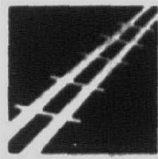

The question of whether to close the York Street railroad crossing was nearly decided by city commissioners

Some residents and business people are opposed to the proposed closing of the York Street railroad crossing. City commissioners nearly resolved the issue Tuesday, then decided to seek more information.

At a public hearing on the issue Feb. 5, most residents and business people told commissioners they'd like

Commissioner John Vos moved to leave the crossing open and put up gates and signals as the state re-

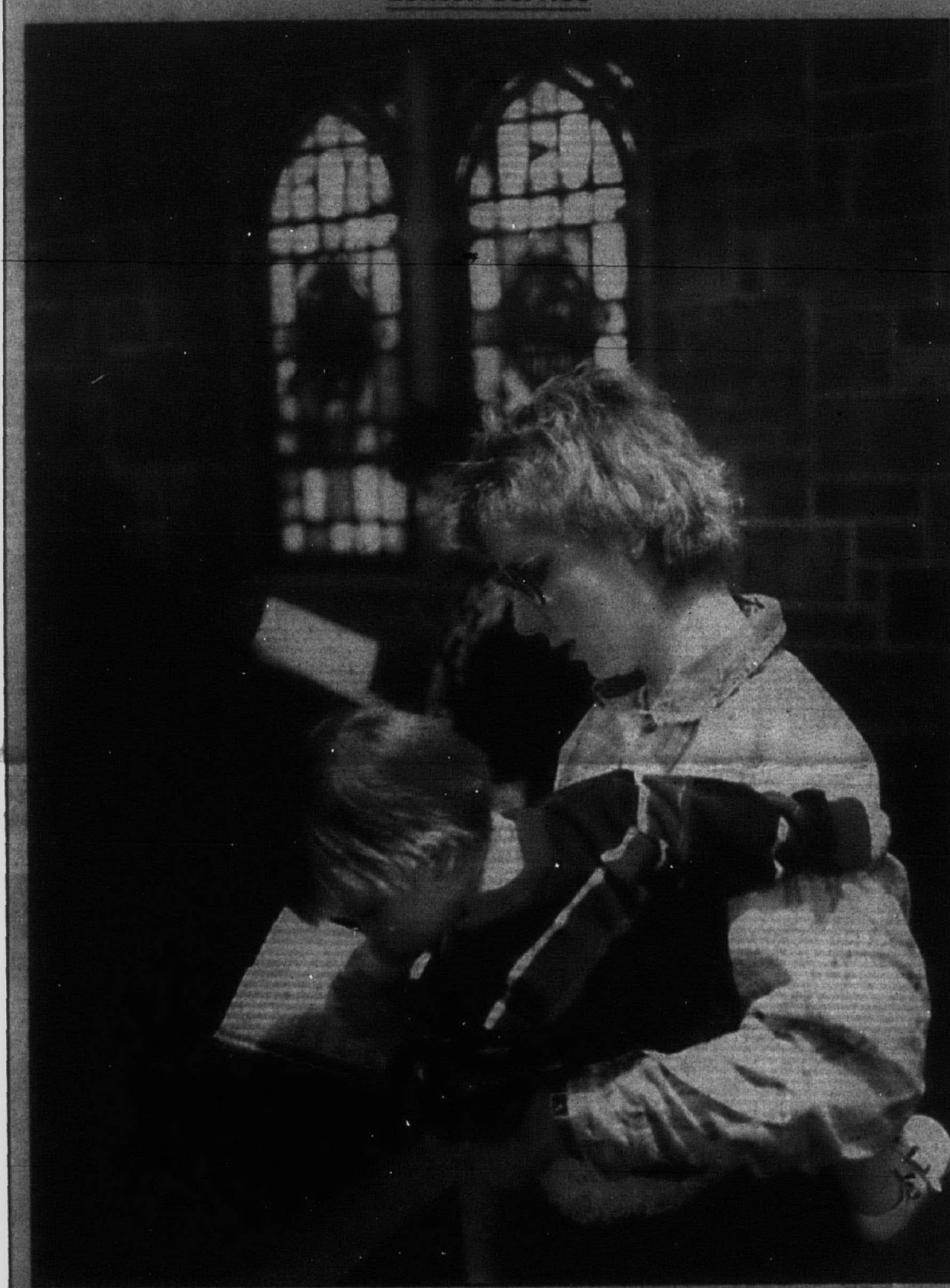
quires, as most residents said they want the crossing open.

But Commissioner Joe Koch said it wasn't really clear to the public that only two options exist. He said just the two options should be presented to the public again, to see which they'll choose.

Break on taxes sought

Military parts maker Loc Performance is seeking to expand and add new equipment, so city commissioners are meeting its request to set up a tax abatement district to make the expansion happen.

Creating the district is the first step toward actual granting of a tax break. Commissioners voted to create the district at their Feb. 20 meeting.

Victor Vojcek, owner of Loc Performance, told commissioners that the company, on Industrial Drive, also has a facility in Florida, and the company could save money by moving to Florida.

"I've lived in Plymouth all my life, my family and friends are here, we'd like to stay," Vojcek said.

Loc Performance is the city's third-largest industrial taxpayer, paying more than \$2.6 million in taxes last year. City commissioners could approve up to a 50-percent tax break on new equipment and an expanded fa-

Values of homes up a bit

Home assessments are rising by an average of more than 4 percent in greater Plymouth, but thanks to the passage of Proposal A in 1994, most homeowners will pay just 2.8 percent more in taxes than last year.

In the city of Plymouth, that means a person with a home valued at \$100,000 last year will pay nearly \$50 more in taxes this year.

In Plymouth Township, someone with a home valued at \$150,000 will pay \$85 more in taxes this year.

Plymouth City Assessor Judy Zirblis said assessments are rising an average of 4.8 percent in the city, based on two and three-year sales studies. Notices of city assessment increases were mailed to homeowners last week.

Homeowners who will get a higher increase than 2.8 percent — the inflation rate — are those who put on an addition, bought new homes last year or those with second homes or rental property.

If you go to the 78th Annual Detroit Kennel Club Dog Show March 10 at Cobo Center, look for the Shih Tzu with Joyce Finney of Plymouth.

Shih Tzus — pronounced shee-zoo — are sturdy, small dogs known for their long coats. Finney's dog, Jofins Sweet Sadie Sue, is one of several she's shown professionally. She and her husband currently own three dogs and two puppies.

"We became interested in this breed when our daughter had an injury to her eye caused by her pony," Ron Finney said. "We decided to get her a

small dog that would not shed, bite or was too big to cause any injury to her."

They got a Shih Tzu, a friendly, sturdy, quiet toy breed. Soon they were taking daughter Marcy and the dogs to puppy matches — small scale dog shows — and eventually showed dogs around the country.

What makes a good show dog? Besides meeting physical standards for the breed, Joyce Finney said, "It's got to want to do it. Some are just born to show."

Resident nominated for community service award

Cindy Merrifield, a Plymouth resident, has been nominated for a 1995 Governor's Community Service Award, a statewide awards program administered by the Michigan Community Service Commission.

Merrifield was nominated in the category of "Exemplary Community Service" by The Salvation Army. "Cindy's direct involvement in the Plymouth Corps of The Salvation Army has had a tremendous impact on the success of that Corps," said Lt. Colonel William J. Speck, Divisional Commander for the Eastern Michigan Division of The Salvation Army.

Merrifield has served the Canton Plymouth Northville community through the Plymouth Corps of The Salvation Army, serving on its Advisory Board since 1980 and chairing its program committee and Christmas kettle campaign. Impact of school funding cut minimal

It appears school officials fears about large cuts in state aid won't be realized.

Officials resolve smoking issue

Wayne County Probate Court and local officials have declared a truce in their disagreement over smoking tickets.

Plymouth-Canton school and law enforcement officials complained recently that court officials were dismissing tickets issued to Plymouth-Canton students for smoking on school property.

At a meeting Thursday, the issue was cleared up. It appears there was a lack of communication.

"We called the meeting because we wanted to resolve the issue of how these smoking tickets are being handled," said Canton Public Safety Director John Santomauro.

"We led people to believe that the tickets were being dismissed, when in fact they were dismissed with prejudice with a fine attached. There's a big difference," the director said.

"Our intent all along with this issue of smoking was to meet with the Probate Court and discuss our concerns. Unfortunately, that did not occur first before we put out inaccurate information."

Derrick Glass, traffic and ordinance referee with the juvenile division of Probate Court, said 25 Plymouth-Canton students have been assessed fines for smoking since mid-December 1995.

"We had 29 tickets scheduled, and 25 of those persons appeared in court and were assessed court costs for possession of tobacco. Three persons didn't appear, and one ticket was withdrawn by an assistant principal."

Tickets are dismissed with prejudice upon receipt of \$25 in costs, Glass said.

Among those in attendance Thursday were Alexander Luvall, juvenile court registrar and chief administrator for the Probate Court's Juvenile Division; Plymouth-Canton school board

members Susan Davis and Michael Maloney; and Santomauro.

"The meeting was real positive," said Davis, who works with the court on a professional basis with Growth Works, a local youth services agency. "We came to the conclusion that we really are playing on the same songsheet. We all want what's best for kids."

"County officials are very willing to work with our community," added Davis. "They see us as being very progressive in wanting to do business differently. They're really open to helping us solve problems we see in the community."

"We're not going to do anything really new, but these violations will be referred back to through the normal channels," Davis said.

Santomauro said it was agreed that one individual at the Probate Court will be made liaison with Canton's Public Safety Department and school district.

It also was agreed, he said, "that the tickets are being issued to emphasize to young people the consequences of their actions, not necessarily the seriousness of smoking, or the violation of a law."

"We appreciate what the court is doing, but it's important for us to emphasize to youths the consequences of their actions," said Santomauro. "We all realized that a (\$25) fine is not going to emphasize consequences."

Probate Court also agreed to refer the offenses back to the local level as much as possible through Growth Works and other social service organizations.

The Canton Public Safety Department and the schools agreed to form a task force "to look at issues involving public safety in the schools," added the director. Probate Court officials are welcome to participate.

Kids race to learn

There are 300 new authorities on the Inuit people and Iditarod in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Two hundred students at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park and 100 fifth-graders at Tonda Elementary School were visited by Dan Anderson, a musher who hails from the Grand Rapids area. He brought with him six Siberian huskies and a dogsled.

Anderson, of Tundra Outfitters, taught students about the Inuit people, and about the 1,150-mile Iditarod dogsled race that kicks off Saturday in Anchorage.

His visit was arranged by fifth-grade teacher Donna Sarrach.

"The kids were super-impressed," said Ron Myers, who also teaches fifth grade at Tonda.

The Iditarod has its own home page on the Internet, and Myers is connecting his students to the web page through America on-line. Each fifth-grader is being matched with a musher, and will track his or her progress through the checkpoints as the race heads for Nome.

Last week's warm weather unfortunately melted all the snow, but luckily, Anderson's practice sled is equipped with wheels. The musher allowed students to pet his dogs and hooked up the huskies to the sled for laps around the bus loop at Tonda and behind Salem High School.

Someone call Ripley's Believe it or Not!

Jane Addams, Albert Einstein, James Monroe, Eli Whitney, Anne Hutchinson, Patrick Henry, John Hancock, Mary McLeod Bethune, Davy Crockett, Colin Powell, John Quincy Adams and many other celebrities were in the Eriksson Elementary School gym Tuesday, regaling students, teachers and parents with tales of their exploits.

Even George Washington was there, looking sporty in his three-corner hat, wavy white wig, and black and white duds. Big silver buckles shone on his black leather shoes.

"I was born Feb. 22, 1732, and became a surveyor. I was the first president of the United States," said Washington, more commonly known to classmates as Eriksson fifth-grader Chris Brown. "I'm on the dollar bill and the quarter. I died Dec. 14, 1799. They believe I ran out of blood and just died."

"I was sick, and they used to believe that if you took blood out of a person, they would get better."

Washington vehemently denied having any wooden teeth.

Addams wore a full-length, peach gown decorated with ivory lace reminiscent of 1860. "I opened the Hull House, a community center for the poor. I established Chicago's first playground and was the vice president of the National American Women's Suffrage Association. I also worked for world peace after the Spanish-American War."

Graying President James Monroe, alias Dave Peacock, looked dapper in his Sunday best. He spoke of his birth in 1758 in Virginia and accepted accolades for authoring the Monroe Doctrine, "which protects North and South America from foreign powers."

Dave said, "One thing that surprised me about President Monroe is that when he was a little kid, he owned his own slaves and had a tobacco field."

Stacy Herberholz impersonated John Hancock, first to sign the Declaration of Independence.

"His father died when he was only 7 years old, and he lived with his Uncle Thomas. His uncle died and left him his fortune from the mercantile business," said Stacy. "He was married to Dolly Quincy. When he died, 20,000 people walked in his funeral procession in Boston. He has four ships named after him."

Anne Hutchinson, born in 1591 and also known as Candace Harmon, told visitors about her life as a

preacher.

"Anne Hutchinson wanted to follow in her dad's footsteps. He was a preacher, and died when she was 14," said Candace. "She was put in jail for four months, because people back then thought women shouldn't be preachers. White men killed her and her whole family."

"She was brave and really stood up for what she believed in. She cared about others, not just herself," said Candace.

Fifth-grade teachers Carol Biro, Jim DeKiere and Donna Jeziorski coordinated the Biography Fair.

Jeziorski said it's gratifying to see young people learning about more women in history. "I teach both science and social studies. I feel authors are making a big effort to highlight the accomplishments of females and minorities, who for so many years weren't recognized as having thinking ability or having made contributions. We perused lots of sources to come up with female figures as well as male."

it takes about three hours to comb out the long, straight coat. When not showing a Shih Tzu, owners cut their coat shorter, making it easier to manage. When parading her dogs before show judges, Finney said it's tradi-

tional to wear something that compliments the dog's color.

While Finney has shown dogs that have become champions, she can recall times a dog has relieved itself before the judges, or gotten friendly with another dog while being shown.

"You say 'We'll just try for the next show,'" Finney said.

While televised dog shows focus on the show aspect, the Detroit Kennel Club Dog Show is also classified as a bench show, meaning owners are required to explain their dog's breed to showgoers who ask questions.

"If you're looking for a good guard dog, this is not the dog," Finney said, adding the dogs are friendly with everyone.

Among the qualities of Shih Tzus she likes are their tendency "to pounce like cats."

"They are truly clowns of the dog world," Ron Finney said. "They don't know they are dogs and they get insulted if you treat them other than a member of the family."

Joyce Finney said a dog show is a good place for people seeking to buy a dog to ask questions to determine a particular breed's characteristics.

While they've become friends with other Shih Tzu owners who travel to shows, Finney said she and her husband aren't traveling to as many shows as they once did.

"We started with the dogs because of the kids," she said. "It gives them something to do and to be proud of." Their daughter Marcy is now a dog groomer.

For those who suspect they might make a lot of money showing and breeding dogs, Finney and fellow Shih Tzu owners have a routine, which involves playing a tape of someone laughing.

"It's basically a wash," Finney said, adding dog breeding and showing is mainly a hobby.

"We just like doing it," she said.

The show runs from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Tickets are \$9 for adults and \$6 for children under 12 and seniors. A family ticket admits two adults and three children for \$25. Tickets are available at Hudson's and Ticketmaster outlets.

The show features an information center staffed by breeders and free literature on breeds. Demonstrations include police dogs in action, sheep herding and retrieving demonstrations.

believe more than two options exist.

The commission voted 5-1 in favor of Koch's motion to postpone a vote. Mayor Ron Loiselle voted against the motion, saying the public had expressed a desire not to close the crossing. Commissioner Don Dismuke had an excused absence from the meeting.

Loiselle said he spoke with a CSX employee who said other states use crossing bells only when the gates are moving — not the entire time the train passes. Saying crossing bells were one concern of residents, Loiselle said the city could explore such a crossing arrangement. But he said this was a side issue, adding, "We should make a decision."

Commissioner Dennis Shrewsbury raised the issue of cost, saying it would cost the city \$60,000

to pay for ordered crossing equipment. To close the crossing would cost the city nothing, plus CSX would pay toward a rubber crossing at Holbrook or Mill if the city votes to close the York crossing.

"We're talking about a saving of \$80,000 minimum," he said. "I heard everything the citizens said last week. We have the classic coin toss. Even though the citizens were pretty vocal, I can't in good conscience ignore the fiscal concerns, and there are a lot of safety concerns," Shrewsbury said, adding financial concerns affect all residents.

Vos said that citizens don't support closing the crossing, plus an adjacent business owner has threatened to leave if the crossing is closed. "I don't think we need to lose any businesses. It's true we lose money, this is the cost of doing business. We should not

infringe on our citizens," Vos said.

"I think it's real important to consider what the residents think," Commissioner Doug Miller said. "I always get real concerned when government makes that decision, we always get real upset when the state does that."

Miller asked the city administration to study closing both York and Holbrook, something some residents said they'd support. Some commissioners said that wouldn't be desirable, as traffic would be shifted heavily onto Mill Street.

City Manager Steve Walters said the city administration would review Miller's suggestion and any options possible in crossing gate equipment required by the state, and report back to commissioners at their next meeting March 4.

tility for up to 12 years, by state law governing granting of tax abatements.

A study performed two years ago by a committee appointed by the City Commission concluded it's best to offer tax breaks to industrial companies that qualify, to keep them in the city paying taxes.

Vojcek said the company, which makes parts for tanks and Army trucks, is the largest such parts maker in the world.

The company, in Plymouth since 1977, records annual sales

of more than \$15 million and employs 85 people. "Sales for 1996 are expected to be approximately 60 percent higher than 1995," said company Controller Jeanine Byrd in a letter to the city.

"To handle the increased sales volume, Loc Performance will need to purchase approximately \$2 million worth of new machining equipment during the next 18 months," she said.

The company said about 50 new jobs will be created by the upgrading and expansion.

City Manager Steve Walters said this is the fourth request for a tax abatement from current city industries.

"While this is an unusually high number for the city compared to recent years, it is an encouraging sign that the city has existing industrial taxpayers who have been here for a long period of time, have experienced sustained business growth, and want to expand and continue to compete in the marketplace from their existing city locations," Walters said.

Duggan a eyes cleaner Rouge River by 1998

Michael Duggan is a big fan of paddleboats.

He likes the idea of having them on the Rouge River.

Duggan, deputy Wayne County executive, who's taken on cleaning up the Rouge River and making it accessible to residents, wants to help people create memories. He shared his plans with members of the Rouge Remedial Action Plan Advisory Council at the council's meeting Wednesday.

Since the Rouge was polluted and Hines Park had gained a reputation for drugs, bikers and crime by the time he was growing up in Livonia in the late 1960s and early '70s, he wants people to be able to make memories like those of Russ Gronevelt, director of public services for the county. Gronevelt grew up in Livonia

about 15 years earlier than Duggan, Duggan said. His memories include canoeing on Newburgh Lake and ice skating on Wilcox Lake.

"What could we do to go back to that?" Duggan said he asked himself.

As a youth, going to Kensington Park was a family activity, but it's also a full day's activity, he said. Today, with both parents working, it hard to find time; it's easier to stick a tape in the video-cassette recorder, he said.

But lately with canoeing on parts of the Rouge, which started last year and ice skating on Wilcox and Newburgh lakes, which started this year, Duggan said it's been more convenient to take his kids out.

"Someday my kids will remember skating and canoeing with dad. I guarantee if we had just sat

down and watched TV we wouldn't have those memories," he said.

He said he has spent hours talking with James Murray, director of the county's Department of Environment, about recreational opportunities on the Rouge.

"There's something about this Rouge project, and you already know this, it's magical," he said.

He described an experience of years ago when he was asked to talk to citizens in Wyandotte concerned about the proposed construction of a retention basin. When he asked people what the

creek was like, they described it as smelly, flowing with sewage.

After asking if people would rather have the sewage removed and kept in the retention basin, he realized that people didn't understand what the basin would do, he said.

Now he's asking again what the county can do to make the public understand, to "show people that they're getting value for their money," he said.

Duggan described work done on the Rouge in Hines Park as a cooperative effort with Department of Public Works workers volun-

teering to clear log jams from the river.

Among plans to improve recreational facilities in Hines Park is dredging Newburgh Lake. A PCB site nearby still needs to be cleaned up, and the Department of Environmental Quality will start the cleanup this spring, he said.

Duggan said the potential for drowning in the lake because of the undertow near the dam has caused him concern. "We brought in the best dam engineers we could find," Duggan said to a round of laughter at the pun.

The result is that the slope of the dam will be changed to reduce undertow, he said.

"If we're going to bring water activities to Newburgh Lake, we have to make sure it's safe," he said.

He predicted that by 1998, it will be safe to eat fish caught in the Rouge. He also said he hopes to bring a beach back to a local

lake. Joan Lintelman, a member of the council, raised concerns that until sewage flowing into the Rouge is stopped, the water isn't safe even for canoeing because of the potential of people falling into the water.

"We're really concerned because we have met with people from the health department. We not always positive that it's real good for the public," she said.

Water is tested at the canoe launch sites, Duggan said. Only the Newburgh to Nankin area is safe, and canoe rentals won't occur when the water contamination levels are too high, Duggan said.

"We have signs that will be placed at both access sites," said Hurley Coleman, Parks director. County officials don't want people to use their own canoes, if the county is not operating the canoe sites, he said. "The signs will say why," he said. "But there are places along the river that we have no control over."

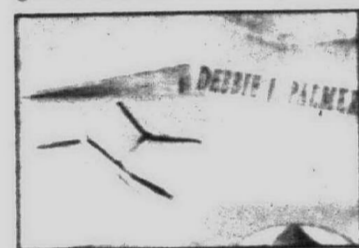

My informal survey yielded "yeas" from most makeup savvy women. Some said they applied lipstick, but never powdered their nose. Others painted their lips, but demured depending upon whom they were with.

One M.A.C. cosmetics professional at the Somerset Collection in Troy admitted that it was normal behavior for her to put on lipstick sans mirror in public, but she wouldn't do it in front of her dad. Nicky Cole of Birmingham lacquers lips among family but doesn't when she's with friends. Jayne Mooney of Bloomfield knows she shouldn't, but she does. "Never with a client, though," she adds.

Karen St. Charles, a manufacturers' rep from Pontiac, suggested that most men would probably disapprove of applying lipstick in public because they're not wild about lipstick, or at least the taste of it. "I think they like the way it looks on a woman, but they don't like kissing stained lips," she surmised.

Carol Winakur swears by lip liner and finds that applying liner and lipstick at the table is just a bit indiscreet, so she generally refrains. And manicurist Caren Kosarek was adamant in her beliefs. "Never," she answered when asked the burning lip etiquette question. "Isn't that what they have bathrooms for?" volunteered 10-year-old Nate Lewis of Detroit.

Lori Karbal, whose boutique by the same name offers lipsticks from several cosmetics lines, gives an enthusiastic thumbs up to a tasteful table-side lipstick refresher. She shared some of spring's newest lip colors and textures. From Carol Shaw for Lorac, look for gold, amethyst and pewter glosses (\$18.50). Shimmer and shine is in, as exhibited by Chanel's top-selling Levres Cristallines Crystal lip gloss compact, containing opal and metallic shades (\$37).

Also hot from Lorac, the sunburnt tints called Julia (as in Roberts) and Fran (as in Drescher) and the clear pink of Bess

(Armstrong) \$18.50.

Triah McEvoy's moisturizing shimmer stick #92 (\$16) is perfect worn over a lip liner in a sexy brown, #10 and #15. This will give the pearlescent moonlit effect that is so popular for spring.

Also from Lori Karbal in Birmingham, Rosebud Salve (\$4) or Klehl's Lip Balm (\$4.50) for inexpensive shine plus moisture. To tuck in your purse for discreet pampering, Lori recommends a tiny jeweled compact (\$50) or a matte gold pocket-book mirror (\$29.50).

Oh, if we could just once give our mouths a hearty swipe with our napkin, as the menfolk do. Guess we're destined to a dainty dab at the corners — all in deference to luscious, luminous lips.

Mall readies opening

■ Somerset North is six months away from a grand opening and tenants are announcing their leases. Here's an update, plus where to go for the jobs!

Shopping fever is spreading along Big Beaver at Coolidge in Troy and it's hard to drive by the massive mall under construction without catching it.

When the \$200-million Somerset North opens Aug. 16, it will add 3,500 full- and part-time jobs to the area, bring dozens of new dining and retailing adventures to town, and generate close to \$2 million in property taxes for the Troy Downtown Development Authority.

In 1994, the Somerset Collection across the street paid \$1,229,809 in property taxes which were earmarked for the Troy DDA and road improvements. The Oakland Mall, the city's other major retail center, paid \$1,800,608 in property taxes last year, shared by the schools, Oakland Community College and the city.

"The opening of Somerset North is a celebration for all because it puts Detroit on the big retail map," said Saks Fifth Avenue spokeswoman Cheryl Hall. "Detroit will become a shopping mecca. People used to leave town to shop at stores like Bendel's

and Nordstrom. Now they'll stay here and we'll draw shoppers from other cities."

Despite owner/manager Forbes-Cohen Properties' refusals to disclose the tenant list at the new center, the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers learned that the following retailers are among the 120 set to join tri-level anchors Nordstrom and Hudson's:

Bendel's, Helzberg Diamonds, The Right Start, Roots, Banana Republic, The Gap, Ralph Lauren's Polo Shop, Kay Bee Toys, Things Remembered, Mother's Work Maternity, most divisions of The Limited (including

Structure, Victoria's Secret, Abercrombie & Fitch, Bath & Body Works) President Tuxedo, The Pottery Barn, The Disney Store, Warner Bros. Studio Store, Franklin Mint and Gymboree.

The Peacock Food Court will feature a cappuccino bar and 10 quicky eateries around seating for 700 people. Restaurants will include The Capital Grille, a sophisticated steakhouse; California Pizza Kitchen, featuring 27 varieties of wood-fired pizza; and J. Alexander's with open-

grille entrees and slow-roaster prime rib.

The most eagerly anticipated mall attraction is the moving skywalk elevated 16-feet above Big Beaver that will transport shoppers between the Somerset Collection and Somerset North in three minutes. Ground-breaking took place in October 1994.

Throughout the summer before the Aug. 16 grand opening at Somerset North, shoppers will see an increase of promotions and special events at

"With about two million customers, we've become the leading specialty infant and toddler product merchant in America," she pointed out. "Our rapidly expanding catalog list is the perfect springboard from which to grow The Right Start stores."

The shop's interiors were created especially for young families with wide aisles for strollers, and lots of toys and videos to keep small customers happy while parents browse. All products can be pre-tested before purchase. Sales associates are mostly moms "with experience."

"Our sales staff is more than willing to help ease babies in and out of carseats and carry-alls because we understand new mothers are extra cautious about buying baby items," Blumenfeld said. Customers have typically been "new moms, 25 to 39 years old, with an average annual income in excess of \$50,000."

Best-selling products at the Right Start include strollers, nursing supplies, safety devices, nursery organiz-

ers, toys and the thermocan thermometers that take infant temperatures through the ear.

The Right Start was founded as a catalog in 1986 by Stan Fridstein and Lenny Targon who identified that a mini baby boom was taking place, coupled with the fact that 70-percent of new moms worked outside the home. These new parents had little time to shop for the latest safety and time-saving baby items.

The Right Start catalog stores have virtually "everything to make parenting easier from birth through three years," except clothing, according to Blumenfeld.

Readers are hungry for more Crock-pot recipes

February has been full of frigid temperatures and occasional bouts with snow. Many of you have been cooking (and eating) up a storm.

This month's calls were heavily in favor of two columns that appeared in January. The first, a column on whatever happened to the "good old mom & pop" type restaurants of yesteryear prompted many calls from readers who told me about their favorite local restaurants.

Doris Dennison of Livonia called with kudos for a place called Don's of Traverse City at Grand River and Wixom Roads in Wixom, and Bode's in Plymouth. Doris said the milk shakes and burgers at Don's, and the corned beef hash at Bode's, always brings back memories.

An anonymous caller said there's still a "Clock" restaurant in Lapeer, and Jan McCellan of Livonia called and recommended Thomas' on Plymouth Road in Livonia. The response was so great, I'm working on a story that will highlight local old-fashioned menus sometime in March.

Your comments also came through loud and clear about my story on "cleaning your dinner plate," with many readers relating to my early life experiences of having to eat everything on your plate.

Finally, there must be some Crock-Pot lovers still out there because your numerous responses will prompt another slow cooker column in the future. Here's a little something to hold you over till then!

PORK LOIN WITH DIJON MUSTARD AND WALNUTS

- 1 (3-4 pound) boneless pork loin
- 1/4 cup Dijon mustard
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon rosemary
- 3 cups apple juice
- 1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
- 1/2 cup walnuts, chopped

In a heavy skillet, brown pork loin in olive oil until golden on 2 sides. Brush generously with Dijon mustard and place in a crock pot.

Saute onion and garlic in pan that the loin was browned in until tender, about 3-4 minutes. Add 1/2 cup apple juice to pan and scrape bottom to remove bits. Add remaining apple juice and bring to a boil. Remove from heat and stir in balsamic vinegar and rosemary. Pour this mixture over the pork loin in a Crock-Pot and cook on high for 4-6 hours, depending on size of loin or until thermometer reaches 180 degrees. Serves 6.

Doris Allen of Livonia called a few weeks back and commented on how much she loves eating the scalloped potatoes at Rocky's in Northville. Well Doris, here's the real thing, compliments of Chef Chuck Rachwitz.

SCALLOPED POTATOES

- 6 medium size whole Idaho potatoes, peeled
- 3/4 cup white onions, sliced thin, julienne cut
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped fine
- 1 quart heavy whipping cream
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 1/2 tablespoons ground black pepper

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Slice the peeled potatoes very thin (like a potato chip). Use a 10-inch casserole dish and mix the potatoes, onions, garlic, salt and pepper together. Place in the casserole dish. Pour heavy cream over all. Cover with foil and bake at 375 degrees F. for 1 hour.

Remove foil and brown for 15 minutes. Serve immediately. Serves 6.

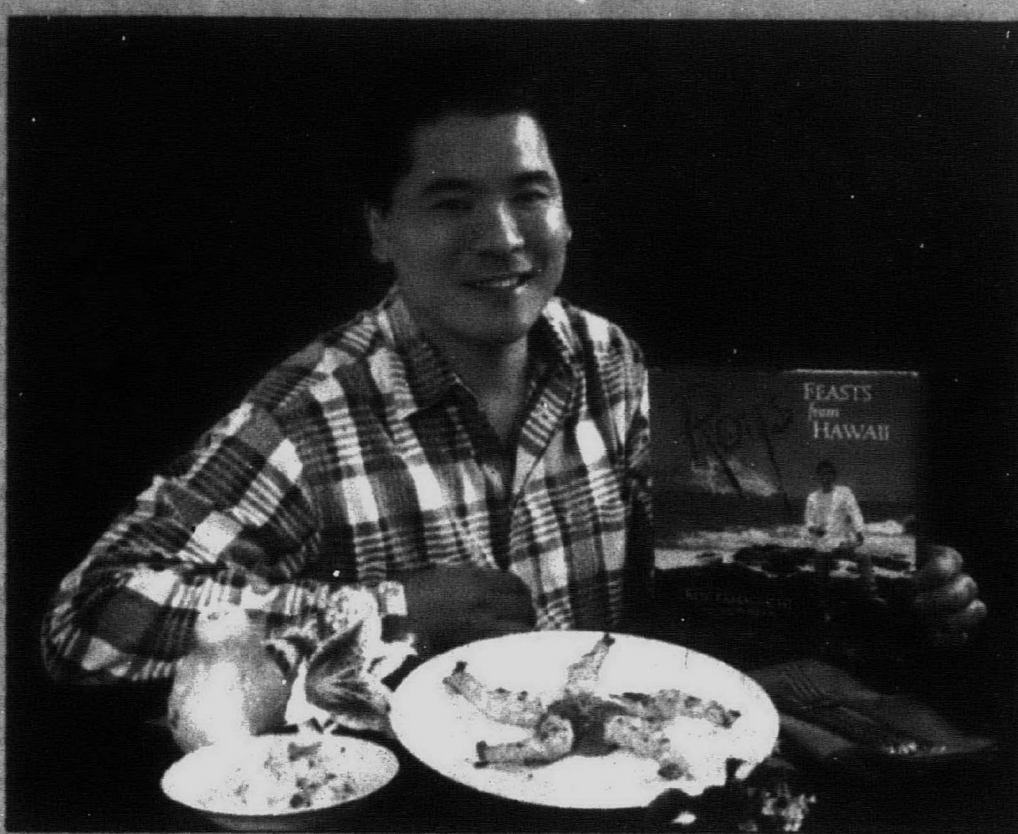

FEASTS FROM

HAWAII

Warm, sunny Hawaii sounds good right now - but how many of us can afford the time or expense?

Chef and restaurateur Roy Yamaguchi brings "Feasts from Hawaii" home with his newly published cookbook - "Roy's Feasts from Hawaii" (Ten Speed Press, 1995, \$27.95). The book is co-authored with John Harrison.

Yamaguchi who is known for combining his classic French training with Asian spices and ingredients, recently visited the Observer offices in Livonia on a cold winter day to talk about Hawaii, and his new book, which is both a cookbook and travelogue of recipes, photographs, and stories of local growers, fish farms, and families.

"Cooking should come from your heart," he said. "To me, my parents cooking was the best because they made it out of love. I remember my mother watching me eat, and smile because I ate the food she made. Recipes in books are ideas people have. This is my inspiration."

Yamaguchi owns eight award-winning restaurants - Roy's in Honolulu; Roy's Kahana Bar and Grill and Roy's Nicolina on Maui; Roy's Poipu Bar and Grill on Kauai, Roy's Pebble Beach in the Inn at the Spanish Bay in California; Roy's in Tokyo, and Roy's on Guam in the Hilton Hotel, and is opening another one in Bangkok. Yet, "I start each day as if I have to prove myself all over again," he said.

Five minutes from his home in Honolulu's Hawaii Kai district - where he settled with his wife Janne and two children, Yamaguchi, 37, can be found laboring seven nights a week in the open kitchen of his first Roy's Restaurant.

"Cooking is my life," he said. "When I'm in the kitchen and I look out the window, I can't help but think that I must be one of the luckiest people in the world. It's very rewarding. In the restaurant you create a dish, serve it, and get immediate reaction, and see the outcome of what you made."

In "Feasts from Hawaii" Yamaguchi showcases some of the best Hawaii has to offer. He started the project in 1991, and finished in 1995. "My vision of food comes with what I can find in Hawaii," he said. "But this is 1996, and you basically get any ingredient you want. It's a question of how much you're into it. I encourage people to experiment with my recipes. They're not set in stone."

For example, you can substitute orange juice concentrate for passion fruit syrup.

"Roy's Feasts from Hawaii" offers more than 150 new and old favorites from Roy's restaurants. The 10 chapters include appetizers, soups, salads, pastas and Imu Pizzas, fish and shellfish, meat and poultry, side dishes and salsas, brunch, desserts and basic recipes.

Beautiful color photographs illustrate each recipe. Readers will learn that Hawaii has the highest per capita watermelon consumption of any state in the country, and meet Larry Jefts who grows watermelons at his 1,600 acre farm on Molokai. They'll also visit the Honolulu fish auction (one of four in the U.S.) and learn about the island's other agricultural products including Kona coffee, Maui onions, and Macadamia nuts.

Yamaguchi, whose name has become synonymous with Hawaiian cuisine, first studied cooking in a high school home economics class "because I liked the odds of being the only boy in class," he said. "Even as a boy I loved to cook,

whether it was fried Portuguese sausage and eggs, or a Thanksgiving dinner - which I once prepared for my family growing up in the middle of Tokyo, Japan."

After completing high school, Yamaguchi enrolled in the Culinary Institute of America. After graduating in 1976 he worked in some of the finest kitchens in the Los Angeles area including L'Escoffier, L'Ermitage, and Michaels.

In 1984 he formed a partnership to create his own restaurant, 385 North in West Hollywood where his "Euro-Asian" style came into bloom.

In 1988 he moved to the original home of his father and grandparents - the Hawaiian Islands and opened the first "Roy's" in 1988. "My grandfather owned a restaurant and my father worked there," he said. "My dad was an excellent cook and prepared most of our family meals. We rarely ate out."

Cooking is a passion Yamaguchi enjoys sharing with others. He just began filming the third year of of Hawaii Public Television series, "Hawaii Cooks with Roy Yamaguchi." The first season, which debuted in Hawaii in the fall of 1993, is still being shown on more than 141 stations in 41 other states.

"I like to do it because it showcases Hawaii," he said.

As for the future, Yamaguchi is still experimenting, and innovating. "As I open restaurants throughout Asia I learn new things he said. I believe my cookbook is one of the best cookbooks about Hawaii. The recipes are innovative, and a lot of the dishes are favorites of our customers. You can really see Hawaii as you look at the book and read the stories."

BANANA-MACADAMIA NUT BREAD

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 pound overripe bananas, peeled and mashed (about 1 1/2 cups)
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 3/4 cups flour
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup chopped macadamia nuts, (reserve 2 tablespoons for the topping)
- 1/4 cup raisins (optional)
- 1/4 cup shredded coconut (optional)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease and flour a 9-inch round cake pan or a loaf pan.

In the bowl of an electric mixer, cream together the butter and sugars until smooth. Add the bananas and beat for 1 minute. Sift the bak-

ing powder and baking soda into the flour, and stir into the banana-butter mixture. Add the eggs and the water, and beat for 1 minute. Stir in the nuts, and the raisins and coconut, if desired.

Pour the batter into the prepared pan and sprinkle with the reserved nuts. Bake on the middle rack of the oven for 35-45 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean. Remove from the oven and let cool on a wire rack. Yield 1 loaf.

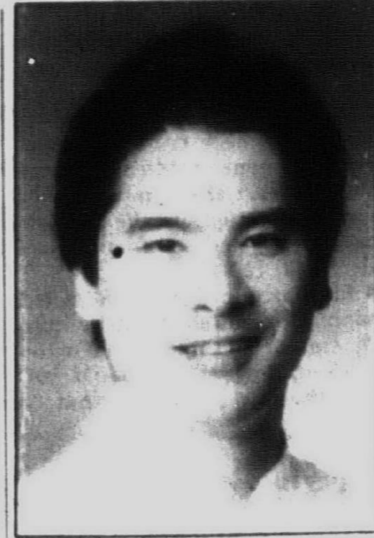
KAHUKA SHRIMP ON A STICK WITH WASABI COCKTAIL SAUCE AND PAPAYA-MINT RELISH

- 1 cup Papaya-Mint Relish (recipe follows)
- 1 pound extra-large shrimp (about 16 to 20), peeled and deveined
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- 1/4 cup peanut oil
- Wasabi Cocktail Sauce:
- 2 tablespoons powdered wasabi
- 2 tablespoons water
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 2 tablespoons prepared horseradish

Prepare the Papaya-Mint Relish and set aside.

Prepare the grill and soak 16 to 20 short bamboo or wooden skewers in water. Skewer the shrimp, tail end first, and slide the shrimp down the skewers, with the head end pointed toward the pointed end of the skewer. Season with salt and pepper, coat with the peanut oil, and keep refrigerated.

To prepare the sauce, combine the wasabi powder with the water to form a paste. Cover and let stand for 15 minutes. Combine the ketchup and horseradish in a separate dish and add the wasabi paste, and mix well.

Sear the shrimp on the grill for about 1 minute per side, or until cooked through. Place 2 tablespoons of cocktail sauce in each serving bowl and arrange 4 or 5 skewers in each bowl. Serve with the Papaya-Mint Relish on the side. Serves 4.

PAPAYA-MINT RELISH

- 1 large ripe papaya, peeled and seeded, and diced
 - 1 tablespoon julienned fresh mint leaves
 - 1 tablespoon julienned fresh cilantro
 - 1 tablespoon seeded and minced jalapeno
 - 1 to 2 teaspoons seeded and diced red bell pepper
 - 1 teaspoon finely minced Maui (or sweet) onion
 - Juice of 1 lime
 - Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- Thoroughly combine all ingredients in a mixing bowl. Refrigerate for 1 hour. Makes about 1 cup.

SEARED AHI WITH PASSION-FRUIT SHRIMP SALSA

Passion-Fruit Shrimp Salsa (recipe follows)

4 ahi tuna steaks, about 7 ounces each

3 tablespoons peanut oil

Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Prepare the salsa and set aside. Coat the ahi steaks with the peanut oil and season with salt and pepper. Heat a dry cast-iron skillet and sear the ahi over high heat for about 15 to 20 seconds each side for rare (about 1 minute each side for medium-rare). Place the steaks on serving plates and spoon the salsa over the tuna, letting the juices from the salsa run onto the plates. Serves 4.

PASSION FRUIT-SHRIMP SALSA

- 1 ripe passion fruit
- 4 or 5 extra-large shrimp (about 4 ounces), peeled, deveined, and diced
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1/4 cup finely minced Maui onion (can substitute OSO Sweet or other sweet onion)
- 1/2 cup peeled, seeded, and finely diced tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons finely sliced scallions
- 1 tablespoon finely minced fresh cilantro
- 1 teaspoon Tabasco sauce
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Scoop out the pulp from the passion fruit and press through a fine sieve. Reserve the juice (about 1 tablespoon).

Coat the shrimp in the olive oil and sear in a skillet over high heat until cooked through. Transfer to a stainless steel mixing bowl, add the passion fruit juice and the remaining ingredients, and toss well to combine. Makes about 1 cup.

Make it a muffin morning

Muffins are the perfect breakfast bread for busy mornings because you can bake a batch on the weekend and tuck them into the freezer. Thirty seconds in the microwave oven, and you're out the door with a warm homemade muffin in hand.

Here's a recipe from Quaker Oats.

BANANA-ORANGE OATMEAL MUFFINS

- 1 1/2 cups oatmeal quick or old-fashioned, uncooked
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar

- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1/2 cup chopped dates or raisins
- 1 carton (8 ounces) plain non-fat yogurt
- 1/4 cup mashed ripe banana (about two medium)
- 2 egg whites or 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 1/2 teaspoons grated orange peel

Heat oven to 400 degrees F. Line 12 medium muffin cups with paper

baking cups or spray bottoms only with non-stick cooking spray. Combine dry ingredients including dates, mix well.

Add combined yogurt, banana, egg whites, oil and orange peel; mix until dry ingredients are moistened. Fill muffin cups almost full. Sprinkle with additional oats, if desired.

Bake 20-22 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 12.

To freeze: Wrap muffins separately in foil or place in freezer bag, label and freeze.

To reheat: Place one muffin on microwave-safe plate. Microwave at High about 30 seconds.

Try these tips for better braising

Here are some tips for better braising from the Michigan Beef Industry Commission.

- Browning the beef first gives the roast its rich color and flavor, but resist the temptation to turn up the heat and brown it quickly. The key is to brown the meat slowly and evenly.
- Use just a small amount of liquid, usually no more than 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 cups.
- Be sure to cover the pan tightly

and keep it covered, so the steam can gently cook the meat until tender. Braising does take time, but very little attention. There's no need to stir or even lift the cover while the beef cooks.

- Remember to simmer, do not let the liquid boil or the meat will toughen. When properly simmering, bubbles will form slowly and break apart just below the surface. To simmer, cook over low heat on top of the range or in the

oven at 300 to 325 degrees F.

■ The meat is done when it's fork tender. Insert a fork toward the end of the cooking time; if it goes in easily, the roast is ready to serve.

■ Flavor it your way! The cooking liquid can be your choice of water, broth, fruit or vegetable juice, wine, prepared sauce or a combination of these.

Chef Larry Janes answers more reader requests

Beth from Canton called after reading a recipe in Taste for a low-fat chocolate cake calling for Dutch processed cocoa.

She wanted to know what it is, and where she could get some. Dutch processed cocoa is alkalinized to make the cocoa less bitter and much darker in color. It's available at Kitchen Glamour stores and at cake decorating

shops. It also might be available at some of the better upscale grocery stores.

Speaking of great cake decorating shops, check out the Baker's Acre in Wayne on Michigan Avenue (just east of Wayne Road) for a great selection of cake decorating supplies and real friendly service. (313) 722-4110.

Ida Baxter of Southfield called hoping I might shed a little light on making some homemade chicken stock. Well Ida, if you have the time, it's well worth it.

CHICKEN STOCK

- 1 old stewing hen, about 4-5 pounds
- 2 gallons fresh cold water
- ½ bunch celery, with leaves, chopped
- ½ pound carrots, unpeeled, chopped
- 3 large onions, quartered, with skin left on
- 2 cloves garlic
- 7-9 whole peppercorns
- 2 bay leaves

A handful of fresh parsley

Combine all ingredients in the largest pot you can find. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to lowest setting and simmer, uncovered, for 6 hours, skimming foam off the top if necessary.

To make a heartier stock, cook for 10 hours. Strain through a colander. Place strained stock in a refrigerator or cover and chill outside on a cold day until the fat rises to the top. Skim off fat and remove. Heat broth until barely warm.

Strain through a fine sieve or through 3-4 layers of cheesecloth to remove any bits of sediment. Keep refrigerated until ready to use. Makes about 4 quarts.

Diane Sands of Farmington called requesting a recipe she and a friend enjoyed for Friendship Tea. Well Diane, here's a recipe from days gone by when I had my own cooking shop in downtown Plymouth. We ran a class with one of the area's best home economists, Loreta Mirro, now of Birmingham, who originally gave me this recipe.

FRIENDSHIP TEA

- 1 cup Tang
- ¼ cup instant tea (plain)
- 1 (3 ounce) package instant dry lemonade mix
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon cloves

Combine all ingredients together and store in an airtight container. To make one cup, place one tablespoon of the mix in a cup of boiling water and stir until dissolved. Great hot or iced.

Winter fillings make shortcake a year-round favorite

Most folks think about enjoying shortcake only in the summer. What a shame to relegate such a treat to one short season. By taking advantage of winter fruits like pears, apples, cranberries and dried apricots, shortcake can be a winter highlight.

"Many people call any kind of cake topped with fruit and whipped cream shortcake," said Linda Carman, Martha White baking expert. "However, in the South, traditional shortcake is simply a dressed-up biscuit. It's buttery, sweet and enriched with an egg. And shortcake, which is really just fruit and biscuits, can be served anytime, not just for dessert. They make a festive statement for breakfast, brunch, late lunch or light supper."

Here are some recipes to try.

RICH BISCUIT SHORTCAKES

- 2 cups sifted Martha White Self-Rising Flour
 - 3 tablespoons sugar
 - ½ cup butter or margarine
 - 1 egg
 - About ½ cup milk
- Preheat oven to 450 degrees F.

Combine flour and sugar. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Beat egg in measuring cup; add enough milk to make ½ cup. Add to flour mixture and stir with a fork. Turn out onto a lightly floured board or pastry cloth; knead just until smooth. Roll dough out about ¼-inch thick and cut with floured cutter or with a knife in desired shapes. Place on lightly greased baking sheet. Bake 9 to 12 minutes. Makes 8 to 10 shortcakes.

Note: If using Martha White All Purpose Flour, sift 1 tablespoon baking powder and ¼ teaspoon salt with flour. For drop biscuit shortcakes, add 1 tablespoon additional milk to form a soft dough. Drop by spoonfuls onto baking sheet.

Tip: Sprinkle shortcakes with 2 tablespoons sliced almonds before baking, if desired.

APRICOT CREAM CHEESE SHORTCAKE

- 1 package (6 ounces) dried apricots, snipped into bite-size pieces

- 2 cups water
 - ½ cup sugar
 - 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
 - ½ teaspoon vanilla
- Rich Biscuit Shortcakes (prepared with Tip for almonds and Note for drop biscuits)
Cream Cheese Filling (follows)

Combine apricots and water in medium saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and cook until apricots are tender, about 15 minutes. Stir in sugar and butter. Simmer until thickened, about 30 to 40 minutes. Cool to room temperature. Stir in vanilla. Split shortcakes; fill and top with fruit and cream cheese filling. Makes 8 servings.

Cream Cheese Filling: In small

ng bowl, combine 6 ounces cream cheese (softened), 6 tablespoons heavy cream, 2 tablespoons sugar and ¼ teaspoon vanilla with a fork until smooth and creamy.

PEAR CRANBERRY SHORTCAKE

- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine

- 4 medium pears, peeled, cored and sliced
 - 1 cup fresh or frozen cranberries
 - ½ cup sugar
 - ¼ cup orange juice
- Rich Biscuit Shortcakes
Heavy cream

Melt butter in large skillet. Stir in pears, cranberries, sugar and orange juice. Simmer, stirring occasionally, until pears are tender and juice is thickened, about 20 to 25 minutes. Split shortcakes; fill and top with fruit mixture. Drizzle each serving with cream. Makes 8 servings.

APPLE SAUSAGE SHORTCAKE

- 1 package (10 to 12 ounces) breakfast sausage links, cut into 1-inch pieces
 - 3 large Golden Delicious apples, peeled, cored and coarsely chopped
 - ½ cup maple or maple-flavored syrup
- Rich Biscuit Shortcakes

- Warm maple or maple-flavored syrup, if desired

Cook sausage in large skillet until browned; drain. Stir in apples and cook until tender, about 5 minutes; keep warm. Just before serving stir

in ½ cup maple syrup. Split shortcakes; fill and top with apple sausage mixture. Serve with additional warm maple syrup. Makes 8 servings.

Dynamic 'City Hall' is well-acted, significant

It's a not uncommon happening on a city street: A shootout leaves three people dead. But this one has wide repercussions. The victims are a New York City cop, a minor member of a Mafia family and a 6-year-old boy on the way to school with his father.

Thus begins "City Hall," a dynamic political drama with superior acting and wide significance. The competing forces of city government have rarely been portrayed with such immediacy and incisiveness.

Al Pacino plays John Pappas, pictured as "the best mayor New York has ever had." Well, maybe not as good as his hero, Fiorello La Guardia, the man who read the funnypapers to children on the radio during a newspaper strike.

Mayor Pappas runs a tight ship, managing to placate the conflicting factions of the metropolis. His strong right arm is his young deputy mayor, Kevin Calhoun (John Cusack), a pragmatic political battler from Louisiana, where politics is a way of life.

Calhoun begins to perceive the ramifications of the street shoot-

out. He investigates further and finds the Mafia minion had been given probation on a serious charge. Someone had switched probation reports. It had to be someone high up in city government.

He first combats, then joins forces with a feisty lawyer (Bridget Fonda), who represents the family of the slain cop. Others appear involved in the web of intrigue: Danny Aiello as a Brooklyn Democratic Party boss; Martin Landau, a respected judge who signed the probation report; Anthony Franciosa, a shrewd Mafia chieftain who knows how to massage the body politic; and David Paymer, the mayor's dutiful chief of staff.

Cusack occupies the major role, peering into the inner workings of city government and growing more apprehensive with each new revelation. "City Hall" is a major step forward for this attractive actor, whose bland face belies an inner fire.

Although he has less screen time, Pacino empowers his every

scene. His oration at the funeral of the murdered boy ranks as one of the great movie speeches of all time.

The strong cast bolsters each scene, especially Aiello and Franciosa, who plays the mob boss like the CEO of a major corporation. He should enjoy a rich career as a character actor.

Director Harold Becker captures the political rhythms of the big city and keeps the rather complicated plot comprehensible. But audiences need to pay attention; this is not a by-the-numbers urban thriller.

Significantly, the original script was written by Ken Lipper, former deputy mayor for Ed Koch. He obviously instilled a feeling of reality to the screenplay, which is also credited to Paul Schrader, Nicholas Pileggi and Bo Goldman. Unlike many multiple writing collaborations, this one turned out well.

The Columbia Pictures release of a Castle Rock Entertainment film was produced by Becker, Lipper, Edward R. Pressman and Charles Mulvihill. Running time: 111 minutes.

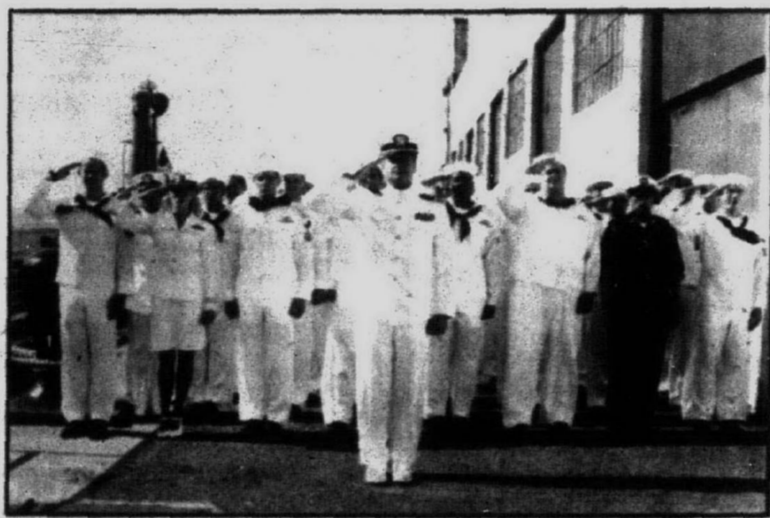

Here are some tips on how to cool foods safely

"Winter winds and whirling snowflakes may inspire you to cook up a large pot of homemade soup," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension Service, Oakland County.

"But, improper cooling can be a potential source of food poisoning."

An old wives tale has made many people believe that it is not a good idea to put hot food in the refrigerator until it is thoroughly cooled, for fear of it turning "sour."

This myth is confusing and dangerous! Leaving food out long-

er than two hours is a real no!!

Here are some easy and quick ways to cool foods safely:

- Take large pot off burner when food is cooked. Stir entire contents with a large utensil frequently during first 10 minutes of cooling.

- Set large pot of cooked food in a sink or large pan of ice water to hasten cooling.
- Divide contents of pot into several smaller utensils no deeper than about two inches.
- Refrigerate the smaller utensils quickly allowing plenty of space

in the refrigerator for air circulation. If food is to be frozen divide into freezer containers and allow ample space in freezer. Food should be refrigerated promptly.

- Do not leave cooked food out until it cools completely by itself. It may take many hours for a large pot of soup to cool, and by

this time it may have grown bacteria which will cause food poisoning.

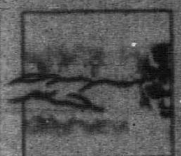

Salem's depth drowns foes



What Plymouth Salem coach Chuck Olson did with his team preparing it for the Western Lakes Activities Association finals was a calculated risk — but with the depth of talent the Rocks have displayed all season, he figured the risk to be a small one. He was right.

A year ago, Plymouth Salem won just three of the 12 events at the Western Lakes Activities Association championship swim meet and still captured their third-straight title.

This season, the Rocks outdid themselves — and the entire WLAA — once again. Despite winning just one event at the championship meet, they collected another title.

That's four in a row, if you're counting, and 10 in the WLAA's 14 years.

"You have to have a plan," Salem coach Chuck Olson said. "Our plan was to shave for state meet. I'm excited we could do what we did here without shaving. We got one relay qualified (for state) — I can live with that.

"We just had a little too much balance for everybody."

Guess they must have. The Rocks scored 441 points, beating runner-up Livonia Stevenson by 60. The Spartans were perhaps the biggest surprise of the meet, beating third-place North Farmington by a single point, despite having just seven swimmers qualify for Saturday's finals (stats on 4C).

"It's incredible," said Stevenson coach Doug Buckler. "For a team of 13 kids, with seven in the finals, to pull out second place... what a great group of kids."

Salem's only win came in what, on a state-qualifying scale, was the slowest event of the meet: the 100-yard butterfly. Mark Dettling won it for the Rocks (55.84), and teammate Tim Buchanan finished second (55.91) — state qualifying is 55.59.

Every other event had at least one finisher beat the qualifying standard.

Salem's 200 medley relay did make the state cut, finishing fourth in 1:42.40. Stevenson's team of Brian Butrico, Ted Burmeister, Mark Sgriccia and Chad Crosby won the event in 1:40.60.

There were two individual event double-winners in the meet: Livonia Churchill's Mark Campbell, in the 100-yard (48.68) and 200-yard (1:47.07) freestyle, both bettering the state cut; and Northville's Jeff Sieving, who set new league records in the 50-yard free (21.70) and the 100 breaststroke (59.83), again, both better than the state cut.

"I was real happy," said Campbell afterward. "I usually do my best at league meet — I'm a big meet swimmer."

There was another incentive. "I hadn't qualified for state in either," Campbell said.

Every team had similar incentives, but none hit as many as the Spartans. They qualified two relays (the 200 and 400 free), Keith Falk in the 200 individual medley, Brian Butrico in the 100 backstroke and

Ted Burmeister in the 100 breaststroke Saturday.

Falk was a winner in the 500 free (4:55.72), an event he had previously qualified for state in. Other individual event winners were Northville's Eyan Whitbeck in the 200 IM (2:00.79), Walled Lake's Casey Guntzvilier in diving (479.40 points) and North Farmington's Dan Gabriel in the 100 backstroke (55.52).

North's Gabriel, Brian Rajdl, Jason Speer and Pat Duthie won the 400 free relay (3:20.27, making state cut), and Northville's Chris Anderson, Craig Sieving, Jeff Sieving and Whitbeck won the 200 free relay (1:30.17).

In the swimmers-to-watch category, Canton's Alex Rottgers was a leader. The freshman qualified for state in both his individual events, the 200 IM (2:02.01), in which he finished third, and the 100 breast (1:01.98), in which he placed fifth.

The 100 breast was the fastest race of the meet. Sieving's league-record swim won easily, but the time difference between the four swimmers from second to fifth was just .12 of a second.

Rocks ambushed in WLAA semifinals

There wasn't enough Pepto-Bismol to pass around Saturday at the Western Lakes Activities Association volleyball tournament.

It was an "Upset Special" as underdog Livonia Stevenson earned its first title since 1993 with a 15-13, 15-8 victory over rival Livonia Churchill in the finals at Walled Lake Central.

Both teams pulled off shocking victories in the semifinals.

Senior outside hitter Kristi DiBascio was all over the floor throughout the day for the Spartans. She had eight kills in the final against Churchill.

Churchill, meanwhile, was hitting on all cylinders against Plymouth Canton and Salem in the

elimination rounds.

The Chargers were impressive in the opening game against Salem, winning 15-7. But the Rocks (41-7-2 overall) got going in the second behind the fierce hitting of 6-foot senior Shellye Sills. Salem won that one, 15-11.

Salem's momentum carried over into the third as the Rocks jumped to a 7-1 lead, but Churchill roared back for a 15-12 victory.

"We gave up too many quick points off their serves," Salem coach Brian Gilles said. "And we haven't seen a team do that to us since early January."

"Churchill served well and we quit passing the ball. We missed some key serves early and late."

"But they (Churchill) played well. They moved their game up a level. I thought we'd pull it out, but it just didn't happen."

Churchill eliminated Canton in the previous round, 15-8, 15-7.

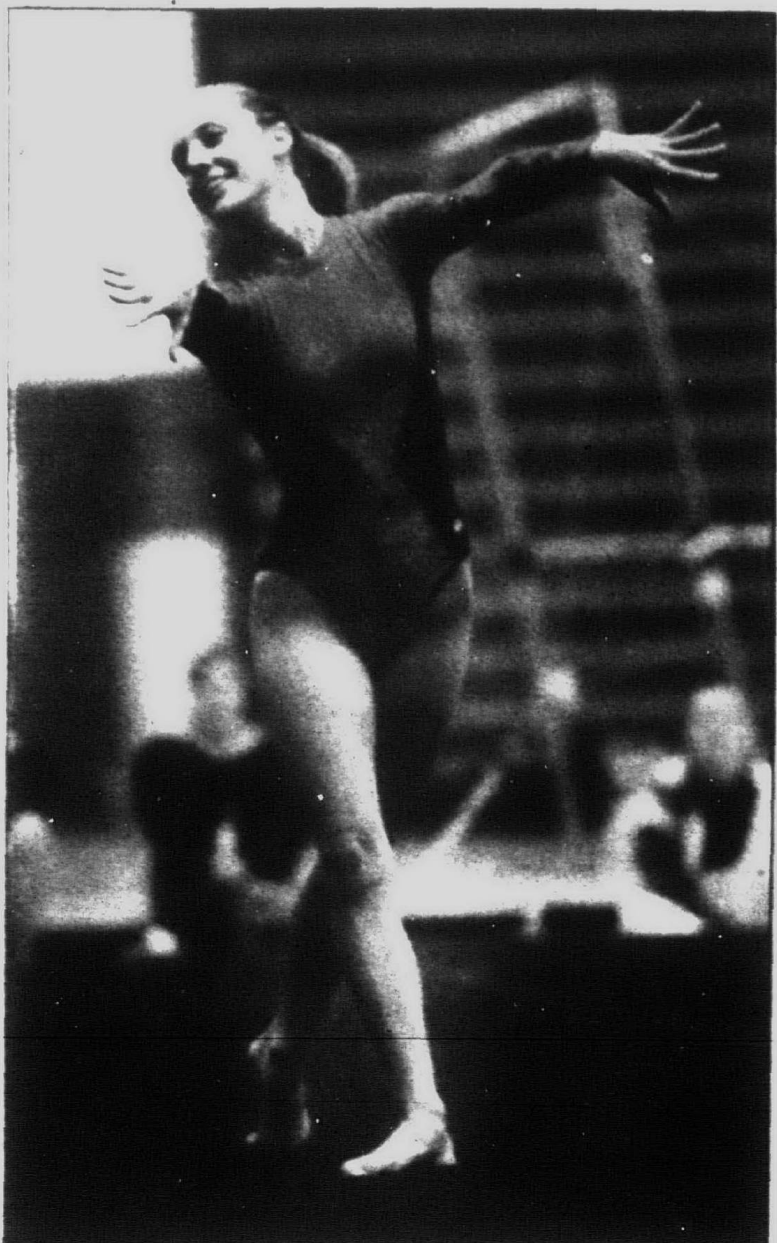
"If you give them errors, they'll capitalize on them," said Canton first-year coach Steve Anderson, whose team is 20-13-6 overall. "In the last three games in pool we just played awesome. Canton gains 2nd-straight WLAA title

One thing that makes Plymouth Canton the top candidate to end Holland's recent domination in Class A gymnastics is something each team searches for: a mid-season boost.

Seasons drag — which results in athletes losing their mental edge. What most coaches search for is that certain something to reignite their team, something to give them a lift.

What the Chiefs got at mid-season not only boosted their team, but had to depress their counterparts, particularly in the Western Lakes Activities Association. That's the effect a Katey Gilles — who won the individual all-around state championship two years ago as a freshman — can have.

Gilles showed why Thursday in the WLAA League Finals, which Canton hosted — and won, outscoring favored Northville-Novu 142.35 to 140.30. Hartland was third with 137.50, with Plymouth Salem edging Westland John Glenn for fourth, scoring 134.855 to the Rockets' 134.850.

Despite a mental mistake in

her best event, the vault, Gilles easily won the all-around, piling up 37.05 points. But what assured the victory was the second-place finisher in the all-around — Canton's Kim Nowak, with a career-best 35.6.

So the Chiefs not only got a mid-season jolt with Gilles' return, but also a bonus end-of-the-season boost from Nowak. And that should cause some concern for two-time defending champion Holland.

"Sassass," was Nowak's sizzling description. "We're on fire!" Gilles was no less confident in sizing up the state final. "They don't know what's waiting," she said, referring to Holland. "We're awesome — and we're gonna win it!"

First however, comes the regional, which Canton hosts Saturday at noon. The top three teams advance to the state finals, which will be Friday, March 8 at Troy HS. The state individual championships will be the next day (March 9) at Troy, with Division II in the morning and Division I

in the afternoon.

Winning their second-straight league title pleased Canton coach John Cunningham, to be sure, but no more than the reasons why.

"We lost 1.75 points" on mistakes, he said, referring to Gilles' mental miscue on vault that cost her half-a-point, dropping her to ninth in the event, and a fall by Brie Wall. "But with these kids, they can leave it behind. They can just say, 'OK, I messed up. I'll do better.'"

The event that won it for Canton, Cunningham felt, was the floor exercise. "We went out and kicked butt on the floor," he said.

Indeed, with Gilles finishing second (9.4), Wall fourth (9.3) and Nowak fifth (9.25), the Chiefs were impressive in floor. But then again, they had four finish in the top seven in the uneven parallel bars and three in the top seven in the balance beam.

Gilles won both, scoring 9.45 in the bars and 9.55 in the beam. Nowak was third in beam (9.05) and sixth in bars (8.75), with Wall placing seventh in both (8.7 in beam, 8.65 in bars).

Canton's depth played a large

role, too. The Chiefs outscored all their WLAA rivals in the bars, beam and floor, and finished second to Northville-Novu in the vault.

Salem got a strong performance from Kristin Kosik, who won the vault (9.1) and was third in floor (9.35). Kosik was seventh in the all-around (35.05).

The winner in floor was Hartland's Holly Davis (9.45), whose all-around total of 35.55 placed her third.

Thursday's result made Gilles' decision to return to the team a gratifying one. She had decided after last season that it might be best for her to compete at the club level this year, instead of high school.

But: "I just wasn't enjoying club. The first two years of being on the (Canton) team — I missed that. At club, it's more individual."

Her return, plus the improving skills of Nowak, Wall and several other Chiefs, have supplied Canton with the tools necessary to realize its singular goal. And it shouldn't be difficult to guess what that is.

A different look

Pitching, defense hold the key to Crusaders' hopes

People wandering past Madonna Park while a game's going on this spring may wonder who's using the field, and if Mike George — the Madonna University baseball coach — knows about it. The reason for their puzzlement will be the kind of game being played. No balls flying over the fence every inning or so, no double-digit numbers on the scoreboard... who are these guys?

The answer is, first of all, George will know about the game because one of the teams on the field will be his. What all this means is the game will be different for the Fighting Crusaders this season. The winners of the Great Lakes Independent Section last season won't be thumping the ball like they have in the past because, well, most of the big ball-thumpers are gone.

Last year's team had a few question marks in pitching; in this year's squad, pitching is the strength. "We're going to have a lot of 2-0, 3-1 games because our offense won't be as strong," said returning righthander Craig Benedict, a junior from Canton (Plymouth Canton HS).

So can last year's question marks become this season's strengths? Dan Pydyn, another returning right-handed junior, thinks so: "It's just a matter of going out and getting it done," he said. "That's all."

Pydyn and Benedict each went 8-2 in '95, tying the now-graduated Sean Henkel for most pitching wins. Pydyn had 46 strikeouts in 63 innings pitched, with a 3.57 earned run average. Benedict walked just 14 in a team-high 80 innings pitched, with a 3.71 ERA.

Bolstering the staff considerably is right-handed junior Joel Hillebrand, a 6-foot-5 transfer from Henry Ford CC. Twice drafted by the Detroit Tigers, Hillebrand was 9-0 for the Hawks last year.

Then there's the depth, which includes — for the first time ever at Madonna — three left-handers: sophomore Mark Serra, who's battling for a starting role, and freshmen Mitch Jabczynski (from

Novi HS) and Eric Crawford (Davison).

Others who will spend considerable time on the mound are junior Eric Butler and sophomore Jason Dubey, both right-handers. Butler was 1-1 last year with a 3.46 ERA and a team best three saves; Dubey was 5-2 with a 3.53 ERA.

What should help make the pitching more effective is the defense behind it. Dan Taylor, a junior, returns for his third year of starting at shortstop. Taylor committed 12 errors last season and hit .333, with three homers and 26 RBI.

Also back is junior third baseman Kurt Wilczynski, who hit .338 with 35 RBI and a team-high 18 doubles. However, Wilczynski committed 21 errors — a number that will have to decrease if Madonna is to be competitive.

While the left side of the infield returns intact, the right side, along with the Crusaders' top two catchers and two talented starting outfielders, must be replaced.

Sophomore Jeff Gutt (Redford Catholic Central), who batted just 29 times last season (hitting .207), is currently the top choice at first base. Eric Marcotte, a sophomore transfer who played at Plymouth Canton HS, and sophomore Brandon Jaskolski are the front runners at second.

in '95 (.382, 30 RBI), will probably serve as the designated hitter this season.

Behind the plate, George has just two choices, both lacking experience: freshmen Delano Voletti (Redford/Dearborn Divine Child) and Daryl Rocho, with Voletti the current favorite.

Returnee Shawn Penczak, a junior who hit .336 and had 19 RBI, is scheduled for left field. Sophomore Kevin Foley, who saw limited action last season (31 at-bats) but was second on the team in stolen bases (12-of-14), is slated to start in center, with sophomore Pete Quinn (Redford Thurston), a part-time starter last season (.264, three HRs, 19 RBI), in right.

One other thing Madonna won't have: seniors. There are nine juniors, and they'll have to provide the leadership.

For the Crusaders, that life begins again Friday, when they play a double-header against NCAA II Eckard College (from St. Petersburg, Fla.) in Tampa. They follow that with single games against Malone College and Moravian College Sunday in Tampa.

Hoener's late basket lifts CC into Catholic finals

Justin Hoener and Michael Jordan stood side-by-side in the Detroit Catholic Central locker room Wednesday night, reliving their 59-58 Catholic League semifinal playoff victory over Redford Bishop Borgess at Schoolcraft College.

"I just told Justin he saved me," Jordan said.

Actually, Hoener was just seeking some redemption for himself.

True, Hoener rebounded Jordan's miss from about 10 feet and scored the winning basket with 2.54 seconds left. But Hoener was

especially glad he could make up for some of his earlier traveling violations.

"I must have had like four travels," Hoener said. "(Assistant) coach (John) Mulroy always says, 'Keep going to the glass.' It's something we work on, being down one, two, three. Thank God it ended up in my hands."

Hoener's basket came after Aaron Jessup had given Borgess 45-57 lead with a three-point play

with 17.82 seconds left.

The Shamrocks didn't have a timeout remaining and pushed the ball to Jordan, whose shot over a Borgess player hit the rim and was grabbed by Hoener.

The Spartans contested his put-back, but coach Roosevelt Barnes wishes one of his players was there seconds earlier in rebounding position.

The Shamrocks had a 41-34 rebounding advantage, including 13 from senior center Eric Gilbo, who wasn't on the court for the winning points.

Gilbo scored eight first-half points before getting in foul trou-

ble in the second half.

Senior point guard Jerome Ross, who played outstanding defense against CC's prolific shooter Marc McDonald, led the Spartans with 14 points and sophomore Samuel Hoskin had nine to go with 10 rebounds.

"We played good defense but we did not wrap up the ball," Barnes said. "It's a game of aggression and we were not aggressive at all. We stand flat footed on the last rebound. If we get the rebound, we win the ball game."

The Shamrocks made only 22 of 56 shot attempts (39 percent) and the Spartans were only 20-of-

66 (30 percent).

Senior guard Chris Misiak, scoreless in the first half, had 10 of his team-high 15 points in the fourth quarter.

He made three triples in the fourth quarter, including his last with 1:05 remaining for 56-52 CC lead.

Borgess wouldn't quit and answered with a triple by sophomore guard Kevin Jordan with :43 left to cut the deficit to 56-55.

Hoener, a reserve guard, scored all eight of his points in the second half. Jordan added 13 points and tied Richard Turk with eight rebounds. McDonald was held to

eight points on 3-of-13 shooting.

The Spartans (13-5) led 29-23 at halftime and enjoyed a 41-33 lead following a steal and layup by Jessup with 2:47 left in the third. Jordan and Hoener scored four points each during an 8-0 CC run, however, to tie the score.

Misiak gave the Shamrocks their first lead, 46-45, since the first half with a three-point shot early in the fourth. He finished four of 13 from the floor.

"Mark was a little off, I was a little off in the first half, but we've got the green light to shoot," Misiak said.

**CITY OF PLYMOUTH
ORDINANCE NO. 96-02**

An Ordinance adopted pursuant to the Charter of the City of Plymouth, Michigan, for the purpose of amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Plymouth, Michigan, by adding an Article IX to Chapter 54 to be numbered sections 54-401 through 54-450 to provide for municipal civil infractions, a municipal ordinance violations bureau and municipal civil infraction fines and sanctions for violations.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDINANCES

Section 1. Amending Sections 54-401 through 54-450 of Chapter 54.

Sections 54-401 through 54-450 of Chapter 54 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Plymouth are hereby added as a new Article IX of Chapter 54 entitled "Municipal Civil Infractions and Violations Bureau," which sections shall read, as follows:

Section 54-401. Definitions and Rules of Construction. The following definitions and rules of construction shall apply to Sections 54-402 through 54-450 of the City Code:

"Act" means Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, as amended.

"Authorized city official" means a Police Officer, Ordinance Officer, Building Official or other personnel of the city authorized by this Code or designated by the City Manager or an employee of the Plymouth Community Fire Department designated by the City Manager to issue municipal civil infraction citations or municipal civil infraction violation notices.

"Bureau" means the City of Plymouth Municipal Ordinance Violations Bureau as established by this Article.

"Municipal civil infraction action" means a civil action in which the defendant is alleged to be responsible for a municipal civil infraction.

"Municipal civil infraction citation" means a written complaint or notice prepared by an authorized city official, directing a person to appear in court regarding the occurrence or existence of one or more municipal civil infractions by the person cited.

"Municipal civil infraction violation notice" means a written notice prepared by an authorized city official, directing a person to appear at the City of Plymouth Municipal Ordinance Violations Bureau regarding the occurrence or existence of one or more municipal civil infractions by that person and to pay the fine and costs, if any, prescribed for the violation by the schedule of civil fines adopted by the City, as authorized under Sections 8705 and 8707 (6) of the Act.

Section 54-402. Municipal civil infraction action, commencement.

A municipal civil infraction action may be commenced upon the issuance by an authorized city official of a citation directing the alleged violator to appear in court, or (2) a municipal civil infraction violation notice directing the alleged violator to appear at the City of Plymouth Municipal Ordinance Violations Bureau.

Section 54-403. Municipal civil infraction citations, issuance and service.

Municipal civil infraction citations shall be issued and served by authorized city officials as follows:

- The time for appearance specified in a citation shall be within a reasonable time after the citation is issued.
- The place for appearance specified in a citation shall be the 35th Judicial District Court.
- Each citation shall be numbered consecutively and shall be in a form approved by the state court administrator. The original citation shall be filed with the 35th Judicial District Court. Copies of the citation shall be retained by the city and issued to the alleged violator as provided by Section 8705 of the Act.
- A citation for a municipal civil infraction citation signed by an authorized city official shall be treated as made under each of the violation alleged in the citation occurred in the presence of the official signing the complaint and if the citation contains the following statement immediately above the date and signature of the official: "I declare under the penalties of perjury that the statements above are true to the best of my information, knowledge and belief."
- An authorized city official who witnesses a person commit a municipal civil infraction shall prepare and subscribe, as soon as possible and as completely as possible, an original and required copies of a citation.
- An authorized city official may issue a citation to a person if, based upon investigation, the official has reasonable cause to believe that the person is responsible for a municipal civil infraction.

Further, an authorized city official may issue a citation to a person if, upon investigation of a complaint by someone who allegedly witnessed the person violate an ordinance or violation of which is a municipal civil infraction, the official has reasonable cause to believe that the person is responsible for an infraction and if the City Attorney approves in writing the issuance of the citation.

- An authorized city official shall personally serve a copy of the citation upon the alleged violator; however, in a municipal civil infraction citation involving the use or occupancy of land, a building or other structure, a copy of the citation does not need to be personally served upon the alleged violator but may be served upon an owner or occupant of the land, building or structure by posting the copy on the land or attaching the copy to the building or structure. In addition, a copy of the citation shall be sent by first-class mail to the owner of the land, building or structure at the owner's last known address.

Section 54-404. Municipal civil infraction citations, contents.

- A municipal ordinance citation shall contain the name and address of the alleged violator, the municipal civil infraction alleged, the place where the alleged violator shall appear in court, the telephone number of the court, and the time at or by which the appearance shall be made.
- Further, the citation shall inform the alleged violator that he or she may do one of the following:
 - Admit responsibility for the municipal civil infraction by mail, in person, or by representation, at or by the time specified for appearance.
 - Admit responsibility for the municipal civil infraction "with explanation" by mail by the time specified for appearance or, in person, or by representation.
 - Deny responsibility for the municipal civil infraction by doing either of the following:
 - Appearing in person for an informal hearing before a judge or district court magistrate, without the opportunity of being represented by an attorney unless a formal hearing before a judge is requested by the City of Plymouth.
 - Appearing in court for a formal hearing before a judge, with the opportunity of being represented by an attorney.
- The citation shall inform the alleged violator of all of the following:
 - That if the alleged violator desires to admit responsibility "with explanation" in person or by representation, the alleged violator must appear in person, by mail, by telephone, or by representation within the time specified for appearance and obtain a schedule date and time for an appearance.
 - That if the alleged violator desires to deny responsibility the alleged violator must appear in person, by mail, by telephone, or by representation within the time specified for appearance and obtain a scheduled date and time to appear for a hearing, unless a hearing date is obtained by an attorney.
 - That a hearing shall be an informal hearing unless a formal hearing is requested by the alleged violator or the City of Plymouth.
 - That at an informal hearing the alleged violator must appear in person before a judge or district court magistrate, without the opportunity of being represented by an attorney.
 - That at a formal hearing the alleged violator must appear in person before a judge with the opportunity of being represented by an attorney.

Section 54-407. Schedule of civil fines established.

- A schedule of civil fines payable to the Bureau for admissions of responsibility by person served with municipal ordinance violation notices shall be established by resolution of the City Commission from time to time.
- A copy of the schedule of civil fines payable to the Bureau shall be prominently posted at the Bureau and readily available for public inspection.
- All collected civil fines shall go to the general fund of the City or to such other account of the City that the Commission of the City of Plymouth may from time to time designate by resolution.

Section 54-408. 54-450. Reserved.

Section 5. Enactment.

This ordinance shall become effective March 11th, 1996.

"Shorter date not less than 21 days from date of Commission action and not earlier than the publication of this ordinance in the City of Plymouth."

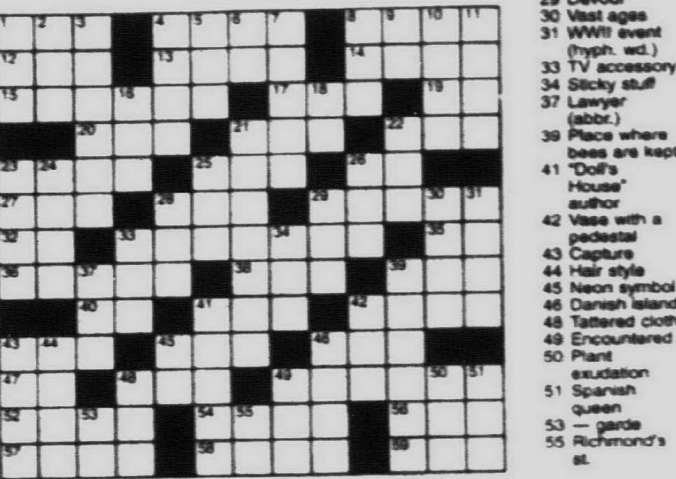

Lexus SC 400 delivers a good time

When it was first hinted that Lexus would soon unveil a sports coupe, skeptics theorized it would be exactly what every other luxury carmaker had accomplished — just sticking two fewer doors on a sedan and giving it a couple of upgraded, sleek lines.

But hold your breath. The sporty SC 400 doesn't have the feel or look of a two-door sedan, or drive like one. The 1996 model is better than the average two-door sedan could ever dream of being.

Lexus' SC 400 is revolutionary enough to rearrange the way auto makers design vehicles for the 1990s and beyond.

Sort of what Ford Motor Co. accomplished with the aerodynamic, wrap-around look of the 1986 Taurus and Sable.

When Lexus and Toyota officials introduced their SC 400 a few years ago, they gave us a car that in years to come could become the symbol of unconventional design and innovation.

The traditional method of designing a car is to put it all on paper first, sketch after sketch, drawing

after drawing, clay model after clay model and fiberglass rendering after fiberglass rendering — all the while enduring approval processes from designers, engineers, more designers and engineers and finally from the big guys at the top.

The SC 400's development team sidestepped more than 90 percent of the standard bureaucratic mumbo-jumbo and effectively and efficiently came up with a vehicle that's pure in design and flawless in execution.

The team succeeded in achieving a bold, distinct, unique design that was created by human touch — and,

accomplish this, started with clay models. Pencil never hit paper on this project.

And, instead of design teams arguing and compromising with engineering teams, both worked together to assure the design was functional and fun.

"This sort of cooperation just seems like common sense, but just take a look at some of the new cars on the road with humped fenders and hood bulges because the designers and engineers weren't talking to each other," said Dave Illingworth, a former Lexus general manager who moved up the corporate ladder at Toyota.

"As a result of this cooperation, we have one of the most dramatic designs ever to travel from the modeling studio to the production line — without losing an ounce of artistry, emotion or beauty."

Artistic, emotional and beautiful this SC 400 is, that's for sure. Chief Designer Dennis Campbell, who headed the project at Toyota's Calty Design Research team headquarters in California, said when a portion of the vehicle didn't fit the design, engineers simply found somewhere

else to put that part.

Quite an accomplishment. This is truly a four-wheel work of art. And the process that made it a reality and a machine to be driven on American soil may be remembered as a modern-day miracle.

A drive around city streets with this head-turning SC 400 can be an eye-opener. Front engine. Rear-wheel-drive. A 4.0-liter V8 EFI with 32 valves. Power has jumped to 260 horses. Zero-to-60 time is a mere 6.8 seconds. Redlines at 6,250 rpms. Eighteen city, 23 highway. U.S.-designed, built in Japan. And ABS is standard.

It's billed as a four-passenger, but realistically it's a two-passenger coupe. The SC 400 is marketed toward those who would like to move up from a mid-level Cadillac or low-end BMW, but can't afford an LS 400.

Everything under the sun is standard equipment in the SC 400, but don't faint from sticker shock. The high-thirty something price is something an on-the-move executive should try to afford.

Listen to Your Car When You Think Something's Wrong

(NU) - Little kids cry when they're not feeling well. Adults wheeze or groan. How does your car tell you when something's wrong? In lots of ways, according to the Automotive Service Association.

If you suspect your car's not at its best, listen carefully. Describing the sounds you hear will help your automotive technician begin to diagnose the problem.

ASA suggests listening for...

- Booms that sound like a bass drum.
- Grinding, like metal rubbing against metal.
- Buzzing that sounds like a bee.
- Hisses, like the sound of air escaping from a tire.
- Rattling that sounds just like a child's toy.
- Squeaks, like rubbing on a glass surface.

Of course, be sure to pay attention to your dashboard malfunction indicator lights, strange smells, and handling and performance difficulties.

Here are some more signs of car trouble:

- Black, blue, gray or white smoke coming from the rear of the car or from under the hood.
- The car hesitates or there's a delayed response when you push the accelerator pedal.
- The car stalls at stop signs or red lights.
- The vehicle tends to pull to one side when traveling.

- The car vibrates.
- A sweet and steamy smell could be coming from leaking antifreeze.
- A sulfur-like odor (rotten eggs) could indicate emissions problems.

Car Talk

When you talk with your technician, describe all the symptoms, no matter how large or small, and be sure to answer all of the technician's questions, no matter how irrelevant they may seem.

Be precise when describing your car's problem and use simple language. Technical jargon is best left to the technicians. Like a doctor, the technician will consider all the symptoms and begin to diagnose the problem.

Here's one more thing to keep in mind. Like people, cars benefit from regular checkups. Routine maintenance will save you time and money, and may prevent severe problems in the future.

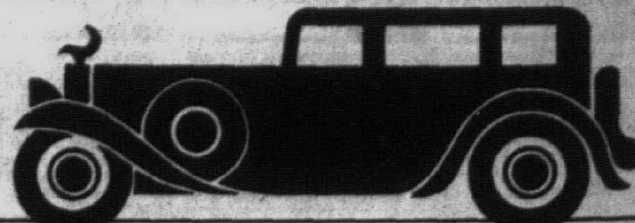


