School suit windfall unlikely

The Plymouth-Canton schools stand to get \$8.9 million, their share in the settlement of a lawsuit brought against the state. When the local district will receive money is undetermined.

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools are in line to get \$8.9 million from the state as their part of a settlement of a 16-year-old lawsuit. But no one is counting the money yet.

"We're not counting this money

until we have it," said Judy Evola, community relations director for the Plymouth-Canton schools. "This has already been 16 years, and it could be two years if it's appealed."

The total due to school districts across the state exceeds \$532 million.

In all, 84 school districts stand to receive from \$111,842 (Augres-Sims) to \$41.3 million (Pontiac). The suit

was initiated in 1980 by the Fitzgerald School District in Macomb County and was joined over the years by the other school districts.

Essentially, the plaintiffs claimed that the Headlee Amendment prohibited the state from reducing state aid to schools to below the pre-1978 levels.

The case eventually made its way to the state Court of Appeals which remanded it to Macomb County Circuit Court. In 1989, Circuit Court Judge George Deneweth ruled that the State Department of Education cut categorical aid for such programs as drivers' education, special

education transportation, school lunches and bilingual education, to out-of-formula school districts in order to help fund poorer in-formula districts.

The in-formula districts - those that received per-pupil grants from the state - said they were entitled to be reimbursed for what they spent on the programs since 1979 when Headlee went into effect.

Engler spokesman John Truscott said that before any money is paid, the state will ask the Michigan Supreme Court to reconsider its

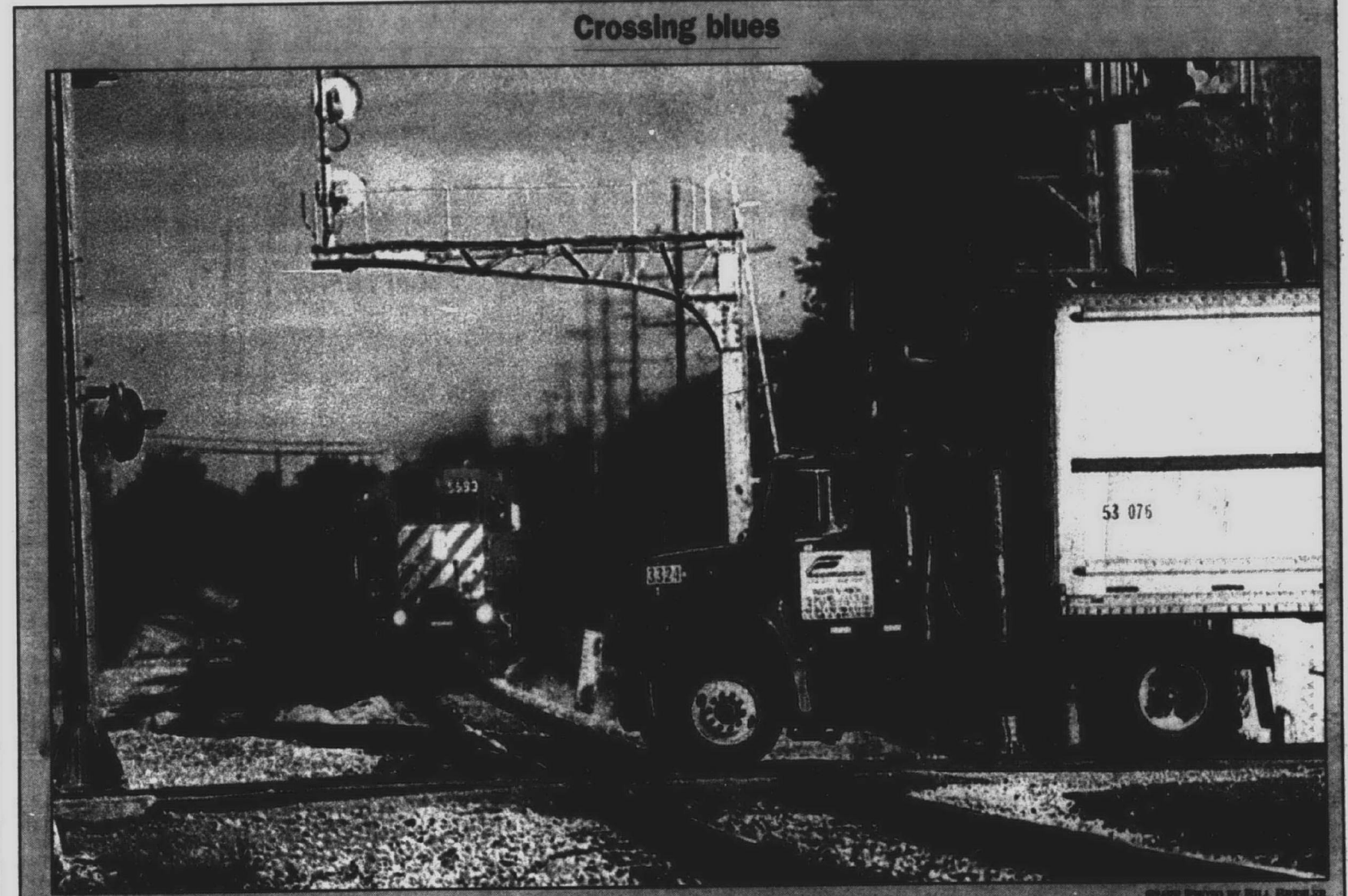

Dodging trains: Growing development in west Plymouth Township has some elected officials talking about the day when underpasses or overpasses will be necessary where train tracks cross roadways.

Railroad crossings draw attention

Imagine never again having to wait for a train to pass at a Plymouth Township crossing.

It could take 20-30 years. Still, it's not too early to start thinking about underpasses or overpasses where tracks cross roads.

That's what some township officials

are saying as booming development on the township's west side draws attention to railroad crossings.

Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen McCarthy said she does get complaints about long traffic stoppages at the tracks crossing Sheldon Road near M-14. "That crossing has been tremendously impact-

ed by long trains," she said.

Township Trustee Ron Griffith said that as development expands west, it follows that Plymouth and Canton will experience some problems Livonia has faced.

"In Livonia there was enough development that they decided they couldn't tolerate train interruptions any longer," he said.

Of crossings needing attention, Griffith said, "I think Sheldon is one of them and I anticipate Beck eventually. Sooner or later it's going to happen and if the money comes available we should jump on it."

While McCarthy said neither businesses nor residents are clam-

Effort to pay for Lincoln collection gets boost from Ford

Those hoping to bring a whopping collection of Abraham Lincoln items to Plymouth just got a boost from Ford Motor Co.

"We are very excited and happy to report that we received our grant from the Ford Motor Company Fund for \$50,000 toward the Petz Lincoln Acquisition," said Plymouth Historical Museum Director Beth Stewart.

Since museum backers had already raised \$27,000, money raised so far totals just more than half of the \$150,000 they've targeted to raise in the next year.

"We're working on other grants. We have a grant request into the State Bar of Michigan, we're looking at other possibilities," Stewart said.

The Ford grant was secured with the help of Plymouth Historical Society President Dan LeBlond, who works at the Ford Sheldon Road plant, and the plant's community relations committee.

The Plymouth museum is trying to obtain the collection of approximately 20,000 Lincoln-related items compiled by Oakland County's Weldon Petz.

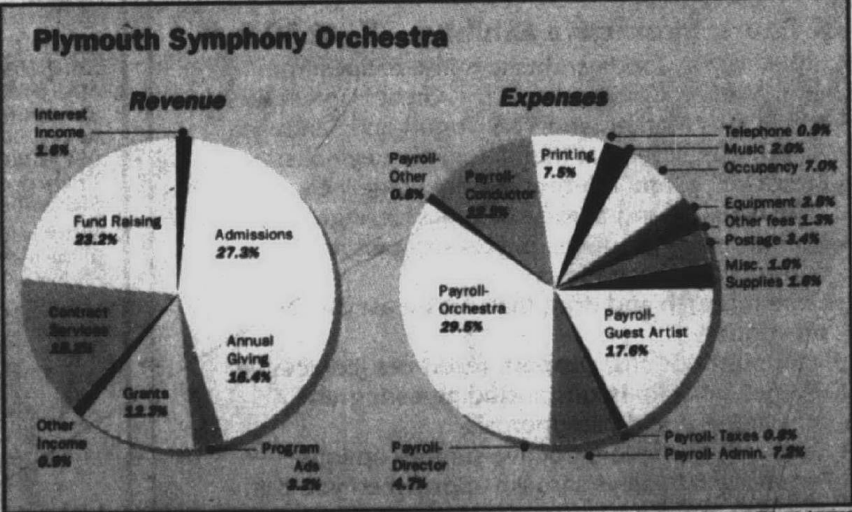
His collection has twice been exhibited at the Plymouth museum. The last showing was last spring and summer.

"The size of the collection is pretty incredible," Stewart said. "It includes exhibit items as well as documents, photographs and research material."

Among some standout pieces are a book Lincoln owned as a child and a plaster cast or mask of Lincoln's face and hands. "It also includes some of the greatest in-depth research material on Lincoln compiled in one place," Stewart said.

Plymouth Historical Society member and former Plymouth Mayor Jack Kenyon said housing the Lincoln collection "would give us a local facility in which Lincoln scholars can do some in-depth research."

Symphony struggles to balance finances

Funding for community orchestras is like musical notes: It runs high and low. Attracting patrons, developing marketing strategies and meeting budgets are ongoing struggles for both Plymouth's and Livonia's symphony orchestras.

The Plymouth Symphony Orchestra, which will operate

under a \$125,000 budget this year, spends an average of \$14,000 per concert and draws an audience of 400.

"Amortizing over the average annual attendance, the cost would be \$35 per concertgoer," said Ron Frechen, PSO treasurer.

The Livonia Symphony, operating under a \$142,000 budget this year,

Schools superintendent disputes equity fund claim by union

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools Superintendent Charles Little is taking issue with statements made by teachers in an advertisement in the Observer Sept. 26.

Little says that contrary to the ad - entitled "Plymouth-Canton Teachers Don't Strike, So Superintendent Does" - the district does not have a \$9 million fund equity surplus.
The superintendent also denies having said, "The board and I would be negligent if we

did not use every weapon in our arsenal against teachers" as quoted in the ad.
"That quote is incorrect. It is absolutely not true," said Little. "I am curious as to who said it, but there have been so many rumors that it is impossible to get to the bottom of it or even

find out the sources."
Plymouth-Canton Community Schools' 800-plus teachers have been working without a contract since school began a month ago.
The superintendent said he has some idea of how confusion could surface surrounding the district's surplus funds.

"We are going to have an audit report at the (board of education) meeting Tuesday which has a fund balance of \$4.5 million, give or take a 10th of a million," he said. "Someone looked at this year's budget, took the revenue change which is about 4.5 percent, and added them together. That truly would be a wonderful fund balance."
Little said he's also heard about things he supposedly said at the Sept. 27 student walk-out in protest of the labor dispute at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park. "I wasn't even at the park; I was in my office," the superintendent said.
The remainder of the teachers'

quarter-page ad said "Gov. Engler's Public Act 112 effectively prohibits teachers from striking for a fair contract. Superintendent Little and the board are taking unfair advantage of this law to attack teachers' salaries and medical benefits."
"This is a strike against teachers. This is a strike against the quality of your children's education. This is a strike against the Plymouth-Canton community. Something's rotten in the state of education."
The ad was paid for by donations from Plymouth-Canton teachers.

"The museum will have a lot of artifacts, and we should be able to draw visitors from the area and from some distance," Kenyon said.
Stewart said a countywide mailing to raise money to buy the collection will happen in the next few months. "We basically haven't solicited the community yet."
Part of the money raised will go to pay for improvements to the museum to exhibit and store the materials properly.
The historical society has

scheduled a mixer event with the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce 5-7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 15, in the museum, 155 S. Main, to raise money toward the Lincoln collection purchase.
Stewart said a mailing is also planned for parents of children attending Plymouth-Canton district schools. Much of the collection is to be made available to youngsters studying Lincoln, one of the stipulations sought by Petz in determining where the collection would go.

oring for underpasses. "We get different kinds of inquiries."
"When the road gets really bad around the (Sheldon) railroad crossing people are concerned about damaging their car. Our only recourse is to go to CSX and try to get them to take care of the crossing."
Township officials have made only preliminary inquiries on what it takes to build underpasses. "The numbers we are hearing are so large, it has to be done in conjunction with the state and county. And we certainly don't have the money."
The cost to put an underpass under the tracks at Sheldon would likely run comparable to a current \$10 million underpass project, in Livonia at Merriman road south of I-96.
Livonia residents are paying for half the project through a bond issue. The other half comes from a federal grant administered by the county.
Ed Siemert, director of engineering for Wayne County, said the county ranks various crossings by need, then evaluates train and auto traffic among other factors.
The county gets \$8 million in federal funds each year for out-county underpass projects. A 48-

member committee from around the metro area then meets to evaluate which one proposed project will receive federal funding.
Alan Richardson, deputy director of engineering for Wayne County, said the Sheldon crossing ranks No. 2 in the county in terms of greatest need for improvement. But the Merriman Road project, ranked fourth, got the money because Livonia officials were ready to pay their half.
Traffic studies show the Sheldon crossing carries 20,000 cars and 14 trains per day.
The drive to build underpasses has to come locally, as the county views such projects as costly. "We the county view grade separations as being a luxury, we have too many road needs," Richardson said.
That's because the \$8 million to \$10 million it costs to do a four-lane underpass could be used to resurface 15 miles of five-lane roadway.
"Can we really afford them on a very austere budget?" Siemert asked. "I've got a couple of pages of roads that need to be resurfaced, most are congested roads."

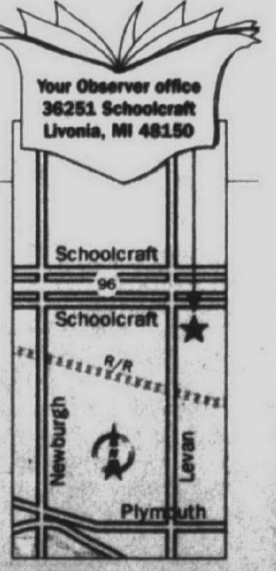

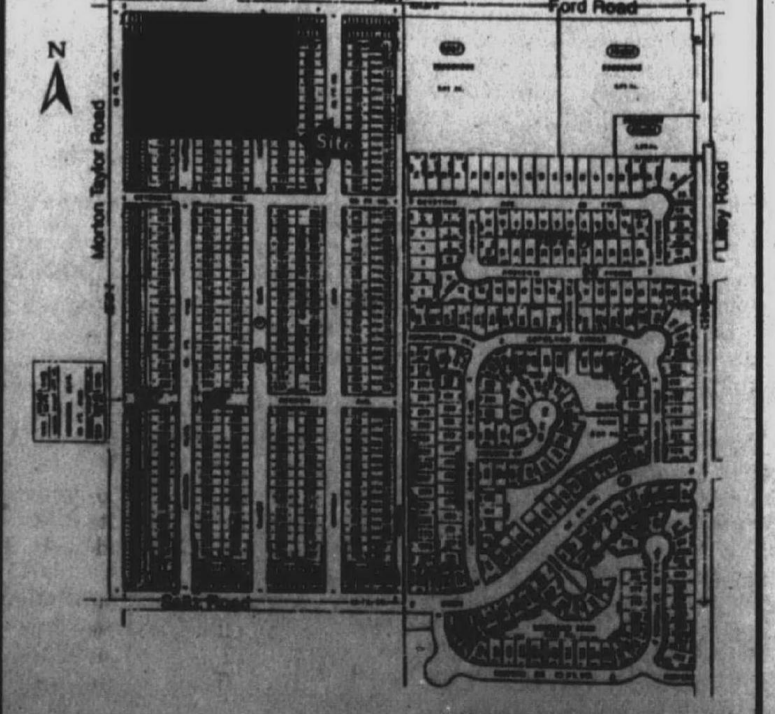

son, spends \$15,700 on an average concert. Their average concert attendance is 400 to 500. "We want to get it up to 700 or 800 paid tickets," said Jack Van Ash, LSO treasurer.

In many ways last year was a "golden" season for the Plymouth Symphony. The orchestra celebrated its 50th anniversary, initiated an endowment program, commissioned new works and hosted an elegant end-of-the-season gala. However, revenue figures for 1995-96 reflected significant drops in certain income areas from the year before.

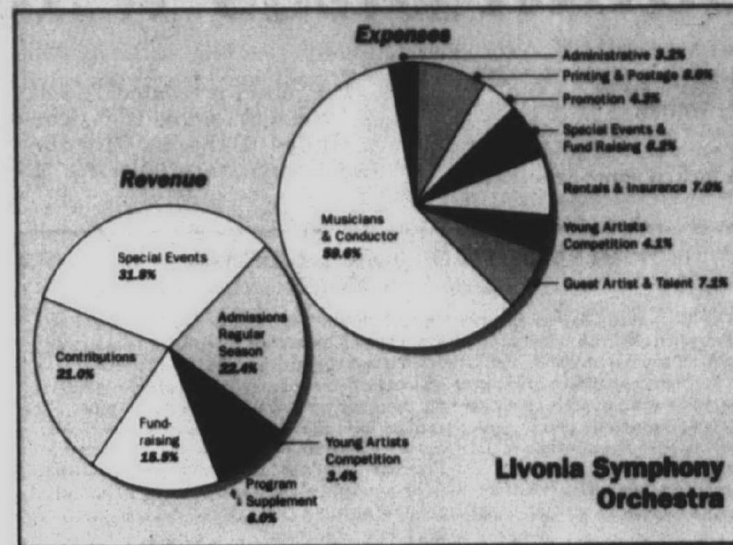
Individual and corporate gifts, which totaled \$42,099 for the 1994-95 season, brought in \$21,151 for 1995-96. This disparity could be explained in terms the orchestra's Endowment 2000 campaign, initiated in September of 1995, which realized \$86,000 in donations.

Significant as well as perplexing to David Burnisky, PSO president, were the admissions figures. Ticket revenues declined from \$53,759 for the 1994-95 season to \$35,340 for 1995-96.

According to Burnisky, the problem is one that has plagued the arts for centuries: lack of community awareness. During a recent business trip in Texas, Burnisky met a man from Plymouth who, when he saw the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra name on Burnisky's business card, said he didn't realize Plymouth had an orchestra.

Grants are an "icing on the cake" funding source for community orchestras. Last year, the PSO received two programming grants from the Michigan Council of Arts and Culture in the amount of \$15,810. Last spring the Chrysler Corp. Fund awarded the PSO a \$45,000 grant to be used for non-operating expenses. The orchestra will use part of the money to hire a marketing consultant.

But public awareness of the grants may have discouraged donations. "Sometimes I wonder if when you're awarded grants, people think, 'Well, they're OK,"

" said executive director Bonnie Holyoak a Canton resident.

The LSO doesn't do much grant-writing.

"Last we got something it was about \$400, and we spent \$600 to get it," said Van Ash. "After the big boys get their cut, there ain't much left for the little guys."

The LSO, which will celebrate its 25th anniversary next year, had a great season last year. "We had a hole to dig out of. We did some aggressive fund-raising. Things are starting to jell," said Betty Jean Awrey, LSO president and a Plymouth Township resident.

Unlike the PSO, the LSO did not initiate a big endowment campaign that could detract from annual giving. The business community always has been a strong supporter of the orchestra. "We like to get each concert partially funded by the business community," said Awrey. Last year, Awrey said the LSO received about \$25,000 in concert sponsorships.

While Burnisky is appreciative of contributions from individual businesses, he believes the business community in general could do more for the PSO. "Panasonic and Ford have always been our larger supporters. Target last year gave \$4,500. And Don Soenen, a PSO board member

and a Plymouth resident who owns Sensors Inc. in Saline, is more than generous.

"However, there are a number of companies in the area that could support the arts, the PSO in particular, and in turn elevate their profiles in the community."

Often, it takes a new identity to spark revenues. Both Awrey and Van Ash credit the LSO's new conductor, Volodymyr Scheiuk, a former resident conductor of the Bolshoi Ballet, with a resurgence in ticket sales. Van Ash said the orchestra is now playing "all the pieces we've never played or haven't played in the past five years."

Burnisky said concertgoers do not have to go to Detroit to attend a quality performance. "I think we put out a really good product," he said. "The Plymouth Symphony's mission is the same as always, to enlighten people."

Van Ash said the key to any community orchestra's success is attracting an audience. "You got to have a real good product to sell. Then you jump through hoops for the audience, giving them something new they haven't heard before."

"Come ready to be entertained," Plymouth-Canton band director David McGrath advised those who plan to attend the Great Lakes Invitational band competition. Sponsored by the Plymouth-Canton Music Boosters, the GLI will be held at the Plymouth-Canton home stadium 10:30 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 12, to the awards presentation at 6:15 p.m. on Canton Center Road at Joy.

refusal to hear the case. Evola said district officials wouldn't be surprised to see the case go to the federal court.

On Wednesday, Gov. John Engler placed a freeze on state hiring.

"It couldn't come at a worse time," said state Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Redford, a member of the House Appropriations subcommittee on school aid. She said the state was hoping to get two breaks from the federal government, on welfare and Medicaid, but only the welfare break materialized.

"This will have an impact on the K-12 fund," Bankes said. "But it will have more impact on the 'rainy day' fund, which is

about \$1.3 billion. This could wipe out the rainy day fund."

Rick Simonson, assistant superintendent for state and local affairs for the Oakland Intermediate School District, said of the Supreme Court ruling: "It was not a surprise to us but it clearly was to the administration. I was surprised that he (Engler) was surprised."

Simonson said most of the legal questions along with the amount the state owed had been settled long ago.

Simonson said he consulted with Dennis Pollard, attorney for plaintiffs, and arrived at the \$600 million figure the state owed them.

But there are unresolved

claims from other school districts that weren't part of the original case, Simonson said.

"They (Engler administration) offered a year ago to settle for 10 cents on the dollar. The school districts held a meeting in Okemos and decided not to settle," Simonson said.

Although no one would say so publicly, it's possible the school districts will settle for one year's worth of special aid money. There is a precedent for this. When Engler took office in 1991, he settled a lawsuit by Oakland County for mental health money on the basis of one year's worth.

Candidates who show for forum provide views

It was the candidates' forum that lacked some candidates.

The forum presented Tuesday at Plymouth Canton High School included Deborah Hoadley, Democratic candidate for the

20th District state House seat — but not her opponent, longtime incumbent Republican Gerald Law.

And in the local race for county commission, incumbent Republican Thaddeus McCotter showed — but not Democratic challenger R. Karl Burnett.

Forum co-sponsor the League of Women Voters of Livonia said Law and Burnett failed to respond in time to invitations to appear.

The candidates taking the stage each presented opening and closing statements and responded to questions posed by the audience of nearly 100. Also participating were candidates in races affecting Canton. To open the forum, moderator

Ann Marie Graham instructed McCotter on rules. As his opponent wasn't there, McCotter asked, "I was just curious how long I had to rebut anything I might say."

"My job is to protect the interests of Plymouth, Livonia and Northville," said the second-term commissioner. He said the two main issues are taxes and spending.

"The problem that we face in Wayne County is a question of priorities," he said.

The Democratic county executive and Democratic county commission majority "are too preoccupied with things like building stadiums," McCotter charged. He said they should be more into taking care of roads.

He stressed his opposition to the tax to pay for the countywide SMART bus system, a tax which Plymouth voters rejected. McCotter also opposes a Detroit casino. "Liberal government has failed, they're (Democrats) looking for another source of revenue," he said. "Government should not perpetuate vice."

Asked if he supports western county communities seceding from Wayne County, McCotter said he opposed it for two reasons. First, he said it would cost taxpayers plenty to set up a new county government, while help-

wise. Responding to other schools questions, Hoadley said she would support legislation to reduce class sizes, and said tax-shift Proposal A "is not taking care of the schools."

"This district cannot keep up with the funds. Students are being cheated and resources are being spread thinner and thinner," Hoadley said.

She recalled in 1991 when Law resigned from the Legislature to take the job of township supervisor. He was re-elected to the state House in 1994.

"When you elected him, he resigned. That's how much he thought about being state rep," Hoadley said. "You will have my total commitment."

Asked to discuss her position on campaign finance reform, Hoadley said legislators "lean more toward certain groups who give them money instead of listening to their constituents. They should be accountable to the people in their district."

"What I have said," responded Little, "is that under Public Act 112, the balance of negotiations is decidedly tipped in favor of management. I think that has driven the situation a little bit."

Passed in the spring of 1994 at Gov. John Engler's urging, the new state law imposes fines on striking teachers; prohibits strikes over unfair labor practices; and removes a number of items from the list of things that can be bargained. The law also bars education associations from vetoing a collective bargaining agreement reached by a local bargaining unit.

"In the past, teachers have been allowed to strike at will, and that has changed," said Little. "The scales are tipped in our favor, there's no doubt about it. I think that has really had an impact."

Little added that contrary to what's been said by some teachers, the district "is not hiding behind Public Act 112. I think (chief teacher negotiator) Tom Cotner's comments at the board meeting at Central Middle School summed up all the major issues. He said it's health care and salaries. There aren't many secrets around this negotiation."

The district wants to freeze salaries and has proposed that employees switch to a Preferred Provider Organization, or pay \$740 per year to keep their Blue Cross-Blue Shield coverage.

Teachers are asking for a 3 percent raise and want to keep their health care carrier and coverage.

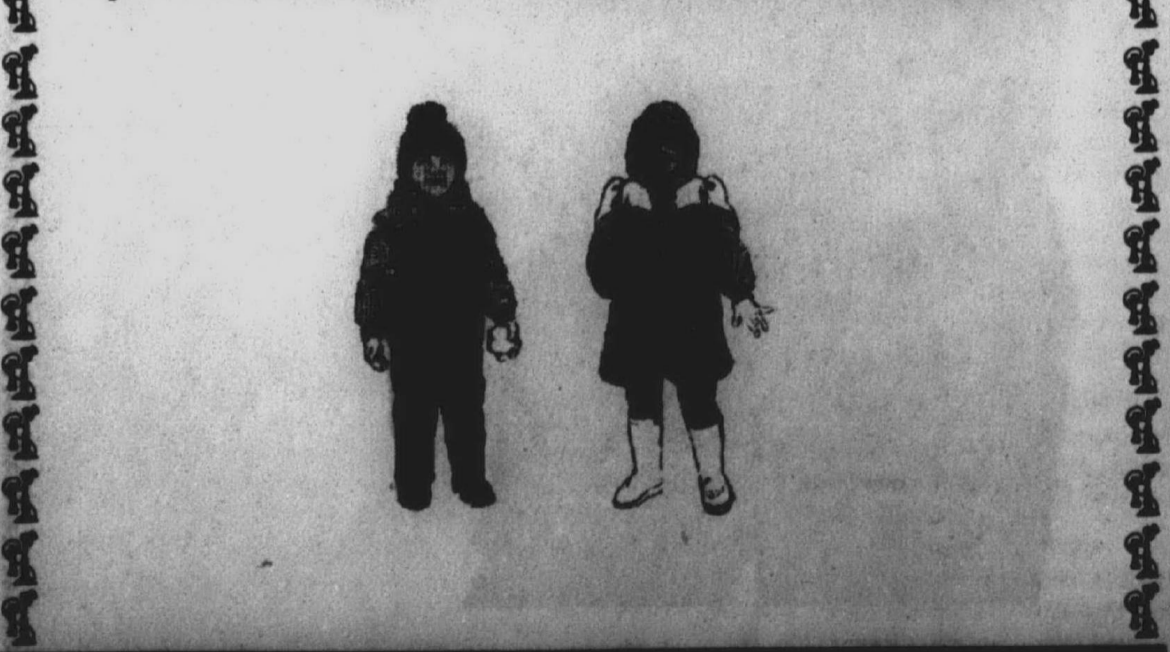

Voters to decide 6 statewide ballot proposals

Proposal A:

Political bingo

A "yes" vote will: Prohibit political parties and candidates from conducting bingo games as fund-raisers. (Churches and charitable groups would still be allowed to conduct games.)

Sought by: Democrats, who seek a "no" vote to overturn a 1994 Republican-passed bill in the Legislature. Party organizations, mostly Democratic, have been raising \$30 million to \$40 million a year. Democrats argue that political activity is a perfectly proper use for bingo proceeds, lessening the parties' dependence on lobbyists and cor-

porate backers.

Opponents say: Bingo players are duped into supporting Democratic organizations. Partisan bingos divert money from churches and charities. The number of bingos would be little affected because political organizations account for only 5 percent of the take.

Proposal B:

Qualified judges

A "yes" vote will: Amend the Michigan Constitution to require that judicial candidates be licensed attorneys for at least five years. (Currently, the Constitution requires only that they

be licensed and may not run after reaching age 70.)

Sought by: The Legislature, which put the proposal on the ballot by a two-thirds vote of each chamber. Purpose is to assure judges have legal experience before deciding others' cases. Supporters say inexperienced "name" candidates, fresh from law school, have been winning judicial elections on bed-sheet ballots, notably in Wayne

County.

Opponents say: The proposal doesn't guarantee experience because it says a candidate need only be "licensed" five years. A smart candidate with four years of experience in major litigation would be excluded from the ballot. No group, however, has openly opposed the proposals.

Proposal C:

Vets' trust fund

A "yes" vote will: Amend the

Michigan Constitution to prohibit the veterans' trust fund from being used for anything but emergency grants to military veterans, their widows or dependents.

Sought by: The Legislature, which established the fund at \$50 million in 1946 but has borrowed from it during the economic downturns of 1959 and 1976.

Opponents say: No known opposition has developed. Intellectually, it can be argued that the Legislature is tying its own hands and making tax increases

more necessary during economic downturns. Most of the fund that was borrowed was used for veterans' programs anyway.

Proposal D:

Bear restrictions

(See also Proposal G below.) A "yes" vote will: Prohibit the use of bait piles and dogs for hunting black bear in Michigan. It also will shorten the bear season to three weeks in September.

Judge throws out lawsuit, McMaster seeks appeal

A tax crusader charging Wayne County officials with undermining laws to push forward the Detroit Lions-Tiger stadium deal said politics influenced a judge's ruling last week that his lawsuit was frivolous.

Circuit Court Judge Cynthia Stephens said the lawsuit filed by William McMaster, chairman of the Michigan Taxpayers United, was "at best groundless and at worst bad faith."

The suit argued, among many allegations, that the Wayne County Commission violated the Open Meetings Act when it approved a legal agreement for a new dual stadium.

"The error on the part of the judge is so blatant that it should be short work on the Michigan Court of Appeals," McMaster said. "In an appeal we will at least have a three-judge panel and it will be out of the influence of the Wayne County Democrats."

Mike Duggan, Deputy Wayne County executive, said he will seek legal fees, some \$10,000, for Wayne County attorneys working on the case.

"We don't think the taxpayers should have to pay for a frivolous case," Duggan said. "I think the people in Wayne County should be comfortable that everything that we did was perfectly legal."

Duggan charged McMaster with using the courts to get free publicity for his fight against a ballot proposal for the Nov. 5 election asking voters to use tax dollars to pay the \$505 million for the dual Lions-Tiger stadium. The proposal calls for 52 percent of costs to come from private entities and 48 percent from public funding.

It is misleading to call it the "tourist tax," McMaster said, because it will include taxes on car rentals, as well as truck rentals, which are primarily used by Wayne County residents.

"It's not just a tourist tax," McMaster said. "It's a tax on the people of Wayne County."

McMaster's lawsuit also claimed that the 165-word ballot

United for Bear), mainly Upper Peninsula landowners who see it as a method of stopping trespassing. They contend hunters trailing dogs with radio collars ignore "posted" signs and threaten those who tell them to leave. Anti-hunting animal rights groups also are backing it.

Opponents say: See Proposal G below.

Proposal E:

Detroit casinos

A "yes" vote will: Amend state law to allow casino gambling other than on Indian reservations. The legal definition fits only the city of Detroit, which would be allowed three casinos. The proposal would set up a five-member State Gaming Commission appointed by the governor.

It would end what is in effect an Indian monopoly on casinos.

Sought by: Detroit, where voters rejected casino proposals four times between 1976 and 1993. Backers say Casino Windsor, in Ontario, is attracting 19,000 customers a day, 76 percent from the U.S. An 18 percent tax on casinos' gross would be split with 55 percent going to the city, 45 percent to the school aid fund. The proposal was placed on the ballot by the Legislature.

Opponents say: Gambling produces no useful products, lures the weak into debt and bankruptcy, and robs society of moral fiber. The bill is written to give preferential treatment to those who already have applied for casino licenses.

Proposal G:

Game management

(The opposite of Proposal D, above)

A "yes" vote will: Amend state law to designate the state Natural Resources Commission as the sole authority to regulate all hunting, including bear - called "scientific management" by supporters.

Sought by: The Legislature, which passed PA 377 of 1996 as a counter-measure to Proposal D, and supported by Michigan United Conservation Clubs. They say the ballot box is a poor way to manage wildlife populations. Michigan has 10,000 bears; the state receives 26,000 applications for licenses and issues about 6,400 licenses. Actual kill: 1,500. Of these, 95 percent are taken through the use of bait piles and/or dogs.

That's a 33 percent success rate compared to only 10 percent among hunters who stalk. Supporters fear that if Proposal D becomes law, the "antis" will seek to outlaw all hunting in Michigan.

Opponents say: See Proposal D above. In addition, opponents say the claims that bears are dangerous to human beings is wildly exaggerated.

■ If voters say yes to both, the proposal with the most "yes" votes becomes law.

■ If voters reject both, then the director of the DNR continues to regulate bear hunting.

proposal is too long and confusing for voters to understand.

Duggan said McMaster had every right to fight the proposal, but he shouldn't use the courts to make his point.

"It was a misuse of the judicial process and was used as an election ploy," Duggan said. "They made up a bunch of false allegations to get themselves free publicity. They served the claim to The Detroit News before they filed in court. It was cheap publicity to oppose the ballot proposal."

McMaster said he thought Stephens was "charming and

intelligent, but I do not believe that she was objective." The ballot proposal wording is confusing and deceptive, he added.

Issues dominate local ed forum

Candidates for trustees of Michigan State University disagree on charter schools and whether MSU has done enough to hold down tuition for the middle class.

Most favor open meetings except when it comes to interviewing candidates for president.

The four answered questions at a Sept. 26 forum sponsored by the Livonia branch of the American Association of University Women.

Charter schools

They were asked by moderator Yvonne Constat why MSU hasn't joined Central Michigan University in the parade to issue charters to public school academies.

David Porteous (R), incumbent, called Michigan "a leader in charter schools" and said MSU should charter agricultural high schools because many local school districts have ended agricultural offerings. "We have a long partnership with agriculture," he said.

Joel Ferguson (D) said he's "opposed to charter schools across the board. We should strengthen public schools."

Colleen Pero (R) supports charter schools. "They can enhance public education. Charter schools will force public schools to be the best they can be."

Robert Weiss (D), incumbent, is "opposed to charter schools

MSU trustee candidates

■ Democrats

Robert Weiss, 57, Grand Blanc, incumbent trustee and board chair. Former Genesee County prosecutor.

Joel Ferguson, 57, Lansing, real estate developer. Served on MSU board 1987-94. Prominent in Democratic Party.

■ Republicans

David Porteous, 43, Reed City, incumbent trustee (by appointment). Attorney; served on Gov. Engler's 1990 transition team.

Colleen Pero, 41, East Lansing. Attorney; former top

Engler aide, active in governor's campaigns.

■ MSU

Located in East Lansing and has six outreach offices and the Agricultural Extension Service. Has 41,000 students, 75 percent undergraduates.

Nation's first land-grant college; now classified as a research institution. Board sets budget (nearly \$1 billion) and hires president. Voters will pick two persons for eight-year terms. Board has four Democrats, four Republicans.

that are not under a local (K-12) system with an elected board. Charter schools will try to take the cream (good students) off the top. We need better public education, and charter schools are not conducive to that."

Tuition hikes

Candidates were asked about years of tuition increases that have exceeded inflation.

Pero (R): "Tuition is up tremendously; it's almost unaffordable. It should rise no more than the cost of inflation. We (the board) need to look at cost containment. . . We have to be affordable. We should never put athletics ahead of academics."

Weiss (D): "Eight years ago, I ran on this issue. I have voted against more tuition increases than any other trustee." MSU guarantees it will not increase tuition faster than the rate of general price inflation as long as state appropriations keep pace. The state provided 60 percent of MSU's operating budget eight years ago; now it provides 50 percent. "The pack has shifted to the backs of the middle class. . . I will fight for lower tuition."

Porteous (R): "Tuition has been a spiraling cost. There have been huge tuition increases at MSU since Weiss and Fer-

ugson have been on the board." He approved of the policy of guaranteeing tuition won't rise faster than the rate of inflation as long as state aid keeps pace. "Tuition increases should be kept at a minimum."

Ferguson (D): "The most important step was in picking a president (who would hold down costs). I called a banker, a businessman (to be president). Pete McPherson did many sound things and is a sound manager. . . I picked a lifelong Republican to be president who will go down in history as another John Hannah."

Open interviews

MSU trustees face a suit for holding closed meetings prior to hiring a president. The Open Meetings Act requires that all deliberations, and all interviews of presidential candidates, be conducted in public. Candidates were asked their views on the law.

Porteous (R): "As an attorney, I've represented municipalities on the Open Meetings Act. I've never known a municipality to get in trouble with open meetings."

Ferguson (D): "I hope Mr. Porteous will never have the opportunity to pick a president. There should be rules that the final

10 or final seven (be interviewed in the open). We shouldn't be destroying individuals' careers."

Pero (R): "Meetings must be open. But I agree with Ferguson: We need a period to have preliminary discussions without putting people's lives on hold; you endanger their present job (with open interviews). When selecting a president, preliminary discussions should be behind closed doors."

Weiss (D): "It's the people's business. But in selecting a president, allegations are made but not proven. . . to destroy that person's life. The three finalists should be interviewed in the open."

Cooperation

Can Michigan's 15 institutions of higher education cooperate?

Ferguson (D): "The greatest failure was for MSU to think it's the University of Michigan. As we work with our agricultural component, we have undertaken an urban component (in Flint). We should recognize our own niche."

Pero (R): "Chinese studies is not big at MSU; it is at U-M. Some of these decisions (winnowing out duplicative programs) are going to be tough."

Weiss (D): MSU has 41,000 students. Of those, 30,000 are undergraduates. Our primary purpose is undergraduate education. We can't lose sight of that; 85 percent of our students are from Michigan."

Porteous (R): "A partnership is long over due. The adversarial relationship (between universities) has to change. We have a partnership with Northwestern Michigan Community College in Traverse City in offering classes."



- Madeleine belts are sold by size, 6-18.
- Clothing lengths are available in one-inch increments.
- Pockets can be seen or camouflaged.
- Most styles are a year ahead of American collections.
- Representatives personally deliver orders and make returns for their customers.

"I can offer a woman very private, very customized wardrobe service at her convenience," she said. "This is investment dressing at its finest."

Jacqueline Fleming of Scotland, stopped by to check out Madeleine's fall collection. Her husband recently transferred the family to Michigan on business.

"These clothes are very classic and top quality as far as fabrics and tailoring go," she said. "I prefer a choice of color and combination when dressing, and you get that here."

Fleming left promising to think about the \$495 wool and cashmere tailored brown blazer she left behind.

Herdegen said her favorite outfit in the 275-piece fall line, is the black jacket dress made of Crespino fabric, "a woven, high-twisted crepe yarns that is crease-resistant." The dress is precision tailored and couture cut, a timeless addition to any wardrobe." The two-piece garment sells for \$750.

Retailers ready for the holidays

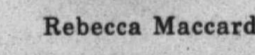

Cheat to save time when it's your turn to bring dessert

It sometimes seems as though the world is divided into those who are waiting for dessert and those who have to produce it. The producers often find themselves hoping for a brilliant recipe to materialize, because we all know that when guests are invited over, they must be given something sweet.

Cooks who are pressed for time can get around this problem by shopping at their local gourmet grocery store, the theory being a bought-dessert is better than a bad dessert, or worse, no dessert at all.

Then there are cooks who can do wonders with a cake mix, or frozen pie crust and can of pie filling. Point in fact: last week the Janes Gang was invited to my good friend Bianca Lemon's house for a barbecue.

Bianca entertains as if all her guests were somehow related to the British monarchy. Everything should be perfect, and it always is. But because on that day she was entertaining no less than 24 friends, each couple was asked to contribute to the feast, which we all did.

Homemade taste

Our delectable dinner included everything from potato salad to Caponata, to a bean-laden chili. I am constantly amazed at her power of persuasion.

After dinner, Bianca brought out an assortment of luscious desserts, which included a homemade-looking cherry pie. Needless to say, the pie looked irresistible. Kudos were offered to the baker, and in my ubiquitous wisdom, I announced that it was one of the best "homemade" cherry pies I had ever tasted.

I was partially correct, it was homemade, but made with frozen pie crust and canned pie filling.

When people feel they must make a "real" dessert, they are usually looking for something simple and wonderful, two qualities often seen as mutually exclusive. I like a cake that takes about four seconds to put together and gives somewhat of an ambrosial result on the tongue. Fortunately, such cakes exist and are generally found at someone else's home.

Recipes

You then ask for the recipe and serve it to other friends who, in turn, pass it on to yet others. This is the way families and friends are unified and relationships made solid.

Undoubtedly you know of what I speak if you've ever asked for the recipe for Hot Artichoke Dip, "Better than Sex" Cake, or the latest craze, an Oriental salad made with Ramen noodles, shredded cabbage, sesame oil and chopped nuts.

My dear friend Jane Brown of Canton, whose idea of cooking dinner is making reservations, brought the Oriental salad to a summer barbecue and not only received raves but also requests for the recipe.

These are the types of recipes that turn up most at bridal and baby showers, the types of recipes that belong in church or civic organization cookbooks. These are tried-and-true recipes that, if nothing else, are what we remember our grandmas, aunts and long-departed friends by.

The recipes are usually made with canned soups, packaged noodles, enough butter to evoke a warning from the Surgeon General's office, and most of all, with minimal effort.

Yes, I must admit, I'll be willing to wait for dessert until the proverbial cows come home. I belong to the group of cooks whose one claim to fame is that if we go to the trouble of making dinner, then why not go the distance and make dessert?

After one has trussed the chicken, washed the lettuce, made the dressing, mashed the potatoes, chopped or peeled the vegetables, the dessert is the fun part.

A store-bought dessert is definitely cheating, but you don't have to be a pastry chef to prepare a luscious dessert. It's perfectly acceptable to use store-bought ingredients like frozen pie crusts and canned pie filling to make desserts with minimal effort that taste like homemade. Be creative: There are lots of options. Box cake mixes can be dressed up with chocolate chips and cherries.

- Chili peppers aren't peppers. Technically they are fruits, members of the genus Capsicum. The distinguishing characteristic of peppers comes from the presence of capsaicin, a clear highly pungent substance; the more of this stuff, the hotter the pepper.
- A tremendous number of medicinal values have been attributed to chilies. People believed chili peppers relieved gas, eased childbirth, removed warts and pimples, healed stings, and prevented cavities. In fact, chilies are a good source of vitamins A and C, and it is thought that regular chili consumption might be helpful in regulating cholesterol levels in the blood. True chili lovers need no scientific validations; they know that true chili induces a sense of spiritual and physical well-being that transcends analysis.
- Chilies are harvested in September. The brilliant flame of chili ristras (strings) hanging from porches and rafters is said to rival the beauty of fall leaves.
- True chili cooks know that chili recipes are really like the melodies heard at a jazz performance. One starts with the basic structure (the chili pepper) and improvises by adding a variety of ingredients. The final blend is unique and like jazz, each rendition is like no other.

Amador Foothill wines offer value

We're sure you've noticed escalation in the price of California wines, especially those carrying prestigious Napa and Sonoma County appellations. We've talked to top winery personnel. Among their explanations are: grape supply down 25 percent due to short crops and vineyards not bearing due to phylloxera-caused replanting. They don't deny that because they're selling every drop of wine they make, they're reacting to the supply and demand law of economics and raising prices.

Whatever, we're not going to see prices come down until replanted vineyards are in full production or California has a mediocre, but large harvest, such as it had in 1989 or there's an economic recession. None of these operatives are at work for the 1996 harvest, so it may be two to three years before we see prices heading south.

What's a California wine lover to do? Among the many suggestions (and we will be presenting more as future columns take shape) is to look for wines from regions besides Napa and Sonoma. A good place to begin is Amador County,

especially for sauvignon blanc, zinfandel (and this variety has really been affected by skyrocketing prices elsewhere), sangiovese and other Cal-Ital wines (Italian varieties planted in California).

If you've not heard about or tried the wines of Amador Foothill Winery in Amador County, let us introduce you. The winery is on western slopes of the Sierra Nevada mountains. Owners are the husband and wife team of Ben Zeitman and Katie Quinn. Ben, a former NASA chemist, founded the 9,000 case per year winery in 1980. Katie, armed with a master's degree in enology from the University of California at Davis, joined in 1986 when she and Ben were married. With her, she brought several years of winemaking experience. Today, they do most of the vineyard work themselves and are passionate about sangiovese.

In 1991, they grafted over four acres of 12-year-old cabernet sauvignon (not the greatest grape from Amador) to three clonal selections of sangiovese. This is one of the best managed sangiovese vineyards in all of California. The goal here is to produce Tuscan character wine. Since 1990, Ben and Katie have traveled to Tuscany many times to con-

fer with Italian winemakers.

"We like sangiovese on its own from our property and have no intention of blending with another varietal such as cabernet sauvignon," Katie said. "We like the purity of the fruit and its distinctive character."

But it is zinfandel that is famed in Amador and Amador Foothills Winery makes two vineyard-designates, Ferrero, carrying the Shenandoah Valley appellation and Eechen, from the Fiddletown area. Two whites are particularly stylish: Amador Fume (a blend of 75 percent sauvignon blanc and 25 percent semillon) and 100 percent barrel-fermented Semillon. All wines show tremendous flavor depth.

You're reading on for the prices aren't you? The 1994 Amador Fume is \$8.50; 1994 Semillon is \$10; 1994 Sangiovese (released October 1) is \$14, but you may still be able to find the 1993 at some shops for \$12. Both 1993 Zinfandels are \$12.

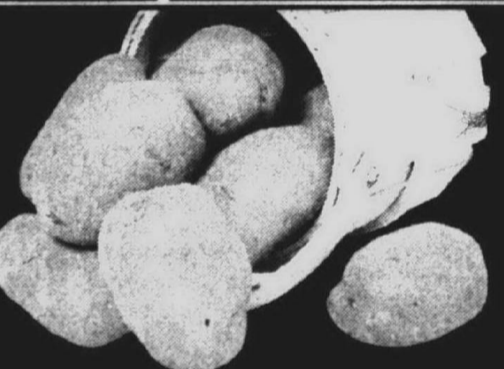

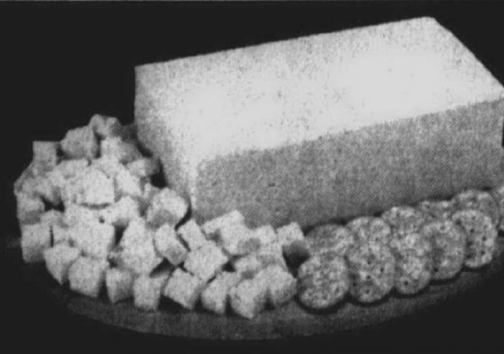

The following recipe was created by chef Matt Pinsonneault of Sierra Nevada Tap Room and Restaurant in Chico, Calif., to specifically accompany Amador Foothill Winery Zinfandel.

GRILLED LAMB LOIN WITH ZINFANDEL SAGE MOREL SAUCE

Marinade:
2 tablespoons olive oil
fresh minced rosemary, sage

and garlic to taste.
Coat the 8-oz. lamb loin with olive oil, herbs and garlic.
Marinate for 2 hours at room temperature. Grill lamb to your liking.

Sauce:
2 oz. fresh morel, sliced thin (shitake or oyster mushrooms may be substituted)
1 cup Amador Foothill Zinfandel
1 teaspoon fresh sage, minced
1/2 teaspoon fresh rosemary,

minced
1 teaspoon black pepper
2 tablespoons sweet butter
In a small saucepan, combine mushrooms, zinfandel, sage, rosemary and black pepper. Cook over medium heat, reducing volume by 1/3. Add butter and simmer until sauce thickens, stirring constantly. Slice grilled lamb thinly and serve over a bed of the sauce. Accompany with roasted new potatoes, fresh seasonal vegetable and of course Amador Foothill Zinfandel. Serves 2.

"The artist is R.C. Gorman of Arizona. It will retail for \$20, and \$15 will go to Make-A-Wish. We'll also have T-shirts for sale, and anyone who wants to can make a donation to Make-A-Wish.

The first prize chili cook-off winner will receive \$500 and a trophy, second place \$200 and trophy, third place, \$50 and trophy.

"After the chili is submitted for judging, you can buy samples for 25 cents a taste. Local restaurants, including Plymouth Landing and Station 885, will be making chili and selling it for \$2 a bowl. Western barbecue dinners, hot dogs and other foods will also be offered for sale.

Chili cook-offs always benefit a charity, and that's one reason why people who like to make chili, compete. It's not cheap. It costs \$60 to \$100 to make a pot of chili for competition. International Chili Society rules don't allow beans, pasta or other fillers.

"My first experience was in 1983 when I went with a group of friends to a chili cook-off in Saline," said Horn. "Everyone was having way too much fun, and I wanted to be a part of it. I thought, 'I can make chili.'"

Annette and Ken competed in the cook-off two years later. "I was trying to think of a name for our chili, something with a theme. First I thought hot lips, then I changed my mind to fireworks - like the Fourth of July, an explosion of flavor. Out of 80

cooks we placed eighth; our goal was to place in the first 10," she said. "In 1987 we placed first and qualified for the World Championship Cook-off. That was it, we were hooked."

Ken competed in the 18th Annual Michigan Chili Cook-off Sept. 8 at Five Lakes Grill in Milford, while Annette minded the gallery. "It was fall festival weekend," she said.

Marilyn and Ray Frederick of Farmington Hills also share the Horns' passion for chili competed in the World Championship Cook-off Oct. 4-6 in Reno, Nevada, after this week's issue went to press.

Marilyn won the Wyandotte cook-off to qualify for the semi-finals on Oct. 5. Ray won the Michigan Chili Cook-off to qualify for the finals, Oct. 6 and \$25,000 first prize. Marilyn was one of 100 cooks competing in the semi-finals. If she placed in the top 20, she qualified for the finals.

"I used to cook with my brother," said Frederick, who is head judge of the Winter Freeze Regional Cook-off in Allen Park. "I was successful and got the bug to compete. It's fun. We like to travel and meet cooks from different states."

This year Marilyn and Ray competed in cook-offs in Michigan, Ohio and Illinois. They will be competing against each other at the Plymouth cook-off.

Lots of husbands and wives compete against each other in chili cook-offs, but no one knows

of any divorces that occurred because of it.

"I think my chili is better than his," said Annette. "He thinks his is better than mine. I give him my suggestions, and we rely on each other's senses. My taste, his smell. When I liked how the chili tasted, and he liked how it smelled, we knew we had a winner."

"He cooks an extremely different recipe from mine," said Marilyn Frederick about her husband Ray's chili. "He makes a real smooth Western-style chili. Mine is more Midwestern; it's hotter and sweeter."

What is the secret to good chili? "Everyone thinks their chili is the best chili, and I won't dispute this," said Annette. "The recipe develops over time. The chili we made in 1987 isn't the same chili we make today. Seasoned chili cooks use pure ingredients; they make their own spice blends. They use the best quality meat."

Frederick agreed - "Try to make it as simple as possible. Some people use too many different seasonings - Worcestershire Sauce and soy sauce. Chili is meat, tomato sauce, green chilies, and a combination of garlic powder, onion powder and other spices."

Champion chili cooks make their own blend of spices. Here's a recipe from Robert Stillborn of Calgary, Alberta, Canada who won the spice trade award at the 1993 World Championship Chili Cook-off in Reno.

ROBERT'S SPICE BLEND

4 teaspoons onion powder
1 teaspoon paprika
2 teaspoons salt
1 1/2 teaspoon thyme leaves, crushed
1 1/2 teaspoons celery salt
1 1/2 teaspoons garlic salt
1 1/2 teaspoons ground white pepper
1 teaspoon ground mustard
1 teaspoon oregano
1/2 teaspoon red pepper
1/2 teaspoon ground cardamom
Pinch nutmeg

Combine all ingredients and store in a tightly covered container. Yield 1/3 cup.

HERE'S ROBERT'S CHILI RECIPE. TOKYO TOM'S BONZAI CHILI

1 tablespoon vegetable oil
4 1/2 pounds ground beef
1/3 cup chili powder

1/3 cup instant minced onion
1 teaspoon ground cumin
2 teaspoons instant minced garlic
1 teaspoon ground black pepper
1 teaspoon Robert's Spice Blend
1 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon ground red pepper
1 bay leaf
1 can (29 ounces) tomato sauce
1 can (13 3/4 ounces) beef broth.

In a large saucepan heat oil until hot; add beef and cook, breaking up meat, until brown, about 5 minutes; drain off any accumulated liquid. Add chili powder, onion, cumin, garlic, black pepper, Robert's Spice Blend, salt and red pepper and bay leaf; stir until beef is coated. Stir in tomato sauce and beef broth; simmer, covered, until flavors blend, about 1 hour. Remove bay leaf before serving. Yield 10 3/4 cups, 6 portions.

Ray Frederick of Farmington Hills placed first in the Michigan Championship Chili Cook-off at Five Lakes Grill, here's his winning recipe.

TIGER'S BITE CHILI

4 1/2 tablespoons chili powder
1 tablespoon New Mexico chili powder
2 1/2 tablespoons cumin
1 tablespoon paprika
1 tablespoon brown sugar
1 teaspoon onion salt
1 teaspoon garlic powder
1/4 teaspoon oregano
1/2 teaspoon black pepper
1 jalapeno pepper, chopped
1 small onion, chopped
1 teaspoon salt or to taste
1 (14 1/2 ounce) can beef broth
6 ounces beer
8 ounces tomato sauce
1 (4 ounce) can green chilies, chopped
1 small green pepper, chopped
2 1/4 pounds cubed beef
1/2 pound ground beef

Mix all dry spices together. Brown meat, drain excess fat. In a large pot mix broth, tomato sauce, chilies and chopped vegetables. Bring to a boil. Add 1/2 cup of spices and meat. Cook 1 1/2 hours. Add additional spices and cook 1 hour longer or until thick.

My brothers and I looked forward to family-style chicken dinners at Zehnder's with the same anticipation as Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner.

Now you can enjoy your favorite dishes from Zehnder's of Frankenmuth without hopping in the car and heading for I-75.

The cookbook also includes tidbits about the food and people of Frankenmuth.

"Sundays have always been big dining days here at Zehnder's," writes John Zehnder in the book. "Even back in the 1930s we occasionally had lines waiting to eat. Our most famous dinner guest, back in those days, was Henry Ford. Old Henry never carried cash so my Grandfather would have to send the bill to the Ford Motor Company in Dearborn."

- 1 (3 pound) chicken, cut up
- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 tablespoon salt
- 3 teaspoons black pepper
- 1/4 cup butter
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 Spanish onion, large, diced
- 1/2 tablespoon Zehnder's Chicken Seasoning
- 1 cup water

Wash chicken under cool running water.

Mix flour, salt and pepper together and dust moist chicken in it.

Heat vegetable oil until medium hot in iron skillet. Add butter and melt quickly. This mixture will give the chicken a deep golden color.

Brown chicken on both sides, skin side down first. Your chicken will be undercooked.

Remove when browned and place in small roasting pan. For this recipe to work you need to double stack the chicken pieces. All chicken skin side up.

Combine eggs and milk in large bowl. Beat until mixed well.

Place fine crushed crumbs in 2-inch pan.

Dip chops in egg mix.

Immediately transfer crumbs. Cover with crumbs and press chop firmly into crumbs with palm of hand.

Place oil in large skillet, brown on both sides.

Remove from pan and place in 2-inch deep pan. Add salt, pepper, and onions. Pour in water. Cover tightly with foil and place in 350° degree F. oven for 50 minutes. Serve.

This recipe is one my momma used to bring to church functions.

BLUEBERRY DESSERT ROLL

- 2 cups Bisquick biscuit mix
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup fresh blueberries, or frozen blueberries, thawed
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted

Combine Bisquick and milk to make dough. Roll on a lightly floured surface into a rectangle 1/2-inch thick.

Sprinkle with blueberries and brown sugar leaving 1 inch uncovered around edges. Roll up like a jelly roll and place on a lightly greased baking sheet.

Cut 3 openings on top to release steam. Brush with melted butter. Bake at 400° F. for 30 minutes. Serve warm or chilled. Serves 6.

CHAFING DISH MEATBALLS

- 2 pounds ground chuck or ground turkey
- 1 egg
- 1 onion, grated or chopped fine
- 1/2 cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 1 bottle chili sauce
- the juice of 1 lemon (1/4 cup)
- 12 ounces grape jelly (without seeds)

Mix meat, egg, onion, bread crumbs and ketchup together to form meatballs. Make small balls for appetizers, larger balls for dinner. Broil or pan-fry until cooked throughout, about 10 minutes. Drain any remaining fat. Place meatballs in chafing dish. In a separate bowl, combine chili sauce, lemon juice and grape jelly and mix well. Pour over meatballs and heat gently. Serve with toothpicks as an appetizer or over cooked noodles as an entree. Makes about 48 appetizer meatballs.

I copied this recipe from the PBS show In the kitchen with Julia Child and the Master Chefs one lazy, rainy Saturday afternoon.

HARVEST APPLE PIE

- Crust:**
- 2-1/2 cups unbleached all purpose flour
 - 1 teaspoon sugar
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 2 sticks (1/2 pound) chilled unsalted butter, cut into 16 pieces
 - 6 tablespoons ice water
- Filling:**
- 6 large, firm early crop apples (Empires, Cortlands, Granny Smith)
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
 - 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 - 1 tablespoon tapioca flour or arrowroot

To make the crust: Measure the flour, sugar and salt into the mixing bowl. Toss the pieces of chilled butter around in the flour to coat them on all sides. Dump the contents of the bowl onto a work surface and begin rolling it out into a rough rectangle with your rolling pin. Proceeding rapidly, keep sweeping the flour-butter mixture into a pile and rolling it out again. Pieces of dough will stick to your rolling pin; just keep scraping them back into the pile and keep on rolling. When all the lumps of butter are rolled into sheets, lift the dough back into the bowl and add the ice water. Use a scraper or pastry blender and turn the dough over several times. The

dough will be in clumps. With an open hand, press the dough against the bottom of the bowl to pick up any loose flour.

Divide the dough in half, press it together and wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate 30 minutes. Makes enough dough for a two crusted nine inch pie.

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. Set a rack on the lowest level.

To make filling: Peel the apples and cut them in half. Use a melon baller to remove cores. Cut

each half into three wedges, slicing each wedge into thirds. Thoroughly blend the sugar, spices and tapioca or arrowroot in a mixing bowl. Toss with the apples, coating them evenly. Press a piece of plastic wrap onto the apples to make an airtight covering and set aside.

Remove the dough from the refrigerator and massage through the plastic for several minutes to soften. Sprinkle your work surface and top of the dough lightly with flour and roll into a circle that is 10 inches across and about 1/8

inch thick. Fold the circle in half and lay the dough in the pie pan. Press into pan tightly. Empty the apples into the crust and make sure all seasonings and juice go in too. Brush edges of dough with a little egg white to help seal. Roll out remaining dough and place over the top. Crimp and seal edges. make a cut in the top to release steam. Bake in the preheated oven for 10 minutes, then reduce heat to 375 degrees and continue baking for 45-50 minutes or until top is golden. Remove to a wire rack and allow to cool for 1 hour before cutting. Makes one 9 inch pie.

Stylish look can't save 'Rich Man's Wife'

Worthy contenders in the Worst Movie of the Year sweepstakes, and Hollywood Pictures' "The Rich Man's Wife" rates as a 2-1 entry.

Supposedly a sexy excursion in murder and double-cross, the movie amounts to little more than a laughable flop, replete with cliché-challenged dialogue and plot elements that borrow from every film-noir movie as well as all thrillers involving spousal murder and life among the rich.

"The Rich Man's Wife" was written by Amy Holden Jones, who wrote the wonderful "Mystic Pizza." Then again, she also made her directorial debut with "Slumber Party Massacre" and wrote the unbelievable screenplay for "Indecent Proposal." (How many women would actually leave handsome, charming and rich Robert Redford for loser Woody Harrelson?)

The movie opens as a flashback. Beautiful Josie Potenza (Halle Berry) sits in a police station, waives all her rights to silence and having an attorney (get real) and announces she wants "to tell the truth." How cute. So she tells us the story of how her wealthy, alcoholic, beer-belly husband Tony gets murdered.

On the surface, Josie appears

to lead a wonderful life. She lives in a gorgeous home in the Pacific Palisades, is surrounded by beautiful art, wears expensive jewelry and clothes, and can have anything she wants — except her husband's attention. Tony (Christopher McDonald) is a slave to his work at a TV studio — and he's a womanizer.

Josie, meanwhile, is having an affair with a British restaurateur, Jake (Clive Owen), in whose business Tony has invested. But Josie won't leave him because she signed a prenuptial agreement in which she gets nothing if she leaves Tony.

But Josie is a plucky gal. She decides to forgive Tony, try to make things better, and stick it out. "I love my husband," she repeats often in the movie.

Tony, in his own sloppy way, also loves Josie. She persuades him to go away to the mountains with her for an intimate vacation. It all falls apart when Tony decides to rush back to his office. Josie, forlorn and angry, heads for the nearest bar where she meets a psycho named Cole (Peter Greene).

Against all good judgment, she agrees to have dinner with him and winds up telling him about her husband. Cole suggests that she hire him to kill Tony; Josie panics and demands that he drive her home. The ride is a trip through hell as Cole turns off his

headlights and speeds along a curvy mountain road. Once home, he tries to rape Josie and she pulls a gun on him, nicking him in the cheek.

Bad move. Cole murders Tony. He then visits Josie demanding \$30,000 or else he'll go to the police and tell them that she had hired him. Josie goes along with the demand and takes Jake into her confidence. Another bad move.

With a series of dumb decisions, predictable plots twists and totally unrealistic police procedure, "The Rich Man's Wife" tumbles to its logical conclusion. There's an ending that's supposed to be a surprise. But you can smell it a mile away.

"The Rich Man's Wife" has a stylish look and Berry is a beautiful adornment. But neither can save the movie.

A positive note to the filmmakers: It is good to see race isn't an issue in this movie. Josie is a role that could be filled by a white actress or black actress, as Berry is. Josie also could be European, Asian, Latin, Arab or African. Doesn't matter. And that's good.

"The Rich Man's Wife" was produced by Roger Birnbaum and Julie Bergman Sender, with Jennifer Ogden as executive producer. The film is now playing at metro Detroit movie theaters.

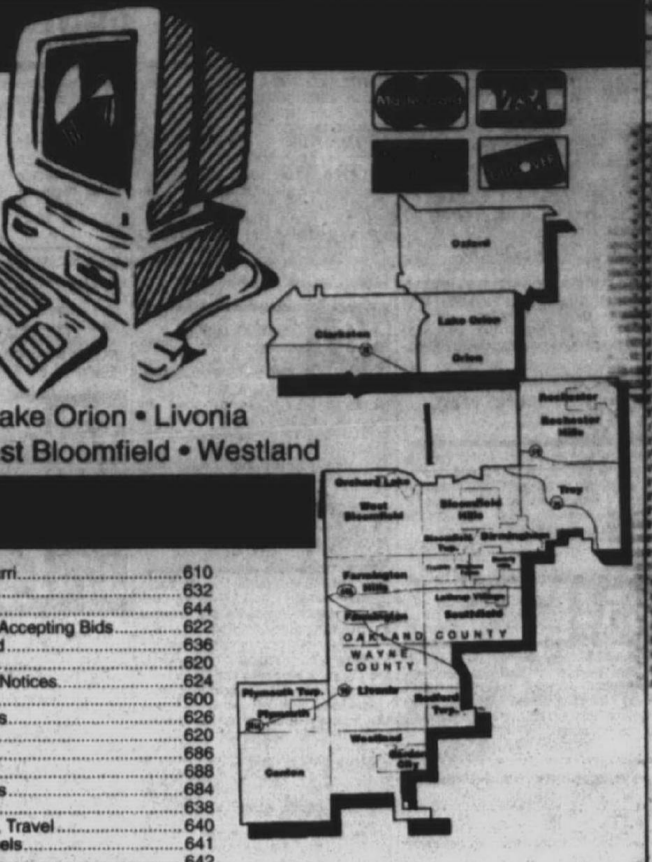

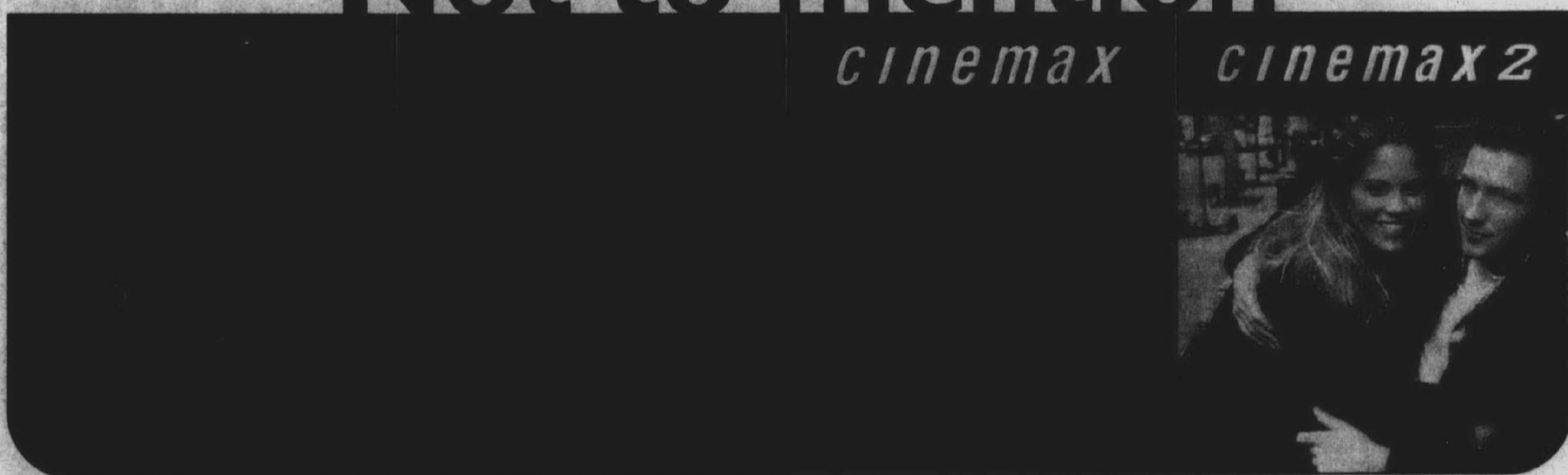

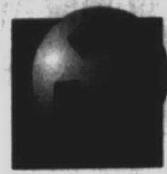

On the same day the Plymouth Canton quarterback was named Homecoming King, Johnson was by far the marked man of the Livonia Franklin defense.

The Bravada, which was re-engineered and re-introduced last year, has really been improved all the way around. It's familial look of Oldsmobile is still there — unmistakably there — but if you're a loyal Olds buyer, you'll like it.

Inside, much has been changed — and all for the better. You'll find the instrumentation easier to

Take a look above and there's another console. There you'll find switches for the optional tilt and slide electric sunroof (also new this year), a trip computer, digital compass, storage for that extra pair of sunglasses or whatever, universal garage door opener and digital outside temperature read-outs.

Need even more storage? There are large map pockets located in the front doors.

The electric sunroof can be tilted up for ventilation or slid partially or fully open for a little more circulation. The sunroof also has a wind deflector and a sun shade. I was surprised just how quiet it was with the sunroof all the way open.

Standard are leather trim and front bucket seats with recliners, power lumbar adjusters, 6-way power driver seat and split-folding rear seat.

Another new feature on the Bravada is a different rear cargo access. Oldsmobile incorporated a one piece liftgate that includes

both the liftglass and liftgate.

The great thing about this new design is that the door swings up and out of the way when loading cargo. At the same time, the glass door doesn't go so far up and can provide a rain or snow shield while loading the cargo. The rest of the droppate operates much like a pickup truck's gate.

Speaking of the cargo area, Bravada is now outfitted with a retractable rear cargo cover, a convenient cargo net to keep everything in place and a really neat protective cargo area mat to keep everything clean. The mat also has molded sides, so that if anything spills, it's all contained within the mat. Really great idea.

Under the hood there's a 4.3 liter V6 capable of 190 horsepower mated to a electronically controlled 4-speed automatic transmission with SmartTrak. The shifter is on the floor, by the way. You can't race that Mitsubishi 3000GT next to you revving up at the light, but it does provide adequate power for driving around

town.

To help in reduced theft, Oldsmobile has Bravada's VIN markings to the engine, transmission, front fenders, doors, tailgate, bumpers, hood and both bodyside assemblies.

Safety features include driver's side air bag, anti-lock brake system, remote keyless lock control, illuminated entry, rear door child security locks and intermittent wipers with rear wiper/washer.

Other standard features include a luggage rack with adjustable cross bars, AM/FM cassette with 6 speakers, air conditioning, cruise control, power door locks and liftgate release, power mirrors, fog lamps, leather tilt steering wheel, deep tinted glass in the rear doors and tailgate, daytime running lamps, driver and passenger illuminated front visor mirrors, floor mats both front and rear, front side window defoggers and electric rear window defogger, power side windows with driver automatic down and power lockout, solar treated windshield, two front towing hooks and five wire trailer towing harness.

The Oldsmobile Bravada is a true contender in the sport utility ring. A bit pricey at almost \$30,000, but with all that equipment, you're not getting short-changed.

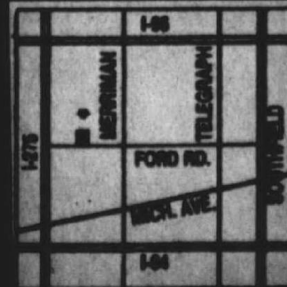

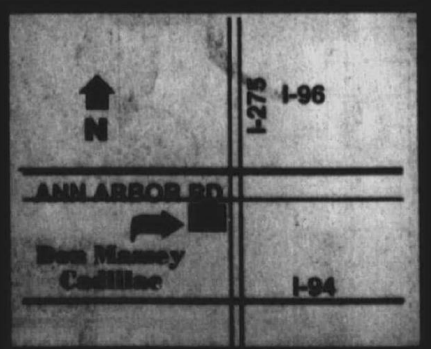
