Trustees vexed by late taxes



Plymouth Township officials have called for a review of apparent delays in disbursing taxes to other communities. The husband of township treasurer Mary Brooks alluded to the issue "a political thing."

Plymouth Township trustees have asked legal counsel to review a treasurer's office practice, saying it could leave the township open to lawsuits. The practice, also identified by auditing firm Rehmann and Robson, involves payment and disbursement

of taxes collected by the township. For the third consecutive year, Rehmann and Robson in the annual township audit have found that tax payments are being made later than required to other taxing authorities. The township treasurer's office collects taxes for all taxing units then disburses payments to the Ply-

mouth-Canton schools and other taxing authorities.

"Delinquent personal property taxes approximating \$230,000 have been held in the general fund and not distributed to the various taxing jurisdictions in accordance with the Michigan Compiled Laws," the audit firm found in a Dec. 31, 1995 management letter.

One late payment dates back to Nov. 1994.

Treasurer Mary Brooks, in the fourth year of her third term as treasurer, was on vacation with her daughter last week, and unavailable

for comment. Her husband, Robert Brooks, said he was angry with township trustees for being critical of his wife.

"She wanted a computer system to be able to disburse the funds and (township Supervisor Kathleen Keen) McCarthy has not come through with this for her, she has been after this for months and months. It's a political thing is what it is," he said.

"She's not going to do anything that's not legal," Robert Brooks

Idea blooms for Plymouth city flower

The city of Plymouth now has an official flower.

The perennial daylily edged out other flowers considered by the city Beautification Committee, and the flower was named by Plymouth city commissioners on Monday as the official city flower.

Why a city flower? "We wanted to do something that would generate enthusiasm for our Adopt-a-Curb Garden Program," said Carol Stone, city personnel director and beautification committee member.

"One of the goals of the beautification committee is to achieve public awareness of the committee and its programs and to encourage beautification of the city through the planting of flower gardens," she said.

The Adopt-a-Curb Garden Program would encourage the planting of gardens between streets and sidewalks. The beautification committee plans to get the program going around the city later this month.

"We're going to promote the use of the daylily in whatever gardens people do," said beautification committee chairman Dan Dwyer.

The group also plans to re-landscape the former Amoco station at the corner of Ann Arbor Trail and Main Street downtown.

So why the daylily? "We thought about the tulip, but that's very common," Dwyer said. "We thought about marigolds but that's an annual, we were looking at a perennial. Asters were considered real hardy but they have a short bloom time and they don't bloom until late fall."

Candidates gear up for June school race

Four candidates vying for two seats on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education shared views with voters at a Candidates Forum at the Canton Little Theater Thursday night.

The election is Monday, June 10. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. - 8 p.m.

The Livonia League of Women Voters session was taped by Conti-

mental Cablevision and will be aired Wednesday, May 22 at 9:30 p.m., and again on Friday, May 24 at 6 p.m. Viewers who live in the area required for cable tune into Channel 11. Other cable customers can view the forum on Channel 8.

Trustee Jack Farrow is seeking a second four-year term. Also in the running are Jeff Phillips of Plymouth and Paul Schrauben of Canton, both of whom ran last year.

Political newcomer Elizabeth

Givens of Canton is also running.

In his opening statement, Farrow said he's lived in Plymouth since 1978 and has four children who've gone through, or are enrolled in, Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

"I want my children to live in a better world than I do. I believe better education is the only way to do that. I want to bring the best possible education we can to Plymouth-Canton."

Givens has lived in the communi-

ty since 1981. She has two children who've graduated from Plymouth-Canton, and one who's now a high school freshman. Givens has worked as a teacher's aide and has served as president of the Community School Council.

"When I tell people I'm running, I get three reactions," she said. "People say 'Why bother?' or they say 'I really admire what you do, but I think you're crazy,' or 'Yes, I'm glad

Worshippers remember victims of plane crash

When Donna Rennolds and daughter Kim died Saturday, they left behind a loving family and many good friends.

The two women were among the more than 100 passengers and crew members who died in Saturday's ValuJet plane crash in the Florida Everglades. The Rennolds family lives in Plymouth Township and worships at Geneva Presbyterian Church in Canton, where a prayer service was held Sunday evening.

Many lives were affected by the

crash, said the Rev. Bryan Smith, pastor of the congregation. "I think of Roy Rennolds, for example, who lost both a wife and a daughter."

The family also includes an older son, Chris. Kim Rennolds, an Eastern Michigan University student, was dating Justin Patterson, son of Wayne County Commissioner Bruce Patterson. The Pattersons attended the Sunday prayer service, although Roy and Chris Rennolds did not. Memorial service arrangements were incomplete as of press time.

The trip south was a 21st birthday present for Kim Rennolds. The mother and daughter were return-

ing home when the plane crashed after taking off from Miami's airport. Donna Rennolds was a faculty member at Schoolcraft College.

The women were to return home Friday from their scuba diving trip, but a doctor treating Kim Rennolds' ear infection recommended they delay the return trip.

During the prayer service, Smith spoke of the truth of God's presence and goodness in such times, asking for prayers for Roy and Chris Rennolds, other loved ones, other victims and the rescue workers. "We come here tonight, oh God, trusting in your goodness. We come here, oh

God, with heavy hearts and yet hearts that continue to trust that you are the source of healing redemption."

Smith spoke of Justin Patterson. "We know his heart also is broken this evening," Smith also asked the worshippers, many in tears, for prayers for Donna Rennolds' parents, her sister and other family members.

The loss is felt deeply, the pastor said, but the family members of other victims also feel that pain. They "find themselves struggling this evening under a burden that seems too much to bear."

Grange scene of modern dance

The Plymouth Grange, once home to the local farm community, was the scene of a modern dance show Thursday and Friday.

The show, "Hoe Down," was the first put on by choreographers Kelly Borcherts and Elaine Economou.

Borcherts, 24, said, "Our purpose is just to really have fun and have people exposed to more to this type of performance," she said.

"It's not jazz dance, it's not ballet, it's not tap, the best way in laymen's terms to describe it is a blend," Borcherts said.

The performance included two solo performances, one by Borcherts and one by Economou; a duet, and a trio performance with Borcherts and Eastern Michigan Uni-

versity dance students Kelly Garbacik and Carrie Trinka.

A Northville native, Borcherts said, "I danced pretty much all my life, but when I wanted to be this prima ballerina in high school they told me I was too tall, I'm 6 feet," she said.

In college, she studied graphic design, then decided to keep studying dance. She earned a bachelor's degree at Columbia College in Chicago.

Why the attraction to modern dance? "I think it was just my instructors, they had a strong will to make everyone go out and be an artist, we were provoked to go out in the community and start our own dance pro-

grams," Borcherts said.

"I was taught how to be an artist, how to be self critical, and the ideas just started to flow," she said.

After moving to Plymouth last summer, Borcherts has taught dance at the Plymouth YMCA which uses the Grange building at 273 S. Union for class space. That sparked the idea to put on a dance show at the Grange.

The Grange setting sparked the "Hoe Down" theme. "Grange means gathering, a bunch of farmers got together there, we thought 'Hoe Down' had a certain fun sound to it," Borcherts said.

added. Mary Brooks is on the board of directors of the Michigan Treasurer's Association.

Supervisor Keen McCarthy said: "There is a concern that the other taxing units, if they have had to borrow money because they didn't receive their taxes in a timely fashion, they have a cost to borrow that money."

"One of the questions we have for the attorney is what is the

treasurer's responsibility and what is the board's responsibility under the charter," McCarthy said.

The issue was raised by trustees at their meeting Tuesday at Plymouth Township Hall. Township Attorney Tim Cronin was directed to report back to trustees at a study session May 23, McCarthy said.

McCarthy said Brooks has discussed the management letter

with the auditor.

She said other taxing authorities have not complained to the township about late payments. "I haven't gotten anything officially, no," McCarthy said, but added that an outside government official once brought the matter up informally.

By law, payments must generally be deposited in 10 days. The auditors said that to make more

timely payments, the treasurer's office should adopt a lock-box system.

Under that type of system, tax or water bills would be addressed to a post office box, not to the township hall as they are currently. The bank would pick up bills mailed to the address, mark checks as received and deposit them, then send a record to the township.

"The reason that we picked it is it comes in all kinds of different colors and sizes, it's very easy to grow and very hardy," Dwyer said. "It's a perennial, so as a city flower it's a cost savings to the city and residents, and it grows in just about any kind of soil, shade or sun."

"Initially the committee sought to tie the

official flower to our sister city, Plymouth, England," Stone said. But the British city has no official flower.

Next, they contacted Plymouth, Mass. Their flower is the Mayflower.

"As this is more of a bush and difficult to grow, the committee did not feel it would be

appropriate for our flower," Stone said.

The city's Downtown Development Authority has stated its support for the beautification committee's effort and will incorporate the official city flower into the planter boxes and banners displayed on light poles downtown.

Parental law draws reaction

Plymouth and Canton's two local judges say they understand why communities want to enact laws to force parents to reign in wayward youth.

"I think it was inevitable it was going to move this way," said 35th District Court Judge Ron Lowe.

"People aren't stepping up to their responsibilities on their own, that's why they're trying to find ways to legislate responsibility. I'm not opposed to the concept of parents being responsible for their children," Lowe said.

"I don't think it's a bad idea; some of those ordinances have been on the law for years," said District Judge John MacDonald.

He recalled trying a case sparked by youths breaking some school windows. MacDonald ordered the parents to pay \$1,500.

"The concept of parental responsibility in the courts is not a new one," he said.

The judges' comments came last week as a jury in St. Clair Shores found two parents guilty of violating a city ordinance that requires parents to be responsible for their child's criminal behavior. They were ordered to pay \$2,200 in fines and court costs.

The case, the first tried under a 2-year-old ordinance, won national attention and was shown on the national cable TV network Court TV, which also broadcast the O.J. Simpson trial.

Should authorities consider jail time for parents who don't meet their responsibility to control their children?

"I guess it depends on how bad the situation was," MacDonald said. "If the parent just ignored the situation and just looked the other way perhaps you'd consider jail time. But I don't think you're responsible for every act your child does."

MacDonald added that the problem may follow the trend toward both parents working outside the home, which leaves children to fend for themselves.

"I see young people here who are clearly uncontrollable," Lowe said.

Asked if he'd ever consider jail time for negligent parents, he said: "Everything's going to have to turn on its own facts. Generally speaking, I would be hard put to articulate a set of facts where jailing those people would be a benefit to society."

"The only thing I can think of, is if you did it to set a high publicity example of what could happen if you don't step up to your responsibilities," Lowe said.

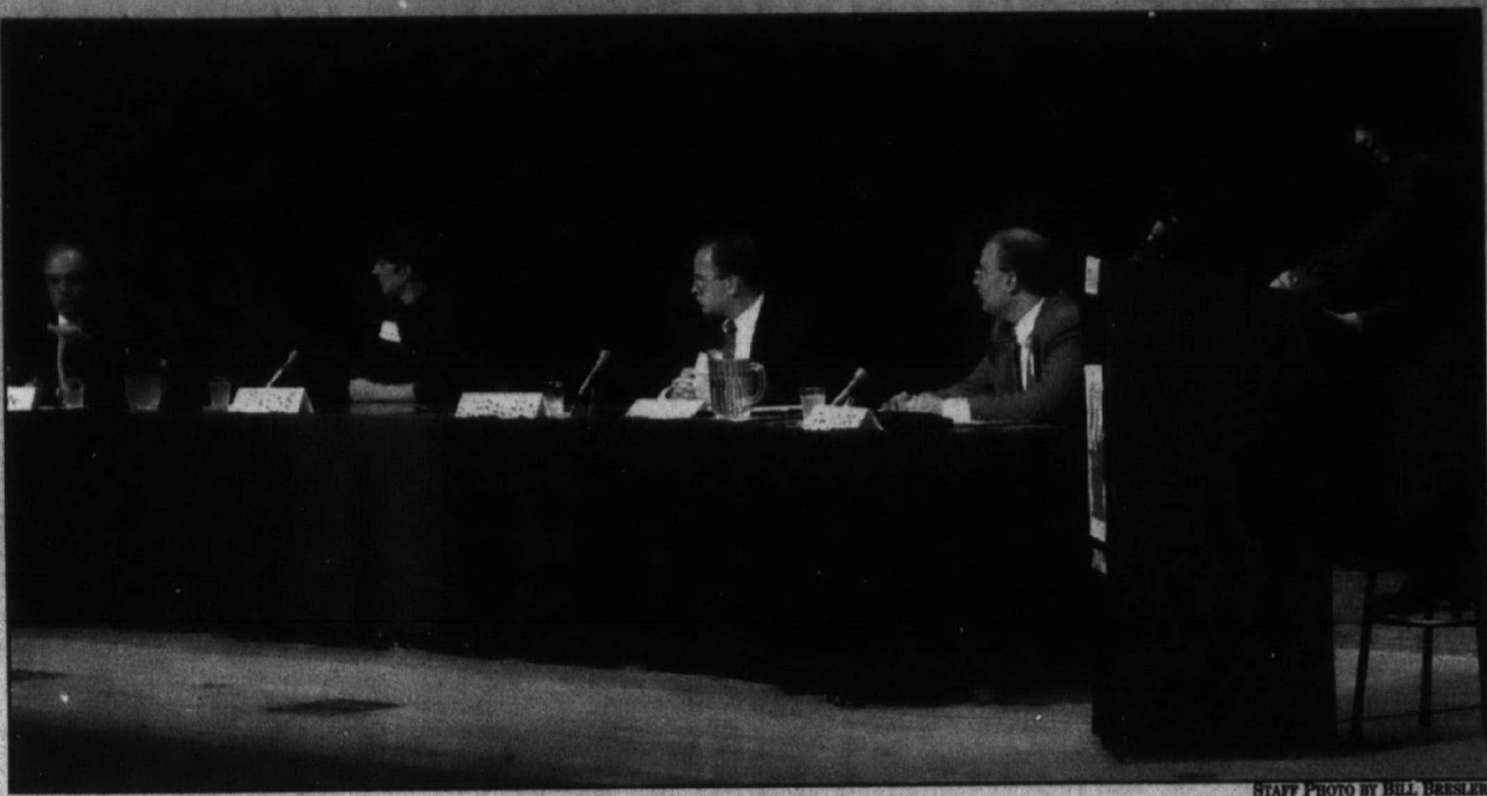
"Society's struggling to get people to accept responsibility for their actions or inactions," he added. "I would like to think there are other ways (outside the courts) to bring back responsibility."

"It's a sign as to how society has deteriorated that they're looking at some way to force change," Lowe added. "You can't always legislate that."

you are running; you have been inside schools and know the administrators, teachers, and kids."

Schrauben has lived in Canton for six years and is a stay-at-home parent. He serves on the school district's citizens' advisory finance committee, and on the education sub-committee of the Community Development Committee of the Canton Chamber of Commerce. He also attends school board meetings regularly.

"I'm here because I believe I can make a difference, given my educational, professional and financial background. What I'd like to bring to the board is planning," he said.

Phillips has been in the district for 11 years and has three children; the oldest of whom is in third grade. He's served on several elementary school committees and others about reproductive health, and attends board meetings regularly.

"I think it's sad there are so few people

at meetings, and sad that there is so little documentation of what we are doing in the district. I want to take a chance at fixing that," he said.

Candidates were asked about the district's hiring of an athletic director for \$80,000.

Farrow said he approved the action. "One of the most important things we teach is hard work, cooperation with others and planning. I know of no better way to do this than through teams working together, planning and achieving success. Sports teaches lessons that aren't regularly taught in academics."

Givens said: "We have a pay schedule,

and this isn't out of line with what we pay our administrators. It's part of learning. Learning doesn't take place just in the classroom. We aren't paying everyone \$80,000, but we need to pay someone to run the department. Education takes place in many, many different ways."

Said Schrauben: "The question to me comes down to did we complete the necessary analysis? Maybe it's appropriate, maybe it isn't. If it's commensurate with other administrators, then it's fair. But if we are paying \$80,000 just because the last person made that much, it's not fair. If we are making athletics more important than academics, then I don't think that is right."

Phillips said, "Athletics is important, but most of the time what they are learning is reinforcement of what they are taught in the home. Maybe it would be better to pay him \$60,000 and not cut football. It's going to come down to prioritizing what is important and what isn't."

Paving project approved

A \$1.9 million project to pave portions of Ridge and Powell roads will get underway in June and be finished in October.

Plymouth Township trustees approved the project, which was sought by nearby residents. Of property owners of the 377 lots with frontage on the affected roadways, 85 percent signed petitions stating their desire for the paving project, for which they'll be assessed by property frontage.







Murray says Rouge pollution needs local action

Problems with Rouge River pollution should be dealt with by the local communities, not regionally, according to James Murray, director of Wayne County's Department of Environment.

Murray said he differs with U.S. District Court Judge John Feikens who is telling officials to solve the problem regionally.

An informational hearing was held Tuesday in U.S. District Court in Detroit about the water quality in the Rouge River. A suit dating back to the '70s has resulted in Feikens taking jurisdiction in getting communities to comply with federal clean water regulations.

On Friday, Murray presented members of the Conference of Western Wayne, a consortium of western Wayne County communities, with an overview of Rouge

River pollution.

The county executive has always argued that a community's problem is its own problem and not to be shared with other communities, Murray said.

The city of Detroit put the cost of Combined Sewer Overflow control on bills of payers in the entire system, Murray said. "We argued with them strenuously to give us one legal reason that gives you the ability to do this," Murray said. The charge was removed from bills.

Money is a major factor in cleaning up the waterways. The federal government is no longer funding 80 percent for cleanup, Murray said, even though the federal Clean Water Act of 1972 made cleaning up the waterways a goal.

Since that time communities have been required to control their combined sewer overflows.

By 2005 the problem of CSOs will be solved, he said.

The National Wet Weather Demonstration Project was begun when \$288 million in federal money was awarded to the Detroit Metro area to study and deal with pollution of an urban waterway. About 95 percent of that money is going to construction of CSO controls, he said.

But besides the CSOs, there

are other types of pollution, Murray said. Storm water flows are also causing significant problems, he said.

Murray pointed out the cleanup proposals by the Department of Environmental Quality would have cost \$2.5 billion, but a compromise was reached costing about \$800 million.

But now the cost of dealing with storm water runoff may be

even higher and decisions will need to be made on how much should be spent to control storm water, Murray said.

High pollution levels in dry weather are more unacceptable than storm water problems, he said.

"Don't we have to know what we want to do?" Thomas Yack, Canton Township supervisor, said. "How clean is clean?" he

said, echoing a sentiment that has been raised in the district court hearings. "I think this kind of debate needs to be held all over the country."

The next informational hearing in Feikens' courtroom is scheduled for June 11. DEQ and EPA officials will present information on what will be required of local communities, Murray said.

With the grand opening of Somerset Collection North in Troy just three months away, time-pressed developer Nate Forbes, took a few moments to discuss the tri-level shopping center and its impact on the community with Malls & Mainstreets editor Susan DeMaggio.

M&M: What stores are opening at Somerset Collection North?

Forbes: We always intended the north mall to round-out and complement the higher-end exclusive shops on the south side and fill all the category voids. On the first level there will be all the sit down restaurants, valet parking operations, the promotions stage, fountains, young-attitude apparel shops.

On the second level, the skywalk joins both sides of the shopping center by a covered, climate-controlled bridge with two automated walkways moving in opposite directions and a eight-foot wide stationary pedestrian path. The retail mix features serious shopping - home and lifestyle stores, some hardgoods.

The third level has the Peacock Food Cafe, and dozens of entertainment retailers with merchandise for hobbyists, kids, weekend athletes. It's the family level.

M&M: Are all available leases signed?

Forbes: We're 95-percent leased and after the International Council of Shopping Centers convention in Las Vegas this week, we'll be 100-percent leased. We have five people working on leasing this new center, including my brother David. I'm proud to report that in the Somerset Collection, 62-percent of the retailers are exclusive to Michigan and in Somerset North, 35-percent of the retailers will be exclusive to this market.

We've got some retailers moving from the south end to the north, and others who want to be a presence in

both ends.

M&M: What's been the most challenging aspect of opening Somerset North?

Forbes: (Laughing) Getting each end of the skywalk to meet in the middle. No. Just kidding. It's been rough arranging leases in a difficult retail environment. We've had to work hard to make the economics work.

Also, this long, cold winter has been bad for construction. We've only been in the ground 15 months. We've got a lot of detail and exterior work to finish. That's the nature of our shopping centers. We use a lot of high end finishes.

M&M: When you drive up to the corner of Big Beaver and Coolidge and see this gigantic retail complex, how do you feel knowing you've had a hand in the formation?

Forbes: Wow. I guess I feel a sense of pride, accomplishment. We've

brought a national presence of retailers to the development that has been missing in the Detroit market. Forbes-Cohen has been working on Somerset North since becoming involved in the development with Sam Frankel in 1990. But, building the center is only a part of the success. It's got to be managed well, marketed well, leased properly. We want to keep the exclusivity of the stores which have sales per square foot, three or four times higher than the national average.

M&M: You mentioned the difficult retail climate. Is there room for another shopping center in metro Detroit? And will the Somerset Collection take business away from nearby shopping centers like Oakland Mall and downtown Birmingham?

Forbes: We're all fighting for people's free time. People don't think,

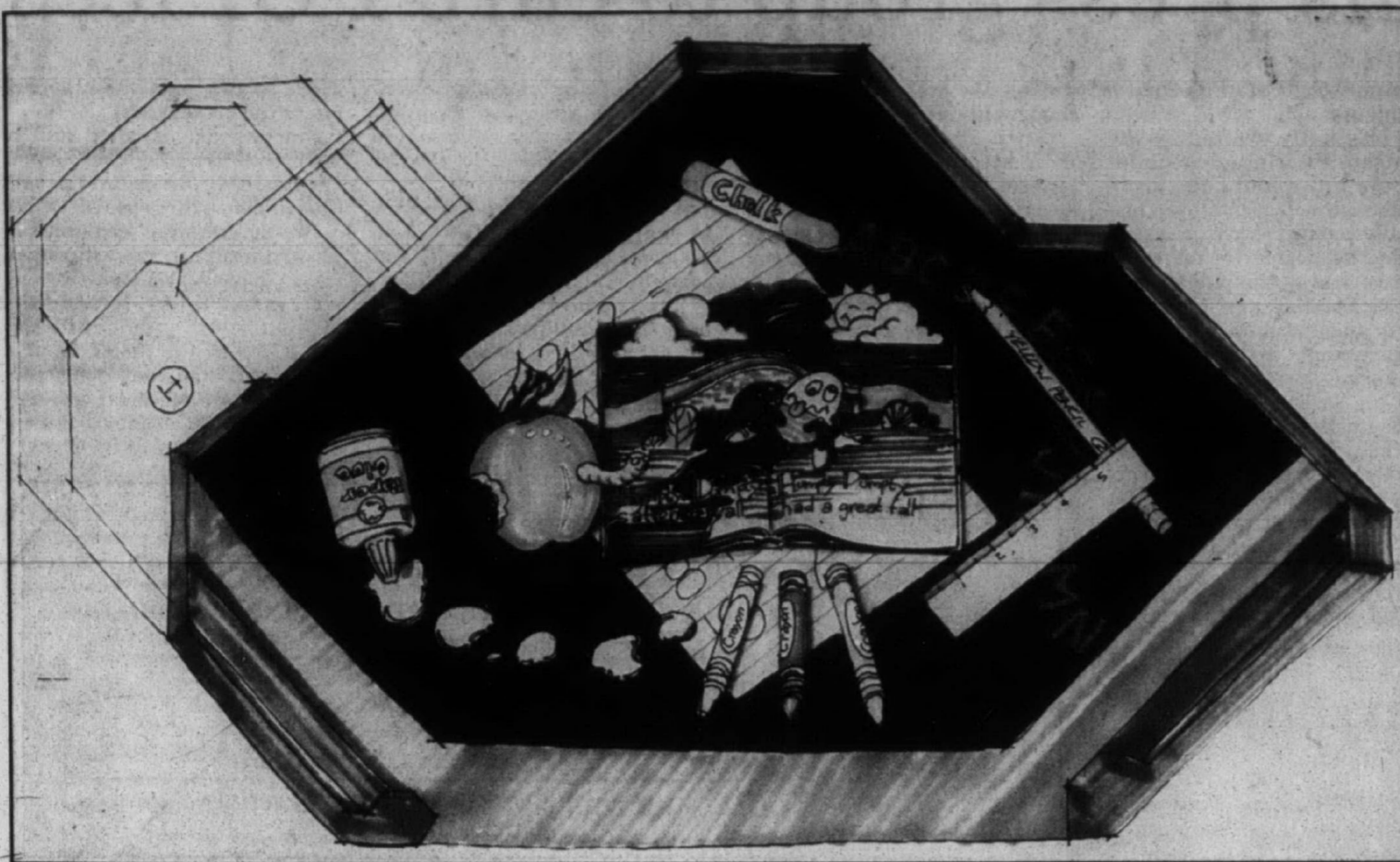

"let's go shopping," when they have leisure hours. Instead they cocoon, spend time at home, work on their personal fitness and well being. It's back-to-basics. But, with all the amenities and world class retailers we've brought to Somerset, people will have a reason to say, "It feels good to be here."

The other centers must work at being distinct as well. There are many Detroit-area shopping centers doing well; doing things differently and successfully. Birmingham, once it discovers its niche as a downtown and makes the most of that niche, will grow stronger over time. Birmingham should expand its park, encourage boutique and gallery shop owners, and provide entertainment venues.

Birmingham can't compete with Somerset. We just have such a broader retail reach. But, the relationship is synergistic. The two areas are just two-and-a-half miles apart.

M&M: You've brought Neiman Marcus, Barney's New York, Tiffany's and Nordstrom to Detroit, who did you miss? Who didn't

come? Bloomingdales?

Forbes: Hmm. A good question. But, outside of a few world travelers, who really knows Bloomingdales? Our local focus groups showed a high comfort level with Hudson's. Hudson's is a great pull as a compliment to Nordstrom.

M&M: Discuss day-to-day operations at the twin centers. Will each have different managements?

Forbes: The Somerset Collection is one entity with two sides, the north and south. Tom Miles will continue to be general manager. Sally Victor will market both sides. We've had to add a layer of management positions due to the expanded size of the operation, but the staff is essentially the same. Once the center opens, 3,000 new retail jobs will be created.

M&M: When shoppers think, Somerset, they think expensive. Many believe they'll be paying for the new center with higher prices for its merchandise.

Forbes: That's absolutely false. Somerset retailers will enjoy a high volume of sales and to get these sales they will need competitive prices. I think that's what you'll find at Somerset.

M&M: What's next for Forbes-Cohen? Where do you go from here?

Forbes: We're looking at niche-type developments, unique opportunities to provide market-places for communities across the country. The dynamics just don't exist anywhere right now for developing large shopping centers.

M&M: Your father, Sid Forbes, and his partner, Morry Cohen, are developers with many office and retail centers. How old are you, and do you like the work?

Forbes: I'm 34. I grew up in

Franklin, married a Huntington Woods native, Cathy, and we have one child and a dog named Neiman, bought on the day Neiman Marcus opened at Somerset. We live in Bloomfield Hills. I've been in this business since I was 13, tagging along with my dad to property reviews and tenant meetings. I love the work. But, I must add that the company's success is due to a collection of effort from a lot of people. Becky Maccardini, operations manager, our CFO, our director of leasing, they have the expertise that coupled with our expectation levels, guarantees success. Our high bar is so high. We want our centers to have longevity, continuity in the community that change with lifestyle and logistics.

M&M: Nate, where do you shop?

Forbes: The Somerset Collection, of course. I buy my suits from Neiman Marcus and Barney's.

State chamber joins press group to curb FOI fees

The State Chamber of Commerce joined the Michigan Press Association to rescue the Freedom of Information Act from high fees sought by county governments.

"Many state agencies are opening up mountains of information with existing technology," said Richard Studley, senior vice president of the chamber and a Grand Ledge councilman, "but local government is moving in the opposite direction - limited access."

"In a few years, we could end up with two classes of citizens: one, with resources, would have access to information; the other, with limited resources, would have little access," Studley told the House Local Government

Committee May 9 in Lansing.

"We stand four-square with Studley," added Bruce McIntyre, representing the Michigan Press Association and chairman of Great Lakes Media.

Rep. Robert Brackenridge, R-St. Joseph, took the advice by splitting up a crippling bill sought by the Michigan Association of Counties into two:

- House Bill 5832 - "Enhanced access," a separate bill allowing counties to recover costs of providing land and court records to such business customers as developers and engineers. Oakland County is in the forefront of this movement, spurred by the 125-member Business Roundtable. Ameritech, the telephone company, hopes to be the contracted vendor.

- House Bill 5726, minor

amendments to the Freedom of Information Act.

As originally drafted by the Michigan Association of Counties, the bill would have given government copyrights over historically public records and narrowed the definition of what could be sold to the public. Critics like Studley and McIntyre said it amounted to a "revenue enhancement" bill, burdening both business and individuals.

On the "enhanced access" bill, Studley asked the panel to narrow the definition of cost recovery to eliminate heating, overhead and maintenance - just allow government to recover the cost of computer hardware and software.

Studley asked the panel to require an annual review of costs because "we expect the cost to

decline. We are seeing dramatic changes in technology."

Dawn Phillips, Bloomfield Hills attorney who is general counsel for the Michigan Press Association and many individual newspapers, asked for even narrower definitions of costs that government could charge. Her examples:

- FOIA allows government to make a search charge equal to the wage of the lowest-paid clerical employee. House Bill 5726 allows a charge for the lowest-

paid employee "capable of complying with a request" for information. That, she said, would allow government to charge attorney's fees.

- HB 5726 allows government to charge rental fees of \$25 to \$100 an hour for public use of computers.

"I'm troubled at the \$100 an hour fee," Phillips said. "It's one thing if I bill it to my clients, another if I write a personal check. The cost of receiving information has been rising."

We're getting bills of \$50 to \$75 under the present act."

Brackenridge assigned staff to work with the groups on further amendments. Brackenridge said the panel has three goals:

- "We did not want local units of government to use enhanced access to block FOIA."

- "It is our intent to wide the availability of public information. We agree it should be at a reasonable cost, but not a revenue vehicle for local government."

SMART routes expand, more changes planned to improve service - Kaufman

Things at SMART are great, and the routes are starting to reflect the "reality of the tri-county area," according to Richard Kaufman, general manager of the regional bus system.

Kaufman made his remarks before the monthly meeting of the Conference of Western Wayne, a consortium of western Wayne County municipalities, which met in Huron Township Friday.

Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation began making route changes last year. On Dec. 1, the first changes began including a route through Livonia to Laurel Park Place and Schoolcraft College. On April 1, the second phase began with a route on Telegraph Road, Kaufman said.

It's the first time in the history of public transportation that there's been a route on Telegraph, he said. "It boggles my mind that we didn't have one before," said Kaufman, who left a circuit court judgeship in January to take over the job at SMART from Deputy Wayne County CEO Michael Duggan, who worked as interim general manager and spearheaded a successful millage campaign to fund SMART.

Next on the agenda is a plan to extend the bus routes to West Bloomfield, which voted in mid-March to rejoin the SMART system, Kaufman said.

SMART is also looking at putting more community transit on the road at no extra cost, with community-based service plans for partnership between communities and SMART, Kaufman

said. In response to a question about SMART working with the Detroit Department of Transportation and the possibility of a regional bus system, Kaufman said DDOT and SMART could clearly work together.

"I see five to 10 areas where DDOT and SMART can do things together to save money," he said.

But as for the next step, a truly regional bus system, "in my opinion we're a long way from that," he said.

Carrying the torch

The Olympic Torch relay runners will be coming through western Wayne County and volunteers are sought to help out along the way.

On June 8 and 9, the relay will pass through Michigan, including Redford Township, on its 84-day trek across country. The trek began on April 27 in Los Angeles and will end up in Atlanta for the start of the summer Olympic games there.

Doris Hester of Ford Motor Co., and a member of the Torch Relay Steering Committee, told Conference of Western Wayne members that volunteers are needed to prepare the way for runners and to help plan the event.

Some 10,000 Americans will participate as torch bearers, including 80 people carrying the torch through southeast Michigan.

Hearing postponed

The hearing date for the lawsuit over the 911 tax on phone bills has been postponed until June 21. It was originally scheduled for May 3.

The lawsuit, which is scheduled to go before Circuit Court Judge Andrea Ferrara, was filed by the Wayne County Taxpayers Association against Wayne County. Earlier this year, the Conference of Western Wayne, a consortium of western Wayne County municipalities, voted to enter the case on the side of Wayne County. The Downriver Community Conference also voted to enter the case.

The taxpayers association contends the 911 charge is an illegal tax.

The CWW and DCC use the money generated by the tax to fund improvements to 911 emergency systems.

The CWW and DCC have filed for a summary disposition in the case, according to Daniel P. Gilmartin, executive director of the CWW.

Firefighter testing

Conference of Western Wayne members Friday approved a plan to negotiate a contract with Schoolcraft College for a firefighter candidate testing program.

CWW received five bids to give the testing. Two were late, one was incomplete and another raised concerns about cost, according to Marsha Bianconi, of

the CWW.

Schoolcraft, however, has a low price, past experience and all the necessary equipment in place, according to Bianconi.

CWW member municipalities that choose to use the program will be able to draw from a pool of people who have passed the CWW's firefighter testing. Applicants will pay for the test, which will include written and physical testing, and Schoolcraft will give the test four times a year, Bianconi said.

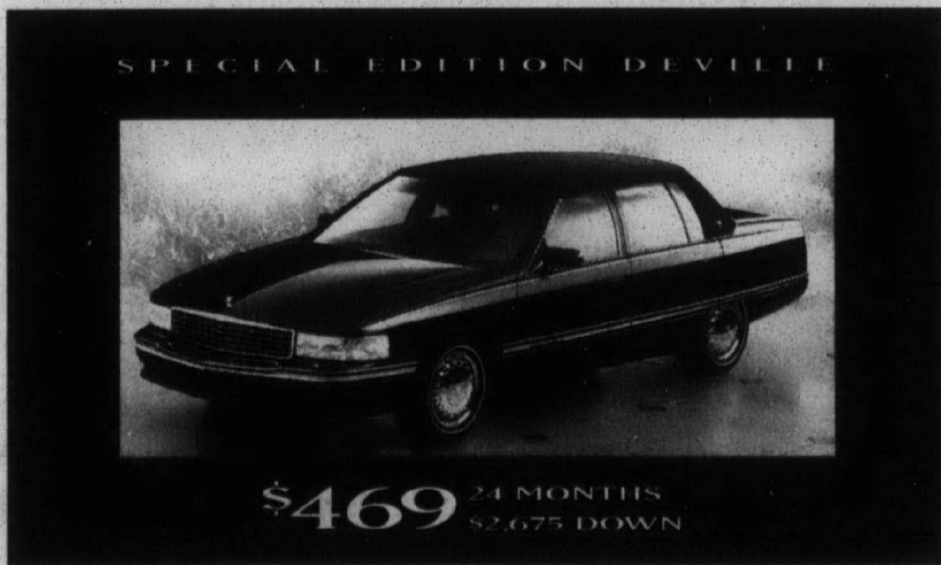

Sweet-tart rhubarb springtime delight

If there was one plant that always flourished in the Janes Gang garden it was rhubarb. Like the chives and wild leeks that reappear every year, no matter what I do to the garden, the rhubarb remains ever faithful.

Rhubarb is an odd plant. Its roots are touted as being medicinal, the stalks make a pie that tickles your taste buds, and the leaves are so high in oxalic acid that they can kill. How can something so good, so tasty, so beneficial, be so deadly?

Grandma Janes (we called her "mimmi") was a champion at canning rhubarb, and concocting all sorts of jams, jellies and sauces. Of course, when you're 10 years old, and sent over to grandmas on your Schwinn to fetch a jar from the cellar, it wasn't appreciated. To this day, I can vividly remember standing at her side, watching her "put up" the late spring bounty of rhubarb.

Grow your own

"The Joy of Cooking" claims that rhubarb is at its best when grown in a hothouse setting because "when grown under wraps, the stems are more tender and sweeter than those grown in a garden." Not being one to argue with one of the best selling cookbooks of all time, I would add that home-grown rhubarb is best when picked early. When allowed to mature, the stems get a bit rubbery, and necessitate peeling before cooking. If you happen to come across some rhubarb later in the season, a handy dandy vegetable peeler used to remove just the outer layer of skin will give you succulent rhubarb that can be cooked or frozen for use later in the season. If you are thinking about heading out to a greenhouse in search of rhubarb plants, you will really have to search because most of the rhubarb plants come from mail order supply houses. After planting they need at least a full year in the ground before they begin to produce. Your best bet, of course, is to locate an already prolific plant and in the spring or fall, divide the roots.

Rhubarb is one of the fruits that work best in conjunction with other fruits, especially those higher in sugar and sweetening power which offset rhubarb's tartness.

Purists can cut rhubarb into 1-inch chunks and place in a heavy saucpan and just lightly sprinkle with water. Cover and bring the pot to a full steam, then reduce the heat to a simmer, shaking the pot frequently until the chunks are tender enough and can be pierced with a fork. Because rhubarb is a tart fruit, a generous sprinkling of sugar during the light steaming wouldn't hurt. As the sugar melts with the excess moisture, the rhubarb almost "poaches" in this liquid and the final product is quite delectable. Although I have the Janes Gang heritage, I have, in all honesty, only cooked rhubarb in one way, that being in a simple pie. More on that to follow.

Freezing

"The Farm Journal of Freezing and Canning" says that rhubarb lends itself well to just that. Canning and freezing should be done as soon after cutting as possible for optimum flavor and vitamin content. Although I have yet to attempt the canning of the delectable stalk, I have in the past frozen the spears. This is done by washing the spears, cutting them into large chunks and then by dousing them into a pot of boiling water for about 30 seconds. The rhubarb is then drained, patted dry and placed in freezer bags, labeled and frozen for later use.

In the Janes Gang garden, we have but one lonely rhubarb plant. It thrives well in deep, well drained soil. Although all the garden books claim that rhubarb needs "full" sun, our lonely bush might be lucky enough to get only 3-4 hours of sun because of the large shade tree. This sole plant produces enough rhubarb throughout the season to easily make a dozen or so pies with enough left over for a half dozen frozen packages for fall and winter use.

I would be remiss in my duties as a reporter not to mention my favorite rhubarb recipe and from whence it came. A dear friend from Plymouth, Mary Lou Richenbach-Stone who once took the daring initiative to prepare her rhubarb pie for me, has stumbled upon a winning recipe by my standards. If I've made this pie once, I've made it a hundred times; it's that good! M.L.'s original hand-written recipe holds a coveted spot in my recipe box. You won't believe how easy it is, yet how good it tastes. Thanks again Mary Lou!

Pair eggs, veggies for dinner

Years ago, when Mom said, "Eat your vegetables," she was probably referring to a small dab of overcooked peas or stringy green beans on your plate along with some very buttery mashed potatoes. Today, when nutrition professionals remind us to eat more vegetables, they'd prefer we eat them raw or crisp-tender without big dollops of fat... and they mean three to five 1/2 to 1-cup servings a day!

For many of us, that's a tall order. But, it's not as hard as it may seem to set your diet right. You can add vegetables to already favorite foods—using them as an omelet filling, for example. Or, you can plan to serve vegetable main dishes occasionally. Just be sure to include a good protein source during the day.

With the exception of nuts and cooked dry beans and peas, the protein in vegetables is incomplete protein, lacking in some of the protein building blocks that your body can't make. Once you begin to include more and more plant foods in your menus, you can try to mix and match them to make their protein complete. But, even many vegetarians find it much easier to simply include complete protein sources such as eggs or milk products in their diets.

It's particularly easy to incorporate eggs into vegetable entrees, and there's no better time than May, which is National Egg

Month. You can serve eggs over a bed of vegetables, blanket them in a pureed-vegetable sauce or mix them with milk to make a vegetable-filled quiche, strata or frittata. With their appetite appeal and unassuming flavor, eggs can enhance vegetable dishes without overpowering them. As a bonus, most egg dishes are quick and easy to cook.

For good balance, in addition to some of the highest quality protein available, nutrient-dense eggs provide varying amounts of some of the vitamins and minerals that are not abundant in vegetable foods. If you use no-fat cooking methods, each large egg

will cost you only 75 calories and 5 grams of fat, most of which is unsaturated.

"Eggs are one of the most nutritious and versatile foods available," said Lois Thieleke of Birmingham, an Extension Home Economist for the Michigan State University Extension, Oakland County. "The white contains mostly water with some proteins, while the yolk contains fat, cholesterol, protein, vitamins and minerals."

Food economists at the American Egg Board recommends storing eggs in their carton on an inside shelf. Repeated opening and closing of the door causes

temperature fluctuations and can result in breakage. The egg carton also helps keep the eggs from picking up odors and flavors from other foods in your refrigerator.

"Eggs fresh, in shell, will keep three weeks in the refrigerator. Eggs cannot be frozen in their shells" said Thieleke. "Hard-cooked egg whites become tough if frozen. Hard-cooked yolks and raw whole eggs, whites and yolks can be frozen for use later. The thawed product may be somewhat thicker than a fresh egg. Thaw in the refrigerator. Raw yolks and whites can be stored 2-4 days in the refrigerator, 1 year in the freezer. Store hard-cooked eggs 1 week in the refrigerator. Opened cartons of liquid pasteurized eggs or egg substitutes will keep three days in the refrigerator, but don't freeze. Unopened cartons can be stored 10 days in the refrigerator and 1 year in the freezer."

Home economist Sylvia Treitman, who answers the food and nutrition hotline for the MSU Extension, Oakland County, adds — "cook eggs thoroughly — yolk and white both should be firm. Recipes that use raw eggs should not be used because salmonella bacteria may be present, and cause food poisoning. Substitute pasteurized egg products for fresh eggs in recipes. Use dried egg white powder in place of fresh egg whites for royal icings, meringues or chiffon pies."

V-EGG-IE-LICIOUS IDEAS

- If you're not accustomed to having lots of fibrous vegetables in your diet, increase your intake slowly to give your body time to adjust to more roughage.
- To get the most vitamins, minerals and fiber from vegetables, leave the skins on whenever possible and eat them raw or cook them lightly. If you prefer long-cooked vegetables, try to use the cooking liquid as part of the liquid in the recipe or save it to use as the base for homemade soup so the vitamins don't go down the drain.
- To keep fat down, steam your vegetables in a nonstick pan coated with cooking spray rather than sauteing them. Instead of fatty toppings, look to herbs, spices, vinegar, mustard, salsa and similar condiments for seasoning.
- For a new taste treat out of leftovers, steam or microwave leftover rice and vegetables until they're heated throughout. Top with a poached egg and pizza sauce.
- Invent your own skillet supper. Steam shredded, chopped or sliced vegetables in a nonstick pan coated with cooking spray. Drain, if necessary. Beat eggs with milk and herbs, pour over the vegetables and scramble until there's no trace of liquid egg in the pan.
- Layer fresh sliced vegetables, crisp greens and hard-cooked eggs on a French or Kaiser roll and top with your favorite flavor of low- or no-fat salad dressing.

Spontaneous meals with grilled chops

Grilling — a low-fat cooking method that offers great taste — has become an American classic. Grilling brings out the best of these fresh flavors of the season and the savory taste of pork chops.

"Grillers today want versatility, flavor and convenience and the basic pork chop has that," said Anne Roberts a home economist and director of marketing and education for the Michigan Pork Producers Association. "Like the abundant fresh produce of the season, pork chops offers bold taste with little fat."

Roberts recommends four basic tactics for cooking chops — using glazes, salsas, rubs or marinades — to bring out the natural flavor of pork chops without adding fat.

Cook chops following these basic steps:
■ Season the pork chops with the flavorings of your choice. Place chops directly over the heat source and cover with grill hood. Turn chops once for even browning and cook to medium doneness, 6-8 minutes for 3/4-inch thick chop, 8-10 minutes for 1-inch thick chop and 12-16 minutes for 1 1/2-inch thick chop.

■ Pork is best when cooked to medium doneness — it might have a slight blush of pink in the cen-

ter at an internal temperature of 160 degrees F. Touch the center of the chop with tongs — if it's done perfectly, there should be a slight "give."

■ If you're brushing chops with a sauce or glaze, don't sauce too soon. Brush on sauces about 5 minutes before chops are done — this prevents sauces from burning while maximizing flavor.

■ If marinating chops, use excess marinade to baste while grilling, then discard any leftover marinade. Let pork bathe in marinade overnight, or for about 30 minutes before grilling.

■ A sprinkling of fresh herbs including your choice of dill, rosemary, cilantro or tarragon add flavor without fat. Sprinkle fresh herbs on top of chops or even on grilled vegetables to add some punch.

For sizzling side dishes, grill whole or halved fresh vegetables, brushed with olive oil. Grilled corn on the cob, potatoes, sweet onions, sweet potatoes and bell peppers make colorful — and — flavorful — side dishes. 2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
4 eggs

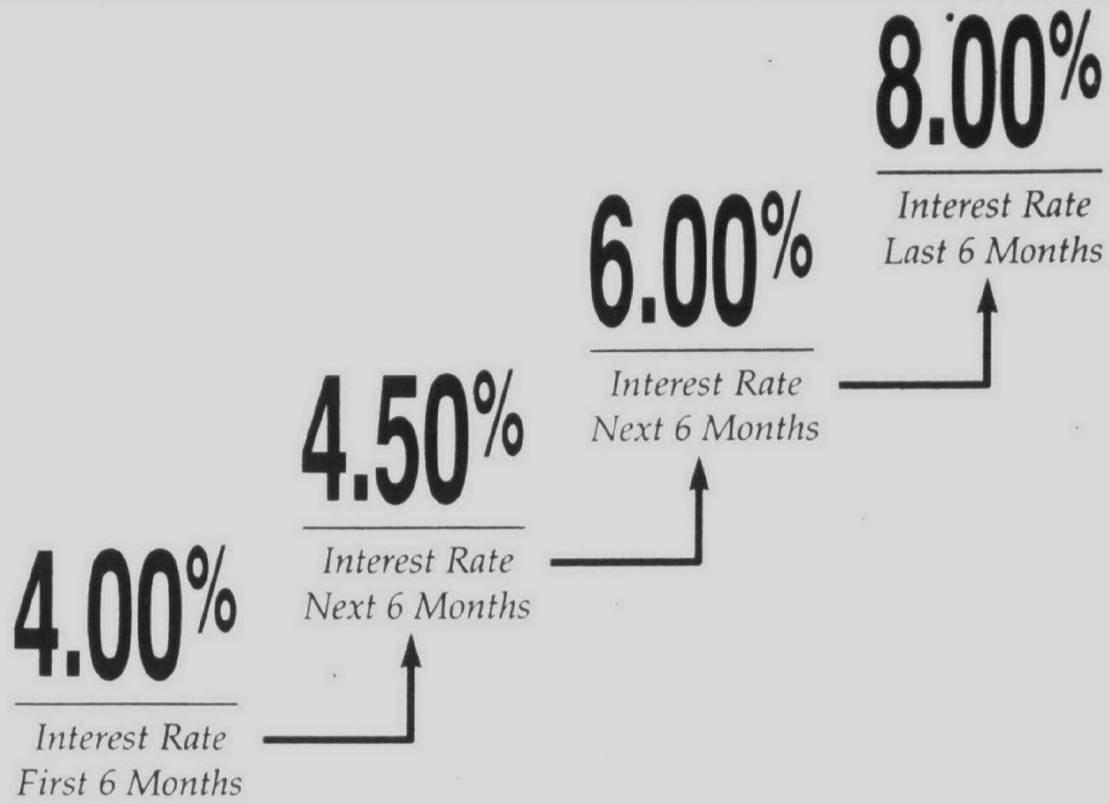

Any of the following glazes can be brushed on pork chops during grilling, or used as "table sauce" for serving alongside chops. If using both as a glaze and table sauce, boil the remaining glaze for 4-5 minutes before serving; serve hot. If using only as a table sauce, stir ingredients together and serve at room temperature; cover and refrigerate any leftovers.

• Ginger-Apricot Glaze

Stir together 1 cup apricot jam, 2 tablespoons lime juice, 1 tablespoon soy sauce, 1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger root. Makes 1 1/4 cups. Brush onto meat on grill during last 5 minutes of cooking time.

• Cranberry Barbecue Glaze

Stir together 1 1/2 cups bottled barbecue sauce and one 16-ounce can whole berry cranberry sauce. Makes 3 cups. Brush onto meat on grill during last 5 minutes of cooking time.

• Honey-Lime Ginger Glaze

Stir together 6 tablespoons honey, 3 tablespoons grated fresh ginger root, 6 tablespoons lime juice, and 3 tablespoons vegetable oil. Use to baste meat throughout cooking time, glazing well before removing from grill. Makes about 2/3 cup, enough for 4 pork chops.

• Pear-Mustard Sauce

In blender container, puree together one 16-ounce can pear halves, drained, 3 tablespoons of

the pear syrup, 1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard, 1 tablespoon cider vinegar, 2 tablespoons honey, a dash of hot pepper sauce and salt and pepper to taste. Makes about 2 cups. Brush onto meat on grill during last 5 minutes of cooking time.

Marvelous Marinades

Marinades are great flavor carriers that enhance any grilled food. Marinating overnight is ideal, although with some strong-flavored marinades, 30 minutes prior to cooking imparts flavor too. Don't overlook bottled marinades at the store, or use your favorite bottled Italian-style salad dressing.

• Coriander-Pepper Marinade

In self-sealing bag, combine 2

crushed garlic cloves, 1 tablespoon ground coriander seed, 1 tablespoon ground black pepper, 1 tablespoon brown sugar and 3 tablespoons soy sauce. Add 4 pork chops to bag, seal, and refrigerate overnight.

• Honey-Garlic Marinade

In self-sealing bag, combine 1/2 cup lemon juice, 1/4 cup honey, 2 tablespoons soy sauce, 1 tablespoon dry sherry and 2 crushed garlic cloves. Add 4 pork chops to bag, seal and refrigerate overnight.

Racing Rubs

Rubs are mixtures of spices and herbs that can create unique flavoring additions when rubbed onto the surface of the meat. Rubs combine with the juices

drawn from the meat and work like a "dry" marinade. Rubs can be applied to meat, covered and refrigerated overnight, as typical for marinades, or applied 10-20 minutes before grilling

• Caribbean Jerk Rub

In jar with tight-fitting lid, shake together 2 tablespoons dried minced onion, 1 tablespoon garlic powder, 4 teaspoons dry thyme leaves, crushed, 2 teaspoons salt, 2 teaspoons ground allspice, 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg, 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon, 1 tablespoon sugar, 2 teaspoons black pepper and 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper. Makes 1/2 cup. Store in jar; use for coating pork chops.

• Cajun Rub

In jar with tight-fitting lid,

shake together 2 tablespoons paprika, 2 teaspoons salt, 2 teaspoons onion powder, 2 teaspoons garlic powder, 2 teaspoons cayenne, 1 1/2 teaspoons ground white pepper, 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper, 1 teaspoon dry thyme leaves and 1 teaspoon oregano leaves. Makes about 1/2 cup. Store in jar; use for coating pork chops.

• Spicy Latin American Rub

In jar with tight-fitting lid, shake together 4 tablespoons each ground cumin and chili powder, 2 tablespoons ground coriander, 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon, 1 tablespoon brown sugar, 2 teaspoons salt, 1 tablespoon red pepper flakes and 2 tablespoons ground black pepper. Makes about 1 cup. Store in jar; use for coating pork chops.

MARY LOU'S RHUBARB PIE

- 4 cups fresh rhubarb
- 5 tablespoons flour
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh ground nutmeg
- 1 small orange rind, grated (about 1 tablespoon)
- 2 tablespoons orange juice
- One prepared pie shell

In a large bowl, combine the rhubarb with the flour and sugar. Toss to coat. Beat the eggs with the nutmeg, grated rind and juice and stir into the rhubarb mixture. Pour into a prepared pie shell and bake at 350 degrees F. for 30-40 minutes. Serves 6.

compote if desired or simply as is, especially with pork, ribs or other house grilled goodies.

POACHED RHUBARB

- 1 pound rhubarb
- 1/4 cup water or sweet wine like Reisling
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- Cinnamon or powdered ginger to taste

Wash and cut the rhubarb into 1

inch pieces. Place in a heavy saucepan and add water or wine. Cover and simmer over low heat until rhubarb can be pierced with a fork, about 30 minutes. Stir in sugar and continue poaching until rhubarb is tender, about 15 additional minutes. To serve: dot with butter or margarine and a light sprinkle of cinnamon or powdered ginger. Serves 4-6.

Asparagus and shrimp salad delightful

For a flavorful springtime salad, combine fresh asparagus with papaya, shrimp and pasta. The salad is served on Boston or bibb lettuce leaves and garnished with lemon twists or wedges and fresh mint.

When shopping, select bright green asparagus with closed, compact, firm tips. If the tips are slightly wilted, freshen them up by soaking them in cold water. To store, keep fresh asparagus cool and moist until you intend to use it.

ASPARAGUS AND SHRIMP SALAD

- 1 pound fresh asparagus
- Boiling water

- 1 medium papaya (about 1 pound), halved, seeded and peeled
- 1-3rd cup light sour cream
- 1/4 cup papaya or mango nectar
- 1 to 1 1/2 tablespoons bottled mango chutney
- Grated peel of 1/2 lemon
- 6 ounces dry fusilli, rotelle or other curly pasta, cooked, rinsed with cold water and drained (about 3 cups cooked)
- 1-3rd pound small shelled and cooked shrimp
- 1/4 cup sliced green onions
- 8 Boston or bibb lettuce leaves

Lemon twists or wedges, for garnish
Fresh mint, for garnish

Trim or break off asparagus spears at tender point; rinse.

In large skillet, in boiling water to cover, cook asparagus until crisp-tender, about 3 to 5 minutes. Do not overcook. Drain and rinse under cold water.

Reserve and chill 12 spears; cut remaining asparagus into 1-inch pieces.

Cut one-half of papaya into 8 to 12 thin lengthwise slices; reserve and chill. Cut remaining half into bite-size pieces.

In large bowl, combine sour

cream, nectar, chutney and lemon peel. Add cooled pasta; mix well. Stir in asparagus and papaya pieces, shrimp and green onions. Chill briefly. To serve, on four individual plates, spoon pasta mixture on lettuce leaves and arrange reserved papaya and asparagus spears. Garnish with lemon twists or wedges and fresh mint, it desired. Makes 4 servings.

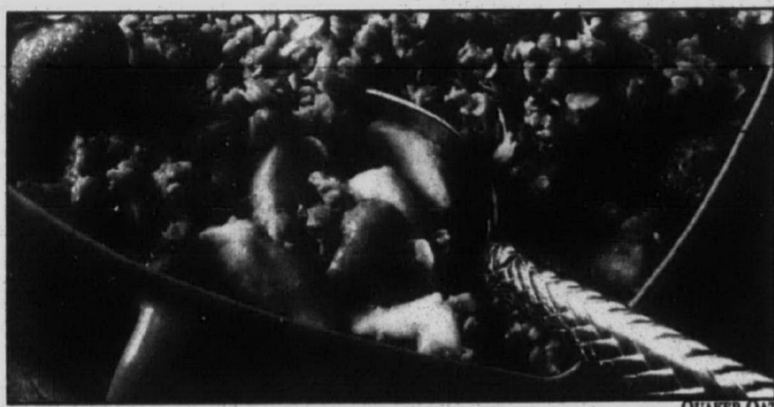

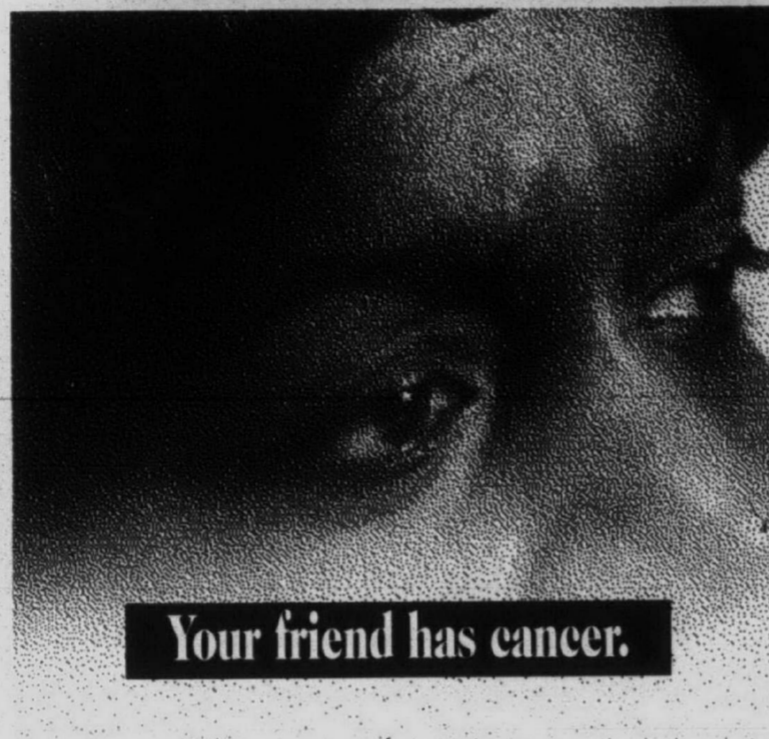

Schoolcraft honors, graduates 900 students

Some 900 students graduated from Schoolcraft College this year, and many of them participated in a graduation ceremony May 4.

Newsman Mort Crim delivered the commencement address. Honorary degree recipients included businessman and civic leader Charles McIlhargey and former Detroit News reporters Eleanor Breitmeyer and Armand

Gebert. Arthur Rockall, Northville artist and friend of the Schoolcraft College Scholarship Fund, received the Distinguished Alumni Award.

In the graduating class, about 550 people received associate's degrees in science, general science or engineering. Popular majors were registered nursing, business administration, applied science, criminal justice and liberal arts.

Some graduates overcame the odds to reach graduation.

Claudia Trudeau of Westland graduated with a degree in occupational therapy. She is now beginning an internship at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak. Her success comes after a period marked by tragedy.

She was a postal worker for 18 years. She was bored with her job, saw no chance for advancement and dabbled in computer and science courses without getting a degree. She thought maybe she would try physical therapy.

In some sense, her decision was made for her in 1992 when

she was in a snowmobile accident which broke her back and shattered her ankle. She was in a body cast for six months and a leg cast for nine months.

"When I got hurt, my job was over," she said. "The post office wouldn't transfer me to a less physically demanding job so I just plain quit. During my recovery I worked closely with physical therapists and occupational therapists. By that time, I decided a career in physical therapy would be too physical, so I chose occupational therapy," she said.

She was accepted in the Schoolcraft program although she hadn't completed the prerequisite courses. She took the needed courses at night and during the summer, sometimes carrying 19 hours.

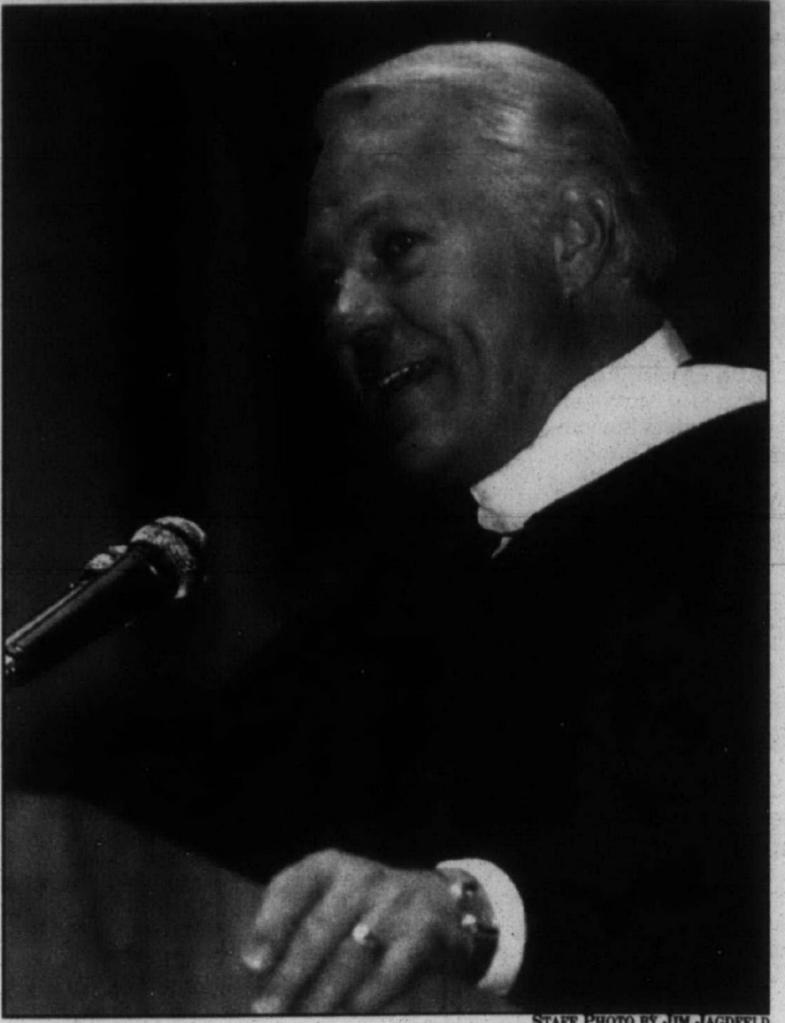
As she worked on her degree, she faced several difficult family crises. Her sister-in-law was one of the people shot when a gunman opened fire in the Dearborn Post Office. Her stepson was shot in the face in an incident at a Taco Bell in Dearborn Heights. Her father was very ill, became a hospice patient and died at home.

"It's been such a rough few years," Trudeau said. "I couldn't have done it without my husband's aid and support."

She also credits her 20 fellow occupational therapy classmates, who she said were a very close class and helped her mentally and physically through the hardest times.

For Michael Thiel, of Livonia, persistence paid off.

Thiel was not a spectacular student in high school. It took him five years to graduate from Livonia Franklin High School with "maybe a 2.0 grade-point average." He tried working for a year after high school, but wasn't enthralled with the job scene.

"I wasn't sure if I would do college or not," he said. "I thought I would soothe into it a little and see what happened."

He took a class to learn study skills, and began taking credit classes in winter 1992 while continuing to work.

"I have about 100 credits," he said. "I had to start at a lower level - start from the bottom and work my way up."

He worked his way up to a 3.975 overall grade-point average. He is accepted at the University of Michigan, has a scholarship if he chooses Wayne State and might opt for Michigan State University.

Thiel plans to get his undergraduate degree in chemistry and apply to medical school to become a family practitioner.

Linda Finney of Westland always loved school and always was a good student. Her life-long dream was to be a teacher.

She enrolled in Eastern Michigan University in 1974, but "I was a child and I thought school was too hard," she said. She dropped out, got married and had three sons. It was only when her husband's job was threatened by a General Motors plant downsizing that she considered returning to college to get that long wished-for degree.

"I was working at Plymouth-Canton Schools as a teacher's assistant and was steered toward Schoolcraft," she said. "A teacher there said to go to the Women's Resource Center. They took me in, and I owe everything to them."

Finney found it took a year to relearn the art of studying after 22 years of "doing housework and reading Better Homes and Gardens."

Her children, she discovered, were a great help. "Homework time was 7 p.m. for the boys, so I started joining them at the table," she said. "They came in handy. As I drove them to soccer of basketball, they had to quiz me on my assignments."

'Great White Hype' worth checking out

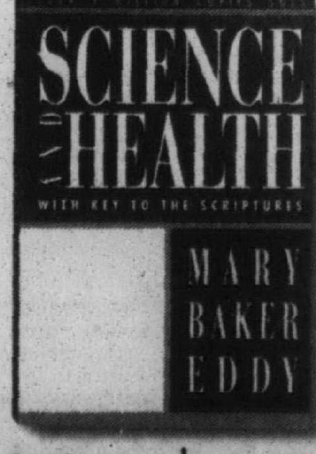

The Raiders didn't have any let-downs and blanked the Chiefs in a Western Lakes Activities Association crossover contest at Canton.

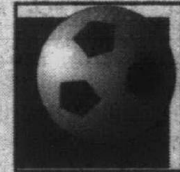
"I knew we were capable of this kind of game," Brubaker said. "They played it like they know how to play it."

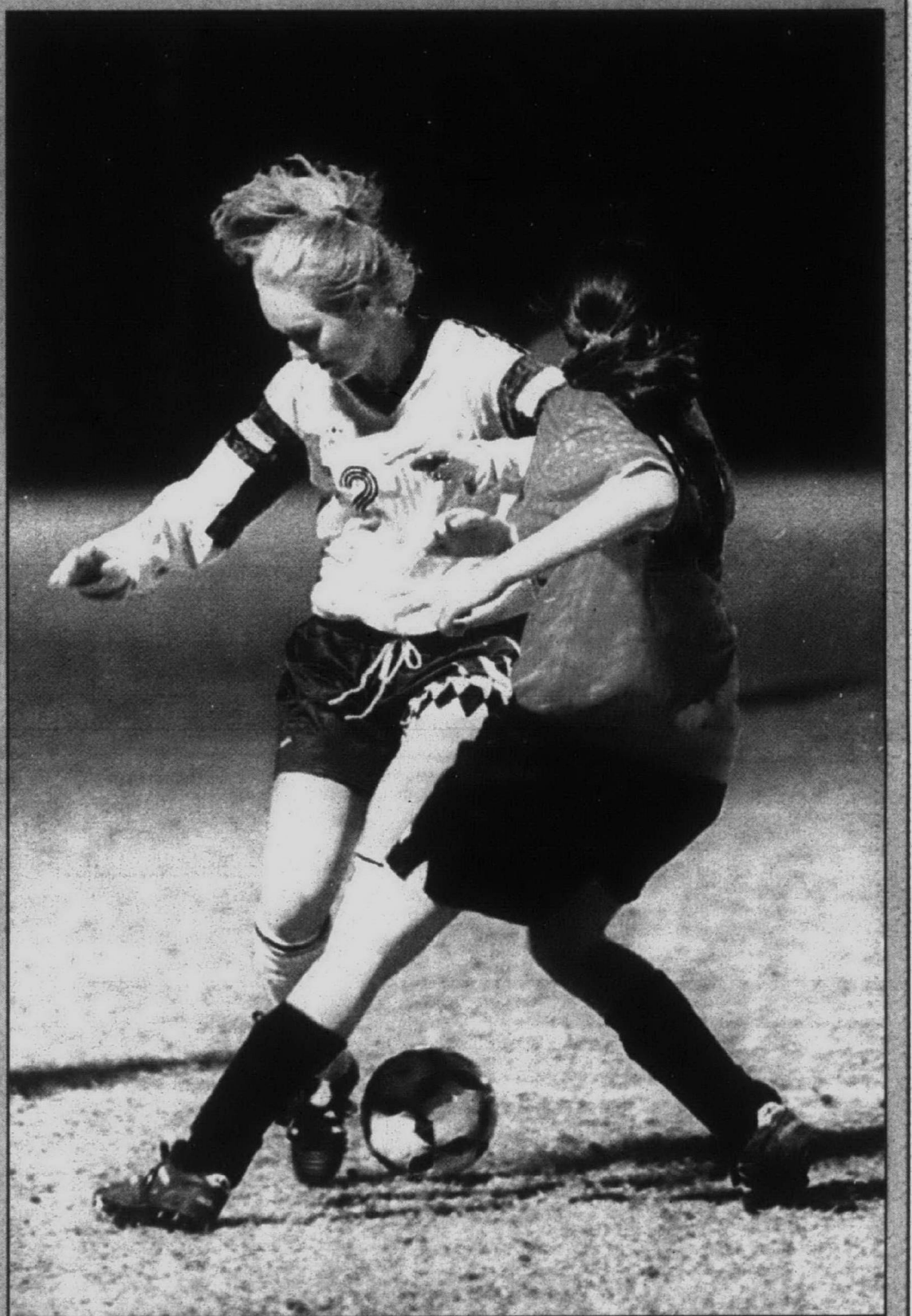
"She made a pretty big difference on the first two goals," said Landefeld. "Jenny had a really good game for us."

Salem stumbles to Spartans

Maybe the weather was trying to tell Plymouth Salem something.

A severe thunderstorm rushed through the Plymouth-Canton area Thursday, just before the Salem and Livonia Stevenson girls track teams were scheduled to run off for the WLA Lakes Division title.

Coaches sent their girls indoors to wait, an hour and one-half as it turned out.

"There was a little window we had to run in to beat the weather after the delay," Livonia Stevenson girls track coach Paul Holmberg said. "We had 1:15 to run. And it turned out to be the best weather we've had to run in all year. It was warm and it wasn't windy."

Well, there was a little breeze. Caused mostly by the whirring feet and flashing arms of the Spartans as they blew the Rocks off the track, 75-48.

Stevenson remained unbeaten,

The Rocks got a first from junior Kristin Kosik, a superlative all-around gymnast who qualified for the state meet by hitting a personal best 5-2 in the high jump.

Junior Jessica Ash went seven inches past 35 feet to win the shot put while sophomore Katie Bonner took the 400 in 1:03.5

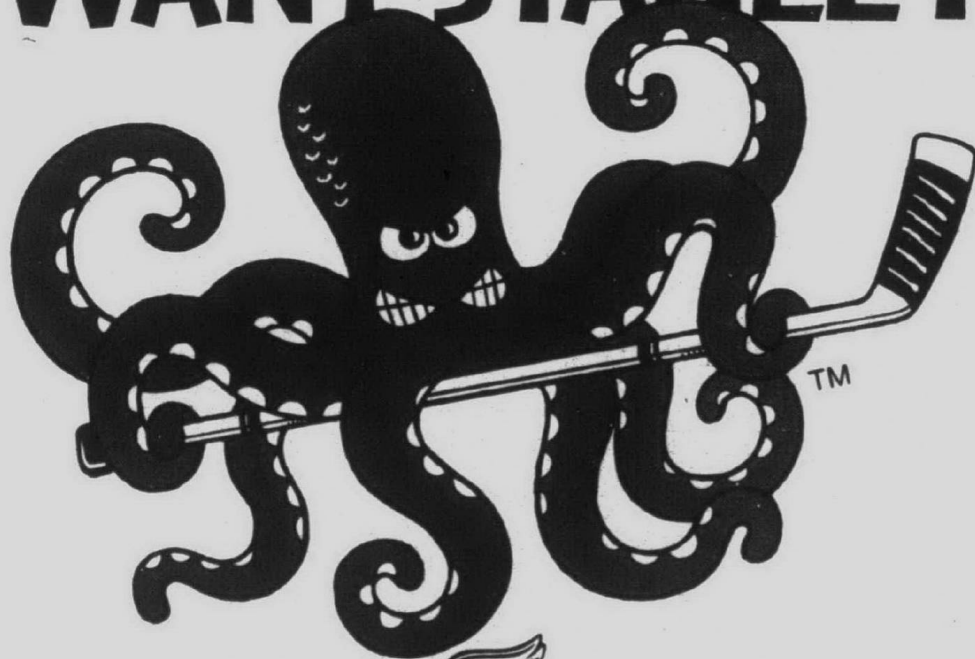

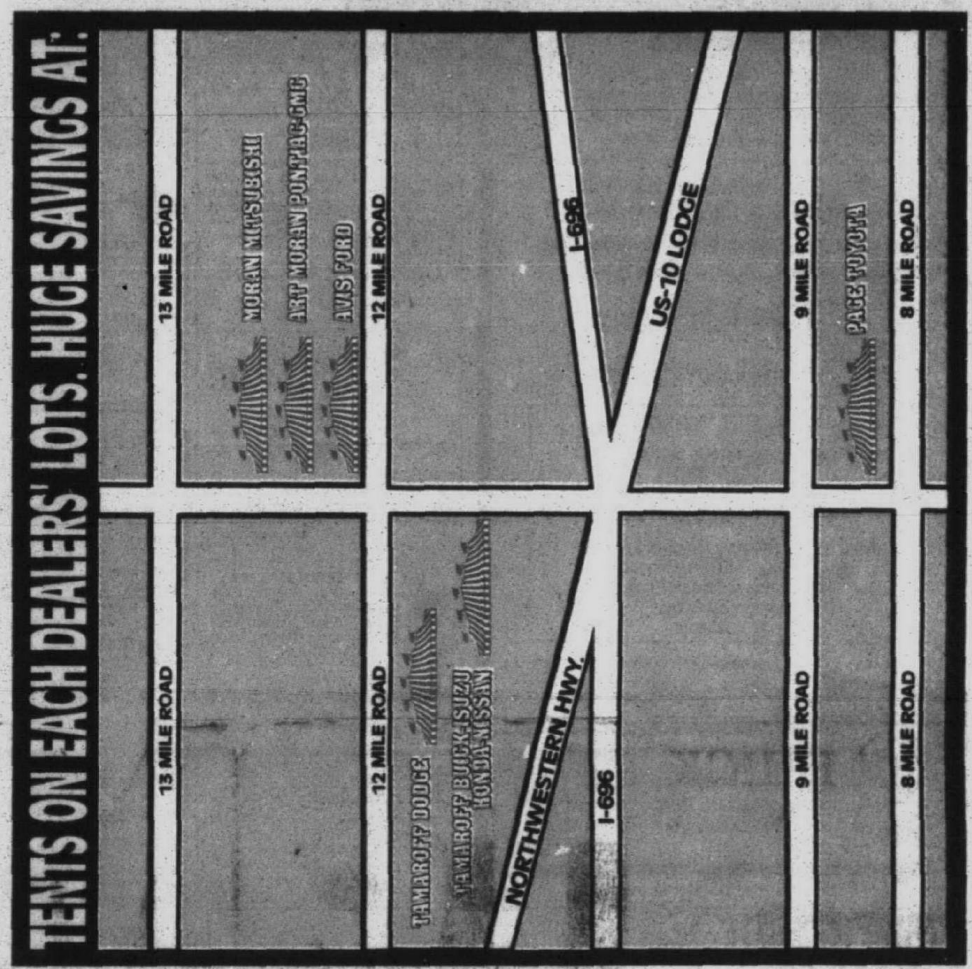

Ford creates a higher standard for small cars with 1997 Escort, Tracer

PINE MOUNTAIN, Ga. — Now here's a novel idea: Redesign a car, inside and out, put a new engine in it, beef up the suspension so it feels much more comfortable, make it wider and longer, increase the interior room for passenger comfort and price it lower than its predecessor.

That's what I said. Put all that research and development and effort into a brand new Ford Escort and Mercury Tracer and then price it about \$500 lower than the 1996 models being sold today.

That's exactly what Ford Motor Co. is doing for its 1997 models. The 1997 Ford Escort will be sold at a base price of \$11,430 (\$500 less) and the Tracer models will start at \$11,560 (\$610 less) when they hit the dealer showrooms on May 23.

What's important here is that these aren't just reskinned entry-level vehicles. This is a totally redesigned and re-engineered car. A car that in the past has cap-



tured almost 20 percent of the

sales in its class.

And most impressive is that it provides a superior ride. This is a suspension package that you would normally find on a mid-sized sedan. This has a ride better than Contour and Mystique; a ride just as nice as what's on the Taurus and Sable.

A little bit of history is in order: The original plan was to develop this new car in a partnership with Mazda, with Ford doing the styling, quality control and manu-

facturing and Mazda taking care of the implementation and testing. That idea was soon scrapped when Ford started to listen to its customers, who wanted a lower price on the car but an increase in equipment, power and comfort.

What's happened here is that Ford has set a new standard for small cars. Bob Kiessel, Ford's chief project engineer for the 1997 Escort and Tracer, said the team even came in under budget. That's unheard of.

But the bottom line is that the customer benefits. And that's all that matters to people like you and me.

The details seem minor, but make all the difference in the world. Stuff like better corrosion protection, a substantial decrease in noise, vibration and harshness, torsional rigidity and a water management system that makes the rain hitting the windshield travel up to the roof line, rather than to the sides and inside the car.

The powertrain program team had a tough job to do, but succeeded in giving the Escort and Tracer a performance feel, better shift quality and quieter idle quality. It also pumped up the horsepower and improved the smoothness of the automatic transmission. Everything the program team sought out to do was accomplished.

Traversing the winding hills of rural Georgia proved effortless for both the Escort and Tracer. The automatic transmission in the cars performed flawlessly, never hunting for a gear on even the steepest hills. Passing performance was quite impressive as well.

The Escort and Tracer are powered by a 2.0-liter 4-cylinder engine that's called Split Port Induction (SPI) 2000. This new engine delivers 110 horsepower, a 25 percent improvement over the 1.9-liter engine it replaces.

But that's not all. There's better fuel economy and a 15 percent

increase in torque. The engine has the revability of a 4-valve and the low-end feel of a 2-valve.

The styling of the new Escort and Tracer is a radical departure from the existing models. There used to be a familial look to the Escort and Tracer all these years. Now that's gone.

Ford didn't just update the styling here. It's refined, has a more distinct appearance, softer lines and a steeply raked windshield. The headlights have clear outer lenses and the bumpers, side moldings and door handles are all color keyed, giving the cars a smarter, cleaner look.

Ford also increased the size of the Escort by making it 4 inches longer. What that translates into is more front headroom and legroom. With the 4-door model (which is the only model available until later in the model year), you'll find it easier to get in and out of and the rear seat room isn't shabby.

Instrumentation has been upgraded significantly. Unfortunately, the tachometer is gone unless you opt for the LE trim level. And the audio and climate control are together in the integrated control panel (ICP) — which is also on the Taurus and Sable. There's a larger display, bigger buttons and a dedicated clock on the ICP.

The Escort and Tracer also have manual belts. Thank heavens. Those motorized numbers were a pain in the you know what. The belts are even height-adjustable in front.

Another feature usually only available on higher-priced models is a key fob that will open the driver's door and tailgate. And it even has a panic button. Anti-lock

brakes are available on all models. Also available is an integrated child car seat. There's a battery saver, dual airbags, child-proof door locks, rear-seat heat ducts and bolt-through wheel covers as well.

One thing is gone — the one-price structure. Remember? Escort and Tracer were one price for all models. Ford's eliminated the 3-door and 5-door models and has returned to a traditional form of pricing. There are two models now: The coupe and sedan.

Later this year, you'll see a wagon model. That was another disappointment. The rear of the wagon looks exactly like the model it "replaces." Everything else has changed — the interior, the front, the engine ... everything. It just has the same tired-looking rear end. Can't have everything, I guess.

That said, remember when you're looking at them that the 1997 Escort and Tracer are quality vehicles that have true value. Both are smart choices for informed buyers.




