Fake bell ringer spotted collecting

Salvation Army officials in the Canton and Plymouth areas are warning consumers that at least one person has been caught impersonating a red kettle bell-ringer this holiday season.

"There are people out there who are dishonest and they are soliciting in the Salvation Army name," said Martha Schultz, community center director and kettle coordinator for the Salvation Army in this area. "It's unfortunate, but there are some out there."

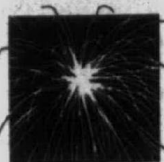
The incident in question occurred on Nov. 27 and involved a man who was holding a tin can in front of the Canton Kroger store, asking for donations on behalf of the Salvation Army. When a Salvation Army worker confronted him and asked for identification, he bolted for his car and left the area, Schultz said. Unfortunately, a number of people were seen putting money in the man's tin cup.

Schultz asks area residents to watch for the Salvation Army's "three b's" at any of their 18 sites throughout the community:

- the Salvation Army bell
- the Salvation Army bucket
- and a badge identifying the person as a worker or volunteer.

Also, she noted, no Salvation Army personnel work on Sunday. "We don't even ring on Sundays, but our stand is still out there," she added.

Ice fest to scrap fireworks

Better hang those holiday decorations well. You may want to leave them up a couple of weeks longer than usual.

That's because during the 15th Annual Plymouth Ice Sculpture Spectacular Jan. 15-20, prizes will be given for residences and businesses decorated in Christmas song

themes.

Carol Stone, of the city beautification committee which is judging the contest, said those seeking to enter the contest should pick a song — like "Frosty the Snowman" — and decorate along that theme.

The committee hasn't decided on prizes, but she said one idea is to offer Victorian yard lanterns.

Ice festival organizer Mike Watts

said he's doing pretty well in signing up sponsors for this year's ice fest, thanks partly to the success last year. "But the more money we raise the more can add to event," he said.

The non-profit ice festival committee asks businesses to sponsor the placing of ice carvings in front of their locations for \$300. Watts stresses this is the basic cost to have the work done. "It encourages people to walk the downtown streets."

"We need those sponsorships because time is running short," he said. Watts can be reached at 459-6969.

The fireworks — which last year

drew the largest crowd ever for the festival — won't return this year.

"I found with fireworks that everybody comes at one time and leaves at one time," Watts said. "It was probably more people than we anticipated."

New this year will be a cyber light show. "They can change color and shape, they're much brighter than the other kinds of lighting we've done in the past. We're able to have that every night of the event," Watts said.

Because this is the 15th or "crys-

Kids can bear more with teddy bears

Earlier this year, Plymouth Police Sgt. Steven Hundersmarck found himself responding to an incident and wishing that "Operation Teddy Bear" was still in existence.

"It was an instance of domestic abuse between a mom and the other adult living there, who

became very violent. The mom chased the boyfriend out of the house," said Hundersmarck.

"There were two children, both boys, 7 and 8 years old. They of course were traumatized and became so scared that they ran outside, at which time the parents ran off.

"I remember it was a very cold evening. The boys were shaking. It

wasn't so much that it was cold, but that they were scared. This wasn't the first time this had happened, we learned later."

Had Operation Teddy Bear been operational, Hundersmarck would have been able to pull two teddy bears out of his trunk to give to the boys; the intent being to give them something comforting to hold during a difficult time.

Thanks to the Plymouth Wool Gatherers Knitting Guild, Operation Teddy Bear is back in business.

"On Nov. 21, the Plymouth and Plymouth Township police agencies received a gift of 30 teddy bears from the Wool Gatherers Knitting Guild of Plymouth," said

New treasurer eyes higher interest yield

New Plymouth Township Treasurer Ron Edwards is looking to make more interest dollars for residents.

The township board of trustees, which Edwards sits on, approved a new investment policy a few days after he took office late last month.

"One of the changes is it allows us to invest more in commercial paper," said the certified public accountant. "Right now there isn't an advantage in today's market but there will be. We wanted to be able to adapt to changes when the marketplace changes," he said.

"We need to move our money quickly to maximize our opportunity. Our interest income will increase," Edwards told fellow township trustees Nov. 26 as they approved the policy.

Also by the policy, Finance Director Rosemary Harvey prepares a monthly cash flow statement used to analyze investments. She and Edwards meet at least once each quarter "to review the performance of the township's investment portfolio and to recommend strategy for

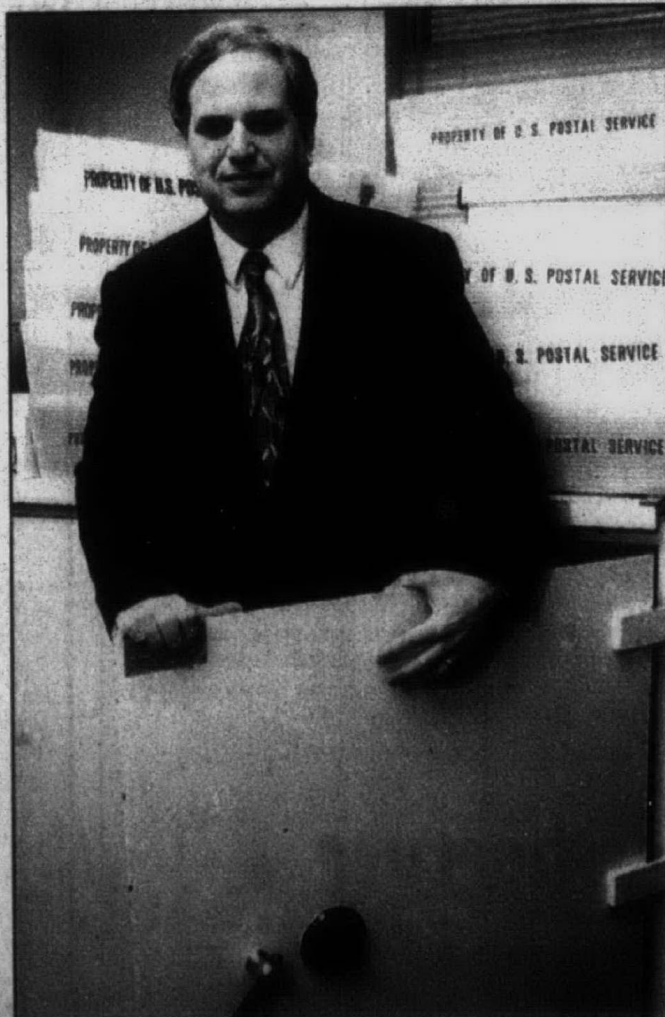
the upcoming quarter," the policy states.

Among other changes, on the second Tuesday of each month, treasurer's office hours will be expanded to 7 p.m. On the second Saturday, there will be office hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

"This allows for people coming home late from work who have a question on their water bill to come in," Edwards said. "Some people call on the phone, others like it explained in person, were trying to make it convenient for taxpayers."

"We are dealing with the public, we try to answer their questions, their concerns, we try to take care of

Plymouth postmaster dead at 65

Long time Plymouth Postmaster John Mulligan served in the Korean War and was remembered last week as "a terrific dad" by his son Pat.

Mulligan, 65, died Dec. 4 in Livonia.

"I would look to him for some advice. My feeling is he had a long and distinguished career," said current Plymouth Postmaster Joe Groff.

Pat Mulligan recalled that his father was one of first postmasters in the country appointed by the president in the mid 1960s. The family has a plaque marking that appointment, by Lyndon Johnson.

He was born Jan. 12, 1931 in Long Island, N.Y. Mulligan served in the Navy during the Korean War. "He served on a destroyer as a gunner's mate, he would site in targets on the shoreline," his son recalled.

"He saw combat action. He said he really didn't like the idea of war but he did it because there were people he needed to help out," Pat Mulligan said. John Mulligan lost hearing in one ear due to his military service.

Mulligan was into exercise and was active-

ly involved with the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve, helping with patrols during events including the hydroplane races.

"His family and friends truly loved him," his son said.

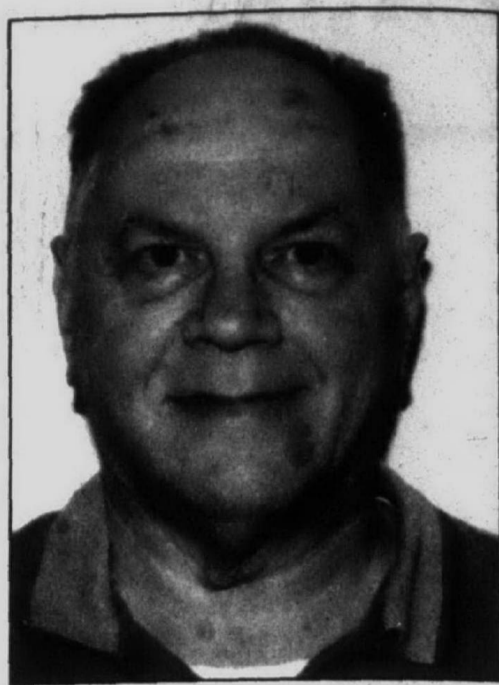
Mulligan came to Plymouth in 1956. He was a member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church, the Plymouth Morning Kiwanis Club and was a member of the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce.

He retired from the postmaster job in October 1995 after 24 years with the postal service.

Survivors include wife Catherine of Plymouth; son Pat Mulligan of Plymouth, his mother Mary Mulligan of Plymouth, and his uncle Jerome V. Jerome of North Carolina.

Funeral services were scheduled for 10:30 a.m. today at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church with the Rev. John Sullivan officiating. Burial was scheduled for Riverside Cemetery in Plymouth.

Funeral arrangements were handled by the Schrader-Howell Funeral Home of Plymouth.

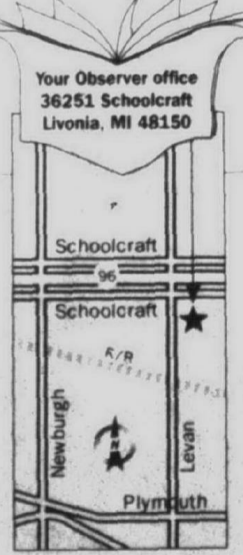

Pause before buying pet for Christmas

It seems that pet store owners and veterinarians have 101 reasons why not to buy dalmations.

Instead, they advise holiday shoppers who want to give pets as gifts to consider ferrets, cats, birds, fish or dogs such as beagles, golden retrievers and mixed breeds.

Still others don't recommend giving pets at all for Christmas.

"Kids are too excited, and sometimes a living creature gets lost in the holiday shuffle," said Terri Bennett, owner of Specialty Pets of Plymouth.

Puppies, for example, need love and attention, and they may resort to whining at night and wetting the floor because of neglect, she said.

"And then they get the blame for it."

With "101 Dalmations" a box-office hit, many children want one of the spotted canines for Christmas, and that concerns pet store owners and vets.

"They have a lot of kidney problems, and 20 percent of them are blind," said Sue Comerinski, owner of Amazing Animals in Westland. "They don't have a very good temperament, either."

"I would not recommend buying a dalmation at Christmas or otherwise," she said. "I'd take a golden retriever any day."

Tammy Miller of Five Mile Animal Hospital in Redford described dalmations as "high-strung" and warned, "They can turn on you, too."

Bennett fears that the dalmation fad will prompt breeders to cash in.

"They're going to be popping out puppies left and right," she said. "Buy a stuffed one, instead."

Veterinarian Sharon Lawrenchuk of Westland Veterinary Hospital recommends ferrets for children over 10 years old.

"They are wonderful pets," she said, adding that they require

little maintenance and can be kept in a cage most of the time.

Lawrenchuk, a Livonia resident, cautioned that children under 10 tend to be afraid of ferrets, which sometimes like to nibble on an owner's hands when being held.

"It's not really mean behavior, though," she said.

Some vets say that parents buying Christmas pets for their children don't think ahead.

"At Christmas or anytime, owning a pet requires a lot of care and responsibility," Lawrenchuk said.

She offered these tips when looking for pets:

■ Consider the animal's size and whether it will have enough space in a residence and yard.

■ "Meet the animal's parents," if possible, to see what their personalities are like.

■ If shopping for a dog, consider a mixed breed. "They are usually the most healthy, intelligent and best-tempered."

■ Think about an animal's maintenance. Long-haired dogs such as collies "need a lot of upkeep," Lawrenchuk said.

Bennett discouraged hasty

decisions to buy animals during the holiday rush.

"It's the wrong thing to do," she said.

Would-be pet owners should do their homework and learn about animals before buying them, Bennett said.

Rather than buying a pet for Christmas, she suggested that parents show a child a picture of an animal and discuss plans for a post-holiday purchase - when the holiday rush is over.

Miller noted that "the whole family needs to think about it before getting a pet. It's a major

responsibility."

Too often, she said, families buy pets on a whim and end up dumping them in the street or taking them to the humane society, where "they may be put to sleep."

Pets can be costly, too. Miller said they may need to be vaccinated, treated for worms and spayed or neutered - not to mention the ongoing expense of food and the potential costs of sudden health problems.

For parents determined to buy a pet for Christmas, many vets recommend getting one from the

Michigan Humane Society - a move that could save an animal's life.

Meanwhile, the humane society suggests these ways of being kind to animals:

■ Provide daily grooming.

■ Provide fresh food and water daily.

■ Keep vaccinations current.

■ Provide the proper shelter that pets need and deserve.

■ Seek medical attention promptly when needed.

■ Dress pets with appropriate collars and identification tags.

■ Spay or neuter pet.

Backyard dogs need attention

The most common abuse of backyard dogs is "out of sight, out of mind."

That's according to the Michigan Humane Society's anti-cruelty division.

"Some owners of outside dogs forget to feed and water their pets as often as they should since the dog is never directly underfoot, whining by its bowl," said a publication from the society.

"Many owners also fail to provide adequate shelter for their outside dog. In winter, an outside dog's water can freeze in their dish within an hour. The responsibility of frequently checking on the dog in periods of extreme hot and cold weather is a great one and though most people would not neglect their pet intentionally, they are often just too busy with work or other activities to attend to the animal's needs."

Besides the deprivation of physical needs, the group's cruelty investigation division commented

that most outside dogs suffer from one or more forms of emotional cruelty or neglect.

That happens when dogs are chained and typically abandoned in their owner's back yard with little contact with humans and limited chance to move around.

With such little human contact, "the exile (in the back yard) becomes an act of cruelty," said the humane society.

"In winter, they shiver. In summer, they languish. Year round, they suffer," the organization said.

Holidays a bad time to get a new animal

The Michigan Humane Society wants adults to think twice before giving a youngster a pet as a Christmas gift.

"From our perspective, never, never give a pet as a gift. When it is done, the results aren't so good," Michelle Mitchell, the society's community relations director, said.

She added that buying a pet as a gift is usually an impulse purchase.

In a flier aimed at gift-givers, the organization said:

"Do you really want a puppy? Don't just look at the cute furry

face. You're looking at a 10- to 20-year commitment of time, hundreds of hours, and money, some \$300 a year or more.

"You're looking at an animal that will be five or 10 times bigger a year from now. Those cute little teeth will chew rugs, books, furniture, fingers and everything else.

"Many, many poops and piddles lie between now and that glorious day when the puppy is finally housebroken."

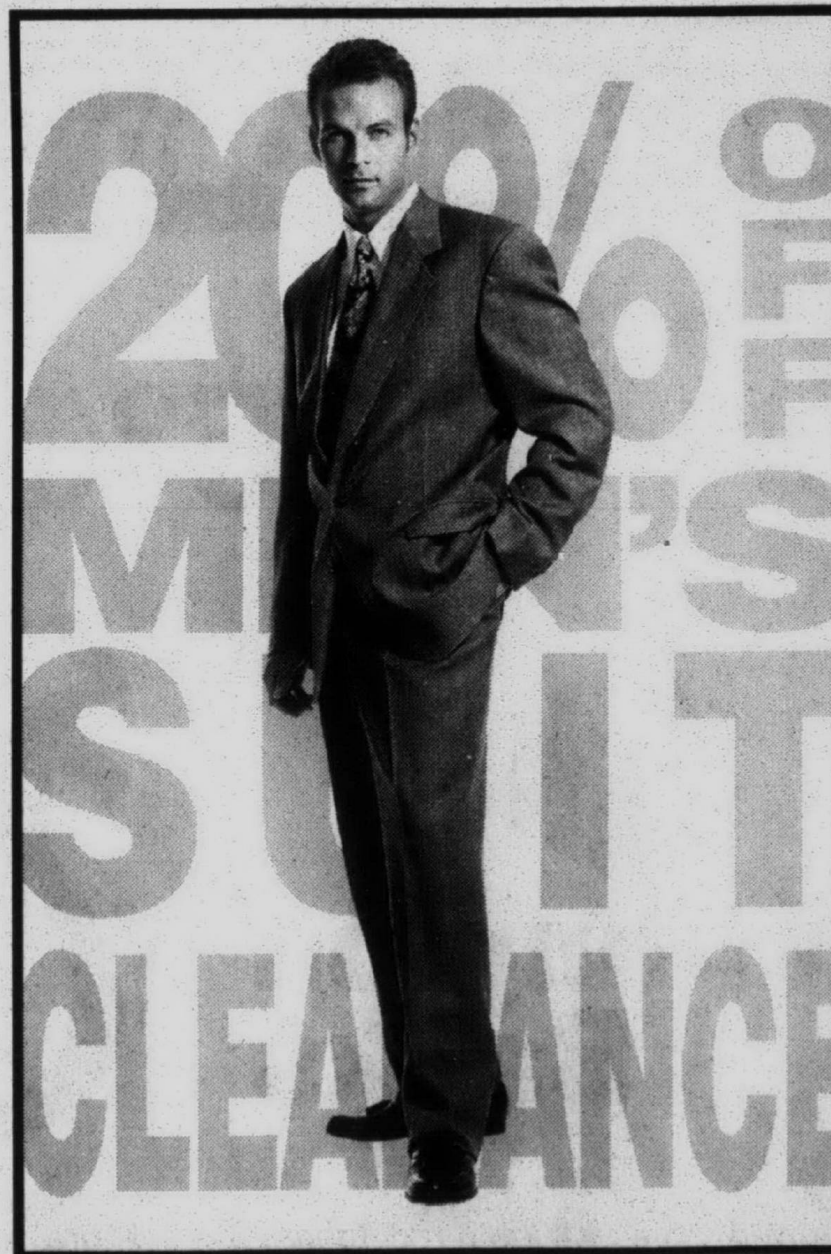
In another MHS publication, the organization stressed:

"The hectic holiday season is a

difficult time to bring a pet into a household. Holiday food and decorations can be special dangers to pets.

"Ornaments, lights, tinsel, ribbons and extension cords should be kept out of reach. Poinsettia plants can be poisonous and chocolate contains a substance which is toxic to dogs and can be fatal.

"The treasurer's main duties are collection and disbursement of the township funds, so on a daily basis I'm moving money between accounts to make sure we're earning the highest interest rate possible under State of Michigan law," Edwards said. "We make sure deposits are done at the bank on a daily basis."

The treasurer's office handles \$40 million in tax payments each year. Nearly three quarters of that total does not go to the township, but is collected here and transferred to the schools and other taxing authorities.

The office also handles dog licenses. To encourage folks to license their dogs - it costs just \$5 - Edwards stresses the licens-

es are available through the mail or by stopping in the office on the northeast corner of Ann Arbor and Lilley roads. Proof of rabies vaccination is required.

To draw attention to the dog licensing drive, the township treasurer's office today is scheduled to present Kathy Mount of Plymouth Township and her performing dog Bambi License No. 1. Mount heads the Brandy Memorial Fund raiser to help kids at Mott Children's Hospital.

Among other changes, township residents can now make tax payments at Standard Federal Bank on Haggerty Road. "If people pay their bills there the money is deposited immediately in our account," Edwards said.

Hundersmarck. "Over the past year, the members of the Guild have each purchased a bear and knitted an outfit for their bear. The bears are truly a labor of love given from each member for the Plymouth community."

Plymouth Township Sgt. Robert Smith said his department's supply of teddy bears was exhausted some time ago, and that he's delighted to have a fresh supply.

"When kids are involved in traumatic incidents, a car crash or some sort of crime, they often get a sense of being alone, especially if their parents are involved in a crash. A teddy bear gives them some security; something to hang onto. It seems to really help calm the child down," said Smith. "We've had great success with it."

Dorie Mefford, president of the Plymouth Wool Gatherers Knitting Guild, said her club borrowed the idea from the Knitting Guild of America's national program.

"When this first came up, we could send our bears down to Tennessee. We decided two years ago to give them away locally, because every police department has a program of some sort.

"We contacted the police departments this year and they were delighted to help us out," said the Plymouth Township resident.

Hundersmarck said that in the past, police gave badges to kids

at crime scenes. "The kids just held onto them. A lot of times, kids look for something physical they can grab as kind of reassurance," he said. "Teddy bears are an excellent symbol of something they can hold. Plus it's a symbol that, 'Hey, this is a police officer. He brought safety here, and he's here to help us.'"

"There's probably no better physical symbol of that than a teddy bear. That's a pretty universal sign for kids," Hundersmarck said.

The guild, which meets from 7 p.m. - 9 p.m. the third Thursday of each month at the Salvation Army on S. Main Street, includes females ranging in age from 12 - 85, and one male. They hail from communities including Plymouth, Dearborn Heights, Ann Arbor and Rochester, said Mefford, knitting instructor for Plymouth-Canton schools' adult education program.

"We have fun doing this. And it's nice knowing that some child will not necessarily be happy, but perhaps have an easier time of it with something cuddly and comforting to hang onto," she said.

Anyone interested in more information about the guild or Operation Teddy Bear may call Mefford at (313) 459-7343. "This is a project that can be kept up," she said. "There are still a lot of people who don't know we exist."

Presidential politics

Action expected on bills outlining university searches

Rep. Liz Brater, D-Ann Arbor, summed up months of waiting and days of intense work on a bill to close down university presidential searches: "Neither side likes it, so it must be good legislation."

The full state House is scheduled to vote this week on its version of Senate Bill 211, originally intended to allow university boards to search for, interview and hire presidents in total secrecy.

As it emerged from the Higher Education Committee, however, SB 211 requires a board to

SB 212, a companion bill whose fate is still in doubt, would allow universities to suppress background material on candidates under a Freedom of Information Act exemption. It came out of committee on a 5-1

vote with one abstention. Rep. Clark Harder, D-Owosso, will fight the FOIA measure unless it's amended to require revelation of all but the most personal documents about the candidates. "The finalists should stand public scrutiny," he said.

The two sides: University of Michigan Board of Regents, which sought total secrecy in its hiring. In committee, Regent Phil Power,

D-Ann Arbor, supported by Wayne State University President David Adamany, said the prospect of open applications and open interviews scared off sitting presidents of other universities.

Even if U-M was able to hire a top-notch person in Lee Bollinger last month, Power said, the open process was flawed and limiting. "I was personally told by three university presidents that they refused to go forward" under the current Open Meetings Act, said Power, without naming the presidents.

Michigan Press Association and newspapers, which sought to

A committee pushing for an ice arena in Canton has township officials interested, but not quite ready to glide ahead with a \$7 million ice arena.

The consensus at a recent township board study session seemed to be: Great idea, but will it pay for itself?

Canton Finance Director Tony Minghine has been directed to meet with members of the independent committee to look over their cost analysis. The meeting will likely take place this week.

If the township board proceeds with the ice arena proposal, a \$12,000 to \$25,000 feasibility study would be the next step. Officials would have to approve the expenditure at a public

meeting.

The \$7 million estimate includes land acquisition (approximately 10 acres) for building a two-rink, 68,000-square-foot arena.

Two of the four-member committee presented the proposal to the township board, including Wally Hill, a member of the Plymouth-Canton Hockey Association and local businessman Ralph Shufeldt. Hill called the study "conservative."

The other two members not in attendance were Mike Gulkewicz, member of the township's Recreation Advisory Committee and Dick Duwel, manager of the Canton office of Rudolph/Libbe Construction, a

company known for building ice arenas.

"We didn't want to oversell and underdeliver . . . We even figured in the Zamboni and kitchen equipment," Hill said.

The report estimates each ice surface would generate \$770,650 annually in rental revenue with 81 percent utilization. Operating costs are estimated at \$800,000 for personnel, maintenance, insurance and office supplies.

The committee is independent of the 1995 Recreation Task Force report, although the impetus for the committee meeting began during that community-based process.

Parents have day to learn needed skills

It's something you were never taught in school: how to be a good parent.

A special community Parent Day scheduled for Saturday, March 8 from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. at East Middle School is designed to change that. Child care will be provided free to those who pre-register.

A group of community leaders in Canton and Plymouth is coordinating the spring session to give area residents a chance to learn about parenting and issues that may affect their children such as gangs, drug abuse, study habits, and learning skills.

"Parent involvement is closely linked to student achievement," said Carole Levine, executive director of the Plymouth-Canton Educational Excellence Foundation, one of the sponsoring agencies for the event. "This is one way to . . . create that joint effort between the parents, educators and business community."

"There have always been a lot of resources available, but many (people) don't know where to go."

Those attending will hear a keynote speaker and have a chance to select from 21 other speakers on a variety of topics. Area agencies and businesses will also be on hand to offer information on their services, and refreshments will be served. The topics came

from a recent survey of elementary and middle school parent groups.

There will be a nominal charge for the event, which is tied to the celebration in March of Parenting Awareness Month.

Other sponsors of the day include the Plymouth-Canton Schools, the Plymouth-Canton Business Education Partnership, the Canton Chamber of Commerce, the Observer Newspapers, Johnson Controls, and Hegira Programs, Inc. a non-profit group brought in to help organize the event. Hegira has organized similar days in Wayne-Westland and Romulus.

"Redford and Livonia have these and Westland is on it's third year," said Connie Moore of Hegira. "The effort has always been providing parents with information to raise their children in a more responsible manner."

Organizers are still seeking business support and in-kind contributions of services.

The idea for the event stemmed from a three-year-old elementary education study group, including elementary school counselors.

"Parents Day — a day where parents can be educated — has been a goal of this group for some time," said Betty Bloch, coordinator of the Plymouth-Canton Business Education Partnership, and a member of that group.

She said that all parents are encouraged to attend, but that organizers are focusing on

the parents of elementary and middle school-age children. "It's at that point that parents have the most impact on their kids," she said. "That positive influence is very important."

The keynote speaker has already been selected for the day. Janice Gabe, a social worker from Indianapolis and an expert of family therapy and substance abuse issues will speak about "Raising Responsible Kids in the '90s."

Moore said that, in her experience in other communities, "parents look forward to it. They enjoy having a day to learn for themselves."

"It's not like taking medicine," Levine added. "I think people will have a good time."

Organizers said they hope to have up to 500 parents sign up for the program — the maximum East Middle School can hold.

Registration forms with a list of available speakers and topics will be available in January. Information will be promoted through the schools, the chamber and local newspapers.

House package directs gas tax money exclusively to roads

Rep. Tom Kelly, D-Wayne, had a big hand in re-designing a package of bills to trim road-building costs in Michigan.

The state House of Representatives this week will vote on the four Senate-passed bills, but the question is whether the Senate will accept the amendments.

"Right now, eight different departments take almost \$110 million from the Michigan Transportation Fund," said Kelly, a first-term member, citing the Department of State's \$86 million.

"My amendment says no state department can do that any more. When we passed the last gas tax increase in 1982, we said all the new money would be used for roads and bridges. It hasn't been."

The Kelly amendment, approved 13-1 in the Transportation Committee, would keep the \$110 million for use on roads and bridges — the equivalent of a 2 to 2.5 cents a gallon hike in the fuel tax. The political result: Lawmakers might avoid voting on a fuel tax hike in their post-election, lame-duck session.

The total state transportation fund is about \$2.1 billion. Fuel taxes bring in about \$700 million, or

one-third.

Kelly also succeeded in altering an amendment from the upper chamber sponsored by Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton. The Bennett amendment would have allowed townships of more than 10,000 population to receive state road allotments directly, taking jurisdiction away from counties.

Kelly's amendment limited the impact to Wayne County and will require townships to accept legal liability for roads, too. It also gives townships five years to opt out of the deal and return the money and jurisdiction to counties.

"My amendment forces townships to take liability.

That was my main concern," said Kelly. "It narrows the scope to Wayne County. That's where most of the argument came from."

Wayne County's government is Democratic, while many townships such as Canton have Republican officials. Townships see themselves as being short-changed by county handling of road money.

Rep. Terry London, R-Marysville, chair of the House Transportation Committee, conceded the bills "are not the answer to all of Michigan's road woes" but "provide the necessary foundation to

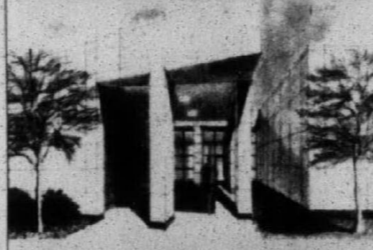

keep the law as enacted in 1976. Dawn Phillips, MPA general counsel, said 10 years of fighting cases convinced her "there's lots of paranoia and distrust of government. It's odd that you should be feeding that distrust by closing down the process."

Ed Petykiewicz, editor of the Ann Arbor News which twice has won court battles against the U-M regents, said the regents' own bad reputation was partly responsible for scaring off sitting presidents. He cited incidents where a faculty review committee, whose records were brought to light by a Freedom of Information Act suit, made derogatory references to "the Armenian candidate" and "the short and stocky candidate" in its secret deliberations.

The committee vote to recommend SB 211, the Open Meetings Act amendment, was:

YES: Republicans Jessie Dalman of Holland, Charles Perricone of Kalamazoo and John

Llewellyn of Fremont, and Democrat Clark Harder of Owosso.

NO - Democrats Brater of Ann Arbor and Lingg Brewer of Holt and Republican Harold Voorhees of Wyoming.

Dalman, three-term lawmaker and committee chair, took criticism from both sides for her handling of the bill.

The bills were sponsored by Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, and passed by the Senate in March 1995. Dalman waited 20 months, until the lame-duck session, to take them up in the House.

After the open meetings amendment was rejected on Dec. 3, Dalman didn't adjourn the meeting but merely recessed it

"at the call of the chair," giving the backers time to work on opponents. She reconvened the meeting Dec. 5.

"I'm concerned with the lame-duck process," said Harder. "I got my meeting notice the day before Thanksgiving. I'm not pleased with the fact that we (members) were bouncing between here and other committees."

Added Brater, a former council member and mayor of Ann Arbor: "I'm disappointed with the process. We were forced to rush. We met on (a Tuesday), not our usual meeting day. We're flying by the seat of our pants. We don't know the implications of this bill."

"The timing is suspect," said Brewer, criticizing Dalman for failing to bring up the bill for 11 months in 1996. Brewer, a for-

mer county commissioner and clerk, added, "People in academia, when subject to back-room deals, are first to howl. But here they put on an air of injured self-righteousness."

Voorhees, a former mayor of Wyoming, criticized the bill for setting up one set of rules for the university "niche" and another set for intermediate school districts, community colleges, school districts, counties, cities, villages and townships.

The committee rejected his amendment to extend the closed process to other units of government. The majority viewed it as a "poison pill" amendment designed to make the bill so unacceptable that it would be defeated.

Harder and Voorhees predicted that other units of government will insist on equal measures of secrecy if the university bills are enacted.

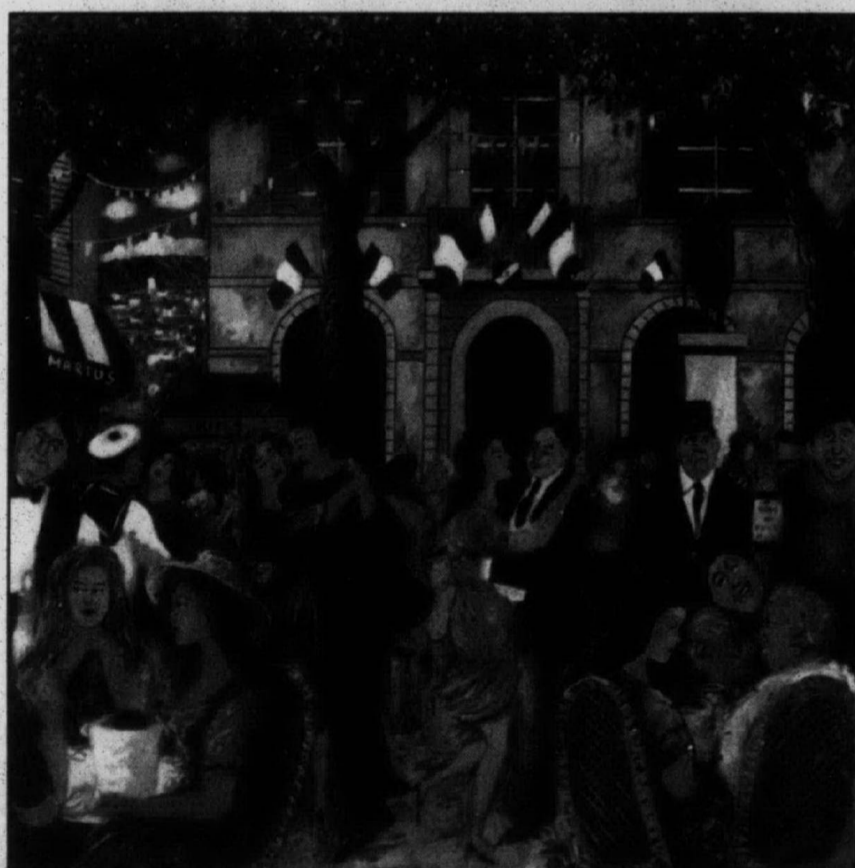

build upon."

If enacted as revised by his panel, the bills would:

- Put monetary caps on lawsuit damages by uninsured drivers. The state would have no liability if the driver were intoxicated.

- Streamlines the state pro-

cess for condemning land for highway construction.

Still in the Transportation Committee is Senate Bill 746, which would increase the motor carrier fuel tax for truckers to 18.5 cents a gallon. It provides a credit for the six-cents sales tax paid on diesel fuel.

Refer to Senate Bills 1011 (distribution of road funds), 353 (caps on liability), 778 (condemnation procedures) and 746 (diesel tax) when writing to your lawmaker, State Capitol, Lansing 48909.

Early baking, freezing eases holiday pressure

Positioned between two of the largest "cooking, baking, feasting, shopping and frenzied" holidays, it's hard to know where to start. Beat some of the holiday rush with detailed shopping lists for gifts, food and party guests. Early baking and freezing food for gifts or entertaining later will help take the pressure off. Get a head start by baking cookies, candies or breads before the rush. If these are frozen and used within six months, the taste and texture will not be affected. They will taste as fresh as the day you baked them.

To store cookies in the freezer:

- Both frosted and unfrosted cookies can be frozen.
- Arrange cookies in a container lined with plastic wrap or aluminum foil; separated with layers of aluminum foil or plastic wrap.
- Tightly seal container, label and freeze.
- Thaw cookies by allowing them to stand loosely covered on a serving plate for about 20 minutes before serving.

To store candies in the freezer:

- Individually wrap candies in wax paper or plastic wrap; nearly all candies will stay fresher longer.
- Store individually wrapped candies in boxes, tins or carton with tight-fitting lids.
- Exception: store small, hard candies together in a tight fitting jar after dusting with finely ground (not powdered) sugar.
- Do not mix candies that absorb moisture (caramels, mints, hard candies) in the same container as those that lose moisture (fudge, fondants, meringues).
- Use wax paper to individually wrap or separate layers of fudge to avoid sticking.

To store breads in the freezer:

- Baked quick breads such as muffins, biscuits, corn bread and fruit and nut breads should be wrapped air tight before freezing.
- Wrap in double thickness of foil or put in two plastic bags.
- Thaw soft-crust breads at room temperature still inside the wrapping.
- Muffin dough can be frozen right in the muffin tin, wrap well to make hot breakfast muffins when you want them, but you'll need to thaw an hour before baking.

If you are worried about making foods healthier for the holiday, make over some of your recipes. Nut breads, muffins, carrot cakes and other moist cakes are all candidates for a make-over. Use pureed fruit such as applesauce or prune to replace up to three-quarters of the oil called for in a recipe. In bar cookies, substitute equal amounts of dried fruit in place of nuts or chocolate chips.

Substitute two egg whites for every egg and use cocoa powder for chocolate. Your old-fashioned cookie recipes don't usually fare too well with fat or sugar reductions, so it may be better to find a recipe designed specifically for that purpose. There are certainly enough cookbooks out there with tested low-fat recipes.

Update recipes for holiday eggnog. Do not serve raw eggs in any form. Eggs need to be cooked for safe consumption. Commercially made eggnogs are safe to serve, they are made with pasteurized eggs. Commercial pasteurization destroys the salmonella bacteria. If you want to make homemade eggnog or homemade ice cream, start with a cooked base, not a raw base.

More helpful hints for the holidays are:

- Pies can be baked and frozen. For best results use within two to four months.
- If you forget to thaw the frozen whipped dessert topping, place the container of topping in the microwave, cook uncovered on medium-low until softened, about one minute.
- Buy candles and freeze, they burn better after being frozen.
- There are holiday food hazards to watch out for while entertaining. If you set food around on low tables during a party, be careful if there are small children around. These items can get caught in their windpipes and they can choke: peanuts, hard candies, popcorn, cocktail franks, small meatballs and raw carrots.

The holidays are for enjoying, not for panicking. Design a plan now to avoid feeling overwhelmed with things left to do. The more things you can do ahead of time, the better off you'll be to avoid the last minute rush.

BEATING THE HOLIDAY BLUES

This is supposed to be a happy time of the year, when friends and family gather together, exchange gifts and reflect on all that we are thankful for. But for many, the frantic pace, added responsibilities and financial strain of the season can lead to depression. Add fast food eaten in the car, between shopping stops, and we can feel down right sick.

It is common to feel sluggish and bored as the days grow shorter and the weather gets colder. Many people suffer from seasonal adjustment disorder (SAD) this time of year. We drive to work before the sun comes up and drive home in the dark too. Some people respond to the lack of sun by overeating, sleeping more, feeling like they have no energy and even feeling mildly depressed.

To overcome the Holiday Blues and the urge to hibernate, you must be a little selfish. It is important to keep sight of your body's needs and adhere to them in order to stay healthy and ready to tackle the next shopping trip.

Try to avoid the fast food drive-through line. Instead, when you head off on your next shopping junket, pack some easy-to-eat snacks that provide energy and are nutritious. Apples, bananas and other fresh fruit are good choices. Raisins, sunflower seeds and pretzels are easy to eat out of hand. Sandwiches made

with whole-grain bread and lean meat are a much better choice than a high-fat burger. If you stop at a fast-food restaurant, choose a plain hamburger with no "special sauce," or a plain baked potato, side salad and juice or low-fat milk.

Exercise! The chart below gives you an idea of some suggested exercises you can do in order to burn off some of the extra food we tend to eat this time of the year. If you are not

Here's one way to think positive! Look at this suggested exercise list before you sit down to a big feast. Eat moderately, but don't deny yourself a taste of any special holiday foods. Then, plan the exercises right into your schedule. You'll feel better knowing that you are in control. These are general guidelines. Remember that each individual burns calories at a different rate, depending on fitness level, age, sex and other factors. These are only meant to be examples.

Turkey: nine ounces of light and dark meat, with skin and gravy
580 calories
Walk 5.8 miles

Stuffing: one cup
500 calories
Rowing machine for 50 minutes

accustomed to exercising, begin moderately. A brisk walk can do wonders for your spirit. Learn to cross-country ski or help a child build a snowman. Shovel a shut-ins sidewalk and make two people happy.

Try to put more light into your life. Make sure you get outside during the daylight hours, even on a cloudy day. Soak up the sun wherever you can, but remember that the sun reflecting on snow magnifies its intensity. Be sure to wear sunscreen and sunglasses.

Eat feel-good foods. Food that helps you relax are rich in carbohydrates and low in fat and protein. A baked potato with salsa, a bagel with jam, oatmeal or pretzels can help you wind down. Remember not to add butter or other fats to these foods and you'll feel more relaxed.

To fight drowsiness, eat protein-rich foods like cottage cheese, beans or lentils, fat-free yogurt, a hard-boiled egg or tuna.

Share those Christmas cookies with others. Don't keep them around the house. By giving them to someone else, you will not only get them out of your sight, the act of giving will lift your spirits.

Eat regular meals. It doesn't make sense to starve yourself before a big party then eat out of control when you get there. Eat your normal meals and satisfy your hunger.

Limit alcohol consumption. It's easy to get carried away with

all the parties and stress of the season. But booze not only stimulates your appetite, it also clouds your judgment and works as a depressant. Sparkling water and lime is a great alcohol substitute. You'll feel much better the day after a party if you down a few of these instead of martinis, spiked eggnog or champagne.

At parties, concentrate on eating slowly. Put your fork down and make conversation between bites. You'll eat less and enjoy your meal more. It takes about 20 minutes for your brain to tell you that your hunger has been satisfied.

Experiment with the "five minute rule." Wait about five minutes after each course to decide if you are still hungry.

Think positive! Talk back to your "internal critic" that says "I'll always be inferior." Train yourself to recognize self-critical thoughts and think about how these are distorted visions of reality. Strive to want to be well and plan to be well.

Here's an elegant meal in quick time

The holiday season can leave us feeling rushed and tired. With so many functions to attend, gifts to buy and chores to do, it is no wonder we don't look forward to standing over a stove in the evening. Yet, healthy meals don't have to be time consuming.

This month's recipe, Chicken with Mushroom Gravy, is an elegant meal with minimal preparation. Served with a tossed salad and steamed green vegetables, it is nutritious and filling.

The original recipe called for one pound of chicken breasts. With the skin, there are 784 calories, 41.6 grams of fat and 288 milligrams of cholesterol.

If we replace the original chicken with one pound of boneless, skinless chicken breast meat, we lower the calories to 496, contribute only 6.4 grams of fat and reduce the cholesterol to 256 milligrams. Sour cream should always be

substituted in a recipe for a lower fat alternative. Three quarters of a cup of sour cream contains 36.2 grams of fat and 369.6 calories. Substituting nonfat yogurt or nonfat sour cream will eliminate all the fat from this ingredient and contribute only 100 calories!

Margarine is added to most recipes to provide moisture. Since yogurt is higher in water content than sour cream, the excess liquid from the yogurt will allow us to reduce the amount of margarine.

Don't forget to use low-fat or fat-free salad dressing! Fat grams and calories can add up quickly if you aren't careful.

CHICKEN WITH MUSHROOM GRAVY

Original Version • Serves 4

- 1 pound chicken breasts
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 3/4 cup sour cream
- 1-1/2 teaspoons corn starch
- 1/8 teaspoon smoked yeast
- 1/4 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup onions, chopped
- 1 cup sliced fresh mushroom
- 1/4 cup dry cooking sherry



Sprinkle chicken breasts with pepper. Set aside. Combine sour cream, cornstarch and yeast. Set aside. Melt margarine in a skillet. Sauté mushrooms and onions in melted margarine. Push mushrooms and onions to the side of the pan and sear chicken on both sides until cooked through. Remove chicken and mushrooms and onions to a dish. Pour sherry into pan and let cook until reduced to 1 tablespoon. Return mushrooms and onions to pan. Stir in the yogurt mixture and heat gently. To serve, pour gravy over chicken.

CHICKEN WITH MUSHROOM GRAVY

Low-fat Version • Serves 4

- 1 pound skinless, boneless chicken breasts
- Salt-free lemon pepper
- 3/4 cup nonfat plain yogurt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1/8 teaspoon smoked yeast
- 1 teaspoon salt-free margarine
- 1/2 cup chopped onions
- 1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- 2 tablespoons dry cooking sherry


Remove all visible fat from chicken. Sprinkle generously with lemon pepper. Set aside. Combine yogurt, cornstarch and yeast. Set aside. Add margarine to a non-stick skillet and melt. Sauté mushrooms and onions. Add water or chicken broth if more liquid is needed. Place mushrooms and onions in a bowl. Place chicken in pan and sear on both sides until cooked through. Remove to a serving dish. Pour sherry into the skillet and cook until reduced to one tablespoon. Return the onions and mushrooms to pan. Stir in the yogurt mixture and heat gently. Pour gravy over chicken.

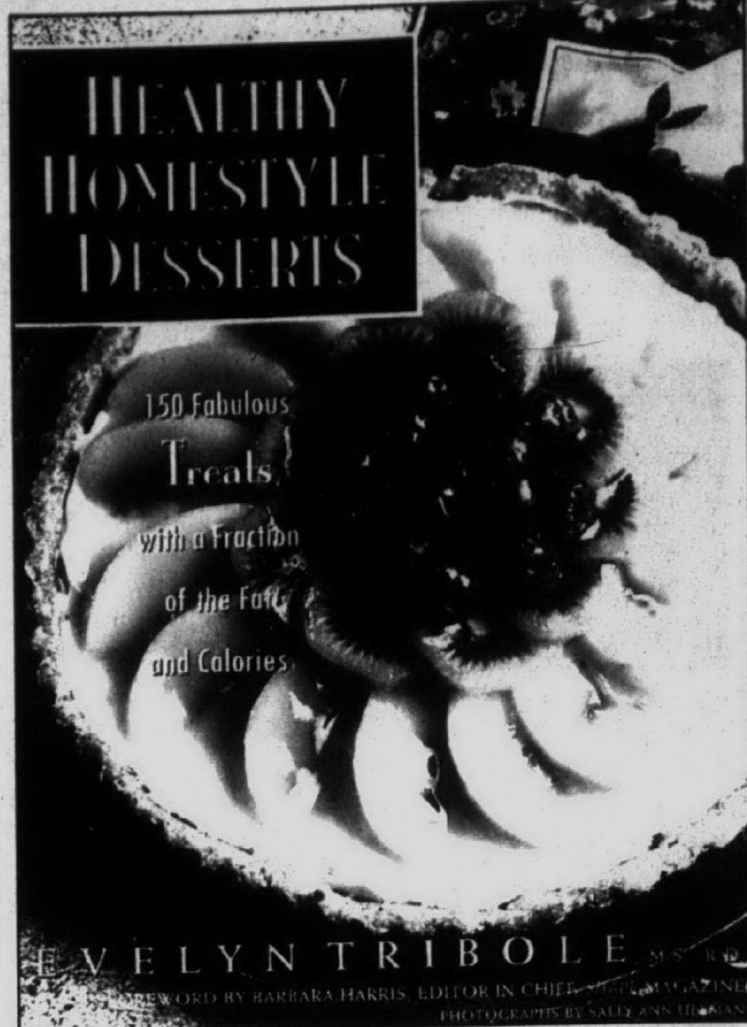

Hanukkah recipes can be easy to make

BY THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

In the November-December issue of the culinary newsletter "Cinnamon Hearts," visiting chef Dorothy Baldauf shares her recipes for Hanukkah. Hanukkah Fruit Fritters are easy to make, using a fresh banana and apple and canned, well-drained pineapple pieces. The recipe for Sweet Israeli Chicken is made with dried fruits and walnuts, but canned fruits or other nuts can also be used.

SWEET ISRAELI CHICKEN

2 pounds chicken, cut into

- small pieces
- 25 dried apricots, or apricots and prunes
- 4 ounces orange, apricot or pomegranate preserves or marmalade
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts or almonds
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1/2 cup heavy grape juice or kosher blackberry wine
- 1 1/2 tablespoons vinegar
- 3 cloves minced garlic
- 1 large onion, thinly sliced
- 1/3rd cup honey

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Rinse chicken pieces and pat dry. Place in a large roasting dish or casserole.

Combine the rest of the ingredients in a large bowl and mix well. Pour the mixture over the chicken. Bake for 1 1/2 hours or until golden brown, basting every 15 minutes. Add water, if necessary. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

Note: Dried apples or pears, or canned fruits like mandarin oranges, or fresh peaches, oranges or tangerines may be used in place of the dried apricots or apricots and prunes. Other nuts like cashews, pistachios or hazelnuts may be used

for variety.

HANUKKAH FRUIT FRITTERS

- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- Vegetable oil
- 1 banana, sliced
- 1 apple, peeled, cored and thinly sliced
- 6 slices canned, well-drained pineapple pieces

Prepare batter by beating

together the egg, milk and melted butter.

Sift the dry ingredients together and blend with liquid ingredients. Beat until smooth and no lumps remain (flour may be added to make a stiff, but not dry, batter).

Heat vegetable oil to a depth of 1/2-inch in a large, heavy skillet. (Note: Oil should be no less than 365 degrees F and should never be smoking. Let oil reheat between batches.)

Stir well-dried fruit slices into batter; drain, drop by full tablespoonfuls into oil. Fry until brown on both sides.

Lift fritters out with a slotted spoon and dry on absorbent paper. Serve hot with a sprinkling of confectioners' sugar. Makes 6 servings.

Eating tips for the holidays

A pinch of moderation and a dash of common sense can help prevent your holiday meals from becoming a recipe for heartburn and the discomfort that goes with it.

Heartburn is an irritation of the esophagus - the tube connecting the throat and the stomach. It is often caused by eating too much too quickly.

Ordinarily, after you swallow, food travels down the esophagus to the junction of the esophagus and stomach where there is a valvelike mechanism known as the lower esophageal sphincter.

This muscular ring generally opens only to allow food into the stomach or to permit the escape of excess gas in the form of a burp.

When you overeat or eat too fast, you strain the capacity of the digestive tract to process the food and cause a buildup of pressure in the stomach.

This excess causes a buildup of pressure in the stomach that forces the opening of the lower esophageal sphincter. As a consequence, the acids and gastric juices used in digestion within the stomach reflux, or flow back into, and irritate the esophagus.

Pacing yourself and taking time to enjoy the food you eat can help prevent one part of the problem. But it's also important to monitor when and what

you eat and drink.

If you want to reduce the chance of reflux, begin by avoiding an excess of alcoholic drinks or caffeinated beverages, such as coffee, tea or colas.

Alcoholic drinks pose additional problems because they serve as irritants to the digestive tract.

Another step to avoid heartburn is to limit the amount of fried or high-fat foods that you eat - gravies, sausage stuffing and ham for example.

It generally takes two-to-three hours for digestion within the stomach to be completed and the stomach to empty.

But high-fat foods slow the digestive process, leading to an uncomfortable, bloated sensation. They can also stimulate reflux by inducing relaxation of the lower esophageal sphincter.

Despite their best intentions, many people overdo their holiday cheer. If this is the case, medications, such as antacids or histamine receptor antagonists, now available over-the-counter, can provide relief.

Be aware, however, that these medications are for occasional use and are not a substitute for restraint at the dinner table.

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT (96-3)

The Canton Township Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended as follows: Article 27.03 -- SPECIAL LAND USE REVIEW PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS

This section is amended by amending the application data requirements to require a preliminary site plan and written documentation of meeting the Special Land Use standards to be submitted and acted upon prior to the submission of site plans or plats (subsection B), and amending the standards for granting Special Land Use Approval (subsection C).

FIRST READING DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON, MICHIGAN ORDINANCE NO. 115A

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CANTON PURSUANT TO ACT 197, PUBLIC ACT OF MICHIGAN, 1975; TO DETERMINE THE NECESSITY THEREOF; TO PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION OF THE AUTHORITY; TO DEFINE THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE AUTHORITY; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THE ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE NOTICE AND EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON ORDAINS: 104.751 Section 1 TITLE OF ORDINANCE. The ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Downtown Development Authority Ordinance." (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.752 Section 2 DEFINITIONS. The terms used in the ordinance shall have the same meaning as given to them in Act 197 or hereinafter in this section provided unless the context clearly indicates to the contrary. As used in this ordinance:

"Act 197" means Act No. 197 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1975, as now in effect or hereinafter amended. "Authority" means the Downtown Development Authority of Township of Canton created by this ordinance. "BOARD" or "BOARD of Directors" means the BOARD of Directors of the Authority, the governing body of the Authority.

"Chief Executive Officer" means the supervisor of the Township. "Downtown District" means the downtown district designated by this ordinance as now existing or hereafter amended.

"Township" means the Township of Canton, Wayne County, Michigan. "Township BOARD" means the Township BOARD of the Township of Canton. (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.753 Section 3 DETERMINATION OF NECESSITY. The Township Board hereby determines that it is necessary for the best interests of the Township to amend the boundaries of the Downtown District in order to halt property value deterioration and increase property tax valuation where possible in the business district of the Township, to eliminate the causes of the deterioration and to promote economic growth by establishing a downtown development authority pursuant to Act 197. (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.754 Section 4 CREATION OF AUTHORITY. There is hereby created pursuant to Act 197 a downtown development authority for the Township. The Authority shall be a public body corporate and shall be known and exercise its powers under the title of "Downtown Development Authority of the Township of Canton." The Authority may adopt a seal, may sue and be sued in any court of this state and shall possess all of the powers necessary to carry out the purpose of its incorporation as provided by this ordinance and Act 197. The enumeration of a power in this ordinance or in Act 197 shall not be construed as a limitation upon the general powers of the Authority. (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.755 Section 5 DESCRIPTION OF DOWNTOWN DISTRICT. The Downtown District in which the Authority shall exercise its powers as provided by Act 197 shall consist of the described territory in the Township, subject to this ordinance and Act 197, as set forth in Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part hereof. (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.756 Section 6 BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The Authority shall be under the supervision and control of the BOARD of Directors consisting of the chief executive of the Township and not less than eight or more than twelve members as determined by the Township BOARD. The members shall be appointed by the chief executive officer of the township, subject to the approval by the Township BOARD. Not less than a majority of the members shall be persons having interest in property located in the downtown district. Not less than one of the members shall be a resident of the downtown district, if the downtown district has 100 or more persons residing within it. Of the members first appointed, an equal number, as near as is practical, shall be appointed for one year, two years, three years and four years. Members shall hold office until the members' successor is appointed. Thereafter, each member shall serve for a term of four years. An appointment to fill vacancy shall be made by the chief executive officer of the township for the unexpired term only. Members of the BOARD shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses. (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.757 Section 7 POWERS OF AUTHORITY. The Authority shall have all powers enumerated or implied by law in Act 197. (Ord. no. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.758 Section 8 FISCAL YEAR; ADOPTION OF BUDGET. A) The fiscal year of the Authority shall begin on January 1 of each year and end on December 31 of that same year, or such other fiscal year as may hereafter be adopted by the Township. B) The BOARD shall annually prepare a budget and shall submit it to the Township BOARD on the same date that the proposed budget for the Township is required by law to be submitted to the Township BOARD. The BOARD shall not finally adopt a budget for any fiscal year until the budget has been approved by the Township BOARD. The BOARD may, however, temporarily adopt a budget in connection with the operation of any improvements which have been financed by revenue bonds where required to do so by the ordinance authorizing the revenue bonds.

C) The Authority shall submit financial reports to the Township BOARD at the same time and on the same basis as departments of the Township are required to submit reports. The Authority shall be audited annually by the same independent auditors auditing the Township and copies of the audit report shall be filed with the Township BOARD. (Ord. No. 115, eff. July 24, 1984)

104.759 Section 9 SECTION HEADINGS; SEVERABILITY; REPEALER. Section headings in this Ordinance are furnished for convenience only and shall not be considered to be part of this ordinance. Ordinance No. 115 is hereby amended to incorporate the amended boundaries of the Downtown District as stated above and is otherwise ratified and confirmed as being in full force and effect. All other ordinances, resolutions and orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed, and each section of the Ordinance and each subdivision of any section thereof is hereby declared to be independent, and the finding or holding of any section of subdivision thereof to be invalid or void shall not be deemed or held to affect the validity of any other section or subdivision.

104.760 Section 10 PUBLICATION, RECORDING, AND EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be published once in full promptly after its adoption in the Canton Observer and Eccentric, a newspaper of general circulation in the Township, qualified under State Law to publish legal notices, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the Township, which recording shall be authenticated by the signature of the Township Clerk. This Ordinance is hereby determined by the Township Board to be immediately necessary for the interests of the Township and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND A TAX INCREMENT FINANCE PLAN PERTAINING TO THE DOWNTOWN

DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY DISTRICT PROJECT PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 197, PUBLIC ACTS OF MICHIGAN OF 1975, AND TO PROVIDE FOR MATTERS RELATED THERETO. THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON HEREBY ORDAINS:

104.801 Section 1 DEFINITIONS. The terms used in this ordinance shall have the following meaning unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

"Act 197" means the Downtown Development Authority Act, Act No. 197 of Public Acts of Michigan of 1975. "Captured Assessed Value" means the amount in any one year by which the current assessed value as finally equalized of all taxable property in the Development Area exceeds the Initial Assessed Value, as more fully described in the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan.

"Development Area" shall mean the area within the boundaries of the Canton Downtown Development Authority Ordinance, Ordinance No. 115(A) as amended, and as illustrated in the Downtown Development Authority Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan, 1984/2000.

"Development Plan" means the Development Plan for the Downtown Development Authority District, illustrated in the Downtown Development Authority Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan, 1984/2000.

"Initial Assessed Value" means the most recently assessed value, as finally equalized by the State Board of Equalization, of all taxable property within the boundaries of the Downtown Development Authority at the time of adoption of this ordinance, as more fully described in the Downtown Development Authority Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan, 1984/2000.

"Tax Increment" shall be that portion of the tax levy of all Taxing Jurisdictions paid each year on real and personal property in the Downtown Development Authority district on the Captured Assessed Value, as more fully described in the Downtown Development Authority Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan, 1984/2000.

"Downtown Development Authority" means the Charter Township of Canton Downtown Development Authority as established by Ordinance No. 115(A) as amended.

"Tax Increment Finance Plan" means the Tax Increment Finance Plan for the Canton Downtown Development Authority District, including the Development Plan, as transmitted to the Canton Township Board of Trustees by the Downtown Development Authority for public hearing, and as confirmed by this Ordinance, copies of which are on file in the office of the Township Clerk.

"Taxing Jurisdiction" shall mean each unit of government levying an ad valorem property tax on property in the Downtown Development Authority District.

All other undefined terms, unless the context of this Ordinance specifically requires otherwise, shall have the meanings attributed to them by current usage. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.802 Section 2 APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF THE DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND TAX INCREMENT FINANCE PLAN, 1984/2000

Pursuant to Section 19(1) Act 197, the Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Canton hereby finds and determines as follows:

- a) That the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan constitutes and embodies a public purpose of the Charter Township of Canton; b) That the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan meets the requirements set forth in Section 17(2) of Act 197; c) That the proposed method of financing the development activities described in the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan is feasible, and that the Downtown Development Authority has the ability to arrange the financing; d) That the development activities described in the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan are reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of Act 197; e) That the land to be acquired within the Downtown Development Authority District is reasonable necessary to carry out the purposes of the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan and the purposes of Act 197; f) That the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan is in reasonable accord with the approved Master Plan of the Charter Township of Canton; g) That public services, such as fire and police protection and utilities are, or will be, adequate to service the Downtown Development Authority District; and h) That such changes in zoning, street levels, intersections and utilities as are contemplated by the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan are reasonably necessary for the Project and for the Charter Township of Canton. In accordance with the foregoing considerations, the Downtown Development Authority Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan, 1984/2000 and all respective amendments thereto shall be maintained on file in the Township Clerk's office and cross-indexed to this Ordinance. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.803 Section 3 BOUNDARIES OF DEVELOPMENT AREA. The boundaries of the development Area are hereby adopted and confirmed. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.804 Section 4 PREPARATION OF BASE YEAR ASSESSMENT ROLL

a) Within 60 days of the effective date of this Ordinance, the Township Assessor shall prepare the Base Year Assessment Roll. The Base Year Assessment Roll shall list each Taxing Jurisdiction in which the Downtown Development Authority District is located, the Initial Assessed Value of the Development District on the effective date of this Ordinance and the amount of tax revenue derived by each Taxing Jurisdiction from ad valorem taxes on the property in the Development District.

b) The Township Assessor shall transmit copies of the Base Year Assessment to the Township Treasurer, the County Treasurer, the Downtown Development Authority, and each Taxing Jurisdiction, together with a notice that the assessment roll has been prepared in accordance with this Ordinance and the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan approved by this Ordinance. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.805 Section 5 PREPARATION OF ANNUAL ASSESSMENT ROLL

Each year within 15 days following the final equalization of property in the Development District, the Township Assessor shall prepare an updated Annual Assessment Roll. The Annual Assessment Roll shall show the information required in the Base Year Assessment Roll and, in addition, the Captured Assessed Value for that year. Copies of the Annual Assessment Roll shall be transmitted by the Assessor to the same persons as the Base Year Assessment Roll, together with a notice that it has been prepared in accordance with this Ordinance and the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.806 Section 6 IMPLEMENTATION

All Tax Increments shall be transmitted by the Township Treasurer and the Treasurer of Wayne County to the Township Treasurer for the account of the Downtown Development Authority at the earliest practicable date. All Tax Increments, so received by the Downtown Development Authority shall be disbursed in accordance with the provisions of the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan and the requisitions of the Downtown Development Authority. For the purposes of segregation and transfer of such funds, the Township Treasurer shall maintain a separate fund which shall be kept in a depository bank account or accounts in a bank or banks approved by the Controller of the Township, to be designated Downtown Development Authority Project fund. All amounts payable to the Downtown development Authority shall, subject to the foregoing, be deposited directly in the Downtown Development Authority Project Fund. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.807 Section 7 DURATION OF TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN

The Tax Increment Finance Plan will continue in effect until all purposes of the Development Plan and Tax Increment Finance Plan have been fulfilled. (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

104.808 Section 8 ORDINANCE IMMEDIATELY EFFECTIVE UPON PUBLICATION

This Ordinance has been deemed necessary to assure the preservation of the general welfare of the Canton Community; therefore, said Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the Township (Ord. no. 116, eff. Dec. 22, 1984)

Seminars offered in Livonia for coping with grief during holidays

GranCare Hospice in Livonia is offering two seminars, "Bittersweet Celebration: Coping With Grief During the Holidays," on Tuesday from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. and on Wednesday from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.

"Grief during the holidays is often intensified because of the fantasy society has created of the 'perfect holiday,'" said Joan Southworth, GranCare bereavement counselor. "The grieving person misses the intimacy and closeness of their loved one, making coping with their absence even more difficult."

The seminars are open to the public at no charge.

Southworth offers these tips for coping with grief over the holidays:

- Plan ahead. Prepare emotionally by thinking about the holidays and making a plan for celebrating without your loved one. Talk over your plan with family and friends.
- Break tradition. Celebrate the holidays differently by creating new traditions like opening

- gifts at your child's home instead of yours, or opening gifts at a different time.
- Allow yourself to grieve. Take time to feel sadness, but set a limit of 15 or maybe 30 minutes. Cry if you need to. Tears are normal and can be healing.
- Be aware of possible grief attacks. You may feel emotionally overwhelmed when you hear a special holiday song or drive by familiar holiday displays. Allow yourself to feel what you feel. Afterward, you will probably be better able to cope with your activities.
- Recognize that holiday stress and distress are normal. People expect holidays to mean family closeness, relaxation, intimacy and togetherness. Realize that, in reality, most of us experience some level of holiday stress, anxiety and sometimes disappointment, even when not grieving. We often remember only the good parts of holidays and not the anxieties, even when not grieving. We often remember

- only the good parts and not the anxieties, even when loved ones were here to celebrate.
- Reminisce about past holidays. Talk about your loved one and holidays you've shared. Encourage others to share with you about your loved one who has died.
- Talk about your feelings. Choose a family member or friend with whom you feel comfortable sharing your feelings. Or, join a support group.
- Start a new ritual in your loved one's memory. Volunteer at a soup kitchen or nursing home, or make a special decoration that you display in a visible spot.
- Learn to ask for help. Be specific about what you need from family and friends. Ask for help with decorating, shopping, cooking and baking or addressing holiday cards.

House votes to sell state's vaccine manufacturing laboratory

The House of Representatives voted to sell the state's vaccine manufacturing laboratory, the nation's last such state-owned facility, and sent the bill to the Senate.

The vote was 66-32. Republican Lyn Bankes of Redford joined Democrats Maxine Berman of Southfield, Eileen DeHart of Westland and Tom Kelly of Wayne in opposing the House Bill 6192 on Dec. 3.

"The entire process has been co-opted by the executive branch for the last four years," Berman objected. "The Legislature held no hearings until the bill was presented to them."

"The labs should not have been allowed to deteriorate, but since Gov. John Engler's administration decided to have this happen, we should at least get fair value for what we are giving up."

The Michigan Biologic Products Institute's childhood vaccine sales have dwindled in recent years. But it is the only licensed manufacturer of the anthrax vaccine, an inoculation against chemical warfare that the Pentagon requires for active-duty personnel.

HB 6192, which drew opposition, authorizes the lab's sale. A second bill, passed, 96-0, provides for early retirement options and a one-year job guarantee for employees after the sale.

Youth bills OK'd

Three bills by Sen. Mike Rogers, R-Brighton, would crack down on juvenile home escapees if signed by the governor. The House passed them 88-0 and the Senate concurred in amendments 34-0 during the post-session.

tion session.

Aimed at the W.J. Maxey home in Livingston County but applying to all juvenile residences, the bills require state officials to notify local police departments and State Police of escapes and place the notification on the law enforcement information network (LEIN).

Lists to be public

Private citizens would have access to records of sex offenders in their community under a Senate-passed bill waiting House action.

"We now have 20,384 individuals in Michigan's sex offender registry," said Sen. Michael Boucard, R-Birmingham, the bill's sponsor. "While that's a startling number, it also allows law enforcement personnel to

monitor the whereabouts of these potentially dangerous individuals."

"Also, information like this will empower people to take preventive actions to protect themselves and their children," he said, citing the case of two girls murdered in 1992 by repeat sex offender Leslie A. Williams.

Opponents, however, fear vigilante action may be taken against ex-convicts who have served their prison terms.

Liquor bill passes

Sen. Willis Bullard Jr., R-Milford, said his Senate-passed bill will help protect the public and employees as the Liquor Control Commission privatizes its operations.

His SB 1171, passed Dec. 4 and sent to the House, would:

- Reduce the state's markup from 65 percent to 55 percent.
- Ensures that authorized distribution agents (ADAs) will provide weekly deliveries and 12 emergency deliveries to retailers and prohibit the charging of split-case and delivery fees.
- Prohibits ADAs from having an interest in a retailer of liquor.
- Requires that liquor distributors be located in Michigan and encourages them to hire former state LCC employees.

Residence bill stalled

A bill prohibiting city residency requirements is stalled in a

House committee and may die there. Senate Bill 766, sponsored by former Sen. Dave Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, is in the Local Government Committee.

Lame-duck Rep. Sandy Hill, R-Montrose, is seeking a House vote to discharge the bill from committee but so far has been unsuccessful.

"I have heard from many police officers and firefighters on this issue who feel their rights are being violated," said Hill. "People should be allowed to live where they wish if they can do their jobs competently."

"I am very impressed with the number of children's lives the Livonia Head Start program enriches and wanted to show my support for the program as well as the community," Tennyson said.

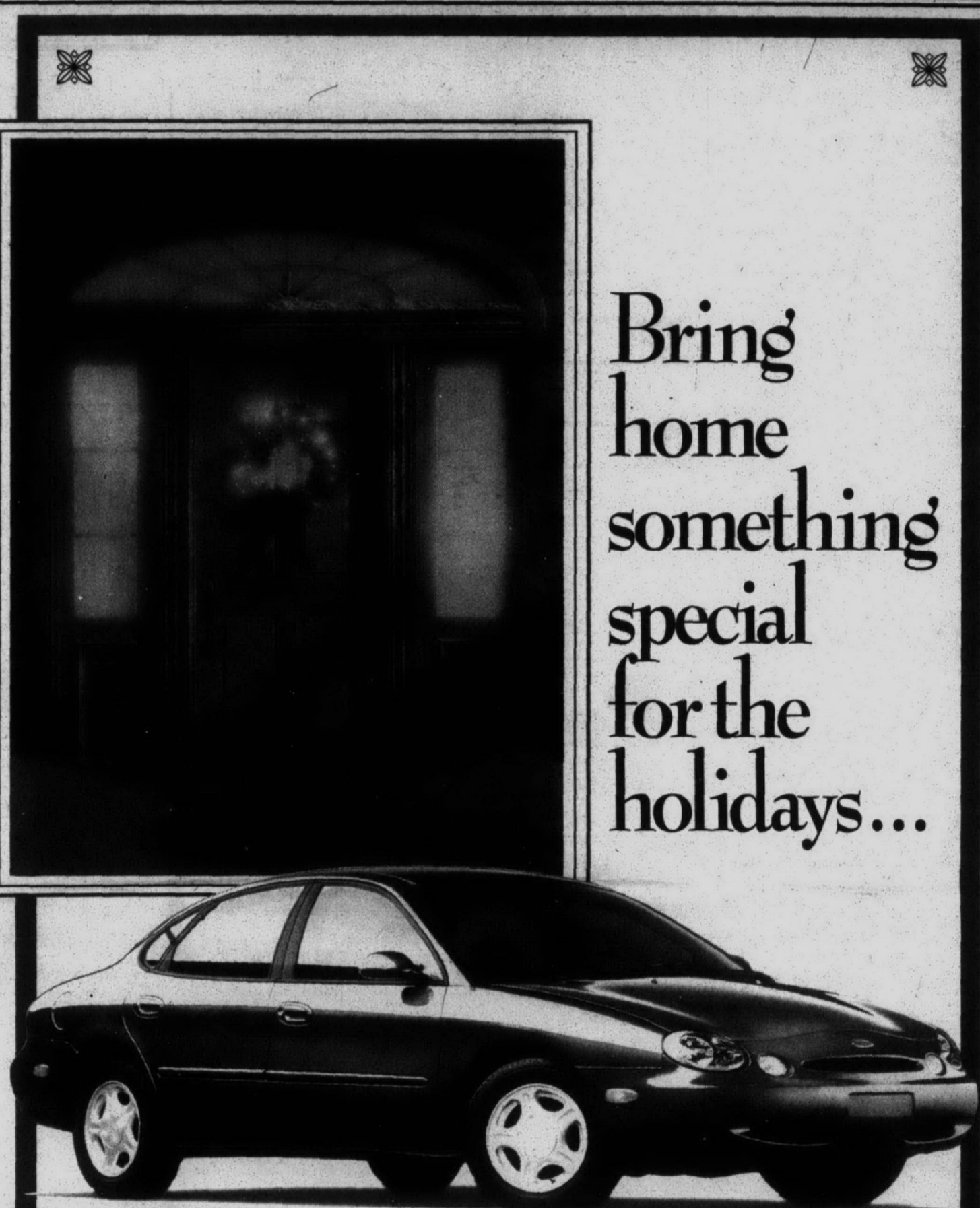
Donna Pomerson, director of the Livonia Head Start program, was pleased with the generosity of Tennyson.

5. Matt Bauman, senior center, Livonia Franklin: Slowed by a pre-season leg injury, the University of Detroit-Mercy signee won't return to the lineup until January. The 6-8 Bauman has been productive each of his two years in the Franklin lineup.

6. Rob Johnson, senior forward, Plymouth Canton: Johnson came back from a knee injury early in his junior year to lead Canton to a 22-2 record and a district championship before losing to Detroit Pershing in the regional. He can take a hit, as he has shown as a quarterback in football, and is as rugged as they get in the paint in basketball. Signed with Northwestern for football.

7. Richard Rashad, senior forward, Wayne Memorial: The 6-4 senior is Wayne's biggest threat around the basket. He is more comfortable facing the basket, but can post up when the Zebras are in the half-court offense.

8. Chris Young, junior center, Detroit Catholic Central: Young played only a handful of games on the varsity as a sophomore but is getting a lot of looks from major colleges after an impressive summer on Battier's AAU team. He runs the floor well for someone 6-9 and has some strong moves in the post.

9. Shawn Wolosyn, senior guard, Livonia Churchill: If he's improved his defense, the 6-3 Wolosyn is a definite Division I player. He has a variety of moves on offense and a jump shot that's hard to defend.

10. LaVelle Guess, senior guard, Wayne Memorial: Wouldn't it be something if you could combine Lorenzo Guess' playmaking ability and LaVelle Guess' sweet shot into one? The twins have their own styles and complement one another perfectly. LaVelle, long in Lorenzo's shadow, has become one of the most feared shooters in the metro area.

But perhaps Madonna's defining moment came the previous day.

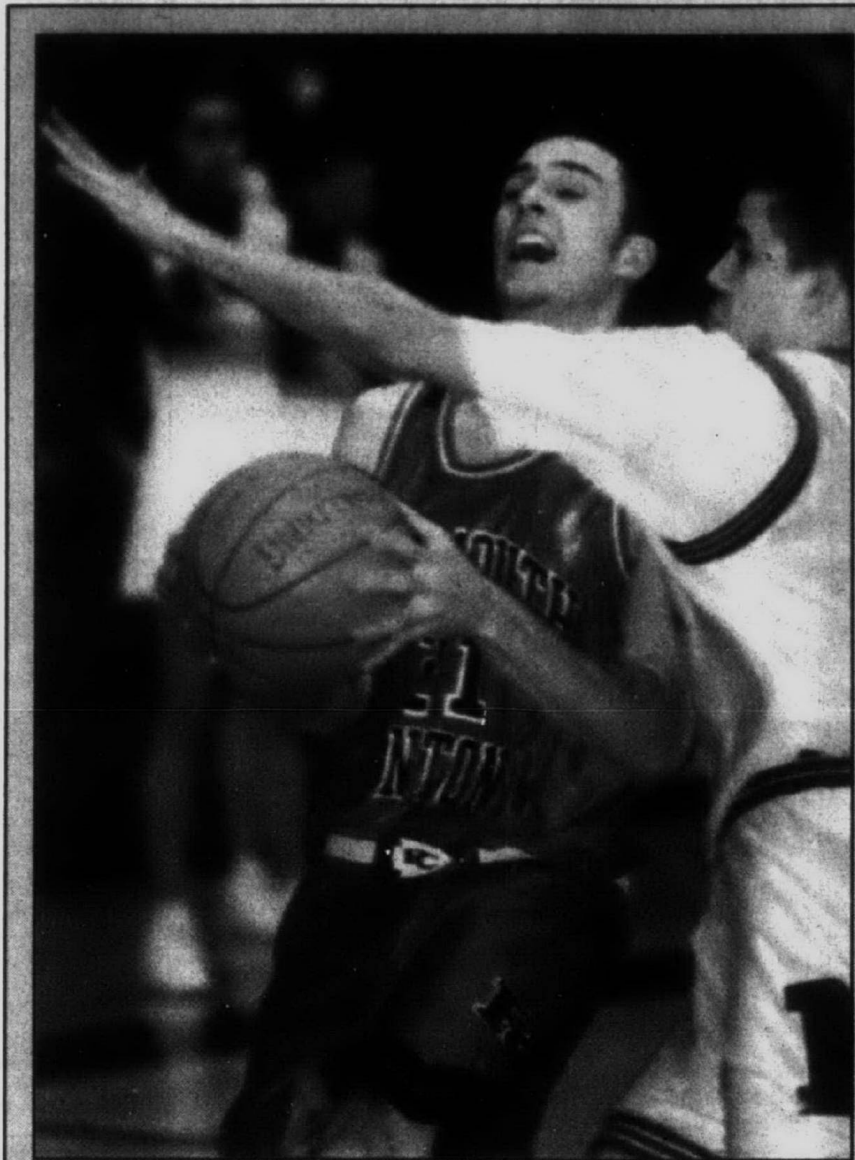

Seniors to make Canton a power

The future is now for Plymouth Canton's basketball team.

For the past three years, the Chiefs have been a powerhouse in the Western Lakes Activities Association. Such top-drawer athletes as Ted Docks (now a sophomore at Morehead State) and Ron Hunter (a freshman at Michigan State) have left a rich legacy to fill.

It won't be easy. Canton was 22-2 a year ago, including a season-opening overtime win at Wayne Memorial, which went on to the Class A semifinals.

The Chiefs have won the last two Western Lakes Activities Association Tournament titles, and last year they were WLAA regular-season champs, too, with a 10-1 mark.

The losses from the 1995-96 team are considerable: Hunter, the team's leading scorer (18 points per game) and rebounder (6.5), now playing football at MSU; guard Mark Bray (13 ppg), who's playing on the Hope College varsity; and forward Brandon Hartke (5.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg).

All three were starters.

But Canton's success was not carved out by just three players. Coach Dan Young, entering his third season as the Chiefs' head coach, has six seniors returning,

and they should be more than enough to make Canton a WLAA contender again.

"It was a great year," said Young of last season's campaign, which ended in the state regionals against nationally-ranked Detroit Pershing. "I don't know if we can win that many games again, and to be truthful I really don't care how many we win."

"I just know we'll have a real solid group."

The biggest problem will be replacing the points Hunter and Bray produced as the Chiefs' top two scorers. Although Young won't have a single go-to guy like he has over the past two years in Docks and Hunter, he doesn't believe his offense will be lacking.

"I don't see any one guy scoring 18 points a night for us," he said, "but any one guy could lead us in scoring on any given night. I think we'll be much more balanced."

Four seniors — three of them returning starters and another who was one of the first substitutes off the bench — should provide "the bulk of our scoring," Young said.

Rob Johnson will start for the third season. A 6-foot-4, 205-pound forward, Johnson — the Chiefs' quarterback in football who offi-

Rebuilt Rocks should reap better results

Can it possibly get worse than it was last year?

Not if Bob Brodie, who coached Plymouth Salem to an uncharacteristic 8-13 campaign in 1995-96, has anything to say about it.

And he does.

The Rocks never developed last year the way Brodie hoped they would. A team possessing four seniors (Ryan Andrzejewski, Ryan Hoffman, Kirk Craggs, Jared Biniecki) with marginal skills, Salem was never able to sustain consistent play offensively or defensively.

That's why Brodie went with his younger players over the last half of the season.

It should translate into something promising for the upcoming campaign. After all, the Rocks have seven players with varsity experience, and six of them started some time last season.

It's something to build with, right?

"When we were on last year, we gave teams fit," said Brodie. "You could see the makings of a good team."

Problem was, all-too-often the makings of a bad team were evident, too. "We averaged 22 turnovers a game last year, and that's terrible," said Brodie.

With a year of experience, that should decrease. "We're approaching this year with

guarded optimism. We're going to try and forget about last year, try not to dwell on it and look ahead," said Brodie.

The problems won't disappear entirely — he knows that. "I think there's still going to be some of that inconsistency. We're going to be young, but experienced."

Their leaders will be a pair of seniors and a junior. Andres Lopez, a 6-foot-4 senior forward, was the team's top scorer (14 points) and rebounder (nine boards), and was named to the all-Western Lakes Activities Association's all-Lakes Division team.

The team's only other senior is 6-1 off-guard Nate Gray, who averaged approximately seven points and three assists a game last season.

The other player Brodie is relying on is 5-7 point guard Andy Power, a junior who averaged nearly five assists a game. "I don't think there's anyone who can guard him right now," said Brodie. "But he tries to do too much at times."

There is plenty of experienced support for Power to look to, like 6-2 junior Bhavin Patel (six points, four rebounds in 12 starts), and 6-4 junior Jeff McKian, and 6-6 sophomore Mike Korduba, and 6-8 sophomore Tony Jancevski.

"They don't play like seniors yet, but they have gotten better," said Brodie. "The

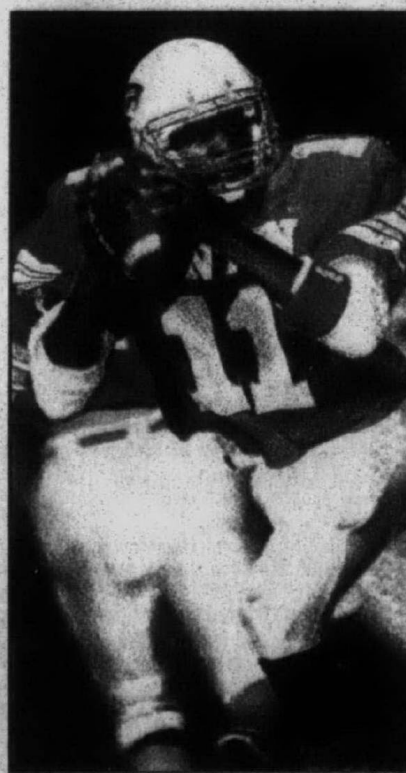
Kid each other? Are you kidding me?

Area's grid talent always first rate

Talk about a dream team! If a coach were to take the 1996 All-Observer football team on a barnstorming tour, the 26 players featured on this page would be a part of it.

Observerland talent is always among the best in the state, and this year is no exception. Westland John Glenn, the Western Lakes Activities Association champion and a Class AA semifinalist, leads the way with seven first-team selections.

Catholic League champion Redford Catholic Central and Class A runner-up Farmington Harrison have four players each on the squad.

Six players are repeat honorees: Francis Gojcak, Rob Johnson, Matt Griglio, Greg Call, Lorenzo Guess and Nick Shaieb.

Scott Wiemer of Lutheran High Westland was chosen Coach of the Year after guiding the Warriors to an 8-1 record in his first year as head coach.

Lutheran High began the season with a 16-14 loss to Harper Woods and then won its last eight games. The Warriors just missed qualifying for the playoffs, however, finishing fifth in Class C Region 4 behind Southgate Aquinas, Almont, Deckerville and Harper Woods.

"We were disappointed we didn't make the playoffs, but we had a very, very good year," Wiemer said. "We felt we could have competed with those teams, because our defense had improved so much in the last two games."

"Matt Lawson, lineman, Franklin: Law is a two-year starter at offensive defensive tackle. He had 42 tackles and four sacks. Only a junior, he is one reason the Patriots expect to have a strong team against next season. "He's a real student of his position," coach Rick Lee said. "He has quick feet and was a dominating lineman. Against the big teams we played, Matt played even better."

Eric Jachym, lineman, John Glenn: Much of the reason Glenn was effective in the air and on the ground was due in large part to the blocking of this two-year starter. "Jachym used his superb footwork and balance to keep defensive linemen in block. According to Glenn coach Chuck Gordon, his outstanding ability to move and player his size made the difference. "Eric works very hard," Gordon said. "He had a great off season in preparing for this senior year. He's one of the best linemen we've ever had at Glenn."

Francis Gojcak, lineman, Harrison: Gojcak was a three-year varsity player and the best lineman on Harrison's offensive and defensive lines this year. He played offensive guard and defensive tackle; he was second in tackles (96) with 66 first downs in 13 games. He also returned a fumble 73 yards for a touchdown. "I was told by one college scout he might be one of the best two or three tackles in the state," coach John Herrington said. "He has great athletic ability for someone that size."

Albert Cook, Lutheran Westland: Cook was a hard-nosed player. He liked to run toward him, and we would like to run over him on the goal line."

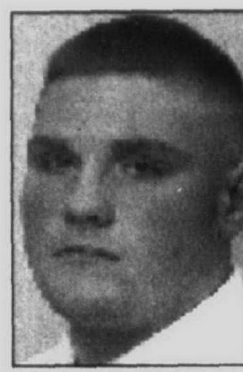
Jay Myrand, lineman, Franklin: Myrand started 27 games at left guard and also was a two-year starter at offensive tackle. He was a key to making the running game go; he had 54 tackles and five sacks. Myrand can bench press 360 pounds. "Jay has been the foundation of the program since I took over," Lee said. "He was the first kid we looked at to bring us up as a sophomore. He contributed on and off the field with his leadership; he is well respected by his coaches and his peers."

Matt Kuska, tight end, Thurston: Kuska was a three-year starter who excelled on both sides of the ball. "At tight end, he caught 30 passes, including three for touchdowns; he also caught a pair two-point conversion tosses. He had 71 career catches. As a blocker, Kuska had 109 tackles, including four sacks and 13 for losses. He had two interceptions.

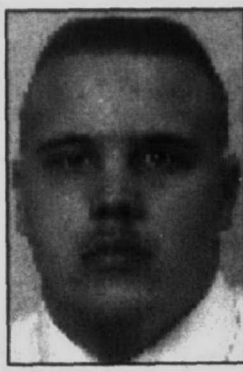
Raul Terek, wide receiver, Franklin: Terek was an all-round player for the Patriots, but he excelled as a pass receiver with 32 receptions for 602 yards and seven touchdowns. "He had 1,128 all-purpose yards, which included 19 punt returns for 200 yards and a touchdown, 10 kickoff returns for 224 yards and 10 rushing attempts for 102 yards."

Kevin Bambenek, wide receiver, Farmington Harrison: Bambenek became the starting quarterback in the sixth game of his sophomore year and led the Hawks to two state finals, a Class A championship and two league titles. Harrison had a 27-4 record with him at quarterback.

David Jarrett, wide receiver, Glenn: Jarrett did just about everything for the Rockets except kick extra points. The two-way starter was most resourceful at wide receiver with 29 receptions for 342 yards and five touchdowns. Jarrett also excelled at defensive



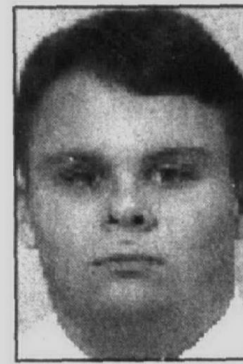

back where he picked off seven passes and returned one for a TD. He also returned a fumble for a score, and he even rushed for two touchdowns.

"David is a very exciting player and a big-play threat," Gordon said. "He was at his best in the big games."

LaVelle Guess, wide receiver, Wayne: Guess wasn't overshadowed by his brother this season as he put his own talents on display, with the help of Lorenzo's passing.

Guess became one of the area's leading receivers. He caught 28 passes for 456 yards and 10 touchdowns. On defense, he recorded 39 tackles and picked off two passes.

"He also ran back punts and kickoffs and played great defense," Wayne coach Chuck Howton said. "He did it all and was truly our most valuable player."

Rob Johnson, quarterback, Canton: Johnson made his college choice last weekend when he committed to Northwestern University. He displayed his intelligence on the field as well, doing a bit of everything for the Chiefs.

Johnson was 68-of-154 passing for 966 yards, with eight touchdowns and three interceptions. He also rushed 79 times for 350 yards and seven TDs, returned nine kickoffs for 313 yards and two TDs and had two punt returns for 67 yards and a score.

"Rob is the only one we've ever had (recruited) to a Division I school," said Canton coach Bob Knoelle. "He could help (Northwestern) as a wide receiver, defensive back, punt returner, kick returner; he could do anything, really."

He'll get his first shot at Northwestern as a quarterback, though.

Kevin Bambenek, quarterback, Harrison: Bambenek became the starting quarterback in the sixth game of his sophomore year and led the Hawks to two state finals, a Class A championship and two league titles. Harrison had a 27-4 record with him at quarterback.

Bambenek was 94-of-180 passing for 1,701 yards and 11 touchdowns. He was 15-of-24 and passed for a state-finals record 282 yards in the Silverdome this year.

His career passing numbers are 201 completions, 371 attempts, 3,150 yards and 21 TDs. He also became an effective runner this year, rushing for 202

yards and 12 touchdowns. "He really matured as the season progressed," Herrington said. "He was required to do more and more; he was just terrific in the playoffs — his decision making and the way he threw the ball. The only other quarterback who played that much (in his career) was Mill Coleman."

Justin Berent, quarterback, Glenn: Berent led the Rockets to another WLA title and the Class AA semifinals. Berent gave foes more than just the Glenn defense and tailback Reggie Spearmon to worry about.

The second-year starter was able to establish an explosive passing attack. He set school records with 101 completions and 179 attempts while passing for 1,448 yards and 10 TDs.

"Justin is a very hard worker and has made tremendous improvement during his career at John Glenn," Gordon said.

Gade Clark, back, Stevenson: Clark, who started in every game (39) since his freshman year, was a stellar performer for the Spartans. Due to his durability, the senior tailback gained a school-record 3,260 yards in his career.

Clark saved his best season for last as he gained 1,270 yards on 213 rushes (an average of 24 carries a game), including 14 touchdowns. He also caught 10 passes for 108 yards and returned 18 kickoffs for 393 yards.

"Gade was an absolute force this year," Stevenson coach Tim Gabel said. "He really had an ideal senior season in that all his talents came together in a complete package. He learned to blend his quickness and power with knowing when to cut and when to lower his shoulder."

Reggie Spearmon, back, Glenn: Spearmon used his cutback ability and elusiveness to rush for 1,130 yards on 108 carries and find the end zone 13 times. He also started as a defensive back.

The tailback was forced to miss Glenn's regional championship victory over Dearborn Fordson with a sprained ankle but played the semifinal game against Sterling Heights Stevenson.

"Reggie is very quick and runs hard," Gordon said. "He is also an excellent cover guy as a defensive back."

Albert Cook, back, Lutheran High: The Warriors had their best season ever,

"Ira has very good speed and some of the best work habits I've ever seen," Gordon said. "He's a very good player



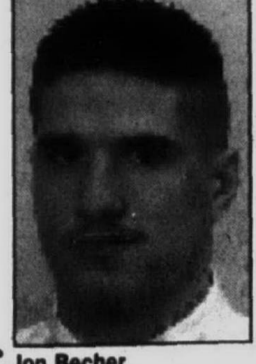

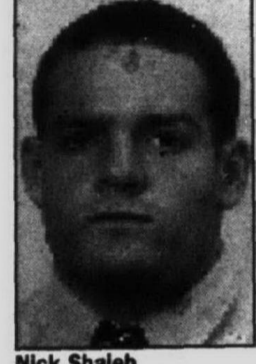

Gino DiGiandomenico, lineman, Redford CC: After hardly playing as a junior, DiGiandomenico developed into Overberland's top pass rusher with nine sacks.

He had 49 tackles, including 16 solos and 24 assists. The one-time soccer goalkeeper also recovered two fumbles.

"He was relentless, the way he'd pass rush," Mach said. "He developed a lot. No one could block him one on one. Teams ended up double teaming him as time went on."

Jon Becher, lineman, John Glenn: Becher's speed made him one of the most dangerous defensive ends in the WLA. In addition, he provided much of the leadership and heart that propelled the Rockets to the Class AA semifinals.

He recorded 30 solo tackles and assisted on 24 others. The team captain also was a force on offense where he started two seasons at tight end. He grabbed seven passes this year and was a key blocker.

"Jon had a great senior year," Gordon said. "He worked very hard and is one of the best leaders we've ever had."

Mike Allison, linebacker, Stevenson: Allison recorded 86 tackles (nearly twice that of the next leading tackler), knocked down four passes, recovered a fumble and had two interceptions. Both of his interceptions led to game-winning touchdowns.

"His toughness and mobility stood out, but he is also a very savvy player," Stevenson defensive coordinator Conrad Newman said. "We relied on him to make our reads and calls on the field, and he used those keys to always be around the ball."

Allison also scored three touchdowns as a fullback on offense.

Matt Griglio, linebacker, John Glenn: The three-year starter saved his best season for last as he recorded 75 solo tackles and 57 assists this season.

Griglio will graduate as the leading tackler in Glenn history.

"Matt is very smart and understands what to do," Gordon said. "He's worked so hard the past three years. It's been a real pleasure to coach him."

Nick Shaieb, linebacker, Harrison: Shaieb, a three-year starter on defense, played both ways most of the season despite a recurring elbow injury. He was fourth in tackles with 76.

He was a two-year starter at fullback and emerged as a legitimate rushing threat this year. Shaieb was the leading rusher with 892 yards (107 attempts) and scored with 90 points. He had 14 rushing touchdowns and returned a fumble for a TD.

"He really blossomed as an offensive player this year," coach John Herrington said. "When we were having trouble with the running game, Shaieb really came on and did a good job. His 304-yard game (against Country Day) is unheard of for a Harrison fullback."

Milan Brooks, linebacker, Redford CC: No one knows the quickest way between two points is a straight line

better than Brooks.

He plugged the gaps as his role required and finished with a team-high 97 total tackles.

As a fullback, the three-year letter winner rushed for 300 yards on 52 carries and two TDs. Brooks sparked the Shamrocks to the Catholic League title with 144 yards on 11 attempts against Brother Rice.

"Milan is an impact hitter," Mach said. "People knew when they got hit by him and wouldn't want to come back twice. His aggressiveness is what we pattern ourselves after."

Ed Hight, linebacker, Harrison: Hight was a two-year starter at inside linebacker and Harrison's leading tackler each season. He had 129 total tackles this year (with 75 first hits) and 246 for two seasons. Hight also started at offensive guard.

"He was the hardest hitter on our team," Herrington said. "We moved him from tackle to linebacker as a junior; he adapted quickly to the position and was outstanding. Ed came to play all the time; he had a mean disposition on the field."

Lorenzo Guess, back, Wayne: Guess, who committed to play Michigan State University, ended his career by having a stellar season on both sides of the ball.

He made 39 tackles, intercepted two passes and recovered one fumble. The four-year starter at quarterback threw for 990 yards and 12 touchdowns.

"Lorenzo leads by example on the football field, on the basketball court and in the classroom," Howton said. "Hard work and commitment are the keys to his success. His work ethic is unparalleled; he was never outworked."

Greg Call, back, Catholic Central: The three-year starter on both sides of the ball had four interceptions, two fumble recoveries and 48 total tackles.

At quarterback he completed 34 of 75 passes for 412 yards with only one interception and two touchdowns. Call executed the option attack and rushed for 281 yards on 93 carries. He also filled in as a placekicker, converting one extra point and a 26-yard field goal.

"I'll always associate Greg Call with the word winner," Mach said. "He's one of the best athletes to come through CC and one of the reasons we were so successful. He's a real leader whose competitive attitude is contagious."

Nate Gray, back, Ply. Salem: Gray was a three-year varsity player and two-year, two-way starter at quarterback and defensive back.

He had three interceptions and returned two for touchdowns of 72 and 91 yards. He had 33 tackles, caused one fumble and recovered another.

Gray directed Salem's wishbone attack, rushing 96 times for 444 yards and eight TDs. He completed 42 of 99 passes for 707 yards and five TDs.

"He provided great leadership and was a catalyst," Salem assistant coach Tom Garrett said. "He set the tone with his toughness and attitude. He's a real winner; he's the kind of guy who refuses to lose."

chemistry is real good on this team, and they're all good athletes, they like to run the floor. "Defensively, we're a pretty solid group. We have enough athletic ability to guard anybody — we've just got to keep our focus. At times last year, we lost that mental concentration. Can the Rocks regain their lofty status at, or at least near, the top of the WCAA? Brodie figures defending league champ Plymouth Canton, as well as Westland John Glenn and Farmington Harrison, are probably in the best position to make a run at the title. Salem could contend, too. "It's going to be real well-balanced, I believe," said Brodie. "Every game's going to be tough. You're just going to have to buckle those chin straps." The Rocks should be ready for it — as long as the problems of youth have been overcome by experience. "They've been around the block, they should be able to handle it better," said Brodie. It won't be easy, he knows. "We've got to maintain their confidence level," he said, then added, "We'll be right in the thick of it — trust me." No reason not to. The Rocks open against Monroe at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday at Salem.

cially signed with Northwestern University last weekend — averaged 10 points and six boards a game, although he missed half the season with a knee injury. Also back is 6-0 point guard Nick Hurley (10 ppg, five assists, three steals). His strengths are his quickness and ability to go to the basket. Matt Ammons, a 6-5 forward (6 ppg, 4.5 rpg), is consistent in his role as a support player. Donte Scott, a 6-2 guard, should provide the Chiefs with the outside shooting they lost when Bray graduated. Two other seniors will add size to the lineup: 6-7 Jason Meagrow and 6-4 Mike Elsner. Young wants them to fill the vacancy left by Hartke's departure. Others to watch are juniors Eric Larsen, a 6-5 forward, Bryon Lake, a 6-2 forward, and Andy Merrick, a 6-0 guard; and sophomore Joe Cortellini, a 5-10 guard. Larsen, Lake and Cortellini have solid skills offensively and defensively, while Merrick is inexperienced but is a strong shooter. "Our biggest strengths are our defense and we rebound pretty good, from all positions," Young said. "Rob Johnson is the best rebounding and defensive player I've ever coached." It will be up to Johnson to post-up opponents and crash the boards, but his job will prove much easier if Scott provides the outside shooting touch Young thinks he's capable of. Scott's game may have developed more over the past year than any of his teammates. "He's one of our better players," said Young. "He's quick, he's one of our best defenders, he's stronger and he can shoot." But he not the only one who's upgraded his game. "I think everybody's improved a bit," Young added. "I think we're a better perimeter-shooting team, too. We saw nothing but zones last year." The Chiefs may see fewer zone defenses, but there'll still be plenty of challenges. Westland John Glenn, Farmington Harrison and Walled Lake Western have strong returning lineups, and Plymouth Salem is expected to rebound from last season's lackluster performance. "The biggest thing for us is how we deal with adversity," said Young. "We have to be going out and fighting for each other, and working together. "It's going to be interesting, and it's going to be fun." The journey begins with a bang. Canton opens its season by hosting state-ranked Wayne at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday.

ball. And he has the arm, too; in '96, he completed 68-of-154 passes (44.3 percent) for 966 yards (6.28 per attempt) and eight touchdowns, with three interceptions. But Johnson is blessed with speed as well, enough to play defensive back and return kicks, which he also did for Canton this season. Johnson rushed for 350 yards (4.4 per carry) and seven touchdowns, returned two punts for 67 yards (33.5 per return) and a touchdown, and had nine kick returns for 313 yards and two TDs. He chose Northwestern because "I considered other schools, but the first time I went down there I felt very comfortable. They made me feel right at home." Johnson said quarterback is his position of choice. If that doesn't work, "it's up to me if I want to change or not." Gray isn't the prospect Johnson is, but he is drawing interest

from various places. Hope College is one; he's also talked with the football coach at Dartmouth College, and later this week he'll meet with the coach from Columbia University. "I really just want to play, if they'll give me the chance," said Gray. "Playing in the Ivy League, it would be a dream if I could get a top-notch education and play football." One reason Gray's drawing so much attention is his winner's attitude. The Rocks were expected to struggle this season; Gray was the main reason they didn't. A two-year starter at quarterback and defensive back, he completed 42-of-99 passes (42.4 percent) for 707 yards (7.14 yards per attempt) and five TDs, and he rushed 96 times for 444 yards (4.6 per carry), scoring eight TDs. He also had three interceptions, returning two of them for scores (72 and 91 yards). "I did my share," Gray said. "But really, Coach Moshimer did a great job. I did what I was told." While Salem did far better than expected, Canton — even with Johnson at the helm — struggled to a 4-5 finish. The reason: As talented as Johnson was, he could not do it alone. "It was frustrating," said Johnson. "We started out playing Monroe (in the season-opener) pretty tough, then we kind of fell apart after that. When we played better teams, it seemed we stepped up to the occasion." Johnson won't be expected to carry quite as big a load at Northwestern. And Gray won't be the two-way standout in the Ivy League (should he end up there) he was at Salem. And the rivalry-that-should-have-been-but-wasn't will end when basketball season closes in the spring. But their friendship, which brooked any and all athletic tensions, will continue to endure.

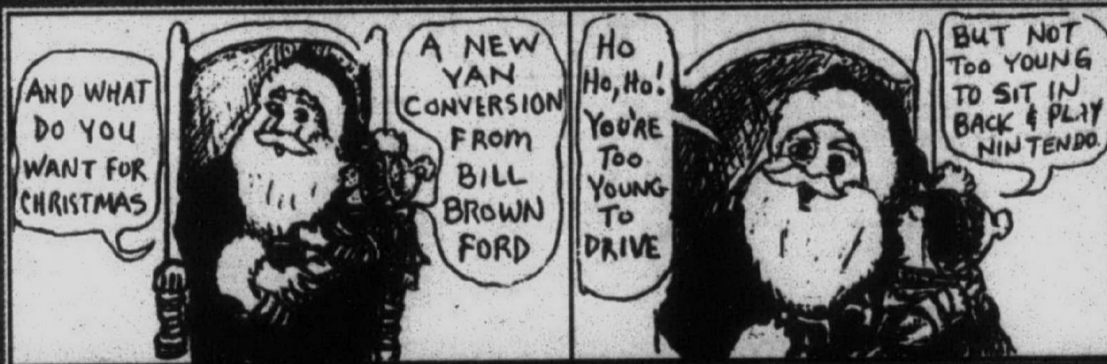

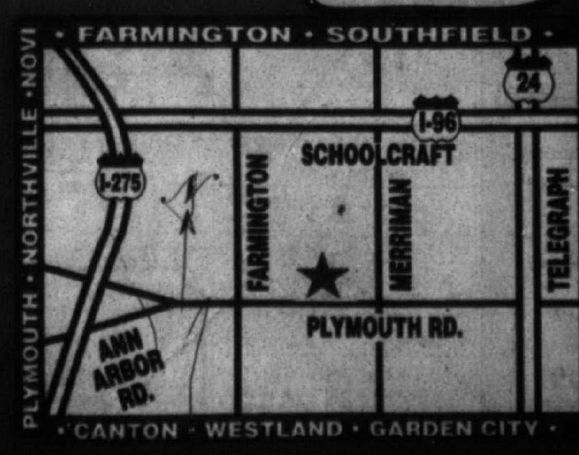

Special Camaro is unadulterated power on wheels

Take a deep breath. Open the door. Slip behind the wheel. Buckle up. Slowly turn the key in the ignition.

Listen. It's the sound of pure, unadulterated power.

The 1997 Chevrolet Camaro limited edition Z28 SS 30th anniversary package makes you feel young again.

Back to the time when the whole world was ahead of you, your eyes were clear and bright and you didn't have a care in the world.

Take yourself back to 1967, when the first Camaro was born. Wide hood stripes were all the rage. Thirty years later, Chevrolet brings back the wide stripes on the anniversary edition Camaro.

There will only be 1,000 of these "Hugger" orange-striped arctic white Camaros built, so it's certain they'll become collector cars. The anniversary edition is stocked full of special features.

It's a doggone pretty package, too. White all the way around, the exterior features white door handles, white five-spoke wheels and white front fascia. The interior instrumentation,

dash (a word from the past) and all around is black.

Complimenting the interior are white front leather bucket seats with black-and-white cloth inserts. At the top of the headrest is a neat 30th anniversary heat-stamped logo. The seats are new and are wider to offer better lumbar support during long-distance driving.

Back to the inside in a minute.

Let's jump to what's hiding

under the hood.

It's the beautiful 5.7-liter LT4 V8 engine with sequential fuel injection that's graced the Corvette for a number of years. Turn the key and this engine roars to life, has a beautiful, throaty growl on takeoff and makes this puppy just too much fun to drive.

The 5.7-liter features a cast-iron block and cast-aluminum cylinder head and provides 350 horses under the hood.

Mated to a 6-speed manual transmission, the V8 performs flawlessly and gives you power with just a tap on the accelerator. Without trying to risk an accident, if you look at the tachometer, it barely moves when you shift into the different gears.

The 6-speed performed quite well, but there was one annoyance. On occasion, when shooting out of the gate, there was a second-shift override. When you tried to get it into third, it was

difficult and it was unnatural just to pop it into fourth gear. Minor annoyance and actually my fault for not shifting at the right time.

Top speed on the speedometer is 150 miles per hour. I never got it above 80 mph. That was more than enough. With a hot-looking car like this, you're prime for a ticket for just driving it around town.

I didn't turn on the sound system until just a couple of days before I turned the car back in. I just loved listening to the engine roar and the sound of the throaty exhaust.

But the new high-performance audio system in this anniversary edition deserves some mention. It was outfitted with an electronically tuned AM/FM stereo with seek-scan, digital clock, automatic tone control, speed-compensated volume, Dolby noise reduction and compact disc. The six speakers strategically located throughout

the cabin make music come alive.

One thing was new to me. In choosing the pre-calculated equalizer choices there now is one just for country-western. Usually you can just pick the rock choice on most. But there actually was a difference in sound when you chose the "C-W" mode. The stereo also has a TheftLock security system on it.

Other neat features on the anniversary edition include remote keyless entry, leather-wrapped steering wheel, power windows with driver's express down, theft-deterrent alarm system, remote rear hatch release, power door locks, twin remote electric mirrors, electric rear window defogger, electronic speed control, fog lamps, 6-way power driver's seat, 16-inch aluminum wheels on 16-inch performance blackwalls and acceleration slip regulation (designed to decrease tire spin on slippery surfaces).

Safety doesn't take a back seat on this Camaro. No surprise that it has dual air bags or even daytime running lamps. But standard is a 4-wheel anti-lock brake system. There's also reinforced steel safety cage with steel side-door beams and front and rear crush zones. The safety belts were easy enough to get into and out of in the front seats, but in the rear seats were a bit annoying.

All Camaro owners have, at their dispatch, the Chevrolet 24-hour Roadside Assistance program. The program provides everything from a gallon of gas and free towing for warranty repairs to free locksmith and routing assistance. Heck, you can even have a tire changed or

a jump start if need be.

Camaro also features platinum-tipped spark plugs that don't need maintenance for the first 100,000 miles, automatic trans fluid that never needs replacing, battery-rundown protection and extended-life engine coolant good for 5 years or 150,000 miles (whichever comes first).

The anniversary edition wasn't outrageous in cost, either. It starts at a reasonable \$20,115 and with all the bells and whistles topped out at \$24,217. Not bad for a collector's item.

This pony sure is a lot of fun to drive, looks great and performs well. You'd expect the younger kids to be craning their necks to get a look at this anniversary edition Camaro. Nothing was farther from the truth.

Most of the looks came from late thirty-something and forty-something guys and gals. I guess it reminded them of when they were young.

Can you tell? I loved this car. You will too.

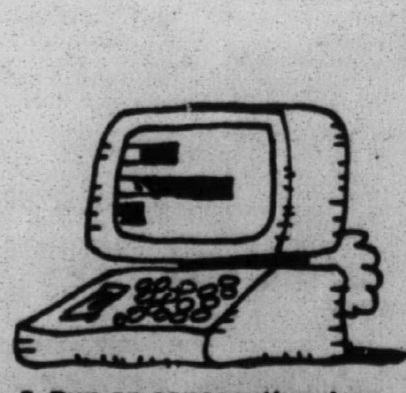
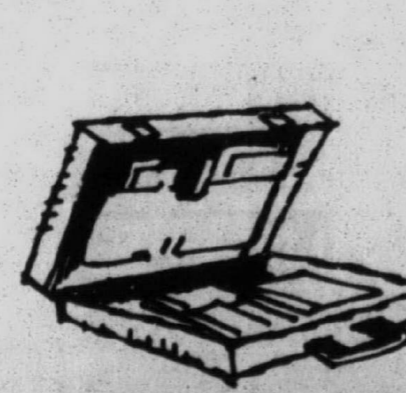

Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.

3. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in-kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.

4. Include phone number and specify hours. Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!

5. Run on consecutive days. Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.

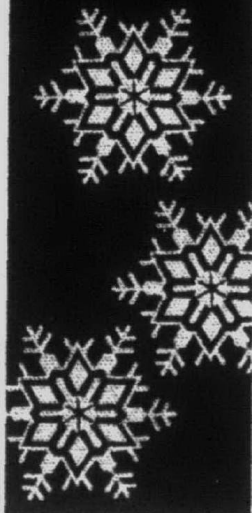

Lansbury, Herman reunited in Mrs. Santa Claus musical

You don't even contemplate writing the first major original TV musical since Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Cinderella* (1964) unless either: a) you're a moron with a career death wish, or b) you're the only American composer to have three of your musicals pass the 1,500-performance mark on Broadway and you've got a dear friend, who's made Tony Award history in her own right, in the title role.

Happily, the latter applies to *Mrs. Santa Claus*, which premieres Sunday, Dec. 8, on CBS. A \$10-million, pull-out-all-the-stops family extravaganza, *Mrs. Santa Claus* reunites TV favorite Angela Lansbury (*Murder, She Wrote*) with the man who helped reshape her professional image, two-time Tony-winning composer-lyricist Jerry Herman.

In their new collaboration, set in December 1910, Mrs. Claus (Lansbury) plans a round-the-world route that she is sure will save time for Santa (Charles Durning). She's hurt when her overworked spouse brushes her off, and decides to test the route on her own. A wind current forces the sleigh down on Manhattan's Lower East Side, where she gets a job in a sweatshop.

The score is written by Herman, the irrepressible tunesmith and lyricist behind the smash musicals *Hello, Dolly!*, *Mame* and *LaCage aux Folles*.

But to understand why Lansbury and the composer are such soulmates, go back to the mid-1960s, when Herman was coming off the *Hello, Dolly!* phenomenon. Backers were lining up for his next project, a musical version of *Auntie Mame*.

Recalling her performance in the short-lived musical *Anyone Can Whistle*, Herman was convinced that Lansbury was his ideal Mame. But the producers scoffed at his choice, telling Herman they needed a glamorous star for the role.

While the producers continued auditioning proven Broadway stars such as Nanette Fabray and Lisa Kirk, Herman secretly coached his chosen candidate in two of Mame's biggest numbers: her dazzling introduction, "It's Today," and "If He Walked Into My Life," the bal-

lad that Herman says may be the most beautiful song he ever wrote.

"Some of the other actresses might be upset when they finally read this," Herman says, "but she was the only lady who had the benefit of singing songs from the show. During her audition, I slipped into the pit without the producers knowing and I played rehearsal piano for her. And they absolutely died."

The rest is history. In *Mame*, Lansbury gave Herman one of the most brilliant performances Broadway had seen. He gave her leading-lady glamour, which led to the first of her record-setting four Tonys as best actress in a musical.

Flash forward three decades. "The most wonderful thing about *Mrs. Santa Claus* was the job of working with someone whose every breath you know," Herman says. "I think the score came out so comfortable for her because I knew exactly who I was writing for."

The seed for the new musical was sown when an old friend suggested that Herman consider writing a musical for TV. At first reluctant, he relented at the idea that such a project could become a perennial like *The Wizard of Oz*. And when former Muppets writer Mark Saltzman, co-writer of the teleplay, suggested Mrs. Claus as a focus, Herman raced to the phone to enlighten Lansbury.

"If you do it, I'll do it," said Lansbury, confident that her old friend would spotlight her voice like no one else.

"She can do anything, but what immediately comes to mind is her vulnerability, her warmth and her strength, all at the same time," Herman says. "Now, that's a big order. But that's great fun for me."

"Also, she has a lovely, smart sense of humor. Just knowing the lady and knowing what she portrays by just having her face on the screen made my job much easier. And I can tell you, she is singing more effortlessly, and more beautifully, than I have ever heard in my life."

Lansbury calls *Mrs. Santa Claus* "the most rejuvenating experience I could possibly have had" after the painfully public demise of *Murder, She Wrote*, following an ill-advised schedule change that she has

admitted hurt her deeply. Some fans have not forgiven CBS for that perceived insult.

"With this score, she sounds like she has a smile on her face through the whole thing," Herman says. "It's been such a good experience. A star brings an attitude to a production. Everybody loved Angela - and everybody loved working with her."

Herman says he strove for an "evergreen" Christmas sound that would hold up years from now.

"The orchestrations are absolutely breathtaking," he says. "I think they're the most beautiful ones I've ever had. And they will not date. They will sound fresh 50 years from now."

Tomlin gets her Christmas wish with Edith Ann special

From where Edith Ann sits—in a big yellow rocking chair with her dog, Buster—the world is a mess that badly needs fixing. And if not the world, then at least Edgetown, where Edith Ann's family lives.

After a two-year hiatus, ABC brings back Lily Tomlin's animated heroine in *An Edith Ann Christmas*, airing Saturday, Dec. 14. It is the first of six new specials to air over three years.

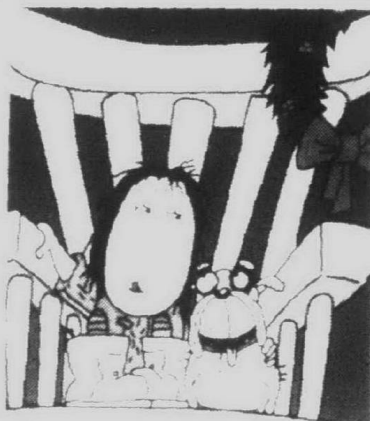
Since the last Edith Ann special in 1994, Tomlin has changed animation studios, looking for just the right artists to represent her characters.

"If I could draw the pictures myself," Tomlin says, "maybe I could do it faster."

"You think of yourself as an actor, then you think of somebody who has to act by drawing. Somehow that has to go out their body and through their fingers into a pencil and make those characters live."

In *An Edith Ann Christmas*, Edgetown has just been named the worst place in America to live. Edith and her friends are rehearsing a Christmas play to raise funds for the town's latest drive-by shooting victims, a 6-year-old and his dog. Edith's sister, Irene, has run away after a fight with their parents over a tattoo on her derriere.

"It's Edith's kind of Christmas, what would happen in her family," Tomlin explains. Though Edith feels guilty for snitching to her parents about Irene's tattoo, she is determined to use the

holiday spirit to set things right.

"She's trying to figure out the world and how she fits into it and why things are inconsistent," Tomlin says, adding that the adventures of this thoughtful 6-year-old aren't for children alone. Tomlin and her collaborator, writer Jane Wagner, intend the special for a family audience, particularly the moment when Edith gives a new interpretation to the children's play.

Tomlin says she hopes the special will be a success.

"Maybe I'm too naive, but I feel it's a way in for adults, to return to that innocent place without being cynical, to let go of cynicism for even a half hour and identify with Edith."
