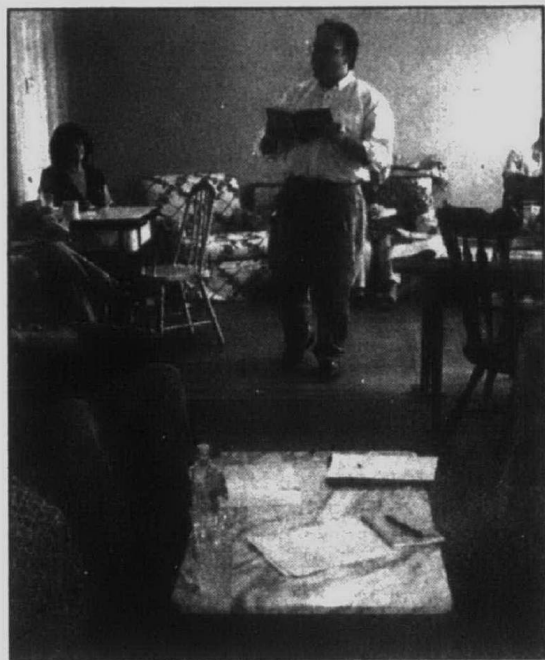

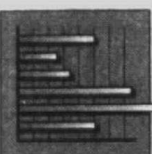

Landmark building is sold

The family of Mayflower Hotel founder Ralph Lorenz has sold the Mayflower Meeting House and some other properties east of Main Street.

With the sale of the Mayflower Meeting House and the earlier loss of the Mayflower Hotel to bankrupt-

cy, on Wednesday Staton Lorenz announced the sale of Lorenz Square to James Tomaro of Bloomfield.

But his brother, Randy Lorenz, and partner Mary Nadolny will continue to manage some of the properties in the two-acre parcel, as they have a long-term lease on the Mayflower Meeting House and Motor Inn.

"Our parents, Ralph and Mabel Lorenz, vested their life's work in developing the real estate known as Lorenz Square and in nurturing community spirit and caring for customers, tenants and the people of Plymouth," said Staton Lorenz, president of Lorenz Square Inc.

"Speaking on behalf of my sister Sheila Osann and my brothers Rick, Randy, Scott and Kirk, it is with mixed emotions that we announce the sale of Lorenz Square," he said.

Lorenz declined to announce the sale price.

The property had been willed to Ralph Lorenz's 43 heirs. "Every-

body's got different ideas about what they want to do, which directions their lives are taking," Staton Lorenz said.

Some family members, he said, were facing college expenses for their children. "Everyone decided by mutual agreement the best idea would be to sell it. We're pretty happy about finding the right person," he said. Lorenz said the family name will continue to be connected to the property, as Randy Lorenz and his partner will continue to manage the Meeting House and

Life a race for retired engineer

Roberta Nichols, 65, loves life in the fast lane. What's the fastest this retired Ford engineer who shares her home in Salem Township with eight vintage Mercedes cars and a tiger skin rug ever went?

"I drove 190 mph in a 1929 Highboy Roadster with a 354 Chrysler Hemi on methanol," she said without batting an eyelash.

Nichols, who worked extensively in the aerospace industry before joining Ford Motor Co. in 1979 as an alternative fuel expert, is an environmental engineer by training and a race driver by avocation. "I enjoy the competition," she said.

In 1994, she drove a Ford EcoStar, an electric vehicle, in the American Tour de Sol, a six-day road rally. "We won that race and we got the efficiency award every day. Our longest distance on a single charge was 193 miles."

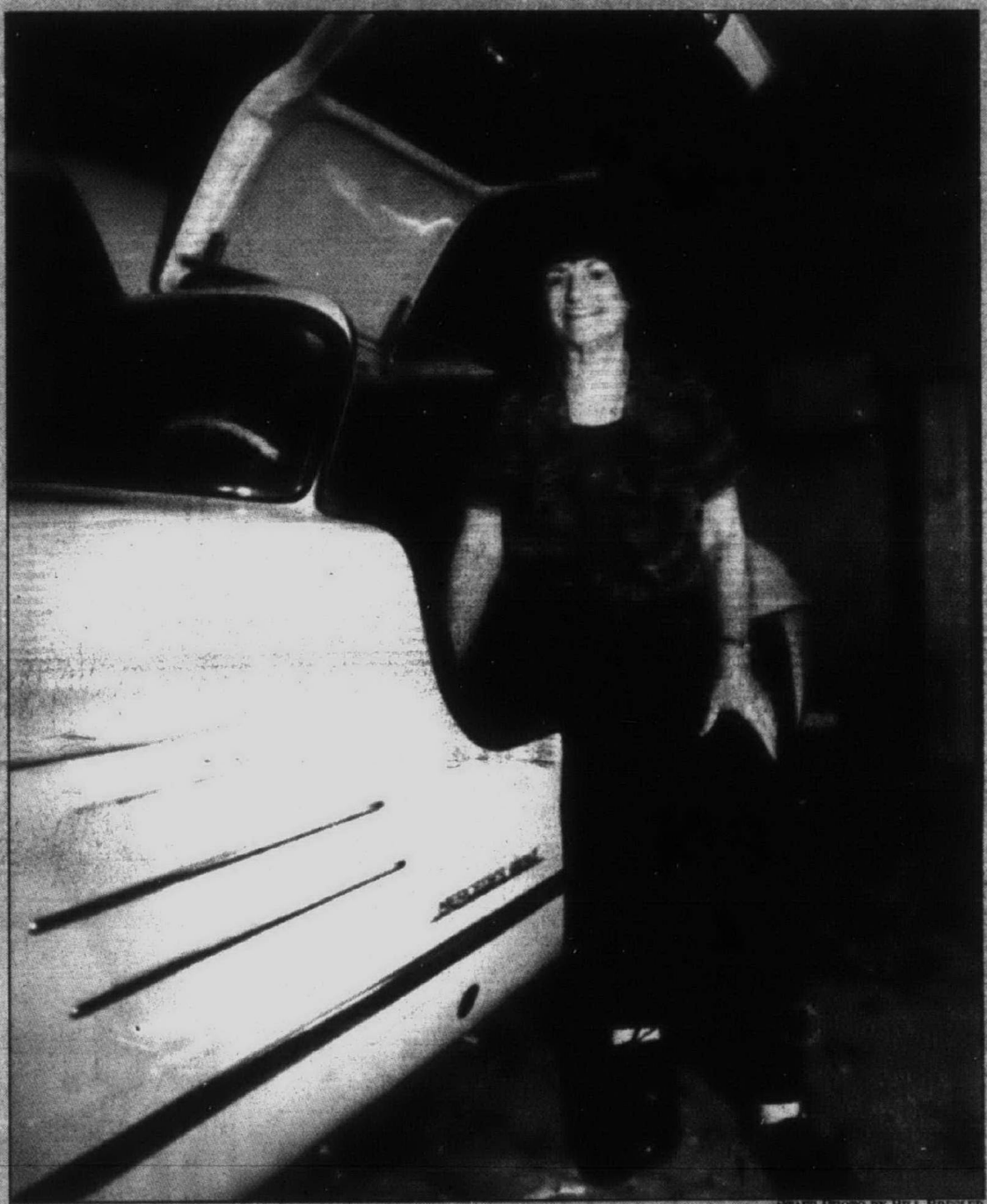
Nichols is a fellow in the Society of Automotive Engineers, the first woman fellow elected among the 80,000 members. Her family room walls are lined with awards and pictures of cars, including her beloved Mercedes Gull Wings.

She is proud of a picture of a sleek, green racing boat. In 1996, she set a world record for quarter mile racing for drag boats, clocking in at 131 mph.

Nichols and her husband, Lynn Yakel, also an engineer, have two garages and a state-of-the-art basement machine shop. When asked if she could build a car in her basement, Nichols hesitated, then said, "But we don't have any stamping machines."

A tour of the garages revealed several Gull Wings, one of which, a 1954 model, once belonged to Jeanne Crain, the movie actress.

Board member awaits appointment

Mettetal Airport Advisory Board member Mike Stankov knows what the federal government's budget feels like.

For months federal spending was kept alive by one continuing resolution after another while Congress and the president argued over what the fiscal 1996 budget would include.

Stankov has served on the airport board on a month-to-month basis since October while awaiting renomination from Plymouth Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen-McCarthy.

Keen-McCarthy said Tuesday she wants Stankov to continue and has told the Michigan Bureau of Aeronautics as much. "I'm going to have to check with

them," she said, "because I thought we had that resolved."

Stankov is one of the four remaining original members of the airport board, having begun a two-year term in October 1993.

He is the only board member appointed by the Plymouth Township supervisor. (Canton township has two appointments, while the state government has four.)

"If there's any resistance on anyone's part (to the reappointment), I'd like to know it," Stankov said. "If not let's get moving."

Board Chairman Mark Merlanti said he would like to see Stankov reappointed, but doesn't feel it's his place to intervene. "I don't know what good my phone calls would do," he said.

The board has been lucky,

Merlanti said, because Stankov is willing to serve month-to-month and "because we haven't had a lot of difficult issues come up in the last few months."

The problem is that Merlanti doesn't want Stankov to be assigned to a subcommittee, then have to leave if Keen-McCarthy appoints someone else.

Randy Collier, who oversees Mettetal for the state Department of Transportation, said Stankov's amorphous status is no hardship to the Bureau of Aeronautics. "It hasn't created any problems for us," he said.

Keen-McCarthy said she will call Bureau of Aeronautics Director Bill Gehman to "find out what they don't have from me."

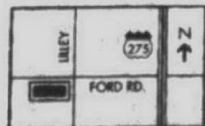

Plymouth poets plan to make summer a well-versed affair

Add to downtown Plymouth's summer art and music programs the Summer Celebration of Poetry.

Organized by Rod Reinhart, founder of the Plymouth Poets group, the poetry events this summer offer a range of poetry styles and venues.

Established Michigan poets are scheduled to read at most events, but time is also set aside for beginning poets.

What's special about poetry? "Poetry in America is like a canary in a coal mine," Reinhart said.

"Poets are the first to give warnings about changes in the atmosphere, changes in the environment that can hurt people. They're more sensitive to future problems and future joys that can affect us."

Currently, Reinhart said young poets are talking about facing difficulties in succeeding in the modern world.

"They talk of the fear of finding a job, fear of their families falling apart, and fear of accomplishing anything in their own lives," he said.

"I think poetry is important because a lot of the best writers do it. They can capture in one paragraph a reality which will make us weep, make us roar with laughter and will change our lives," Reinhart said.

Ongoing events include sessions from 7:30-10:30 p.m. at the Plymouth Coffee Bean Co. at 844 Penniman. Featured poets July 11 are Thomas Lynch, author of "Gri-

malin; Keith Taylor, author of "Life Stories;" and Reinhart, author of "Spiritual Aerobics of the 21st Century."

The sessions open with an open mike period, in which emerging poets are encouraged to read.

Poet workshop sessions have also been conducted Sunday evenings at the Coffee Studio, 600 Ann Arbor Trail. These sessions are in the process of being moved to Monday evenings.

From 2-7 p.m. Saturday, July 13, a "Poetry Crawl at Art in the Park" is scheduled. Readings are scheduled for the main stage at Kellogg Park and in city coffee houses and restaurants.

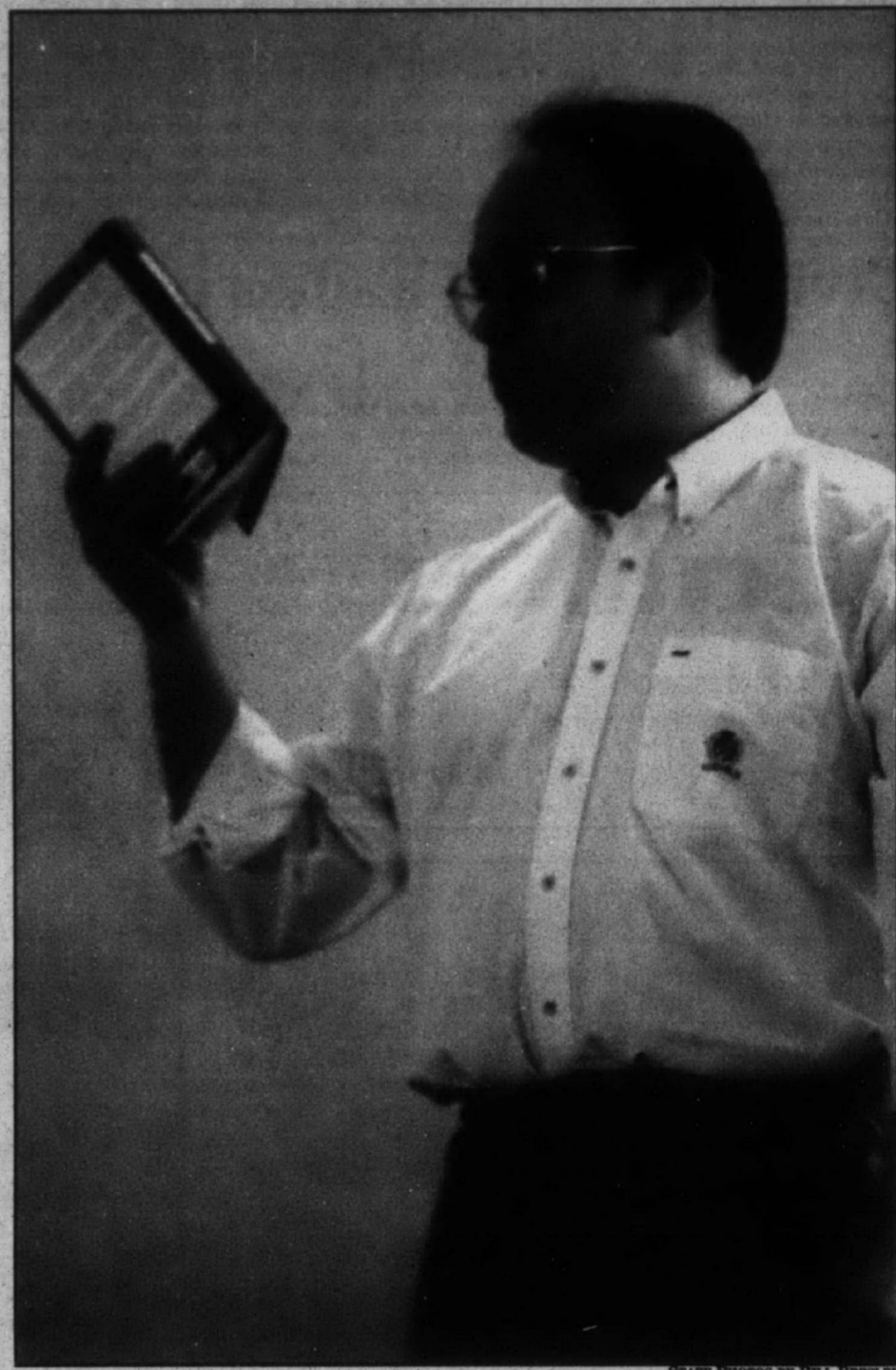
Reinhart encourages local poets to contact him at 459-7819 to be scheduled to read.

At 1 p.m. at the Coffee Studio, "We will show you to the performance spaces," Reinhart said. So far, participating performance venues are the Kellogg Park main stage, the Coffee Studio, Uncle Frank's Conel Island restaurant on Forest, the Harvest Moon cafe on Forest, Native West on Ann Arbor Trail, The Serenity Shop on Forest and the Sweet Afton Tea Room on Ann Arbor Trail.

There are already more than 50 poets invited to read at the poetry Crawl.

Exchange student tradition is alive

What Daisy Air Rifle owner Charles Bennett and the president of Czechoslovakia began 60 years ago Dr. E.J. McClendon and exchange student Ales Klempa are keeping alive.

In 1936, Bennett, a Plymouth Rotarian, was his own international marketing staff, said McClendon. The Great Depression was on, and sales were down.

Trying to drum up business, Bennett visited fellow Rotarian Tomas G. Masaryk. "He had just left office after serving from 1918 to 1935 as the first president of the Czechoslovak republic, of which he was leading founder," said McClendon, a past president of Rotary.

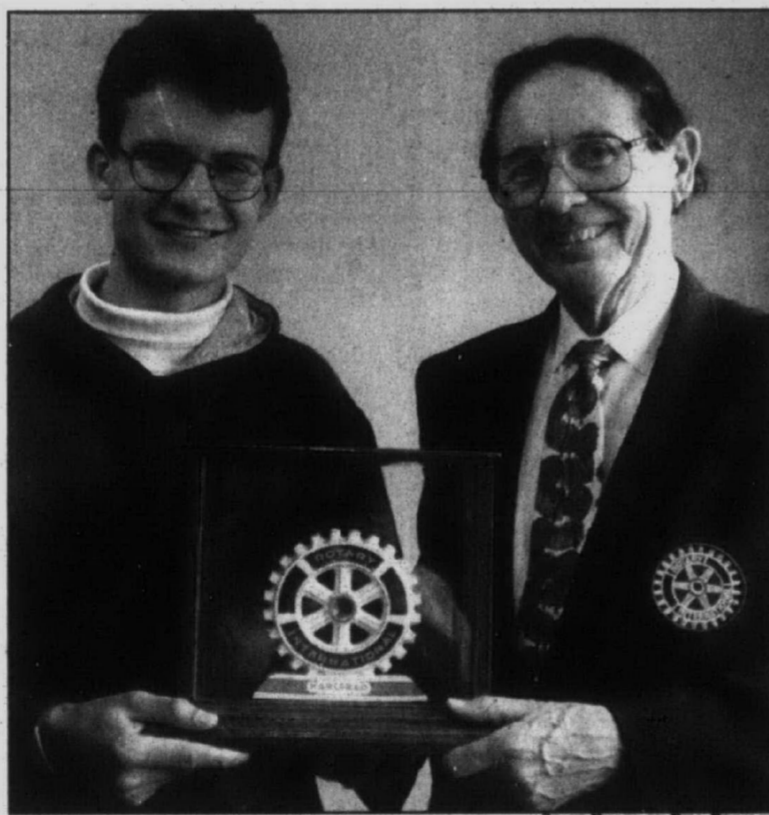
As a token of friendship, Masaryk presented Bennett with a Dresden china Rotary wheel encased in glass and wood. With it was a placard that said, "Presented to the Rotary Club of Plymouth, Michigan by the Rotary Club of Karlsbad, Czechoslovakia, on a visit to the latter club by Rotarian Charles H. Bennett, March 13th, 1936."

The gift ended up in the hands of Plymouth's guardian of history, the late Sam Hudson. "When Sam died, his wife Jessie called a few of us Rotarians over and said there were some things in the basement we might like to have," recalled McClendon, a retired University of Michigan health professor and former Plymouth-Canton school board member.

Rotarian Sid Disbrow, a talented woodworker, agreed to restore the wheel and box, which were soot-covered and in disrepair.

"The thing was a circular blob of black grease. Sid did a great job. I'm not sure he gets enough credit. I'm not sure anyone else would have had the courage to try it," said McClendon. "It's a very interesting story; that we even have this just amazes me."

"The Plymouth club found itself holding a historic international Rotary treasure, and was challenged with how best to treat such a valued memento,"

he added. "Since Rotary is returning to that part of the world, seeking an international exchange student seemed like an appropriate move. District 6400 and the local Rotary Foundation cooperated, and Ales Klempa, 18, from Brno in the Czech Republic arrived in Plymouth. An excellent student and personable ambassador from the newly-free Eastern European nation, Klempa was excited to find a 60-year-old symbol from his country in Plymouth.

"It's very exciting and very embracing. It kind of relates me to them," said Klempa, who was a guest of Plymouth Rotary at the Mayflower Meeting House last Friday. "It helps deepen the relationship between my country and Plymouth."

Klempa has enjoyed his year

at Canton High School. "People here are much more open," he said. "Friends are dedicated and will help you more. Back home, people are a little bit more reserved."

Education is approached differently in the Czech Republic, he said. Students go to specialized schools, depending their aptitude, beginning in elementary school.

Klempa, who plans to become a lawyer, attended a language-oriented school beginning in third grade. He speaks Russian, German, English and Czech.

"Here, you don't feel the necessity to learn a foreign language. Students here know it, and say it's kind of sad," Klempa said.

Cable firm awards grants to Plymouth

some other properties. They declined to state the length of the lease.

"It became more difficult for us to properly manage Lorenz Square from five cities. We know that it's the little things that make a big difference and the distances that most of us live from Plymouth now and in the future would only make quality management less likely," said Station Lorenz.

While some family members lost the Mayflower Hotel to bankruptcy in recent years, Lorenz stressed that Lorenz Square "has always been sepa-

rate."

"This property has never been in any trouble financially," he said.

"We dedicated the last 42 months to improving the property, continuing their high standards, honoring previous obligations and establishing comfortable and useful facilities for our tenants and their customers," Lorenz said.

Tomaro said nothing has changed for tenants of Lorenz Square, "except where tenants send their rent checks."

"I vintage raced it, that's why I have the roll bar and fire extinguisher," said Nichols. "It's the only way you can drive it in the way it was meant to be driven. I drove it at 145 mph at Bonnevill."

Entering a male-dominated profession was a natural for Nichols, who earned a Ph.D. and holds three patents for the Flexible Fuel Vehicle. In a family of daughters, Nichols became her father's son. They often would visit junk yards and welding shops together.

"He was a great do-it-yourself kind of guy, an engineer at Douglas Aircraft Company. I just grew up in that kind of activity not knowing that wasn't usual

for little girls," she said.

Nichols cannot imagine life in the slow lane. She travels the world frequently as a consultant on alternative fuels and recently returned from South Africa, where she was the closing keynote speaker for an international symposium on alcohol fuels.

Roberta Nichols will always drive cars, and drive them fast. In a way, that tiger skin across her living room rug (a gift from a friend, it came from RKO studios, circa 1932) is analogous with her spirit. It's a matter of adrenalin.

Recalling her boat racing days, Nichols said, "I always thought I would make a terrific study for adrenalin, because all I had to do was think about it and the adrenalin would rush."

items to pull out of the creek. "In earlier years we found a lot more diverse kinds of debris - car parts, shopping carts, tires, it was probably because it hadn't been cleaned before," Penn said.

"Now we get log jams. Wood piles behind houses get knocked in or washed in. We haul logs away, dead trees, we drag all that out," he said.

The Friends of the Rouge provide dumpsters and the city municipal services department provides work gloves. "We haul it out with our bare hands or with ropes or rakes," Penn said.

The items are taken to a central location where wood and metal are sorted, wood is ground up for composting and metal is recycled.

What's the weirdest thing he's ever found in the water? "Probably a car hood," Penn said.

The local Rouge clean-up origi-

nally started along the Rouge in Hines Park in Plymouth Township, but in recent years has shifted to Tonquinc Creek.

Why the section of the creek at Lions Park? Penn said there's no specific problem; it's just that they try to rotate local clean-up sites.

Turnout over the years has been as high as 130 volunteers, Penn said. But last year, only 10 volunteers showed up.

"If it's real good weather sometimes they don't come because there are other things they'd rather be doing," he said. The event will happen rain or shine.

Penn said volunteers should wear work boots, long shirts and pants - not shorts in case they run into poison ivy and mosquitoes. Contact with water is not encouraged.

Pop, coffee and donuts will be available at Lions Park for volunteers, who are to include Close-Up students from the Plymouth Canton Educational Park.

"We're also encouraging people to join Friends of the Rouge," Penn said.

Schoolcraft trustees approve tuition increase

A tuition increase was approved along with the 1996-97 budget Wednesday at Schoolcraft College.

"None of the trustees take tuition increases lightly," Trustee Mary Breen said before the vote by Schoolcraft College's Board of Trustees. "I'm going to vote for the tuition rate because I believe we have to do it."

The tuition increase means in-state students will pay \$2 more per credit hour and out-of-state students will pay \$4 more per credit hour. Schoolcraft College district residents will pay \$50 per credit hour; non-resident students will pay \$73 per credit hour; and out-of-state students will pay \$109 per credit hour. The new rates were approved 6-0, with trustee John Walsh absent.

Schoolcraft students have seen tuition increase several times in the past year. Tuition increased \$2 a credit hour in May 1995 and increased \$1 a credit hour in January 1996.

Trustees also approved a \$36.8 million budget, which is a 3.61 percent increase over last year. A tentative tax levy of \$1.8521 per thousand dollars of taxable State Equalized Valuation was approved based on last year's figure, because the rate isn't expected to be certified by the State Tax Commission until May 28.

The rate is expected to be close to that this year, according to Adelard Raby III, vice president for business services.

The 1996-97 general fund budget includes \$22 million or 60.04 percent of the budget for instruction; \$3.7 million or 10.10 percent of the budget on student

services; \$6.97 million or 18.93 percent of the budget for business services; \$2.4 million or 6.55 percent of the budget for general administration; and 1.6 million or 4.16 percent of the budget for the institutional contingency fund.

Revenue includes \$14.48 million in property taxes, a 3 percent increase over last year; \$9.9 million in state appropriations, a 5 percent increase over last year; \$11.9 million in tuition and fees, a 3.34 percent increase over last year; and other income of \$508,200, a 0.58 percent increase over last year.

SEV is expected to increase about 2.8 percent and grow about 0.2 percent, Raby said. An increase of a half percent in the number of credit hours taken is also expected, Raby said.

Schoolcraft's tuition rate is about average in comparison to

nearby colleges: Oakland Community College, which recently won a millage increase is at \$46 a credit hour; Wayne County Community College was proposing \$54; Washtenaw Community College, \$52; Henry Ford Community College, \$49; and Macomb is at \$51.

Eastern Michigan University charges \$91 per credit hour for 100 and 200 level courses.

Tuition and fees play a larger part in the college's budget than they did 15 years ago, while state appropriations as a percentage have dropped, Raby said at the April meeting.

He also cited a "fairly rich" faculty union contract and the increasing cost of updating technology as budget pressures, but that was disputed by the faculty union president at Wednesday's meeting.

The budget still reflects the

same relative rank in salaries (about fifth) in comparison to other community colleges, with \$60,526 being the maximum salary, according to Bill Nickels, president of the Faculty Forum, the faculty union.

He called "fairly rich" a relative and comparative term. If it creates a budget pressure, then it would follow that it would take a bigger percentage of the bud-

get, but that isn't the case, Nickels said.

He presented Michigan State Board of Education figures that showed a drop in the percentage of the general fund budget spent on instruction, while figures presented by the administration to the board at the April meeting showed an increase in the cost of instruction as a percentage of the budget.

Spending bill aids higher ed

Liberal with money. Conservative on social policy.

That sums up the way the Michigan Legislature this year treated 15 state universities in a \$1.5 billion appropriations bill. It's 5 percent higher than a year ago in a time when inflation is below 3 percent.

"It's about as good as you can do — the best in 10 years," said Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, chair of the Senate Appropriations subcommittee on higher education.

"It brings some floors up," he added, referring to a 12 percent boost for U-M Dearborn and nearly 16 percent for Grand Valley and Saginaw Valley universities. They were brought up to a floor of \$4,150 per student.

The Senate May 22 voted 33-3 to concur in two controversial House amendments to Senate Bill 850 and sent it to the governor's desk for signing. The amendments:

- A deduction for the University of Michigan and Wayne State University to the extent they provide benefits for unmarried "domestic partners."

The House failed May 21 to strip out that amendment by a 25-72 vote. Voting to knock it out were Maxine Berman, D-Southfield, and Republicans Barbara Dobb of Union Lake and Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills.

- A prohibition against funding abortions as a health benefit, and an order to university boards to negotiate an end to abortion funding in future union contracts.

That amendment, sponsored by Rep. David Jaye, R-Utica, was tacked on by a bare 56-44 vote with 10 members absent. Here is how area members voted:

YES — Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, Jim Ryan, R-Redford, Deborah Whyman, R-Canton.

NO — Lyn Bankes, R-Redford, Eileen DeHart, D-Westland, Tom Kelly, D-Wayne.

Sen. Don Koivisto, D-Ironwood, praised the monetary increase because "the more we put into higher education, the less tuition students have to pay. We put a dent into the upward spiral of tuition."

Sen. Alma Wheeler Smith, D-Salem, whose district includes U-M and Eastern Michigan University, agreed on the money part but deplored the amendments. "I think it's unconstitutional," she said, referring to a section of the Michigan Constitution that gives U-M, Michigan State and Wayne State operating autonomy. "Universities will have to expend tax dollars to go to court."

Sen. Gary Peters, D-Bloomfield Township, joined Smith in voting no.

The budget bill includes \$1.495 billion in state money and \$5 million in federal financial aid — a 2 percent cut in Washington's contribution.

Student aids — including tuition grants, work-study, dental and allied health programs — also are boosted about 5 percent.

'Get tough' bills attract criticism

More juveniles would be tried and punished as adults under a series of "get tough" bills passed by the Legislature and due for Gov. John Engler's signature.

A handful of Senate Democratic critics, however, protested that over-zealous prosecutors could ruin children with jail time instead of saving them.

"The House (amendment) has no (lower) age limit," said Sen. Virgil Smith, D-Detroit, who is running for Wayne County prosecutor in the Aug. 6 Democratic primary. "If you don't like 13, how about 10? Nine? Eight? ... This will come back to haunt us."

Sen. William VanRegenmorter, R-Hudsonville, who steered the bills through the Judiciary Committee, defended the House's tougher version in which the Senate concurred May 23.

"It's a package that makes some fundamental changes. We added to the list of crimes for

which a juvenile could be charged. We dropped the age from 15 to 14. The prosecutor could petition the juvenile to a juvenile court or adult court. The judge can move them into the juvenile system or youth prison," said VanRegenmorter.

As for sending kids under 14 to adult jails, VanRegenmorter said there are four procedural safeguards: "The prosecutor must request adult treatment; the judge must agree; the sheriff must agree to accept them; and there must be physical separation of facilities."

"For a 12-year-old who is into serious crime, there's an argument that a night in jail might be an attention-getter."

Sen. Alma Wheeler Smith, D-Salem, joined Virgil Smith (no kin) in blistering the bills. "The chair talks of frightening children with a day in jail. But the bill leaves an unlimited (young) age and leaves 25 years for a drug offense."

"Oh, we will save money by sending kids to the Department of Corrections, but we will not save children," she said.

"There's no question we have to deal with prevention," replied VanRegenmorter, "but there's an explosion of juvenile violence."

Most bills were adopted 36-0. But Senate Bill 724, calling for certain juveniles to be held in adult jails while awaiting trial in adult court, won by a lesser margin of 25-11.

Among those voting against were area Democrats John Cherry of Clio, the two Smiths and George Z. Hart of Dearborn. All other area senators voted yes.

SB 682, expanding the list of crimes for which juveniles could be charged as adults, passed on a 29-8 vote, with Cherry, the two Smiths and Hart dissenting.

Alma Smith also cast a dissenting vote as the Senate gave final approval to a bill by Sen. Mike Rogers, R-Brighton, aimed at cracking down on escapees

from Maxey boys training school in Livingston County and a dozen other institutions.

"We have created a four-year felony for escape from a juvenile facility," said Smith. "Until the Legislature fences the facility, I vote no," said Smith. The Senate concurred in the House's version on a 34-2 vote.

Currently, juveniles can be waived to adult courts when charged with first- and second-degree murder, attempted murder and rape. Under the new package, which becomes law as soon as the governor signs the bills, the list would be expanded to armed robbery, carjacking, kidnapping and arson.

The Senate threw a scare into Sen. Mike Bouchard, R-Birmingham, sponsor of the bill to expand the list of crimes for which a juvenile can be tried as an adult. One portion allows the Family Independence Agency (formerly Department of Social Services) to place juveniles in

out-of-state facilities.

Virgil Smith came a vote short with an amendment to require courts to consider options in Michigan, the comparative condition of out-of-state facilities and the role of parents. It lost 18-19.

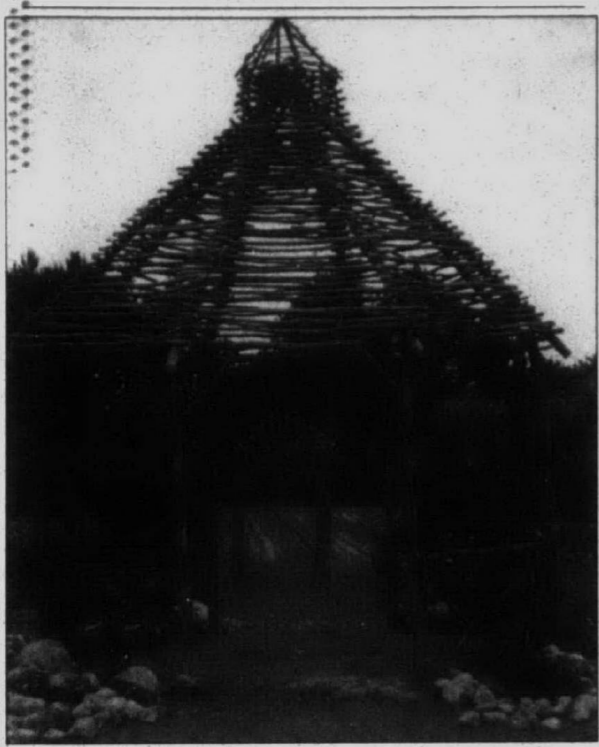

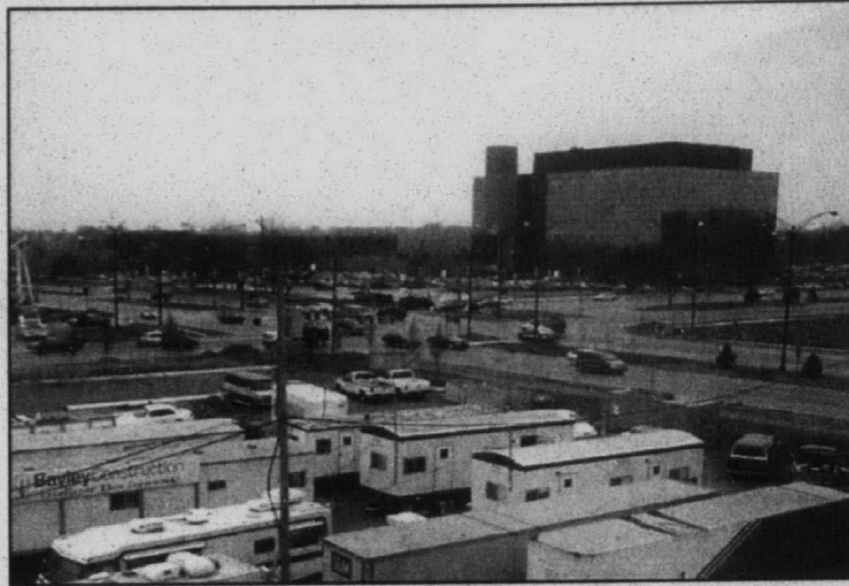

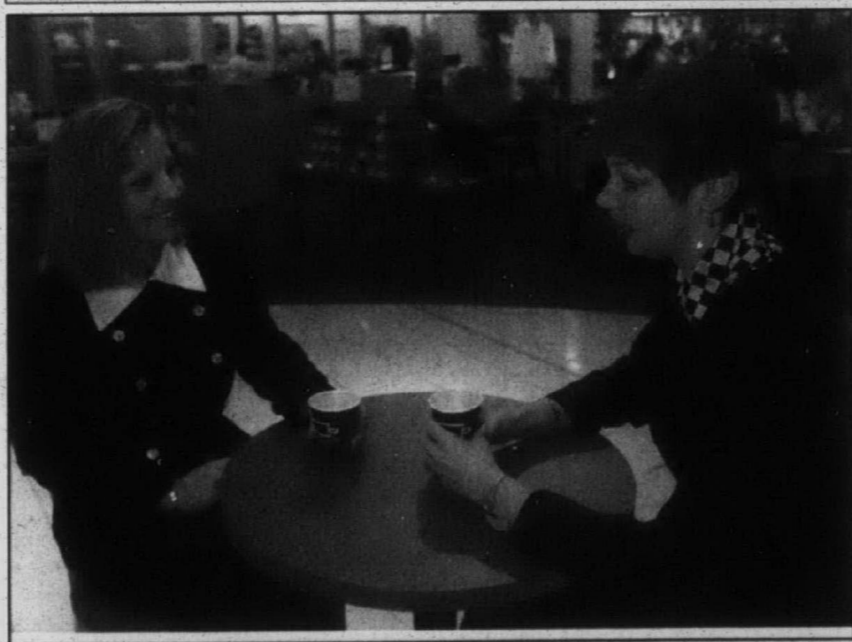

Schoolcraft staffers OK contract

The Schoolcraft Board of Trustees and the college's union of office personnel have ratified a new contract.

In the new contract, Schoolcraft College Association of Office Personnel members received 2.5 percent pay increases, beginning June 1, plus a lump sum payment which will average \$514 per person, according to Betty Gilbert, director of labor relations at Schoolcraft.

A change in the payment

structure that union members receive for opting out of the health insurance program was increased to \$75 per pay period, Gilbert said.

The board ratified the contract Wednesday. The union ratified it Tuesday.

It is a one-year contract from July 1, 1995, through June 30, 1996, for the 60-member union, which had worked for about 11 months without a contract. A three-year contract for the union expired June 30, 1995.

Contract talks broke off in November, and the board of

trustees decided not to offer retroactive pay raises to the union, Gilbert said. Union president Belinda Eleison came before the board earlier this year, in hopes of having talks resume. Talks resumed about three weeks ago, Eleison said.

"We just kept talking," Gilbert said. "I don't know in particular what did it."

Eleison called the agreement "bittersweet." "We lost more ground than we gained. But it was just a matter of closure," she said.

Contract talks will now begin

for the next contract since this one ends June 30. Gilbert said she hopes contract talks won't drag on as long for the next contract, but "we do have some issues," she said. Eleison said the union is optimistic.

When talks broke off Eleison said the issue was money. The secretaries' union is always the last to settle, both sides say.

Last time the union went a year and a half without a contract, Eleison said last year.

The secretaries' salaries range from about \$24,000 to \$33,000.

Plawecki, D-Dearborn Heights, had been approached but opted not to run for state representative against Rep. James Ryan and is seeking her third term on the county commission.

"I was overwhelmed by how many people contacted me and offered their support for the state representative seat, and for that I am sincerely grateful. For now, however, I am satisfied with my duties as a county commissioner and look forward to continuing to represent the citizens of district nine," she said.

She sees negotiations at Northwest and expansion at Metro Airport among the big issues coming up. "Everybody's looking to see what happens with negotiations with Northwest," she said.

Demolition and cleanup at the county-owned Northville Township property, in Commissioner Thaddeus McCotter's district, is also very important, she said.

Plawecki cited her vote in favor of the county's holiday light show, LightFest, as one of the more controversial issues she's voted on in her tenure, but one that has brought many complimentary letters.

She lists a plan to build a Corporate Family Picnic area in Bell Creek Park in Redford Township among her accomplishments. "It's rewarding to see that that project is finally coming," she said.

Other accomplishments she lists include, the commission's stand on road funding and an ordinance bringing stiffer fines for littering in Wayne County parks.

Plawecki is a graduate of St. Sabina's grade school and graduated from Mercy High School in 1984. She received a bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan in 1988 with a double major in political science and psychology and a master's degree from U-M in public administration.

Plawecki, 29, serves as chairperson of the committee on Roads, Airports and Public Services, which approves projects and services at Detroit Metro Airport and Willow Run as well as for county roads.

During her freshman term on the commission, Plawecki was appointed as the first chairperson of the Committee on Environment and Energy. Currently Plawecki is a member of Health and Human Services, Economic Development and Ways and Means committees.

Plawecki serves as vice chair of the board of directors for HealthChoice, a health-care program designed to provide insurance for individuals who live and work in Wayne County, but do not have insurance provided by their employer. Currently, 3,366 people are receiving benefits.

In addition to being appointed to the Wayne County Solid Waste Planning Committee by county Executive Edward H. McNamara, Plawecki also serves on the Wayne County Drainage Board.

Plawecki is chairperson of the

Southeast Michigan Council of Governments Aviation Task Force Committee. She is also a member of the advisory board at Madonna University.

Plawecki is a member of the League of Women Voters, the chambers of commerce in Dearborn Heights, Redford Township and Livonia, the Women's Economic Club, Michigan Association of Counties, Dearborn Heights Goodfellows, National Association of Counties, National Association for the Mentally Ill, Conference of Western Wayne, Detroit Institute of Arts Founder Society, Michigan Humane Society, University of Michigan Alumnae Association and Divine Child Parish.

Readers make time for more gourmet fare

Here I sit with an aching back, feeling good about how great the lawn looks, the fact that my garden is in, and the patio furniture is set up. All the while I'm thinking that my readers are not too busy to find the time to cook, not just good old comfort food, but surprisingly, far more gourmet fare.

I base my comments on the fact that after the tamale column ran last month, I received more than 30 calls about it. Some of the more interesting calls included:

■ A call from Chris Morris of Redford who said I missed the boat not mentioning Evie's Tamales, a restaurant in Mexicantown. Well, Chris, my sources claim that Evie's formerly owned the take-out tamaleria now occupied by Nuevo Leon; but if Evie still makes tamales like she used to, I stand corrected. Evie's is at 3454 Bagley (313) 843-5056.

■ Bonnie Kelly of Birmingham called about the tamale column, and said she wants to know more about Latino and Cuban food. One of my favorite books on the subject is "A Taste of Old Cuba," by Maria Josefa Lloria De O'Higgins (Harper Collins, 1994, \$25). This book has more than 150 recipes highlighted by the author's reflections and memories. I really enjoyed this recipe as O'Higgins claimed her mother made it, and it was considered a real "comfort food" Cuban style!

PUDIN DE BONITO (TUNA PUDDING)

- 4 slices white bread, cut into pieces
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1 large onion, peeled and chopped
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- Two (6 ounce) cans tuna, drained and flaked
- 1 tablespoon butter

Place the bread in a mixing bowl and pour the milk over it. In a small skillet, warm the olive oil over medium heat and saute the onion until translucent, about 3 minutes. Stir the eggs into the bread mixture. Add the onion, pepper, salt, cumin and tuna and stir to combine.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 2-quart casserole with butter and fill with tuna mixture. Bake for 30 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Serves 6.

■ I really love it when a local turns entrepreneur. The next time you're in any Kitchen Glam or store, or Kitchen Port in Ann Arbor, check out Westland's self-proclaimed Pizza Gourmet Chef Carl Oshinski and his new line of gourmet food products. P.G.'s flavored oils (the wild mushroom infused oil, my favorite) is stellar drizzled over cooked pasta and grilled portobello mushrooms. He also offers bread machine mixes, pizza doughs, pasta - all of the highest quality, and without a doubt, locally made. Oshinski said his products will be soon available at Best Buy as they are expanding into housewares.

■ An anonymous reader called to say she was curious about my rhubarb pie recipe. She wanted to know what a "prepared pie shell" was. A prepared pie shell is dough that has been made and rolled and fitted into a pie plate and as yet remains unbaked.

A prepared pie crust, on the other hand, is a prebaked crust. The reader also wanted to know if she could substitute sugar Twin for half the 2 cups recommended sugar. Unfortunately, even though it pours the same, I wouldn't recommend it because when artificial sweeteners warm to any temperature above 300 degrees F. their chemical make-up changes and they usually become bitter.

■ Fancy food lovers - have I got a hot one for you! I recently returned from the International Association of Culinary Professionals Conference in Philadelphia and tried a new product called Demi-Glace Gold. Made with no MSG, salt, sugar and in the classically made Old World Tradition as defined by Chef Master Escoffier, this product is just what gourmets need when preparing homemade sauces needed a veal or chicken stock that tastes almost as good as homemade. It's available locally at GFS (Gordon Food Services) in Canton and Rochester, and Novi or you can get other sources by calling 1-(800)-860-9385.

AMERICANS GRAB AND GO FOR

For a quick lunch or dinner, it's hard to beat a burger. They are the source of fond childhood memories, and harbingers of summer. Some of us mark our passage from childhood to adulthood with burgers.

We start out with a "Happy Meal" and graduate to a double cheeseburger, "Big Mac" or "Whopper."

A&W Root Beer was our family's favorite burger joint. We used to go there on summer nights when it was too hot for mom to cook, or when good report cards or deeds merited a treat. When we were little tykes, mom always ordered the "Baby Burger" for my brothers and I. Then as we, and our appetites grew, so did the size our burgers.

While most of us think of hamburgers as being as American as apple pie, they're not.

"It came from the Baltic provinces of Russia in the Middle Ages where various tribes of Tartary, who were rowdy, nomadic horsemen, developed a fondness for raw beef, known today as steak tartare," writes Jeffrey Tenyson author of "Hamburger Heaven," (Hyperion, 1993). "These Tartars introduced it to their German trading partners from the port city of Hamburg, who developed a taste for it fried and seasoned with onions - Hamburg Steak. When German immigrants arrived in the United States in the 1700s and 1800s, they brought the steak with them. The first documented American appearance of the Hamburg steak is on the menu at New York's fabled Delmonico's Restaurant in 1834."

According to some sources, Charlie Nagreen of Seymour, Wis., invented the American ham-

burger at the age of 15 when he delivered it from his ox-drawn concession stand at the Outagamie County Fair in 1885.

Other sources say a German, Frank Menches, introduced the sandwich at his food stall at the Summit County Fair in 1892 in Ohio when he ran out of bulk pork sausage for his sandwiches and substituted beef.

Another story credits Louis Lassen of New Haven, Conn., with creating the hamburger steak in 1900 as a means of using the trimmings from the steak sandwich he featured at his lunch wagon.

Hamburgers created a sensation at the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis. Several authorities believe the vendor was Fletcher Davis who owned a lunch counter in Athens, Texas. In 1921, Walt Anderson and Billy Ingram founded White Castle in Wichita.

Today, burgers remain one of America's favorite foods. The Taste of America Survey conducted in 1994 by "Restaurants & Institutions" showed 86 percent of the population ordering them in the past year.

According to "The Great Food Almanac: A Feast of Facts from A to Z," by Irena Chalmers (Collins Publishers San Francisco, 1994) even the "King" himself, Elvis Presley, loved burgers. His favorite food was a hamburger burned to a crisp. He often sent his back until it was what some people would call totally charred.

According to the National Cattlemen's Beef Association, the secret to moist, flavorful burgers is careful handling.

■ Shape ground beef gently; over handling can result in firm, compact burgers.

■ Don't overcook - Burgers should be cooked to medium (160 degrees F) doneness, or until

no longer pink in the center. It's risky to eat rare or raw ground beef because any surface bacteria are transferred to the interior of the meat during grinding.

■ Use a spatula to turn burgers without pressing or flattening; flavorful juices can escape, resulting in a dry burger.

Burgers have come a long way from the basic burger on a sesame seed bun, with lettuce, tomato and mayo. For a change of pace, try a Mediterranean Burger. Season ground beef patties with lemon pepper, then grill to medium doneness. Instead of a traditional bun, serve the burgers with pita bread quarters. Garnish with tomato slices, red onion, and a sauce made from a blend of yogurt, chopped cucumber and lemon pepper.

For "Cooking With Three Ingredients: Flavorful Food Easy as 1, 2, 3" try "Buffalo Burgers made with ground beef, butter and hot pepper sauce."

"These are great" writes cookbook author Andrew Schloss. "The butter and hot sauce blend with the meat juices to make a truly extraordinary burger. If you feel the need to gild this lily, a crumbing of blue cheese will turn it into the most unusual and tastiest cheeseburger you've ever had."

Safety tips

■ To store ground beef in the refrigerator, place in the meat compartment or coldest part of the refrigerator. Use within two days.

■ Ground beef can be frozen in its original transparent packaging for up to 2 weeks. For longer storage, wrap ground beef tightly in heavy-duty aluminum foil, place in plastic freezer bags or wrap in freezer paper. Ground beef may be stored in the freezer for up to four months.

■ For convenience, ground beef patties can be frozen. Shape ground beef into patties and arrange in a single layer on a wax paper-lined tray or cookie sheet; freeze just until firm. Remove patties from tray and wrap tightly or place in freezer bags and freeze.

■ If you're pulling burgers out of the freezer, make sure they are completely defrosted before grilling. Otherwise, you could undercook them.

■ Use microwave for quick defrosting, or defrost in the refrigerator allowing approximately 24 hours to defrost a 1 to 1 1/2-inch package of ground beef. Do not defrost ground beef at room temperature.

■ Cook with medium-low temperature coals. When coals are ash-covered (in about 30 minutes), spread in single layer. Place ground beef patties on grid directly over ash-covered coals. Grill uncovered 11 to 15 minutes.

■ Brush brown sauces (like soy or teriyaki) on the cooked surface of the burger. When a sauce is mixed into raw ground beef, it's difficult to determine doneness.

■ Don't put cooked meat on a platter that's been used for raw meat without thoroughly washing the platter with warm, soapy water. Or, use two different platters for raw and cooked meats. Be sure to wash all grilling utensils too, and anything else that touches uncooked meat.

Author satisfies hunger for veggie burgers

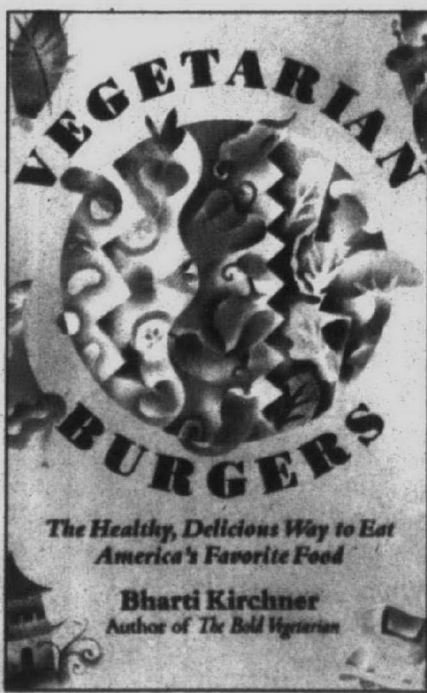
Cookbook author Bharti Kirchner was first introduced to vegetarian patties as a child in India, the land of her birth. In her newly published cookbook, "Vegetarian Burgers: The Healthy Way to Eat America's Favorite Food," (HarperPerennial; \$12.50/trade paperback) she shares a bevy of burger ideas developed from her travels around the world.

Drawing from a wide variety of ethnic cuisines - Indian, Middle Eastern, Asian and European - she combines the rich flavors and unique textures of whole grains, legumes, vegetables, seeds, fresh herbs and spices to create burgers.

"Indian cooks prepare not only many sorts of ground meat patties, called kebabs, but they also do an equally varied set of vegetable patties, known as chop, patis, tikki, or bora," writes Kirchner. "These vegetarian delights are composed of legumes, grains, and various minced vegetables, laced with fresh chiles, herbs, and spices. Indian cooks roll them into balls or flatten them into oval shapes, then coat them with bread crumbs before frying or baking."

Many people are familiar with falafel and kibbe, the Middle Eastern version of vegetarian burger.

"All cultures have some sort of patty, but Americans have a unique way of serving it," Kirchner says in her book. Onion-filled Kibbes, with their creamy filling of cheese and sweet onion were inspired by the tra-

ditions of the Middle East, and her Falafel Burger is a low-fat variation on Near Eastern cookery.

The variety of her inspired recipes is evidenced by chapters on "Grain and Bean Burgers," "Vegetable Burgers," "Nut and Seed Burgers," "Tofu and Other Soy Burgers," and "Stuffed Burgers."

As for the "trimmings," Kirchner's book includes a chapter on healthful and satisfying salads, grains and vegetables. Her cumin and fresh chile-laced Double-Garlic Potatoes are a crusty, golden-brown alternative to oil-laden French fries.

In addition to using low-fat ingredients, Kirchner recommends practicing low-fat cooking methods like grilling, baking, and broiling, and offers a glossary of ingredients and step-by-step instructions for preparing and serving the most delicious vegetarian burgers you'll ever taste.

"Most of the recipes are simple and the majority of the ingredients are now available in supermarkets," writes Kirchner.

Kirchner is an accomplished vegetarian cook whose tempting interpretations of ethnic cuisine have been showcased in her previous books, "The Bold Vegetarian," "The Healthy Cuisine of India," and "Indian Inspired." She lives in Seattle, Washington.

Veggie Burger Basics

■ A food processor is a must for preparing vegetarian burgers. It helps blend the ingredients, creates the proper texture, and eliminates the need for eggs as a binding agent.

■ Prepare ingredients ahead of time. Form patties early on the day you intend to serve them or even a day ahead of time. If preparing them more than an hour in advance, refrigerate them, and then bring them to room temperature just prior to cooking.

■ For grilling burgers, a vegetable grid works best. You can also use a hinged basket, a two-sided hinged grill with long handles that encloses one or more patties, depending on size.

■ If using an outdoor charcoal grill, be sure to let the charcoal briquettes burn until they are covered with a thin layer of gray ash with a dull red glow underneath. It generally takes about 30 minutes to reach this stage. Grill burgers 3 to 5 inches from the heat source, otherwise they are likely to burn.

■ If broiling, do so also 3 to 5 inches from the heat.

■ If sauteeing burgers, use a nonstick skillet and nonstick spatula for turning the burgers.

■ You can make a large batch of burgers by doubling or tripling the recipes and freezing the surplus. Wrap uncooked patties individually in plastic wrap. To thaw, transfer them to the refrigerator a day in advance.

■ To reheat, place burgers in a 325 degree F. oven for up to 15 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Overbaking makes them dry.

MEDITERRANEAN BURGERS

1 1/2 pounds lean ground beef
 1 1/2 teaspoons lemon pepper
 2 pita pocket breads, lightly toasted
 1/4 cup chopped red onion
 Sliced tomato
 Sauce:
 1/3 cup chopped, unpeeled cucumber
 1/2 cup plain low-fat yogurt
 1/2 teaspoon lemon pepper
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 In small bowl, combine sauce ingredients, set aside.
 Shape ground beef into 3/4-inch patties. Sprinkle lemon pepper over both sides of patties.

Place patties on grid over medium ash-covered coals. Grill, uncovered 13 to 15 minutes or until centers are no longer pink, turning once.

Cut each pita bread into quarters. To serve, top each burger with chopped onion; serve with tomato slices, pita wedges and sauce.

BUFFALO BURGERS

1 pound ground beef
 2 tablespoons butter
 2 tablespoons mild hot pepper sauce, such as Duke's Red Hot
 Mix the ground beef with 3 tablespoons water, 1/4 teaspoon salt, and 1/8 teaspoon pepper.

Form into 4 burgers about 1/2 inch thick.

Grill over a hot fire or broil 4 inches from the heat to desired doneness, 8 to 15 minutes, depending upon heat source and taste preferences.

Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, melt the butter over medium-low heat. Remove from the heat and mix in the hot sauce. Brush the sauce all over the cooked burgers. Serves 4.

 4 hamburger buns or Kaiser rolls
 Optional: Mayonnaise.

ketchup, mustard, tomato slices, shredded lettuce

Prepare a hot fire in a grill or adjust broiler rack about 4 inches from source of heat and preheat broiler. In a medium bowl, working as quickly and gently as possible, mix ground round with crushed potato chips, salt, and pepper. Lightly form into 4 burgers about 1 inch thick.

Brush onion slices with olive oil and place on an oiled grill set 4 to 6 inches from coals or place in broiler. Cook, turning once, until lightly browned and tender, 5 to 7

minutes. As onions cook, transfer to a plate cover with foil to keep warm.

Place burgers on grill or broiler and cook turning once until done.

Meanwhile, split open buns and toast on sides of grill or under broiler until warm and lightly browned. Placed cooked burgers in buns and top with grilled onions. Let everyone choose their own fixings. Serves 4.

I'm still receiving calls from readers requesting more Crock Pot recipes. Her's a recipe I found in my recipe box that best describes Crock Pot cooking from 20 or 30 years ago. I've made this once, I've made it a hundred times!

CROCK POT POT ROAST

1 (2.2 ounce) box beef onion soup mix (dry)
 1 (3 1/2 pound) beef rump roast, trimmed of fat
 3 large carrots, peeled and sliced thick
 2 ribs celery, sliced thick
 3 cloves garlic, minced
 2 teaspoons dried thyme
 1 bay leaf
 1 1/2 cups dry red wine
 1 (14 1/2 ounce) can beef broth
 1/4 cup all purpose flour
 Rub or pat the dry soup mix all

over the roast beef. Place vegetables and seasonings in a slow cooker. Mix 1 cup each of wine and broth and pour over vegetables and seasonings. Add the roast and scrape any dry soup mix left on dish into Crock Pot. Cover and cook on the low heat setting for 9 hours or until meat is tender. Remove meat.

Remove and discard bay leaf. Scoop out the vegetables with a slotted spoon and reserve. Pour juices from Crock Pot into a medium saucepan. Bring to a boil. Whisk together remaining 1/2 cup wine and flour until well blended. Stir into the simmering juices and cook, stirring constantly until the gravy is thickened, about 3-4 minutes. Pour gravy over meat and vegetables and enjoy. Serves 6-8.

Shirley Clark of Plymouth called requesting a recipe for White Chili. Well Shirley, not only did I find a winning recipe, it's actually low fat, but can be

easily fattening by frying all the vegetables first, and of course, by adding the cooked chicken or turkey. I think you'll agree it's a hit.

WHITE BEAN CHILI

1 can (14 1/2 ounces) fat-free chicken or vegetable broth
 1 large onion, chopped (about 1 cup)
 1 medium yellow pepper, chopped
 2 jalapeno chile peppers, seeded and chopped
 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
 1 1/2 cups water
 1 teaspoon grated lime peel
 1 teaspoon cumin seed
 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano leaves
 1/2 teaspoon ground coriander
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1 can (15 ounces) great

Northern beans, rinsed and drained

1 can (15 ounces) butter beans, drained and rinsed
 1 can (15 ounces) black eyed peas, drained and rinsed

Heat half of the broth to boiling in a large Dutch oven. Cook onion, pepper, chiles and garlic in broth, stirring frequently until tender. Stir in remaining ingredients and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer uncovered for 20 minutes. Serve with salsa, if desired.

Serves 6. Each serving contains 250 calories with 3 grams fat, 0 cholesterol.



FALAFEL BURGERS

1 tablespoon olive oil
1 cup diced onion
1 tablespoon minced garlic
1 jalapeno pepper or other green chile of choice, cored, seeded, and minced (or to taste)
1 1/2 cups cooked or 1 (15 ounce) can chick-peas, drained (measured after draining)
1 cup cooked basmati rice or other long-grain white rice
1 tablespoon freshly squeezed lime juice
3/4 cups bread crumbs
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
Ground pasilla or red (or cayenne) pepper to taste

Heat the olive oil in a small skillet until sizzling. Cook the onion and garlic until the onion is wilted and the garlic is golden. Add the jalapeno and stir several times.

Remove from heat and allow to cool.

Place the onion mixture, drained chick peas, and rice in the container of a food processor. Pulse on and off several times until the mixture becomes a smooth puree. Transfer to a large bowl. Add the lime juice and 1 cup of the bread crumbs. Season to taste with salt, black pepper, and red pepper. Mix with a large spoon, or even better, with your hands, until all ingredients are thoroughly combined.

Shape into 3-inch patties 1/2 inch thick, adding extra bread crumbs if the patties don't hold their shape. They will be slightly sticky.

Prepare a grill or preheat the broiler. If broiling, place the patties on a broiler pan or large cookie sheet lined with a lightly oiled piece of aluminum foil. Grill or broil 3 to 5 inches from the heat, 4 to 7 minutes per side or until lightly browned. (When one side is done, turn the patties carefully with a spatula). Check often to prevent burning. Makes 7 to 8 patties, 3 to 4 servings.

Serving suggestions: Tuck these falafels into warmed pita pockets along with shredded lettuce, tomato slices, onion slices, or alfalfa sprouts.

DOUBLE-GARLIC POTATOES

1 1/2 tablespoons mustard oil or canola oil
1/2 teaspoon asafetida powder (available in health and specialty food stores)
2 to 3 garlic cloves, minced
1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
1 1/2 pounds boiling potatoes peeled or unpeeled, cut into 1 1/2-inch cubes
1 jalapeno pepper or other green chile of choice, cored, seeded, and minced (or to taste)
Salt
Garnish:
Finely chopped chives or scallions

Heat the mustard or canola oil in a large skillet over moderate heat. Sprinkle the asafetida over the oil. Add the garlic, cumin, potatoes, and jalapeno. Cook, uncovered, until the potatoes turn

brown in places, 5 to 8 minutes, stirring often.

Reduce heat, add 3 tablespoons of water, and cook, covered until the potatoes can be pierced easily with a toothpick, another 10 to 15 minutes. Season to taste with salt. Best served immediately, garnish with chives, but can also be served at room temperature. Serves 4 side dish servings.

TRIPLE MUSHROOM BURGERS

1 tablespoon canola oil
1 cup diced onion
1 tablespoon minced garlic
1 jalapeno or other green chile of choice, cored, seeded and chopped or to taste
1 red bell pepper, cored, seeded, and coarsely chopped
1 pound fresh mushrooms (a mixture of shiitake, chanterelle, portobello, or others or the standard supermarket cultivated variety), sliced 1/4 to 1/2 inch thick, touch stems removed if necessary

2 tablespoons hoisin sauce
1 cup cooked white basmati rice, preferably (or other long-grain white rice)
1/4 cup pecans, toasted and ground to a coarse powder in a spice/coffee grinder
1 1/2 cups bread crumbs
Salt to taste

Heat the oil in a large skillet over moderate heat.

Cook the onions and the garlic until the onion turns brown at the edges and the garlic is golden. Add the jalapeno, bell pepper, and mushrooms. Reduce heat. Cover and cook until the vegetables are tender, 10 to 15 minutes. Uncover occasionally and check to see if the mixture is sticking. If so, stir in up to a tablespoon of water. Add the hoisin sauce and mix well. With a slotted spoon, remove the vegetables and place them in a large bowl.

Reduce the sauce remaining in the skillet by placing over medium heat. Cook, uncovered, stirring often, until the sauce is very thick, 5 to 10 minutes. Pour sauce over

the onion-mushroom mixture.

Place the onion-mushroom mixture and the rice in a food processor. Pulse on and off several times until the ingredients are thoroughly blended. Transfer to a large bowl and add the ground pecans and 1 1/4 cups of the bread crumbs. Season to taste with salt. Mix with a large spoon, or even better, with your hands, until all ingredients are thoroughly combined. Form into patties 3 inches in diameter and 1/2 inch thick, mixing in extra bread crumbs if the patties don't hold their shape. They will be delicate, so handle them gently.

Prepare a grill or the preheat the broiler. Grill or broil 3 to 5 inches from the heat, 5 to 7 minutes per side or until lightly browned. If broiling, place the patties on the broiler pan or a large cookie sheet lined with a lightly oiled piece of aluminum foil. Check often to prevent burning. Makes 12 burgers, 6 servings.

Serving suggestion: These burgers are best served on toasted garlic rolls or bread of your choice.

Celebrate warmer weather with spring vegetables

HYDE PARK, N.Y. (AP) — Spring is a glorious season that can awaken our senses to the simpler things in life. Our taste buds seem to come out of hibernation as we anticipate one of life's great pleasures, fresh spring vegetables.

This time of year my mind immediately goes to work thinking of ways to combine local produce with other new harvests from around the country, like sweet Vidalia onions from Georgia, globe artichokes from California or earthy wild mushrooms from Virginia.

Although these vegetables can always stand on their own, blending their flavors together can be a pleasure for the palate.

A multitude of cooking methods can enhance the flavor of these tender vegetables, but their nutrients, color and texture are preserved if they are cooked in the quickest manner.

The recipes that follow are a few ways to prepare these seasonal vegetables at home.

FRESH ASPARAGUS SALAD

1 pound fresh asparagus
2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard

1/2 teaspoon shallots, minced
6 tablespoons olive oil
1 teaspoon Italian parsley, chopped
Salt and black pepper, to taste
1 red pepper, roasted, peeled and finely diced
2 tablespoons capers, drained
4 tablespoons pine nuts, lightly toasted
2 ounces Parmesan cheese, grated

Cut the fibrous root end off the

asparagus and peel the lower portion of the stem.

Bring a large pot of salted water to a rolling boil. Add the asparagus and cook for about 2 minutes, or until tender. Drain in a colander and rinse with cold water until the asparagus is cooled.

To make the vinaigrette, mix together the balsamic vinegar, Dijon mustard and shallots. While whisking slowly, add the olive oil and season with the parsley, salt, and pepper.

Place the asparagus on a plate and sprinkle with the roasted red pepper, capers, pine nuts and

Parmesan cheese. Drizzle the vinaigrette over the asparagus and serve. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

SAUTEED SPINACH WITH VIDALIA ONIONS AND MUSHROOMS

1 1/2 tablespoons unsalted butter
1/3rd cup Vidalia onions, finely diced
1 cup shiitake mushrooms, stemmed and cut into thin strips
1 pound fresh spinach leaves, stemmed, washed and drained
Salt and black pepper, to

taste

Melt butter in a skillet over low heat and add the onions. Sweat the onions for 2 minutes.

Add the mushrooms and continue to sweat for an additional 3 minutes or until the mushrooms are tender.

Increase the heat to medium and add the spinach leaves, a few handfuls at a time, allowing each batch to wilt before adding more. Season with salt and pepper, and serve. Makes 4 to 6 servings.



Fans of 'Friends' will enjoy Schwimmer in 'The Pallbearer'

NEW YORK (AP) — Meet Tom Thompson, a dull, nerdy-looking guy who lives with his mother and can't seem to find a job. Actually, you probably won't want to meet Tom — he's that boring.

But at least one character in Matt Reeves' "The Pallbearer" finds him simply scintillating and that's the vamp queen Ruth Abernathy (Barbara Hershey), whose son has just died.

Ruth asks Tom (David Schwimmer), who she thinks was her son's good friend, to be a pallbearer and to otherwise "help out" — a request that takes on interesting ramifications as the movie progresses.

But there's one big problem: Tom doesn't have even the slightest glimmer of an idea who the guy was.

His friends, played by Michael Rapaport, Toni Collette, Bitty Schram and Michael Vartan, think he's nuts when he agrees to carry out the mother's wishes. And they're no help, either: They also have no idea who the dead kid was. When Tom checks the yearbook for clues, across from the guy's name is just a blank square.

But Tom's mind veers away from matters funeral when his pals throw a party and invite Julie DeMarco (Gwyneth Paltrow), his high school crush.

Tom and Julie get together, of course, in what has got to be one of the most awkward date scenes on film. And it's somewhat sweet to watch two adults tip-toe around a man's apartment because they don't want to

awaken his eccentric mother (Carol Kane). Meanwhile, Ruth ups the ante: Tom now must give the eulogy. This turns out to be one of the highlights of the movie, a rib-cracking laughfest. Then Ruth drops the other shoe — and the other shoe, and her dress and everything else. Yes, you get the picture.

Dimwit that he is, Tom goes along with the seduction, jeopardizing his budding romance with Julie. Reeves, who wrote "The Pallbearer" with Jason Katims, has crafted a bunch of characters who don't really care much about each other. They're nice, but they're all fairly vapid.

But the screenwriters make up for it with Ruth Abernathy, and Hershey certainly steals the show as Ruth. Paltrow is lovely and lithe, but still gives off such a waifish air that doesn't give you much to hold onto. It would be interesting to see what this young actress could do with a well-developed, meaty role.

Rapaport, a dynamic young actor, is wasted in this movie. He's miles above Schwimmer and Vartan, but has little to do. Collette, fresh from the very wonderful "Muriel's Wedding," also isn't allowed to stretch. Schwimmer, who shot to TV stardom in the sitcom "Friends," holds little fascination. He's perfectly cast for the role of Tom, but hardly a compelling presence.

"The Pallbearer" makes a perfect date movie for TV fans, and probably will perform smashingly when it hits video stores. It was produced by Jeffrey Abrams and Paul Webster.

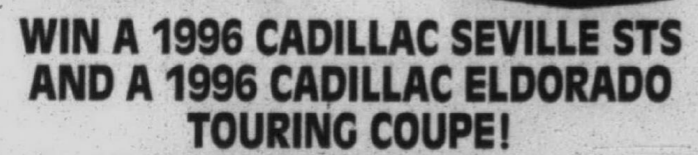

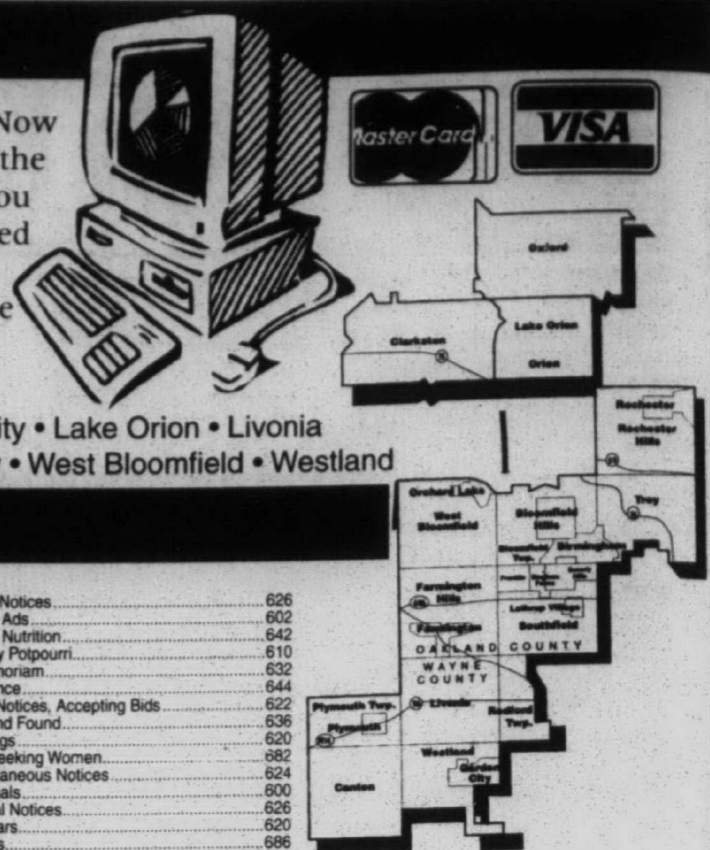

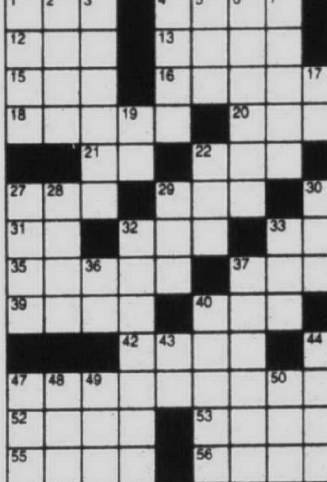

Officials' mistake ends up hurting everyone involved

Not to make light of a serious matter, but a sports season wouldn't be complete without some kind of MHSAA screwup.

Remember last fall, when Plymouth Salem's basketball team had to wait and wait and wait for its first regional game because of a court injunction filed on behalf of three Oak Park players who had been ruled ineligible?

And then there was the first-ever cancellation and eventual rescheduling of a state championship soccer match, also involving Salem.

The list, if not endless, is indeed lengthy. The point is, why not one more?

And so here it is, courtesy of officials who used the wrong rule book.

The beneficiary: Plymouth Canton, which advanced to last Saturday's Class A soccer district final against Plymouth Salem.

The loser: Livonia Churchill's girls team, which has experienced nothing but bad luck when battling the Chiefs at Canton.

A point of clarity is necessary regarding the latter, however. Because when officials make mistakes, everyone loses.

And the district semifinal between Canton and Churchill deserved better, because it was high-volume, fast-paced drama from start to finish.

Of course, where that finish finally ended up was the controversy. Seems the officiating crew - referee Saba Kayj and sideline judges Tom Montroy and Joe Trachy - went by the wrong rulebook for the overtime format.

They said it would be two 10-minute sessions (not sudden death) followed by a five-minute sudden death period, then a penalty kick shootout.

Wrong ruling

That would be correct, if high school state tournament games followed the National Federation guidelines. However, the Michigan High School Athletic Association (the previously-mentioned MHSAA), with support from the state soccer coaches' association, opted two years ago to have two 15-minute sudden death periods, followed by a penalty kick shootout.

(Note: Except in the state final. Teams play only two 15-minute sudden death periods; if the score is still tied, the teams are declared co-champions. There is no shootout.)

Now if Canton had just scored first, there would never have been a problem. But the Chiefs didn't; Churchill got a goal from Marie Spaccarotella early in the first OT.

End it there? By MHSAA rules, it should have. But the officials, with the previous acknowledgement of both coaches, had already ruled otherwise. Canton subsequently tied it, then won it in the second OT.

Churchill coach Nick O'Shea, contrary to what the officials later said, did challenge their OT format interpretation at the end of regulation. But he didn't do so vehemently enough, and when all three officials in unison told him what the format would be, well, what could he do?

"If the officials don't know, who does?" O'Shea questioned.

A lot of people wondered about it. But it didn't come to the officials' attention until an hour after the game had ended.

Churchill people, quite understandably, were incensed. It isn't the first time they feel they were cheated by officials while playing Canton at Canton.

History repeats

Two years ago, in a game that eventually decided the Western Lakes Activities Association's Western Division champion, the referee allowed play to continue past the time on the scoreboard clock. When O'Shea told him the scoreboard, by state rules, had to be the official clock, he was waved away and, later, yellow-carded.

Canton scored in that extra time to win the game, which allowed the Chiefs to play Livonia Stevenson in the WLAA title game (they tied).

And the protest? The MHSAA agreed the official was wrong; however, as stated in the rule book, official's rulings (or mis-rulings) can not be disputed or reversed.

In other words, his word is law. End of story.

Same thing happened to Churchill this time. Yes, a mistake was made. The officials are sorry. But the result - a 3-2 Canton win - stands. That's the MHSAA's ruling (as of Thursday).

Churchill players feel cheated. Canton players feel fortunate - but was it because they were just lucky? Is that what got them to the district final? Luck?

You see what I mean. Nobody wins, not really. And a game as good as this one deserves a better epitaph.

Chiefs' depth major factor in victory



There weren't a lot of individual wins to propel Plymouth Canton to another WLAA girls track championship. But there was more than enough depth to keep the Chiefs on top.

For the past five years, the Western Lakes Activities Association girls track championship has rested with either Plymouth Canton or Plymouth Salem.

And it was a battle again between the two intra-city rivals which went down to the wire before Salem faded and the Chiefs won the title for the third year in a row and for the fourth time in the past six years.

Canton accomplished the feat the hard way, with only one first-place

finish. Ironically, Livonia Ladywood recorded only one first when the Blazers won the Catholic League title Tuesday. The Chiefs did, however, place in 15 of the 16 events.

Canton scored 88.5 points in the victory. Second went to Livonia Stevenson, with 73. Livonia Churchill was third (72.5), with Salem dropping to fourth (72).

"We knew we were the favorite but we knew the competition would be intense," said Canton coach George Przygodski, who picked up

his fifth title in his 11 years.

"As coaches, we had to work harder and coach more this year than in the previous years we won," Przygodski said. "In past years, we've have the prime time athletes, but we didn't this year and only one first place shows that."

The lone win for Canton was from Angkana Roy, who ran a season-best 2:26.1 in the 800-meter run. Roy had plenty of help, including second places by Marisa Kovach in the high

Chiefs reign

2 late goals carry Canton to triumph over Salem

To say the game was an even struggle to the end wouldn't be right.

It wouldn't be fair.

There's little doubt the best scoring opportunities went to Plymouth Salem. But it was Plymouth Canton, behind some spectacular goalkeeping from Sarah Warnke, that made better use of its chances to record a 2-0 triumph in the Class A district final at Livonia Ladywood Saturday.

The victory puts the Chiefs, now 14-4, into the state regional tournament hosted by Walled Lake Western. They'll play Ann Arbor Pioneer at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday; the winner advances to Friday's regional final against the Livonia Stevenson-Brighton winner.

Both Canton goals came in the final three minutes of play. Kelly Connell retrieved a deflected pass and knocked a shot past Salem keeper Julie Buczek with three minutes left to stun the Rocks.

Melissa Marzolf finished them off with 30 seconds remaining, angling a drive from the corner of the box into the far end of the net.

"We should have put it away before then," said a disappointed Doug Landefeld, Salem's coach, his team's season ended with a 15-4 record. "It was a great effort, but not great finishing."

Historically speaking, the Canton win isn't surprising. Salem had destroyed the Chiefs 3-0 during the regular season, but that rarely supplies any sort of mental edge. Last year, Salem lost twice to Canton during the regular season, then beat the Chiefs in the district and advanced all the way to the state final.

Canton coach Don Smith felt certain the Rocks lacked respect for his team. "I think they felt they could take us anytime," he said. "But winning twice in a row is tough to do in this rivalry."

Still, it wasn't so much what the Chiefs did that stopped Salem. It was unfriendly goal posts and crossbars - four shots by the Rocks drew iron - and Warnke. If Salem

star Mari Hoff has any nightmares about this game, Warnke no doubt will dominate them.

Hoff had one shot bend just wide of the net, two others hit the crossbar and Warnke grab another - all in the first half. She ended up hitting the post again in the second half.

Warnke made two other diving saves in the first half. "I just felt that nothing was getting by," the four-year starter said.

And what about that first meeting, when Salem put two in the back of the net in the first few minutes? "That game was over with," Warnke replied. "I put it behind us."

In this meeting, nothing got behind her. Despite the marking efforts of Kristie Drinkhahn on Hoff - "I thought Kristie did a nice job on her. She made her distribute the ball more than she wanted to," said Smith - there were plenty of opportunities.

"One player cannot mark Mari Hoff," said Landefeld. "She's the best player in the state."

"We played as well today I thought as we did before (in the 3-0 win). We had as many good (scoring) chances."

"The ball just bounced all their way."

Smith and all the Canton followers don't mind that.

Salem's Collins collects top honors

Who ended up on top when the final scores were tallied at Thursday's Western Lakes Activities Association championship golf tournament wasn't so surprising.

The margin of victory at Huron Meadows in Brighton, however, was astounding.

Livonia Stevenson cruised through the WLAA regular season, posting a 7-0 dual-meet record. So, quite obviously, the Spartans were heavy favorites.

Stevenson's Mara Mazzoni was second (85), with Salem's Katie Murinas third (88), Northville's Monica Prasad fourth (89) and Stevenson's Andrea Khoury fifth (91). All five were named to the all-WLAA team.

The Spartans' next two scorers were Kelly Kristy and Kristin Bartholomew, both with a 96. They were each named to the all-division team.

Western's leader was Becky Vollmer (101). Churchill's top scorer was Emily Bischoff (92). Canton's best was Anne Alioto (109), Central's was Amy Emerine (106), and Franklin's was Beth Parnell (117).

Weather contributed to the scores, to be sure, particularly on the back nine holes, according to Salem's Wilson. Collins' ability to handle the changing conditions was a main reason she earned medalist honors; she shot 41-43 for her 84.

All that remains on the golf schedule is the state finals, May 31-June 1 at Forest Akers West Golf Course in East Lansing.

(5-foot-0) and Mary Anderson in the 100 hurdles (16.1), and third-place finishes by Becky Uryga in the 400 dash (1:00.8) and Nancy Hoffman in the 300 hurdles (48.9). Roy edged out Farmington's Kate Adams and Livonia Stevenson's Kelly McNeilance. "Some of the other girls in the race had already run a couple races and Roy had only run in one, and it really made a difference in the last 200 meters," Przygodski said. The Rocks, who scored in 14 of the events, had only one first also. That came from Kristin Kosik in the high jump (5-foot-2). Salem coach Mark Gregor was happy with his team's performance, but believed his squad had a chance to pull the upset at the end. "I thought we had a chance to

make it interesting toward the end of the meet," Gregor said. "The meet was there for us to make close but we couldn't take advantage." Gregor was referring to the 800-meter run, where the Rocks were ranked first and the 1600 relay, where they were ranked second. Salem even caught a break when Canton's Mary Anderson got hurt and had to sit out the 1600 relay. One of Salem's top runners in the 1600, Christie Giddings, also got injured and couldn't run in the relay, however. Turning in a strong meet was Harrison's Devron Kennedy, who won the 100 dash (12.7) and the 200 dash (26.1). In each event, she edged out Churchill's Becky Couyoumjan by less than a second. Kennedy also teamed with

Cierra Colbert, Emily Mayberry and Mahogany Fletcher on the Hawks' winning 400 relay team (51.8). In the field events, winners included Livonia Franklin's Danielle Wensing in the shot put (36-foot-7 1/4), Westland John Glenn's Nicolette Jarrett in the long jump (personal best 17-8) and Farmington's Kim Washnock in the discus (117-10). Other winners were Walled Lake Western's Tessie Harfoot in the 100 hurdles (15.7), Farmington's Ann Grimaldi in the 1,600 run (personal best 5:22.8), North Farmington's Heather Burcar in the 400 dash (1:00.2) and Churchill's Laura Gauci in the 300 hurdles (48.2). In the 3200 relay, Stevenson's Jeannette Stojcevski, Danielle Harris, Kelly McNeilance and Kelly Travis took first in 9:54.

According to Przygodski, Churchill's performance was one of the more impressive outcomes of the meet. "I think what was surprising was Churchill's third place finish," the Canton coach said. "(Churchill coach) Kelly Graham did a great job preparing her team and they ran a great meet." Przygodski also noted the performances of Canton's Nkechi Okwumabua, Mary Anderson, and team captain Sara Israel, who took fourth in the discus (104-11). "When you only win by 14 points, those type of points are big," Przygodski said. And don't expect too many things to change for next season. The Chiefs graduate only three key seniors, while Salem only graduates two seniors and return a total of 60 runners.

Gilles sisters can still dominate

It's been awhile since Plymouth Salem grads Chris and Wendy Gilles took to the tennis courts for a national tournament, but the sisters proved last weekend they still have the winning touch. In the 25-and-over U.S. Tennis Association National Indoor championships, the University of Wisconsin products came away with both the women's singles and doubles titles. It was the Gilles' first major tournament together since their collegiate days in Madison. Wendy, 28, and now residing in Farmington Hills, won the

singles title with a 7-5, 6-1 triumph over Ashlee Ashba of Sacramento, Calif. at the Home-wood (Ill.) Racquet Club. Ironically, the 1986 Salem grad defeated Chris, 29, in the semifinals, 2-6, 6-4, 6-1. Chris, an '84 Rock now living in Lake of the Hills, Ill., bounced back to win the consolation final for third place against Karen Fox of Oaklawn, Ill., 5-7, 7-5, 6-1. In doubles, the Gilles sisters won the championship with a 7-5, 6-1 victory over Karen O'Sullivan (Naperville, Ill.) and Donna Yuric (Palos Hills, Ill.). The former Salem All-Staters and prep All-Americans eliminated Julie Sierkas (Lake Bluff, Ill.) and Beth Thompson (Lake Forest, Ill.), 5-7, 6-3, 6-1, in the semifinals. At Wisconsin, the Gilles sisters earned several accolades including captaincy and MVP honors. They also made All-Big Ten four years in a row and competed in four straight NCAA championships. 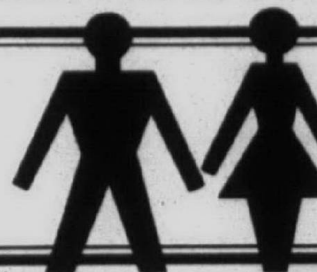

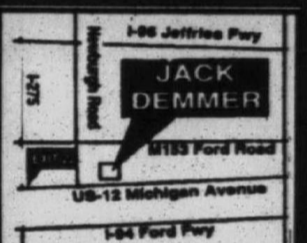

Mazda pickup offers something for everyone

Here's a no-nonsense truck that's perfect for a single guy or gal, a couple with small children or a contractor.

This may sound trite, but it's got something for everybody. Really.

The Mazda B4000 4x4 Cab Plus pickup is so versatile it can handle towing, taking the family to dinner or hauling a kitchen dinette set across town. It's high off the ground for anyone who loves four-wheeling in a field full of mud and muck.

Best of all, it's a comfortable pickup. My two little girls loved to sit in the rear jump seats. My 4-year-old told me the seats were perfect for her. She and her sister could easily see out of the truck and the belts fit around them perfectly. I even stuck the booster car seat in there for my 3-year-old (very awkward) and it fit decently.

Up front there's a split bench seat, which makes getting a passenger into the back very easy. The bench seat can also accommodate three adults, and there are

belts for each. That means you can seat five without a lot of problems.

This year, a driver's-side airbag is standard on all B-Series trucks and a passenger-side airbag is available on SE and LE models. Also standard this year are anti-lock brakes.

Assembled in Edison, N.J., alongside the Ford Ranger pickup, Mazda's B-Series trucks are offered in three trim levels, with two cab configurations, two bed

lengths and in 2- or 4-wheel drive. Hey, that's a lot to choose from, and prices start at just \$9,925.

There are engine choices as well. The B2300 has a 112-horsepower 2.3-liter 4-cylinder engine, while the B3000 is powered by a 145-horsepower 3.0-liter V6.

I tested the B4000 4-wheel drive Cab Plus SE model. This baby has one of the largest and most powerful powerplants in its class — a 160-horsepower 4.0-liter V6. That translates into fun four-wheeling and easy towing of anything under 5,900 pounds.

The suspension is outfitted with an independent twin traction beam with stabilizer bar, and the ride is smooth for a pickup. You're not going to get a luxury-type ride, but it doesn't knock you around the cab like a lot of other manufacturers' trucks.

Sporty body-side graphics add some color and give the truck a special look.

The truck's bed has added durability with its double wall construction and stake pockets. It can be outfitted with a bed liner for around \$275, a great value if your plan to haul stuff.

The standard privacy glass, located on the quarter and rear windows, is there to reduce ultraviolet rays and heat damage and offers a bit of security for important packages stored in the rear cab.

I haven't seen many vehicles outfitted with a key-activated switch for the passenger airbag.

Someone asked me why anyone would turn the passenger airbag off. Well, if you've got an infant, you've got to turn it off to protect that baby. Industry studies have found that when an airbag deploys and a rear-facing infant car seat is in the front seat, significant injury or death can occur. The rear jump seats can't accommodate an infant car seat, so the

switch is there. Great idea.

The shift-on-the-fly capability allows you to simply switch into 2- or 4-wheel-drive from the driver's seat. The switch, located right of the steering wheel on the dash, locks the front hubs automatically. That means you don't have to exit the truck to manually lock the hubs.

The base price of the B4000 is \$19,460, which looks like a steep pricetag. In reality, this truck has a standard equipment list that'll poke your eyes out it's so good.

Take a look: Full gauge group (including a tachometer), headlights-on warning chime, 4-wheel anti-lock brakes, 2-speed transfer case with shift-on-the-fly, power assisted steering, power assisted brakes, 72-amp heavy-duty battery, heavy-duty shock absorbers, underbody skid plates, front and rear mud guards, all-terrain 15-inch tires, a high-mount stop light, cargo box light, engine compartment light, map light, intermittent windshield wipers, dual mirrors, an AM/FM cassette stereo, tinted glass and fold-down center armrest with storage.

The B4000 tested had a lot more equipment on it, like air conditioning, a premium cassette stereo, sliding rear window, keyless entry, towing package, anti-theft system, privacy glass, power window/locks/mirrors and cruise control. With all that equipment, it pumped up the price to just a hair under \$25,000.

For that price, you won't expect this pickup to be easily dismissed by people on the street. It isn't. One woman driving a late-model pickup rolled down her

window to get information about my test truck after chasing after me for four traffic lights. And a stockboy at an office supply store who lugged a 5-foot-long table into the flatbed for me said "that's so COOOOL" when he first laid eyes on the truck.

Performance the B4000's got. You wouldn't expect it to be so, but the 4-speed automatic transmission performed well. It's not even sluggish when traversing steep inclines.

All in all, this is a pickup that measures up 100 percent to give you good value, versatility, durability and comfort. Can you really ask for anything more?
