## Arrests follow bank robbery

Police nabbed two men on Friday for the robbery of a Plymouth Township bank. Police chased the men through Livonia and into Detroit. It was the third bank robbery in Plymouth Township this year.

The third armed robbery of a Plymouth Township bank in recent months ended Friday with the capture of two suspects in Detroit. A third person was still at large Friday afternoon.

Plymouth Township police got the call at 10:28 a.m. Friday that the Comerica Bank at 41486 Wilcox Road was being robbed by two men wearing surgical masks, Police Chief Carl Berry said.

"One of the employees in the bank observed two subjects coming in the front door and saw that a robbery was going to occur," Berry said.

The bank employee got on the phone and called an acquaintance, then hung up quickly, Berry said. The acquaintance called the Canton Township Public Safety Department, which notified Plymouth Township police, Berry said.

"By the time we got there the robbers had left. When the robbers were in the parking lot a bank teller dialed 9-1-1 and gave a description of the getaway car," Berry said.

Livonia police spotted a vehicle matching the description of the car — a black 1994 Pontiac Grand Prix — headed east on I-96 at Wayne Road and pursued it. The chase continued into Detroit, with other police agencies joining the pursuit, Berry said.

## Edison optimistic about upgrades

Detroit Edison officials say Plymouth-area residents should have fewer problems with power outages this spring when storms blow through, compared to recent years.

That's because the company has spent \$2.5 million locally in the past year to upgrade lines, trim trees near power lines, build a new substation to relieve strain on others, and more.

"I believe they will see significant improvement in some of the areas that have had some problems," said Lawrence Eix, Edison director of West Suburban Distribution Planning.

That could be good news for some area residents, who maintain greater Plymouth suffers more from power outages than other communities.

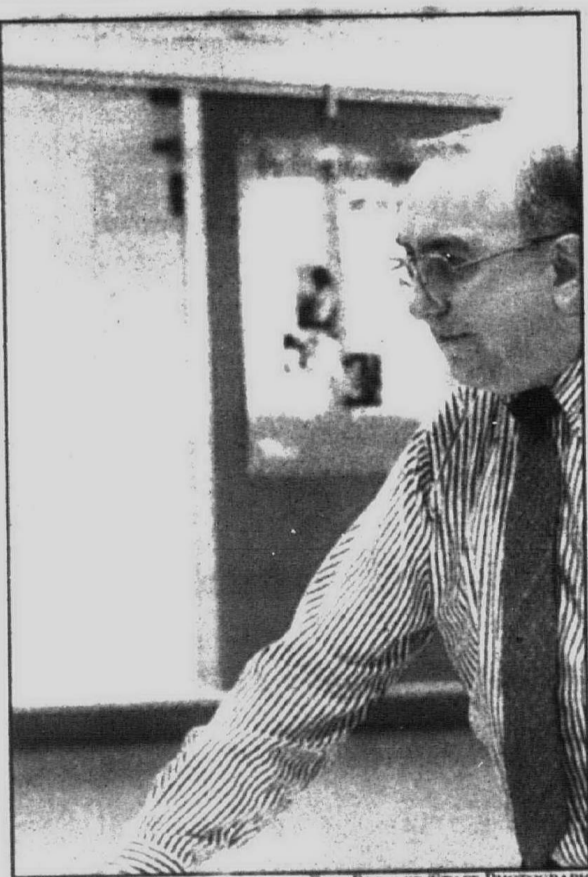
Last fall, residents of Old Village, on the north end of the city by the railroad tracks, complained of frequent power outages and power surges that damaged appliances. Edison responded, paying damage claims and doing extensive work in the city to replace old lines.

Still, residents in other parts of the city and Plymouth Township have also complained about Detroit Edison reliability. On Feb. 27, lightning knocked out power to about 5,300 Edison customers for three hours and knocked out traffic signals to some Ann Arbor Road intersections during morning rush hour.

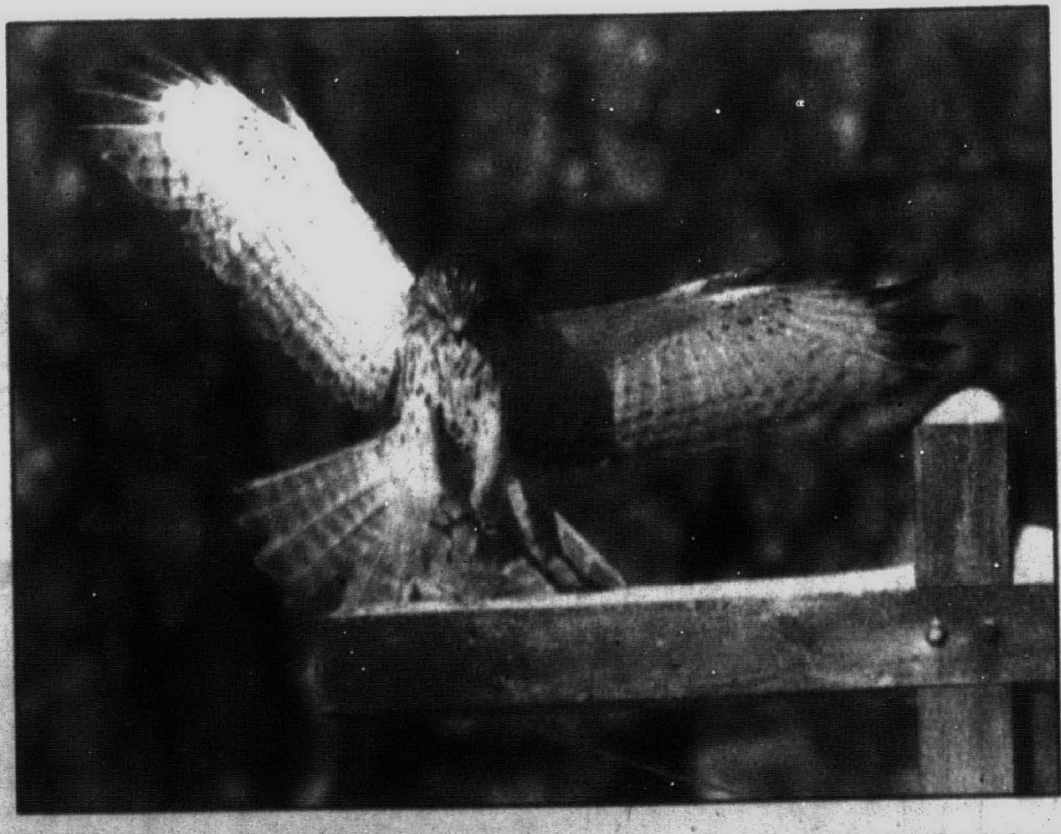
So does Plymouth have more problems than more areas?

## Hawk visits couple often

Peggy Farell's feathered friends got a big buddy last September who eschews the sunflower seeds and refrains from eating the little birds, but feasts on chicken parts instead.

"We call him Gary," Farell said, referring to the Cooper's hawk who has stopped by daily since fall, usually scaring the smaller birds off as he swoops in to retrieve some talon-lickin'-good chicken giblets.

"It all started because I wanted to buy chicken necks," Farell said.

As she prepared this chicken-neck dish, Farell had a few parts left over. So she cast them into the back yard of the Pilgrim Hills home she has shared with husband Tony for 21 years.

Farell figured the crows would finish the job, but a Cooper's hawk about 16 inches in length arrived to teach the crows a thing or two about claiming a meal.

Since then, the Farells have fed Gary nearly every day. A veteran bird watcher with four feeders, a heated bird bath and a bag of suet hanging from a tree for woodpeckers, Farell had never seen a hawk up close and personal before.

"It's just wonderful to look at something like that so closely," she said. "Hopefully he's improving his hunting skills. (But) maybe he's just a mooch. Maybe he's a couch potato hawk."

# City commission lauds policeman

Plymouth police Officer Ronald Bianchi was recognized by the city commission March 4 for his fast action to evacuate people from a burning apartment complex on Penniman last month.

Reading a proclamation honoring Bianchi, Mayor Ron Loiselle said, "The fire had started in the attic space above the fire detectors, which likely would have resulted in serious injury or death to the people sleeping in the dwelling, had it not been for Officer Bianchi's quick and decisive action."

During the early morning

hours of Feb. 15, Bianchi noticed smoke coming from the apartment building rafters. After residents were evacuated, the building was destroyed by fire.

Loiselle said he, the commission and Plymouth residents thank him "for his dedication to duty and his quick and effective action which contributed to the saving of lives and property."

**Law's bill**

State Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth is sponsoring a state

law to extend tax breaks to businesses.

Specifically, Public Act 94 sponsored by Law would allow firms not getting maximum 12-year abatements to have their lesser-term tax breaks extended up to 12 years.

"When new industries apply for these tax breaks, local governments are put in an awkward position," Law said.

"This law gives them the flexibility to approve a short-term abatement, evaluate the results over time and decide if the subsidy is worth renewing," he said.

**New DeMattia projects**

The R.A. DeMattia Co. of Plymouth Township is scheduled to undertake a project to expand and renovate various research areas at the Johnson Controls building at Metro West Technology Park.

The new research areas will provide for product review and testing, and will accommodate an expansion of the firm's technology library.

The firm will also build a 125,000 research and development facility for Inalfa Roof Systems in Auburn Hills.

# Man charged with thefts from homes

A Dearborn Heights man was arrested and charged last week after undercover Dearborn police officers followed him into three Canton homes being shown by Realtors, where they believe he stole several items.

Judge John MacDonald of the 35th District Court entered a not guilty plea March 5 on behalf of Vito Lena, 39, who was charged with two counts of larceny in a building, a four-year felony, and one count of habitual offender fourth degree, a 15-year felony in this case.

Lena was soon free after family members paid 10 percent of a \$15,000 bond set by MacDonald, said Canton Police Detective Richard Pomorski, who was assigned to the case.

A pre-trial examination was set for 9 a.m. Friday, March 15, before 35th District Court Judge Ronald Lowe.

Pomorski said Lena "made a full statement, admitted to it."

Lena's past convictions include larceny, shoplifting and forgery.

According to Canton police reports, Lena entered three houses

in Canton the afternoon of Sunday, March 3. Each house was for sale and had been advertised as an "open house" for that day.

Undercover Dearborn officers followed Lena into each house.

Once Lena left the third house, Dearborn officers contacted Canton police and requested that Lena's car be stopped, according to police reports.

Officers stopped Lena at Hanford and Lilley and found that his license had been suspended.

They searched Lena's 1993 Lincoln Continental and found a gold necklace, a bracelet, two folding pocket knives, a jar of birth-control pills and a black bra.

Ownership of the necklace and pills were claimed by a mother and daughter, respectively, from one house that Lena visited.

The pocket knives were claimed by the owner of another house Lena visited. The owner's initials were carved in one knife. The knife owner said the black bra belonged to his girlfriend, according to the police report.

The three houses Lena visited are on Devon, Lee Ann and Bunker Hill in subdivisions between Warren and Ford near Morton Taylor.

Board requests and reports will precede action items. Under the consent calendar are bills for payment, leaves and resignations, and tenure recommendations.

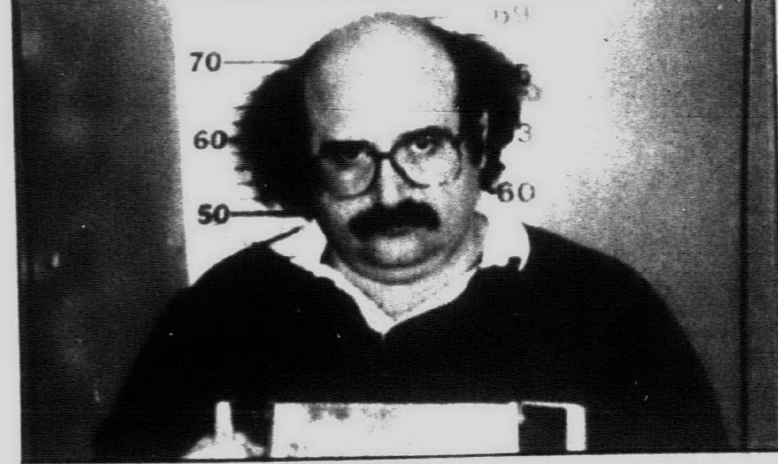
Other action items are approval

# Population increase keeps township police busy

More home building and an increasing population in Plymouth Township are sparking increased calls to police for service and more crime in some categories.

Crime statistics for 1995 in the township show marked increases in reported assaults and burglaries. They also show a drop in car thefts and larcenies.

Police Chief Carl Berry is scheduled to present a 1995 annual department report to Plymouth Township's board of

trustees at their meeting at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday at Plymouth Township Hall, 42350 Ann Arbor Road just east of Lilley Road.

The report shows dispatched calls for service have grown sharply — from 33,141 in 1994 to 41,293 in 1995.

Reported rape in the township was up, from three cases reported in 1994 to eight in 1995. "Most of those rapes would be considered date rape situations," Berry said, adding that no women were attacked or abducted in public.

Robberies were stable, with three reported in 1995 compared

to two in 1994. "There's very little violent crime that's occurred out here, most of the crimes we have are property crimes," Berry said.

Reported assaults rose more than double, from 97 in 1994 to 190 in 1995. "A lot of that has to do with the new domestic violence law, what wasn't reported

last year are down from the 138 burglaries reported in 1991.

Larcenies were also up in 1995, to 414 compared to 371 in 1994. This category includes thefts from stores, autos and garages. "People should secure their goods and report suspicious people," Berry said, adding homeowners should lock garages.

The number of stolen autos dropped from 61 last year to 51 this year. Berry credited an increasing number of auto-theft protection devices and work by police task forces to reduce car theft. "There are a lot of things

out there that are taking the problem down, we need to continue the pressure to keep them down," Berry said.

Berry said it's important for the township police department to respond to the township's growth.

"Obviously somewhere in the future the police department has to grow with the community to continue to provide the protection that's provided today, we need to keep citizens informed and we need citizen cooperation," he said.

"We encourage people to call if they see something suspicious. Let us check it out," Berry said.

# Couple awaits verdict in Fisher's third murder trial

For Manuel and Evelyn Mercado, a Cape Coral, Fla., couple awaiting a Wayne Circuit Court jury verdict, it's been a long week.

To be more accurate, it's been a long 12 years. That's how long the Mercados have waited for justice in the 1984 asphyxiation death of their daughter, Ella Maria Mercado Fisher.

"We just can't wake up from the nightmare," said Evelyn Mercado, while the couple spent yet another day on the wooden bench outside the courtroom of Wayne Circuit Judge Cynthia Stephens.

An eight-woman, four-man jury began deliberating Thursday, Feb. 28, following the third murder trial of Dr. Charles Fisher, the Mercados' former son-in-law. Fisher, who was director of microbiology at Ann Arbor's Veterans Administration Hospital, was found guilty of first-degree murder after two previous trials. Both jury verdicts were overturned on technicalities.

Charles and Ella Maria Mercado Fisher lived in Canton at the time of Mercado Fisher's death in July of 1984.

Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Bob Donaldson told the jury Fisher killed his wife out of jealousy and desperation. Just days after she was attacked, Mercado Fisher, 31, had planned to leave for Germany and Belgium where she intended to visit a male cousin and to study transcultural nursing.

Fisher tried to talk her out of going, according to testimony.

Fisher told police that unknown intruders entered their home on Thornwood and bound and gagged the couple with rope and duct tape around midnight on July 15.

Fisher's third murder trial before Judge Stephens began Feb. 5.

The jury deliberated Thursday afternoon (Feb. 28), Friday, part of Monday, and all day Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of last week. Stephens

dismissed the jury at 5 p.m. Friday. Jurors were to resume deliberations this morning.

After closing arguments, Canton Detective William Keppen cautiously predicted the jury would find Fisher guilty in a matter of hours. "I think our case went very well, but there is always concern about the jury and how they view everything," Keppen said.

In Fisher's second trial, the jury returned a guilty verdict after just 45 minutes. In the microbiologist's first trial, jurors were out for two days.

Donaldson speculated Friday that the jury is in disagreement over whether Fisher is guilty of first- or second-degree murder.

First-degree murder, defined as pre-meditated murder with intent to kill, is punishable by life in prison without parole.

To prove second-degree murder, prosecutors must show the defendant intended to kill or to cause great bodily harm, or acted with the knowledge that death was likely to result. Second-degree murder is punishable by any number of years up to life in prison.

The jury on Friday sent a note to Judge Stephens asking for a definition of "pre-meditation," Donaldson said.

The prosecutor said that considering the number of hours the jury has actually deliberated — even though it's been over a long period of time — "I wouldn't call this unusually long. It seems very long, and it's a pain, but given this case, I don't think it's extraordinary." Early in the week, the judge dismissed the jury for a day-and-a-half because one juror had strep throat.

"Theoretically, they could deliberate until infinity. The judge won't discharge them unless they say they are (a) hung (jury)," said Donaldson, a Canton resident.

Offentimes, even juries that claim they're hung are told by the judge to continue deliberating, he added.

Fisher's attorney, Paul Daniel Curtis of Detroit, couldn't be reached for comment.

"Our goal will be to show support to the Clintons and their programs by expressing a positive message," Joyner said.

"This will be done by expressing our respect and admiration for the first lady, by supporting the projects on which Mrs. Clinton is working, by providing a coordinated effort in support of President Clinton's program and by focusing on the women's vote in 1996," he said.

The first Hillary fan club was founded in 1992 in Maryland. It was a year ago January that Joyner, while in the Borders book store in Ann Arbor, noticed a woman wearing a Hillary Rodham Clinton T-shirt.

"I talked to her and I heard there was a fan club. I went to a potluck dinner and the room was packed with probably 120 women. There was this wonderful food,

one wrote a poem, another woman sang some songs she had written, there was a lot of excitement in the air," Joyner said.

Last summer, Joyner spent time staffing the fan club's booth at the Ann Arbor Art Fair. "It was just phenomenal how many people would stop by to talk," he said. They also signed up 300 new members.

This January, Clinton appeared at the Borders book store in Ann Arbor. "There were over 2,500 people who stood in line to autograph her book, the fan club rented the Michigan Theater," Joyner said.

The scene was captured by the national TV show "Nightline," which even showed Joyner passing out chocolate chip cookies baked from the first lady's recipe.

"We baked thousands of them, we passed those out, and some literature about the fan club, that day we signed up 400 members," he said. Roughly 80 percent of the Ann Arbor club's 1,400 members are women.

Because 70 club members are from Western Wayne County, Joyner said a club here makes sense.

So why are people interested in joining a Hillary Rodham Clinton fan club?

"She's articulate, she's compassionate, she has a real self-assertive style, she's an excellent role model for women in this country," Joyner said, adding Clinton projected warmth while meeting people in Ann Arbor.

What does the fan club think about the Whitewater business?

"It's a shame the federal government is spending \$30 million dollars to investigate how she lost several thousand dollars, and it's a shame she has to spend \$2 million to defend herself. There has been absolutely no indication at all she's done anything wrong. It happened over 10 years ago, it's been scrutinized, evaluated; the chairman of Bob Dole's campaign committee is chairman of the Whitewater investigation," Joyner said. "Why don't they get out of her face? She is a great lady."

At the meeting Wednesday, Joyner said, "We'll set up the organization and talk about recruiting new members. We'll talk about disseminating information to other women in Plymouth and Canton, we'll have our first potluck dinner in May."

He stressed that the club includes Republican and independent members as well as Democrats. "We're having fun," Joyner said.

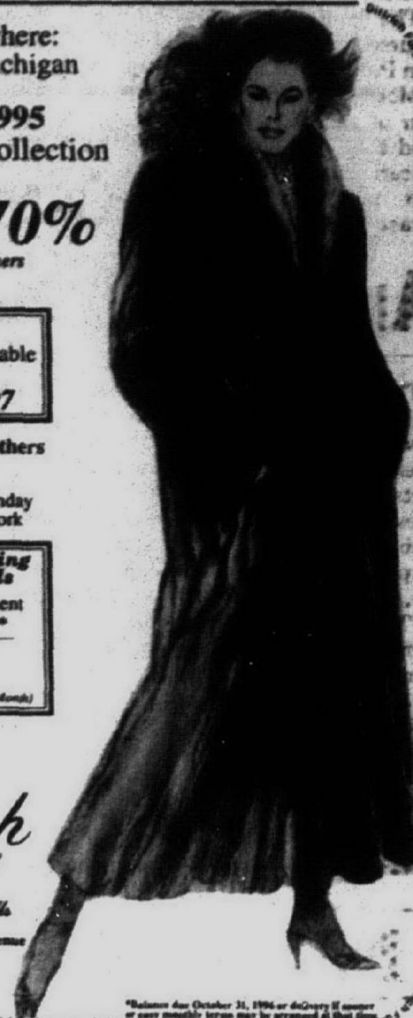

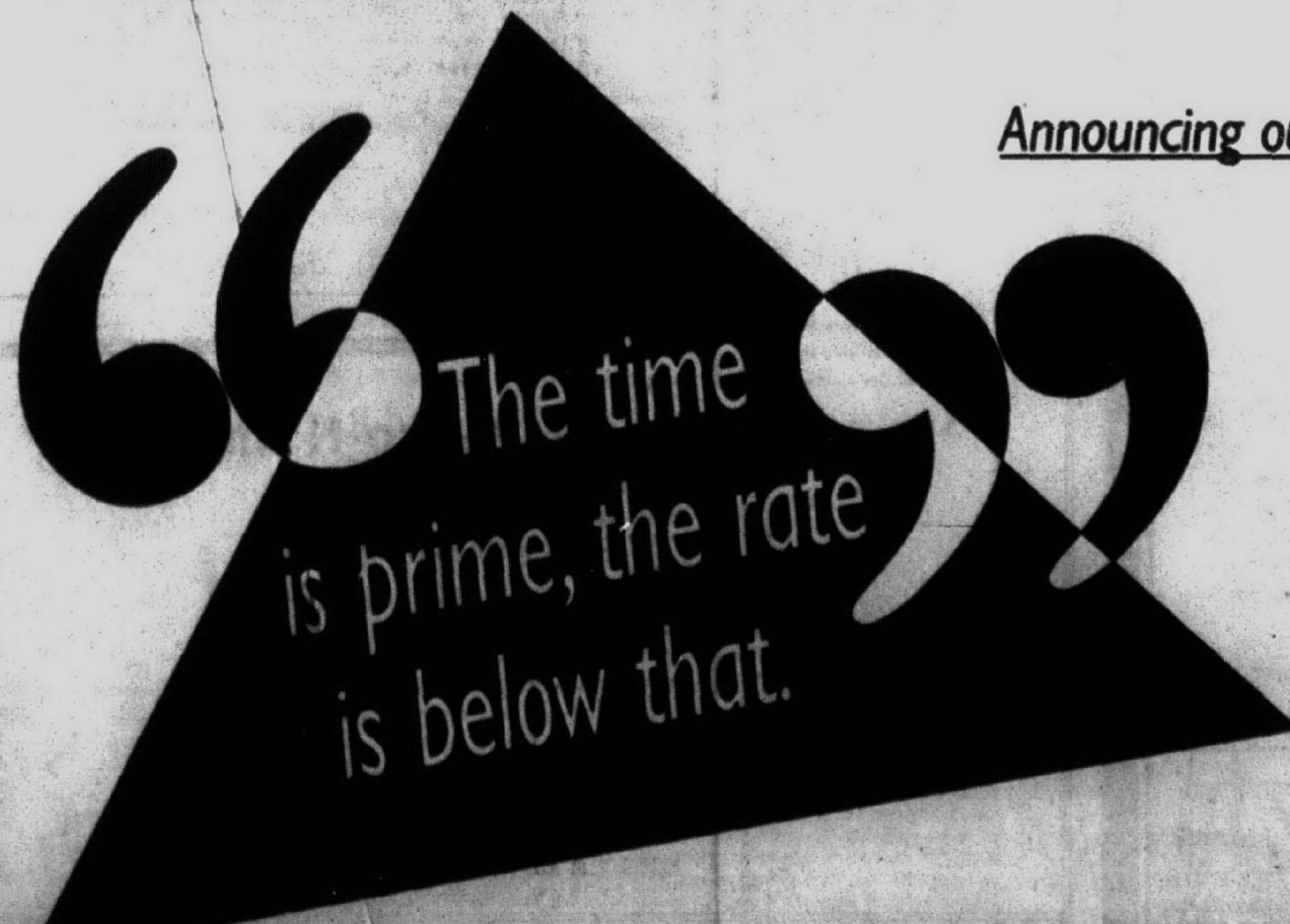

# SEMCOG, state headed for road funding showdown

Regional planners and the Michigan Department of Transportation are heading for a March 21 showdown over how to split a shrinking bundle of federal and state fuel taxes in the next three years.

The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments, the regional planning agency, decided 29-9 it would acquiesce to the state's eating the lion's share of money this year in return for giving local roads a better break in 1997-98.

"It's not a win-win situation. It's lose-lose," said Brent Bair, managing director of the Oakland County Road Commission, which has rattled the state cage for more road funds.

"I feel like I'm getting screwed, but I have to vote yes," said Nancy Dingledey, R-Wixom, an Oakland County commissioner and executive committee member of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. Her ribaldry brought laughs of agreement from nearly 40 other SEMCOG delegates and staffers at a March 7 executive committee meeting.

"I voted 'no' because the resolution restrains us to a one-year guarantee of funding," said a key state official, Louis Lambert, a planner with MDOT who serves on SEMCOG's executive committee.

## State wins in '96

Michael Duggan, deputy Wayne County executive from Livonia, won SEMCOG's "reluctant" approval of what he called a "compromise" resolution. Most delegates from Detroit, suburban Wayne County, Oakland, Livingston and Washtenaw counties supported it. Opposed were MDOT's Lambert along with Macomb and St. Clair counties.

The heart of SEMCOG's resolution: For nearly two decades, federal road aid has been split 75-25 between state and local agencies. MDOT, under Gov. John Engler, this year is seeking a bigger chunk of the money for four major projects: rebuilding Davison Freeway in Detroit, extending the Haggerty Connector north of 12 Mile in Oakland County, widening a section of I-96 between

Brighton and Howell in Livingston County, and upgrading a chunk of M-59 in Macomb County.

This year, the first in a three-year plan, the state could keep 86 percent, the state 14.

But in 1997 and '98, local roads would get their customary 25 percent. MDOT's Lambert objected that it would hamstring the state in those two years.

"There would be one condition," added Duggan. "Local roads would get any savings from state projects. The state could not substitute projects or spend all its share if bids came in low."

The effect was for SEMCOG to amend the dollar amounts of its three-year TIP (Traffic Improve-

ment Plan). SEMCOG, whose delegates are local elected officials, will meet again March 21 to prioritize projects.

## Engler blistered

Although MDOT spokesperson Robin Pannecouck said SEMCOG's March 7 action "jeopardized" the 1996 entire construction program, the matter is still pending until March 21, or 10 days before the deadline for submitting TIP to federal officials.

"A TIP isn't just numbers. We have to put projects behind Duggan's numbers," said SEMCOG chair Joan Buser, supervisor of Oakland Township.

SEMCOG in January was sent back to the drawing board after 1)

Many SEMCOG delegates were infuriated at Engler's unilateral action to commandeer the federal money and his refusal to negotiate a compromise with SEMCOG. Some wanted to disapprove a new TIP, cancelling the entire 1996 construction program for every-one.

Majority sentiment, as Duggan represented it, is to keep looking for a deal, no matter how painful.

It's "our best bet," agreed John Grubba, deputy Oakland County executive and a Milford resident.

"Government and politics are the art of the possible," said SEMCOG executive director John Amberger, of Livonia.

The OCRC's Bair called even the Duggan compromise a "Sophie's Choice" — a reference to the novel in which a mother must decide which of her children won't survive.

## 'Hold your nose'

"Hold your nose and vote yes," advised Steve Brock, assistant city manager from Farmington Hills, during the public comment portion of the meeting.

John Grace, an attorney from Rochester Hills who practices in Farmington Hills, praised Michigan's congressional delegation for getting US-DOT to remind the Engler administration that it must deal with SEMCOG, which is a federally-designated "metropolitan planning organization" as well as a creature of the state.

Grace singled out U.S. Rep. Dale Kildee, D-Flint, for praise. Kildee faces an election challenge this year from former MDOT director Patrick Nowak, a Republican from Waterford.

Novi City Manager Ed Kriewall said his growth city is "extremely disappointed at how the Legislature and governor have dodged a much-needed gas tax increase," helping to precipitate the showdown.

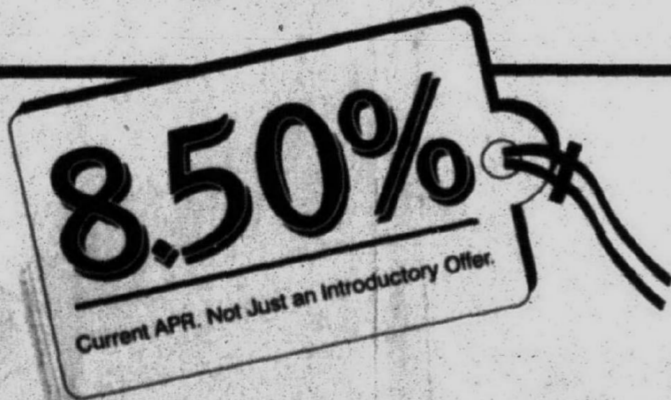

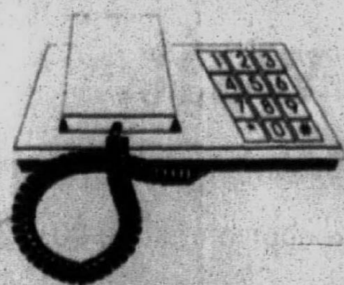

**GETTING STRAIGHT TO THE POINT**

Gum disease is a bacterial infection that arises from the sticky substance known as plaque that forms on the teeth each day. If not removed on a daily basis, plaque may harden into a substance known as tartar (or calculus). The bacteria in plaque and tartar produce toxins that inflame the gums to cause bleeding, an early indication of the disease known as gingivitis. At this point, the disease can be stopped and even reversed with professional treatment. To this end, the FDA recently approved a new site-specific antibiotic therapy for gum disease. It entails placement of a thread saturated with a slow-release antibiotic into the pocket around the teeth. It is left in place for 10 days, during which time it delivers an antibiotic about 100 times stronger than would be possible in pill form, and without side effects. Without treatment of any kind, gingivitis may progress to a point where supporting bone is lost and teeth loosen or fall out.

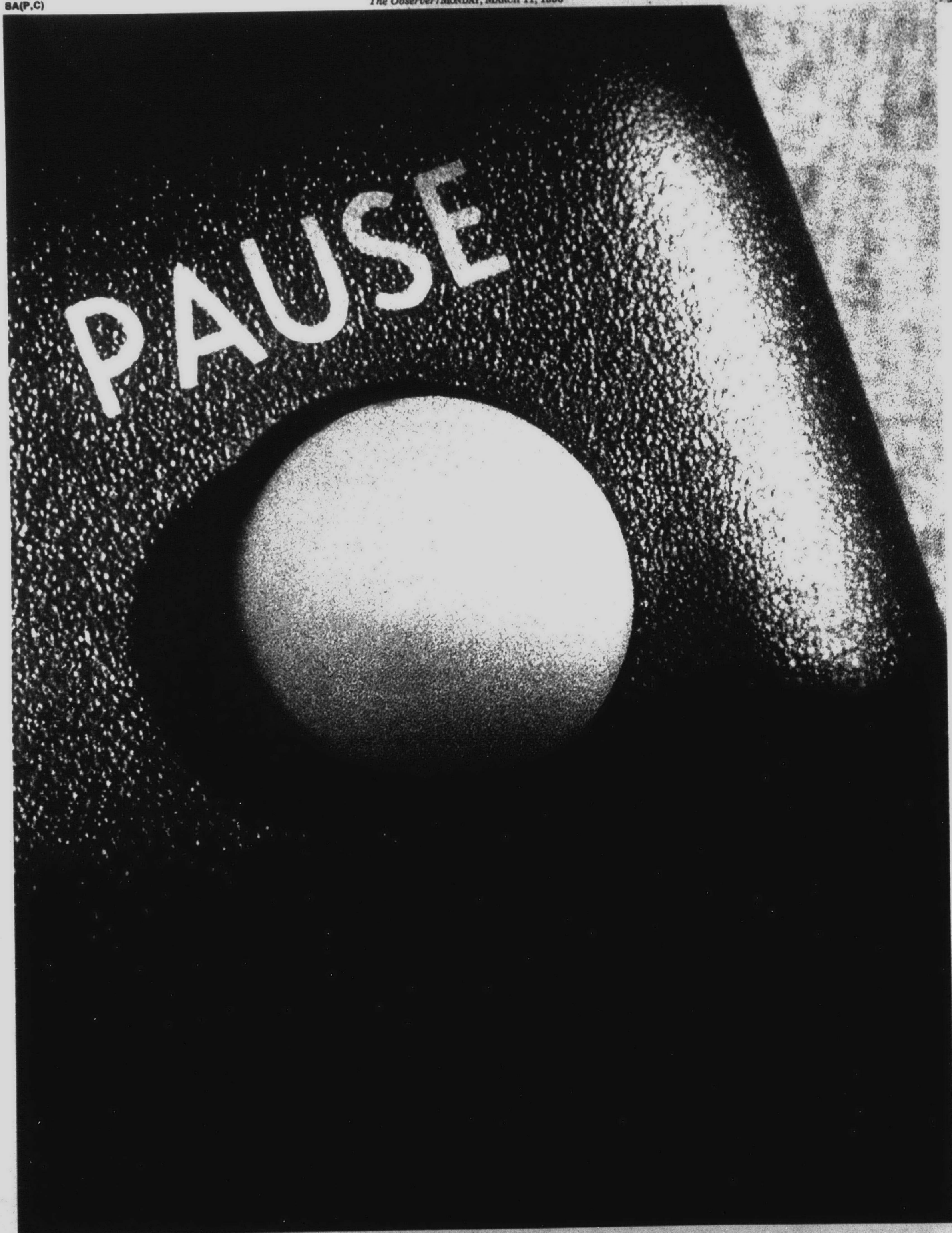

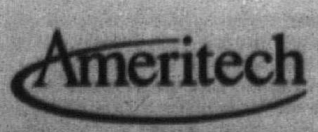

McGuire said she tries to stay one step ahead of the competition and has some very fresh and new looks ahead for spring. She also goes to great lengths to ensure the cast fits together with their surroundings, matching the funky atmosphere of their way-cool apartment and coffeehouse hangout.

She color codes the "sixsome" according to the room they're in. Quirky character Phoebe (Lisa Kudrow) is the only character who wears patterns and bright colors.

McGuire also clothes Dolly Parton, numerous Emmy award winners, and has her own couture shop in Pacific Palisades, Calif.

Men on television aren't immune to the fashion tug. Kramer, of "Seinfeld," looks like he just strolled out of a thrift shop specializing in vintage wears. The bowling shirts and '50s-era clothes he sports are hotter than ever. Just wish we could get Jerry out of those Nikes.

Probably no outfits are more fashionably noticed than Heather Locklear's short suit combinations on "Melrose Place." Most likely because they live in Los Angeles, this drama-plagued gang aims for a lighter, more California look than their darker-clothed contemporaries from "Friends." A couple of characters actually play fashion designers on the show, so costumer Denise Wingate tries hard to stay true to contemporary fashion and achieve just the right looks for cast members.

With several characters working at the fictional D&D Advertising, the search for professional yet fashionable outfits challenges Wingate, whose current creative outlet is Sydney, played by Laura Leighton. The flame-haired Sydney, appears to be a funky '60s cross between Nancy Sinatra and the "Laugh-In" go-go dancers.

"I've been going a little more retro for her. It started with a great pair of go-go boots that I found in a thrift store in Hollywood. Laura loved them. Next I came across a vintage leopard outfit," Wingate said. "With most of the cast needing fairly conservative clothing for D&D, we can have as much fun as we want with Sydney."

Wingate creates the looks after reading the scripts. If Jane needs to appear vulnerable or sexy, something soft and light-colored is worn. But when Brooke or Kimberly throw one of their fits, Wingate pulls out red and black — stronger colors to match their moods.

Don't expect, however, to trace down the exact looks from your favorite show. Wingate shops at the coolest boutiques, lately on La Brea Avenue in Los Angeles. She tries to discover new designers who haven't made it yet and give them a chance.

DKNY and Calvin Klein apparel are also worn regularly on "Melrose Place." Both she and "Friends" McGuire avoid most chain stores and mass-marketed clothes — it's unique they're looking for.

## Expert tells retailers: Focus on customer



Sloppy stores, solemn salespeople and silly answers to questions about your products will kill your business, a consultant tells local mall retailers.

Competition is strong and change is required if retailers are to survive and thrive in 1996.

That's the message from industry expert Barbara Wold to more than 250 Northland, Westland and Eastland Shopping Center merchants gathered for their annual meeting at

the Ritz Carlton in Dearborn last Wednesday.

"With more than 20,000 square feet of retail space for every man, woman and child in the country, the competition is tough," she said. "Every single area of the nation has vacancies in (shopping) centers."

"The most common mistakes retailers are making: not paying atten-

tion to customer service, cutting staff, hiring employees with no product knowledge and no enthusiasm, and using sale signs as marketing tools."

Wold's been advising retailers for more than 20 years. Her client list includes Taubman Properties, The Hahn Company and Edward J. DeBartolo Corp. As one of the nation's leading authorities on retail development, marketing and image, she serves as a consultant for USA Today and is a guest columnist for several international retail publications. She began her retail career 37 years ago as owner of a mini-department store in

southern California.

Wold pointed out that image is most important in retail because a customer assesses a business in 2.5 seconds. If the windows or carpeting is dirty, it's an immediate turnoff.

Next, an enthusiastic staff is essential. Wold reminded retailers that a single salesperson represents the entire establishment. She relayed an incident where during a purchase the salesperson said absolutely nothing, not even thank you. When confronted later about her lack of enthusiasm,

the salesperson said absolutely nothing, not even "thank you." When confronted later about her lack of enthusiasm, the salesperson responded that a thank you was printed on the sales receipt.

A verbal greeting, eye contact, a smile, and attentive body language indicate to a customer that his business is important to the retailer, Wold emphasized.

"I advise retailers to spend more time communicating with their staff so associates feel a part of the organization," she said. "Hold weekly staff meetings and appoint one of the staff members charge of the agenda."

Eric Willingham of Sibley

Shoes at Northland said he holds quarterly staff meetings, but after hearing Wold, he plans to begin monthly meetings with a staff member at the helm.

At the Pretzel Peddler in Westland, owner Mary Tombrella said weekly meetings are already part of the routine. That could be one reason this family owned business has grown to 11 locations over 25 years.

"Yes, you must make employees feel like part of the business," she said. "You have to spread this energy and enthusiasm because your employees are a mirror of the company. We hire a lot of college kids and we instruct them about

the way to treat a customer."

Creating an exciting retail environment is another must for the modern retailer, according to Wold. She cited the Nike Town Store in Chicago on Michigan Avenue as the ultimate merchandiser with basketball hoops and portable cash registers in the store. Once she stood across the street from Nike Town taking an informal survey. She noted that 85 percent of the customers leaving the store were carrying packages.

This bit of information lit a fire in Deron Washington of The Tie Box at Northland. He couldn't wait to get back to his store.

"Wold inspired me to think about the creativity of your store, to make sure it's inviting so it makes shoppers want to buy something," he said. "It's all about having more enthusiasm with the customers and motivating the whole staff. It's almost the year 2000, so you've got to change."

Wold's message was positive reinforcement for Judi Colorite of the Modern Woman, formerly Woman's World, at Westland Shopping Center.

"At Modern Woman customer service has always been number one," she said. "I'm going back and find out my staff's strengths so I can put them to better use."

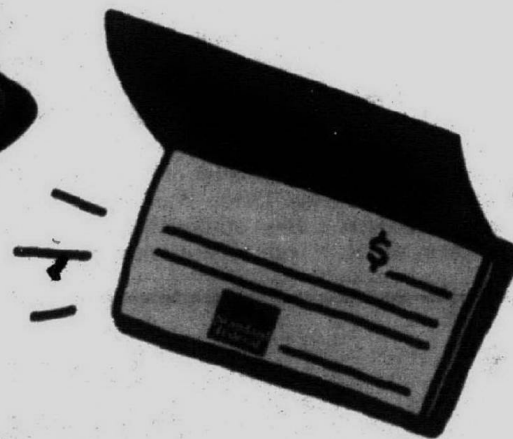

## Irish eyes smile on traditional dishes

Have you heard the one about the only thing an Irish cook has in the Kitchen? "Luck?"

Contrary to popular belief, Irish cooks know a little more than how to make boiled potatoes, steaming platters of cabbage, and stew.

I grew up in Wyandotte, and all the Irish attended St. Patrick's Church, including the McNamaras (no relation to our Wayne County executive) who lived about five doors down from us on Sycamore Street. I went to school with Karen McNamara, whose younger brother Dave was part of the Sycamore Street version of "Our Gang." He was the only kid on the block with hair the color of carrots and enough freckles to go around for everyone on the block.

I remember the McNamaras because on March 17, the entire block got caught up in the traditional Irish St. Patrick's Day celebration. Wearing something green was generally accepted, even if your name didn't start with "Mc."

The Cozy Corner (the local watering hole around the corner) served green beer and Momma cooked a corned beef and cabbage in her upright (barrel shaped) roaster.

Locally, interested cooks can learn quite a bit from a cookbook published by the Detroit Chapter of the Irish American Cultural Institute. The cookbook contains "Irish Country House Breakfast and Pub Grub" recipes, which reflect the theme of the group's fifth annual Irish Cooking School held at Botsford Inn on March 2. Call (810) 540-6687 for information on how to get your copy.

Another stop that should be on every Irish lover's list is The Irish Baker, Jack Derrig, 5472 Schaefer (Between Michigan Avenue and Ford Road) in Dearborn, (313) 584-2444. If you shop at upscale markets around town, you've undoubtedly seen The Irish Baker's famed shortbread in bakery sections. If you haven't tried it, it's to die for. This unbelievably little store,

in addition to supplying Irish baked goods, is a great place to find gifts imported from the Emerald Isle.

Ireland is not known as a cooking school destination, but if you're looking for an authentic Irish cooking school, I'm hearing nothing but accolades from the folks who have taken courses at Darina Allen's Ballymaloe Cookery School in Shangarry, County Cork, Ireland. Her skills as a teacher, her wonderful manner, and the layout of the school rivals the best French culinary academies. Accommodations at Allen's in-law's Ballymaloe House are nothing short of dazzling. You can phone them at 353 (21) 064-6785 or fax them at 353 (21) 064-6909 for more information.

No visit to Ireland is complete without a stop. You don't have to sign up for months or weeks at a time either - if a visit to Ireland is in your future, check it out!

Of course, I can remember jumping into the old family Fairlane Ford and heading on down to Ronnie's Meats at the Eastern Market in Detroit for the best corned beef. Many folks think that the entire Eastern Market burned down last fall when in fact, it was only the Gratiot Central Market which housed meat dealers, some restaurants, and a local fish market.

Well, good news for the folks who remember Ronnie's - they have reopened, and are once again selling the best corned beef money can buy. Tom Bedway and the folks at Ronnie's want you to know they are still alive and doing business about a mile north of their old site at 1445 Kirby (313) 874-5796. Ronnie's is three blocks north of Warren Road off of Russel Street (next to Thorn Apple Valley) and is open for business Monday through Saturday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.. Remember what the locals say - "everyone has a little bit of Irish blood in them," and if you can't make corned beef and cabbage, try something with an Irish twist like Irish Soda Bread, shortbread, braised cabbage or smoked salmon.

## Eat less, exercise more to lose weight

So often people ask me how to lose weight. I used to tell them about calories and the body's ability to use fuel. Now I give a simple answer - to lose weight, eat less, exercise more.

Many people are not satisfied with that explanation. They want complicated diets or specific foods. They want a prescription for losing a certain amount of weight. They want calorie tables and meal plans. Just like when they pick a certain pain reliever for a headache, or laundry soap to remove a stain. People want a method to lose weight, and they want it to work quickly. Unfortunately, it didn't take them two weeks to put 30 extra pounds on, and it won't take two weeks for it to come off.

So the advice to eat less and exercise more is simple, but important. It involves more than just counting fat grams and getting on the scale. In some regard, losing weight starts with making some changes within.

March is National Nutrition Month, and a good time for putting some healthful habits into practice. Here are some of my suggestions for healthy lifestyle changes.

■ Get back to enjoying food. Someone once said "eating is one of life's greatest pleasures." Food is not the enemy. Make peace with your refrigerator.

■ Go for moderation in eating and life. Beware of any diet that requires you to eat only certain foods or to make major changes in your lifestyle. Accept the fact that you need to make some sensible changes, and that you must get

some physical exercise.

■ Learn the facts about good nutrition. Don't act impulsively, but search for answers. Read to improve your knowledge and beware of "sensational" claims.

■ Get some physical activity every day. This can be a challenge especially here in the Motor City area in the winter. As a start, add movement to your day. Do some stretches in the shower, stand up straight and tall and stretch your arms above your head. Vacuum with gusto. Be the one to "run" the garbage to the curb. Sit on the floor and stretch out while you're playing with your kids. Park far from the door and use the opportunity to add steps to your day. And, of course, always take the stairs, not the elevator. Then, when you're ready, 30 minutes of exercise on most (preferably all) days of the week. Start slowly, building as your strength and fitness improve.

■ Don't sit down. Staying upright is one key to a long life. Find activities that you can enjoy with others. A business associate of mine started square dancing and finds it to be both physically and mentally challenging. Her husband enjoys this exercise far more than riding a stationary bike so now they dance twice a week. Recently they tried ballroom dancing lessons and are enjoying that as well. Check out your Parks and Recreation department, they offer all kinds of activities that will keep you on your feet.

■ Follow the recommendations on the Food Guide Pyramid. The Food Guide

Pyramid visually shows you how to create a good diet. The foundation is grains, followed by fruits and vegetables, then smaller servings of meats and dairy, and fats and sweets only for added calories.

This way of eating is actually quite different from how most of us are accustomed to eating. In the U.S. meat takes center-of-the plate, vegetables are sometimes given only as garnish and desserts are high in sugar, fat and calories. Try to make grains and vegetables the highlight of your meal with "meat on the side." Build fruits and dairy products into desserts, and never add extra fats or sugars to foods. Eat this way as often as possible.

■ Don't gain as you age. Adding pounds, a few each year, puts us at risk for heart disease, high blood pressure, stroke, diabetes, certain types of cancer, and other illnesses. While it is not necessary to be as skinny as a model, we must pay attention to our body weight and not continue to gain weight throughout adulthood.

So the the advice to eat less and exercise more starts with a few simple changes applied to every meal, every day.

Eat well - live well

# Lamb stew, soda bread Irish favorites

### TRADITIONAL IRISH STEW

- 2 pounds stewing lamb, cut into cubes
- 2 large onions, chopped coarse
- 2 pounds potatoes, scrubbed and peeled
- 2 tablespoons parsley, chopped
- Salt and fresh ground pepper to taste
- 1 1/2 cups water

Wash the lamb in cold water and pat dry. Prepare the onions and potatoes. Cut potatoes and onions into 1/2-inch dice. Layer the meat and the potatoes into a medium heavy Dutch oven. Season well with salt and pepper and parsley.

Pour the water over all. Seal the pan with foil or a tight fitting lid and bake in a preheated 325 degree F oven for 2 1/2 to 3 hours. Serves 4.

Recipe compliments of The Detroit Chapter of the Irish American Cultural Institute

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 6 tablespoons (1/4 stick) butter
- 2 cups grated cheddar cheese
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups buttermilk

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 1 1/2 quart, 3-inch deep round baking dish. In a separate bowl, combine flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda. Cut in butter until it resembles coarse meal. Stir in grated cheese.

Beat eggs in a medium bowl, reserving 1 tablespoon to brush on as a glaze. Blend buttermilk into beaten eggs. Stir into flour mixture; dough will be sticky. Turn onto a lightly floured surface and knead until well blended, about 2-3 minutes. Shape into a round and fit into prepared dish. Cut a deep cross in the center of the dough. Brush with reserved egg. Bake until a tester inserted in the center comes out clean, about 75 minutes. Cool in pan on a rack for 15 minutes. Invert onto rack and continue cooling. Makes 1 loaf.

How to cook Corned Beef from "The Joy of Cooking" (by Irma S. Rombauer Becker, Bobbs Merrill Publishers, copyright 1931-1975)

Wash corned beef brisket under running water to remove any surface brine.

Cover with enough boiling water to cover and simmer (uncovered), allowing about 1 hour of cooking per pound or until a fork can penetrate

the center. Always slice corned beef very thin and diagonally across the grain.

A classic accompaniment to corned beef is cabbage wedges, simmered with the beef during the last 15 minutes of cooking time.

### OATMEAL SPICE COOKIES

- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 6 tablespoons margarine
- 1 tablespoon vanilla
- 1 cup flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 2 cups oatmeal
- 1 cup raisins

In large bowl, with mixer at high speed, beat margarine and sugars until creamy. Add egg and vanilla. Beat until fluffy, about 2 minutes. In medium bowl, combine flour, cinnamon, baking soda and nutmeg. Stir in margarine mixture until well blended. Stir in oatmeal and raisins. Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls 2 inches apart on lightly greased cookie sheets. Bake in 350 degree F oven for 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned. Makes 4 dozen.

### ORANGE ROUGHY WITH DILLED VEGETABLES

- 2 orange roughy fish fillets (approximately 8 ounces each)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice

- 1 teaspoon dried dill weed
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 small (5 ounces) zucchini, cut lengthwise in half and then crosswise into 1/4-inch slices
- 3 plum tomatoes, each cut crosswise in half and then into quarters (approximately 1 cup)
- 1/2 small yellow, red or green bell pepper, cut into thin strips
- 1 green onion, cut diagonally into slices
- Salt (optional)

Cut fish fillets to make 4 equal serving-size portions. In 8-inch square microwave-safe baking dish, arrange fish in spoke-fashion with one portion fish in each corner; fold thinner ends under to make even thickness. In medium bowl, combine oil, lemon juice, dill and pepper. Add vegetables, tossing to coat. Arrange vegetables evenly over fish. Cover with microwave-safe plastic wrap, lifting one edge of plastic to vent.

Microwave on HIGH 7-8 minutes or until fish flakes and vegetables are tender; rotating dish halfway through cooking. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Season with salt if desired. Makes 4 servings.

### CHERUBS ON ANGEL HAIR

- 2 ounces dry angel hair pasta
- 12 ounces ground turkey breast
- 4 egg whites
- 8 tablespoons seasoned bread crumbs
- 1 tablespoon, plus 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 2 teaspoons basil, chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic, minced
- 2 scallions, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon olive oil
- Sauce: 2 cups tomatoes, chopped (3-4 medium)
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh garlic,

- minced
- 2 teaspoons basil
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon Balsamic vinegar

Mix turkey with egg whites, bread crumbs, olive oil, garlic, onions and basil. Roll into small balls. Saute with 1/2 teaspoon of olive oil in non-stick pan until golden. Meanwhile, cook pasta as directed. For the sauce, cook together tomatoes, garlic, onions and basil until flavors marry (2-3 minutes). Just before finished, add vinegar to sauce. To serve, divide pasta on four plates, add meatballs, cover with sauce.

# Pros shed light on 'weighty' issues

"There's so much intense guilt around food issues — you need to deal with them," said Gale Cox, a registered dietitian and Health Program's Coordinator for Botsford Hospital's Health Development Network. "Eat when you're hungry. Then you can make a smart choice. Try to keep yourself from being very hungry so you've got control."

Cox, and other dietitians at local community hospitals, are helping people win the fight against flab one day at a time with a variety of programs.

"You have to adapt diets to

meet your needs, and stop beating yourself up. Your ability to make good choices correlates with how hungry you are. If you don't eat breakfast and have a late lunch you'll be overly hungry, and your ability to make good choices is zero," said Cox. "Eat an apple or have a glass of milk to keep you in a safe zone."

Julie Carrigan, Chief Clinical Dietitian at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia agrees. "People think the more you eat, the less likely you are to lose weight. This isn't true. One of the most important things to do is to eat breakfast in the morning. Your metabolism stays at sleeping rate until you eat, then it increases. You burn more calories when your metabolism gets out of the sleeping rate. To lose weight most effectively you should eat regularly."

Throughout March, dietitians at St. Mary Hospital will explore "Nutrition through the Life Cycle." A dietitian will be the cafeteria 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. one day each week to answer questions. Weekly hand-outs, which are available in the cafeteria, explore themes such as nutrition for men (March 11), women (March 18), and senior citizens (March 25).

At Garden City Hospital Alicia Taub registered dietitian and Clinical Dietetics Manager is planning a Quick and Easy Low-fat Class that will be offered in April. Her advice to anyone trying to shed pounds is to avoid anything fried and to minimize your use of added fats — salad dressing, gravy, mayonnaise, margarine, and oil.

"Reflect upon what you're doing," said Mary Heiser, also a registered dietitian at Garden City Hospital, and Diabetes Educator. "Be aware of added fat and sodium in your diet." To cut fat she recommends using non-stick pans, and non-stick sprays instead of oil. Take the skin off chicken, and trim the fat off meat before you cook it. "But be careful not to add fat when you cook the meat. Try broiling or baking instead of frying. Saute meats with chicken broth, wine, water, lemon juice or low-sodium soy sauce."

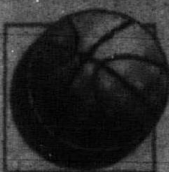

Hills Mercy. And the Marlins, who had not taken a game off their Central Division foe in two years, put up a fight before falling 15-13, 13-15, 15-7.

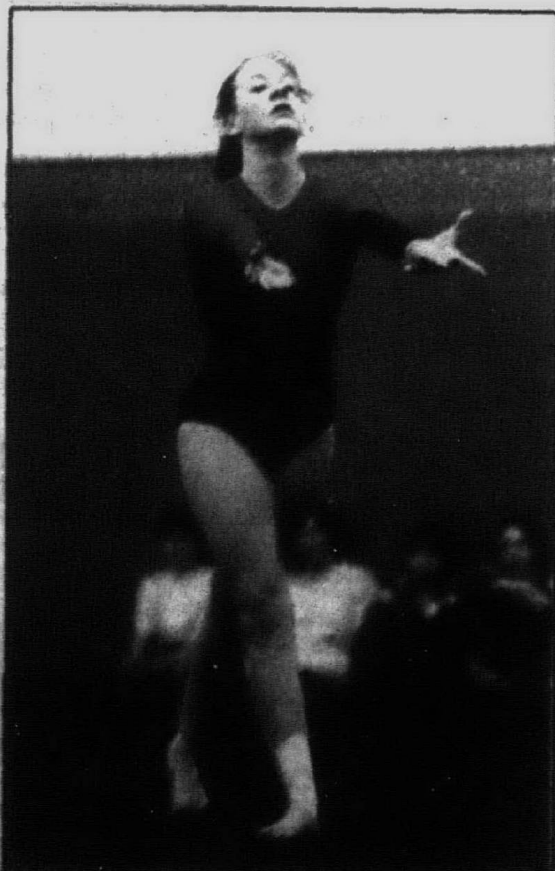

## Despite Canton's efforts, Holland still rules at state

Plymouth Canton tumbled to its best finish ever at Friday's Michigan High School Athletic Association State Gymnastic Meet at Troy High School. The Chiefs, who had been ranked as high as No. 3 in the state, were jubilant with their second-place team finish.

Holland was crowned state champion for the third consecutive year by collecting 144.85 points. The Chiefs followed with 141.85 points, Northville-Nowi was third with 141.35 and Rochester Adams fourth with 140.80 points.

Plymouth Salem, Troy and Troy Athens finished 10th through 12th, respectively. Salem scored 135.85 points, Troy 133.85 and the Red Hawks 130.30.

# Northville guns down Salem

The first time these teams met this season on the hardwood, Plymouth Salem was surging and Northville was struggling.

"Whenever she touched the ball, good things would happen," Teeters said. "She had the magic touch... passing, serving, you

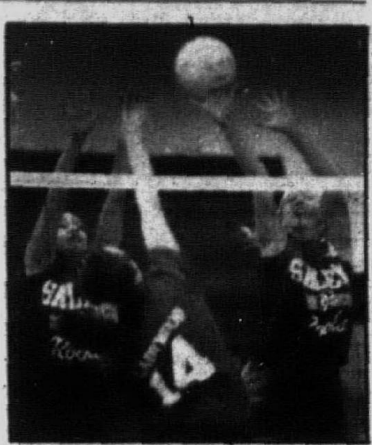
name it. She just played great." While Ladywood struggled with its serving the first two games, the Rocks fell apart in the third because of serve reception and passing.

The 1996 Oldsmobile LSS remains the only vehicle General Motors sells that is outfitted with the neat Guidestar system.

I really thought the Guidestar would catch on as the coolest option to hit the upper crust of GM vehicles, especially since the system only costs around \$1,500. It's still really neat, and although it's not always accurate, it's still perfect for someone like real-estate sales people who need road map information at their fingertips.

That aside, the LSS is still a premium automobile with enough comfort and room for the largest of families or anyone who needs to haul a lot of people around. With the demise of the super-large cars at GM, the LSS may become the next vehicle of choice for taxicab drivers.

Although the standard engine on the LSS is the 3800 Series 3.8-liter, tested was the optional supercharged 3800 Series 3.8-liter engine with sequential fuel injection mated to a 4-speed electronically con-

rol automatic transmission that packs a whopping 240 horses under the hood.

It's a strong power plant that gets you where you need to go with a minimum of effort and is as quiet as a lamb when getting you there. This thing performs like a strong V8, providing instant response in passing or acceleration from a standstill.

Although Oldsmobile touts this full-size front-wheel-drive sedan as a close kin to the Aurora, the LSS is tamer in looks. Conservative is what you

could call it. The LSS is much closer in looks to the Ninety Eight, with some refinements.

Detailing all around has been freshened for 1996. Added fog lamps and 16-inch wheels help distinguish it from the Ninety Eight. There's also the fact that the LSS comes fully equipped - there are only five options to choose from. They include the supercharged engine, cloth trim, a CD player, an engine block heater (for the cold climates) and a power-operated sunroof.

That's it. The standard list is extensive for a vehicle that has a base price of \$26,000 -- dual airbags, anti-lock brakes, a security system, intermittent wipers, child security locks, 4-wheel independent suspension, twilight sentinel, 16-inch aluminum wheels and blackwall tires, dual 8-way power adjustable bucket seats, an electrochromatic mirror with compass, front and rear floor mats, an AM/FM cassette stereo, dual zone air condition-

ing, cruise control, fog lamps, illuminated entry and exit, power door locks, power outside mirrors, a power trunk lid release, power windows with automatic down, a rear window defogger, tilt steering wheel, speed-variable power steering, leather seating, traction control, touring suspension and a trunk cargo net.

Also new for 1996 is the trunk pass-through feature for extra-long items, programmable door locks, daytime running lamps and an improved exterior design.

This five-passenger sedan has plenty of headroom, hip-room and legroom, even for the tallest person. Rear seating is comfortable and it's easy to get in and out of. The cargo area could hold at least a month's worth of groceries or take five people's worth of luggage to the airport with little problem.

Ride and handling are taken care of with independent MacPherson struts, coil springs and an anti-roll bar in the front and independent

Chapman struts, coil springs and anti-roll bar in the rear. No mistaking the luxury-type ride here.

The Oldsmobile LSS is definitely positioned to meet the needs and expectations of anyone who wants to purchase a full-size import vehicle. The value is certainly there, given its long list of standard equipment.
