvin.

Temple Baptist's move to Plymouth Township faces stiff opposition from nearby residents who claim it would increase traffic and noise levels. If the latest compromise is approved by trustees, Temple Baptist would be able to build a building to house 2,500 worshippers.

According to an agreement approved by trustees in August but rejected by the church, Temple Baptist would have capacity for 2,000 worshippers as well as permission to host up to 10 concerts every year, plus Christmas and Easter week concerts.

Powell says the cool reception comes as a surprise given recent history. "We were given the thumbs up before we even bought the property by then-Supervisor Gerald Law," the pastor said. "It has always been the Temple's desire to fit in with the community and enhance it as a place of worship and ministry. That is what we are still trying to do."

Temple Baptist will bring to the community diverse types of ministry, the pastor said. "We bring all kinds of ministry that will build up a community. We are a service ministry that will meet needs — making families and marriages stronger, offering help to those in grief and to those who find themselves single again, and helping people live full, abundant lives."

Plymouth Township is the one that is losing."

The Temple Baptist congregation sees the issue as a biblical principle, Powell said. "People think Christians shouldn't stand up for their rights. Well, look at Paul. He appealed to Caesar when his rights were violated, so that his rights could be upheld under Roman law. We believe we are appealing to a higher court for freedom of our rights."

Powell said that although "we don't necessarily like the decisions that have been made, the church has a great amount of respect for the Plymouth Township leadership, and its attorneys. They have been kind toward us, and continue to communicate with us."

The religious freedom restoration act will work in Temple Baptist's favor, Powell added. "Bottom line, the act says that protection of religious freedoms overrides the rights, freedoms and minimal concerns, such as traffic concerns, that municipalities have."

"I think ultimately, a good solution will be had between both parties. We're negotiating to make that happen."

**Livonia man runs red light, attracts Plymouth police attention**

Plymouth police made two arrests driving through a red light at 3:25 a.m. Oct. 11.

The driver, a 28-year-old Livonia man in a Buick Century, was eastbound on Church Street approaching Church when the officer saw a front-seat passenger climb into the back seat. The car then went through the red light.

The driver told police he disobeyed the signal because he was nervous. He said his brother had been outside the car vomiting.

The man said he had been drinking, but not in the last hour or so. Given sobriety tests, the

man twice tried to say his ABC's but couldn't get past the letter "H" and gave up. His blood alcohol level was measured at .14 percent. The driver was processed and jailed. The driver's brother was turned over to his parents, as he was highly intoxicated, police said.

A check was done on the second passenger, a 31-year-old Plymouth man. The man was wanted on an Oakland County civil warrant for child neglect.

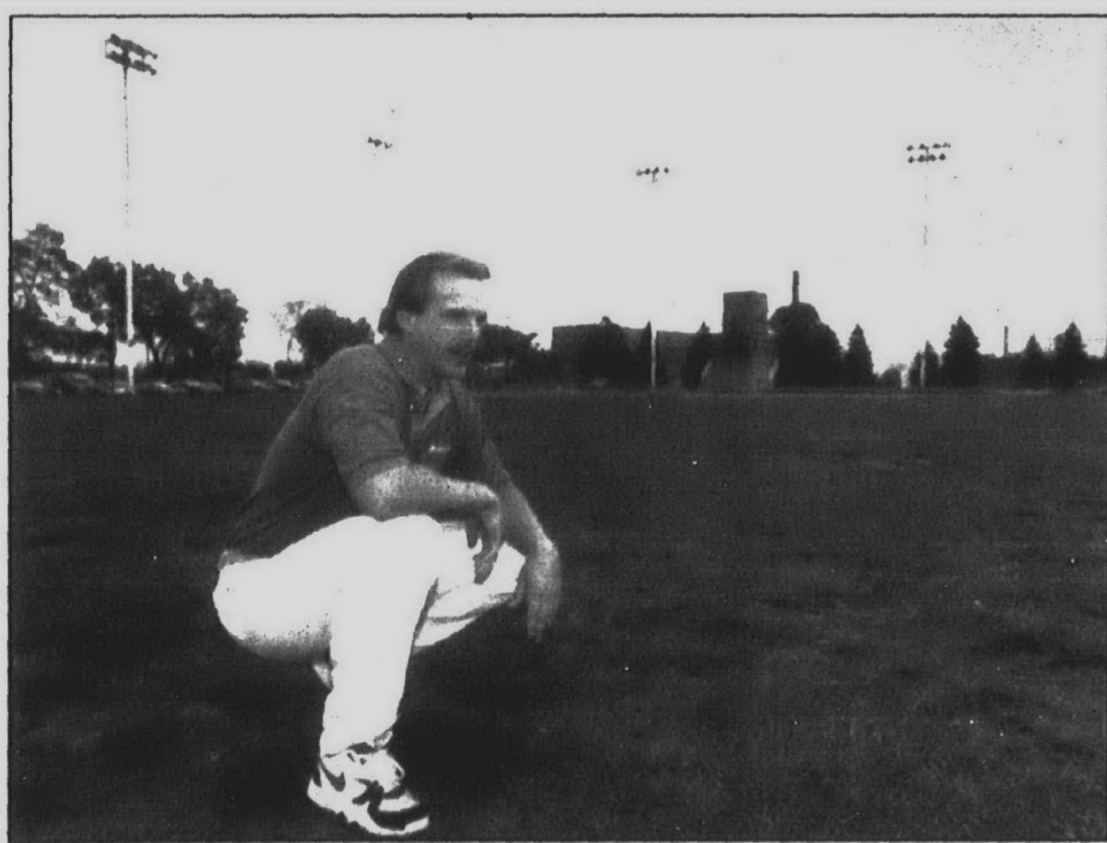

## Mole holes cancel season

Those darn skunks and moles canceled this fall's softball season at Massey Field — but the field should be ready for play next spring.

"I did not offer a softball league this fall because of the condition of the outfield," said city recreation Director Tom Willette in a letter to the city manager.

"There are several low spots, bare spots, and there has been a lot of skunk and mole damage. It has gotten to the point where it has become a safety concern," he said.

City commissioners on Oct. 3 awarded an \$18,080 low bid from R&M Contracting Corp. to redo the field off of Plymouth Road on the east side of the city.

"They'll completely be tearing out the old outfield and leveling it out, spreading topsoil to fill in the low spots," Willette said.

"October is the ideal time to have this work done," he said. "It gives the sod the opportunity to take root this fall and next spring. Our summer softball leagues start in early May."

An underground sprinkling system will also be installed, and it will be put on a timer for regular watering to maintain the new sod.

Massey Field's condition started to deteriorate a few years ago, when an especially dry summer caused some brown patches to form. The dry grass was more susceptible to damage, from players in spikes playing four or five games in an evening.

During the summer, 56 men's, women's, kids' and coed teams use the field.

Then in recent years, a problem with moles and skunks at nearby Riverside Cemetery caused the city Department of Public Works to spray sod there — and the critters moved over to Massey Field.

"The outfield is pretty beat up, there's a lot of moles out there," Willette said. "We sprayed this summer, but they came back."

The recreation department is spending \$13,000 on the project was from Clink Landscaping, for \$21,945.

The teams that would have used the field this fall were told to contact Canton parks and recreation, to join their program this season, Willette said.

# Club welcomes new arrivals

When Melanie Hopper and her family moved to Canton from St. Louis two years ago, they were pretty much alone.

"We had no relatives, no friends up here," said Hopper, the new president of Canton Newcomers Club. Plymouth also has a Newcomers Club.

She had heard about the club and joined. "It got me through my first Michigan winter. It helped me feel at home. I made a lot of friends," Hopper said.

You don't have to be brand new to the area to join the club. But if you are, it's the place to be if you're interested in meeting new people and getting involved in a host of interesting social, civic and charitable activities.

"It's a big misconception that you have to be new. It's not even necessary that you're a Canton resident," said board member Kristy Engle, in charge of publicity.

The Newcomers Club as of June had about 125 members. By September, 13 new members, nine from the new Fairway Pines subdivision hopped aboard.

"The membership has been growing as quickly as Canton is growing," Hopper said. "Canton is a transient community. A lot of people up here don't have friends and family as a support."

The club, which meets at 7 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month at the Sunflower Clubhouse, 45800 Hanford, is designed to acquaint women in the community with each other through many activities. The club also publishes a newsletter.

While club members do things out in the community, there's plenty of activities within the organization. For moms and kids, the club offers a monthly outing, as well as a play group Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at a member's home. There's also a babysitting cooperative.

While the club helped Hopper

meet new friends, it did the same for her two children. "At the time they were both pre-school. The club allowed them to socialize with other kids."

The club also is open to women who stay at home with their children and women who work outside the home. Since she joined, Hopper went out to work and continues to benefit from club activities.

"There really is something for everyone," Engle said. "And it's not just a women's club. But that is all we do see. The men get involved in the couple's social activities."

"It's such a nice way to meet people in all the different subdivisions," Engle continued. "If you have a child, it's a way to learn about all the different schools."

Prospective members are allowed two activities before being asked to join. Dues are \$20 a year, which includes the summer play groups.

The club also gets involved in charitable efforts. The biggest fundraiser raises money for Community Hospice. Efforts for the fundraiser begin in February. The club also works with First Step. At each meeting, members who bring food, goods or a cash donation are given an extra raffle ticket for the door prize.

The club also was given two names of families who needed help.

Coming up for the club is a yet unscheduled newcomers tea, where new members will get a chance to talk to other members. Also scheduled is a Halloween party for moms and tots on Oct. 27 at the Plymouth Cultural Center. Participants must pre-register by calling 416-8664.

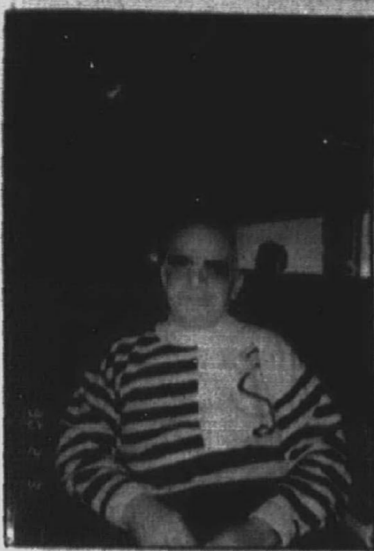

**WORD OF MOUTH**

Kissing may be a very good way to express affection, but recent research shows that it also carries the potential to spread gum infection amongst kissing partners. That is the conclusion reached by a new study from Finland's University of Helsinki. Other less likely ways to convey the harmful bacteria from one mouth to another include the shared use of food implements. In light of this new information, couples who are plagued by recurring gum infections should be treated simultaneously by their dentist for the problem. Paying attention to one's own oral hygiene is also a good idea for parents of newborns and young children. Doing so will serve to reduce the chances that unwanted oral bacteria will be passed on to children as a consequence of being kissed by their parents. Gum disease is a particular problem for adults, much more so than cavities. If the problem is allowed to progress, it can lead to the destruction of ligaments and bone structures that hold teeth in place, resulting in teeth lost to advanced gum disease.

# Test for auto emissions goes the way of the Edsel

**State Capitol capsules:** Motorists in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties won't have to give their cars annual auto emissions tests (AETs) after Dec. 31.

Gov. John Engler and Secretary of State Candice Miller called the 10-year-old program "misguided." Drivers pay \$10 for the tests before they can get their vehicle registration tabs for the license plates.

Some 1,400 AET test stations, mostly run by auto service stations, will be shut down. Some 1.3 million vehicles a year have been tested.

**Safety course**

Snowmobile owners in southeastern Michigan can get a free home study course from the Department of Natural Resources.

To earn a certificate, operators must complete two-hour courses, class review and test. The study packet can be obtained by calling

DNR's southeastern Michigan district headquarters 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Oct. 16-30 at (313) 432-1285.

The review and test will be held at 9 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 12, at the Lake Erie Metropark nature center, 32481 W. Jefferson, Rockwood.

**License break**

Nonprofit recycling centers can receive a financial break on license plates under PA 129, recently signed into the law by the governor.

Rep. Frank Fitzgerald, R-Grand Ledge, sponsored the measure at the urging of the Rev. John Toth of the Presbyterian Church of Diamondale. Recyclers now will pay \$10 for the state "Y" plate for license plates for nonprofit organizations. The special plate is valid for five years.

Currently, recycling centers pay an average of more than \$50 for auto plates and \$96 for truck plates. The law is already in effect.

**Burial benefit**

Families of employees who die as a result of work-related injuries would get greater workers' compensation under a Fitzgerald-sponsored bill passed by the House and sent to the Senate.

House Bill 4500 increases the maximum allowable burial expense to \$6,000 from \$1,500, a figure set in 1969. "While burial expenses have continued to increase, the compensation for families of deceased workers has not," Fitzgerald said.

**Big collection**

August collections from 13 of Michigan's major taxes were 5.5 percent above collections in August of 1994, the Senate Fiscal Agency reported.

Collections were \$1.3 billion. Unemployment in the summer months was 5.1 percent versus an even 6 percent in the summer of 1994.

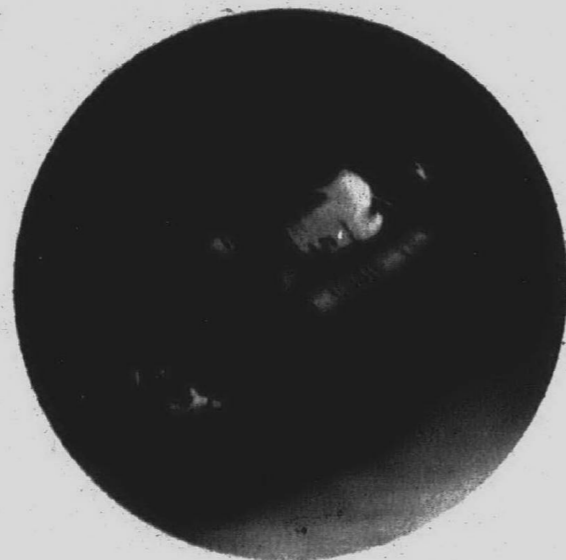

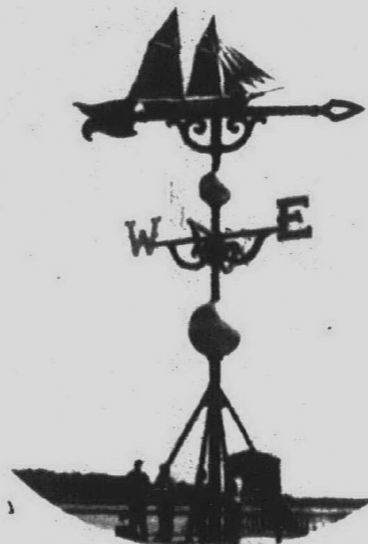

# Changes made to zoning standards

Canton Township, trustees unanimously approved several changes to the township's zoning ordinance Sept. 26.


The changes include the following:  
 ■ Dead-end streets, previously limited to 300 feet in length, may now be 700 feet long, unless the subdivision has a minimum lot size of one acre or a density of one house per acre. In that case, dead-

end streets may be 1,000 feet long.  
 ■ Regarding fast-food restaurants, the following requirement was approved: "Accessory uses and facilities, including but not limited to interior or exterior playgrounds, shall be architecturally integrated with the primary structure, and the height and bulk of said use or facility shall be dimensionally in proportion to

the primary structure."  
 ■ The existing requirement for a minimum of 50 percent face brick on residential buildings has been extended to include commercial and office buildings. And the following sentence was added: "The office portion of an industrial/warehouse building shall be a minimum of 75 percent face brick."


■ "Utility substations" were added to the list of things that must be screened from view by evergreens on at least three sides. However, "specific screening requirements for utility substations will be determined on a case-by-case basis by the township depending on the particular character of the area where the substation is proposed to be located."

# Finances given 5-day review

A Pennsylvania-based management consulting company is conducting a five-day review of Canton Township's finance operation. Township trustees voted unanimously Oct. 3 to hire Bartell and Bartell to work with Michigan-based Plante & Moran, Canton's auditor, to do the job. Although "we had already been talking about doing something" to fine-tune the township's money-handling apparatus, said Administrative Services Director Dan Durack, the recent resignation of Financial Services Manager Susan Kopinski made the time ideal for such a review. If Bartell and Bartell recommends changes in the financial services manager job — which now includes supervision of accounting, purchasing, water bill-

ing and payroll — a replacement for Kopinski can be hired after the changes are made, Durack said. Bartell and Bartell were to begin interviews with eight to 14 township employees, including Kopinski, who is serving out her notice. Kopinski took a job with county government at Metro Airport. In a letter to Durack, Bartell client services director Victor Dickinson said the project should take no more than five days to complete and cost taxpayers no more than \$6,000. Bartell conducted a similar study for Canton Township in 1989, Durack said, but studied the entire township operation. This study is "a small follow-up of just finance," Durack said.

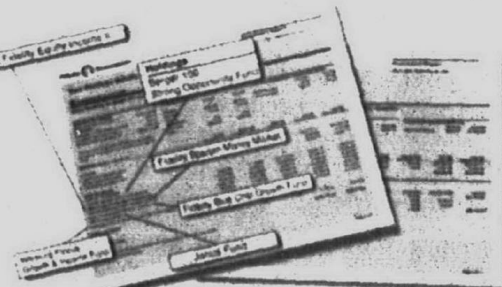

# Bank or Credit Union: What's best for you?

Each October credit unions all around the world celebrate International Credit Union Week. What's all the fuss? After all, isn't a credit union just like a bank?

In short, the answer is no. Last year alone, over 90,000 people in Michigan joined a credit union for the first time. At the end of last year, more than 3.8 million Michigan citizens (more

than 40% of the state's entire population) were credit union members. Why? The quick answer is that credit unions are—for most people, most of the time—a better deal than banks.

Is there really any difference among financial institutions? Consumer groups, such as the Consumer Federation of America, have for years been advising con-

sumers to join a credit union. A recent study on bank and credit union fees done by the Public Interest Research Group (PIRG) starkly demonstrates some of the differences between credit unions and banks.

The contrast in the PIRG study of fees for a range of services is quite striking. Need to stop payment on a check? The average fee at a bank is \$13.57 while credit unions charge \$8.01. Covering an overdraft check? The average bank fee is \$14.43 while the average credit union charges \$5.52. "No fee" checking? The bank average is a \$2.94 monthly charge with 9 free checks and then 20¢ per check. The credit union average is 27¢ monthly charge with 19 free checks and then 1¢ per check. Some differences.

"The bankers still have their hands buried deep in our wallets," stated Ed Mierzwinski, Director of the PIRG Consumer Program. "Consumer bank fee increases once again defied gravity, rising at twice the inflation rate from 1993 to 1995." Mierzwinski cited the rising cost of an interest-bearing NOW checking account. In 1990, a consumer had to leave a \$135 balance in his interest-earning NOW checking account to cover fees. By 1993, that had risen to \$725. By mid-year 1995, the required balance had reached \$1,123.

Then there are the rates for savings and loans. According to

June 1995 figures, banks charge 9.56% for new car loans while credit unions charged 8.49%. Banks charged 18.21% for credit card loans and credit union charged 13.14%. For savings, banks paid 4.92 on a one year certificate and credit unions paid 5.97%. The numbers go on and on in that fashion. It is no surprise that educated consumers often chose credit unions as their primary financial institution.

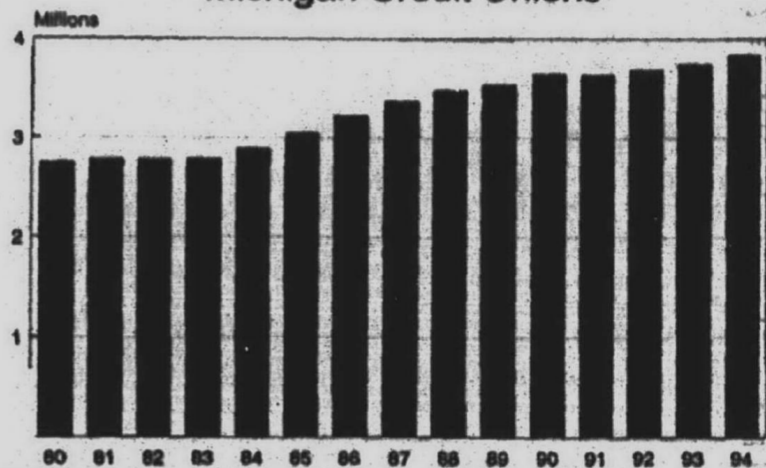
The reason for this difference lies in the different structures and purposes of banks and credit unions. Banks are businesses created to make money from their customers and give it to their stockholders. Credit unions are member-owned financial cooperatives which exist to provide services. Any money earned beyond the cost of operation just goes back to the members, usually through lower interest on loans, higher interest rates on savings, or lower service fees.

There are times for banks, of course. Credit unions serve individuals but most don't serve businesses. If you are a corporation seeking a line of credit, a business wanting a loan to build inventory or developer seeking a few million to construct a new subdivision, credit unions won't be much help. If, however, you just want a car loan, a checking account, an ATM card or other individual services, you might want to look into a credit union.

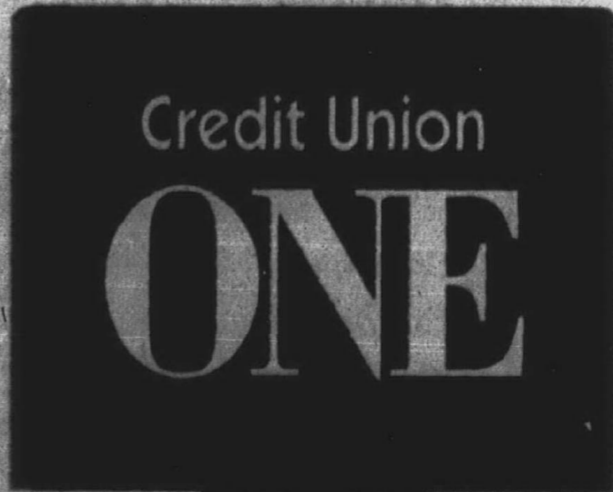

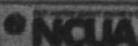

# TEACHING KIDS ABOUT MONEY

With the new school year in full swing, children throughout Michigan are studying everything from computer science to English literature to international economics. But how about those practical life skills that schools can't always impart to their students?

"The importance of education has never been more important," says Allan Kemp McMorris, Chairman of the Board for the Michigan Credit Union League (MCUL). "So much is being demanded of schools these days that it's usually up to parents to help their kids understand the ABC's of money - one of the most important lessons in life," McMorris says.

Teaching basic money management skills to children has never been more critical, according to McMorris. Statistics indicate that teenagers alone spend more than \$80 billion a year, yet fewer than half (42%) know the basics about credit, checking, savings accounts or auto insurance. "Children who are taught early to become regular savers and responsible borrowers are far better prepared for adulthood than those who are not exposed to basic financial concepts," according to expert Bobbie Shocket Lazarz, Director of Member Education for the CUNA Mutual Insurance Group (CMG).

MCUL and CMG have developed the following tips and guidelines for parents who want to teach their children about money.

## Under Age 5

Set up a coin bank at home to help the little ones learn how to identify different coins and how to count money. Introduce the concept of money by giving children small change to spend occasionally when you go to the store. Set limits on the type of items to be purchased in order to save time and minimize conflict.

## Ages 5 to 10

This is the time to begin a weekly allowance program to offer hands-on money management experience. Set down the

terms of the allowance - how much, and when it will be distributed. Saving habits for youngsters of this age group are reinforced by reaching goals, so encourage the child to save for, and then buy something he really wants. Another good technique is setting up three coin banks, labeled "Spend," "Save" and "Share." Encourage children to contribute a portion of their allowance and cash gifts to each of the coin banks. When the "Save" bank is full, take the child to your local credit union or bank to open an account. Many financial institutions have special programs for children; be sure to inquire. The "Share" money could be contributed periodically to a charity or non-profit organization of the child's choice.

## Ages 11 to 14

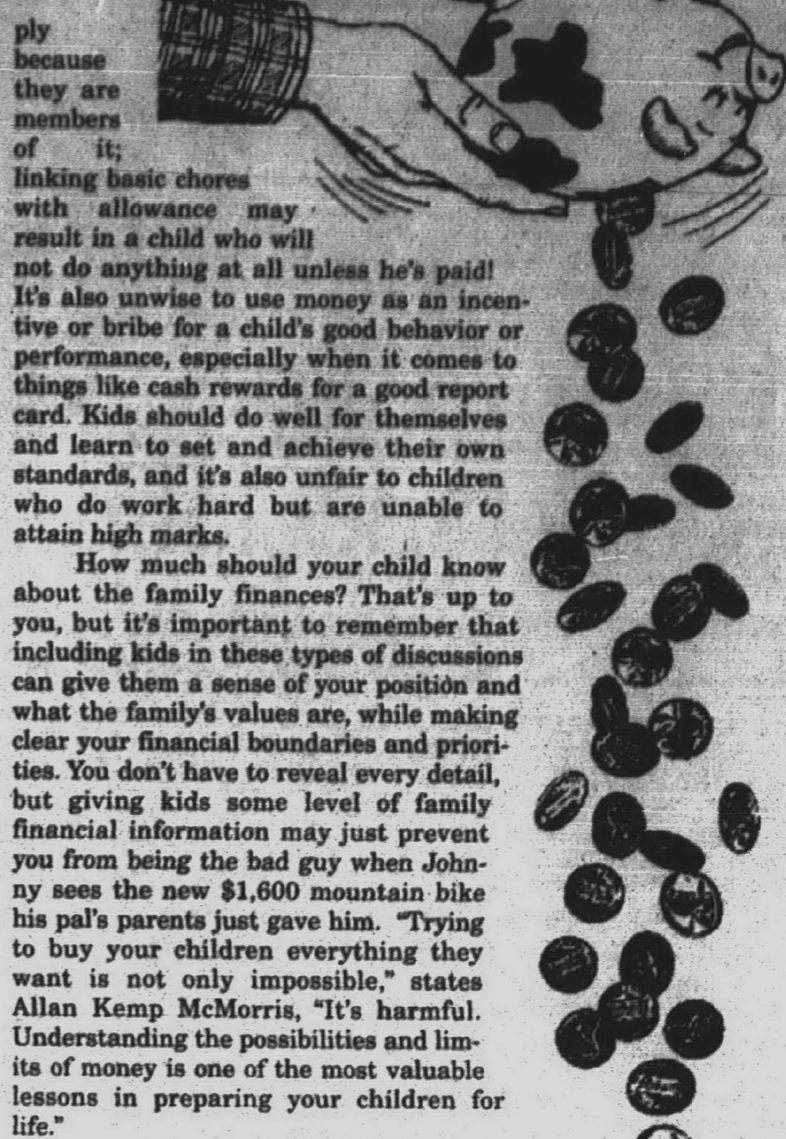
Bring children on shopping trips to show them what things cost. Let them help compare product quality, prices, return policies and warranties. Encourage children to use their own savings to buy "beyond the basics" clothing and accessories. Warn them against the dangers of impulse shopping. At this age, encourage your kids to take on odd jobs, such as babysitting, yard work or pet care, to earn extra money. These should be tasks beyond the realm of a child's regular household duties. This is also a good age to introduce the concept of investments. Consider purchasing a share or two of stock in a company the child picks (perhaps Disney or Mattel) and then monitor progress together by checking the daily newspapers.

## Ages 15 to 18

Start discussing savings plans with your children to cover larger goals, such as the purchase of a car, or the child's contribution to his college fund. You might set up a seasonal clothing allowance for kids in this age range. This fund should be separate from regular allowance; after setting spending guidelines and limits, let the child make his or her own choices. Consider helping your teen to open a share draft or checking account, if he has shown adequate signs of fiscal responsibility. You might also consider letting him use your credit card, or co-signing for a card in the teen's name, again based on your own judgment of his readiness.

## Other Tips

When it comes to allowances, use your financial situation and your child's maturity level as guidelines. Spell out the details on paper, so there's no confusion. If a child overspends, do not reimburse him. Do review the terms of the allowance agreement periodically to see if adjustments are needed. Do not link the allowance to the performance of regular household duties. Children ought to contribute to the household sim-



ply because they are members of it; linking basic chores with allowance may result in a child who will not do anything at all unless he's paid! It's also unwise to use money as an incentive or bribe for a child's good behavior or performance, especially when it comes to things like cash rewards for a good report card. Kids should do well for themselves and learn to set and achieve their own standards, and it's also unfair to children who do work hard but are unable to attain high marks.

How much should your child know about the family finances? That's up to you, but it's important to remember that including kids in these types of discussions can give them a sense of your position and what the family's values are, while making clear your financial boundaries and priorities. You don't have to reveal every detail, but giving kids some level of family financial information may just prevent you from being the bad guy when Johnny sees the new \$1,600 mountain bike his pal's parents just gave him. "Trying to buy your children everything they want is not only impossible," states Allan Kemp McMorris, "it's harmful. Understanding the possibilities and limits of money is one of the most valuable lessons in preparing your children for life."

## SAVINGS MYTH

You probably say it every time a paycheck comes: "Next time, I'm going to set aside some money for a rainy day." It's a sincere yet oft-broken promise we make to ourselves whenever we look at the state of our savings accounts and think about that summer cottage, a shiny new car or school tuition for the little one. Saving money isn't a habit everyone is born with; it's a skill you need to cultivate.

Start with desire and a positive frame of mind and then consider this common misconception about saving money outlined in a recent edition of "Everybody's Money," the consumer publication for members of America's credit unions.

**Never spend saved money - it should stay in a savings account.**

Funny thing about money - the only thing you can actually do with it is SPEND IT! The question then becomes when to spend it on what, and how much should be spent. Would it better to buy that new suit with your credit card and pay interest on your purchase, or would you rather cover the cost from money you set aside awhile back for that very purpose? That \$50 you've been socking away every month will get spent eventually, and if you don't spend it in your lifetime, someone else will get the chance to do so. The point of saving money is to spend it at some point in time.



would like to, here's how to find a credit union to join:

1. Ask the boss. Often you'll find out when you're hired that the company sponsors its own credit union, or is a Select Employee Group (SEG) that provides access to an existing credit union. Employers consider the credit union an employee benefit that help workers avoid financial problems and build savings, while being able to borrow money at fair rates. Many employers offer direct deposit of part or all of your paycheck to the credit union. This services helps you save regularly, make efficient deposits to your checking account and even make loan payments.
2. Poll your family members. If your employer doesn't sponsor a credit union, perhaps your spouse's employer does. Or a parent, brother or sister, or child might work at a company sponsoring a credit union. Most credit unions allow credit union members' families to join the credit union also.
3. Quiz the neighbors. Many credit unions have a "commu-

nity" field of membership, serving a region defined by geography rather than by employment or some other association. Ask friends in the community if they know of a credit union you may join.

4. Read the yellow pages. Some credit unions never or rarely advertise, so you might not know about them unless you look them up in the phone book. (Although word of mouth is a powerful messenger for credit unions, too.)

And, sometimes a credit union that originally served only employees of a meat-packing plant, for example, expands its field of membership to other companies over the years.

A credit union with an expanded field of membership often changes its name to signal its new "field." But don't assume that the credit union that always served, say, air force base employees still only serves base employees.

A yellow pages display ad may state a credit union's field of membership. If not, at least you'll know what number to call to ask about membership eligibility.

5. Call us. The Michigan Credit Union League, offers a service to help you find a credit union by calling (800) 474-JOIN. You'll hear an electronic message that asks for some information that will enable us to help you find a convenient credit union you are eligible to join.

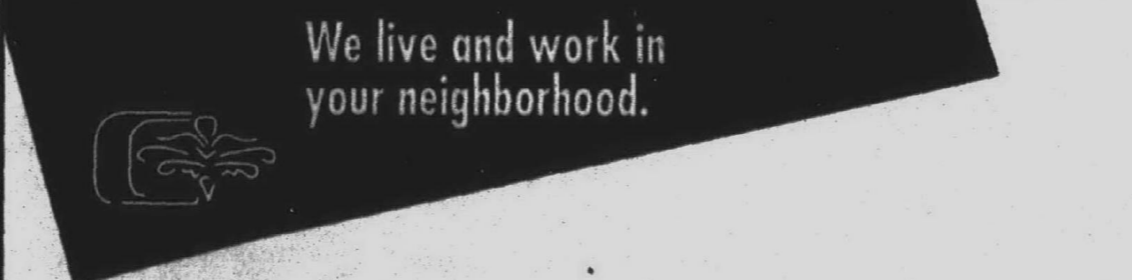

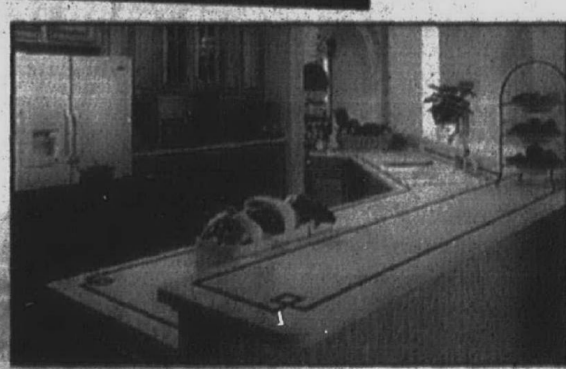

## Farm-raised catfish is utterly delicious

I'll admit that I'm a bit prejudiced about Great Lakes fish. I grew up in Wyandotte, and when we didn't have tuna noodle casserole on Fridays, Momma either pan-fried fresh Lake Erie perch or we piled into the 1962 Chevy Nova and headed for the perch fish fry at the local Dom Polski hall.

When perch wasn't on the dias, there was always a large fillet of walleye, or a couple of pounds of bass or lake trout buried in the freezer. All of the fish was caught in an old 13-foot fiberglass boat that was originally aqua, and now painted red. If memory serves me correctly, Dad won the boat in an all night card game at Uncle Johnnie's house.

Many an early morning five a.m. alarm sounded to wake me so that I was ready and waiting to help Dad hook up the boat to the car for the five minute drive to the Wyandotte boat docks. Then there was a 20 minute boat ride to where the Detroit River opens its mouth and empties into Lake Erie. When we caught an occasional channel catfish or carp, it was immediately thrown back with absolutely no desire to eat. My, how times have changed.

### Aqua culture

With the advent of aqua culture (the science of raising water-based animals in a controlled environment) every time I walk into my local fish market or grocery store, I'm noticing a bigger space being afforded catfish. Rightfully so, I guess, because the U.S. government calls aqua culture "the fastest growing segment of U.S. agriculture."

None of this is more evident than seeing millions of acres upon acres of catfish ponds viewable from 20,000 feet while flying over Arkansas, Mississippi, Louisiana and Alabama. More catfish is produced in the United States on a yearly basis than all other farm-raised fish combined. Furthermore, catfish consumption has more than doubled since 1985 with the average man, woman and child consuming more than a pound per person, per year. I'll admit to the fact that I ate (with the emphasis on "ate" and not "enjoyed") a channel catfish on my last fishing expedition with the boys. But up until recently, the thought of purchasing catfish for dinner from my local fish monger never really crossed my mind.

Mike McNamara, owner of the Plymouth Fish Market sells 25-40 pounds of catfish per week and claims that his western-suburban market is beginning to prefer catfish over cod, mainly for the light flavor, no smell and excellent pricing.

"Cod and scrod are getting more difficult to obtain and when I do get my hands on them, the price is getting higher and higher" said McNamara who was frying up a batch of catfish for a waiting Unysis employee on his lunch hour when I called. McNamara also said "the secret to preparing good catfish is not to overcook it."

The Plymouth Fish Market suggests customers quickly pan-fry catfish fillets that have been lightly dusted with bread crumbs or seasoned flour in a little butter or oil.

### Dietary differences

So what is it that makes farm-raised catfish the preferential choice of fish consumers? One of the main differences between farm-raised catfish and wild catfish is their living conditions.

Farm-raised cats are raised in a quality controlled environment of clay based ponds filled with fresh water pumped from underground wells. Farm-raised cats are fed a "gourmet diet" of puffed, high protein food pellets (a mixture of soybean, corn, wheat, vitamins and minerals) that give the fish a very mild, almost sweet taste. Because the food pellets are "puffed" they float, giving farm-raised catfish a cleaner food source, unlike their distant cousins, notoriously known as "bottom feeders."

After 18 months from hatchery to pond, the fish are harvested with seine nets and loading baskets and are transported alive to processing plants in aerated tank trucks. Once they reach the processing plants, the whole production takes less than 30 minutes from start to finish. Approximately 50 percent of the crop is frozen for agricultural export while the remaining is packed on ice and air freighted to your nearest wholesaler who then distributes his catch to local markets and fish mongers.

## BUSY MOM BRINGS HOME LIGHT

Rush - that's what most of us do. And after we've survived the rush hour - there's another rush - making dinner.

"Pasta is a good choice for busy families," said Rose Reisman, author of "Rose Reisman Brings Home Light Pasta," (Robert Rose, Inc.; September 1995; \$16.95). "It's economical and versatile."

Married, and the mother of four children ages 4, 7, 9 and 11, Reisman takes readers beyond spaghetti and lasagna with healthy dishes that can be prepared in 30 minutes or less.

"You can make the pasta the night before," she said during a visit to the Observer & Eccentric offices in Livonia. "But rinse it in cold water. Coat it with three tablespoons of cooking water or sauce. You can store it at room temperature, or put it in the refrigerator. After work, cover the bowl with Saran wrap and microwave on high for one minute. If you put the pasta in the refrigerator the night before, it could take a little longer to reheat. Heat the sauce and toss with the pasta."

Generous servings of tips make Reisman's book even more appetizing. Every chapter and recipe has them.

There are tips for stocking a pasta pantry, preparing soup, salads, fish, chicken, meat, and vegetables. Very busy cooks will appreciate the make ahead recipe suggestions.

"One of the mistakes people make when they cook pasta is they don't use enough water, and they don't wait until the water boils to add the pasta," she said. "Cook pasta in a large pot of boiling water. Use 12-16 cups water for each pound. Cook pasta "al dente," or firm to the bite. Do not add sauce to pasta until just

ready to serve, or pasta will absorb the sauce, leaving the appearance of not enough."

Reisman also encourages readers to try different shapes of pasta. "They taste differently," she said.

These recipes are low in fat, but yet many contain a sprinkling of cheese. "They're allowed," she said. "I don't use diet cheese in my recipes. I find that people who use diet products are not satisfied and they're binging somewhere

else. It's OK to keep fat in your diet, but keep it to a minimum."

Her suggestions include sauteing chicken in a non-stick pan sprayed with vegetable oil. Using Cheddar, feta, goat, Swiss and other strong cheeses in recipes. "Most Greek salads have eight ounces of feta cheese on them. Two ounces is plenty," she said. "In light pasta cooking, the key is lowering the amount of cheese used, not eliminating it."

Her passion for light cooking

stems from her belief that lifestyle and eating habits play significant roles in health for all ages.

"My children eat very little meat, and they'll be a lot healthier," she said.

"Enlightened," is the word Reisman prefers to use when talking about low fat cooking. "Everyone is so used to hearing low fat and light. This is about substituting great flavor for fats."

A resident of Toronto, Reisman holds masters of fine arts and business administration degrees. ## COOKING TIPS

- Prepare the sauce while the pasta is cooking. Plan ahead so the sauce will be completed at the same time the pasta is cooked.
- If reheating leftover pasta, add more stock or tomato sauce to provide extra moisture.
- Use meat sauce with larger, heavier pastas, such as rigatoni, large shell pasta or tortellini.
- If vegetables are to be cooked in advance for a pasta dish, they can be steamed, microwaved, blanched or boiled. Stop cooking vegetables when they are tender-crisp and still retain their color. Drain and rinse with cold water to prevent overcooking. Add to pasta. Overcooked vegetables are dull and soft, and most of the nutrients are lost.
- After cooking manicotti or cannelloni pasta shells, drain, rinse with cold water and cover until ready to use. To stuff easily, slice shell to open and lay flat. Place some filling over top shell, close and place seam side down in baking dish. These shells can be refrigerated up to 1 day ahead, then baked.
- Cook tomato sauces, covered, on low-medium heat, to avoid letting the liquid evaporate. If the sauce appears too thick when reheating, add more stock, water or pureed canned tomatoes.
- Plum tomatoes are the best tomatoes for making a fresh tomato sauce. They are drier and meatier and make a denser, more flavorful sauce.

## Spanish wine myths need to be dispelled

Spain, one of the world's great wine regions, has remained in hiding due to ethno-centric traditions, lack of capital and bulk wine production. A Civil War that ended as World War II was beginning in Europe, destroyed the Spanish economy. Low-yielding wine grapes, those that made the best wines, were ripped out in favor of lesser varieties with higher yields. Only a decade ago, Spain was Third World status with its wine industry dominated by co-ops and negotiants. But much has changed. Prized estate wines are being recognized and myths about Spanish wines need to be dispelled.

Images of Spain's sand and sun may make you think that Spain is hot. Actually, more than half of Spain falls within Continental and Atlantic climatic influences and is cool. Vineyard altitudes average over 2,000 feet. Great grapes are grown at cooler, higher elevations.

Much of what the world knows about the best Spanish wine estates comes through the efforts of Steve Metzler and his Seattle-based company Classical Wines of Spain. His internationally known wine portfolio is recognized for integrity. We caught up with Metzler recently, and were

impressed by the wines he currently represents.

Brand names, grape varieties and regions may be unfamiliar, but a taste of the well-priced wines will be reassuring. Enjoy the dry whites in place of sauvignon blanc and the reds as a change from merlot or cabernet sauvignon.

Sherry is making a comeback as an aperitif. Hidalgo La Gitana Manzanilla \$10 is the standard of excellence. In Seville, it outsells all other dry sherries. Manzanilla should be fresh. The newest lot has arrived from Spain. Look at the lot number on the label. If it says 12/5 this means it

was bottled on the 12th day of 1995. This is old stock bottled last January. You want to try a much later day in 1995 and drink it within eight months of bottling.

Oysters or crab are delicious with 1994 Morgadio Albarino \$18. Albarino is a rare grape variety, and the Spanish contemporary of Vignier, the "hot" white from California.

1994 Canele Monastrell \$7 is a light, fruity dry red that is great with spicier food. Monastrell is the French grape mourvedre. You'll be pleasantly surprised by the Spanish style at a popular price.

1992 Gueibentra EVO \$8 is one of Spain's most acclaimed wines. It's 70 percent cabernet sauvignon, 15 percent merlot and 15 percent tempranillo aged one year in 100 percent new French oak. If it were French, it might be called the producer's grand vin.

And then there's Rioja. The 1994 Lompo Tinto Crianza \$9 is

an estate bottled classic Rioja Alta with plummy fruit and spice. By law, a Rioja labeled Crianza has been aged 12 months in oak, but this wine was aged 18 months, approaching the minimum for a Gran Reserva.

Those who know Spanish wines know Pesquera from Bodegas Alejandro Fernandez. They are 100 percent tempranillo from the hands of a master. Tinto Pesquera is aged a minimum of 18 months in oak, but Reservas and Grandes Reservas from great vintages are aged in barrel 24 months and longer. The 1991 Pesquera Reserva \$16 is a wine unique in the world. Delicious now, it will age into the next millennium.

In addition to Spanish estate grown wines, look for a fabulous Spanish olive oil, Almazara Luis Herrera Unpressed Extra Virgin \$11 for a half litre. Herrera has the smooth fruity character of French olive oil from Provence and the pepperness of great Tuscan olive oils. It's unbeatable at the price.

# Mild, farm-raised catfish is delicious and versatile

## CATFISH ANTIPASTO

- 2 cups water
- 8 ounces catfish filets
- 4 ounces Cheddar or Monterey Jack cheese, cut into cubes
- 4 ounces Calamatta pitted ripe olives, drained
- 1 small zucchini, sliced 1/4-inch thick
- 1 cup canned artichoke hearts, drained, halved
- 1/2 cup white wine vinegar
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 3 green onions, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil, crushed
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

In a skillet bring the water to a boil. Add catfish filets. Return to a boil; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 5 minutes. Remove from water. Cool slightly. Cut into bit sized pieces.

In a large plastic bag or non-metallic bowl, combine cheese, olives, zucchini and artichoke hearts. Add catfish. In a small bowl stir together vinegar, oil, onions, garlic, sugar, basil and pepper. Pour over catfish mixture. Seal bag tightly. Cover and chill for 6 hours or overnight, turning bag occasionally.

To serve, allow mixture to stand at room temperature for about 15 minutes. Drain mixture and arrange on lettuce covered plates. Makes 4 servings.

## CLASSIC PAN-FRIED CATFISH

- 1/4 cup yellow cornmeal
  - 1/4 cup flour
  - 2 teaspoons salt
  - 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
  - 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
  - 4 catfish filets, about 1 1/2 pounds
  - Vegetable oil for pan-frying
- Combine cornmeal, flour, salt, cayenne pepper and garlic powder. Coat catfish with mixture, shaking off the excess.

Cover the bottom of a 12-inch skillet with vegetable oil. Heat to 350 degrees F. or medium heat. Add coated catfish filets in a single layer and pan-fry until golden brown, about 5-6 minutes, depending on size. Remove and drain on paper towels. Makes 4 servings.

## CATFISH FAJITAS

- 2 pounds catfish filets
- 1 cup lime juice (about 5-6 fresh limes)
- 3 cups mesquite or hickory wood chips
- 1 large onion, sliced and sepa-

- rated into rings
- 1 large sweet red pepper, cut into strips
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 8 flour or corn tortillas, warmed
- Salsa, sour cream or guacamole and lime wedges, optional

Place fish in a large plastic bag. Pour lime juice over the fish. Seal and marinate in the refrigerator for 1 hour.

Soak wood chips in enough water to cover for 30-60 minutes. Drain wood chips. In a covered grill, test coals for a medium-hot heat. Sprinkle wood chips over preheated coals. Lightly brush grill rack with cooking oil.

Place catfish filets on grill rack. Cover and grill directly over medium hot coals for 5 minutes on each side.

Meanwhile, in a large skillet, cook onion, pepper strips and garlic in butter or margarine until just tender. Stir in salt and pepper. Cut grilled catfish into chunks. Toss with onion mixture. Fill tortillas with catfish mixture. Serve with salsa, sour cream, guacamole and lime wedges. Makes 4 servings.

## SWEET POTATO, WHITE BEAN AND ORZO SOUP

- 2 teaspoons vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon crushed garlic
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 3 cups diced sweet potatoes
- 1/2 cup diced carrots
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 1 cup canned white kidney beans, drained
- 1/2 cup orzo or small shell pasta
- 1 cup 2 percent milk
- Chopped parsley

In large nonstick saucepan, heat oil; saute garlic, onions and celery until tender, approximately 4 minutes.

- 1/2 cup finely diced celery
- 1/2 cup finely diced carrots
- 12 ounces ground beef
- 1/2 cup dry red wine
- 1/2 cup 2 percent milk
- 1 can (28 ounces) tomatoes, crushed
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 1/2 teaspoons dried basil
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Cook pasta in boiling water according to package instructions or until firm to the bite. Drain and place in serving bowl.

In large nonstick saucepan, heat oil; saute garlic, onions, celery and carrots until tender, approximately 5 minutes. Add beef and saute until no longer pink, approximately 4 minutes.

Add wine and cook on high for 2 minutes. Add milk and cook for 2 minutes. Add tomatoes, tomato paste, basil and oregano; cover and simmer on low-heat for 20 minutes or until sauce becomes thickened, stirring occasionally.

Place in food processor and puree in batches just until still slightly

chunky. Pour over pasta; sprinkle with cheese; toss and serve. Serves 6-8.

To make ahead: Refrigerate sauce up to 2 days ahead and reheat gently, adding more milk if too thick.

## SPINACH CHEESE TORTELLINI

- 1 pound cheese and/or spinach tortellini

- Sauce:
- 1 tablespoon margarine or butter
  - 1 teaspoon crushed garlic
  - 1 cup finely diced carrots
  - 1 cup finely diced zucchini
  - 1 1/2 cups chicken or vegetable stock

- 1/2 cup chopped fresh or (1 1/2 teaspoons dried) basil
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Cook pasta in boiling water according to package instructions or until firm to the bite. Drain and place in serving bowl.

Make the sauce: In small nonstick skillet, melt margarine; add garlic, carrots and zucchini. Cook until tender, approximately 8 minutes. Add stock and basil; simmer on medium heat for 5 minutes. Puree in food processor on and off for 30 seconds. Pour over pasta. Add cheese, and toss. Serves 6.

## Spaghetti carbonara need not be high fat

AP — Low-fat spaghetti carbonara is a contemporary version of a traditional recipe. This creamy egg-and-cheese-based dish is traditionally flavored with bacon. The recipe below cuts the fat by using egg substitute and turkey bacon.

Despite the whittled-down fat and cholesterol content of this recipe — which weighs in at under 30 percent calories from fat — this dish has maintained the richness and flavor of the classic recipe from which it was adapted.

### LOW-FAT SPAGHETTI CARBONARA


- 1 pound spaghetti or thin spaghetti, uncooked
- 6 ounces turkey bacon, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2/3 cup dry white wine
- 1 cup egg substitute

- 1/2 cup fresh parsley, chopped
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste

Cook pasta according to package directions. While pasta is cooking, cook the bacon and garlic in a small saute pan over medium-low heat until the garlic is aromatic and the bacon is lightly browned, about 3 to 4 minutes.

Add the wine, increase heat, bring the wine to a boil and cook until it has reduced by about half. Pour mixture into a large serving bowl and let it cool for 5 minutes. Stir in the egg substitute and the parsley.

When pasta is done, drain it well and add it immediately to the bacon mixture. Add Parmesan cheese and toss quickly. Season with salt and freshly ground pepper and serve. Makes 4 servings.

Heat oven to 450 degrees F. Spray

baking pan with non-stick coating set aside. Sprinkle catfish with lemon juice. Dip fillets in milk, then roll in crumbs. Arrange fillets in prepared pan; drizzle with oil. Bake about 8-10 minutes or just until fish flakes easily. Garnish with chutney.

For pineapple chutney: In small saucepan, combine all the ingredients; simmer, stirring 5 minutes. Serves 4.

# For a happier new year, add a healthy habit monthly

You don't have to wait until New Year's Day to start keeping a resolution. You can begin anytime. And you don't have to do everything at once. If you begin now and add one new healthy habit a month, you'll have significantly improved your family's well-being by a year from now.

Month 1: Commit to the bean routine — serve legumes more often. Dry peas and beans are an excellent source of fiber and other complex carbohydrates. They contain nutrients that most Americans don't eat enough of, besides being a low-fat source of protein. Beans are economical, easy to cook and are valuable to your good health. Start slowly, if you're not used to eating beans, eat small servings initially, then slowly increase your intake to help reduce bean bloat and gas discomfort.

Month 2: Downsize protein portions. Most Americans eat more protein than they need. Limit your consumption of trimmed lean meats, poultry and fish to 5 to 7 ounces per day, and you'll be more likely to keep fat and cholesterol in check. A 3-ounce portion of meat is about the same size as a deck of cards.

Month 3: Count fat grams, not calories. People who eat a high-fat

diet tend to gain more weight than those who eat the same number of calories from lower fat foods. Small changes can make a big fat difference. Check labels for the fat grams. Serving leaner meats and low-fat dairy foods and using a healthier cooking method will keep you on a lower fat diet.

Month 4: Adopt the "five-a-day" approach to better health. The National Cancer Institute estimates that approximately 140 million Americans — almost half the population — eat fewer than the recommended five servings of fruits and vegetables a day. What are they missing? Fruits and vegetables provide much-needed vitamins, minerals and fiber and no cholesterol. Almost all are naturally low in calories, fat and sodium. Eat two fruits or vegetables at each meal, plus snacks and you will get more than the recommended amount.

Month 5: Make an effort to eat seafood at least twice a week. Most seafood is low in fat and is an ideal replacement for fattier protein food. All fish and shellfish have special oils (omega-3 fatty acids), that some studies suggest may protect against heart disease. Be sure to observe any health advisories for eating local fish.

Month 6: Replace a standard-fat product with a low-fat one. These trades will save calories and fat. Switching from whole milk to skim milk for two glasses a day, for instance, will save you more than 50,000 calories a year. If everything else stayed the

same, that would mean a weight loss of 14.5 pounds!

Month 7: Eat your antioxidants. Studies have shown that antioxidants such as vitamin C, vitamin E and beta carotene may reduce the risk of certain diseases, such as cancer and heart disease. Sweet potatoes, berries, peppers, wheat germ, spinach, carrots and squash are some of the foods high in one or more of these important vitamins.

Month 8: Give up rare "burgers." The well-done burger is in, rare is out. Avoid potential problems with ground beef and other ground meats that may have

been contaminated during processing by cooking all ground meats thoroughly.

Month 9: Adopt a new approach to weight loss. Chronic dieters know that with each new diet, weight becomes harder to lose and easier to gain. Stop short-term restrictive dieting and instead develop a healthy lifestyle you can adopt permanently. Adopt a low-fat, high-carbohydrate food plan and combine with exercise.

Month 10: Add variety with one meatless meal a week. Most families eat the same meals over and over. A recent survey indicated that the average cook has a reper-

toire of 10 recipes. Add variety by experimenting once a week with a new recipe that uses a grain, rice or pasta base. Meatless meals highlight good-for-you complex carbohydrates.

Month 11: Help kids build nutritious habits. Studies show that 52 percent of teen-age girls spend two hours per week shopping for family groceries. It's never too early to teach children how to put together nutritious meals and snacks. Start by acquainting them with the Food Guide Pyramid, which emphasizes grains, fruits and vegetables and down plays fats and sweets.

Month 12: Update your cooking habits. Trade in high-fat cooking methods for healthier techniques. Microwave, steam, braise, broil, barbecue, roast, bake, boil, poach, stew or stir fry. Instead of basting meat with fatty drippings, use defatted broth, wine or juice. Substitute flavorings, extracts, herbs and spices for heavy sauces with a cream or fat base. Keep all your favorite recipes low in fat. After these monthly changes, you'll look and feel better.

Some like it hot and some like it hotter.

"Turn It Up!" by noted food writer Janet Hazen (Chronicle Books, \$12.95) is the blistering companion to Hazen's best-selling "Hot, Hotter, Hottest."

With 50 all-new, fiery recipes, "Turn It Up!" is organized by the dominant heat-lending ingredient in each dish. Dedicated hotheads and ingenues alike will enjoy pan-fried potatoes and horseradish cakes, grilled chicken wings with two mustards and honey, and chocolate-coffee brownies with chipotle chilies.

Dave DeWitt and Nancy Gerlach visited pepper farms, saucos and salsa makers and habanero aficionados from the Yucatan peninsula to New Mexico for "The Habanero Cookbook" (Ten Speed Press, \$17.95).

Each of the habanero recipes, including peach-habanero chutney, Caribbean chicken and marinated grilled vegetables, is hot. But those that are truly fiery are labeled "extremely hot," so the reader can always reduce the recipe's heat intensity.

Also of interest: "The All-American Chili Cookbook" by Jenny Kellner and Richard Rosenblatt (Hearst Books, \$14.95 hardcover). This is the "official cookbook" of the International Chili Society in Newport Beach, Calif.

"Red Hot Gourmet" is a collection of 50 recipes from the Cole Cooking Group (\$7.95). The cookbook contains fiery recipes from Southeast Asia, Mexico and other cuisines internationally known for pure heat.

Lucinda Hutson is the author of "Tequila: Cooking with the Spirit of Mexico" (Ten Speed Press, \$16.95). Hutson provides an armchair tour of Mexico's kitchens and cantinas. Among the recipes: pinata punch, "drunken cowgirl-style" beans and jalapeno carrot cake.

Victoria Wise is the author of "Mexico: The Vegetarian Table" (Chronicle Books, \$19.95), with 90 recipes, including ficama and watermelon salsa, melon and potato soup, and candied gourd

squash.

"The Best of Quintana" by Patricia Quintana (Stewart, Tabori and Chang, \$22.50) contains 60 recipes and 60 full-color photographs by Ignacio Urquiza. All of the recipes have been tested for the American kitchen, and substitutions are suggested for the occasional hard-to-find Mexican ingredient. Quintana is the author of "The Taste of Mexico."

"Food From My Heart: Cuisines of Mexico Remembered and Reimagined" by Zarela Martinez (Macmillan, \$14) is a collection of over 175 recipes. With menus and mail-order sources for ingredients, Martinez is the owner of Zarela restaurant in New York City.

"Healthy Mexican Regional Cookery" by Lotte Mendelsohn (Font & Center Press, \$17.95). With 150 recipes, travel tips, shopping tips and charming anecdotal reminiscences of family and friends.

"Betty Crocker's Easy Mexican" (Macmillan General Reference, \$16). Contains 130 "old-time favorites" and new South of the Border tastes.

"The Essential Mexican Cookbook" (Courage Books-Running Press, \$12.95). Contains 50 recipes, 250 full-color, step-by-step photographs and introduction to the most popular Mexican ingredients. Edited by Heather Thomas. Southwest Cooking

Chef Wayne Harley Brachman believes Desserts should be fun. And in his new book, "Cakes and Cowpokes: New Desserts from the Old Southwest" (William Morrow, \$23), Brachman takes the best of the Southwest, adds his own sense of humor and mixes up great-tasting, great-looking desserts.

## Noodles and beef combine

- 1 cup cold water
- 1/4 cup dairy sour cream

Cook egg noodles according to package directions; keep warm. Meanwhile stack beef steaks lengthwise in half and then crosswise into 1-inch wide strips. In large nonstick skillet, heat 2 teaspoons oil over medium-high heat until hot. Add beef and garlic (half

at a time) and stir-fry 1 minute or until outside surface of beef is no longer pink. (Do not overcook.) Remove from skillet; season with salt and pepper. In same skillet, cook mushrooms in 2 teaspoons oil 2 minutes or until tender, stirring occasionally. Remove skillet from heat. Add gravy mix and water; blend well. Return skillet to heat; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low; simmer 1 minute or until sauce is thickened, stirring frequently. Return beef to skillet; heat through, about 1 minute. Serve over noodles; pass sour cream to dollop on top. Makes 4 servings.

## Apples in cheddar pastry add new twist to fall classic

AP — Instead of serving traditional apple pie this fall, try apple bundles in cheddar pastry, served with a spicy syrup and a tangy yogurt sauce. Sharp cheddar cheese and just a touch of mustard give the pastry an added "bite." The brown sugar syrup is contrasted with the tangy flavor of the yogurt sauce. The cheddar pastries can be prepared and frozen in advance, then baked individually or all at once.

### APPLE BUNDLES IN CHEDDAR PASTRY

- For the cheddar pastry:
  - 3 cups all-purpose flour
  - 1/4 cup sugar
  - 1 teaspoon dry mustard
  - 1/4 teaspoon salt
  - 4 tablespoons cold butter, cut into pats
  - 1/4 cup solid vegetable shortening
  - 1 1/2 cups packed (6 ounces) finely shredded sharp cheddar cheese
  - 8 to 12 tablespoons ice water
- For the apple filling:
  - 4 cups peeled, thinly sliced, tart apples, such as Granny Smith or Pippin (3 to 4 apples)
  - 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
  - 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2 tablespoons butter, broken into bits
- For the spicy syrup:
  - 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
  - 1/4 cup water
  - 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
  - 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
  - 1 teaspoon vanilla
  - 1 tablespoon butter
- For the yogurt sauce:
  - 1 cup plain nonfat yogurt
  - 2 tablespoons packed brown sugar

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. To prepare the pastry and filling: In a medium bowl, combine flour, sugar, mustard and salt. With a pastry blender, two knives or your fingertips, cut in butter and shortening until mixture forms small clumps. Add cheddar cheese and work until mixture resembles coarse bread crumbs. Sprinkle the water, 2 tablespoons at a time, over the mixture and toss with a fork until the dough can be gathered into a ball. Knead once or twice in the bowl; refrigerate. In a separate bowl, toss apples together with brown sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg; set aside. Roll chilled dough on a floured surface and cut to make a rectangle 12- by 24-inches. With a knife, cut pastry into eight 6-inch squares. Place apples in the center of the

pastry squares, dividing evenly, and dot with the 2 tablespoons butter. Fold up corners to form square bundles; pinch edges to seal. At this point, pastries can be covered and refrigerated a day ahead of baking, or wrapped in heavy-duty aluminum foil and frozen (there is no need to thaw pastries before baking). Place on a greased baking sheet and bake in a preheated 375-degree F oven 25 to 35 minutes, until browned. Flecks of cheddar cheese give the pastry dough a distinct color. To prepare the sauces: To make spicy syrup, combine brown sugar, water, cinnamon and nutmeg in a heavy saucepan; bring to a boil. Remove from the heat; add vanilla and 1 tablespoon butter; stir until butter is melted. To make yogurt sauce, stir together yogurt and brown sugar. To serve: Place individual pastries on plate and pour several tablespoons of warm syrup over each warm pastry. Pass the yogurt sauce to spoon on top. Makes 8 pastries. ## Only you can prevent freezer burn

"When frozen meat, poultry or fish has been improperly wrapped or kept too long in the freezer — 'freezer burn,' may develop," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension of Oakland County. Signs of freezer burn are a gray dried out appearance and texture, and loss of taste and quality. Products that have freezer burn are safe to eat as long as the freezer has been working properly. "The issue is really one of quali-

ty," adds Treitman. "usually these items become tough, and are difficult to chew when cooked. It is OK to cut away the freezer burned areas before cooking, but often it is best to dispose of the product." Tips to avoid freezer burn: use moisture and vapor proof wrappings, make sure the material is for "freezer" use. Do not use "margarine" or other "refrigerator" containers for

long term freezing. They are not designed for freezer use and freezer burn may result. Make sure packages are air tight, press out excess air and seal with freezer tape. Wrap meats in meal sized packages. Wrap steaks, chops and ground meat patties flat, or stack them in layers separated by double thickness of freezer wrap. Pad any sharp edges with extra freezer wrap to prevent tearing or puncturing the package.

# French onion soup is the clear choice for winter

Although thick winter soups — packed with beans and potatoes are a cold-weather favorite, sometimes a lighter, aromatic broth is more appealing. Perhaps you favor the warmth of a steamy, flavorful clear soup on a blustery fall day.

Clear soups are easy to prepare with the right ingredients. Whether you make your own stock or rely on canned broth or bouillon cubes, stock provides the foundation of flavor for soups — as well as for stews, pilafs and sautéed dishes.

A simple vegetable stock can be prepared with three stalks of chopped celery, two chopped onions, three chopped carrots, two chopped cloves of garlic, 1/2 bay leaf and eight peppercorns (or 1/2 teaspoon ground pepper).

Combine all the ingredients in a large pot with two quarts of water and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and skim any foam from the surface. With the lid ajar, simmer 30 to 90 minutes, then strain through a sieve or colander. Season with salt if desired and cool in the refrigerator. This stock can be stored in the refrigerator up to four days or frozen up to six months.

It's important not to boil the stock, because boiling will cause the vegetables to break down and the stock to become murky. Keep to a simmer (tiny bubbles around the rim of the pot) to keep the stock clear.

Almost any vegetable is good for stock — the tough outer leaves of lettuce, stems and stalks of parsley and other

herbs, pea pods, mushroom stems, leek tops and others. For clarity, avoid legumes and potatoes, as these produce a cloudy broth. Broccoli, cauliflower and dark, leafy vegetables tend to create an overpowering flavor.

You can enliven a commercial broth with the addition of a few tablespoons of minced onion, carrots or celery and a pinch of parsley or thyme.

This French Onion Soup uses low-sodium beef bouillon for a warm, elegant dish that's clearly delicious and easy to prepare.

### FRENCH ONION SOUP

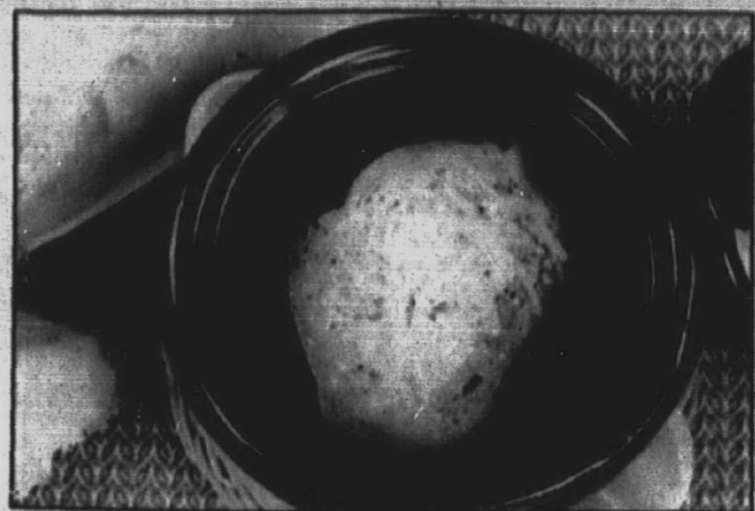
- 1 1/2 cups onions, sliced
- 2 teaspoons margarine
- 6 cups beef bouillon (preferably low-sodium)
- Ground black pepper to taste

- 6 slices French bread
- 2 teaspoons grated Parmesan cheese

Cook the onions in margarine for about 3 minutes over a medium heat in a saucepan. Add the bouillon and pepper. Simmer for 20-30 minutes, until the onions are tender. Sprinkle the cheese over the slices of French bread. Place them under the broiler to melt the cheese. Float the bread on top of the soup in a large soup tureen or individual soup dishes.

Each of the 6 servings contains 144 calories and 3.5 grams of fat.

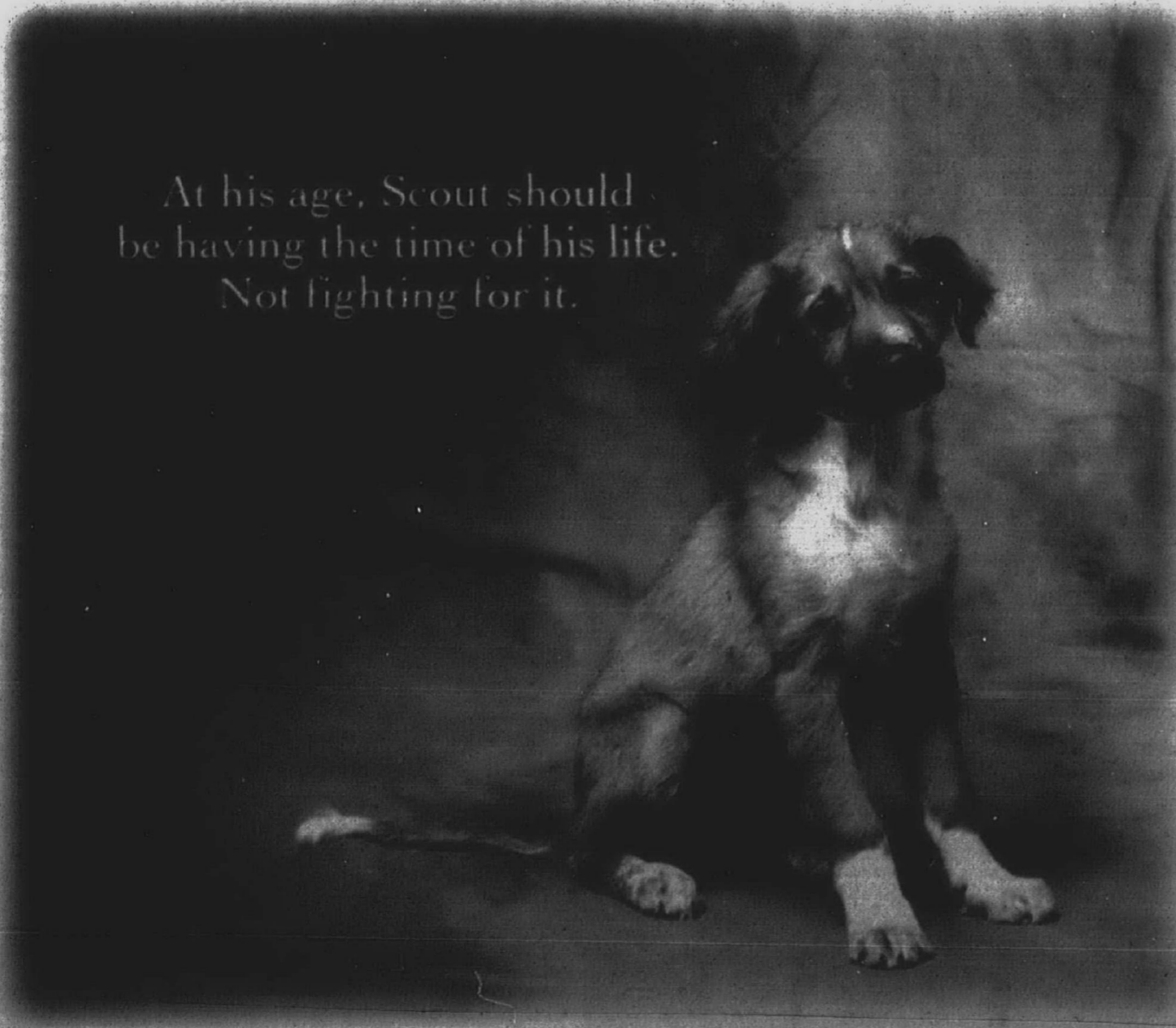

# 'Strange Days' beats to death a fascinating premise

In the final hours of 1999, the streets of Los Angeles look like they've just heard the Rodney King verdict. Police in riot gear hold back crowds as they loot and burn everything in sight. Asian shop owners patrol outside their businesses with Uzis under their arms.

Through these streets walks (or maybe slithers) Lenny Nero, a greasy ex-cop who hustles more than just fake Rolexes from his briefcase. He specializes in a form of virtual reality so state-of-the-art and addictive that it sells like drugs.

It works like this: an octopus-like device lies beneath a hat or wig, wires dangling onto your scalp. Keep a Discman-style deck near you and it will record everything you hear, see, even feel. Lenny collects these slices of life for resale to "wireheads," who can now tap into someone else's cerebral cortex.

A great concept to be sure. But in "Strange Days," director Kathryn Bigelow and writer James

Cameron beat the idea senseless for nearly two-and-a-half hours. What should have been (and sometimes still is) the best cyber-fantasy of the decade becomes one of the year's most frustrating and ponderous films.

Cameron, the man behind the "Terminator" movies and last year's "True Lies," is not one for brevity. His story, co-scripted with former film critic Jay Cocks, has some of the worst dialogue you'll hear in a movie this year, a form of hard-boiled retro banter that would make Raymond Chandler wince.

Bigelow, who made the impressive "Near Dark," has some stunning moments behind the camera, right from the opening shot. Here we see a restaurant robbery take place through the eyes of one of the perpetrators, from the rounding up of customers to a chase across downtown rooftops.

While robberies and sex tapes are his most popular sellers, Nero draws the line at anything where someone is actually killed. He has a doozy on his hands, a graphic rape and murder where the killer has wired the victim so that she

can feel his sensations along with her own pain.

Nero is played by Ralph Fiennes, the talented actor from "Schindler's List" and "Quiz Show." With oily hair falling to his eyes and garish neckties, he's out of his element as this urban loser and ex-cop. Even when he mumbles he's way too articulate.

No problem with Angela Bassett as the limousine driver Mace who comes through time and again for her friend. She disapproves of Nero's business, offering up the movie's few good lines: "Memories are meant to fade; they're designed that way for a reason."

A flashback shows her coming home from work one day to find her husband led away in handcuffs while Nero watches over her son. It's one of the only moments in "Strange Days" where something is conveyed so briefly and effectively.

Of course this is primarily an action movie and it has its share of over-the-top sequences. What looks like a routine car chase, machine guns blazing from the follow car, ends with Mace and Nero trapped in a flaming limousine. Open the door and they know they'll be shot.

Familiar faces dot the support-

ing cast, from Tom Sizemore as the Nero's ex-cop friend to Juliette Lewis as his ex-girlfriend, now the property of a powerful music producer and club owner. He's basically an extension of the long-haired, gravel-voiced baddie in "The Crow," played by the same actor.

In a movie about seeing, the look is very important. Many of the scenes in "Strange Days" are well-designed in wide-screen, but Bigelow overcompensates for those long point-of-view passages by giving everything else more shots than necessary, at one point cutting an entire soliloquy between two slightly different angles.

"Strange Days" is far from the worst movie of the year, but it sure tries hard. Where most of Cameron's movies have been released on laser disc with additional footage in the director's cut, it might be worth a look at this one with a half hour actually trimmed.

### Canton swimmers 3-0

The Plymouth Canton swim team stayed perfect against competition in the Western Lakes Activities Association's Western Division, but it took a strong finish in the final event to do it.

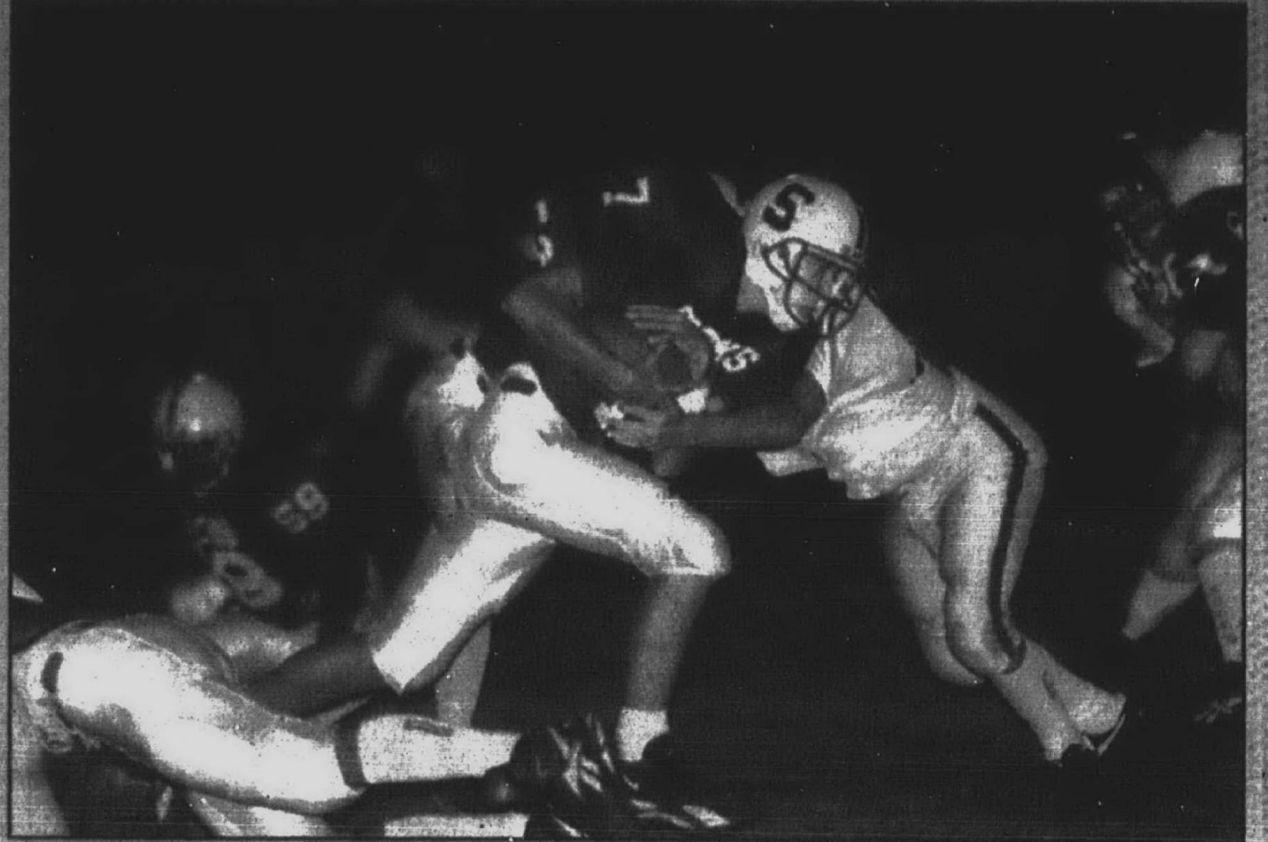
But the beneficiaries of Mack's performance were his offensive line.

## Just good enough

### Rocks edge Northville to qualify for Class A state finals

Friday the 13th certainly wasn't bad luck for Plymouth Salem.

The Rocks used their greatest asset — quality depth — to its fullest extent at Friday's Class A Regional at Oak Pointe Golf Course in Brighton, and it was enough to qualify for the Class A state finals Friday at Michigan State's Forest Akers.

By a single stroke, Livonia Churchill, which three days earlier won the Western Lakes Activities Association championship, finished a stellar week with a victory at the regional. The Chargers shot a 308, edging host Brighton (309). Salem was third with a 317 — one shot better than Northville.

### GOLF

Salem's scorers were Mike Hjelstad, 76; Brian Fox, 77; Ryan Deschaw, 81; and Jeff Lear, 83.

And Ryan Andrzejewski? One of the best golfers in Salem history suffered through one of his poorest rounds, shooting 65-54/119.

## Kurtis IS marathon history

If it isn't the first rule of journalism, it's one of the oldest: "If you want to get it straight, go to the source."

With that adage in mind, it makes perfect sense that the Plymouth Historical Society asked Doug Kurtis to speak on the subject "The history of the marathon."

I mean, considering Kurtis' background — having run in more than 170 marathons, with 38 wins (as of Thursday; those numbers were subject to change with Sunday's running of the Detroit Free Press Marathon, which Kurtis has won six times) — the feeling is he was there, at the very first one.

Certainly my suspicions were further aroused when he pointed out that it was uncertain who that first marathon runner was. In one historical account, the guy who ran from the plains of Marathon to Athens to announce the victory over the Persians was named Philippides; in another, he was Pheidippides.

Philippides could have been the guy announcing the victory, then toppling over dead, I thought; Pheidippides could have been Kurtis, running along with him and then telling the astounded Athenians, "C'mon, fellas, I'm just warmin' up."

You take a look at the diminutive Kurtis (he's about 5-foot-7, 128-130 pounds) and it isn't hard to imagine him garbed in a toga with a crown of fig leaves.

Of course, that's not what the ancient Greeks wore when they competed, Kurtis pointed out. In fact, they didn't wear anything at all. Indeed, it's puzzling to note that our society associates the basic principles of modern logic with ancient Athens when listening to Kurtis relate this:

"Ancient Greeks competed in the nude, but there were no audiences, only all-male judges, who were dressed in togas. This changed when a mother disguised herself as a judge so she could see her son compete and, when he won, in her elation to run to him and congratulate him, she lost her toga.

"After that, the judges were required to be nude as well."

Hey guys: Guess it makes no sense to dress the competitors, does it? None of it makes sense.

But neither does marathon racing. Take the somewhat modern marathon. A couple of Frenchmen actually resurrected it, in time for the 1896 Olympics in Paris. The idea of long-distance racing quickly caught on; Boston had its first marathon that year, too.

And that distance — 26 miles, 385 yards? Another bizarre history. There really was no official distance for a marathon for a while. But for the 1906 Olympics in London, it was determined it would be a race of 26 miles.

The 385 yards, according to Kurtis' historical accounts, were added by royal decree. Seems the monarchy insisted the race go a bit further, to allow them to witness the completion. So the 385 yards was tacked on, finishing the race in front of the royal box.

Still, it was another 14 years before it was made the marathon's official distance.

Clearly, Kurtis has enjoyed discussing the history behind what has become a focal point in his life, instead of the mechanics involved with it. Some of the famous names, from Frank Shorter to Rosie Ruiz (who ran only the last couple of miles of the '80 New York Marathon, then tried to pass herself off as the winner), are intertwined with his own life.

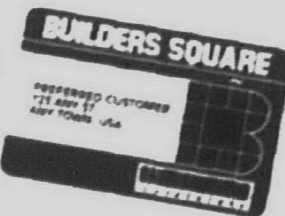

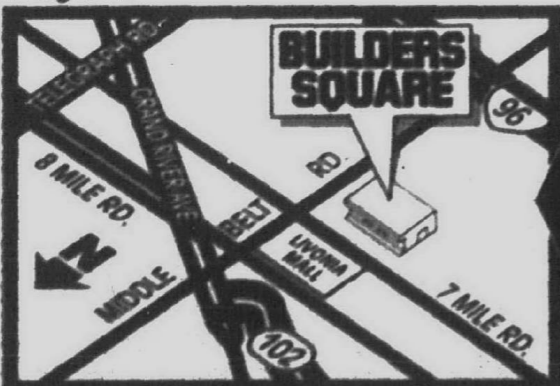

## No challenge

### Salem's too much for Stevenson

It was a week of few challenges for Plymouth Salem's basketball team.

If there was a message Rocks' coach Fred Thomann would like to deliver, it would be that few weeks will ever be this easy. In fact, if he had his way, there wouldn't be any at all.

Salem completely dominated visiting Livonia Stevenson Thursday — much the same way the Rocks reigned over Livonia Churchill in a 25-point victory Tuesday — in handing the Spartans a 69-28 setback.

The win improved the Rocks' record to 8-4 overall, 4-2 in the Western Lakes Activities Association. Stevenson fell to 6-7 overall, 3-4 in the WLAA.

"We got on top pretty quick, and really did a nice job tonight," said Thomann, noting that everyone on the team played at least 10 minutes.

■ Canton 53, Harrison 26: What Plymouth Canton brought to Farmington Harrison's gym Thursday evening was a lesson in defense.

The Chiefs were tied with Harrison coming into the game. By halftime, that issue was decided; Canton led 22-12, a cushion that

was more than the Hawks could make up in a quarter.

The most Harrison managed in a single period was nine points; the loss left it with a 5-2 WLAA mark, 8-5 overall. The Chiefs improved to 6-1 in the WLAA, 10-3 overall.

## Emilia Castillo designs art for the table

Suggest that silver-designer Emilia Castillo lives a dream-life in paradise, and she's the first to agree.

"I surely do have many blessings," she winked at daughters Alex, 11, and



Christina, 8, who accompanied her on a recent visit to Neiman Marcus in the Somerset Collection, Troy.

From her "ranch" (read production compound with 300 employees) in

Taxco, Mexico, the petite brunette and her daughters, design, manufacture, and sell tableware, trophies, sculpture and jewelry across the globe. Clients include The Vatican, Prince Charles of England, and specialty stores like Neiman Marcus.

Castillo and partner/husband Roberto Romo, talked about their craft and company over breakfast in the department store's cafe. Their charm would make you smile. Emilia's enthusiasm for her life and work, would make you envious.

"My daughters are third generation silversmiths and designers," she said with pride. "They have their own workspace in my studio and they love to draw and create ideas. Their jewelry line is a favorite with people around the world."

"Last year in Paris, we met an older woman who told us she wears the girls' pins because they are young and happy. Her trademark is to give our pins away as gifts."

Alex looked at her mother and asked to say a few words on behalf of her own designs.

"I love to draw them," she said with a shy authority. "I am working on some necklaces and pretty silver frames now, and candleholders that come apart to make three."

Emilia explained that four silversmiths are assigned to her daughters' drawings, charged with recreating the best ideas in metal. The pins, exclusive to Neiman Marcus, cost \$30 to \$80.

"My girls are fortunate to attend the school that has been provided at the ranch for the children of the craftsmen," Emilia continued. "The children wear uniforms, study computer, art, English, and Japanese. This year is the first to add high

school. We have 65 students, some who may eventually become apprentices at our workshops."

"Everything we do is by hand, cus-

tom," Castillo continued. "We have resisted installing machines like

other silver companies in the area. I try and tell them, 'You are putting local people out of business,' but they incorrectly believe I do not want them to grow or succeed. We are dedicated to our way because we see the prosperity that being part of our company brings to young Mexican families."

At the ranch the family enjoys horseback riding, natural waterfalls and tropical gardens — luxuries brought about by the town's natural silver deposits and the artistry of Emilia's father, Antonio, and uncles Coco and Chato, who were apprentices of American architect William Spratling in the late 1930s in Taxco.

Vacationing, Spratling came across the town's magnificent silver cathedral, erected to God in the 1700s as repayment for His gift of silver. Spratling recognized the artistry in the sleepy town's trade. He settled in the area to learn its techniques and create silver pieces, now collector's items.

The Castillo's met and married in 1978. Romo explained that it was a "shotgun" wedding quickly arranged by Emilia's father an hour after the pair returned from touring a site in Acapulco that would eventually become their award-winning restaurant "Madeirasas." The restaurant was sold when the couple decided to focus all energies on becoming metal-work innovators.

Today the Castillos make one-of-a-kind silver pieces by request for governments and crown heads of state. They also make hollowware, flatware, dinnerware and sculpture for the rest of us. Most

pieces are silverplated, but sterling pieces are created for customers by special order through Emilia Castillo stores in Taxco, Paris, Milan and St. Barts.

Castillo said her crowning achievement came in 1992, when her company completed a cross for the interior of the Chapel of Guadalupe in the Vatican using 800 kilos of silver, donated by the people of Mexico. The chapel is near St. Peter's tomb.

She is also proud of a World Polo Masters trophy she fashioned for the government of Mexico (recently won by Prince Charles), and a silver iguana for

the governor of Mexico which she uses to illustrate her design philosophy.

"The iguana's tail rattles and the body can be moved many different ways," she explained. "When I designed this gift, I pictured a very serious man with many problems on his shoulders needing, like a little boy, to pull the tail, relax, have some ease from the tensions of the day. I try to add humor to all my designs for this reason."

The Castillos continue to improve their craft, working high-tech materials into their designs and adding new color tones. Collectors have come to appreciate Castillo's unique process of fusing pure silver and porcelain, and her silverplate pieces fused with malachite. She promises to continue embellishing her pieces with inspirations from the tropical landscape that surrounds her — scampering iguanas, ephemeral butterflies and dancing fish.

### '95 Lincoln Continental gives Lexus a run for its money

CARMEL, Calif. — When Lexus came on the market five years ago, American luxury car-makers didn't really take the threat to heart. It was a mistake they later regretted.

Today, the battle to sell a state-of-the-art luxury car to demanding American car buyers isn't so clear-cut. The redesigned Lincoln Continental complicates everything. This car should prove to be one of Ford Motor Co.'s better ideas of all time.

But let's back up for a sec to get some perspective on the luxury-car segment. When Lincoln-Mercury introduced the Mark VIII about 18 months ago, many thought the light bulb had burned out at Ford. The VIII didn't look, feel or act like a luxury car. It just didn't compete with Lexus and Infiniti. And the previous-generation Continental didn't rate, either.

But the lightbulb is back on

you. Colors aren't stark; instead, they're really pleasing. The wood trim is understated and actually looks real — it's not cheap plastic imitation.

This is a Lexus LS 400 with a Lincoln nameplate on it.

The Continental's MSRP is \$41,375, up from the previous model's base price of \$34,375. Ford expects to sell at least 30,000 Continentals in 1995.

Keith McGee, vice president and general manager of the Lincoln-Mercury Division, said the Continental was not built from the ground up.

"The Continental was built from the customer out," he said. "Our mission was to build the best front-wheel-drive luxury car in the world. Every aspect of Continental is personalized for the individual driver."

Herein lies the rub. Personalization for at least two drivers has never been done — by a domestic or foreign automaker.

Oh, sure, we've seen those lit-

tle memory buttons on the driver's door that can recall seating and steering-wheel placement for two different drivers. But this sets everything. Or everything that you change when you get into a car to drive.

Lincoln calls it the Memory Profile System, and it's comprehensive. Each driver can set his or her own preferences for auto-lamp delay settings, inside and outside mirror positions, seat positions, instrument lighting intensity, easy entry and exit seating positions, ride firmness (plush, normal and firm), variable assist steering effort (low, medium and high) and even radio station presets.

The driver can also set on and off positions for the door lock confirmation chirp, automatic express-down driver's window, automatic door locks at 3 miles per hour and automatic tilt-down outside rearview mirrors that help drivers see better when they're backing out of a space.

All this can be programmed in the driver's seat by scrolling through a message center in the instrument panel. Once all the selections are made, the driver can set the program by using the key fob or by choosing the "driver 1" or "driver 2" buttons on the driver's door panel.

And if you just don't want to fool with it — as some mature drivers who aren't computer-oriented — it can all be set at the dealership at delivery, as many times as the owner wishes, said Fred Simon, project manager for the Continental.

"What we're doing is tailoring the car for each individual customer, and (that) lets us build a car around the customer," he said. "Such personalization of a car is the first of its kind in the industry."

The Continental is powered by an all-new InTech V-8 engine. It's Ford's first transverse-mounted front-wheel-drive engine and the first time the Continental has ever had a V-8.

The car's got a 4.6-liter dual overhead cam four-valve 8-cylinder that produces a more-than-adequate 260 horsepower. It has 62 percent more power than the 3.6-liter V6 it replaces, and has a zero-60 time of 7.6 seconds.

Due to its platinum spark plugs, the InTech engine can go 100,000 miles without a tune-up and is coupled to a beefy 4-speed automatic transmission, a computer-managed air suspension, load-leveling suspension and four-wheel independent suspension system.

Other changes on the Continental:

\* The radio antenna is now within the rear window glass to cut wind noise.

\* There's a 5-disc CD changer in

the center console (rather than in the trunk).

\* A hands-free, voice-activated cellular phone is new. The phone is so sensitive that it can even detect your individual voice even if you have a cold. And, more importantly, it won't voice-activate a call during normal conversation. It only calls if you direct a command to make the call. This is an important feature because previous voice systems would dial "the jerk" if that was a keyword, causing embarrassment since the driver didn't really mean to call "the jerk" right now.

Anti-lock brakes, dual airbags, side-impact standards that meet the 1998 federal standards and 5 mph bumpers round out the safety package.

"The interior and exterior design enhancements make the 1995 Continental a more than worthy opponent for its import and domestic competition," said L-M GM McGee.

For once, he's right. The lightbulb shines bright on this one.
