### Hunger pangs

Some 75 students from the Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Key Club teamed up with 10 adults, including Plymouth-Canton Superintendent Craig Fiegel, to package some 22,500 meals for the Kids Against Hunger Great Lakes Coalition.

Of the meals packaged, more than 7,130 went to the Plymouth Salvation Army, where Corps Officer Maj. Jim Irvine said that their requests for need have grown substantially during these tough economic times. These meals from the packaging event will be a big boost to their ability to fulfill the need.

Kiwanis Club of Colonial Plymouth regularly organizes food packaging activities on behalf of the Kids Against Hunger organization by partnering with other local community service groups that provide both funding and volunteers for these packaging activities.

The PCEP Key Club is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Colonial Plymouth. The students also held fund-raisers over the past few months to raise money to buy the required bulk raw ingredients. Student volunteers assemble the bags using these ingredients. The bags are then boxed up, loaded onto a pallet and stored to await shipment. KAH ships them within the U.S. and the international shipping is provided by the U.S. government or by international feeding partners. The food purchased for each packaging activity costs around \$2,800.

## Fox Hills on Chrysler's 'hit' list

A Plymouth Township automobile dealership is among the nearly 800 that Chrysler LLC intends to jettison as the Auburn Hills-based automaker works to recover from bankruptcy and partner with Italy's Fiat.

Fox Hills Chrysler Jeep on Ann Arbor Road, like 788 other dealerships around the country, was notified of Chrysler's plan Thursday morning, according to a published report.

Jim Schebil, a second-generation Chrysler dealer who has owned Fox Hills since the early 1980s, did not want to speak about the news.

"I'm not going to sit there and make this a circus ... OK?" he said Friday. "I don't need everybody to know my business." Schebil did say his dealership has 54 employees and that Chrysler had announced June 9 as the date on which ties to affected dealerships will be severed.

Chrysler's list of 789 affected dealerships was included in a motion filed Thursday in U.S. Bankruptcy Court in New York. A hearing on the motion is scheduled for Wednesday, June 3.

Farther west on Ann Arbor Road at Dick Scott Dodge, which was not on Chrysler's list, general manager Jason Scott said the news was bittersweet.

"We are very pleased that

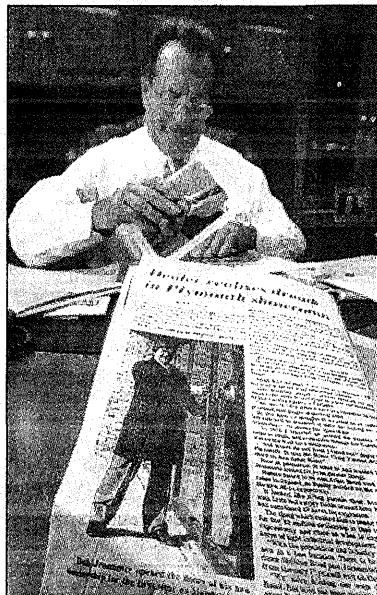

## Relieved local car-sellers survive GM dealership cuts

Most Plymouth area General Motors Corp. dealerships appear to have been spared as the struggling automobile giant on Friday informed about 1,100 dealers around the country that it will not renew contracts with them after late next year.

"We're coming out on the other side of this thing," Scott LaRiche, vice president and executive general manager at Lou LaRiche Chevrolet on Plymouth Road, said of GM's reorganization.

GM had informed affected dealerships by letter, and no such letter was received at LaRiche, Scott LaRiche said. He verified LaRiche's status with a GM dealer liaison, he said.

"I think I'm safe now," said Bob Jeannotte, the owner of Bob Jeannotte Pontiac Buick GMC on Sheldon Road, where no

news was also good news. "I can breathe, and I can sleep tonight."

He said his dealership had been flooded with calls from concerned customers, and that e-mails are being sent to tell customers that Jeannotte will be part of the new GM.

Jeannotte still faces the loss of his Pontiac line when GM stops building Pontiacs after the 2010 model year, but he says his business will be better off in the long term, selling Buicks and GMC trucks and getting more attractive products from a new GM.

"I'm going to have a rough year, I think, maybe a year and a half. In the long run, I'm going to be much better off," he said.

It will be tough going, however, for the dealerships with which GM will be cutting ties next year, Jeannotte said. The company did not release a list, and Jeannotte

## Salvation Army gets new leaders

Not that they want to, because they are servants of God and go where they're called, but Jim and Pat Irvine can't seem to get out of the National Football League's North Division.

The Irvines, the corps officers for the Plymouth Salvation Army, have received orders to move to Green Bay, Wis., home of the Packers. Their new assignment follows three years in Plymouth and two in Pontiac (where the Detroit Lions are rumored to be an NFL team). Before that, the Irvines served in Bear country, having worked in suburban Chicago.

All they need next is an assignment in Minnesota.

The Irvines, who started in Plymouth July 1, 2006, head to Wisconsin July 1.

"It was very unexpected," Maj. Jim Irvine said of the orders. "We're just now getting to know the community, and they're getting to know us. Just last week, I stopped downtown for a cup of coffee and someone said to me, 'Hey, Jim.' That was nice."

The Irvines will be followed in Plymouth by Capt. Dan and Jolene Hull, who move from the Salvation Army's Midland Division in St. Louis, where Dan Hull is finance secretary. Jolene Hull wore several hats, serving as secretary for women's ministries, moral and ethical issues and community care ministries.

Dan and Jolene Hull are no relation to Steve and Jacqueline Hull, who served in Plymouth several years ago.

The Irvines have been happy to serve in Plymouth, where programs continue to flourish.

The recent Letter Carriers Food Drive nearly doubled last year's total of donated food. The annual Red Kettle Drive generally has met or exceeded its goal, and the corps is continuing to assist ever-increasing numbers of families.

And, while there's a sense of unfinished business for them after only three years, the Irvines knew what they were signing up for when they joined.

"It's impossible to divorce the human feelings that go with any change like this," Jim Irvine said. "But at the same time there comes recognition of the fact when we were commissioned and ordained as Salvation Army officers and ministers, it was understood we go where God and the Salvation Army need us."

## Plymouth's public services department welcomes public

Chris Porman wants to change the notion that public works means people in orange vests and hardhats standing around leaning on shovels.

An assistant director of Plymouth's Department of Municipal Services, Porman is inviting the public to find out about their public works during the department's open house, 5-8 p.m. Wednesday at the DMS facility on Goldsmith, east of Sheldon Road. The department's first such event in many years is being held during National Public Works Week.

"We're employees who are dedicated to improving the quality of life on a daily basis," said Porman, who handles the administrative side of things in his department while counterpart Steve Faiman supervises field work.

Plymouth's DPS workers do street sweeping, snow-clearing, grass-cutting, water and sewer system maintenance, brush and branch chipping, bulk leaf pickup and more. The department is also the administrator of the contract with the city's garbage- and recycling-hauler.

Wednesday's open house will feature displays, including one showing how water is

distributed to customers and another on the items that can be recycled, plus tours of the DMS facility, free hot dogs, chips and other refreshments, and equipment children can climb on, such as a front-end loader, a street-sweeper and a Zamboni. The equipment will not be running and the children will be supervised.

There will also be raffles for different prizes, including (for city residents only) a tree to be planted, at no charge, in the right-of-way at the winner's home.

In case of rain, the event will take place entirely indoors.

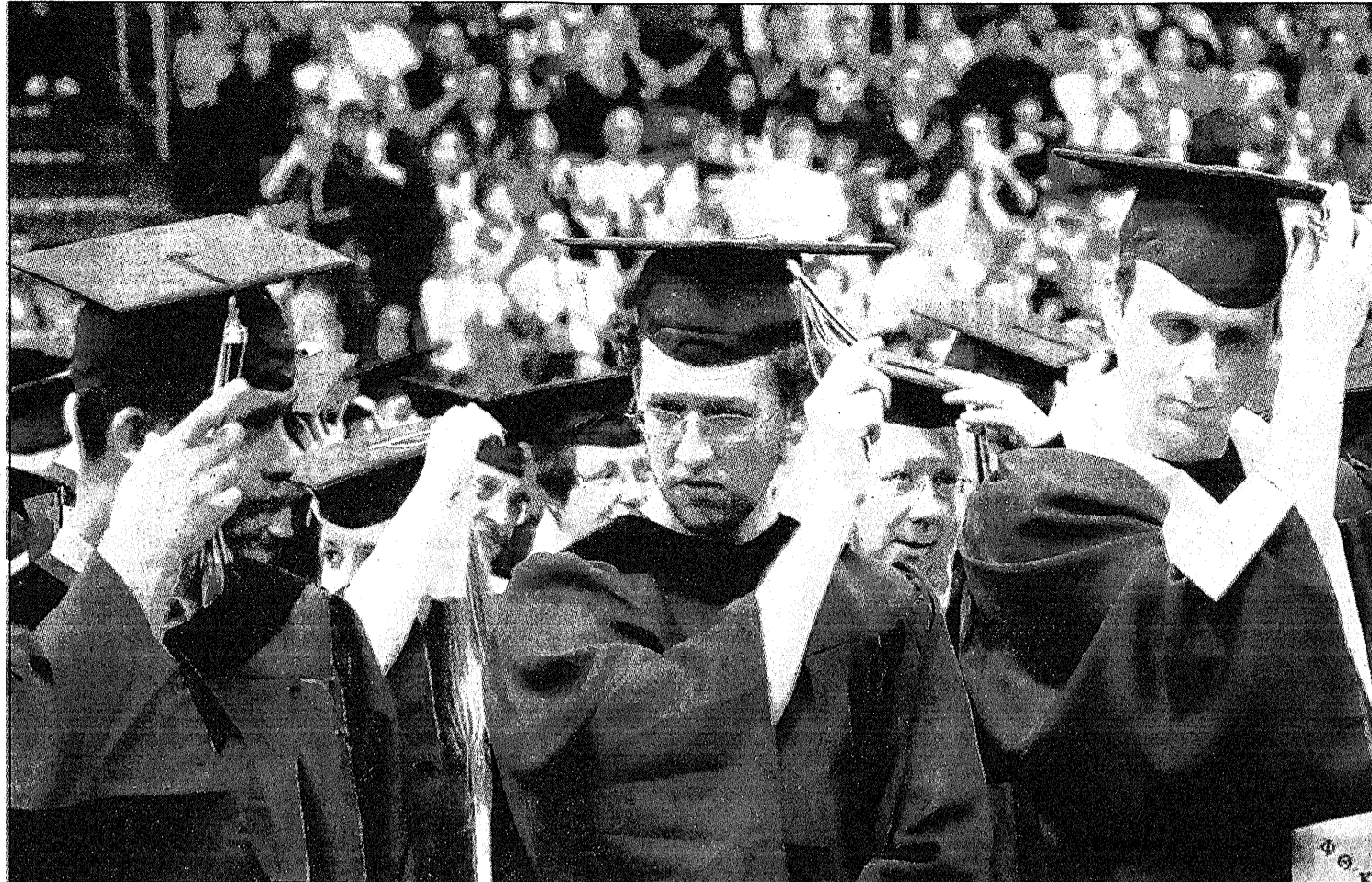

Schoolcraft College recently celebrated its 44th commencement at Compuware Sports Arena in Plymouth.

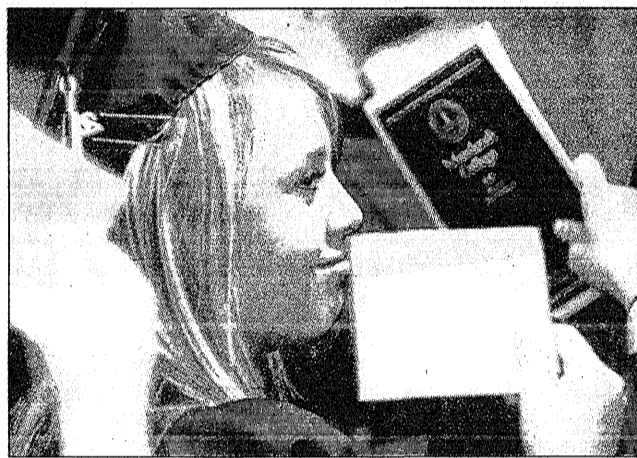
Nearly 1,400 students were eligible to receive diplomas in the ceremony, with about 500 students participating in the actual ceremony.

said affected dealerships will probably stay quiet about it.

"These dealerships are probably going to walk softly as far as ordering anything," he said. "In between now and 2010, the fall, I think there're some dealers who will be going out of business."

Surviving dealerships could benefit, however. At LaRiche, which has 70 employees, Scott LaRiche said the company is planning to hire salespeople to handle an anticipated increase in customers.

At Don Massey Cadillac on Ann Arbor Road, a salesman said the dealership is safe, but no one was available to comment further.

The exception among local GM dealerships is Saturn of Plymouth, which faces an uncertain future. GM announced last month that it will stop producing Saturns this year, and it is unclear whether there will be a buyer for the Saturn division.

we're going to stay open, but at the same time it's a very tough time in the car business," Scott said. He added he has many friends in the business who will be affected.

Scott said he had few details and didn't know the criteria Chrysler used to draw up its list.

Chrysler's list of 789 dealerships represents roughly a quarter of its total of nearly 3,200. A statement from the U.S. Treasury Department, which has assisted Chrysler and General Motors Corp. with federal loans, said the dealerships that will remain are responsible for 87 percent of Chrysler's sales.

"The sacrifices by the dealer community — alongside those of autoworkers, suppliers, creditors, and other Chrysler stakeholders — are necessary for this company and the industry to succeed," said the statement, in part.

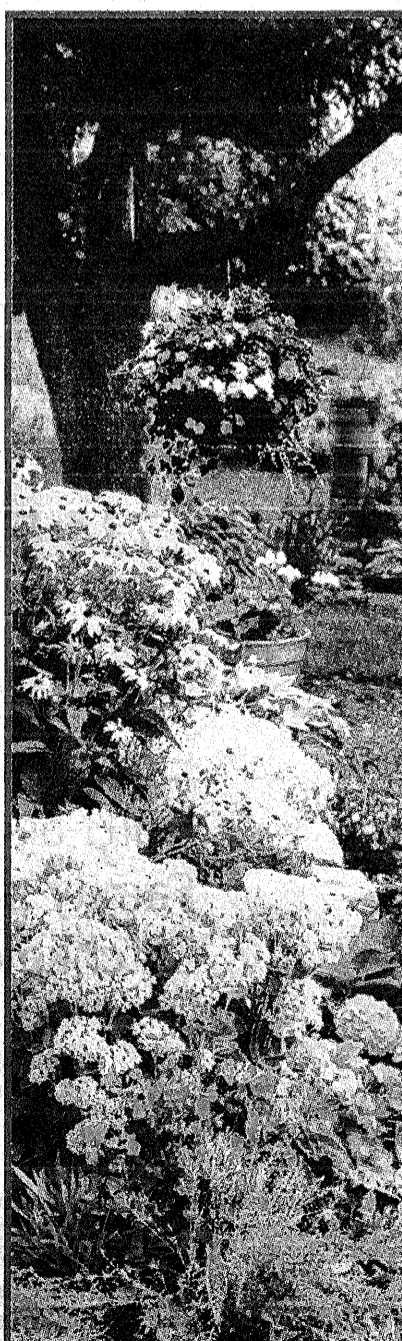

## Back home at the Park

### Zolkowski brings 'new perspective' to position of principal at P-CEP

Bill Zolkowski came late to a career in education, but he's been making up for lost time by moving into increasingly more challenging positions.

On June 30, Zolkowski bids good-bye to Thurston High School, where he has been principal since 2002.

On July 1, he will become the first principal for the Plymouth-Canton Educational Park, as that district reorganizes three high schools under one leader.

Zolkowski started teaching physics and math at Thurston High School in the early '90s, but it was a two-year stint as an assistant principal of curriculum at Canton High School in 2000-02 that gave him a new insight into teaching.

"It gave me an education and opened my eyes to a lot of things I hadn't thought a lot about," he said. "It got me reading about things and talking to colleagues about things that hadn't occurred to me."

He said the position gave him a new perspective on his six years of teaching at Thurston.

"I realized in retrospect that I was a popular teacher, I was a successful teacher in my physics teaching, but I don't think I was a good teacher by our standards today in being

able to reach all kids," he said.

Zolkowski had his own struggles with education. In the 1960s, he attended the University of Michigan with the idea of becoming an engineer, but dropped out.

"It took me 20-some years of various ventures and small businesses to come back and get a university degree," he said.

Even then, he wasn't sure what he wanted when he started at Eastern Michigan University, except that he enjoyed physics and math.

"It was by default that I

said let's give education a try," he said. "It was a fortuitous choice. I was good at it, I have been good at it and I have enjoyed it immensely."

South Redford Superintendent Linda Hicks agrees with Zolkowski's self-assessment.

"Bill Zolkowski is a just a superb educator," she said on his appointment to the Plymouth-Canton position. "When he told me about the challenges and creativity he'd be able to use in the position ... I think it's a great opportunity."

Taking from his years as a teacher and curriculum principal, Zolkowski has come to believe that every student deserves the same level of education, that no matter who is teaching the class, it is important to reach every child.

"That doesn't mean that Mr. X has to teach like Mrs. Y. It does mean that we set out regular benchmarks that we need to meet on a regular basis," he said. "You may get there in your class on one path and I may get there on a different path, but we both have to arrive at these regular spots

through the school year."

He said it is also important to challenge all students intellectually. Thurston High School has gone from four advanced placement classes to 15 under Zolkowski's leadership, and he believes that more students should be taking those classes.

"There are hundreds of kids walking these halls who could succeed in advanced placement classes," he said.

He said studies show that success in AP classes is a strong indicator of how a student will perform in college.

He has also learned the "value and power" of trusting people, particularly his teaching staff.

"Relying on teachers to investigate initiatives, implement initiatives and maintain initiatives. We've done that so successfully here at Thurston," he said.

Zolkowski is proud of the \$22 million in construction at Thurston that includes a new gymnasium and the state-of-the-art William F. Weber Performing Arts Center and the work done to get a bond approved by voters. He is also proud of Thurston placing among the top high schools in the state and nation on the annual *Newsweek* list. But he is most proud of his empowered teaching staff.

"This staff is empowered, intelligent and they know how to make kids succeed and they have the energy to do it. They'll be in good shape for the future," he said.

His challenge in the Plymouth-Canton district

will be to restore unity to the 6,000 student Plymouth-Canton Educational Park, which is home to three high schools — Plymouth, Salem and Canton. A number of retirements gives the district an opportunity to replace three principals with a new organization under one principal and assistant principals at each building.

"Everyone would like to return to the collegial atmosphere that once imbued the Park," Zolkowski said. "I think just by the nature of dropping in a third high school, they had become three separate institutions and estranged from each other and lost a sense of the Park."

Zolkowski's hiring (the district will pay him some \$123,000) came with a unanimous vote based on the recommendation of the Plymouth-Canton search team made through Supt. Dr. Craig Fiegel.

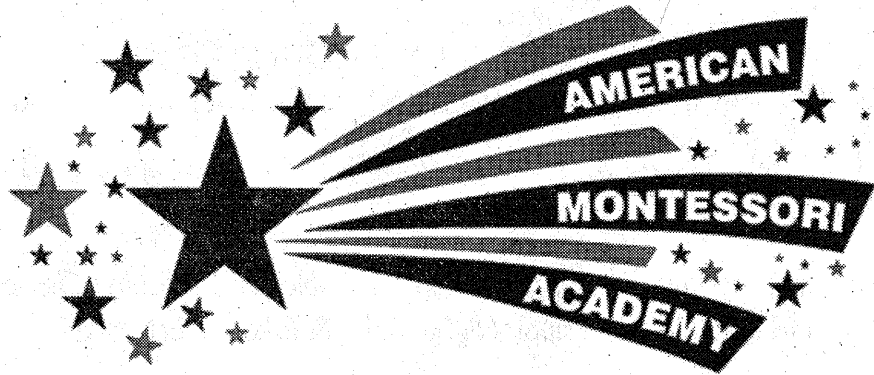
"Bill seemed to be outgoing, and a real advocate for what is going on at Plymouth-Canton," Fiegel said of Zolkowski. "He's a strong believer in what's going on out here and he happened to have some history here, but he's far enough removed to still provide a fresh perspective."

Zolkowski said the Park is a "dynamic, powerful place with a lot of good energy."

But he said he is leaving a good high school with few regrets.

"I'm going to miss this place a lot," he said.

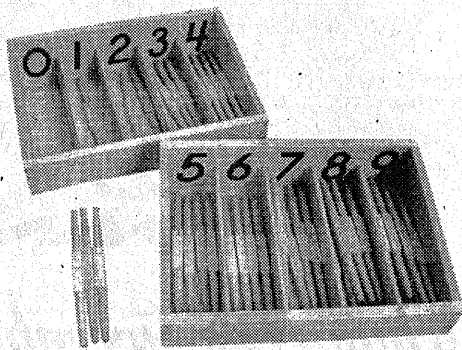

# Sweet smells

## City's downtown gets sweeter with new Kilwin's store

The opening of a downtown Kilwin's gives Plymouth another place where people can satisfy what might be called a recession-proof sweet tooth.

Linda Luhtanen, franchisee of the Kilwin's that opened at Main and Penniman last weekend, said she was concerned about starting a business during a downturn, but also encouraged by a *Wall Street Journal* report that high-end chocolates are one of the things for which sales have gone up despite the economy.

"People are affording themselves little pleasures," said Luhtanen Thursday in her shop, located in a 111-year-old building with exposed brick walls and a high, stamped-tin ceiling.

Customers can find those high-end chocolates and more — ice cream, made-in-the-store fudge and caramel apples, chocolate-covered pretzels and hard candy — at Kilwin's, which joins Kemnitz Fine Candies and The Candy Trail as downtown Plymouth's third candy store. "We were just looking for a new business to go into and we thought this would be fun," said Luhtanen. A daughter, Krista Diamond, worked at a Kilwin's while in college and found the experience rewarding, she said.

The city and the public have been extremely welcoming, Luhtanen said. "It's just been a pleasure," she said. Luhtanen, of Northville,

has a computer background and owned, with other family members, a Livonia software company for about 20 years.

The company was sold two years ago to an India-based firm, with Luhtanen and her son, Todd Luhtanen, contracted to continue working for the new owners to ease the transition. Their contracts will expire shortly.

Luhtanen, however, wanted to stay busy.

"I don't like to sit still," she said. "My plan was to work forever... We had to create some new work."

Todd Luhtanen, who has no financial stake in the new business but might buy into it in the future, is helping his mother get started — and cooking up some of the sweets.

"I kind of have a passion for small business," he said. Luhtanen also does business consulting and produces music from a basement recording studio.

Todd Luhtanen said he's eager for the Plymouth Kilwin's to be part of the community.

"We just really want to be part of the Plymouth downtown community," he said. Kilwin's grew from a store

in Petoskey that opened in 1947; the company now has a presence in several states, with many stores in vacation destinations. The Plymouth Kilwin's is the company's 76th store.

The store hours are 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.; it's open an hour later on Fridays and Saturdays. A grand opening event is planned for next month.

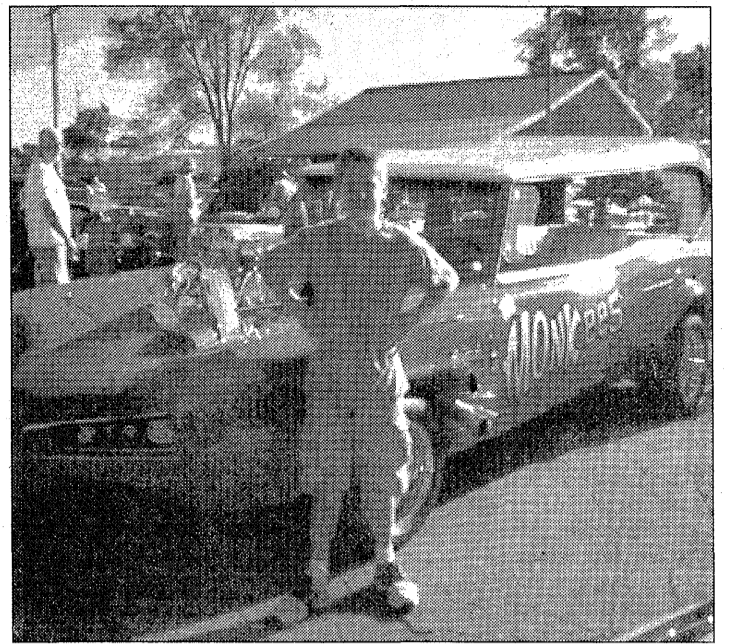

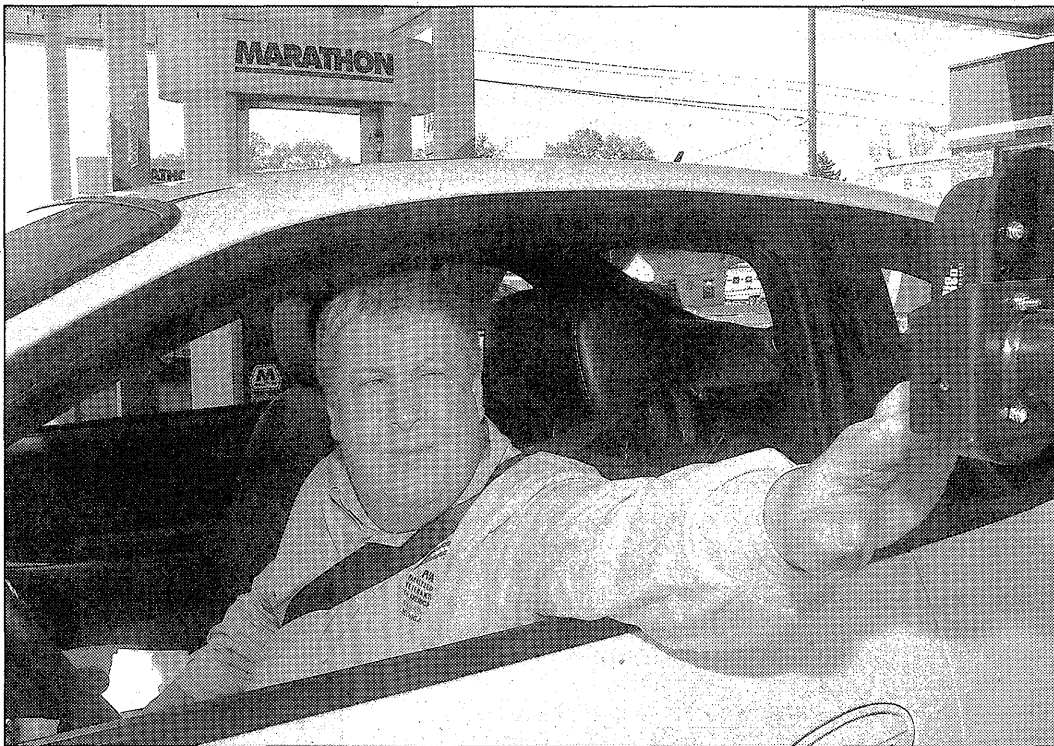

# Button 'dignifies' getting fuel for disabled

Rapids and Mt. Pleasant." The MPVA developed The Pump Guide seven years ago and now lists between 900-1,000 gas stations that provide assistance for the disabled. Another MPVA Web site, [www.disabilitygas.com](http://www.disabilitygas.com), also promotes use of the fuel call and includes a video showing how it is used. The MPVA also is pushing for federal legislation to require the installation of accessible communications devices at all gas stations. In a letter to Iowa Sen. Tom Harkin, Harris said federal legislation "would bring a uniform standard to the gasoline industry and allow drivers with disabilities a process that makes refueling simple and dignified." Harris hopes what Hadi has

done at the Westland gas station will have a domino effect, that once it's proven to be a good investment on his part, other stations will follow suit.

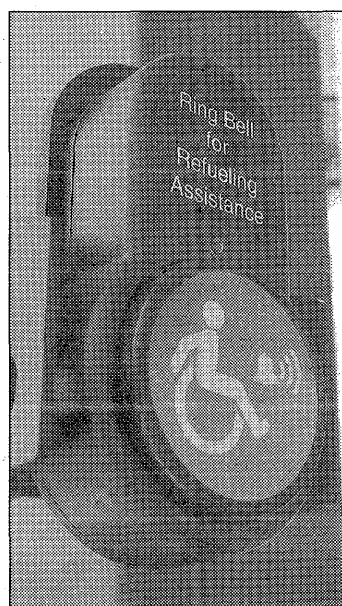
"I hope people see this as a win-win situation," said Harris. "It provides a service for people with disabilities and in return, the owner will see an increase in customers. I hope others take Sam's lead and purchase these buttons."

Harris added that there are tax incentives available under ADA to pay for half the cost of the fuel call buttons.

Harris also said he plans to changing his driving habits. Hadi's station is no longer out of his way.

"I'll come here from now on," he said.

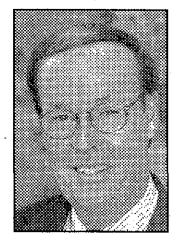

**Top pharmacist**

Medication errors are among the most common medical errors, harming at least 1.5 million people in this country every year according to a 2006 Institute of Medicine report. However, employees at Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills are doing their part to ensure safe delivery of medication to patients every time.

For instance, Botsford

pharmacist Peter Newberry, a Plymouth resident, serves patients through the safety and quality of the hospital's medication system. The library is a drug database, defining clinical guidelines (dose and rate limits, clinical warnings) for each drug in the library. Now when a nurse chooses to infuse a drug in the library, the pump applies the rules and alerts the nurse to any potentially unsafe drug therapy.

"Peter has rapidly responded to concerns about the process for medication order entry based on interactions with our Pharmacy, Nursing and Respiratory staff members," said Marge Hasler, R.N., vice-president and chief nursing officer and chair of the hospital's Safety Board. "By programming the usual dosages and related information into the order entry process, Peter has not only shortened the amount of time it takes to place a medication order, but he has also helped to ensure accuracy and clarity in dispensing and administering."

## Blue streak: Salem dashes to regional title

A few moments after Salem boys track-and-field coach Kyle Meteyer instructed the members of his 1,600-meter relay team to "just hang on to the baton" Friday night, the four speedy Rocks applied a velcro-like grip on the school's most significant track-and-field accomplishment in recent memory.

Bolstered by a surging finish, Salem captured the Division 1 Region 5 title by racking up 99 points, 17 more than hard-charging runner-up Livonia

Stevenson. The Spartans clipped third-place Detroit Cass Tech when the Technicians' four-by-400 relay team was disqualified in the final race of the night.

The icing on the Rocks' amazing resurgence was capped when their mile-relay contingent of Scott O'Connor, Daniel Martin, Dominique Williams and Zachary Gaskell won the finale in 3:28.27.

Salem had taken the lead for good one race earlier when Matt Devey, Mike Charara and Jason Smith finished 2-4-5, respectively, in the 3,200-meter run.

"Before the four-by-four race started, I went down and told the guys that we were very close to winning," recalled Meteyer. "I didn't tell them how many points we needed but I knew if we finished sixth or better, we'd win the meet. I told them to just get around the track and hang on to the baton and they went out and won, which put a stamp on the night."

"This was a long day for all these guys and they were all hurting (before the final race), but they really stepped it up for the team."

Meteyer said he first saw a glimpse

of the program's potential at an invitational two springs ago.

"After we lost our first two dual meets two years ago, we won the Raider Relays," said Meteyer. "After that, I thought to myself, 'Holy cow, we have some athletes on this team.' From that time on, we've been building and building. Although we lose good athletes to injury and graduation every year, we've been able to replace them with better athletes and we're at the point now where we can win a Regional."

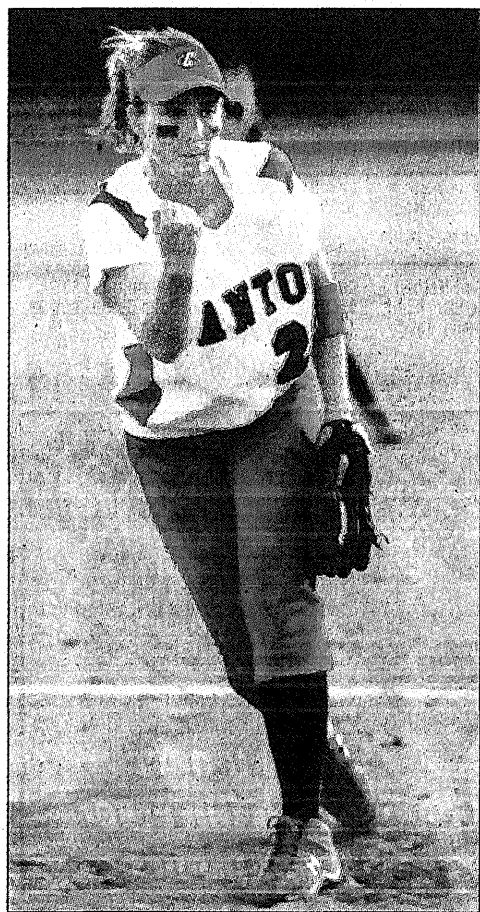

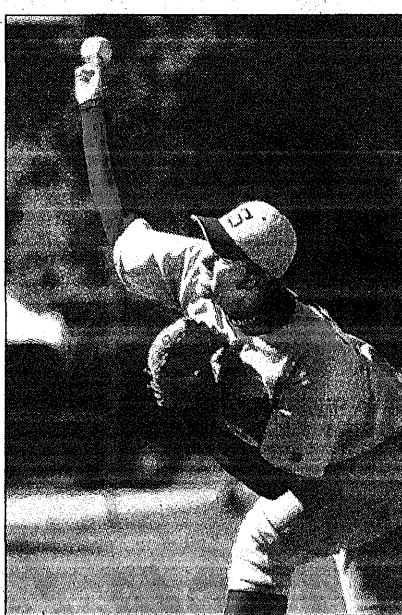
Salem right-handed pitcher Corey Streck was thrown into a pressure cooker Thursday afternoon during the first game of a doubleheader against PCEP rival Canton.

# Charger girls edge Franklin to claim regional track title

Evert needed Navratilova, Ali couldn't avoid Frazier and apparently the Livonia Churchill and Livonia Franklin girls track and field teams bring out the best in each other as well.

Friday's MHSAA Division 1 regional went right down to the final event with Churchill repeating as champion by a razor-thin margin of 122-119.5 over the Patriots.

Westland John Glenn finished third in the 16-team field with 69 points followed by Detroit Cass Tech and Livonia Stevenson rounding out the top five with 65 and 60, respectively.

Once again junior Sara Kroll figured prominently in Churchill's victory as she overhauled Stevenson senior Courtney Calka on the final turn to win feature race of the day, the 1,600-meter run, in 4:57.34; Kroll shattered her own school record, while Calka also lowered her own mark with a 4:57.39.

Churchill also got wins from freshman Senclair McDonnell in the high jump (5 feet, 2 inches) and junior Taylor Byron in the shot put (36-10).

"I don't know what to say other than everybody played huge roles," Churchill coach Pat Daugherty said. "The credit goes to our seniors and captains Samar (Aoude), (Shannon) Getchen, (Alicia) DiMauro and Kroll. We got points from a lot of places. It was a repeat of the city meet where it came down to the 4 x 400.

"I also have to commend Franklin. They really kicked our butts in the 4 x 800. Dave (Bjorklund) has brought that program a long way in three or four years from nothing."

Bethany Pilat also gave Churchill a boost with a fourth in the 1,600 and a third in the 3,200.

"It was huge that she (Pilat) scored in the mile (1,600), too," Daugherty said. "And our throwers, Taylor Byron and Shannon Getchen, along with DiMauro (fourth) in the pole vault, got us 28 points. They go unheralded and don't get a lot of attention, but those were huge points for us."

Churchill's sprint relay tams also grabbed a third (4 x 100) and a fourth (4 x 200). "Those were big for us," Daugherty said. "If we finish sixth where we were seeded in the 4 x 100, and don't get third, we lose.

"We also got a boost from a couple of our freshmen. Leah Heinzelman was in our sprint relays and Senclair (McDonnell) wins the high jump where she was seeded eighth."

Franklin, which defeated Churchill in a dual meet and fell only a few points behind the Chargers in the Public Schools of Livonia Invitational, had a banner day.

The Patriots received individual firsts from Emily Quint, pole vault (10-2.25); Seneca Scott, 100 hurdles (16.09); Ashly Butkowski, 400 (1:00.36); and Megan McPherson, 3,200 (school record 11:14.19).

"I can't complain, we went better than what I scored it

going in," Franklin coach Dave Bjorklund said. "We scored more than our seedings and we had more state qualifiers - seven girls - which is more than we've ever had. I thought Ashly Butkowski had a phenomenal day and Seneca Scott runs the 4 x 800, then goes over to the 100 hurdles prelims and semis, runs the 300 hurdles, then runs the 4 x 400, which is a lot to ask."

Franklin's 4 x 800 relay team also surprised with a runner-up finish to Dearborn in a school record 9:49.73.

"We put the importance on focusing on the state meet," Bjorklund said. "A lot of things went better than expected and nothing worse. But hats off to Churchill. He (Daugherty) had a little more depth than our depth."

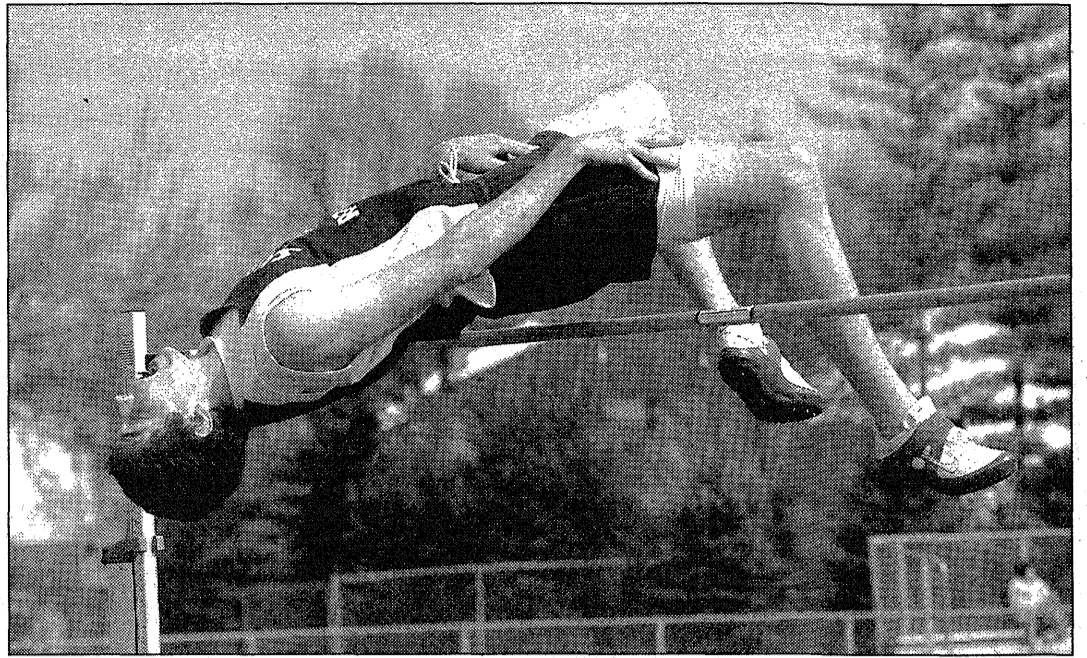
Glenn also impressed led by senior Chanel Payne, who broke a 31-year-old school record in the long jump with a leap of 18 feet, 5.75 inches eclipsing Karen McDougall's mark of 18-3 set in 1978.

Payne also won the 100 in 12.42 and teamed up with Aubrie Scott, Shaunte Roberts and Stephany Brown for a first in the 400 relay (49.61) and a second in the 800 relay (1:47.17).

Stevenson's lone first was recorded by Becky Adamcheck in the 300 hurdles (46.56).

The top two finishers in each event automatically qualify for the Division 1 state meet Saturday, May 30 at East Kentwood. Additional state qualifying standards also at stake. See complete results.

# Busy schedule results in several W's for 'Cats

Plymouth's softball team had a lot to show for a 10-games-in-seven-days stretch that concluded with Thursday afternoon's doubleheader split with visiting South Lyon.

The Wildcats' most notable prize was the first-place trophy they earned following a championship effort at the Canton Classic tournament held May 9.

Plymouth (21-7) defeated the host Chiefs, 3-0, in the Canton Classic title game as pitcher Lauren Smith tossed a complete-game five-hit shutout. Smith struck out three and walked two.

"That's the first time we've won the Canton Classic, so that will definitely be a day to remember," said Plymouth coach Val Canfield. "The team was very excited about winning it all."

"Lauren pitched a great game and our catcher, Erin Rodes, did a great job of calling the pitches."

The Wildcats scored all the runs they would need in their two-run first inning when Marissa Blassic and Smith delivered RBI singles to score Beth Heldmeyer and Amanda Burnard, respectively. Plymouth banged out nine hits.

Plymouth opened the Classic by nipping Belleville, 3-2, despite getting outhit, 10-3.

"Samantha Cole pitched for Belleville, so any time you can beat her, you know you've done something," said Canfield.

Heldmeyer knocked in two runs with a second-inning single and Burnard brought home Christy Pattison with a first-inning hit.

Smith struck out one and didn't walk a batter to pick up the win.

Plymouth improved to 2-0 with a 7-6 triumph over perennially strong Tecumseh, which nearly overcame a 7-3 seventh-inning deficit.

Smith notched the win after yielding 10 hits and one walk. She struck out two Indians.

Offensively, the Wildcats were sparked by Heldmeyer (2-for-4, two doubles), Rodes (2-for-3, three runs), Stacey Klonowski (2-for-4, triple), Burnard (2-for-3, three RBI, triple) and Jill Brennan, who went 2-for-4 with two ribbies.

The Wildcats bounced Brighton, 10-0, in game three, thanks to two-hit efforts from Rodes, Heldmeyer, Klonowski, Pattison and Jessica Bondy. Klonowski scored three runs and drove home a pair with a triple. Smith and Miranda Oliver combined on the four-hit shutout.

Plymouth warmed up for the Canton Classic by sweeping a double-header from South Lyon East, 14-1 and 15-1. Both games were called after five innings due to the MHSAA mercy rule.

Smith tossed a three-hitter in game one before Oliver followed suit in the nightcap when she allowed just four safeties.

Five Wildcats enjoyed big days at the plate in game one: Rodes (3-for-4, three runs), Heldmeyer (3-for-3, double), Klonowski (3-for-3, four runs, four RBI), Burnard (3-for-3, three runs, two RBI) and Pattison, who went 2-for-4 with an RBI.

Pacing the Wildcats' 16-hit attack in game two were Heldmeyer (3-for-4, three RBI), Klonowski (3-for-4, three runs, four RBI, home run), Burnard (2-for-4, two runs, two RBI), Brennan (3-for-4), Tessa Heldmeyer (2-for-4, two runs) and Oliver, who went 1-for-3.

On Monday, Plymouth dropped a 7-4 decision at Canton. The Chiefs jumped out to a 5-1 lead after five innings by scoring one run in the first and two in the second and fifth. The 'Cats rallied to within 5-4 with a three-spot in the top of the sixth, but Canton countered with a pair of runs in the bottom half of the frame.

Canton outhit Plymouth, 13-8. Smith suffered the loss, striking out one and walking one. Heldmeyer and Burnard both went 2-for-4.

Plymouth rebounded from the setback two days later when it pounded Livonia Churchill, 9-0. Smith hurled a six-hitter, striking out two Chargers. Bondy (3-for-3, three runs), Klonowski (2-for-4, two RBI), Burnard (2-for-3, three RBI, triple), Brennan (2-for-3) and Pattison (triple) led the Wildcats' offensive attack.

The Wildcats edged South Lyon, 3-2, in the opening game of Thursday's twinbill before falling in the nightcap, 5-4.

Smith struck out a career-high seven in the game-one triumph as the Wildcats overcame four errors thanks to strong hitting from Burnard (3-for-3, two RBI) and Blassic, who went 2-for-3 with an RBI triple.

The Lions overcame a 4-1 deficit with four seventh-inning runs to avoid getting swept.

"We committed eight errors in the doubleheader, which is unacceptable," said Canfield. "I don't know if it was fatigue or what, but we can't do that in the playoffs and expect to win."

The bright spot in the loss was Heldmeyer, who went 4-for-4 with three two-base hits.

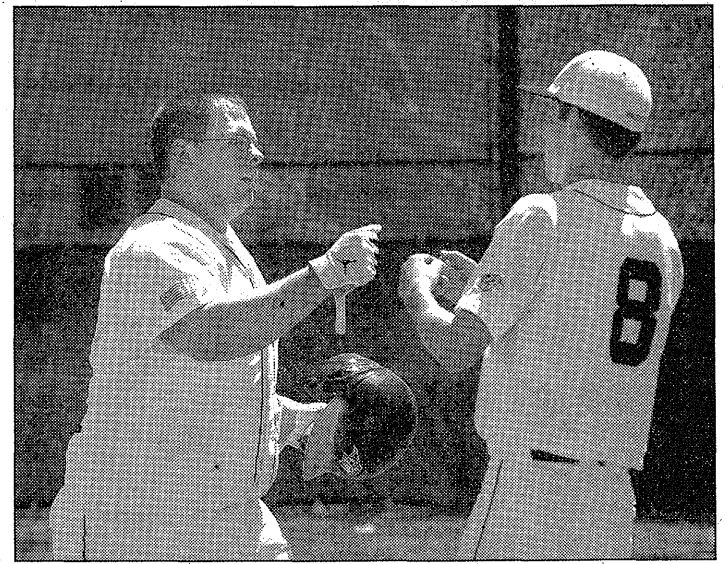

Karen and Phil James miss daughter Leah, who died Aug. 3, 2005, at age 5 1/2. Good memories live on in their hearts, and they reach out to others to fight the illness that claimed Leah.

Leah's Happy Hearts second annual Happy Feet for Happy Hearts Walk will be Sunday, June 7, at Maybury State Park in Northville Township. Registration for the 5K will be at noon, the event at 1 p.m., with proceeds supporting pediatric brain tumor research. The event raises money in memory of Leah James, who died of a brain tumor. Karen James is again organizing the walk, which also will focus on offering fun activities for children with brain tumors.

"Also we host a Christmas event at Mott Children's Hospital" in Ann Arbor, Karen James said. Organizers set up "stores" on the hospital floors where young patients can shop for free for family gifts. The volunteers then wrap those gifts for the families. The nonprofit also makes, with Girl Scout help, no-tie fleece blankets for the children at Mott, where Leah was treated. There are also photos of the children inside snow globes. "I think there needs to be more research done," James said. The goal is for a cure and for

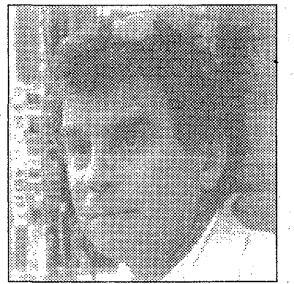

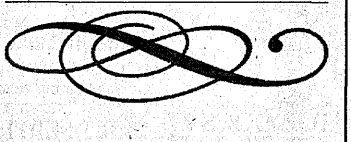

## Spring concert

**Churchill students perform with professional director**

Elizabeth Hering will relinquish her conducting duties for most of Churchill High School Chamber Orchestra's spring concert Wednesday.

But her 50 students will be in good hands as they play music by Tchaikovsky, Gliere and Saint-Saëns, under the direction of maestro Arie Lipsky of the Ann Arbor Symphony Orchestra.

Hering, Churchill's director of bands and orchestras, says she feels confident her student musicians will perform well under another conductor's baton.

"I think every conductor has their own personality. With students who are used to working with one style, there's a bit of adjustment. But maestro Lipsky is clear and easy to work with," she said, adding that he led a workshop with her students in March. He'll rehearse with them again this week, Monday-Wednesday, in preparation for the show.

"What he'll do is likely want to hear what we've been working on and then he'll rehearse the music with them. It's a chance to play under a professional conductor in preparation for a concert."

Although the Ann Arbor Symphony offers several

outreach programs, Lipsky's work with the Churchill students and subsequent concert is a first for the professional orchestra. "We have four ensembles that go to area schools and perform two 30-minute performances with a question and answer period," said Lara Dunbar, education and outreach director for the Ann Arbor Symphony. "Arie also visits schools as part of our Meet Your Conductor program. He gives a 30- to 40-minute presentation as a school assembly. He also works with orchestra classes when asked. Arie loves this type of interaction with young musicians."

"This supports our mission, develops our future audience and just may be preparing our future players. Our orchestra members love the opportunity to work with students as well."

The symphony's "Side-By-Side" concerts bring high school musicians and professionals together for performance. Both Hering and Dunbar hope Churchill's upcoming spring show with Lipsky is a first step in preparation for a Side-By-Side con-

cert at Churchill next year.

"There have been three Side-By-Side concerts with Pinckney Community Schools," Dunbar noted. "Side-By-Side concerts are big projects that take a great deal of time and work. We hope that an actual Side-By-Side concert will grow out of the Orchestra Night with Churchill."

Hering said her orchestra's concert proceeds have paid the fee for Lipsky's visits this year. She's hopeful that the Ann Arbor Symphony will obtain a National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) grant, to cover most of the Side-By-Side costs at Churchill next year.

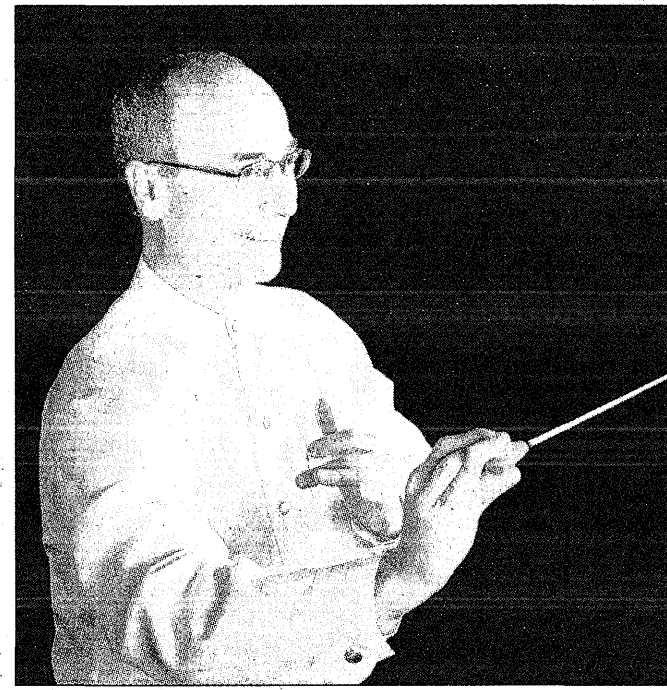
"Next year we'd only have to cover a small portion of the \$10,000 cost. We would not have to do any fund-raisers," Hering said the Side-By-Side cost is considerably higher than Lipsky's workshop fee because it includes "a whole orchestra and union musicians."

She likes the idea that Churchill High School Chamber Orchestra will work with the professional musicians over a two-year period because more students will benefit from the experiences. She learned a few lessons from Lipsky's visit, too.

"The biggest piece of advice to me was that I needed to trust my students to do the right thing. I need to allow them more freedom to perform. It was great advice. I've been trying to do that," Hering said. "They have to be more responsible. If I'm not giving them every bit of information, they have to listen to each other more."

**NEURITIS**  
Why would a column devoted to arthritis discuss neuritis? The reason is that often people with pain in their feet and ankles assume that the pain comes from an arthritis problem. They are surprised when the doctor tells them they should see a neurologist for confirmation and treatment.  
Neuritis means inflammation of nerve endings. The neuritis that look like arthritis comes from nerve endings in the feet and hands. The pain may be sharp but usually is tingling and burning. The pain is present day and night, and is often worse at night. This feature helps a doctor know he is not dealing with arthritis, which improves with rest. Neuritis pain is bilateral, and comes on over a short period of a few days or weeks. In the feet, the discomfort starts in the toes and works up to the ankle, and in the hands the problem begins in the finger tips and moves to the wrist. Thus, doctors describe the pain as moving in "a glove and stocking" distribution.  
Diabetes is a common cause of neuritis. However, drugs, diet, heredity, Lupus, vasculitis and cancers (rarely) can be cause. Many doctors after identifying that the problem is neuritis will refer the patient to a neurologist as this specialist has the equipment and training to determine the underlying cause of the problem.  
Treatment varies. Individuals with neuritis related to diabetes may do well with Lyrca. In cases of drug-related neuritis, stopping the medication is the treatment of choice. At times, no therapy works, and treating the pain is all that doctors can do.

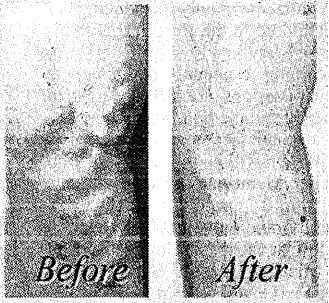

## Healthy Legs, Healthy You!

"I thought it was normal for my legs to ache at the end of the day."



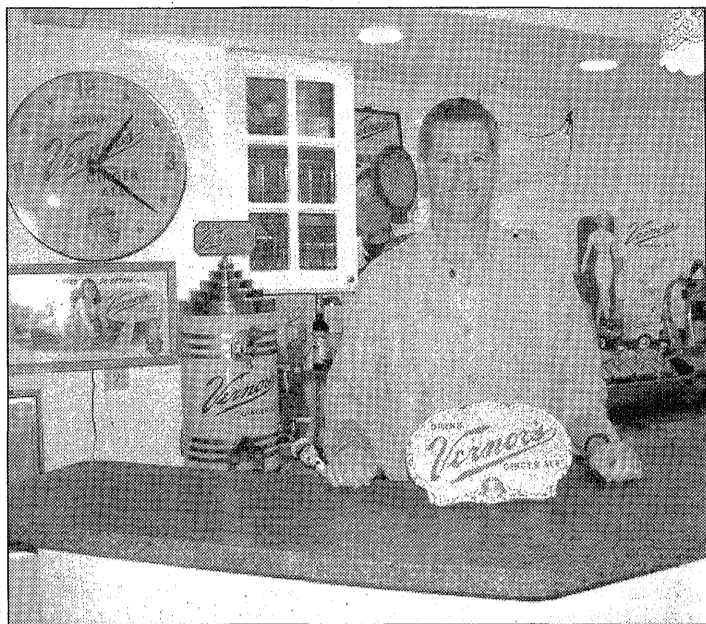

# Vernors collector revives bygone days

story, Wunderlich was able to interview Ron Bialecki who was the Vernors Gnome in the 1970s and 1980s.

### COLLECTING

"I don't remember the plant at the foot of Woodward, but I remember a sign by Wayne State with the Gnome," said Wunderlich, whose slide show traces the history of Vernors from the Civil War to today. "I find items all over the place although they're getting harder to find, garage sales, flea markets, the annual advertising show in Indianapolis. People also know I collect and contact me."

Wunderlich estimates he owns a couple of thousand Vernors items. Stepping into his basement is like returning to Vernors soda fountain days.

"You can do it inexpensively," said Wunderlich. "There are a ton

who could go down in history as Vernors' biggest promoter of the soft drink. "I love it. It's a great pop and there's that Detroit connection. With the economy the way it is now, people are buying local. We're seeing a lot of interest in home-grown things to help our local economy."

Robert Legel remembers Vernors was the only fluid his wife could keep down before she died five years ago. Like Wunderlich

he's heard stories about people's fondness for the soda. That's why the Livonia Historical Society selected Wunderlich as a highlight of its annual banquet. The public is invited to celebrate the 52nd anniversary of the service organization which helps refurbish and restore historic buildings at Greenmead. Its flea market in the fall brought in \$14,000 last year.

"The banquet is not really a fund-raiser," said Legel, historical society president for the last two years. "We hope to have Vernors floats for dessert. I just came back from the senior center in Livonia where I took a flier. People said, 'We grew up there. I know where that building was on Woodward.'"

The LHS banquet begins at 6 p.m. Thursday, May 21, in the Alexander Blue House and features dinner, a silent auction and presentation by Wunderlich. Tickets are \$16, and available by calling Greenmead at (248) 477-7375 or Legel at (734) 591-6845.

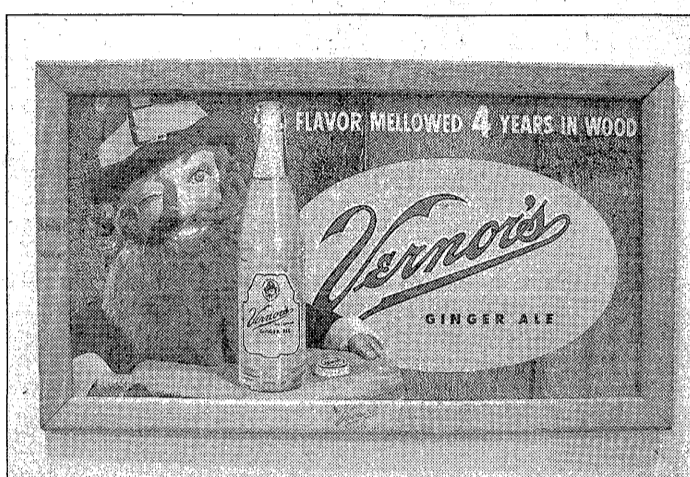
Anytime my brother, sister or I had an upset stomach, our mother would heat up Vernors. Thousands of other Detroiters have similar memories. That's why the Livonia Historical Society invited collector Keith Wunderlich to speak about the phenomena at its annual banquet Thursday, May 21, at Greenmead

Historical Park on the corner of Newburgh and Eight Mile. Wunderlich became interested in the memorabilia after discovering Vernors bottles from the '50s and '60s in his parents' garage as a teenager. The 52-year-old Troy man learns about the impact of the soda every time he gives a presentation or signs copies of his book, *Vernors Ginger Ale*, from Arcadia Publishing. Even his students know about the soda. Wunderlich is assistant superintendent for curriculum and instruction of L'Anse Creuse Public Schools.

"People come up afterwards and tell me they went to Vernors soda fountain or there's a certain recipe they liked, Cream Ales, half cream and half Vernors, or different syrups they put into it, a cherry flavoring. I hear a lot about hot Vernors," said Wunderlich. Vernors was founded by phar-

macist James Vernor in 1866 after he returned home from the Civil War. It's unknown why he chose ginger for the soda formula he was perfecting, but the Chinese have used the extract to treat indigestion for 2,000 years.

"James Vernor worked in a drugstore in the early 1860s and was messing around with a formula for ginger ale," said Wunderlich. "He enlisted and was in the Civil War for four years. When he returned he opened up a keg of extract he was working with. He hadn't changed the formula but it had mellowed. Even today it's still aged in oak barrels for three years."

Vernors is still made in Detroit by Pepsi. It is the oldest produced soda in the nation. For the inside

of bottles you can pick up for a \$1. I see them in antique malls. eBay is full of Vernors memorabilia. I have dispensers. Old newsletters give me a lot of the history of the company, uniforms. My earliest items are from Vernors in the 1870s, early letter heads from 1900 and before, early trays from the soda fountains. It all helps tell the story of Vernors."

Wunderlich writes about different Vernors topic for every quarterly newsletter of the collector's club he founded ([www.wowway.com/~vernors](http://www.wowway.com/~vernors)).

"Vernors had soda fountains in Pontiac, Flint which is still there, Toledo, Dayton, Canada, Buffalo, New York," said Wunderlich,

The 2009 tax rate for City operating millage is proposed to be 11.3834 mills, which is the same as the 2008 operating tax rate. The City Commission has the authority under the City Charter to set the operating millage rate within the maximum allowed rate of 11.3834 mills, as adjusted by the Headlee millage roll-back formula.

The 2009 tax rate for debt service millage to fund debt service requirements for the 2002, 2004 and 2008 General Obligation Street Bond issues is proposed to be 2.7700 mills, an increase of 1.5200 mills from the 2008 tax rate.

The 2009 tax rate for City solid waste and recycling millage is proposed to be 1.7200 mills which is the same as the 2008 tax rate.

The total City millage for all purposes is proposed to be 15.8734 mills for 2009, which is an increase of 1.5200 mills from the 2008 total City tax rate of 14.3534 mills.

**EQUALIZATION FACTORS:** Wayne County established a tentative 2009 equalization factors of 0.8892 for the residential class of property, .9247 for the commercial class of property and .9852 for the industrial class of property. Since the City has decreased assessments for the residential, commercial, and industrial classes for 2009 by the proposed factors, all 2009 equalization factors will be set at 1.0000.

## NOTICE OF ADOPTION CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDINANCE NO. 99.011

### TEXT AMENDMENT 005

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TEXT OF PLYMOUTH CHARTER TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 99 BY AMENDING ARTICLE XXXVI, SECTION 36.2.78, DEFINITIONS: GASOLINE SERVICE STATION WITH OR WITHOUT THE SALE OF CONVENIENCE GOODS.

THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Part I. The Zoning Ordinance No. 99 of the Charter Township of Plymouth is hereby amended as follows:

Section 36.2.78. Definitions.

#### 78. GASOLINE SERVICE STATION WITH OR WITHOUT THE SALE OF CONVENIENCE GOODS:

An establishment that includes buildings and premises for the primary purpose of retail gasoline sales. An automobile convenience/gasoline service station may also include an area devoted to sales of automotive items and convenience goods primarily sold to patrons purchasing gasoline. A service station is not an automobile repair or body shop. The retail sale of foods, drinks and other convenience goods may be included in addition to the sale of fuel, however, the sale of packaged alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

Part II. VIOLATION AND PENALTY. Unless otherwise provided, any person, corporation, partnership or any other legal entity who violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisoned for not more than ninety (90) days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

Part III. SEVERABILITY. If any clause, sentence, section, paragraph or part of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person, firm, corporation, legal entity or circumstances, shall be for any reason adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, said judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to the legislative intent of this body that the Ordinance is severable, and that the Ordinance would have been adopted had such invalid or unconstitutional provision not have been included in this Ordinance.

Part IV. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES. All Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Part V. SAVINGS CLAUSE. All rights and duties which have matured, penalties which have been incurred, proceedings which have begun and prosecution for violations of law occurring before the effective date of this Ordinance are not affected or abated by this Ordinance.

Part VI. PUBLICATION. The Clerk for the Charter Township of Plymouth shall cause a Notice of Adoption of this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

Part VII. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Zoning Ordinance text amendment shall be effective seven days after publication.

Part VIII. ADOPTION. The Ordinance was adopted by the Township Board of the Charter Township of Plymouth by authority of Act 110 of Public Acts of Michigan, 2006, as amended, at a meeting duly called and held on May 12, 2009 and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law. The Ordinance may be purchased or inspected at the office of the Charter Township of Plymouth, 9955 N. Haggerty Road, Plymouth, Michigan 48170, during regular business hours.

## Children's support group builds sandcastles from grief

Megan Wolfston rips page after page from a phone book. Only minutes before the 11-year-old girl was racing to change places under the parachute canopy as part of play therapy. SandCastles grief support group for children brings to the surface feelings hidden deep inside after the loss of a loved one.

Wolfston's sister, 3 1/2 year old Miranda, died from neuroblastoma, a childhood cancer. Afterwards Megan attended the group for several years along with her older brother and sister. She returned recently after the death of her grandfather.

SandCastles is a continuum of the Henry Ford Hospice program in the Henry Ford Health System. Wolfston and her mother Paula leave their home in Clawson for the Birney Middle School location of SandCastles in Southfield every other Tuesday evening. In addition to support groups, a summer camp allows children and teens to grieve in a supportive environment and learn coping skills.

"Joshua had a problem opening up," said Paula Wolfston. "SandCastles helped him learn a way to express himself with grief. Crystal didn't want to upset her mom by talking about it but needed to. It helped Megan, who was 2 1/2, understand her sister wasn't coming back."

After the games were over, Megan talked quietly about the sister she missed.

"It helps me remember her," said Megan. "We used to do a lot together. It's fun being with other people who had members who have passed, doing cool activities, blowing bubbles."

Jason Tylenda is one of the volunteers trained to work with the children. Earlier he was calling out questions. "Everyone who's been sad since their person died" switch to the other side of the

parachute canopy. All of the children raced across the room.

"It's a lot about normalization," said Tylenda. "It shows someone else was sad. There are others like you."

Founded in 1997, SandCastles offers grief support for children, ages 3 to 18, at 7 sites including Livonia and Rochester. The evening begins with dinner followed by activities in the Volcano room to let off steam. A group discussion helps children build sandcastles from grief.

"The anger and frustration for kids build up on the inside," said Peggy Nielsen, program manager. "The feelings are not wrong but what you do with it is wrong. We have punching bags, building blocks to knock down. We start the program with dinner as a lot of families are now single parents. It's a way to get to know each other. There's something about socializing over food that brings people together."

The adults as well as children need support during the grieving. An adult group meets separately in another room.

"I didn't have a support system at home," said Paula Wolfston. "It helped me to talk to people who felt the same way and to under-

stand what my children were going through."

Three years after Sharon Amey's husband committed suicide she continues to attend the SandCastles grief program at a Livonia church every other Thursday evening with her 7-year old twins, Ashley and Kevin. The children were 4 when their 52-year old father killed himself after being laid off two weeks before Christmas in 2005.

"We were going every two weeks then stopped going for awhile until I noticed the kids were struggling," said Amey of Canton. "Most of the times a person who commits suicide gets it in their mind everybody would be better off. They have no clue what the family is going to go through. I don't think he was thinking what Ashley and Kevin would do without him. At first they were so young and I would ask them what you talked about. They'd say we talked about times daddy took them sledding, played with them, took them to the park. They showed me the crafts they made. They would be about their dad being gone. Sometimes they would even say 'mom is sad.' When the kids went to the camp, they finally felt like they were not alone. I could see they got it. It was nice to see them being empathetic with other children who'd lost someone. SandCastles helped them get there. They turned their sad or bad times into telling somebody you're going to be okay."

Amey dealt with her grief in the adult group.

"Talking really does help when someone commits suicide. You have to talk," said Amey. "At SandCastles everyone is so supportive. As parents we mostly talked about the kids and how they were reacting. After a year or two you see your children being helped and they're going to be okay then the parents can grieve."

Amey thinks she's reached a point where she's going to be

okay. "I'd just like people to know there's always, even though it doesn't seem like it, a family member you can go to, a minister. There are just so many different places to help with a problem. I drill that into my kids. You have aunts, uncles, cousins and you always can come to me whatever is going through your mind. With all the layoffs, I just want to tell people there's hope. There's always a new career. My husband could have been a master gardener. Every year I see the two wisteria he tended. Our neighbor said he left his legacy in the crocuses and tulips."

## ADJUSTING TO A NEW CUSTOMER BASE

**WORKWISE**

Developing informal partnerships at work is an emerging trend. While management might advocate specific ones, it's possible for you to form them on your own.

Philip Berry, president of Philip Berry Associates L.L.C., a human capital and employment consulting firm in New York City, defines these as relationships of "shared understanding, with both parties working toward the same goals and objectives." By increasing productivity and motivation, they have a major impact.

**"JOINT DESTINY"**  
When you're feeling isolated in a large or small company, Berry points out, building these partnerships on your own will bring richness to your work, a sense of "joint destiny," with some meaningful benefits:

- feeling that you've rejoined the human community;
- knowing that people are helping you rather than working against you;
- noticing that other people understand, support and validate your work; and
- working more easily, which elevates your

mood.

As Berry puts it, "You'll stop thinking that you're rolling water uphill."

**TALL ORDER**  
The fact that this is a tall order doesn't make it impossible to achieve. You can form these ties if you choose the best people and you follow several steps. The first has to do with finding the partner.

You need a good match, a person whose stake in the shared objective is as great as yours. You'll be able to spot the person when you see "how well (you) click" and appreciate the other's contributions," says Helen Cooke, managing director of Cooke Consulting Group, L.L.C., in Haddon Heights, N.J.

To cultivate successful partnerships," she continues, "you must make time to inquire (without being invasive) about the other person. This doesn't require a major time commitment but to work well, it does require genuine interest in the other person -- his or her likes and dislikes and goals. Begin to demonstrate your care by spending two minutes asking the other person about his or her weekend before launching into your Monday morning meeting agenda." She adds that you must get outside of yourself by empathizing with the other person.

Once you've identified a good potential partner, you can build this relationship if you understand that "relationships are built on meeting each other's needs," states Drew McLellan of McLellan Marketing Group

Inc., in Des Moines, Ia. "Find ways to let the person know that you're paying attention and you care. On occasion, make a grand gesture, such as staying late to them with a project or in smoothing over a mistake with the boss." Express your thanks often and be willing to forgive (genuinely) when the person makes a mistake. These steps will build trust, an essential element in informal partnerships.

Some simple and not-so-simple steps will build a basic, not necessarily formal, structure that allows you to communicate effectively. That is critical in this relationship, because you might not always view a situation the same way. Berry recommends a regular "expectation exchange" whereby you agree to meet in person, communicate by telephone or write a memo summarizing progress. He says that this is essential to facilitating the work, because it develops a comfort level that encourages openness.

If you don't give each other feedback and handle conflicts, you may well jeopardize the relationship. "Sometimes individuals will ignore disagreements or not tell the other party what's on their mind," he explains. "If one has given the other a proposal and the other party didn't like it, there may be hurt feelings. Because of them, there may be a withdrawal from the relationship. Informal partnerships build open communication and trust to meet shared goals and objectives. The effort enriches your work while promoting well-being in the workplace."
