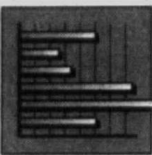

Plymouth gets new area code



Ameritech says Plymouth will be in a new telephone area code. The new number will be announced in 30 days.

Plymouth will get a new area code late next year, Ameritech officials say.

Metro Detroit now has two area codes, 313 and the newer 810 area code used in much of Oakland County. Starting in May, some western communities including greater

Northville will have a 248 area code. And Plymouth city and township will join another group of west metro Detroit communities in getting yet another area code — its number as yet undetermined, Ameritech officials say.

"We've had explosive telecommunications growth in Michigan," said Marcia Sayles, Ameritech public relations director, explaining the

need for more area codes.

"It's fax lines, it's the growth in cellular," she said. "People are walking around with phone pagers, they're putting in modems at home for kids and at school."

Last year 16 new area codes were introduced in the United States and another 21 are being added this year.

Sayles said the number of the new area code for Plymouth will be announced in the next 30 days.

"We've got two years to plan for this, we'll go out and give talks to senior groups and business groups and others, and make sure they

have a high level of understanding," Sayles said. Information on the new area code will also be mailed with monthly phone bills.

A big concern for customers when new area codes are announced is cost. "Customers have a concern that if they have to dial an area code, it's not a local call anymore," Sayles said, stressing that such calls in the metro Detroit area are indeed local.

"The call will not cost them any more. That's been a real difficult thing for customers to understand."

Music festival exits Plymouth's stage

Plymouth residents have seen the last of the Plymouth Music Festival.

The event, held Friday and Saturday in conjunction with ARTrageous, a walking tour of art galleries, was the last, said promoter Mike Watts.

"We just didn't get the community support we needed," he said. "The sponsors paid for the music, but we needed more support. There has been no community ground

swell for the event."

Weather also hurt the music festival. On Friday, heavy rains kept the crowds down and on Saturday, chilly weather reduced the crowds to only a handful for the music acts which performed in the bandshell in Kellogg Park.

With temperatures in the 50s, one musician noted that the song he was doing probably didn't sound right because "my fingers are frozen to the wrong cord."

The music festival was in its sixth year. It featured blues, rock, children's entertainment and

country music.

Traditionally it was held during the summer months, but last fall it was moved to the same weekend as the ARTrageous tour.

Watts, a Plymouth music and events promoter, said he may look at moving the music festival to another community.

"We're just not getting a return on our investment, I'd be better off putting my time into the ice festival," he said.

Watts also runs Plymouth's annual Ice Festival in January.

But while music fans may have

heard their last note, art fans will continue to be entertained by the ARTrageous event.

"We'll have this again next year," said Annette Horn, owner of Native West gallery on Ann Arbor Trail.

"It's a wonderful town event, not a promotion. It's put on by retailers and it gets people into businesses," she said.

The art walk features 11 galleries, many of which bring in artists to work in the store.

Police car hits school bus during chase

Nobody was hurt Thursday after a Plymouth Township police car on route to an armed robbery smashed into a school bus.

Less than an hour later the robbery suspect was arrested by Redford Township police and a second township police car was damaged that afternoon after it was hit from behind by a car on Five Mile Road

east of Sheldon.

It took nearly a half hour for towing crews to figure out how to get the bus blocking Mill at the East Middle School driveway off the hood of the police car, which Police Chief Carl Berry said was totaled.

The bus had turned left in front of the speeding police car, which nearly slid all the way under the bus.

The chain of events opened at 8:50 a.m. That's when police got a call

from the Burger King Restaurant that an armed robbery had just happened.

Restaurant employees told police a man entered the place doorways of the restaurant, placed an order, then pulled out a .38 caliber chrome-plated revolver.

He then told a male counter employee to give him money from a cash drawer, then left through the front door brushing past a fright-

ened husband and wife from Texas with their three children, police said.

The counter worker and other thief get into a 1995 purple Ford Probe, which he drove south on Sheldon to I-96 and headed east.

After police got the call, one officer drove from the township police station with siren and signals on. Fol-

Teacher talks linger, students stage walk out

Despite a student walk-out at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Friday and impassioned pleas from 34 teachers, students and parents at Tuesday's board of education meeting, little progress was realized in the effort to reach agreement on a teachers' contract last week.

Negotiators for teachers and the board were scheduled to resume bargaining at 2:30 p.m. today, Monday, Sept. 30. A state mediator was expected to be present.

While the state has issued a fact

finder for the district, the teachers' union does not consider bargaining to be at an impasse, said Plymouth-Canton Education Association President Chuck Portelli.

Tom Cotner, chief negotiator for the teachers, has requested that the district go to binding arbitration, as it has done in past labor disputes.

However, Errol Goldman, assistant superintendent for employee relations and the district's chief negotiator, contends that fact finding is the next step under the Public Employees Relations Act, which governs collective bargaining for public

employees.

"Fact-finding serves the same function (as arbitration), of having a third party come in with a recommendation," said Goldman.

Unlike arbitration, however, fact-finding is not binding.

In the last bargaining session Sept. 23, "both parties made movement on salary," Goldman said.

Several hundred students took part in a walk-out five minutes into fifth hour Friday afternoon, holding a rally on the Canton High School football field.

A flier distributed by students

urged support for fellow students.

"See, it's against the law for the teachers to protest, but yet there ain't a damn thing in the law that says that students can't," it read.

The hundreds of cheering students who packed the bleachers had their critics. "They think this is going to change something, but it's stupid," said one student, watching in the rain.

"I'm failing chemistry class now, because teachers aren't doing study

School volunteers sought for forums

The Plymouth-Canton Community Schools is in the process of gathering and analyzing data to address facility issues to meet the community's future educational needs.

The second Forum seeks to build on the first by addressing the responses to questions developed as a result of the first Forum as they relate to facility needs.

This will include looking at implications of these responses including costs.

The third Forum will consist of discussing a limited number of options and priorities focusing on previously defined priorities determined in the second Forum.

Geake to hold office hours

Area residents will be able to meet with State Sen. Bob Geake in the district, during office hours being held through October and beginning of November.

Geake is holding weekly meetings at township libraries across the district in order to listen to concerns of constituents and to gather input and feedback on pending public policy issues.

"It is important to stay in touch with the people I represent," Geake said. "I want to make sure I have the input and feedback from my constituents to vote properly on their behalf in Lansing. I enjoy meeting direct-

ly with the people of this area and encourage all those who can attend office hours to please do so."

Butterfly watchers needed in area

Some monarch butterflies migrate up to 3,000 miles from Mexico to the northern U.S. and Canada and researchers want to know more about their travel routes.

Rosita Smith, who serves as a city planning commissioner, gets interested in animal rights and pro-environment efforts and she's also active in Monarch Watch.

It's a non-profit group that grew out of a University of Kansas research project started four years ago.

While researchers said they know where the monarch migration begins and ends, they don't know how the butterflies find their way along the route and back to the same fields in Mexico.

"They're trying to find out if the monarch is endangered," Smith said, adding researchers don't know to what extent encroaching development has affected the butterflies.

While it's estimated there are up to 100 million monarch butterflies, authorities say their annual migration is seriously threatened by human activities. Reducing the number of fields available for habitat is having an impact, partly because milkweed plants are found there.

"Milkweed is the only plant the monarch can lay its eggs on," she said. "They ingest the alkaloids in the milkweed and it protects them from predators. They become unpalatable to birds."

Monarch Watch seeks to sign up members, who are asked to participate in activities to back the project. The activities include tagging the butterflies — an activity Smith introduced to

two classes of sixth-graders last week at East Middle School.

"We need to educate the future generations to appreciate this because this is going to be their world," she said. "They need to know they're part of a cycle."

Monarch Watch reports send-

ing out more than 80,000 tags and 1,100 membership kits to new members last fall. The butterflies lay eggs and new butterflies emerge twice during the year, in spring and in late August through September.

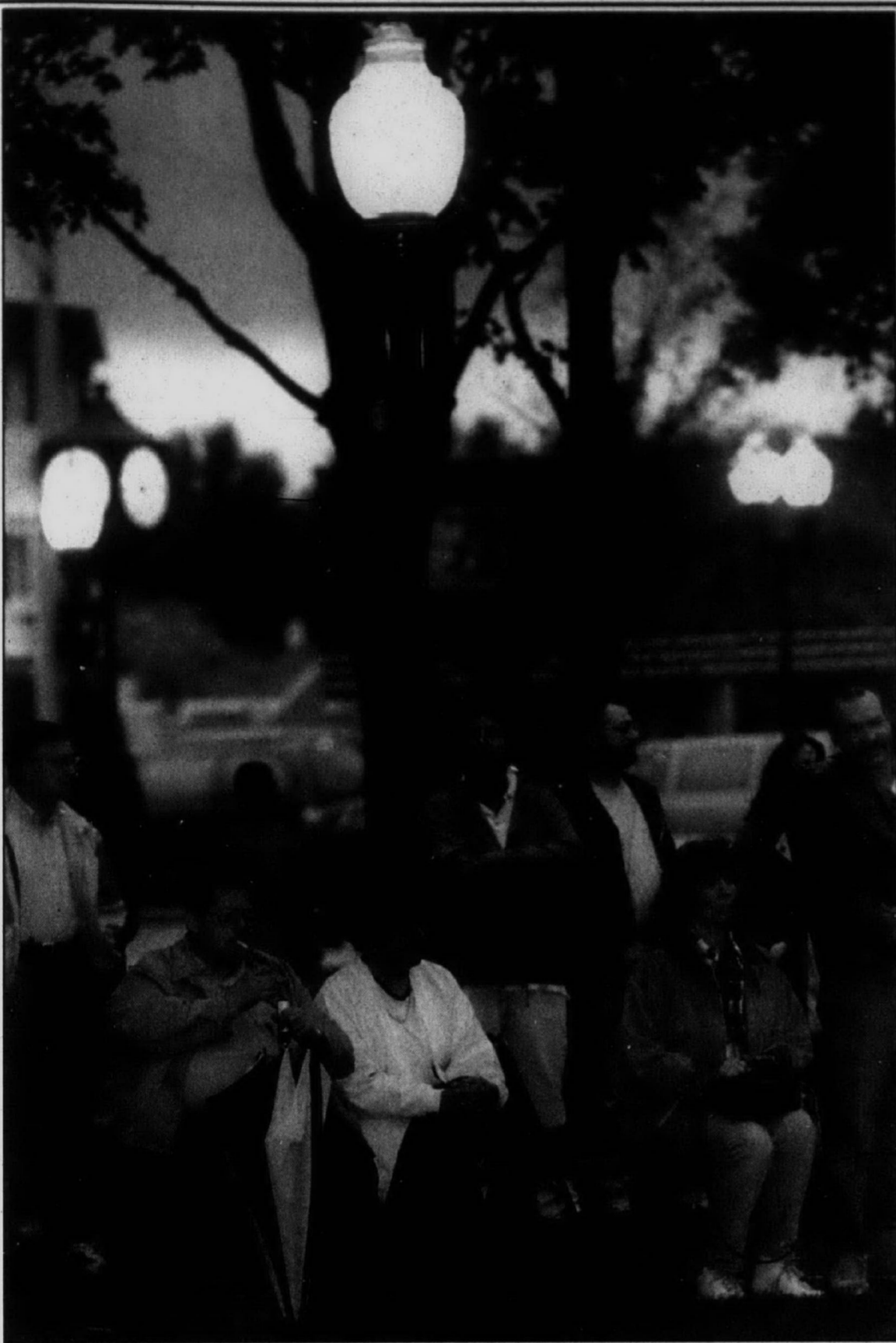

It is sponsored by the art galleries and the Plymouth Community Arts Council. It's in its third year.

"We don't have anything like it in Birmingham," said Jerome Meldrum who was helping out at Wild Wings. "It's a nice turn out."

Meldrum runs a Wild Wings gallery in Birmingham and was working in the Plymouth store.

He speculated that the chilly weather chased a lot of people inside.

"There have been a lot of buyers, a lot of families," he said.

The street traffic between the 11 galleries continued on Sunday as the weather improved, with sunny skies and warmer temperatures.

Street musicians played for the crowds that walked the streets.

At Native West, Michael Kahe, a member of the Hopi tribe from Arizona, carved kachina dolls from wood to the delight of the crowd.

"It's the first time I've done one of these shows," he said.

"The dolls are a way to honor the things around us, the things

in nature," he said.

The native American dolls are supernatural and represent the spirit or essence of animal and inanimate objects in the natural environment.

Kahe said the Hopi believe that the spirits become real when they are carved.

One onlooker asked if he had ever carved a spider kachina.

"No, and I don't want to, it's too powerful to look into the eyes of the spiderwoman spirit," he said.

Township taxes take slight dip

At least for a few months, taxes are going down in Plymouth Township.

The township board of trustees on Tuesday set the total millage rate levied by the township at 3.59 - down from the most recent rate, 3.60.

The new millage rate will be applied to tax bills sent out in December to township residents.

The township homeowner with a house now valued at \$150,000 will see a 75 cent drop in their tax payment to the township

from \$270 under the old millage rate to \$269.25 under the new rate.

Taxpayers with a \$200,000 house will save \$1 thanks to the lower rate. Someone with a \$250,000 house will save \$1.25.

The overall rate dipped because the township's debt millage - used to pay off past water and sewer construction projects - is scheduled to decline over time, as the projects get closer to being paid off. The debt millage shrank to .2696 from .2731.

Township officials approved a general operating millage of .8297 mill, the same as that levied last year.

Also unchanged was the police and fire operating millage levy, at 1.6594, and a separate fire operating levy, at .8297.

While residents will save ever so slightly on their December township tax bill, it's likely rising assessments will mean higher tax payments next year.

Golf course paths to be paved

The plan was to pave new cart paths at Hilltop Golf Course this year. But when the Plymouth Township administration went out for bids, only one came in.

Because that bid was \$180,000 - far above the \$80,000 to \$100,000 the township had budgeted for the project - it will be bid again in January.

Township Engineer Michael Bailey told trustees in a report presented at the trustees regular meeting Tuesday that more contractors will likely be interested before the new construction season begins.

Tax break granted

Hess-Bright Michigan Inc. won approval from township trustees Tuesday for a five-year 50 percent tax break for equipment in its new facility going up in the Metro West Technology Park.

Project manager Steve Brown said the 44,000 square-foot facility, to be completed in January, would house offices, labs and a test facility for the ball bearing maker which serves the auto industry.

Brown said there would be 30 full time employees at the plant. Some would move from a company facility to be closed in Pennsylvania, and most would be new hires from the southeast Michigan area.

Project award

The Ann Arbor Road corridor improvement plan put together by city and township government officials has earned the 1996 Outstanding Planning Project Award from the Michigan Society of Planning Officials.

The award was presented at a dinner in Lansing Thursday, attended by Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen McCarthy, Director of Public Services James Anulewicz, city Mayor Pro-Tem John Vos III and David Schaff, city planning commission chairman.

The MSPO in announcing the award said the charette or brainstorming session involving area university design students that officials organized was a skillful way to generate ideas. Continental

sessions after school," said Sandy Kelly of Salem High School.

"They might cancel prom and

homecoming," said Kris Huston, a Salem sophomore.

Erik Hautly of Canton High School said, "We think this is

stupid and pointless. Teachers don't have to do any extracurricular things or write recommendations for college, because it's not in their contract."

A parent who declined to give her name said, "I think it's appalling that kids have to be involved in this. It's going to affect their lives, and we're talking about one of the highest-paid districts in the area. I think it's disgusting."

Teachers addressing the board Tuesday spoke of declining morale, numerous unfair work rule changes, and the high scores of Plymouth-Canton students on standardized tests.

Twenty-two-year teacher John Bulmer told board members, "You will be remembered as the board that presided over the destruction of a once fine and excellent school district. Please accept the offer from Tom Cotner and turn the matter over to binding arbitration."

Teacher Sarah Smith said, "You've let some of our greatest resources move on to other districts. This debilitating power play is an insult to your staff."

Ted Bohlen, a member of the districts finance subcommittee, was the last speaker Tuesday night, and the only one critical of teachers.

"There is a bigger world than just you," he said. "We have 160 districts in Michigan which have more revenue per pupil than Plymouth-Canton, and pay less on average per teacher."

"At the moment, we have a budget of \$95.5 million. You remove salaries, benefits and utilities, and \$8.8 million is left. That goes for everything else, including textbooks, services,

lowing behind was a second officer in a car that was marked but not equipped with overhead signals.

The bus was operated by a female driver with 19 years experience driving for the Plymouth-Canton schools. The bus, headed north on Mill as were police, pulled to the right shoulder to let police pass. But after the first car passed, Berry said the bus turned left across the roadway to enter the middle school driveway — and the second police car smashed into it.

"The happy ending is that nobody got hurt," the chief said. "I'd rather replace metal any day than go to the hospital and see somebody hurt."

The official investigation of the crash — and any decision to charge the officer or bus driver —

would be made by the Plymouth city police department which is investigating the accident as it happened in the city limits.

Berry said the police car's air bag was not deployed in the collision, as the officer was able to turn the car as the bus was turning causing the front windshield to strike the side of the bus as the front end slid under. He was wearing a seat belt.

Meanwhile, area police were alerted to be on the lookout for the getaway car. Redford police spotted it at 9:25 a.m. at Five Mile and Telegraph roads, pulled it over and arrested the driver.

Charged Friday in 35th District Court in Plymouth was Michael Sebastian Bosket, 32, of Detroit. He was arraigned on one count of armed robbery, one felony firearm count, and one

count of being a fourth degree habitual offender.

Bosket was lodged Friday in the Wayne County Jail on \$100,000 bond. He faces a preliminary exam on the charges Friday in 35th District Court. Police said Bosket is also being investigated in connection with several other suburban armed robberies.

At 1:29 p.m. Thursday a township police car parked along Five Mile Road east of Sheldon was struck from behind, causing \$2,000-\$3,000 in damage, Berry said — the second township police car destroyed or damaged in one day.

The officer had parked the car to see if someone at the side of the road needed help, Berry said. There were no injuries.

she said. "It's a local call today and it will be a local call tomorrow."

Sayles said it's a growing trend around the country to move to 10-digit dialing with the main city and it's inner ring of suburbs usually maintaining the original area code.

To get folks used to the new 248 area code for Northville, callers will have a four-month period — from May through August — to dial either 248 or 810. The 248 area code will also be used for portions of Oakland County, Farmington and part of Livonia.

Callers to Plymouth will get a similar grace period, when both the old and new area codes can be dialed.

As to exactly when Plymouth's new area code will go into effect, Sayles said, "We are firming up specific dates."

Law backs DNA profiles to solve cases

For years, police have successfully used a DNA profiling database to catch and deter sex offenders in Michigan.

The state House recently passed a package allowing police to keep DNA profiles on convicted murderers and kidnapers, said state Rep. Gerald H. Law, the lead sponsor.

"This information is so valuable," said Law, R-Plymouth. "It allows police to pinpoint the perpetrator of a crime, solve numerous open cases and track repeat offenders in the future."

The measurers expand the list of crimes in which DNA records of convicted offenders must be retained.

The crimes include first- and second-degree murder, attempted murder, kidnapping and attempted kidnapping.

Currently, police keep DNA data on those guilty of committing or attempting first- through fourth-degree criminal sexual conduct and assault with intent to commit a sexual assault.

For the first time, DNA profiling also applies to juvenile criminals guilty of murder, kidnapping and sexual assault.

"If we are retaining DNA samples of violent adult offenders, it only makes sense that we keep track of juveniles as well," Law said.

"The age of the criminal does not diminish the crime, nor does it lessen the possibility of a repeat offense."

As a tool for solving crime, DNA comparison is one of the most accurate, according to the Michigan State Police.

By adding murderers and kidnapers to DNA profile databases, officials hope to resolve even more cases.

Under the package, the state Department of Corrections is prohibited from paroling or discharging prisoners without taking blood and saliva samples.

"This legislation allows Corrections officials to collect samples whether the prisoner likes it or not," Law said.

"Plus, it's a significant deterrent. Criminals, when released, will be less likely to commit more crimes if they know the police have foolproof evidence that could link them to a crime."

The bills target only convicted criminals.

Those who had DNA testing done as part of a criminal investigation, but were not convicted of any crime, are protected from having their profile added to the police database.

House Bills 5783, 5912-5914, 6061 and 6062 now go to the Senate for consideration.

Candidates stress connection with voters

Democratic Congresswoman Lynn Rivers and her Republican challenger Joe Fitzsimmons, vying for the 13th District seat in Congress, both say their backgrounds serve them well.

Rivers, who struggled as a teen parent to make ends meet while she studied for her bachelor's and law degrees, says her background helps her identify with ordinary people.

Fitzsimmons, a retired business executive, says his business experience as CEO at UMI in Ann Arbor makes him qualified to serve as a U.S. representative.

In a race that has resulted in some heated exchanges by press release, Rivers, an Ann Arbor resident and former state representative and school board member, is seeking her second term in Congress in the 13th District, while Fitzsimmons, also an Ann Arbor resident, has been campaigning against her for about a year. This would be his first elected office.

Fitzsimmons' campaign has issued press releases accusing Rivers of many things including being against family values and welfare reform.

Rivers calls the attacks nasty, adding she has supported welfare reform and a balanced budget. "It is very surprising to me. I hadn't expected that from him," she said.

On the issues, Fitzsimmons said he sees the major ones as the economy and education.

The country needs to grow a stronger economy, he said.

It is not growing at the rate it needs to grow, and the way to make it grow is to reduce taxes, Fitzsimmons said.

Government spending needs to be controlled as well, he said.

"The only way we can balance the budget is to do both simultaneously," Fitzsimmons said.

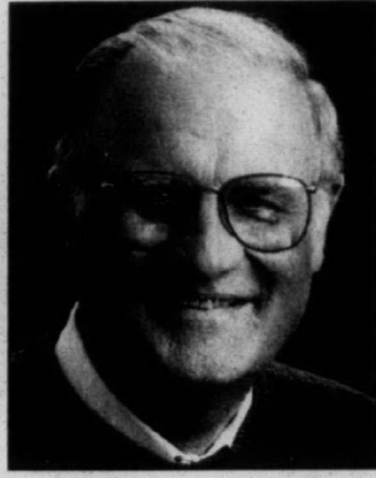
Constituents decide the issues, Rivers said, adding that retirees at a picnic she had just attended before stopping for an interview, expressed concerns about the future of Medicare.

A lot of things proposed in the 104th Congress would make things harder on working families such as a proposal that would have changed the way overtime is handled, an employee could be expected to work an average of 40 hours a week over several weeks meaning it could be 65 hours one week and 15 the next, she said. Or an employee could be forced to accept comp time instead of getting overtime pay, she said.

As someone who at one time depended on her husband's overtime pay to make ends meet, Rivers sees that as "terribly negative" for working families, she said.

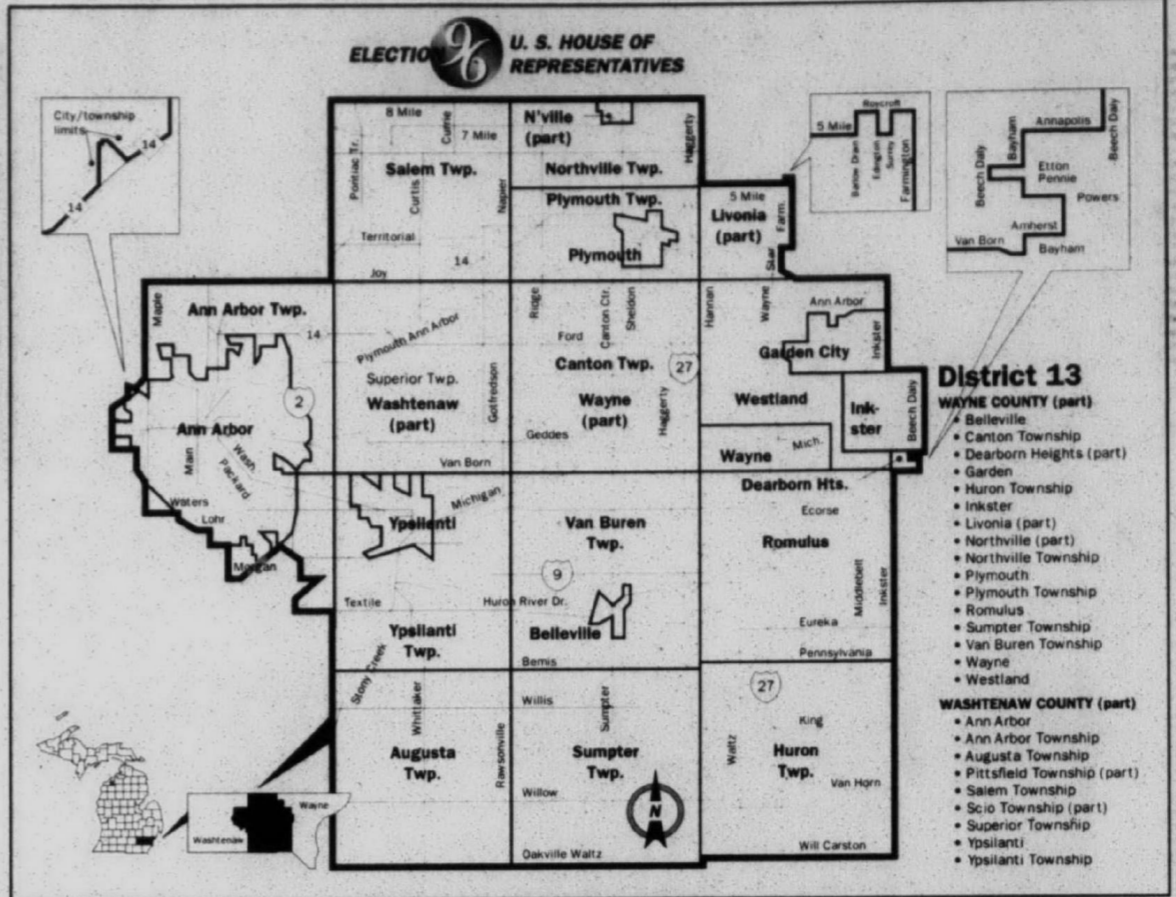
Protection of the environment and whether the government plans to roll back some parts of the environmental laws are also among constituents' top concerns, she said.

Education is a top issue, not only higher education, but kindergarten through 12th grade as well, she said.

Fitzsimmons is also focusing on is education, which he feels goes hand-in-hand with a better economy. If the economy is changed and the budget balanced, interest rates will come down and student loan interest rates will also come down, Fitzsimmons said.

"I want to provide access for everyone who wants to get a good education," he said.

Fitzsimmons said he would look at the education process to allow more local decision making. The education system should be for parents and students and not for bureaucracy,

he said. "People in the education system are consumed with red tape," he said.

He would reduce red tape by downsizing the Department of Education to "eliminate interference," he said.

He would fight for more direct funding as opposed to reducing student loans, but accountability is needed, he said.

People need jobs with paychecks that aren't chewed up by taxes, Fitzsimmons said.

"I'm not one to vote to increase taxes," Rivers said. As a state representative she supported very few tax increases, she said.

"I run my office in a very frugal manner," she said, pointing out she returned more than \$244,000 to the treasurer from her office budget in 1995.

On the issue of crime, she advocates a system of law enforcement and punishment

that deals with criminals quickly, but also backs a prevention program. "We have to have a very integrated system that allows for both," she said.

Fitzsimmons says he is "very tough on crime." A strong economy would help reduce crime, he said. "The best thing in the world you can have is a good job," he said.

On welfare reform, Fitzsimmons says Rivers has voted against it, but she disagrees. She voted in favor of the recent welfare reform proposal that was approved in Congress. "I have always voted in favor of welfare reform," she said.

Rivers said she has fought for changes such as eliminating mass mailing. "I don't do them. They are really campaigning at public expense," she said.

She has done town hall meetings and district meetings in

the coffee shops and restaurants. "I spend a lot of time in the community. I put a tremendous emphasis on community service," she said.

Rivers, 39, is married and has two daughters. Fitzsimmons, 61, is divorced with five children and seven grandchildren.

"Because of my background I identify very closely with ordinary people," Rivers said.

"I think that's one thing I bring to Congress. I understand the real problems of people." Many in Congress don't understand what an additional \$45 a month on student loan payments can mean to working people, she said.

Fitzsimmons also cites his background as the son of a butcher and a school teacher. "I learned to trim in the fat in my father's store," he says in person and in his campaign literature.

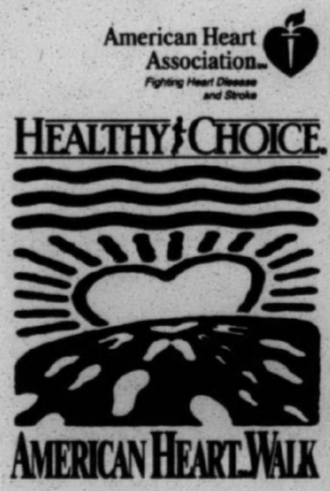

Democrats fall short on minimum wage bill

State Senate Democrats fell three votes short of forcing a minimum wage bill onto the floor for a final vote.

"This bill went through the House like (pause) manure through a goose," said Senate Labor Committee chair Mike Rogers, R-Brighton, who fought the Democratic effort to discharge the bill from his committee.

Replied Senate Democratic leader John Cherry of Clio: "The geese in his district must be constipated. The minimum wage hasn't been increased in 15 years. And this bill has been in the House five years."

When the manure-slinging debate was over, the Senate failed, 17-18 with three absent, to force House Bill 4180 onto the floor Sept. 25, the last session day prior to the election break.

"You're going to pay for it on election day," warned Democrat Virgil Smith of Detroit.

"It was a political rush to do someone's dirty work," said Republican floor leader Dan DeGrow of Port Huron.

Joining 16 Democrats to vote yes was Doug Carl, R-Macomb County. Seventeen Republicans voted no, and three outstate Republicans were absent. All area senators voted with their parties.

The bill cleared the House Sept. 10, first day of the fall session, by 94-12. It would raise the state minimum wage from the current \$4.25 to \$4.75 on Oct. 1 this year and to \$5.15 on Oct. 1, 1997. It also would reduce the tip deduction for restaurant waiters. The effect would be to bring the state minimum into line with the federal.

The parties drew radically different pictures of the 133,000 workers not in interstate commerce who would be affected.

Democrat Alma Smith of Salem saw the beneficiaries as waitresses supporting families and trying to get off welfare.

Republican Rogers saw them not as heads of families but as "younger, first-time workers."

Democrat Virgil Smith saw them as people trying to get by on minimum wage.

Rogers saw them as waiters collecting tips and averaging \$8 an hour.

Democrats argued that staffs in many restaurants pool their tips, so that waiters and waitresses share with bartenders, busboys and bouncers.

Democrat Cherry saw the effects as boosting local economies. "After every minimum wage increase in the past, jobs have increased. Those are high-velocity dollars that go 'round and 'round the economy," he said.

for me." Libby Maynard (D), recently an adjunct instructor of social work at U-M: "We are committed to help all students. It's an issue the whole state faces."

Deane Baker (R), incumbent regent: For any young person who starts, "the university assures they'll have financial support to continue their education. In 1978 the state provided 80 percent of the general fund budget; today, 38 percent."

S. Martin Taylor (D), Detroit Edison vice president: "It's critical that the university not price itself out of reach of the ordinary person. We have to get the biggest bang for our (budget) dollars. We have to make certain we get our faire share of state aid."

Charter schools?

Unlike Central Michigan Uni-

versity, which has granted dozens of charters for specialized academies, U-M's Board of Regents has granted none.

Baker (R): "There has been only one discussion — an amalgamation arrangement with Wayne State University. Wayne went ahead and did that project themselves."

Taylor (D): "I'm not familiar with the responsibilities toward charter schools. . . whether it would detract from the university's mission. I would reserve a position on that."

Bishop (R): "The charter school act requires that those universities which charter schools become superintending controllers. It's difficult for universities, with many things they have to keep their eye on, to run charter schools. It's good to find different ways to educate our kids, but we don't want to lose our

focus on the universities. I have faith in our public schools, and I don't want to scrap them."

Maynard (D): "I'm troubled by the concept of charter schools. I don't want to see the destruction of public schools."

Open meetings?

When the Board of Regents in 1987-8 conducted its search for a president entirely behind closed doors, two newspapers sued and won in the state Supreme Court.

Baker (R): "It presents some very real difficulties. Many competent individuals will not apply without confidential interviews. . . A committee will bring us five candidates."

Bishop (R): The law gives regents "some significant setbacks. Whether we can attract the best candidates. We have to sit down and decide how to attract the most qualified candi-

dates and find a way to satisfy the law."

Taylor (D): "I understand the Open Meetings Act and support its principles. There need to be some exceptions: union negotiations. . . presidential searches. You can't attract top-flight candidates (with open interviews). There should be no negative impact on the public. (Open interviews are) unworkable."

Maynard (D): Open meetings are needed "so the public can know what's going on. I'm confident the regents can live within the law."

operators taking home \$40,000 out of a \$300,000 gross who would lay off two or three workers apiece if the minimum wage were raised.

Added Republican Shugars: "A study by President Jimmy Carter's commission showed that every 10 percent increase in the minimum wage causes a 2 to 3 percent reduction in entry-level jobs."

Rogers closed by saying he would heed the requests of such House Republicans as Jim Ryan of Redford to take up the bill in November.





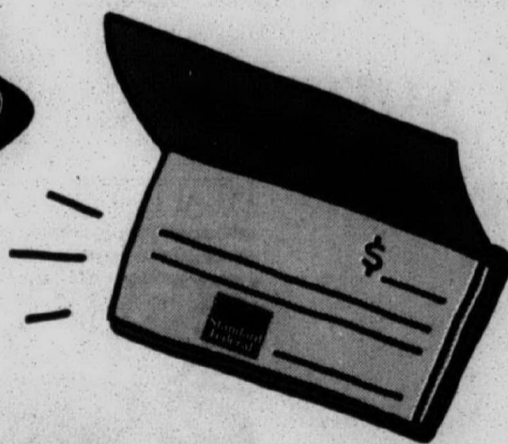

Enjoy your garden goodies, savor their flavor

Don't you just love this time of year? Your calls, and letters, indicate you are enjoying the harvest, and looking for ways to cook, and store those summer treats. If your garden is anything like mine, new ideas for garden goodies will always be appreciated.

■ Ann Malesheski of Plymouth wants a good tomato sauce recipe that cans and freezes well. Trust me Ann, it doesn't get any better than this, and when flavorful summer tomatoes are not available, use canned plum (Roma) tomatoes.

TOMATO SAUCE

- 1/2 cup olive oil, preferably extra virgin
- 1 cup finely chopped onions
- 1 cup finely chopped carrots
- 1 cup finely chopped celery or fennel bulb
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic, or to taste
- 4 cups peeled, seeded and chopped ripe red Roma tomatoes
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Salt and fresh ground pepper to taste

In a saucepan, heat the oil over medium high heat. Add the onions, carrots and celery and saute until soft and lightly golden, about 8 minutes. Add garlic and saute one minute longer.

Stir in the tomatoes, sugar, salt and pepper and lower heat to a simmer and cook, uncovered, until thick, about 30 minutes. Use immediately, or refrigerate for 4-5 days. Sauce can be canned or frozen. Reheat before using. Makes about 4 cups.

Chef's Secret: I like to make this sauce plain, then, while reheating, add about 2 tablespoons of minced fresh basil and parsley. If you can or freeze it with the herbs, it has a tendency to get a tad bitter.

Recipe source: *Janet Gang favorite.*

■ Patty from Rochester Hills wants to know where she can purchase Lavash bread. Lavash is a paper-thin, circular-shaped bread made mostly from whole grain. It contains about 90 calories per round, and makes a great roll-up sandwich. Look for it in the bread department of most grocery stores. Shopping Center Markets, Danny's, Meijer's and Kroger sell it. Expect to pay about \$1.49 per package.

■ Marcy of Garden City has a load of gorgeous eggplant in her garden, and wants to make the Middle Eastern dish called baba ghanouj. Here's a great recipe:

BABA GHANNOUJ

- 1 (1 pound) eggplant
- 3 tablespoons tahini (sesame seed paste)
- Juice of 1 lemon, (about 1/4 cup)
- 1 clove garlic, peeled and crushed with 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons cold water
- 1/2 teaspoon Hot Hungarian paprika
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- Olive oil

Prick the eggplant three or four times with a fork and set in a hot oven or over hot coals and turn as each side becomes black and the flesh very soft.

Meanwhile, place tahini, lemon juice and crushed garlic in a food processor and blend until smooth. Add 3 tablespoons cold water to thin and lighten the mixture. When the eggplant has completely collapsed, remove from heat.

When cool enough to handle, remove the charred skin and any hard seeds. Squeeze the eggplant to remove bitter juices. Mash eggplant with a masher, then add to the tahini mixture in the food processor. Pulse to blend. Place the dip in a shallow bowl and garnish with paprika, parsley and drizzle with olive oil. Serve with pita triangles. Serves 4. Makes about 2 cups.

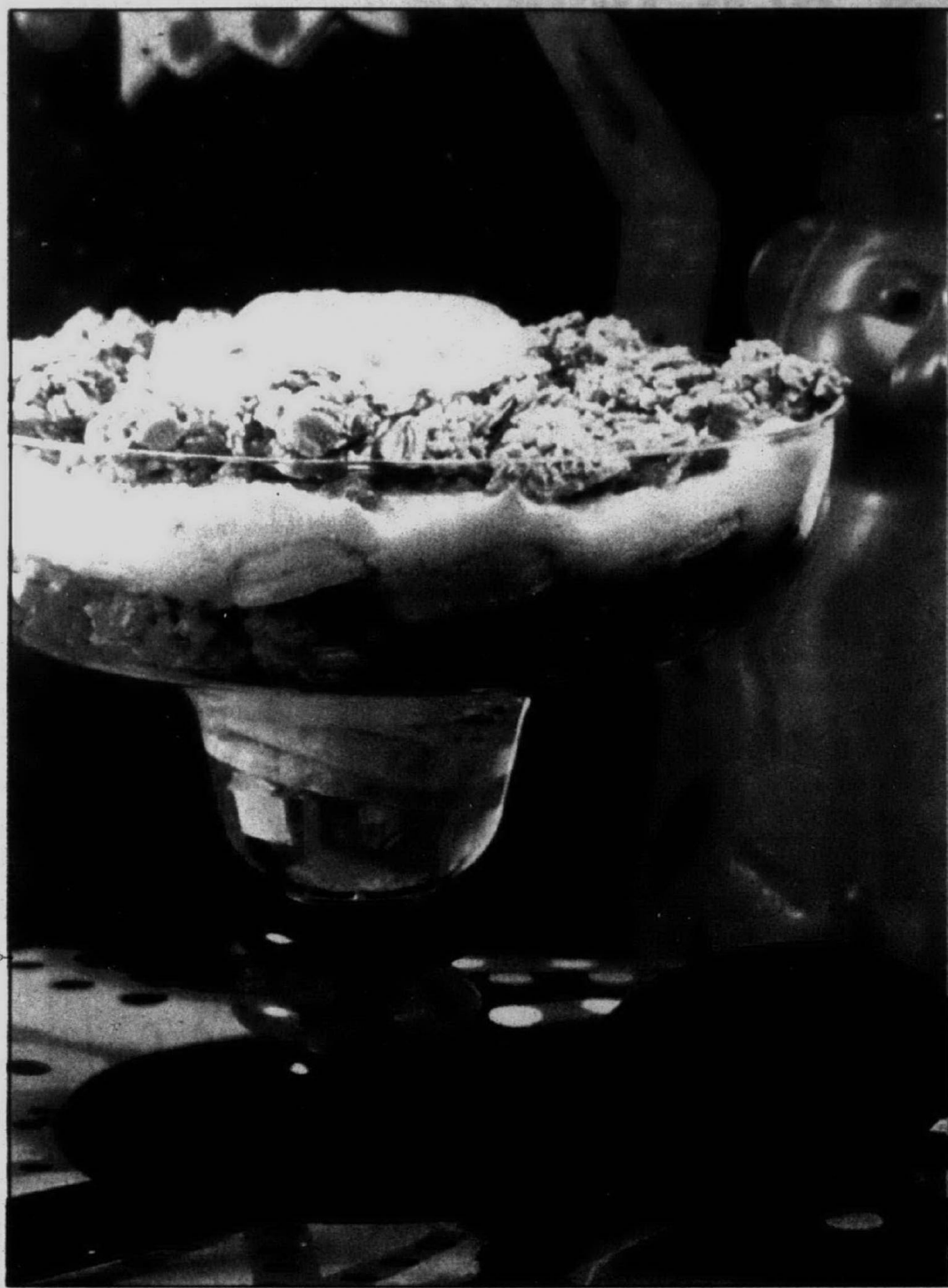

'Break-fast' jump starts your day

Breakfast treat: Combine honey granola, bananas, and low-fat yogurt to make Crunchy Honey-Yogurt Breakfast Parfait. It's pretty to look at, and good to eat.

Even if we're in a hurry, we'll stop at a gas station on the way to work to fuel our cars, but we won't make time for breakfast. Cars don't run on empty, and neither do people. We need fuel to start our day.

"Breakfast is brain food," said American Dietetic Association president Doris Derelian, a registered dietitian. "A child who fills his tank in the morning does better in the classroom - he'll perform better on tests and is more likely to remember what is learned in school. After eight to 10 hours without food, the body is essentially a cold furnace, waiting to be stoked."

Contrary to what you might think, skipping meals won't help you lose weight faster. In a study of women, on a 1,200-calorie-a-day diet, researchers at Vanderbilt University discovered those who skipped breakfast lost about 13 pounds each; those who ate breakfast lost 17 to 19 pounds.

We even burn calories when we sleep. "A lot of refueling goes on while you're asleep," said Betty Kriegel, a registered dietitian, and clinical manager of food and nutrition services at Crittenton Hospital in Rochester.

"The first meal we eat when we wake up is important to give the body the nutrition it needs for the rest of the day, to help us face the day, and the activities. Our metabolism is raised by eating."

Those few minutes saved by skipping breakfast could cost you later. "When we miss breakfast we get into a slump around 10 or 11 a.m.," said Kriegel. "Then we grab - a pastry, doughnut, or something from the vending machine."

Eating and preparing breakfast doesn't take a lot of time. Kriegel recommends a bowl of whole grain cereal and piece of fruit. Read labels, though, because cereals sometimes contain a lot of sugar and sodium.

According to the American Dietetic Association, one-third of school-aged kids fix their own breakfast. Stock up on several kinds of cereals, raisins, fruit, juice, milk and yogurt, breads, and rice cakes.

"Children are most likely to eat breakfast if their parents eat breakfast," said Kay Sweeney of Southfield, a registered dietitian for Botsford Hospital's Health Development

Network in Novi. "Children who don't eat breakfast in the morning become restless, and have trouble concentrating in school."

Adults who skip breakfast often feel irritable and restless by mid-morning because our blood sugar level drops when we don't eat. If we're at work, "we'll grab whatever's readily available, often a doughnut, to satisfy our hunger, and this defeats weight-loss efforts," said Sweeney.

Reviewing research on the effects of breakfast on school performance, Ernesto Pollitt, Ph.D. reported a significant correlation between eating in the morning and test results, recall memory and verbal skills in the *Journal of the American Dietetic Association*, October 1995. Hungry children just can't do their best work. They're easily distracted and become fidgety, irritable and tired.

Sweeney starts her day by eating a bowl of cereal in the morning - warm cereal (oatmeal) in the winter, and cold cereal with milk and cut-up fruit such as bananas during warmer months.

For grab-and-go breakfasts, she recommends bagels or English muffins. "It doesn't have to be anything fancy."

Parents can learn more about food and nutrition issues by calling the Consumer Nutrition Hot Line of the American Dietetic Association's National Center for Nutrition and Dietetics 1-800-366-1655. Registered dietitians are available to answer nutrition questions or provide referrals to local dietitians weekdays 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Callers can listen to a variety of recorded nutrition messages 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday. Messages change every month.

Busy mom makes good food easy to swallow

Apples, broccoli, and cabbage, are good for you, but they're not as appealing as eclairs, fudge and gingersnaps.

"There's still a negative connotation about light, low-fat eating," said cookbook author Rose Reisman. "Those foods are viewed as second-rate."

In her eighth cookbook, "Rose Reisman's Enlightened Home Cooking," (Robert Rose, Inc., copyright, September 1996, \$18.95) she shares recipes for preparing low-fat foods with lots of flavor.

Time-saving tips, and make-ahead suggestions accompany the ten subject chapters in her book, which include appetizers, soups, salads, vegetables, chicken and desserts. Each recipe has a complete nutritional analysis, and there are 16 full-color photographs.

Reisman is an author on a mission. Besides offering nutritious recipes, and meal planning suggestions that help busy families enjoy dinner together, her books benefit the Y-ME National Breast Cancer Organization. A portion of book sales are donated to the non-profit group whose patient advocacy programs have been providing information, hotline counseling, educational programs and self-help meetings for breast cancer patients, their families and friends for more than 15 years.

Research is under way, but there does appear to be an association between a high-fat diet, excessive weight gain and the incidence of breast cancer.

She's the first to admit it's not easy. "People will say 'I get in at 6:30 p.m.,' that's when they turn to pizza delivery. They're still spending time, and money. I set 30 minutes aside for us to eat together, even if it's rushed. I'll give the kids a snack after school, and we might not eat until 7 p.m."

Starting dinner from scratch after work, and school activities is a chore. To save time, Reisman stocks a pantry with canned tomatoes and other frequently used items; makes sauces, Beefaroni and other family favorites on weekends, planning to have leftovers, which she freezes in serving size containers.

Encouraging children to eat nutritious foods takes effort. "Kids are the toughest," she said. "I asked them, 'what foods do you like to eat?' Fast food was their answer." But these foods don't have to be unhealthy.

Potato Wedge Fries, and Honey Coated Crunchy Chicken Fingers, found in the "Kids Favorites" chapter, contain only one gram of fat per serving.

With over 175 recipes to choose from deciding which ones to make is a challenge. "Menus for Everyone," the last chapter of the book, offers suggestions for Family Dinners, Reheatable Family Casseroles, and even Extravagant "Impressive" Dinners, made with recipes featured in the book.

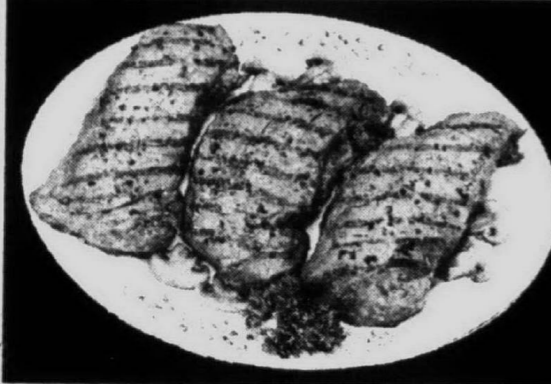

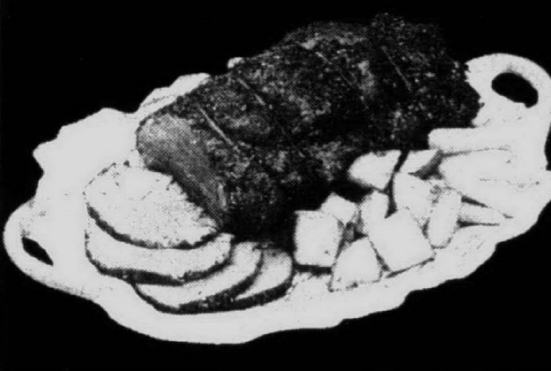
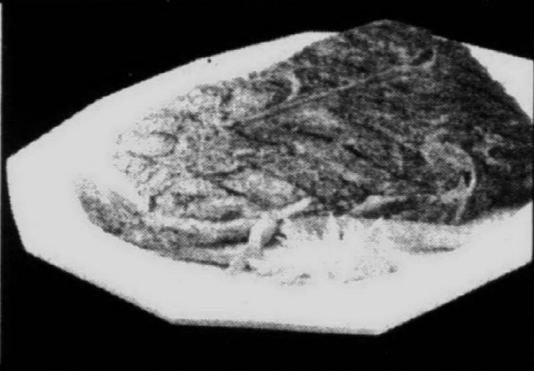

CRUNCHY HONEY-YOGURT BREAKFAST PARFAIT

- 1 large banana, sliced and divided
- 1/3 cup honey, divided
- 1/2 cup plain low-fat yogurt, divided
- 1/2 cup Honey Granola (recipe follows)

Reserve several slices of banana for garnish. Layer 1/4 of the sliced banana, 1 tablespoon honey, 2 tablespoons yogurt, 2 tablespoons granola, 1/4 of the sliced banana, 1

tablespoon honey, 2 tablespoons yogurt, and 2 tablespoons granola in parfait glass.

Repeat for second parfait. Garnish with reserved banana and remaining honey. Serves 2.

HONEY GRANOLA

- 4 cups old-fashioned rolled oats
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped nuts
- 1 cup raisins
- 3/4 cup honey
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

2 egg whites, lightly beaten

In large mixing bowl, combine oats, nuts and raisins; mix well and set aside. Combine remaining ingredients. Pour honey mixture over oat mixture and toss until well blended.

Spread on lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350° F. for 20 minutes or until lightly browned; stir every 5 minutes. Remove from oven and cool. Crumble and store in airtight container up to 2 weeks. Makes 16 (1/2 cup servings).

CATERPILLARS

- 1/2 cup flake cereal
- 1 tube (11 ounces) refrigerated soft breadstick dough
- Yogurt, fruit, applesauce or cottage cheese

Heat oven to 350° degrees F. Spread a large piece of waxed paper or aluminum foil on the kitchen counter.

Put 1/2 cup of the cereal into a sandwich-size plastic bag. Lightly crush the cereal. One at a time, unravel dough on the waxed paper or foil. Fold dough in half so it's about 6 inches long. Put the dough into the plastic bag and turn it until it is coated with cereal.

Place on an ungreased baking sheet, slightly curving the dough to look like a caterpillar.

Repeat with the remaining pieces of dough. Crush more cereal if you run out. Place the dough pieces about 1 inch apart on the baking sheet.

Bake until light brown, about 15 minutes. Cool 5 minutes, then eat warm.

BAKED APPLE

- 1 medium baking apple, washed, not peeled
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 6 raisins
- 2 teaspoons butter or mar-

garine

- 1 sprinkle of ground cinnamon
- 1 whole-grain waffle, toasted, quartered

Cut out the core of the apple. With a peeler, pare the skin from around the top of the apple. Put the apple in a small microwave dish. Put the brown sugar and raisins into the center of the apple.

Top with margarine or butter. Sprinkle lightly with cinnamon. Cook uncovered in microwave for 2 to 2 1/2 minutes on High, or until the apple is almost tender when stuck with a fork. Let stand 5 minutes. Serve with toasted whole-grain waffle. Serves 1.

Ida Baxter of Southfield called to learn more about Bruschetta, a Tuscan-style garlic bread.

To make it, you need Tuscan style bread with a hard crust and chewy center; good olive oil, something imported and "first cold pressed" will work the best; and fresh garlic cloves.

BRUSCHETTA

- 4 large slices Tuscan styled bread
- 2 cloves garlic, peeled and cut in half
- 1/2 cup olive oil

Salt and fresh ground pepper to taste

Place the bread slices on aluminum foil and place in an oven preheated to 375° degrees F. Toast the bread for about 8 minutes on each side, then rub each side with the cut cloves of garlic while the bread is still warm. Warm the oil gently in a small saucepan and immediately drizzle over the toasted bread on a serving dish. Sprinkle lightly with salt and pepper. Serve immediately. Serves 4.

Cindy from Walled Lake is hoping I might have a recipe for great tasting fry cake doughnuts that can be rolled in powdered sugar, cinnamon sugar or finely chopped nuts.

Well Cindy, my Grandma Lory in Trenton used to make some fry cake doughnuts that to this day, bring back memories. Momma still has the recipe, although it looks a little tattered and splattered. I made them and they tasted just as good as they did 30 years ago!

FRY CAKE DOUGHNUTS

- 4 cups sifted all purpose flour
- 5 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup shortening

- 3 eggs
- 2/3 cup whole milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Oil for deep fat frying

Sift flour, salt, nutmeg, cinnamon and baking powder together. Set aside. Cream together the sugar and the shortening until fluffy.

Blend in the eggs, milk and extract. Beginning and ending with the dry ingredients, alternately add the dry ingredients with the creamed ingredients, blending thoroughly after each addition.

Chill dough for easier handling. Roll out dough 1/2 inch thick and cut with a lightly floured round doughnut cutter.

Fry in hot oil (375° degrees F.) for 1 1/2 minutes on each side, until golden brown, turning only once. Drain on absorbent paper towels. Makes about 24 medium doughnuts.

Combine Parmesan and paprika in another small bowl. Brush potato wedges with half of the margarine and cheese mixture. Bake for 20 minutes, turn the wedges, brush with remaining margarine mixture (reheat if necessary). Sprinkle on remaining Parmesan mixture, and bake for another 20 minutes or just until potatoes are tender and crisp. Serves 6.

Cooking classes inspire shoppers

Hudson's Marketplace kicked off its "Time To Get Cooking Classes" at the Somerset Collection in Troy Sept. 21 with Michael Chiarello, executive chef and partner in the award winning Tra Vigne Restaurant set in California's Napa Valley.

Founder and culinary director of the Consorzio line of flavored olive oils and vinegars distributed by Napa Valley Kitchens, Chiarello demonstrated creative recipes using his products. From Porcini Mushroom Flavored Olive Oil (\$8.95) to Roasted Garlic Dressing Marinade (\$6.50), Consorzio offers many ways to bring pleasure to the palate.

Trained in the tradition of French classical cooking, Chiarello spiced up sauteed chicken by adding his Roasted Garlic Vignette to a sage pan sauce then proceeded to splash Consorzio Roasted Garlic Flavored Olive Oil with oils and essences extracted from fresh garlic (\$6.95) in every dish from a parsley pesto sauce to a pastina with dried tomato paste.

I could hardly wait to get home and try it on fresh bread, pasta and in mashed potatoes. But my favorite taste treat was when I drizzled it over hot popcorn.

A chef for 14 years, Chiarello created the Consorzio line five years ago. Since then he has written two cookbooks filled with recipes for cooking with infused oils and flavored vinegars, \$12.95 each. Besides Tra Vigne, the 35-year old chef is also a partner in five restaurants in Aspen, San Francisco and Napa Valley and a bakery in Petaluma. He grew up in an Italian home devoted to the heritage of hearty foods. Chiarello began preserving just-picked herbs, vegetables and fruits in oil to retain the flavor in his foods at Tra Vigne (French for *between the vines*).

"We're the largest producer of virgin olive oil in North America," he boasted. "We farm over 250 acres of fruit and produce more than 40,000 gallons of olive oil a year. I believe that making olive oil is an art, cooking is a craft."

Freshness is key to dishes at Tra Vigne, which on a busy day feeds 1,000 customers.

"We serve simple food you can understand. For our tomato-mozzarella salad, tomatoes are picked fresh every morning so the dish smells as good as it tastes. My food is food for your soul," said the recipient of the 1995 Culinary Institute of America Chef of the Year Award.

Health plays an important role with Chiarello who ran seven miles before appearing at Hudson's. While he claims not to be a low-fat freak, he does not eat a lot of meat, opposes adding chemicals and preservatives to foods, and uses kosher instead of table salt because the more than 100 nutrients the body needs are removed during salt processing.

Wendy Williams first saw Chiarello at the Food and Wine festival in Aspen in June. She drove from Ann Arbor to watch Chiarello demonstrate creative ways of using flavored oils and infused vinegars to enhance foods.

"I like the Mango Vignette with berries, and the Tomato Vignette I use like a salad dressing. They just give it a good flavor. The Mango or Passion Fruit Vignette over a fruit salad is really good," she insisted.

Seated next to me were Dorothy and Tony Suchocki of Rochester Hills. They agreed Chiarello put on "quite a show."

"It was entertaining besides being good," said Dorothy Suchocki who loves to cook and especially enjoyed tasting the pastina and sweet potatoes flavored with Consorzio Cilantro Oil.

Marie Burgess, a former home economics teacher from Detroit, and Cecile Vexler of Windsor agreed with the Suchockis.

Spearmon flitted over the soggy surface 24 times for 134 yards, including a touchdown run of 21 yards.

The Rockets also got a stout night from 6-foot-6 junior quarterback Justin Berent, who completed 8-of-13 throws for 90 yards including a 35-yard scoring throw to Lou Hartwig on the game's opening possession.

Berent also scored on a one-yard run. Sean Heard recovered a fumble and was rewarded with a one-yard touchdown run and Steve Palling kicked a 25-yard field goal to help John Glenn improve to 4-0.

"That's a great football team," Moshimer said. "They're the best team in our conference. If there's a better one, I hope I don't have to play it."

Wow! 1997 BMW Z3 is pure fun

BMW's longtime motto has been "The Ultimate Driving Machine."

With the 1997 BMW Z3, ultimate is an understatement.

Get behind the wheel of this finely crafted instrument and start to play with it. Everything is right there, waiting, wanting to be touched. Knobs and controls are large enough that an ape could drive this thing.

Top speed: 140 mph.
My only wish is that I could have driven it on the speed-limitless Autobahn. It begs to be opened up every time you press down on the gas pedal. A license to speed.

From its traditional BMW heritage and distinctive styling to its ease of operation, this roadster is pure, unadulterated fun.

Everyone noticed this "Bond company car" when I drove it. Some poor gentleman riding his bicycle in Royal Oak craned his head a little too long and crashed into a parked car.

Powered by a 1.9-liter 4-cylinder engine mated to a 5-speed manual transmission, the Z3 is the first BMW roadster to hit the States since 1959, when BMW released the 507, and then in 1988 produced the Z1. Both were available only to the affluent and

are collector cars today.

In contrast, the Z3 — although just as exotic as its predecessors — is affordable at just \$28,750. It's pure BMW engineering at its very best and the Z3 is assembled by American hands in Spartanburg, S.C.

With a wheelbase of just 96.3 inches, the Z3 is 10 inches shorter than BMW's 3-series models. The shorter wheelbase and wide front and rear track immediately give it a tough front stance. The front grille — again, pure BMW

— further differentiate it from anything else on the road.

The Z3 is very agile, quick in handling and has a better-than-you-would-expect ride. The front and rear suspension systems are the same as you would find in the 3-series. It's a quiet ride even with the top secured and the windows rolled up.

This open 2-seater has a manual folding top that's very easy to use. Two quick arms release it from the front windshield and it's back there with the flick of the wrist. The entire top can be hidden with a smart-looking and easy-to-install soft cover that matches the interior color. The manual top is also very light, so you don't have to get out of the car to reinstall it.

As for safety — which is a valid concern with roadsters — BMW was mindful to crash-test it in straight frontal and offset barrier crashes. It meets the 1997 standards for side impacts. There are also reinforced wind-

shield pillars to protect the occupants during a rollover accident.

Instrumentation is smartly done, and the speedometer has great graphics with white numbers on a black background. There's also a tachometer and temp and fuel gauges.

The rear trunk is, well, as you would expect it to be — not too practical. There are storage places throughout the car, however, including in the pretty big glovebox, center console, doors, behind the seats and a lockable compartment directly behind the seats.

There's even a power outlet right up front for that cellular phone or radar detector.

The standard equipment list is right up there with the best: Twin-tube gas-pressure shock absorbers, engine-speed-sensitive variable-assist power steering, 4-wheel vacuum-assisted disc brakes, antilock brakes, 16-inch cast alloy wheels, body-color bumpers, power windows, cour-

tesy lights, cruise control, digital clock, 4-way power driver's seat, 2-way power passenger's seat, leather steering wheel, shift knob, handbrake grip and boot, power windows, air conditioning and dual airbags.

Standard is an AM/FM cassette stereo with six speakers. You wouldn't know it. If there's one thing this baby needs it's headrest-mounted speakers. On a freeway, you lose the stereo. Heck, on a busy street, you lose it.

But the car is so cool it's easy to overlook.

One neat feature is the intermittent wipers. When you're driving, they're going full tilt. When you slow speed or come to a stop, the windshield automatically gets intermittent wiping.

The option list is worth mentioning — all-season traction control, automatic transmission, leather upholstery, heated seats, outside mirrors and windshield washer jets, an aero kit, cell phone, CD changer, remote keyless entry and smoker package, just to name a few.

This car is really cool. James Bond drove it. Why shouldn't you?

Many Cold-Weather Car Problems Are Preventable

(AAA) — Basic car care and early preparation are the keys to safe and enjoyable cold-weather driving, according to the American Automobile Association.

"Winter breakdowns are more likely to occur when batteries are weak and when regular maintenance is neglected," said George Giek, managing director of AAA Automotive Services.

Based on a review of 27.5 million calls for emergency road service in 1995, AAA makes the following suggestions for avoiding winter-driving headaches:

- Have your vehicle thoroughly inspected. The engine oil, radiator, tires, battery and ignition system all must be in top condition to perform properly in cold weather. Windshield wipers, brakes, tires and exterior lights also should be checked.

- Prepare a winter survival kit. Suggested items include: a flashlight, blankets, booster cables, a warning device (flares or reflective triangle), a small bag of abrasive material (sand or nonclumping cat litter), cloth or roll of paper towels and a small shovel.

- To prevent fuel line freeze-up and to avoid running out of gas in dangerous, cold conditions, keep your fuel tank at least half full.

- Before attempting to jump-start a vehicle, always consult your owner's manual for hook-up instructions and safety information.

- Consider carrying a cellular phone or CB radio to summon assistance in case of an emergency.

"Vehicle failure is inconvenient any time of year, but roadside breakdowns in winter can quickly turn into dangerous situations," said Giek. "With careful preparation, however, cold-weather driving can be safe and enjoyable."

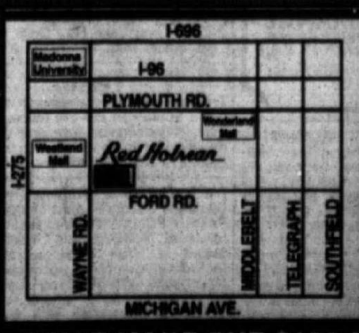

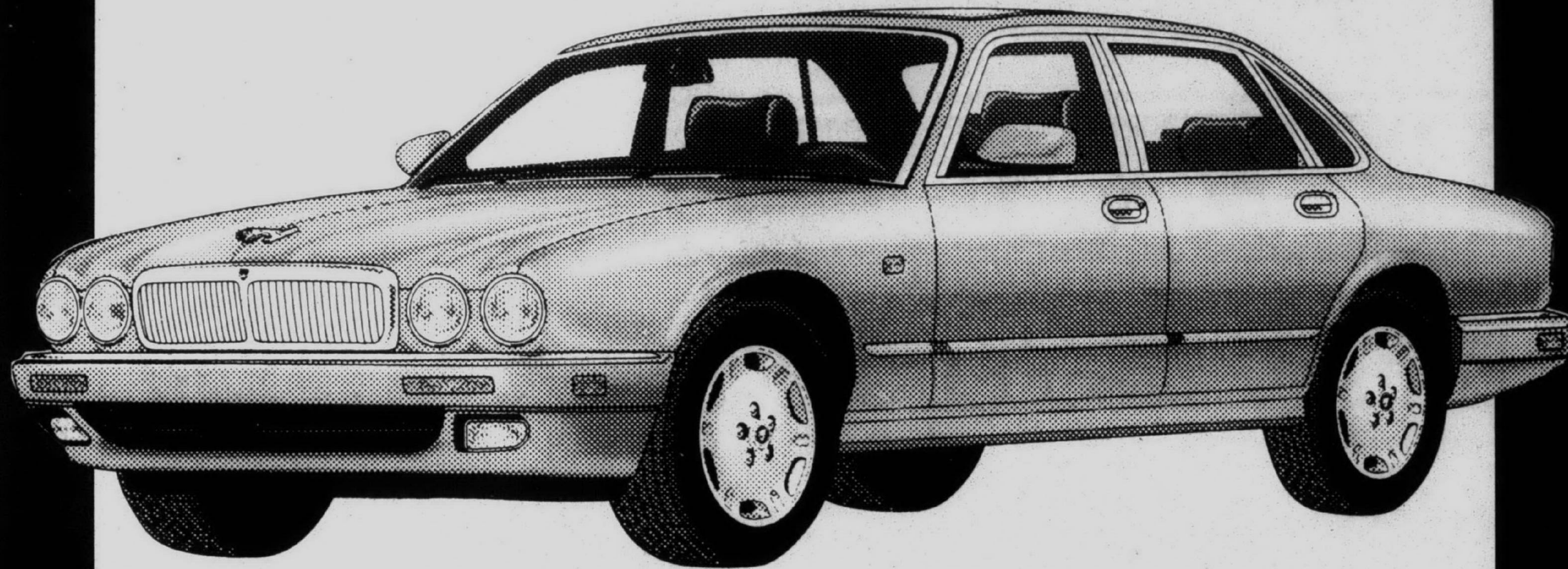
